Founded in 1853, Central College is a four-year coeducational liberal arts college of the Reformed Church in America. Located 40 miles southeast of Des Moines, Central offers its 1,700 students learning opportunities not only on the Pella campus, but on branch campuses in London, England; Merida, Mexico; Leiden, the Netherlands; and Bangor, Wales; and at study centers in Granada, Spain; Hangzhou, China; Paris, France; and Vienna, Austria.

Central is a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, Division III, and the Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. Men compete in baseball, football, basketball, tennis, golf, wrestling, soccer, track and cross country, while women compete in tennis, golf, track, softball, volleyball, cross country, soccer and basketball. Rugby is offered at the club level.

### **The A.N. Kuyper Athletics Complex**

The A.N. Kuyper Athletics Complex is located at the corner of Independence Street and West Fifth Street in southwest Pella. The complex includes P.H. Kuyper Gymnasium (1970), H.S. Kuyper Fieldhouse (1987), Ron and Joyce Schipper Stadium (1977), the baseball and softball fields (1978), Ryerson Golf Practice Range (2005), tennis courts (1992), soccer field (2005) and the Ron Schipper Fitness Center (1999). The complex also includes practice and intramural softball diamonds and football fields. Golf meets are held at the Bos Landen Golf Club, two miles southwest of the campus on Highway T-15.

## Jeff McMartin

### Head coach

Already one of the winningest coaches in the U.S., Jeff McMartin has guided his alma mater back to four Iowa Conference football titles while earning four NCAA Division III football playoff berths in seven seasons as coach.

McMartin has posted a glossy 61-15 record (.802) and entering the year ranked seventh among active NCAA Division III coaches in career winning percentage. He's a three-time conference coach of the year (2005, 2006, 2007) and was named an AFCA Division III regional coach of the year in 2007. McMartin's squads have posted three undefeated regular

seasons, with a 28-game regular-season win streak from 2006-08.

McMartin, who also serves as the team's quarterbacks coach, has been a part of one of the nation's most tradition-rich college football programs as a player, student assistant and now head coach. Central's 2009 league title was the program's 30th and the school's 20 NCAA Division III playoff berths are just one shy of the national record. The Dutch have compiled 17 undefeated regular seasons and haven't had a losing football campaign since 1960.

Named as one of 10 "hot" coaches in the NCAA Division III by American Football Monthly in 2005, McMartin also gained extensive coaching experience at other schools for 13 years, coaching nearly every position.

Prior to returning to Central, McMartin was the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at DePauw University (Ind.). During his four years there, DePauw broke several school offensive records.

From 1995-2000, he served as offensive line coach at Beloit College (Wis.) where he also worked with special teams. From 1994-95 he was the defensive line coach at the University of Rochester (N.Y.) and was defensive line coach at Illinois Wesleyan University from 1992-94. He was a graduate assistant at Wake Forest from 1990-92.

McMartin graduated from Central in 1990 with a bachelor's of arts degree in physical education. He earned a master's degree in liberal studies from Wake Forest University (N.C.) in 1992 in liberal studies.

While at Central, McMartin served as a student coach under hall of fame coach Ron Schipper for two seasons after a career-ending injury. He was also a student coach at Oskaloosa High School in 1987.

McMartin is also a veteran track and field coach. He was head men's and women's coach at Beloit from 1995-2000 and interim head coach at Illinois Wesleyan in 1994. McMartin was an assistant at De Pauw from 2000-03, at Rochester from 1994-95 and at Illinois Wesleyan in 1994.

McMartin's wife Laurie is also a 1990 graduate of Central and they have two children.

## **Assistants**

### **Jeff Bollard - receivers**

Jeff Bollard is in his 26th season as an assistant football coach at Central, working with the receivers.

A native of Pocahontas and a 1989 Central graduate, Bollard is an independent computer consultant and programmer. He is also a commercial pilot flight instructor. Bollard and his wife Betty have two children.

### **Darrell Brand - kickers/punters**

In his 15th season as an assistant coach, Darrell Brand works with the kickers. Brand, a 1959 Central graduate, is a veteran high school coach. He was head football coach at Montezuma High School from 1969-95 and served as the school's principal and athletic director from 1973-96. He previously taught and coached at Harmony High School in Farmington and at Prairie City High School. Brand has also coached boys' and girls' basketball, boys' and girls' track, baseball and softball and has served as an umpire, teacher and guidance counselor.

Brand was inducted into of the Iowa High School Football Coaches' Association Hall of Fame in 1995 and in 2001 his name was added to the Drake Relays Wall of Honor for his service as an official there.

Brand and his wife Sherma have one child.

### **Don De Waard - co-defensive coordinator, linebackers**

Don De Waard is in his 30th year on the Central staff, serving as co-defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. He is a 1982 Central graduate and former Dutch player.

In 2000, the American Football Coaches Association named De Waard the Div. III Assistant Coach of the Year. He was honored at the AFCA convention in Atlanta, Ga. in January, 2001.

A native of Kanawha, he is a certified public accountant and also serves as president of the Molengracht, a \$15-million downtown development project in Pella. De Waard and his wife Jean have four children.

### **Reid Evans - offensive coordinator/offensive line**

Reid Evans is in his 11th season as an assistant coach, and his second year as offensive coordinator while also working with the offensive line.

A 2001 Central graduate, Evans was a four-time varsity letterwinner and a two-time first-team all-Iowa Conference center for the Dutch. The Newton, Iowa native was a third-team pick for the 2000 Hewlett-Packard all-America team and participated with a team of Division III all-stars in the 2000 Aztec Bowl in Mexico.

Evans was also a four-time track and field letterwinner, winning conference titles in the shot put and discus and qualifying for the NCAA Division III national meet in those events.

Following graduation, Evans played and coached football for the Franken Timberwolves in Nuremburg, Germany in 2001. A former co-owner and vice-president of DSI Data Services, Evans also serves in Central's marketing and media relations office as Marketing Web Programmer. He is pursuing a master's degree at the Univ. of Northern Iowa.

**Eric Jones - tight ends**

Eric Jones is in his 14th season on the Central staff, returning in 2006 after a three-year absence.

Jones returned to the offensive side of the ball in 2009, working with tight ends again after two years as defensive line coach. He also previously coached the offensive line and spent a season as the team's offensive coordinator.

A 1987 Central graduate, Jones was an offensive guard for the Dutch. He received a master's degree in counseling education from Iowa State University.

Jones taught and coached in Shelby, Mo. and was an at-risk coordinator and assistant coach at Pella High School. He previously served as assistant director of admission at Central while also working with the college's retention program and in several capacities in the student life office.

In 2002, Jones received a Central Presidential Service Standards Award for his work at the college.

From 2003-06 Jones was dean of students at Waukee High School before returning to Central as a counselor in the student life office. He now heads the college's retention program in the academic affairs office.

**Matt Paulsen - defensive backs**

Matt Paulsen is in his 14th season as an assistant coach, working with the defensive secondary.

A 1997 Central graduate, Paulsen was an all-American defensive back for the Dutch and a four-time letterwinner. He was a three-time all-Iowa Conference selection, the 1997 team MVP, and holds the school career interceptions record (18). He spent the summer of 1999 playing for a club team in Germany. A Waverly-Shell Rock High School graduate, Paulsen was raised on a farm near Plainfield, Iowa and is a two-time selection to the All-American Farm team named by Successful Farming magazine. He is employed by Heritage Lace, Inc.

**Zach Pfantz - co-defensive coordinator/defensive line**

Zach Pfantz is in his fourth season on the Central staff and his second as co-defensive coordinator, working with the defensive line. Pfantz also serves as an admission representative/football recruitment coordinator.

He served as an assistant at Coe College for three seasons before taking over as head coach at Akron-Westfield High School in 2007. He inherited a squad in the midst of a 21-game losing streak and piloted the team to a 5-4 record. Pfantz was named Class 1A District 1 coach of the year.

A former all-Iowa Conference linebacker and captain at Coe College, Pfantz was a four-year letterwinner for the Kohawks, helping lead the squad to a share of the 2002 league title and an NCAA Division III playoff berth. He earned a bachelor's degree at Coe in 2004 and a master's degree in education in 2007.

Originally from Melbourne, Iowa, Pfantz was named team MVP and captain for the 1999 Class 1A state champions at West Marshall High School. He was a first-team all-state honoree as a linebacker and an all-district selection at running back.

In 2004 Pfantz coached running backs at Coe before working with the defensive line in 2005-06. He was co-head coach and defensive coordinator for the Coe junior varsity squad as well and helped the Kohawks win a share of the 2004 and 2005 league crowns.

**Jeff Sanger - outside linebackers**

Jeff Sanger is in his ninth season as an assistant coach at Central, working with the outside linebackers after eight years as a defensive ends coach.

Sanger, a 2001 Central graduate, was a two-time all-America selection, a two-time Schilder team MVP award winner and a three-time all-Iowa Conference pick as a linebacker. He also was chosen as a Central team co-captain for two seasons. The Britt, Iowa native set the school freshman-season tackles record in 1997 with 111 and racked up 375 stops in his career.

Sanger is a staff accountant in the Central controller's office and is pursuing a master's degree at Drake University.

**Austen Schueler - defensive ends**

Austen Schueler is in his second season on the Central staff, returning after a two-year absence. He is working with the defensive ends. Schueler previously coached the defensive secondary and served as a recruiting intern in 2008-09.

A 2008 graduate, Schueler was a defensive back for the Dutch. The two-time letterwinner received the Mel VerMeer Loyalty Award and the P.H. Kuyper Award in 2007. A Granger native, Schueler was also a two-year letterwinner for the men's track and field squad, competing in the triple jump and javelin throw.

Schueler is an admission representative and is entering his fourth season as a volunteer men's and women's track and field coach.

### **Drew Sikkink - receivers**

Drew Sikkink is in his fifth season as an assistant football coach at Central, working with the receivers after four years with the offensive line.

An Urbandale native, Sikkink is a 2006 Central graduate and played offensive line for the Dutch, receiving the P.H. Kuyper Award in 2005. He was a recruiting intern in spring, 2006. Sikkink also serves as a residence hall director.

### **Jerry Southmayd - running backs**

High school hall of famer Jerry Southmayd is in his 10th season as assistant coach, working with the running backs after two seasons as quarterbacks coach.

Southmayd served as head football coach at Wapsie Valley High School from 1969-2001, Southmayd posted a 241-83 record including 18 playoff appearances and three state titles in 1986, 1987 and 1997. He was enshrined in the Iowa Football Coaches Association's hall of fame in 1990 and served as a Shrine Bowl all-star game coach in 1992. He was named the Des Moines Register's state coach of the year in 1987 and was the IFCA Class IA coach of the year in 1997. Southmayd was also a math instructor at Wapsie Valley and was the school's athletic director for two years. He served as head golf coach for 10 years, and was an assistant basketball and wrestling coach.

He served on the IFCA's board of directors for six years and chaired the group's ethics committee for six years.

A graduate of Yankton College (S.D.), Southmayd received a master's degree in physical education from the University of South Dakota and a secondary administration endorsement from the University of Northern Iowa.

A high school baseball umpire, Southmayd has been a counselor and activities director for the American Legion's Boys' State program for 28 years.

### **Strength and conditioning coordinator**

#### **Kyle Johnson**

Kyle Johnson is in his first year as head strength and conditioning coordinator at Central, working with football, and his fourth year on the Dutch staff.

Previously Johnson spent two years as assistant sports performance director at Velocity Sports Performance in Franklin, Tenn. He graduated with honors from Central in 2002 and earned a master's degree in health and human performance from Iowa State University in 2004. Johnson worked as a graduate assistant strength and conditioning coach with the Iowa State football squad and later was a personal trainer and fitness coach at Delta City Club in Nashville, Tenn.

While at Central, Johnson was a member of the Dutch football squad, receiving academic all-Iowa Conference honors.

A certified strength and conditioning specialist, Johnson is a member of the National Strength and Conditioning Association (NSCA). He's an Elliott, Iowa native and graduate of Villisca High School.

Johnson served as a USA Weightlifting club coach and remains a competitive weightlifter as well, winning Olympic lifting titles in the 105-kilogram class at the Georgia Games, the Chattanooga Open and the Southeastern Regional meet in 2005 and the Emory Open in 2007. He was 11th in the 2007 American Open.

### **Head athletic trainer**

#### **Frank Neu**

Frank Neu returned to Central as an assistant athletic trainer in 2010 and was promoted to head athletic trainer in 2011.

A 1991 Central graduate, Neu previously served as assistant athletic trainer at Drake Univ. for five years. Earlier, he spent eight years as head athletic trainer at Lycoming College (Pa.). He earned a master's degree at Drake and served as a graduate assistant athletic trainer there for three years.

Neu has worked at numerous championship and other postseason events, including six trips as an athletic trainer for the AFCA Division III all-star football squad at the Aztec Bowl in Mexico. He was the sports medicine coordinator for the Budd Whitehill Division III National Wrestling Duals from 1998-2005.

A National Athletic Training Association member since 1990, Neu joined the Iowa Athletic Trainers' Association in 2005 and serves as the organization's treasurer. While at Lycoming, Neu was a member of the Eastern Athletic Training Association, the Pennsylvania Athletic Training Association and the College Athletic Trainers' Society. He was the athletic training chair of the Middle Atlantic Conference in 2004-05.

An abundance of playmakers return, but the Central College football team's fate in 2011 may well be determined by what happens in the trenches.

Six offensive starters and five defensive starters are back among 37 returning letterwinners. But the Dutch have just two starting offensive linemen back and one lineman on defense.

Filling the open spots up front tops the task list for 2011, yet the Dutch football tradition was built on consistently meeting challenges. Central hasn't had a losing season since 1960, capturing a record 30 Iowa Conference championships and gaining 20 NCAA Division III playoff berths. The Dutch have the second-winningest record of any college or university in the U.S. since 1975 with an .816 percentage (304-68-1). Coach Jeff McMartin, who ranks seventh in Division III in winning percentage, has led Central to four conference titles and four NCAA appearances in seven seasons at his alma mater, compiling a lofty 61-15 record (.802). The Dutch were 8-2 in 2010.

Five all-conference standouts return from that squad, led by team MVP Nate Snead, a senior quarterback. His younger brother, senior wide receiver Jeremy Snead, was a first-team all-league pick, as were junior defensive back Jake Petersen and senior kick/punt returner Mike Furlong, who also plays wide receiver. Senior defensive back Ryan Schmidt was a second-team pick in 2010, while senior defensive lineman Brady Hill, junior linebacker Keith Rush and senior center Casey Tanner received honorable mention. The Dutch also return senior Brett Wilkin, who was a 2009 first-team choice as a kick/punt returner as well, and plays wide receiver.

"The cupboard is not bare," McMartin said. "We lost some good people but we return some good people. We have to develop some areas and we need improvement from everybody. A lot depends on staying healthy and having a desire to get better every day."

It will take more than all-stars to succeed.

"The two losses we had last year weren't because of any one or two guys, they were team losses," McMartin said. "The guys coming back understand they have to improve. We've got talent, but talent only gets you so far. To be a successful team, you've got to have the right attitude, a commitment to preparation and an ability to execute under pressure. If you have those things, you can be a good football team."

The Dutch got a jump start on the season as 40 players, including several from the 2011 squad, traveled to Italy May 16-24.

“It was a great opportunity for the guys to get to know each other better and become closer as a team,” McMartin said. “We got a chance to practice but the real purpose of the trip was getting the experience they did in begin exposed to a different culture. I think the guys learned a lot and grew a lot as a team. It was an experience they’ll never forget.”

## **OFFENSE**

McMartin expects to have another high-powered offense. Last year Central averaged 380.2 yards and 33.8 points a game.

“Skillwise, we’ve got a lot of players back,” he said. “We’ll go as fast as our offensive line and tight ends can develop. Those are the big questions. As they prove themselves, I think we can be successful offensively. It will take a lot of work, but I don’t have any question that we can develop. We have to stay healthy and have guys step up.”

### **Quarterback**

Central’s hopes are bolstered by Snead’s return as the likely starting quarterback for the third straight year. He completed 96 of 179 passes for 1,510 yards with seven interceptions and 12 touchdowns last year while rushing for 642 yards on 142 carries. He’s completed 56.7 percent of his career passes (204-360-10) for 2,793 yards while rushing for 1,548.

“Nate’s done a great job,” McMartin said. “He’s had two productive years as the starter. We need to continue to develop his skills and allow him to be a playmaker. He has to take on more of a leadership role this year and we expect great things.” Less clear is the rest of the quarterback picture. Junior Jack Flaherty appeared in two games and has extensive junior varsity experience.

“Jack has steadily improved each year,” McMartin said. “He’s a very smart player but will be in a tight battle with a number of other competitors.”

Those include sophomores Austin Blom and Keegan Frisch.

“Austin did a nice job last year as a freshman,” McMartin said. “He’s gotten stronger and faster and just needs to continue to adjust to the speed of the game.”

“Keegan is a very good athlete and the type of player you want on your football team. He’s smart, he hustles and he works hard.”

A couple of transfers could force their way into the fight. Sophomore Blaze Smith came to Central for spring semester and traveled with the team to Italy, while Blaine Forsythe starts classes in the fall and will be listed as a freshman after sitting out a season at Augustana (S.D.).

“Nate (Snead) has to prove himself as the starter again,” McMartin said. “Then we have to figure out where we are with our depth. It’s critical to know how each of these guys can help us. Our top backup could be a returning player, it could be a transfer or it could also come from a talented group of incoming freshmen. We’ve got a good group of athletes.”

### **Running back**

Junior Ross Doehrmann answered a lot of questions last year at running back, emerging as a threat late in the season. He rushed for 522 yards on 109 carries in eight games with two touchdowns.

“He played very well while battling with a couple of injuries,” McMartin said. “We need Ross to be healthy because he can be a great weapon.”

Senior Kenny Harrington has spent time at running back and defensive back. He’s switching back to offense this year and McMartin said that’s where he belongs.

“He’s a good football player,” McMartin said. “He moved to defensive back to help us with our depth but we feel he’ll be even more valuable on offense. He runs hard, is a good blocker and is very smart.”

Also making the move from the secondary is sophomore Mike Rus.

“He’s got a great attitude,” McMartin said. “It will be nice to see what the off-season has done for him.”

**S-back**

Senior Preston West is back at Central's hybrid fullback/wingback position. He gained 167 yards on 33 carries with two touchdowns and also caught two passes for 15 yards.

"Pound for pound, Preston is one of the strongest players on the team," McMartin said. "He can also play running back for us. We need him to excel as a blocker, ball carrier and receiver. And we need him to stay healthy."

Sophomores Sam Armstrong and Austin Blanchard and junior Wes Chatterton could contribute.

**Tight end**

Graduation claimed most of Central's experience at tight end. Yet senior Cory Nikkel, a reserve the past three seasons, is highly regarded enough to be named a team co-captain. A nominee for the AFCA's Good Works team, Nikkel is active in service work and missed the spring semester while on a mission project in the Australian outback.

"Cory came back in great shape," McMartin said. "He's got a tremendous attitude and does a good job of rallying the players. He's improved each year. He got some playing time last year and we saw glimpses of what he can be for us."

Senior David Young will also get an early look.

"He's one of the strongest players on the team," McMartin said. "He's got a great work ethic and a great attitude. He could also help us as a long snapper. He's a hard worker and very physical."

Sophomore Joe Flaherty will either continue to develop at tight end or could be moved to the offensive line.

**Wide receiver**

It's a deep group of deep threats at wide receiver.

Jeremy Snead was a first-team all-league pick with 38 catches for 597 yards and seven touchdowns, topping the team in all three categories.

"Jeremy is big, fast and has good hands," McMartin said. "He's made a lot of plays for us. He needs to be even better this year because teams will be keying on him. We have utilized Jeremy a lot in the past, but we need to get even more out of him this year."

Senior Brett Wilkin had 18 catches for 190 yards and two scores.

"Brett runs good routes and has great hands," McMartin said. "He dedicated himself to getting stronger in the off-season."

Meanwhile, speedy Furlong had 14 catches for 260 yards.

"Mike's a dangerous playmaker," McMartin said. "He can get himself open and make people miss."

The Dutch have some less experienced but capable options as well, including senior Preston Roberts, juniors Ben Lechtenberg, Bobby Daigle and Joseph Kotz and sophomores Nolan Blythe, Austin Aldrich and Mitch Wagoner.

"Preston (Roberts) came on last year and can really contribute," McMartin said. "Ben (Lechtenberg) has grown and improved each season. We need him to be a force this year. Bobby (Daigle) is making progress. He's got a great attitude and is a very hard worker.

"We're moving Joseph (Kotz) from quarterback. We want to utilize his athleticism. Nolan (Blythe) also ran track last spring and has come back faster and stronger this year. Austin (Aldrich) has continued to improve. Mitch (Wagoner) is another track guy who is very fast and we will give a good look."

Senior Alex McArdle and junior Grant McArdle return after both spending a year away and the Dutch also picked up junior transfer Steven Overbergen.

**Offensive line**

Tanner has the most experience in the offensive line as he seeks a starting role at center for the third year. He's also a team

co-captain.

"It's always great to be strong up the middle and Casey helps give us that," McMartin said. "He's a great snapper, a smart player and a very good leader."

Also back at right guard is senior two-time letterwinner Nate Rouse, who spent the spring studying in Spain through Central College Abroad.

"Nate's been a starter for us and provides a lot of experience and leadership," McMartin said.

The Dutch get a boost with the return of senior Colton Smith, who began 2010 as a starter at right guard but was injured and missed most of the season.

"We hope Colton can bounce back and get back on the field," McMartin said. "He is a very good lineman."

Senior Garret Albers is expected to play a significant role as well.

"He's a guy we're going to be counting on," McMartin said. "He's got size, is smart and experienced."

Seniors Brandon Wagner, Nathan Wolff and Adam Dubois have waited for their chance.

"Brandon (Wagner) gives great effort and has the experience to help this football team," McMartin said. "Nathan (Wolff) has really worked hard and will get an opportunity to contribute. Adam (Dubois) knows our program, knows our offense and will come in and compete."

Juniors Brandon Burrell, Travis Hook, Garrett Veldman and Anthony Wolf have shown promise.

"They've all gotten stronger and bigger," McMartin said. "We need them to contribute."

## **DEFENSE**

A stout defense is critical to any title hopes Central harbors. The Dutch must replace six starters from a unit that allowed 255.5 yards and 16.5 points an outing.

"We need the defense to be a strength," McMartin said. "We must find the correct fit for our players and put them in the right spots. We lost some good players but we rotate a lot of guys and have experience at each spot. The defensive backfield was a question mark a year ago in the preseason but it's one of our strengths now."

### **Defensive line**

Hill is bidding to be a three-year starter at nose guard. He made 29 tackles last year, including 16 solo stops, 5.5 tackles for loss and 3.5 sacks.

"Brady's done a great job," McMartin said. "He's one of the best defensive linemen to play here in my time at Central. He's hard-nosed, a great worker and a good football player."

Sophomore Ryan Dahm received the Brian O'Donnell Award as Central's most valuable freshman last year. Juniors Spencer Matlock and Spenser Fuller can also play inside.

"We need them to step up and be playmakers," McMartin said.

Senior Michael Lamos has been added to the mix, moving from linebacker.

"Michael will provide some depth and help shore things up," McMartin said. "I think this position is more natural for him. It's where he played in high school."

McMartin can also call on a transfer, junior Ben Douthart.

"I'm interested in seeing what he can do," McMartin said.

Senior Holden Blythe was a part-time starter at strong-side defensive end. He had 14 tackles with 4.5 for loss and 3.0 sacks.

"Holden had a great off-season," McMartin said. "He's a very good competitor. We really envisioned him being in this role someday and now we're counting on him. Holden is a great leader and has started for us in a number of games over the past two seasons."

Sophomore J.J. Kotz is pushing for a spot.

"J.J. is looking good," McMartin said. "He had a good off-season."

At the rush end position, senior Brady Wilson is forcing his way into the picture.

"Brady is a smart player and a very hard worker," McMartin said. "He's really developed. It's important for him to have a good year."

Junior Derek Beckman is getting "bigger and stronger each year," McMartin said. Sophomores Zach Brennan and Jesse Beringer are options as well.

"Both spent a lot of time in the weight room," McMartin said. "They are developing nicely and we need them to step up."

### **Linebacker**

Central has some experience at linebacker, but the position heading into camp was a bit unsettled.

At 5-10, 190, Rush may be undersized, but not underestimated in the eyes of the Dutch staff. He was Central's fourth-leading tackler last year with 44, including nine tackles for loss. He mans the weak-side spot. Rush received the Lankelma-Manning Award as the team's outstanding underclass player.

"He's aggressive, hard-hitting and loves the game," McMartin said. "He can play football."

Rush is joined by senior Patrick Kelley and sophomore Luke Geneser. Kelley was a part-time starter who recorded 14 tackles with 2.0 tackles for loss.

"He's a hard worker with a great attitude," McMartin said.

Geneser missed much of his freshman campaign with injury.

"When he was healthy, he showed great promise," McMartin said. "He had a great off-season."

Senior Ryan Steinkamp is a likely choice in the middle. He had 28 tackles last year, including 17 solo stops and 4.0 tackles for loss.

"He could play (strong-side or middle) positions as well," McMartin said. "He knows the program, knows his assignments and is one of the hardest hitters on the team. He's a great leader."

Senior Matt Daniels played primarily on special teams yet was tabbed as a team captain, even though he spent the spring in London through Central College Abroad.

"Matt's got a great work ethic and an awesome attitude," McMartin said. "He's a very smart football player with a nose for the ball. He's also a good tackler."

Junior Seth Carson is leaving his mark at the strong-side position. He made 33 tackles with 5.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, a fumble recovery and a forced fumble while emerging last year. He was named the team's most improved player.

"He played a lot of football last year at linebacker and on special teams," McMartin said. "He knows our defense extremely well, he pass rushes well and he covers well. He's a key player for us."

Senior Jason Nabholz should contribute.

“Jason’s very versatile and has a nose for the ball,” McMartin said. “He’s a good athlete.”

Senior Jackson Leuschen, who made 12 tackles last year, has moved from strong safety.

“Jackson has a lot of versatility,” McMartin said. “He’s a very good football player. He contributed a lot last year on special teams. Before it is all said and done, Jackson will be asked to play a number of spots.”

### **Secondary**

Schmidt has started since his freshman season and was a second-team all-conference pick last year at safety. He is Central’s leading returning tackler, making 54 stops last year with 3.0 tackles for loss, seven pass breakups, a sack, interception, forced fumble and blocked kick. Schmidt is also a team co-captain.

“Ryan’s gotten better each year,” McMartin said. “His experience will help him take charge of the defensive backfield.”

Sophomores Mike Young and Levi Ross saw junior varsity action.

“They’re bigger and stronger now,” McMartin said. “Mike can also help us as a long-snapper and Levi is also a punter.” Petersen is a three-year starter at free safety. He’s a first-team all-conference honoree who made 43 tackles with three interceptions, two pass breakups and a blocked kick.

“Jake’s really found a home at free safety,” McMartin said. “He’s made some big plays for us. He really has a nose for the ball.”

Senior Adam Petz filled a void at cornerback last year, making 22 tackles with three interceptions and five breakups.

“Cornerback was a big question mark last year, but we’ve got some guys who played quite a bit of football there now,” McMartin said. “Adam came in and did a great job. He’s a good competitor who loves the game.”

Senior Joey Toale also picked up significant experience.

“Joey’s a smart player,” McMartin said. “We need him to step up this year.”

Junior Jason Breon emerged as the season progressed. He made 21 tackles with five breakups and a fumble recovery.

“Jason has a lot of speed and is a great competitor,” McMartin said.

Junior Trent Heetland made 14 tackles last year with an interception and four pass breakups.

“Trent’s very competitive,” McMartin said. “He loves the program and is definitely someone who can help.”

### **Specialists**

The Dutch graduated a pair of four-year starters at kicker and punter.

“It’s a big area of opportunity,” McMartin said. “It’s wide open.”

Roberts and Ross have some junior varsity punting experience, while Forsythe was a solid performer in high school. Sophomore Tanner Price did some JV placekicking a year ago.

“It could be an upperclassman or we could have freshmen at both positions,” McMartin said. “This has been an area of strength for us and I’m confident it will be again.”

But Central is in the unique position of having two first-team all-conference return specialists. Furlong, also a three-time all-conference baseball player, earned all-league honors after averaging 23.6 yards on kick returns and 9.4 yards on punt returns. Meanwhile Wilkin averaged 19.1 yards on kickoff returns and 8.8 yards on punt returns after winning all-league distinction in 2009.

“They’ve both done it well for three years,” McMartin said. “Now we’ve got to develop some other guys behind them.”

**The freshmen**

Central's class of recruits shows promise.

"We addressed a lot of needs, not only immediate but for the future," McMartin said. "We have some very talented players from in-state and some from out of state as well. Most importantly, I see a lot of guys with great character who are very good students. You win with character and they've demonstrated they have that throughout the recruiting process."

While the Dutch have a large group of upperclassmen, McMartin said some of the newcomers could force their way into the action.

"It's fair to say that a number of freshmen will have an opportunity to be a part of what we do on Saturdays," he said. "That will be determined by how quickly they can adjust to new coaches, new teammates and new terminology, but they'll have some opportunities. We want them to come in and compete."

**The schedule**

Central's non-conference slate is among the most daunting of recent years. The Dutch open Sept. 3 at Wis.-Oskosh, then play host to traditional Division III powerhouse Augustana (Ill.) Sept. 10.

"We have to play a very good football team on its home field in the opening game and we'll go in with a lot of untested players," McMartin said. "Oshkosh is a great team and well-coached.

"And Augustana, wow, what a great program. They've got a new coach and a very good team. Oshkosh and Augustana can play with anybody in the country."

Meanwhile the Iowa Conference schedule isn't getting any easier. Defending champion Wartburg and runnerup Coe both received NCAA playoff berths last year and are in most of the preseason Division III rankings. And McMartin sees little dropoff in the remainder of the league.

"Our goal every year is to win the Iowa Conference," he said. "I hope that we learned a lot from last year, both from our successes and our failures. The guys are excited for the opportunity in front of them but they know we have to be a one-day, one-game-at-a-time team and we have to play hard every week. There are a lot of good teams in our league and we have a tough non-conference schedule so we're going to have to scratch and claw for everything we get.

How the team develops outside of practice will have a big impact on the season and McMartin's class of 30 seniors shoulders much of that responsibility.

"One thing I see the seniors doing a good job of is keeping the players together and united," he said. "We're going into the season a very tight-knit group and that's important. We have to have players who play for each other and for Central. We need to be confident, humble and unselfish. Those are big things for us to be successful."
