GAME NOTES

THE MATCHUP

It's an end of the season Big Cat Battle as the La Verne Leopards visit Orange, Calif. To take on the Panthers. The cross-divisional matchup kicks off at 7 p.m. as Chapman tries to extend its winning streak to five games and clinch a spot in the inaugural SCIAC Championship Game.

SERIES HISTORY

The Panthers have won their last eight matchups against the Leopards, dating back to 2016. La Verne's last win against Chapman came in its SCIAC Championship season of 2015 when the Leopards won 49-42 in La Verne. That is La Verne's only win over Chapman since Chapman joined the SCIAC in the 2013 season. The series has been dominated by Chapman over the last two decades with the teams meeting every year. La Verne has not won on the artificial turf in Orange. Chapman's last loss at home to La Verne was in 2004 when it was still a natural grass field. The Panthers have put up 50 points in their last three home games against La Verne.

CONTROLLING THE SURF

With last week's win over CMS, the Panthers took control of the Surf Division in the SCIAC. Chapman moved to 4-2 in SCIAC games, matching CMS' SCIAC record. However, the Panthers take the edge based on head-to-head results as they have handed CMS their only losses of the year.

SCIAC CHAMPIONSHIP SITUATIONS

Chapman needs a win over La Verne on Saturday to clinch their trip to the inaugural SCIAC Championship game next week. With a win, the Panthers will represent the Surf Division in the SCIAC Championship game. With a loss, the Panthers will travel to the No. 2 seed of the Sun Division — regardless of record. Chapman's matchup will depend on the result of the Pomona-Pitzer/Redlands game (played at the same time on Saturday). If Chapman wins and Pomona-Pitzer wins, Chapman will host the championship game. If Chapman wins and Redlands wins, Chapman will travel to Redlands for the championship matchup. If Chapman loses, the Panthers will travel to whichever team loses Saturday's game.

STINGY AS CAN BE

The defense continues to be the driving force into Chapman's win streak. The Panthers gave up just 10 points in their second matchup with CMS and have not allowed any team to score more than one touchdown during their four-game win streak. In fact, the Panthers have allowed just 27 points in the last four games while allowing just 243.5 yards per game. In terms of scoring, the 2023 Panthers are one of the stingiest in school history. Their 16.1 points per game allowed this year are tied for the second-least in Chapman history. The 153 combined rushing yards the defense has allowed in the last four games is more than 50 yards less than the Chapman offense averages during the win streak. Despite not forcing a turnover last week, Chapman has forced 12 turnovers during the win streak and is plus-10 in the turnover margin category.

WHAT SECOND HALF STRUGGLES?

The Panthers had scored just 14 points in the fourth quarter all season heading into last Saturday's game — a concerning statistic when the score was 7-0 with CMS driving to start the fourth quarter. Luke Peterman led the Panthers down the field and into the end zone on back-to-back drives in the fourth quarter, hitting Gian Lageman for the first TD and taking the second in himself. On the season, Chapman has scored 104 points in the first half and 48 in the second but have

scored 31 of their 52 points in the last two games in the second half.

OUTSIDE LINEBACKERS COMING UP BIG

Kade Jordan and Kyle Sieben (along with many on the defense) came up with some crucial plays down the stretch at CMS to help Chapman take control of the Surf. Sieben's chase down sack of Walter Kuhlenkamp on third and six in the fourth quarter forced a 12-yard loss and a three-and-out to give the Panthers a chance to tie the game or take the lead. On the play before, he took down Justin Edwards at the line of scrimmage to force the third down. Jordan's moment came after the Stags set up first and goal from the five-yard line with less than a minute left. Jordan dragged down Edwards at the line of scrimmage on first down and knocked down a pass at the line on second down. Sieben finished off the fourth down tackle that kept Kuhlenkamp out of the end zone. In Sieben's first season as a starter, he has 26 total tackles with 3.5 for a loss and 2.5 sacks. Jordan is on pace for a career-best number of total tackles this year. His eight tackles for loss are one short of his career-high and he has tied his career-best with three sacks.

KEEFE'S CAREER YEAR

Collin Keefe is having his best season as a Panther. When he and Sieben brought down Kuhlenkamp at the one yard line last Saturday, it was Keefe's 43rd tackle of the year — already a career-high. He also has three interceptions this season, which leads the Panthers.

WOODS ESTABLISHING NEW BESTS

Isaiah Woods is taking on a career-high workload to establish new career-bests. Woods has a career-high 84 touches this year with 77 rushing attempts and seven receptions. The result? A career-best 403 rushing yards and 410 total yards. His 5.2 yards per carry are his best since playing five games as a freshman in 2019 before his season was cut short due to injury. His next touchdown will be his tenth career TD.

TAPIA STILL THE CAREER LEADER

At 42.1 yards per punt in his career, Tapia still leads all active Division III punters. He also ranks in top-15 in Division III history with his current average. This season, he has booted seven punts of 50-plus yards, tying his career-high from last season.

ABOUT LA VERNE

La Verne has struggled through the SCIAC season after picking up a win at Puget Sound in September. The Leopards are averaging just 8.3 points per game against SCIAC opponents and have been held to seven points or fewer in four of their six games. While the defense does lead the SCIAC with 11 interceptions taken away this year, the offense has thrown 16 interceptions and lost four fumbles to also lead the SCIAC. The defense allows 163.4 yards per game on the ground while the offense averages less than 50. The offensive line has allowed 41 sacks in their seven games. Three different QBs have thrown at least 50 passes. Brian Rudden made the start at Redlands last week but Trevor Tedesco is listed as this week's starter under center. Hector Facio leads the defense with three interceptions while Austin Marin has three sacks.

2023 CHAPMAN FOOTBALL NOTES

HEAD COACH BOB OWENS



The rise of Chapman football within the SCIAC has been the residue of a very specific plan put in place by Bob Owens when he took the helm of the Panthers in 2006. That plan has led Chapman football to unprecedented success since joining the SCIAC in 2012. Owens led the Panthers into the national spotlight in 2019.

He has been honored with the SCIAC Coaching Staff of the Year four times and was named the D3football.com and AFCA West Region Coach of the Year following the 2019 season.

Owens' 2019 Panthers reached new heights and finished the season in the top-10 of the national polls after winning their third SCIAC title in six years. Early in the season, the Panthers defeated a ranked team for the first time in school history. They defeated two ranked teams on the way to an undefeated regular season - a first for the Chapman program. The Panthers achieved another first when they were chosen to host a First Round game for the NCAA Championship and made the most of the opportunity with a double overtime win - the first NCAA Tournament win for the program.

The Panthers were poised for another run in 2020 before the COVID-19 pandemic forced the cancellation of the season for the entire SCIAC. Back-to-back seasons with records of 7-3 since the pandemic have given Chapman six consecutive seasons with a winning record - an unprecedented run of success in the history of Chapman football.

The all-time winningest coach in Chapman football history, Owens won the 100th game of his career with a 35-23 win over Pacific in the 2021 season-opener. The four-time SCIAC Coach of the Year has led the Panthers to a three SCIAC championships in its first eight years in the conference. Chapman went undefeated in SCIAC play in 2014, 2017 and 2019 to claim the SCIAC titles and appearances in the NCAA Tournament - the only appearances in school history.

Owens' 2017 squad overcame an 0-2 start and put together a dominant 6-0 run through the SCIAC to claim its second conference title. As a result, Chapman's players were selected as the conference's Offensive Player of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year and Newcomer of the Year.

In 2014, Owens was named Coach of the Year after leading the Panthers to an undefeated conference record and the school's highest ranking in program history (No. 17) en route to its first-ever NCAA playoff berth. After having Chapman one win away from winning the conference in the past two seasons, Owens and his Panthers took home the SCIAC crown in just their third year as a member of the conference. It was Owens' third SCIAC title (two with Whittier).

Chapman is 54-22 since the start of the 2012 season (when Chapman joined the SCIAC) and 43-11 in conference games. Since 2012, the Owens-led Panthers have garnered three SCIAC Offensive Athletes of the Year, three Defensive Players of the Year, two Newcomers of the Year, two Jon Zinda Character Awards and 101 All-SCIAC selections.

In 15 seasons, Chapman has had four All-American selections and 23 players named to All-West Region teams, including a program-best six players in 2019. Owens has also stressed strong academics, already coaching 15 Academic All-District VIII selections and a few dozen more who have been named NFF College Hall of Fame Scholar-Athletes. A handful of former Panthers have signed professional contracts to play football in Europe, Australia and in Arena Football.

Prior to coming to Chapman, Owens served as offensive coordinator at Humboldt State (most recently). He was also the head coach at Division III-rival Whittier College, where he led the Poets to two SCIAC championships (1997-98).

Owens has 32 years of college coaching experience, including stops at Fresno State, Utah State and Oregon. He served as the wide receivers coach for Nevada on its Big West championship team in 1995 and helped lead the Sacramento Surge to a World League title as its running backs coach in 1992.

His passing offense ranked in the top-15 in NCAA Division II at Humboldt State and helped the Lumberjacks to a second place finish in the Great Northwest Athletic Conference in 2004 - the school's best finish in five years.

A graduate of the University of La Verne, where he earned a bachelor's degree in physical education in 1970, Owens went on to earn his master's in curriculum and instruction from the University of Oregon in 1974. He served as a professor of African-American sociology at Whittier (1996-2002) and at Chico State (1993-95), as well as a professor of African-American history at Oregon (1972-74). He and his wife, Debby, currently reside in Whittier.
