#### THIS WEEKEND

Colorado College heads to New Jersey for a non-conference series against Princeton University this weekend. The puck drops at 4 p.m. (ET) on Friday, Dec. 6, and 7 p.m. (ET) on Saturday, Dec. 7. The games will be broadcast in Colorado Springs on KRDO NewsRadio 105.5 FM, 1240 AM and 92.5 FM and West of Pikes Peak on KSBV 93.7, and streamed live on ESPN+.

#### **LAST TIME OUT**

The Tigers dropped a pair of games to No. 8 Minnesota Duluth, Nov. 22-23, at Amsoil Arena ... On Friday, Cole Koepke scored a power-play goal with 18.2 seconds remaining to lift Minnesota Duluth to a 4-3 victory. Nick Halloran scored twice for the Tigers, including a goal with 1:41 left in the third period that evened the score at 3-3, while freshman Matt Vernon tied his career high with 43 saves. Chris Wilkie put the Tigers ahead 1-0 early in the second period, but the Bulldogs evened the score at the 14:15 mark when Jackson Cates placed a shot from the slot past Vernon on the power-play. After a five-minute major and game misconduct for contact to the head against UMD at the 16:48 mark, Halloran took a pass from Kristian Blumenschein and scored from the right circle for his fourth goal of the season and a 2-1 Tiger advantage heading into the third period. Kobe Roth evened the game at the 4:06 mark of the final frame with a deflection in front of Vernon. Later in the period, Grant Cruikshank was called for a five-minute major and game misconduct for checking from behind with 5:11 left in the final frame and the Bulldogs capitalized just 19 seconds into the power play as Tanner Laderoute redirected a Noah Cates shot past Vernon. Halloran scored his second of the game with an extra attacker with less than two minutes remaining, then Koepke fired a one-timer from the top of the right circle past Vernon for the game-winning goal ... On Saturday, Noah Cates scored twice and added an assist and Hunter Shepard had 25 saves for a 5-0 UMD victory. Scott Perunovich had three assists after collecting four helpers Friday night for the Bulldogs. Roth opened the scoring with a power-play goal at the 11:46 mark of the first period. The Bulldogs doubled the lead a couple of minutes later when Koepke's wraparound attempt went right through the crease to Justin Richards, who flipped a backhand past Ryan Ruck at 16:08 of the middle frame. With the Bulldogs on a power play to start the third period, Zach Berzolla was whistled for a five-minute major for checking from behind and Noah Cates scored from the slot nine seconds into the 5-on-3 to make it 3-0. Cates scored a similar goal with UMD still on the power play at the 3:51 mark and Luke Loheit closed out the scoring at 12:23 of the final frame.

#### **TIGER TALES**

Nick Halloran has four goals in his last four games and posted his first multi-goal game (Nov. 22) since Jan. 27, 2018 vs. Miami ... Halloran leads the NCHC in goals/game (0.56) and is fifth in points/game (1.11) ... Chris Wilkie is tied for second in NCHC in goals/game (0.5) and sixth in pts/game (1.10) ... With an assist on Friday, Nov. 22, Alex Berardinelli posted a career-high four-game point streak ... Matt Vernon is fourth in the NCHC with a .907 saves percentage.

#### **THE COACHES**

Mike Haviland (Elmira College, '90) is in his sixth season at the helm of the Tigers. He came to Colorado College after serving one year as head coach of the Hershey Bears (AHL). Haviland was an assistant coach for the Chicago Blackhawks from 2008-12, helping the team win the Stanley Cup in 2010 ... Ron Fogarty (Colgate, '95) is in his sixth season at Princeton. He began the hockey program at Adrian College and was the head coach from 2007-14 before taking the same job at Princeton. Fogarty led the Tigers to the 2018 ECAC title.

#### FOR THE RECORD

Colorado College is 4-5-1 overall and 2-3-1 in the NCHC after losing twice at Minnesota Duluth. The Tigers are in fifth place in the NCHC with seven points ... Princeton is 1-6-3 overall after dropping a pair of contests in Northern Ireland last weekend to Colgate, 3-1, and New Hampshire, 3-2. Princeton is 0-4-2 in the ECAC.

#### **PREVIOUS MEETINGS**

Colorado College and Princeton have met nine times, with CC holding an 8-1 advantage in the series. The teams have not played since Dec. 15, 1990, a 4-3 Colorado College victory in Colorado Springs.

#### **SCOUTING THE (PRINCETON) TIGERS**

Jackson Cressey leads Princeton with eight points (3g,5a), followed by Corey Andonovski with seven (5g,2a) and Christian O'Neill with six (1g,5a). Ryan Ferland has has appeared in seven games this season in the net. He has a 1-4-2 record with a 2.68 goals-against average and .905 saves percentage.

#### **UP NEXT**

The Tigers open the Battle for the Gold Pan with a home-and-home series against the Denver Pioneers next weekend. The teams will play at Magness Arena on Friday, Dec. 13, and at the Broadmoor World Arena on Saturday, Dec. 14.

#### **ANOTHER TOUGH SCHEDULE**

The Tigers are scheduled to play 18 of their 34 regular-season games this season against teams that are ranked in this week's USCHO.com Top 20 Poll. Colorado College also will play five game against teams that received votes and 10 contests against the last four national champions (North Dakota, Denver and Minnesota Duluth).

#### **BALANCED SCORING**

CC has 19 players with at least one point in the first 10 games. Wilkie leads the team with 11 points (5g,6a), followed by Halloran with 10 (5g,5a), while Bailey Conger (4g,3a), Ben Copeland (3g,4a) and Bryan Yoon (0g,7a) each have seven.

#### **VERY DEFENSIVE IN FOUR WINS**

In their four victories this season, the Tigers have allowed seven goals, and have given up 28 in the other six games.

#### **NEW ON-CAMPUS ARENA ON THE HORIZON**

Colorado College, in partnership with Colorado Springs' City for Champions initiative, has unveiled a proposal to build the Edward J. Robson Arena as an on-campus competition arena. The arena, with an estimated capacity of 3,400+ seats, will become the permanent home of CC Tiger Hockey and for the first time since the program began in 1938, the hockey team will play games on campus. The arena is expected to open in the fall of 2021.

#### **AMONG NATIONAL LEADERS IN FEWEST PENALTIES**

The Tigers have taken just 39 penalties this season, tied with Yale for the third-fewest in the nation. Dartmouth leads with 23, followed by Harvard with 28.

Selected games, including both this weekend, will also be available on KSBV 93.7 FM in Cripple Creek, Divide, Buena Vista, Monarch and Leadville.

#### **HEAD COACH MIKE HAVILAND**



Mike Haviland is in his sixth season at the helm of the Colorado College hockey team after taking over as the 14th head coach in the history of the program on May 9, 2014.

Haviland led the Tigers to new heights in 2018-19, posting 17 victories, the most in one season since the '12-13 campaign (18). CC also won the Pikes Peak Trophy with a 6-1 victory over Air Force, reclaimed The Gold Pan with a 2-1-1 regular season record against in-state rival Denver, and advanced to the NCHC Frozen Faceoff for the first time in the six-year existence of the league.

The Tigers swept Denver in a home-and-home series to close out the regular season and finish sixth in the final NCHC standings. Colorado College upset third-seeded Western Michigan in three games to win its first NCHC quarterfinal series and advance to the league's Frozen Faceoff in St. Paul, Minn.

In 2017-18, sophomore Nick Halloran became Haviland's first All-America selection and also was a first-team All-NCHC pick. Halloran finished third in the NCHC in scoring with 45 points, the most by a Tiger in five seasons.

Haviland led the Tigers to a 2-2-1 record against 2017 national champion Denver at Magness Arena in '17-18, including a couple of shutouts, the first time ever the Pioneers were shutout twice in the same season at home by one team.

During the 2016-17 season, Haviland guided the Tigers to the Florida College Hockey Classic title with victories over Merrimack (3-0) and Cornell (2-1 in overtime). His team also squared off against the No. 1 team in the country 10 times and produced 1-1-2 record against national runner-up Minnesota Duluth, including a 1-0-1 mark in Duluth.

In his first two seasons at Colorado College, Haviland helped 15 Tigers achieve a career-high in points and defenseman Jaccob Slavin earn a first-team all-NCHC selection. Seven players from those teams, including Slavin with the Carolina Hurricanes, signed professional contracts.

Haviland, a highly regarded veteran coach with experience at the NCAA, ECHL, AHL and NHL levels, brought more than 20 years of hockey coaching experience to Colorado Springs, most recently as head coach of the Hershey Bears in 2013. Prior to arriving at Hershey, he served as associate head coach of the Norfolk Admirals in 2012-13 and an assistant coach with the Chicago Blackhawks from 2008-12.

During his four-year span in Chicago, he helped guide the Blackhawks to a cumulative mark of 187-101-40, a Central Division title in 2009-10 and the 2010 Stanley Cup championship.

Before joining the Blackhawks organization, Haviland was head coach at Norfolk, then Chicago's top affiliate, and guided the Admirals to a record of 93-51-10-6 from 2005-07. In those two seasons, the Admirals broke the franchise's single-season records for wins and points, an achievement that earned Haviland the 2007 Louis A.R. Pieri Memorial Award as AHL Coach of the Year. He then went on to lead the Blackhawks' new AHL affiliate in Rockford during the 2007-08 campaign to a record of 44-26-4-6 and into two rounds of postseason play.

Prior to his time in the AHL and NHL, Haviland spent four seasons with the ECHL's Trenton Titans (2004-05) and Atlantic City Boardwalk Bullies (2001-04). He led the Boardwalk Bullies to a Kelly Cup championship in 2003, and just two years later, hoisted the trophy as the Titans' bench boss. His cumulative record in four ECHL seasons was 172-81-35.

Haviland also had success at the college level. As an assistant coach at his alma mater, Elmira College, he helped guide the team to a record of 51-12-2 and two ECAC championships from 1996-1998. As a player, he was a four-year member of the Elmira College men's ice hockey team, from 1986-90, and remains one of the top point producers in the school's history. He accumulated 152 points in his four-year career, which is 12th all-time, and is tied for ninth all time in career goals scored with 68. Haviland was a first-team All-America selection in 1989-90 after collecting 39 goals and 33 assists for 72 points in 33 games. He won two ECAC West Championships as a player (1987-88 and 1989-90) and helped the Soaring Eagles make two NCAA Division III Tournament appearances, including a national runner-up finish in '87-88.

Following his time as a student, Haviland was originally selected by the New Jersey Devils in the 1990 NHL Entry Draft. His experience includes AHL time with the Binghamton Whalers (1989-90) and in the ECHL with the Richmond Renegades and the Winston-Salem Thunderbirds in 1990-91.

Haviland, 52, was born in Manhattan and grew up in Middletown, N.J. He and his wife, Kristin, have a blended family of six children.


