CC FAMILY RECOGNIZED

On October 28, 2008, Art Berglund '63 and Jerry Carle were inducted into the 9th Annual Colorado Springs Sports Corporation Hall of Fame.

Berglund's hockey career spanned portions of five decades during which he managed or served on the leadership of more than 30 United States teams worldwide. The native of Fort Frances, Ontario, was inducted into the International Ice Hockey Federation Hall of Fame in May 2008 after serving as USA Hockey's director of international teams and activities and senior director of international administration for more than a decade. Berglund, led the Tigers in scoring in 1963 with 37 points and was inducted into the CC Hall of Fame in 2006. He also served on the

staffs of several U.S. Olympic teams and was honored with the NHL's Lester Patrick Award in 1992.

Jerry Carle is still the winningest coach in Tiger football history, from his 33-year tenure as head football coach of CC. He compiled a record of 137-150-5 and saved the program from extinction in 1960. In 1975 he took his team to the NCAA Division III playoffs, losing to Millsaps, 28-21. He coached Tiger All-Americans Don Soukup, Ed Smith, and Terry Hoadley. He also coached standouts Daryl Crawford, Ray Bridges and Steve Sabol. Carle also served as Athletic Director at CC from 1957- 1982, and retired in 1990. Carle a 1948 graduate of Northwestern University, and North St. Paul native was inducted into the Colorado College Hall of Fame in 1996.

COVER ONE INTERNATIONAL

Cover One International, the award-winning service project conceived by Billy Blaustein '08 (Mill Valley, California), is featured in a story on ESPN.com. The article, written by Lauren Reynolds, chronicles the group's 2008 summer trip to Honduras where they held instructional clinics to promote physical fitness through athletics and health seminars for females ages 15-25. The brainchild of Blaustein, *Cover One* was conceived in 2005 as a personal response to an earthquake in Pakistan which left more than 80,000 people dead and more than a million without homes. He raised money, purchased tents and sleeping bags, and sent them to those in dire need through the Pakistani Consulate in Los Angeles.

In addition to Blaustein (football), the *Cover One* team included sophomore Ericka Baer '10 (women's soccer), Alina Ford '08 (volleyball; former chair of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee), Max Green '08 (football), Jocelyn Corbett '08, Jason Steiert '08 (men's soccer), and Misael Fernandez '08 (football).

The clinics were held at the Laguna Grande Escuela in the municipality of San Miguelito, located in what is primarily an agricultural area in the mountains of central Honduras. Among the health issues *Cover One* addressed was protecting the kids from pesticides and toxic fumes from burning trash. The group also worked with women between the ages of 15 and 25 on sexual awareness and sexual education.

Cover One received a \$10,000 grant as one of the winning entries in The Kathryn Wasserman Davis Projects for Peace. Each member raised additional funds to help defray the costs of necessary items like inoculations and vaccinations, as well as sports and school supplies that were left behind.

Men's and Women's Cross Country

Even though Men's Cross Country expected to go through a rebuilding year in 2008, freshman Jackson Brainerd (Littleton, CO) had a standout year for the Tigers. Brainerd finished seventh overall (26:15) at the SCAC Championship meet, while the Men's team finished second, behind Centre College. Sophomores Andrew Wagner (26:32) and Daniel Kraft (26:33) were separated by just one second and claimed 11th and 12th, respectively. Brainerd, Wagner and Kraft earned All-SCAC honors by finishing among the top 14 individual runners. At Bush Pasture Park in Salem, Oregon, Brainerd went on to set a Colorado College freshman record and earned All-West Region honors by finishing 10th overall at the NCAA Division III West Region Championships. To finish out the season, Brainerd, the only member of CC's Cross Country team to qualify for nationals this fall, finished 173rd in a field of 278 runners at the 2008 NCAA Division III Championship meet in Hanover, IN. He claimed 14th place among all freshmen competing in the event. Women's Cross Country finished fifth place at the SCAC Women's Cross Country Championship. Freshman Margot Cutter paced the Tigers with a time of 23:16, good for 14th place in the 6-kilometer event, and earned the final spot on the All-SCAC team. She also earned All-West Region honors by finishing 22nd overall in a field of 113 runners at the NCAA Division III West Region Cross Country Championships in Salem, Ore. Cutter set a Colorado College freshman record with a time of 22:54.03 on the 6K course at Bush Pasture Park, eclipsing Jeanine Stewart's time of 23:40. It marked the seventh time in eight events she led the Tigers this season. Also competing for the Tigers were, Kate Aitchison in 54th place, while Megan Hurster in 57th place. Louise Tur in 73rd place, just ahead of Claire Daniel who took 77th to round out CC's scoring. Additional runners were Molly McGee (94th) and Emily McCarthy (103rd).

Football

Four members of the football team were named to the 2008 All-Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference team in a vote by the league's head coaches. Junior fullback Sean Farrell, senior punter Martin Golobic, junior defensive end Ian Rivero and junior defensive back Brendan Ross all were second-team selections. Farrell ranked fourth in the conference with a career-high 622 yards rushing and a 69.1 yards-per-game average. Ross ranked fourth in the conference averaging 9.1 tackles per game. He had five games with double-figure tackles, including a career-high 12 solo stops in the season opener against Occidental College. Ross led the Tigers with 82 total and 49 solo tackles, and five passes defended. Rivero was second in the SCAC averaging 0.83 sacks per game and fifth at 1.22 tackles for lost yards. He posted career highs with 7.5 sacks and 11 tackles for lost yards and was fifth on the team with 26 solo and 46 total tackles. Golobic ranked fourth in the conference averaging 38.0 yards per punt. He placed eight of his kicks inside the opponent's 20-yard line and had a career-best 68-yard punt against Occidental.

Men's Soccer

Horst Richardson's Tigers had a solid team in 2008 finishing the season with a 13-6-1 overall record and were fourth in the SCAC with a 6-3-1 mark. The team was led by six All-SCAC selections; senior midfielder, co-captain Ben Beadle-Ryby, senior forward Logan Boccard, senior defender, co-captain Jimmer Comerford, junior, co-captain forward Trevor Cobb and junior goalkeeper Brian Engle were named to the first team, while senior defender Wes Ridders earned a spot on the second team. Boccard and Comerford were named to the 2008 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America teams by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Comerford and Boccard join brothers Sean (third team in 2002) and Patrick McGinnis (first team and Academic All-American of the Year in 2004) as the only CC men's soccer players to earn the honor. Comerford, who carries 3.86 grade-point average as a biology major, was a second-team selection, while Boccard, also a biology major with a 3.88 GPA, earned a spot on the third team. The Tigers also earned the NSCAA/adidas College Men's Team Academic Award for the 2007-08 academic year. The award, given by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, honors teams that post a minimum grade point average of 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale). CC is ranked fifth in the nation, regardless of NCAA division, with a 3.42 combined GPA.

Women's Soccer

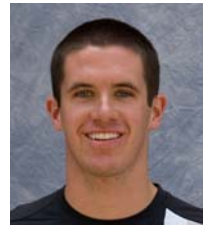
For the third time in three seasons as an affiliate member of Conference USA, the Tigers advanced to the CUSA tournament. The Tigers finished the season 13-7-2, and were led by senior defender, co-captain Molly Uyenishi, named to the All-Conference USA First Team for the third consecutive season and Kelly LaVoie, a junior, is one of four forwards honored on the Second Team. Goalkeeper Caitlin Hulyo and midfielder Kelsey Wise were among 13 players voted to the All-Freshman Team. Uyenishi and sophomore forward Tiffany Brown, earned regional accolades from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America. Uyenishi, helped the Tigers hold their opponents to just 19 goals in 22 games, was named to the 2008 NSCAA/adidas All-Central Region First Team. Brown, whose nine goal and 21 points ranked first among all CC players, was one of four forwards selected to the Second Team.

Volleyball

For the 11th consecutive season, the Tigers earned a bid to the NCAA tournament. Rick Swan's Tigers were led by senior outside hitter Anna Clithero, sophomore middle blocker Emily Perkins, and freshman opposite hitter Meredith Ballard. All three earned all-conference honors from the Southern Collegiate Athletic Conference. Clithero and Perkins also received All-West Region recognition from the American Volleyball Coaches Association. Clithero, who led the Tigers averaging 3.32 kills and 2.98 digs per game, was named to the regional first team. Perkins, who paced CC with 479 points (the sum of kills, service aces and blocks), a .294 hitting percentage and with 74 total blocks, earned honorable mention. To finish Clithero's career she was named third team All-American by the AVCA. She becomes the 10th Tiger to be named to one of the three All-America teams. The Tigers finished the season 27-11 overall.
