Founded in 1853, Central College is a four-year coeducational liberal arts college of the Reformed Church in America. Located 40 miles southeast of Des Moines, Central offers its 1,750 students learning opportunities not only on the Pella campus, but on branch campuses in London and Colchester, England; Merida, Yucatan, Mexico; Leiden, the Netherlands; and Carmarthen, Wales; and at study centers in Granada, Spain; Paris, France; and Vienna, Austria.

Central is a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, Division III, and the Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. Men compete in baseball, football, basketball, tennis, golf, wrestling, soccer, track and cross country while women compete in tennis, golf, track, softball, volleyball, cross country, soccer and basketball. Rugby is offered at the club level.

The Kuyper Athletic Complex

The Kuyper Athletic Complex is located at the corner of Independence Street and West Fifth Street in southwest Pella. The complex includes P.H. Kuyper Gymnasium (1970), H.S. Kuyper Fieldhouse (1987), A.N. Kuyper Field (1977), the baseball and softball fields (1978), Ryerson Golf Driving Range (2002), tennis courts (1992), soccer field (1992) and the Ron Schipper Fitness Center (1999). The complex also includes practice and intramural softball diamonds and football fields. Golf meets are held at the Bos Landen Golf Resort, two miles southwest of the campus on Highway T-15.

Mike Boschee

Head coach

Mike Boschee is entering his second season as head men's basketball at Central after posting a 6-20 mark in his first year.

A graduate of the University of North Dakota and a Valley City, N.D. native, Boschee was an all-North Central Conference and all-region player. He served as captain of the 1990 North Dakota squad that finished third in the NCAA Div. II national tournament. Boschee earned his master's degree from Northern State University (N.D.) and served as a graduate assistant coach for a team that reached the NAIA national championship game.

From 1993 to 2003, Boschee was the assistant coach at Gustavus Adolphus (Minn.), and carried the title of defensive coordinator. The Golden Gusties posted a 221-83 record in that span, and finished second in the 2003 NCAA Div. III national tournament in March. Gustavus Adolphus has made seven NCAA playoff appearances in the past eight years, reaching the final 16 five times.

Nic Nelson

Assistant coach

Nic Nelson is in his first season as assistant men's basketball coach at Central College. Nelson, previously the head boys' basketball coach at Ogden High School, serves as a varsity assistant.

Nelson posted a 39-10 record in two seasons at Ogden, receiving Mid-Iowa Conference coach of the year honors from the Ames Tribune in 2002-03. Earlier he was an assistant high school coach at Bondurant-Farrar and Sioux City West.

A summa cum laude graduate of Morningside College, Nelson was a two-time team MVP and captain in baseball and was named the school's 1999-2000 male scholar-athlete of the year. He went on to play two years of minor league ball. The northwest Iowa native was a four-sport athlete at Central Lyon High School.

Joe Steinkamp

Assistant coach

Joe Steinkamp is in his first season as an assistant men's basketball coach at Central and serves as the junior varsity coach.

Steinkamp, a 2003 Central graduate, was a two-time men's basketball letterwinner, serving as a team co-captain for 2002-03.

In 2003-04 he was a graduate assistant at Loras College, serving as an assistant women's basketball coach while pursuing a master's degree.

Outlook

The upward momentum in the Central College men's basketball program should pick up steam in coach Mike Boschee's second year at the helm.

Boschee inherited an inexperienced club but was able to nurse six wins out of a difficult schedule and gain a spot of the Iowa Conference tournament as Central improved from 5-21 in 2001-02 to 6-20 last season.

With the arrival of Boschee's first recruiting class, a more significant leap is anticipated in 2004-05, particularly if the intensity of early competition for varsity spots is any indicator. Nearly half of the players on the 13-man varsity are in their first year with the Dutch.

"It's going to take a little while," Boschee said. "With seven or eight newcomers, we'll have to be teaching everything again. But the chemistry seems to be good and the guys are enjoying being with each other. They're good guys who play hard and enjoy the game. As a coach, that's all I can ask for."

Perhaps the most significant recruiting was done on campus as senior Scott Huisman, the league's top scorer and rebounder in 2002-03, returns after a year's absence. The 6-foot-7 forward gives an immediate boost to Central's interior strength and maturity level.

Chris Nelson, a 6-2 junior guard, and Brandon Vos, a 6-5 senior forward/center, are the only players with significant starting experience remaining. They'll be joined by a host of newcomers, most noticeably at point guard, where two are top contenders. Zak Clark, a St. Edmond of Fort Dodge product and 6-2 Brett De Hoogh of Clive, a graduate of West Des Moines Valley all show promise.

"Zak (Clark) has great ball skills and is a very good shooter," Boschee said. "Luke (Ballenger) is a hard-nosed player, a very good defender and a good ballhandler. And Brett (De Hoogh) does a lot of things well. He can provide help at all three perimeter positions."

Nelson, a 6-2 junior, averaged 10.4 points and 2.6 rebounds last season. He's the frontrunner at the off guard spot.

"He's one of the better shooters on the team," Boschee said. "His defense has improved and he's improved his overall athletic ability."

Also back are 6-1 senior Doug Hooker, who averaged 4.9 points off the bench last season and 6-3 sophomore Jeff Corkrean, who appeared in 16 games as a freshman.

"Doug's another very good perimeter shooter," Boschee said. "He seems to have improved quite a bit. He's a better ballhandler than a year ago and has shown very good leadership. We're going to need that from him.

"Jeff's a very good spot-up shooter and a solid defensive player. He's doing a good job at the perimeter spots."

Rookie John Carlson, a 6-3 Ankeny native and graduate of Grandview Park Baptist High School, could press for time at a perimeter spot as well.

"John is a scorer who can do a lot of things offensively," Boschee said. "He's very good off the dribble.

Jason Crews, a 6-3 junior, is a two-time letterwinner at small forward. He averaged 5.0 points and 2.7 rebounds last season.

"Jason has improved his game tremendously," Boschee said. "He's shown the ability to knock down the perimeter jump shot which will be invaluable because he can score inside and off the dribble."

Other candidates for the forward rotation include a pair of freshmen from Jefferson, 6-3 Simeon Lang and 6-6 Keith Pedersen. Lang will likely spend more time on the perimeter but can play a number of positions, Boschee said.

"Simeon's strong and might be used inside a little," he said. "He can shoot the three but will counted on to score inside as well. He's pretty versatile."

"Keith will give us some additional help inside on the boards and adds some low-post scoring as well. He's been impressive in the early practices."

Huisman immediately fills a vacancy at power forward. He averaged 14.9 points and 7.4 rebounds and Boschee is

confident that those kind of numbers are realistic again, even after a year away.

“I think Scott will pick up where he left off,” he said. “It’s obvious he has an understanding of the game. He has a knack for scoring and a knack for finding the ball.”

Vos is experienced as well, averaging 7.3 points and 4.2 rebounds last season.

“Brandon gives us some additional help on the boards and has proven he can knock down outside shots,” Boschee said.

Huisman and Vos can also play center, or Boschee can call on three juniors who earned varsity letters playing inside, 6-10 Clint Driftmier, 6-5 Dustin Feldman and 6-4 Taylor Phipps.

Driftmier appeared in 10 games, averaging 4.3 points and 3.1 rebounds.

“Clint’s probably improved more than anybody,” Boschee said. “He’s filled out a little and has developed a nice outside touch. He’ll help us inside both with scoring and rebounding.

“Dustin’s a good shooter for a post, works hard and adds a physical dimension to our inside game. He likes to mix it up. He’s a hard worker and a good team player.”

Phipps was a starter down the stretch for the Dutch, but is out for football and likely won’t be ready to contribute in the early going. He averaged 3.1 points and 2.1 rebounds in 14 games.

“Taylor gives us a physical presence inside,” Boschee said. “He’s got good low-post moves and is a banger on the boards. It will probably take him three or four weeks to get in basketball shape, but I hope by Christmas he’s able to help us quite a bit.”

Once Boschee gets it all sorted out, he thinks fans will see good results.

“I think this year’s squad will be able to rebound better than last year and get to the free throw line better,” he said. “Those were two areas we really struggled with.

“The big thing for us to be successful is just learning to play with each other. We’re going to have to spend some time trying to get these guys ready to defend. But offensively, I think we’ll be able to score, although again, it will take time.”

Even with the inexperience, Boschee wants his squad aiming for the top.

“We want to start winning Iowa Conference titles again,” he said. “Every year I’m here, we’re going to shoot for that. We’ll prepare the players as well as we can every game, then go out and see what happens.”
