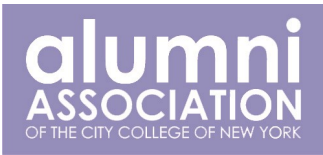

Nicole Carroll '15

Women's Soccer

Nicole Carroll graduated from the College in June, 2015 with a degree in History. A transfer from Concordia College, Nicole was looking to make an impact on the women's soccer team, and an impact she made! She was the starting goalkeeper for our women's team in the three years at the College, playing every minute of every game during her three years! In her second year on the team she helped lead the team to the CUNYAC Championship and the College's first trip to the NCAA D III National Championship Tournament. During that season, Nicole had 14 shut-outs, a CCNY and CUNY record. She received conference All-Star status and other awards that year. In 2013 Nicole continued to be the dominant CUNY goalkeeper, winning CUNY and ECAC All-Star recognition while serving as the team's captain. After graduation, Nicole became the head coach of the Monroe College women's soccer team before becoming the director of goal keeping for the Downtown United Soccer Club, where she now works. Nicole noted that, "my time at City shaped me as a person and put me on the path that I am on today".



GETACHEW ESHETE '82

Men's Track & Field

Getachew Eshete was born in 1952 at a small roadside rural town in south central Ethiopia. He attended school in the area until the age of sixteen. Thereafter, a boarding school in the northern historical city of Gondar; where he briefly participated in playing on the school's basketball team. Running mileage on terrain was a recreational activity until and after coming to New York City in 1974.

In the fall of 1979, Getachew attended the City College of New York. His running potential was discovered while attending a physical education class instructed by Dr. Francisco Castro; the cross country, and track & field coach at the college. Therefore, enticing and getting him to join the college's athletic team that year. He competed in three seasons for the beavers from 1979 to 1982. During that time, he accumulated nine athletic letters in the sport, and established himself as the most valuable runner on the cross country team each year.

In 1981, Getachew participated on 2 CUNY Championship teams in cross country and track & field. In cross country, he won the individual title in the 1980 CUNY championships; and placed second in 1979, and 1981. He placed 7th in the 1981 Collegiate track conference championships in cross country, held at Van Cortlandt park in the Bronx. His time, 25:39 over the grueling 5 mile course, places him 2nd on the CCNY all-time 5 mile cross country list behind Jim O'Connell's 25:12. Mr. Eshete consist-

ently ran under 27:00 minutes for 5 miles; which qualified him to run in regional championship meets. He participated in the 1981 Division III National Collegiate cross country championships held at Carthage College in Kenosha, Wisconsin. On the track, he won individual championship titles in the 1980 CUNY indoor 10,000 meter run; 1981 CUNY indoor 3,000 meter run; 1981 CUNY outdoor 5,000 meter run; and was the anchor leg on the 2 mile relay team placing first in the 1981 CUNY indoor championships. His outstanding running achievements in the 1981 CUNY indoor championship meet earned him the MVP award.

A Foreign student tuition waiver was granted to Getachew in 1981; aiding him in completing his undergraduate education. He graduated from CCNY in 1982 with a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering, and a Master's degree in the same field of study in 1987. Getachew was a outstanding runner in cross country and road races competing for the Millrose Athletic Club in NYC from 1981 to 1987; with victories in the Mazola Corn Oil and Inwood Heights 10k races in 1981; and Steve Prefontaine Memorial Sc in 1982.

In 1988, Getachew relocated to live in Riverside, California; obtaining a job working for the state of California; a regional water quality board position; who design; build; maintain and operate the state freeway and highway systems. Today, he still resides in Riverside, California with his wife and family; a son and daughter; and 31 years of work experience as a Senior transportation engineer



Roger Gonzalez '11

Men's Soccer

Born in Caracas, Venezuela in 1984 and, like many boys Roger grew up, playing soccer. When he was 15 he was on the Venezuelan under 15 national team and was called up to the under 17 team but could not play because he was injured. In 2001 Roger was on an exchange program in Iceland, to both learn the language and culture and to play on their under 18 national team.

After returning to Venezuela I immigrated to the United States with my sister. America, New York City, City College and my coach and mentor Robert Ignaccolo, all of which has helped become the man he is today.

While working on his undergraduate degree in political science at City College, he played on the men's soccer team for 4 years, and served as team co-captain. Roger was a first team All Star in both 2005 and 2006 and was elected for the CUNYAC Goodwill trip to South Africa. That great experience showed me how sports, and soccer, could help to bridge gaps and uplift people.

After graduation he continued his soccer career at City College as an assistant coach for the men's team. Roger went on to coach the boy's soccer team at Columbia Grammar School and then on to coach at the Red Bulls youth development academy. He pursued and completed a Masters Degree in Sports Business Management at Manhattanville College and did my internship with the New York Jets. Roger is a foodie and traveler who, while living in Hoboken, New Jersey still dreams of coaching the Venezuelan team to the World Cup.

Anthony Lewis '15

Men's Basketball

Anthony Lewis was a top Basketball athlete at CCNY, serving as Co-Captain as well as providing on and off the court leadership roles in his years 2011-2015. While being among the top 5 Scorers and Rebounders in Division 3 in the Nation (as well as in CUNY) in his Jr and Sr Years, Anthony became a force to be reckoned with. Anthony's 1,071 points and 551 rebounds in his Junior and Senior seasons was the first time that a CCNY Player amassed more than 1,000 points and pulled down 550 rebounds in two seasons. Anthony was awarded Second Team All-Conference All Star Honors his Senior Year was voted MVP for City College Basketball. He gives his head coach Tom Green and assistance coaches Bigelow, Kennard, and Brett and wonderful teammates props in helping his success story as well as his own dedication daily.

Anthony is now a Mental Health and Disability Counselor residing in New York who owns a clothing line by the name of Life Lessons Apparel LLC that has been around for 5 Years. He coaches young adults in basketball, mentoring and motivating the youth. Anthony has a beautiful daughter by the name of Giselle, and he stays active today playing in top Basketball Tournaments based in NYC, training in the gym, traveling the world and enjoying fun times with his Family and Peers.



Robert Melworm '59

Men's Fencing

Robert Melworm started fencing at CCNY in 1955. Bob originally started as a sabre fencer but was switched by Coach Edward Lucia to epee. Bob fenced on the CCNY team from 1955-1959, a time period when the

Men's Team was competing against the top colleges in the country, including Navy, NYU, and the Ivy League teams. Bob had some outstanding results as a collegiate fencer including a record of all wins against top seeded NYU. In the ECAC Championships, commonly known as the Eastern, Bob had a record of 8 wins and 3 losses. He missed qualifying for the individual championships by one touch. Because of this strong performance, Coach Lucia chose Bob to represent CCNY at the NCAA Championships. The College never competed in this Championship as the competition was being held in Lubbock, Texas and CCNY was told that white and black fencers could not stay in the same hotel. Since

the CCNY foil fencer was black, CCNY and Coach Lucia protested this rule set up by the hotel- but to no avail- and decided that CCNY would not send a team to these Championships.

Bob served as captain of the epee squad in his senior year. Motivated to become a better fencer he joined the Amateur Fencers League of America (AFLA) and competed in open competitions earning a B rating, a rating that most fencers never attain and one that is extremely rare for a college student to attain. Bob was invited to compete in the prestigious Martini Rossi International Competition held each year in New York City. He made it through several rounds of this competition, fencing against some of the best fencers in the world.

After graduating from CCNY Bob continued to fence representing the New York Fencers Club, one of the premier clubs in the country. Bob was coached by Michel Alaux, an internationally recognized coach. He qualified for and fenced in several national championships. Bob placed fourth in the Garden State Games and also, in later years, competed in the Veterans Category in the United States Fencing Association. In 1970 he represented the United States in the Veteran World Championships in Moscow. Bob is most proud of the fact that his love of fencing has encouraged three of his grandchildren to take up the sport and that his grandson has won competitions at the national level.

At CCNY Bob was voted into Pi Tau Sigma, the Mechanical Engineering honorary fraternity and Tau Beta Pi, the general honorary engineering fraternity. He graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering Degree and continued his formal education receiving a Master of Science Degree in Engineering Mechanics from Columbia University and a PhD in Engineering Mechanics from NYU. Bob started his professional career working for a large engineering firm and after several years started his own engineering company dealing with computer and structural analyses. He worked for several industries, notably nuclear power plants and the railroad industry. Fifteen years later he began teaching as a professor at Seton Hall University and then moved to Kean University, where he completed his academic working career thirty years later. His students in the business schools of these universities benefitted greatly by Bob's expertise in computer related areas including information systems, e-commerce, and operation management.



Bertrand Oubida '15
Men's Soccer and Track

Bertrand Oubida exemplifies what it means to be a CCNY student athlete. A graduate of CCNY's Class of 2015 with a major in philosophy, Bertrand excelled academically and within the College's athletic program with a focus in Track and Field and Soccer.

In 2010, Bertrand was named City University of New York Athletic Conference (an NCAA Division III and NJCAA Division III conference, "CUNYAC") Cross County All-Star. From 2010 through 2014, he was named CUNYAC's Indoor and Outdoor All-Star. In 2013, Bertrand was named 2013 CCNY Men's Soccer Team Most Improved Player and tied as the Top Goal Scorer. He was an integral member of the 2010 – 2014 CUNYAC Champion Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field Team and is the CUNYAC and CCNY indoor 800m (1:55:08) and Freshman triple jump (1241m) record holder.

As a midfielder on the CCNY Men's Soccer Team, one of the most impactful positions on the team, Bertrand was critical to leading his team through a successful 2013 season and went on to play professionally in Okinawa, Japan. Bertrand's personal achievements during his athletic career at CCNY have earned him distinction, but his conduct with his teammates underscores his understanding of the importance and inherent values of teamwork. Working collaboratively and competitively with his fellow undergraduates, Bertrand achieved his personal goals while helping his teammates to build something bigger than themselves and ultimately, contribute to the proud legacy of CCNY.



Heather Ruger '14
Women's Soccer

Heather graduated from The City College of New York in 2014 with a B.S. in Psychology. During her 4 years, she was an important contributor to the Women's Soccer program as a starting central defender. Heather was captain as well as CUNYAC All-Conference 1st team defender for 3 years. She helped lead her team in 2012 to be CUNYAC Women's Soccer Champions, which led them to their first ever NCAA bid in the school's history. She helped lead her team to 14 shutouts her junior year, allowing only 23 goals for the season, a school and CUNYAC record. During her senior year, the team had 9 shutouts for the season, and Heather earned ECAC 2nd team all-star accolades. She also was a CUNYAC Scholar Athlete of the Year

Honorable Mention awardee, a recognition for her work both on the field and in the classroom. She has won numerous accolades for her leadership and athletic ability throughout her 4 years at CCNY and was a participant in the CUNYAC Goodwill tour in New Orleans, which helped in clean-up work from Hurricane Katrina. Today, Heather is the Client Finance Manager for an advertising company in NYC and lives in NJ with her Fiancée Yaritza DeJesus.

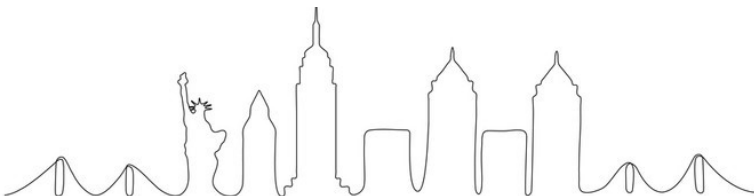

NEW YORK CITY SPORTS LEGEND AWARD

Ice Hockey in Harlem



This remarkable program began in the winter of 1987 when, led by founders Dave Will, Todd Levy and former Ranger Pat Hickey, forty youngsters took the ice at Lasker Rink in northern Central park. Many wore mismatched equipment as they wobbled on to the ice that day., but they were soon skating, shooting and handling the puck. Many of those first IHIH players continue playing the game today. The program always contained more than hockey. Participants must attend educational programming and are often able to participate in guest clinics (often by the NY Rangers). The educational enrichment program takes place at the organization's quarters at the Dempsey Center on West 127 Street and runs throughout the year. Ice hockey practice and games run from November through March at the Lasker Rink. No experience is required and all activities are offered at no charge. Ice Hockey in Harlem clearly understands that its mission is to improve the social and academic well being of children from the Harlem Community through ice hockey and the Alumni Varsity Association salutes the organization as a true New York City Sports legend!

JOHN STARK HUMANITARIAN AWARD



Dee Dee Mozeleski is the Vice President of the Office of Institutional Advancement and Communications, and, as such, also serves as the Executive Director of the Foundation for City College. In 2016, she was asked to serve in the additional capacity of Senior Advisor to the President of City College, Dr. Vince Boudreau.

Ms. Mozeleski has spent almost thirty years working in service to public higher education institutions, cultural programs, international agencies and government organizations. At City, she is a member of the College's senior leadership team, the President's Cabinet and serves on a variety of special committees, including the Task Force for the Future of City College. Her responsibilities include philanthropic management of the Foundation for

City College, stewarding and expanding the College's public profile, workforce development activities, community engagement projects and management of our campus emergency needs programs specific to Benny's Food Pantry, the Urban Gardens at CCNY and a portfolio of emergency support programs to expand opportunities for students. During her time at City, she led the consolidation of the College's two fundraising organizations and oversaw the fundraising campaign which launched the Colin Powell School for Civic and Global Leadership in 2013.

Having worked with some of the largest non-profit organizations in New York City and around the world, with a focus on North America, the Middle East and Africa, Ms. Mozeleski has focused her career working as a public servant in support of causes that impact communities on a global scale. A graduate of San Diego State University, Ms. Mozeleski currently serves on the Board of Directors of the Appalachian Mountain Club, and as the advisor to the College's Outdoor Initiative and Hockey Club.

She served as a Board Member of Women in Development, New York City and Seeds of Africa Foundation, where she also worked to build a K-12 school in Adama, Ethiopia. Ms. Mozeleski was recognized as CASE Professional of the Year (2021) for CASE District II and was named a 2021 Crain's New York Notable in Non-Profits. One of her most proud accomplishments is having raised a City College graduate, class of 2016.
