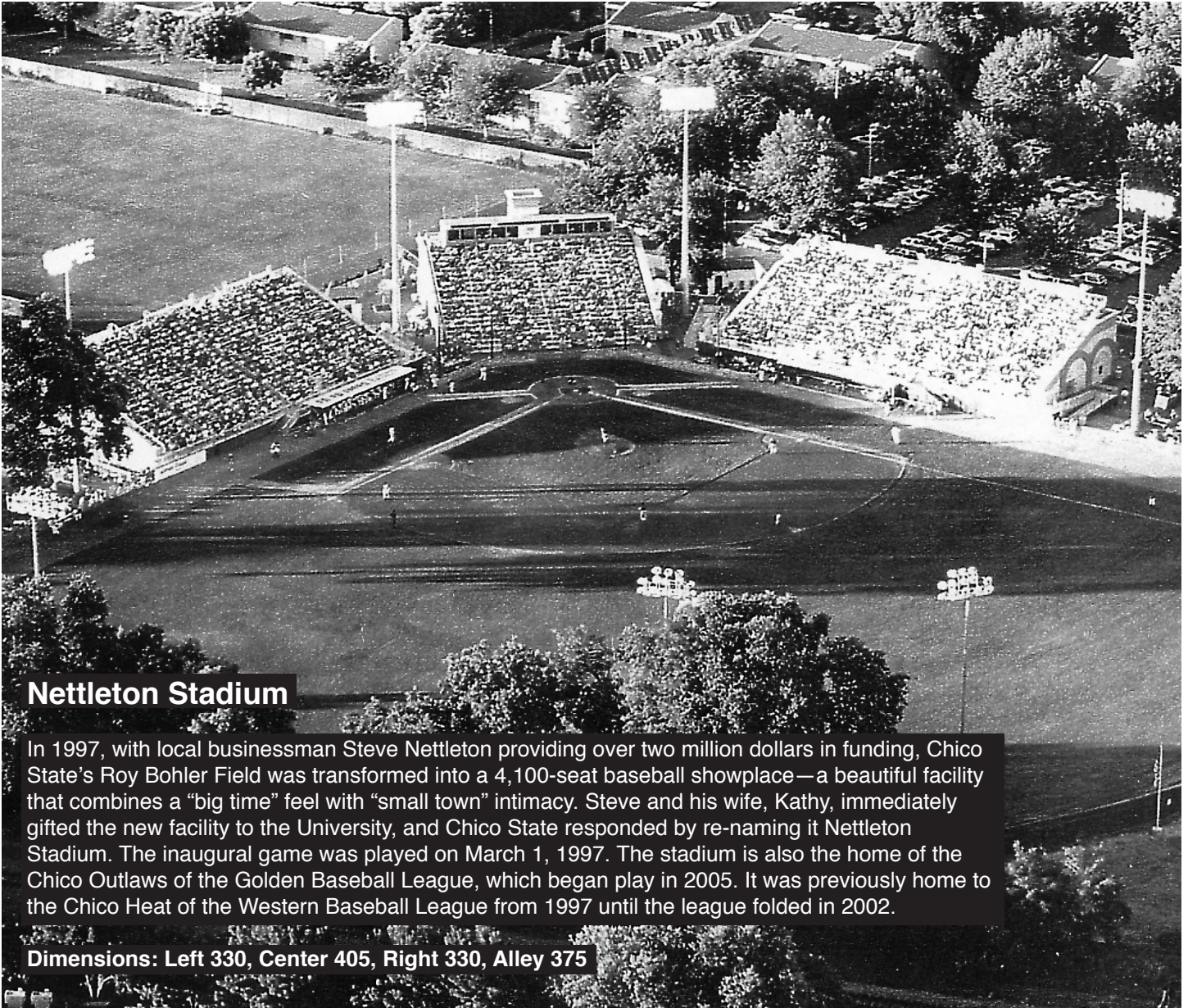

NETTLETON STADIUM - HOME OF THE WILDCATS



Nettleton Stadium

In 1997, with local businessman Steve Nettleton providing over two million dollars in funding, Chico State's Roy Bohler Field was transformed into a 4,100-seat baseball showplace—a beautiful facility that combines a “big time” feel with “small town” intimacy. Steve and his wife, Kathy, immediately gifted the new facility to the University, and Chico State responded by re-naming it Nettleton Stadium. The inaugural game was played on March 1, 1997. The stadium is also the home of the Chico Outlaws of the Golden Baseball League, which began play in 2005. It was previously home to the Chico Heat of the Western Baseball League from 1997 until the league folded in 2002.

EXPERIENCED 'CATS OPEN SEASON RANKED No. 7

Expectations are always high when it comes to the Chico State baseball team. That's what five straight trips to the NCAA Championship Tournament and 11 in the last 13 seasons will do.

In 2009, those expectations are as high as they've ever been.

Entering his third season at the helm, Wildcats Head Coach Dave Taylor believes he has built a team with enough talent to advance to the Division II College World Series. Fifteen players, including nine starters, return from last season's regional finalist team that finished the campaign 42-17 and ranked No. 6 in the nation.

"This is the year we want to take it back to the level this program is accustomed to," said Taylor. "Last year to get as far as we got with a bunch of new guys was the master plan. With that experience, now it's time to head east (for the College World Series) in late May."

All four members of last season's starting rotation – Pete Mickartz, Mike Robbins, Andrew Pluta, and Joel Garcia – are back, along with relievers Bryan Save and Ivan Gonzalez. Sophomore Scott Newberry, an outfielder last season, has also made the switch to a relief pitcher. Five regulars from last season's starting lineup – Josh Meagher, Kyle Eveland, Cody Dee, Jimmy Dodos, and Bret Ringer – also return, along with part-time starters Kevin Seaver, Trevor Moore, and Nick Victor.

"To have all those guys who had significant roles on a club that was one day away from going to the College World Series is outstanding," said Taylor. "We all know you can't substitute experience."

As usual, Taylor's squad is built to win with pitching and defense.

Mickartz led the nation in wins last season, compiling a 13-4 record and 3.48 ERA. He and Robbins (10-1, 3.41) both earned All-West Region recognition. Pluta (9-4, 4.22) led the team with six complete games, and Garcia (5-1, 2.21) was arguably the team's top pitcher over the final month of the season.

Despite last season's success, however, one of those pitchers could become an important piece of the bullpen once the season is in full swing thanks to the emergence of redshirt freshman Jordan Lindebaum. The 6-foot-7 righty has impressed the coaching staff with his maturation over the course of a season, though it wasn't totally unexpected. Lindebaum was a First Team All-State selection as a senior at Rio Mesa High School where he struck out 111 batters and walked just 26 while compiling a 10-4 record and 1.71 ERA as a senior in 2007.

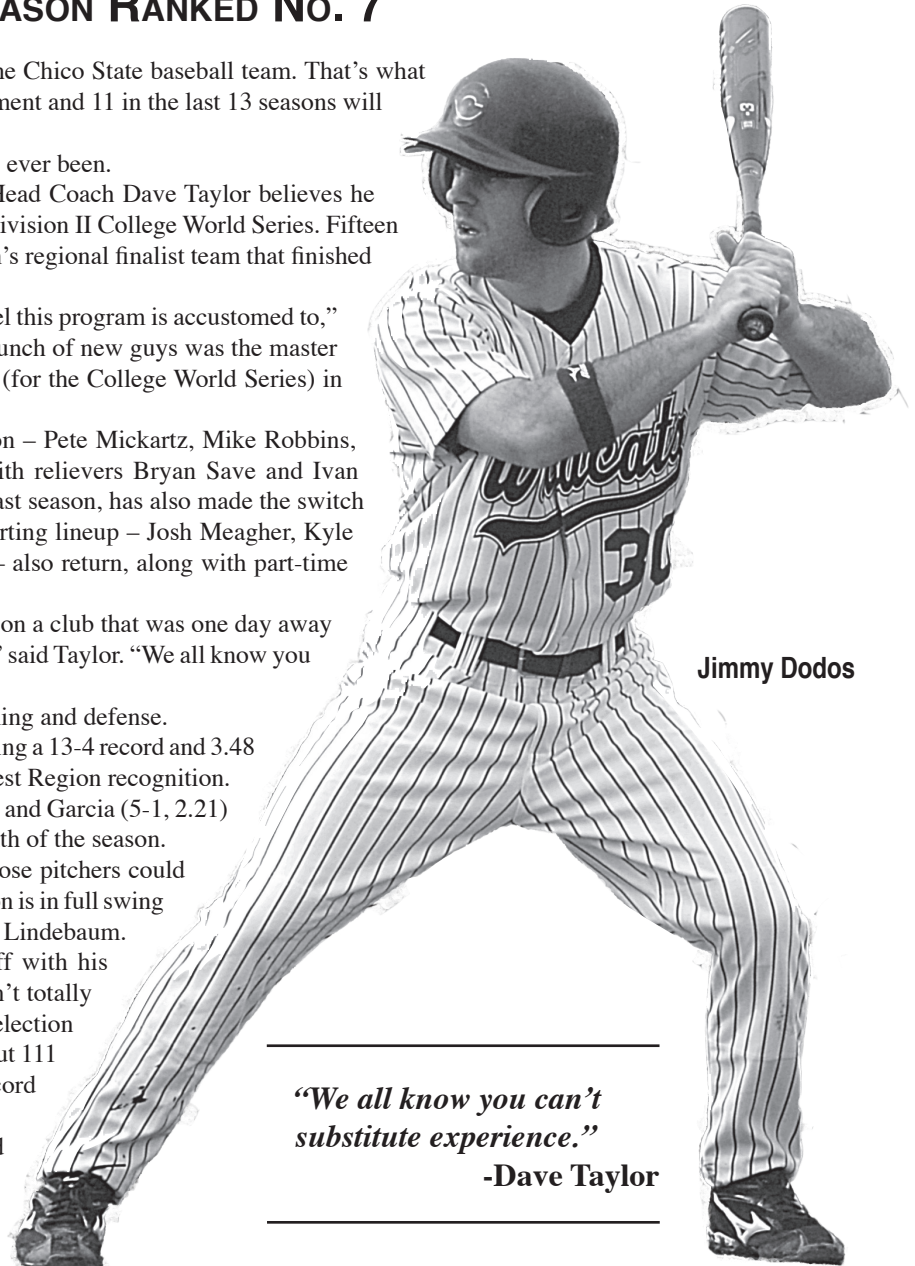
"He was our most consistent pitcher in the fall," said Taylor. "It's been night and day as far as his stuff, and more importantly, his confidence. That guy is riding as high as anybody on our staff as far as trusting his stuff. He got our hitters out in the fall and we think we're pretty good. To have him as a freshman getting some weekend starts is a great thing for him and for us as a program."

Whether it's Lindebaum or one of last season's starters, that addition to the bullpen – probably the team's weak link in 2008 – will certainly help. Save emerged late last season and was one of the bullpen's few bright spots. He and Gonzalez combined to strike out 22 batters in 21-plus innings. Willows High School and Butte College product Michael Gleason has the inside track on the closer role. The converted starter finished fourth in the state with 102 strikeouts in just over 84 innings of work last season.

Helping get Gleason the ball will be junior college transfers Ian Waldron and Brian Fowler, and Missouri Baptist University transfer Derek Mayer. Fowler, the pen's lone southpaw, earned Northwest Athletic Association of Community Colleges (NWAACC) First Team All-East Division honors as a starter and eight-game winner at Treasure Valley Community College last season. Waldron was a starter at Arizona Western College for the last two seasons where he was a combined 13-11 with a 3.20 ERA and WHIP of just 1.03 (171.1 IP, 143 hits, 35 walks). Mayer went 0-1 with a trio of saves at Missouri Baptist. His ERA was 4.76, but opponents went scoreless against him in 12 of 14 appearances. He struck out 23 hitters while allowing just 11 hits and five walks in 17 innings of work.

"Our starters logged a lot of innings last season and we want to avoid making them do the same thing this year," said Taylor. "We feel like we have a group of guys who we can rely on to bridge those two, three, or four innings to get the ball into Gleason's hands."

Three-fifths of last season's infield that helped the team finish seventh in the nation with a .970 fielding percentage is back to make the staff look good. Ringer – a National Gold Glove recipient – and Eveland return to patrol the left side of the infield at third base and shortstop, respectively. Dee will be back behind the dish where he made just two errors in all of 2008, while Dodos (center field) and Seaver (first base) return having never committed an error in a Chico State uniform.

2009 SEASON OUTLOOK

“The foundation of the program has been pitching and defense,” said Taylor. “To have four starting pitchers coming back from a team that went to the regional championship is invaluable. Eveland, Ringer and Cody Dee – that’s a pretty good foundation for the defense. We play 34 home games in a pitchers’ park, so with our experienced arms and solid defense, we should be able to make it hard for teams to come in here and score a lot of runs.”

With Ringer, Eveland, Dee, Dodos, and Meagher sure bets to grace the starting lineup on most days, a number of highly regarded newcomers and returners will have to settle into their roles.

“We’ve talked as a group about guys who come in here with good numbers who might be asked to do some different things this season,” said Taylor. “Our credo is to buy into your piece of the puzzle. Your piece includes accepting your role and understanding what it means to the whole.”

Cal State Fullerton transfer Eric Stephens and Seaver should see the majority of playing time at first base. Seaver, a right-handed batter, started 24 times last season and hit .315. Stephens, a lefty, earned Northwoods League All-Star honors over the summer after knocking in a league-best 50 runs in 66 games. He hit seven home runs and also had 19 doubles. He spent last season in a reserve role at Cal State Fullerton

following a pair of All-Conference selections at East L.A. Community College.

“Kevin really surprised us all last year. Once he got in the lineup it was tough to get him out. He’s not necessarily going to wow you with the long ball, but he’s a guy you want up there with guys in scoring position,” said Taylor. “Stephens has that sock in his bat that makes the ball come off a little differently. It’s rare to have someone with his strength, and his understanding of how to play the game and go about his business has been good for everyone to see.”

True freshman Bryan Willson and Yavapai Community College transfer Deven Braden will attempt to win the starting job at second base throughout the non-conference schedule. Willson finished his 51-game prep career with 10 home runs, 15 doubles, and 53 RBI. Braden stole 14 bases as a sophomore last season.

“Braden’s got good speed and Willson is a little bit more of a threat at the plate,” said Taylor. “To get a freshman in the program and get him going would be good for now and the future, but those guys have to perform early. We’ve got other guys who will be knocking on the door.”

Two of those guys are third-year player Trevor Moore and junior college transfer Cameron Softli. Moore started 16 games at second base last season and hit .293. Softli was the third baseman for the Edmonds Community College team that finished 38-9 and won the NWAACC title last season.

Dee started 44 times behind the dish last season, but it’s likely he won’t approach that number in 2009. The Wildcats feature a number of strong catchers, including Dee, Meagher, University of Cumberland’s senior transfer Robert Mills, and true freshman Ben Manlove.

Dee led the team with eight home runs last season, while Meagher led the way with 55 RBI. Mills is one of Cumberland’s all-time best, with three-year totals of 31 home runs, 57 doubles, 156 RBI and a .667 slugging percentage in 158 games. He ranks second on Cumberland’s career home runs and RBI lists, and third in doubles. With talented veterans ahead of him, Manlove can transition to the collegiate game with little pressure.

Dodos will anchor the outfield following a junior season in which he led the Wildcats with 74 hits and 16 stolen bases while batting .361. East L.A. Community College transfer Jordan Larson could occupy left field and bat leadoff. He hit .346 with 86 runs scored, 34 stolen bases, and 20 sacrifice bunts over his two-year community college career. Another talented junior college transfer, Adam Arakawa, will likely open the season in right field. The Hartnell Community College product hit .364 with seven home runs, eight triples, and 53 RBI last season.

Returner Nick Victor and Cuesta College transfer Ryan Smith could also see significant time in the outfield. Victor hit .324 and slugged a team-high .554 while driving in 24 runs in 34 games last season. Smith hit .343 with 18 extra-base hits and 15 stolen bases last season at Cuesta.

“We’ve got a bunch of tough guys who can play the game and apply pressure,” said Taylor. “I really like our options offensively, especially from the left side. That, with some speed at the top and bottom of the order, will give us a good balance offensively.”

NEW REGION AWAITS WILDCATS

The NCAA has realigned the eight regions around the nation and the West has taken on a decidedly different look. Gone from the region is the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference and with it perennially strong programs like Mesa State and Colorado State-Pueblo.

As a result, only four bids will be available for the NCAA Championship Tournament West Regional from the 19 remaining teams in the west. Those four teams must come out of the 10-team CCAA, the five-team Great Northwest Athletic Conference, or the four-team Pacific West Conference.

The winner of the West Regional earns a berth in the Division II College World Series, to be held in Cary, North Carolina, May 23-30.

WILDCAT HEAD COACH - DAVE TAYLOR

DAVE TAYLOR – HEAD COACH



Dave Taylor has guided the Wildcats to an 89-32 record and back-to-back trips to the NCAA Championship Tournament in his first two seasons as the Chico State baseball team's head coach. His 47-win team in 2007 was the fourth-winningest team in the program's history. His 2008 team finished the season ranked No. 6 in the nation. This isn't the first time Taylor has tasted success in a Chico State uniform, however. He helped build the Chico State baseball program into a perennial national contender as the head assistant/pitching coach from 1997-2004.

"I'm absolutely ecstatic to be in Chico," said Taylor. "This is where I want to coach and it's where my family and I want to live. I couldn't imagine a better fit for us."

Taylor played an integral role in Chico State's national championships in 1997 and 1999 and an NCAA runner-up finish in 2002. In all, the Wildcats reached the College World Series in five of Taylor's eight seasons as an assistant coach. His pitching staffs at Chico State led the California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA) in ERA in each of his last six seasons, and he mentored a trio of CCAA Pitchers of the Year and eight All-American hurlers.

That tradition of grooming top-notch pitchers has continued with Taylor's return to Chico State. Three of Chico State's starting pitchers have been drafted in the last two seasons, and five different pitchers groomed by Taylor are currently pitching in professional organizations, including Drew Carpenter, who made his Major League debut with the Philadelphia Phillies last season.

Taylor left Chico State to become the head coach at Cal State L.A. in 2005 and immediately turned around a struggling program, guiding the program to a 58-39-1 record in two seasons.

In 2006, Taylor's squad finished 36-16-1 and reached the NCAA Championship Tournament West Regional final. The Golden Eagles were ranked as high as No. 6 in the nation during the regular season, tied the school record for most conference wins, earned their first CCAA Championship Tournament berth, and won 30 games for the first time since 1977.

Prior to joining the Chico State coaching staff, Taylor spent three years at the University of Wyoming (1994-96). He was the program's head coach in 1995 and 1996 and earned Western Athletic Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1996 after leading the Cowboys to a 36-20 mark in what had already been announced as the final year of the university's baseball program.

Taylor boasts a 204-126-1 record in six years as a head coach at the NCAA Division I or II level. He earned his 200th career victory on May 8, 2008 as the Wildcats beat UC San Diego 7-4 in the opening round of the CCAA Championship Tournament.

A catcher during his playing days, Taylor played collegiately at Oxnard Community College from 1983-84 before transferring to the University of Arizona for the 1985-86 seasons. It was there he earned the first of his three national titles (the other two coming as a coach at Chico State) during the 1986 campaign.

Taylor went on to play two seasons of minor league baseball in the Milwaukee Brewers' organization. He advanced as high as double-A and earned the Brewers' Minor League Catcher of the Year award in 1987 before retiring as a player.

Taylor began his coaching career at Cal Lutheran in 1989, and after one year as an assistant at Oxnard Community College, earned his first head-coaching job there in 1991.

He also coached at Long Beach City College, Simi Valley High School, and in the Cape Cod League.

Taylor earned his bachelor's degree in social science from Cal Lutheran in 1989 and his master's degree in physical education from Chico State in 2004.

He and his wife, Robin, have two sons, Mark and Jack.

Chris Pfatenhauer is in his second season as an assistant baseball coach at Chico State following three seasons as the head coach at College of the Ozarks.

Pfatenhauer provides a wealth of coaching experience to the Wildcats coaching staff. He led Las Vegas' Faith Lutheran High School to state titles in 2003 and 2004 and was twice named the Nevada State High School Coach of the Year. In 2003 and 2007, Pfatenhauer earned Nevada State American Legion Coach of the Year honors.

Pfatenhauer began his coaching career at Glendale Community College in 1997. He went on to coach at Treasure Valley Community College in 1998 and College of Southern Nevada in 1999.

After coaching at Faith Lutheran from 2002-04, Pfatenhauer was hired at College of the Ozarks, an NAIA school.

Pfatenhauer was named the 1992 Southern Nevada High School Baseball Player of the Year as a senior and went on to star for two seasons at College of the Canyons, where he twice earned All-Conference honors. He completed his collegiate career at the University of Wyoming where he played for his current boss, Dave Taylor.

Pfatenhauer earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Nevada at Las Vegas in 2000 and then a master's degree from Southwest Baptist University in 2007. Pfatenhauer is engaged to be married to Ashley Miller. They have one daughter, Cadence.



MATT FONTENO - ASSISTANT COACH

Matt Fonteno joins the Chico State coaching staff after spending the last three seasons as an assistant coach at UNLV.

While with the Rebels, Fonteno worked primarily with the outfielders and base runners and also served as the first base coach. In 2006 Fonteno helped turn out All-Conference outfielder Keith Smith. Another of his outfielders earned All-Conference honors in 2007, while two others – Ryan Kowalski and Calvin Beamon - went on to play professionally.

Fonteno spent three years serving as an assistant coach at California Lutheran University in Thousand Oaks prior to his work at UNLV.

Fonteno's main responsibilities at Cal Lutheran included recruiting, batting instruction, outfielders, and base running. The Kingsmen finished second in their conference in each of his three years there.

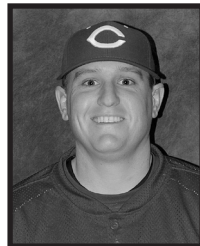
Fonteno managed the Battle Creek Bombers of the prestigious Northwoods League in the summer of 2008. That was his third foray into summer league baseball. In the summer of 2005 Fonteno was the associate head coach of the Petersburg Generals of the Coastal Plain League. Twelve players on that team were eventually drafted. The summer before that, in 2004, he served as an assistant coach for the Highland Park Blue Sox of the Texas Collegiate League. Twelve players went on to get drafted off that team as well, along with current major leaguers Hunter Pence (Houston Astros) and Mark Lowe (Seattle Mariners).

He earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in general studies in May of 2002 from York College. Fonteno is currently working on earning his master's degree in sports science from the United States Sports Academy.

THIS DATE IN WILDCAT BASEBALL HISTORY

February 6 - On this date in 2003, Steve Newson blasted a three-run homer as the Wildcats won their road opener 10-1 at Point Loma Nazarene. On this date in 2006, Daniel Code was named the CCAA Player of the Week. He homered twice and drove in 11 runs while the 'Cats opened the season with four wins in six games at Hawaii Pacific.

February 7 - On this date in 2004, Cody Smith drove in six runs as the Wildcats swept a doubleheader at Concordia 7-1 and 5-2.

February 8 - On this date in 2003, Brian Kroll flirted with a no-hitter before surrendering a single with two out in the final inning of Chico State's 9-0 victory at Concordia.

February 12 - On this date in 2006, the Wildcats wrapped up a hugely successful three-game trip to Las Vegas with a 12-5 win against regional rival and 15th-ranked Mesa State. Billy Spottiswood earned the win, Chico State's second straight against a nationally ranked team, and improved to 2-0 on the season.

February 13 - On this date in 2006, Daniel Code was named CCAA Player of the Week for the second week in a row. In three games in Las Vegas, Code hit .571 (8-14) and drove in eight runs.

February 14 - On this date in 1994, Lindsay Meggs got his first Chico State coaching victory as the Wildcats beat Cal State Dominguez Hills 6-5 in the season opener behind Scott Hoy's six shutout innings in relief.

February 20 - On this date in 2005, the Wildcats and Pomona split a doubleheader; the Broncos took the opener 5-4, but Chico State took the nightcap 2-1 as Kris Krise spun a five-hitter over eight innings.

February 21 - On this date in 2004, the Wildcats came from behind twice to break the hearts of rival Sonoma State. They trailed 9-2 in the opener before rallying for a 15-12 win on the strength of a six-run seventh and seven-run eighth. In the nightcap, Chico State trailed 8-3 before exploding for nine runs in the fourth. Joseph Ramos went 4-for-4 with six RBI.

February 22 - On this date in 2002, Adam Montarbo outdueled UC Davis ace Luke Steidelmeyer as the Wildcats took the CCAA opener for both teams 5-2.

February 27 - On this date in 1998, Chico State and UC Davis opened up the NCAC season with a bench-clearing shoving match that eventually led to both teams forfeiting the entire series. On this date in 2004, Wildcats righthander Brian Kroll took a shutout into the eighth inning but had to settle for a 3-1 win over San Francisco State.

February 28 - On this date in 2003, Ivan Hernandez tossed a shutout and struck out 12 to lift Chico State to a 3-0 win against rival UC Davis. On this date in 1999, Robb Rehfeld homered and delivered an RBI single in a five-run Wildcat seventh inning in a 7-2 win over Cal State Dominguez Hills.

March 1 - On this date in 2003, Robby Poole became the first player in Chico State history to hit for the cycle and drove in six runs as the Wildcats won a wild 18-11 affair over preseason CCAA favorite Sonoma State. On this date in 1997, the Wildcats beat Cal State Stanislaus 5-4 with a run in the bottom of the ninth to open a doubleheader, and then won Game Two 5-4 on Rich Gregory's walk-off homer in the eighth.

March 6 - On this date in 1999, Head Coach Lindsay Meggs collected his 200th career victory in a 7-1 win over San Bernardino.

March 7 - On this date in 2004, the Wildcats reached the low point of their campaign, falling to 11-10 after a four-game sweep at the hands of UC Davis. They were 11-10 at the time, but finished the season 42-21-1 and earned the first of three consecutive trips to the College World Series.

March 8 - On this date in 1997, Chico State came from behind to beat UC Davis twice, 9-8 and 12-9. In the opener, the Wildcats scored five runs in the final two frames to win 9-8 as Shane Howell drove in three runs. In Game Two, UC Davis led 9-5 before the Wildcats scored seven times in the sixth. Steve Gotowala and Howell finished the afternoon with five RBI each.

March 13 - On this date in 2004, Mike Jones and Nick Burger combined on a six-hitter and Jonathan Shepard scored the game-winner on a sixth inning sacrifice fly by Ryan Mathes in the 'Cats 3-2 win over Cal State Stanislaus.

March 14 - On this date in 2004, Brian Kroll was named the CCAA Pitcher of the Week. The senior ace fired a complete-game eight-hitter to lead Chico State to a 6-1 victory against Cal State Stanislaus to earn the nod.

March 15 - On this date in 1996, Tim Hairston swiped three bases for the second game in a row, and Tim Brockway went 5-for-5, as the Wildcats dispatched of Patten College 16-4.

March 20 - On this date in 2008, the Wildcats pounded out a school-record nine doubles in an 18-2 drubbing of Cal State Monterey Bay. Bret Ringer had three of the doubles, matching the Chico State record.

March 21 - On this date in 1998, Rich Gregory belted his 21st career home run, a Chico State record, as the Wildcats hammered Willamette 28-4, matching the school record for runs in a game.

March 22 - On this date in 1997, Willamette snapped Chico State's 15-game winning streak by winning the first of two games 7-6. The Wildcats came back in the nightcap, scoring 11 runs in the fifth to erase a 6-0 deficit in an 11-9 win.

March 26 - On this date in 1999, Doug Thomas was called out on an appeal to third base after scoring what appeared to be the tying run in the bottom of the seventh in a 5-4 loss to UC Davis.

March 27 - On this date in 2004, Jeff Walker moved into second on the school's career stolen base list with his 35th career steal in a 9-5 victory over Cal State L.A..

March 28 - On this date in 2001, Chico State Head Coach Lindsay Meggs collected his 300th career win in a 15-3 shellacking of Westmont. David Slatoff homered and Kurt Probasco doubled and knocked in three runs.

April 3 - On this date in 2004, the Wildcats beat up on Cal State Dominguez Hills, sweeping the Toros in a doubleheader by scores of 12-3 and 20-2. Brian Lucas had a combined six hits and six RBI on the day.

April 4 - On this date in 1998, Eric Turner pitched a five-hit shutout and struck out 12 against Cal State Stanislaus.

April 5 - On this date in 2006, the Wildcats went 2-for-14 with runners in scoring position, culminating in Chad Williams' strikeout with runners on second and third to end the game, in a 3-2 loss to Bethany.

April 7 - On this date in 2000, Chico State broke Sonoma State's hearts, coming from 6-2 down to send it into extra frames. Ryan Tash then led off the 10th with a triple and scored the winning run on Ryan Webb's single.

April 9 - On this date in 2001, the Wildcats held on to first place in the CCAA by salvaging a split with UC San Diego. The Tritons took the opener 5-3, handing Wildcats starter Kris Krise (8-1) his first loss of the season. But Chad Williams' two-run single ignited a five-run second for the Wildcats in the nightcap, and they went on to win 12-3.

April 10 - On this date in 2001, Miguel Mendoza banged out three hits and a pair of RBI as the Wildcats beat Hawaii-Pacific 6-4.

April 11 - On this date in 2003, John Moylan smashed a solo home run down the right field line in the bottom of the 11th inning to beat first-place UC San Diego 7-6. The game went extra frames after Steve Newson's three-run homer in the ninth tied it. In the second game of the doubleheader, Mike Nunes and Clark Johnson combined on a 4-0 shutout victory to move the Wildcats into a first-place tie with the Tritons in the race for the CCAA's regular season title.

April 17 - On this date in 2005, Jeff Walker notched his school-record 197th career hit, passing Kevin Miller's (1987-1990). Chico State beat Grand Canyon 10-3 to complete a four-game series sweep.

April 18 - On this date in 2004, Scott Thompson went 6-for-7 with three RBI to lift Chico State to a doubleheader sweep of host Hawaii Pacific. Thompson drove in the tying run and scored the winning run on a wild pitch in the Wildcats' 4-3 win in the first game. In the nightcap, starting pitcher Mike Jones's complete-game effort led the Wildcats to a 9-2 win.

April 19 - On this date in 2003, Chico State head coach Lindsay Meggs collected his 400th career victory as Freddy Larios and John Paluck hit back-to-back home runs during a 7-3 win against Cal State L.A. The Wildcats also clinched a spot in the CCAA Championship Tournament.

April 21 - On this date in 2001, Ryan Wulfert, a true freshman, etched his name into Chico State history with a 6-for-6 performance in the Wildcats' 9-8 win against Cal State L.A.. On this date in 2000, Ryan Watson drove in seven runs in a doubleheader sweep of Cal State L.A..

April 24 - On this date in 1999, Jason Cly won his ninth straight decision in an 8-1 win over Cal State L.A..

April 25 - On this date in 2004, the Chico State bullpen failed to protect a 7-3 lead when UC San Diego scored four in the seventh inning to tie and one in the bottom of the ninth to win it as the Tritons beat the Wildcats 8-7.

April 26 - On this date in 1997, Rich Gregory went 5-for-6 with two home runs and nine RBI as the Wildcats swept a crucial series with Sonoma State, giving the Wildcats a three-and-a-half game lead in the conference standings with just seven games to play.

May 1 - On this date in 2004, in what head coach Lindsay Meggs called one of his most disappointing days as a coach, the Wildcats went 0-for-17 with runners in scoring position in a two-game sweep at the hands of Cal Poly Pomona. The losses eliminated Chico State from regular-season CCAA championship contention.

May 2 - On this date in 2003, Chris Mendonsa and Jeff Walker scored in the bottom of the ninth, Walker on a passed ball, as the Wildcats rallied to win 2-1 at Cal State Dominguez Hills.

May 3 - On this date in 1997, Steve Gotowala homered twice in a 6-3 victory over Cal State Hayward. Jason Kicherer drove in five runs in a 10-6 victory in the second game of the doubleheader sweep that clinched Chico State's second straight NCAC title.

May 7 - On this date in 2004, the Wildcats claimed the CCAA Championship Tournament title with an 8-7 win against Sonoma State. Jonathan Shepard blasted a seventh-inning solo home run that proved to be the game-winner.

May 8 - On this date in 1999, Chico State beat Sonoma State to earn a spot in the inaugural CCAA Championship Tournament finale, but then lost the title to the Cossacks 13-8.

May 9 - On this date in 2002, Adam Montarbo fired his second complete-game of the season in Chico State's 3-0 CCAA Championship Tournament opening victory against San Bernardino. On this date in 1998, Eric Turner surrendered just one run and four hits in a complete-game effort as the Wildcats clinched a share of the NCAC title with a 4-1 victory over Cal State Stanislaus.

May 14 - On this date in 1998, Josh Osborn fired a complete-game five-hit shutout against Cal State L.A. in a 12-0 victory on opening day of the Western Regional.

May 15 - On this date in 2004, Chico State won its fifth regional title in eight years and advanced to the Division II College World Series with a 4-1 defeat of Sonoma State. The victory was the 450th of Lindsay Meggs's career. Joseph Ramos, 8-for-13 over the weekend, was named Tournament MVP.

May 16 - On this date in 1998, a two-hour and 42 minute rain delay could not slow down the Wildcats and West Regional MVP Doug Thomas as they hammered Sonoma State 13-6 to claim their second straight West Region title. On this date in 1997, Rich Gregory homered and drove in five runs as the Wildcats beat Mesa State 11-8 in their opening game of the Western Regional.

May 17 - On this date in 1997, Eric Christensen and Orin Hirschhorn drew bases-loaded walks in a three-run eighth that gave the Wildcats a 13-11 victory over Fort Hays State and left them just one win shy of their first ever trip to the College World Series in Montgomery, Alabama.

May 23 - On this date in 1998, West Georgia handed Wildcats All-American hurler Josh Osborn his first loss of the season, 5-2, to open the College World Series. On this date in 2006, the Wildcats jumped 19 spots to No. 5 in the national rankings heading into the College World Series.

May 24 - On this date in 1999, Chico State dumped Adelphi 11-3 in a second round winners' bracket game at the College World Series behind homers by Doug Thomas and Luis Sanchez.

May 25 - On this date in 1997, Chico State earned the program's first College World Series victory, beating SIU-Edwardsville 25-5. Brian Carlson had five hits and Dave Mallas had four hits and scored five runs.

May 26 - On this date in 2004, Wildcats closer Nick Burger was named a Second Team All-American after notching 14 saves.

May 27 - On this date in 2002, Brian Thomas tossed a complete-game five-hitter to key a 6-1 victory over Kutztown and leave the Wildcats one win away from the national title game. On this date in 1997, starting pitcher Josh Osborn went the distance as the Wildcats beat Tampa 5-3 to advance to the semifinals of the College World Series.

May 28 - On this date in 2006, Christopher Sweeney singled through a drawn-in infield to plate the winning run in the bottom of the ninth against Emporia State in a 2-1 opening round win at the College World Series.

May 29 - On this date in 1999, Chico State claimed its second national title in three years with an 11-5 victory over Kennesaw State. Jason Cly earned the win to improve to 12-4, and Brian Grover got the save. On this date in 1997, the Wildcats advanced to their first ever national title game with a 4-2 victory over Kennesaw State. Steve Gotowala's two-run double in the seventh gave the Wildcats the lead for good.

May 30 - On this date in 2000, Chico State starting pitcher John-Eric Hernandez was named First Team All-American after finishing the season 10-1 with a 3.46 ERA. On this date in 2006, the Wildcats beat Ashland University 8-4 in 13 innings in a second round winners' bracket game at the College World Series. It was the longest postseason game in Chico State history.

UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT - DR. PAUL J. ZINGG

Dr. Paul J. Zingg, California State University, Chico's 15th president, is in his fifth year of service at the University. CSU, Chico, one of 23 campuses in The California State University System, is a comprehensive, four-year University whose motto "Today Decides Tomorrow" guides 16,000 students.

Prior to being named president at CSU, Chico, Zingg was provost and vice president for academic affairs at California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo from 1995 to 2004. Before that he served as the dean of the College of Liberal Arts at Cal Poly, 1993-1995.

Zingg served as dean of the School of Liberal Arts at Saint Mary's College of California from 1986-1993. Previously, he spent several years at the University of Pennsylvania, serving as assistant to the president from 1984-1986, as an American Council on Education Fellow in Academic Administration and special assistant to the president in 1983-1984, and as vice dean of the School of Arts and Sciences, 1979-1983.

Zingg received his Ph.D. in history in 1974 from the University of Georgia, Athens; an M.A. in history in 1969 from the University of Richmond, Virginia; and a B.A. in history in 1968 from Belmont Abbey College, North Carolina.

He has published ten books and nearly 100 articles on American higher education, student learning, educational leadership, sports history, and intercollegiate athletics. He has also acted as a sports history consultant to several presses, the media, museum curators, and on Ken Burns' acclaimed television documentary series, *Baseball*, in 1994.



ATHLETIC DIRECTOR - ANITA BARKER

Anita Barker is in her seventh year as the athletic director for the University's 13 intercollegiate athletics teams. Barker has successfully worked to build on the prior success of the program and continues to focus on improving fund raising and marketing efforts to offer more athletic grant-in-aid to deserving student-athletes.

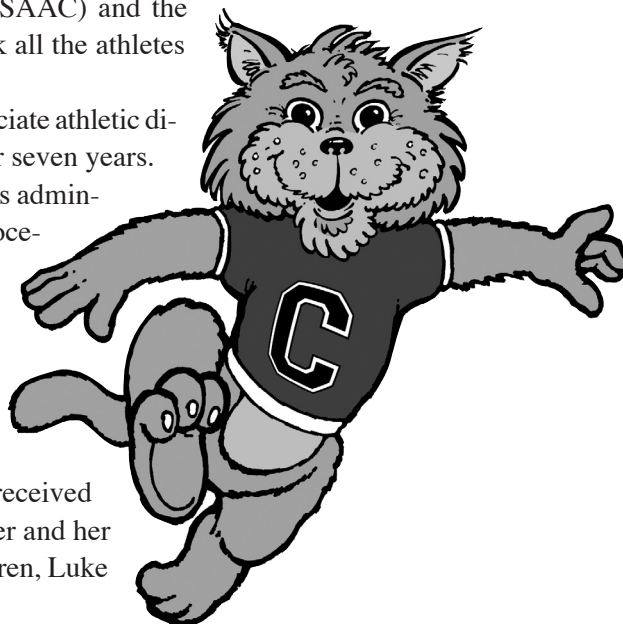
During the 2007-08 school year, Barker helped direct the athletic department to its fifth straight top 25 finish in the U.S. Sports Academy Division II Directors' Cup, which measures the overall success of the more than 280 Division II athletic programs in the United States. It was the sixth time in the last seven years the Wildcats have finished in the top 25. The Wildcats finished in the top ten in 2003-04, 2004-05, and 2005-06.

A priority of Barker's is to continue to improve the student-athlete experience at Chico State, and that is being accomplished through a focus on the Student Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC) and the implementation of fall kickoff and spring wrap up barbecues to thank all the athletes who give so much to the University.

Prior to her current position, Barker served as the University's associate athletic director alongside athletic director Don Batie, who held the position for seven years.

As associate athletic director, Barker served as the senior women's administrator, supervised staff, and developed departmental policy and procedures, among numerous other duties. Barker has worked in the athletic department since 1990, when she was hired as the assistant athletic trainer. She began working in athletic administration in 1995, when she was appointed the assistant athletic director and senior women's administrator. In 1997, she was promoted to associate athletic director.

Barker graduated from Ohio Northern University in 1985 and received her master's from the University of Arizona in Tuscon in 1987. Barker and her husband, Scott, the head athletic trainer at Chico State, have two children, Luke and McKena.

Rarely does one find a single setting which combines the best of location, setting, tradition, opportunity, and people. Chico State is one of those special places. Despite an enrollment of about 16,000 students, Chico State strikes a balance between the warm, social atmosphere of a small campus and the educational and cultural opportunities of a large school.

Chico is located 90 miles north of Sacramento, eight miles from the Sacramento River, and two miles from the foothills of the Sierra Nevada. Several creeks flow through the community, including Big Chico Creek, which winds through a canopy of trees across the Chico State campus and downtown Chico. The campus was declared an arboretum in 1982, an indication of the desire to preserve and enhance its natural beauty. The city of Chico is the proprietor of Bidwell Park, which, with its 3,600 acres, is one of the largest municipal parks in the nation. An 18-hole golf course; softball diamonds; picnic areas; equestrian, jogging, mountain biking and hiking trails; and natural swimming holes along the creek, among other recreational facilities, are available.

The atmosphere on the Chico State campus is determined in part by its rural setting. The general openness and friendliness found in the campus community sometimes surprises those familiar with larger, more urban campuses. This openness extends to academic matters, where students find that their professors are accessible to them, that instructors are willing to spend time with them on an individual basis, and that Chico State is a place where teaching and learning really matter.

Chico's 16,000 students are divided about equally between men and women. Eighty-five percent are full-time students. Eighty percent come from hometowns over 100 miles from Chico. Seventy-six percent live within walking or bicycling distance of campus. Over half receive letters of acceptance from other colleges but choose Chico's dynamic intellectual and social environment.

The university has a traditionally strong and varied academic instructional program. Chico's library contains more than 950,000 books, serial back files, electronic documents and government documents; 23,117 current serial subscriptions; and 1.27 million historical photos, maps, and other items in archives. Facilities for music, drama, and art enable students to participate in cultural and educational experiences. A planetarium, working farm, two satellite telecommunications broadcast antennae, and a rich complement of laboratories, computers, and other modern equipment help students test and confirm theoretical learning. The university sponsors more than 240 student organizations. Over 500 cultural festivals, exhibits, concerts, and other public events occur on campus each year.

The appeal of athletics at Chico State is the opportunity for student-athletes to participate at a high level of competition while pursuing a quality education. The overriding factor in Chico's athletic success is the *Chico Experience*: an almost undefinable mood which makes the student-athlete perceive Chico as "home," not just a place to go to school. This factor, along with excellent coaching and fine facilities, has contributed to Chico's presence in the Division II rankings in many sports, as well as giving student-athletes a memorable experience of their time spent at Chico State.
