Men's basketball poised to take big steps in 2019–20

It's generally understood that the Chico State men's basketball program was undergoing a rebuild during the 2018–19 season. Only two players with starting experience returned to a program that had lost its three leading scorers to graduation. The team's youth and inexperience, and a rash of injuries, took their toll during an up-and-down 9-14 campaign. The Wildcats finished 10th in the California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA) and missed the postseason for the first time in nine years.

With four starters and eight of 11 letterwinners returning, the question now is whether the 2019–20 campaign will mark another step in the rebuilding process, or if the foundation that has been laid will be a cornerstone that another CCAA and NCAA Tournament run as soon as this coming March can be assembled upon.

The CCAA's coaches appear to be wondering the same, having ranked Chico State No. 6 out of 13 teams in the annual Preseason Coaches' Poll. Head Coach Greg Clink is also curious to discover just how good his team can be.

He expects this season to be a "continuance of the rebuilding process." But he's also hoping for a postseason push, with another season of experience under the belts of Second-Team All-CCAA forward Malik Duffy, Honorable Mention All-CCAA point guard Isaiah Brooks, last year's leading scorer, Kevin Warren, and the return of big man Justin Briggs from injury.

"We have the potential to be pretty good," Clink said. "You get a year older. You get a year wiser. You become more mature. But again, there are a handful of guys who haven't played a ton of minutes that we're counting on."

The team's only two seniors, Briggs and Keith Datu, are returning after injuries cut short their junior campaigns. Briggs' 31 career starts are the most among the program's active players. Brooks started 22 games last season, and Warren and Duffy 21 apiece.

Calvin Geraci (two starts last season), Spencer LaShells (one), Josh Lavergne (one), and Joshua Curls also return. Eight Wildcats will be new additions to the program: Redshirt freshmen Kelvin Wright, Jr., Joshua Hamilton, Amari Stroud, and Andrew Parker; sophomore Brennan Wheeler (who missed 2018–19 due to injury); true freshman Julian Vaughns; and junior college transfers Colby Orr and Trenton Mitchell. Vaughns and Mitchell will redshirt this season.

The team's relative youth and inexperience isn't keeping its returning core from setting high expectations.

"You've got a group of guys—the junior class specifically—that feels some expectations from themselves to have a good year. They've seen the guys ahead of them and the success they had through the years and they feel the expectation to live up to that.

They want to experience the same success those guys had," Clink said. "So, they are putting a lot of expectations on themselves to perform well. You hear them talk about it."

Brooks is perhaps the most vocal member of that crew. Coming off a sophomore campaign in which he ranked second in the CCAA in assist-to-turnover ratio and third in assists per game, the athletic junior is ready to put his stamp on the program as its general, both on and off the floor.

"He wants his legacy to be similar to that of Jay Flores, Michael Rosaroso, Jalen McFerren, Giordano Estrada, and all of the great point guards that have come through this program," Clink said. "He's seen the guys who have gone before him win big and he wants to experience the same type of success."

Duffy established himself as one of the CCAA's most gifted big men last season, averaging 10.1 points and 6.6 rebounds while establishing an ability to score from outside the arc and in the paint. Warren led the team in scoring and came on strong toward the end of the season, averaging 14.1 points per game over the last 10. Briggs was averaging 8.8 points, 7.4 rebounds, and more than a blocked shot per game. He enters his final season needing 32 more rejections to become the program's all-time leading shot blocker.

But Clink and the 'Cats understand that it will take more than just those four for the Wildcats to have the success they crave.

That will require important contributions from fellow returners Geraci, LaShells, LaVergne, and Curls, along with the team's exciting newcomers.

"We are counting on a lot of young guys to step up and make a difference early in their career," Clink said.

Right now, Clink is especially focused on the defensive side of the ball.

"We've been focusing a lot of our time and energy on the defensive end because I think this team could be special defensively because of our size and quickness," Clink said. "We just need to continue to improve."

That size and quickness was apparent during Chico State's two exhibition games in Arizona. They grabbed 19 offensive rebounds in an 84-74 win at Arizona Christian and then gave the 17th-ranked University of Arizona all it could handle before falling 74-65. Arizona Head Coach Sean Miller mentioned Chico State's size as something his team struggled to deal with during his postgame comments.

Seven Wildcats measure 6-feet-7 or taller.

"Our size is one of our advantages," said Clink. "We not only have big guys but we have some big guys who can really move. They are all bigs with a lot of quickness and agility. They can do things inside and on the perimeter. They can defend multiple positions, and they give us an advantage on the boards."

According to Clink, they also have the ingredients that it takes to build something special.

"They're really coachable. They're really eager. I like our depth and I like the character of our team," said Clink. "They are good guys who are doing a good job in the classroom. I really like what I've seen so far."

Head Coach Greg Clink

Greg Clink is in his 12th season as the head coach of the Chico State men's basketball program. Since taking over the reins over a decade ago, the former Wildcats player and assistant coach has established Chico State as one of the premier Division II programs in the nation, leading the 'Cats to nine postseason appearances—including six NCAA Championship Tournament berths—while claiming two NCAA West Region titles and three California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA) regular season championships.

Clink enters the 2019–20 season with a career 206-117 record in his 11 years as Wildcat head coach, and over the last seven seasons his teams have gone 168-72—an impressive .700 winning percentage.

Under Clink's tutelage, several Chico State men's basketball players have earned individual recognition, racking up a combined 34 postseason conference awards, nine All-West Region selections and three All-America honors. Clink himself has been named the CCAA Coach of the Year three times, winning the award in 2011–12 and back-to-back in 2014–15 and 2015–16.

In an injury-riddled season that also saw the team's entire pre-conference schedule cancelled due to Paradise's devastating Camp Fire, Clink steered the Wildcats to a 9-14 record in 2018–19. Malik Duffy averaged 10.1 points a game and hit a career-high 43 3-pointers to earn Second Team All-CCAA honors, while teammate Isaiah Brooks (11.1 points a game, 94 assists, and 40 3-pointers) received All-CCAA Honorable Mention.

On December 19, 2018, Clink recorded his 200th career Chico State coaching victory as the Wildcats defeated Dominican 74-61.

Clink led the Wildcats to a 20-8 record and second place finish in the CCAA in 2017–18, reaching the conference tournament for the seventh straight season. The 'Cats posted the seventh-best defense among all Division II schools, holding opponents to just 64.5 points a game. Seniors Jalen McFerren, Isaiah Ellis, and Corey Silverstrom each earned All-CCAA honors and eclipsed the 1,000-point career plateau—a feat only 16 Wildcats had ever previously accomplished, and never three teammates in the same season.

On the strength of a 26-8 record (the most single season wins in the 103-year history of the men's basketball program), the Wildcats reached the NCAA Championship

Tournament Elite 8 for the second time in four years in 2016–17. Clink's squad swept its way to the West Region title with wins over nationally-ranked Western Washington, Hawaii Pacific, and UC San Diego to earn a trip to Sioux Falls, South Dakota, to compete for the national crown.

Clink guided Chico State to a 22-7 record in 2015–16, topping the CCAA standings for the second straight season and earning the program's fifth consecutive NCAA Championship Tournament appearance. The Wildcats posted the fifth-best defense among all Division II schools (holding opponents to just 64.9 points a game) and finished the year ranked 20th in the final National Association of Basketball Coaches poll.

The Clink-led 'Cats recorded a 22-8 record in 2014–15, capturing the CCAA regular season championship. In postseason play, Chico State reached the CCAA Tournament final before making its fourth consecutive NCAA Championship Tournament appearance. The Wildcats' defense held opposing teams to an average of just 60.7 points a game in 2014-15, ranking fourth in the nation.

The 2013–14 season was one of the most exciting and successful in Chico State history. Clink piloted the Wildcats to a 25-8 record and a third place finish in the CCAA. But it was in postseason play that the 'Cats really shined—after reaching the finals of the CCAA Tournament, the Wildcats won three straight to claim the NCAA West Regional title and advance to the NCAA Championship Tournament Elite 8 for the first time in the program's history.

Clink's 2012–13 Chico State squad notched a 19-11 overall record, and thanks to a nine-game winning streak down the stretch, finished third in the conference. The 'Cats reached the CCAA Tournament finals for the second straight year, earning a second consecutive invitation to the NCAA Championship Tournament.

The 2011–12 season was a memorable one for Clink and the Wildcats. Chico State finished 25-8 and hoisted the program's first conference championship banner since 1994. The 'Cats reached the CCAA Tournament final and competed in the NCAA Championship Tournament for the first time since 2005. Chico State topped off its incredible season by logging the program's first NCAA Tournament victory in over 50 years.

Clink led Chico State to a 14-13 record in 2010–11, as the team made its second consecutive CCAA Tournament appearance.

Clink's 2009–10 Wildcats posted a 16-13 record, doubling the team's win output from the previous year and delivering the program's first winning season since 2004–05.

In his first year at the helm, Clink installed a gritty, fast-paced style of play and guided the 'Cats to an 8-19 record in 2008–09—the most wins posted by a Wildcat squad in three years.

The 11th head coach in the 103-year history of Chico State men's basketball, Clink was no stranger to the Wildcats' program when he replaced 21-year coaching legend Puck Smith. Playing under Smith, Clink was part of three Chico State conference title teams from 1992–94, earning a trip to the NCAA Championship Tournament West Regional in 1992–93 and the team's Most Inspirational Player award his senior year. Clink served as an assistant coach under Smith from 1994–96.

Clink joined the UC Davis coaching staff for the 1996–97 season as an assistant to Bob Williams. The Aggies finished 20-9 that year, winning the Northern California Athletic Conference crown and advancing to the NCAA Championship Tournament. After spending the 1997–98 season as head coach at Gavilan Community College (where he played his first two years of college ball), Clink rejoined Williams' staff when the former Aggie boss was named head coach at UC Santa Barbara.

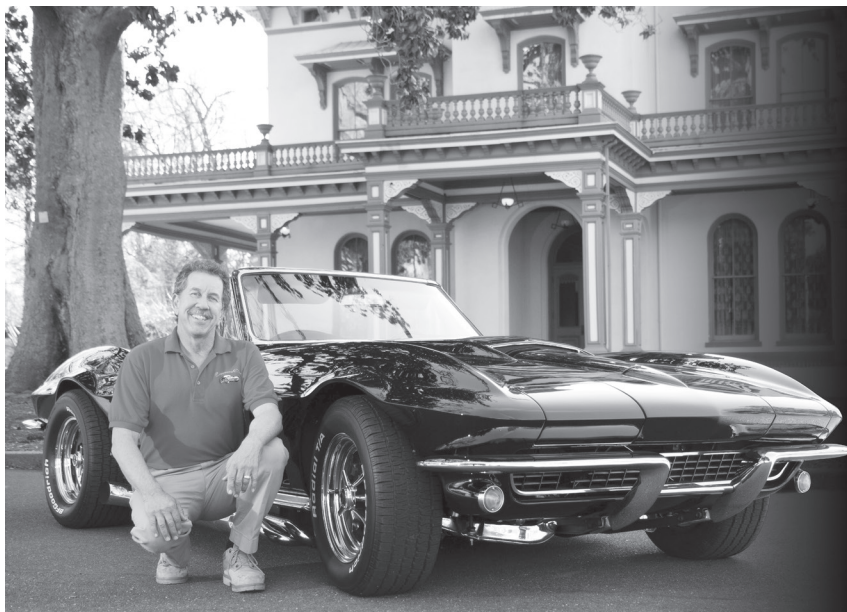
Clink began his second stint as an assistant coach at UC Davis in 2000. He served as the Aggies' associate head coach in 2006 before taking over the Chico State men's basketball program in April, 2008.

A 1994 Chico State graduate, Clink received a bachelor's degree in physical education. He earned his master's degree in physical education at Chico State in 2000.

Clink and his wife, Courtney, have three sons: twins Justin and Tyler, and younger brother Ryan.

Mark Darnall—Assistant Coach

Mark Darnall is in his third season as part of the Chico State men's basketball coaching staff. Greg Clink's top assistant has played an integral part in the program's success, helping guide the Wildcats to 29 wins and a postseason appearance in the past two years.

Darnall brought nearly a decade of coaching experience to Chico when he joined the 'Cats staff in 2017–18. The Lake Mills, Wisconsin native spent the 2016–17 campaign as an assistant at the University of Wisconsin-Platteville, and from 2011–16 served as assistant coach and director of basketball operations at UC Davis.

During Darnall's tenure, UC Davis captured its inaugural Big West championship in 2015, earning the program's first Division I postseason appearance when the Aggies appeared in the National Invitation Tournament. UC Davis ended the season as national three-point champions, shooting a blistering .447 clip from behind the arc—the highest single-season three-point percentage since the three-point line was moved back in 2009.

Prior to his stint at UC Davis, Darnall served as a video coordinator at Bradley University (2010–11) and was an assistant coach at Peoria Christian High School for the 2009–10 season.

Darnall played collegiately at Eureka College in Illinois, where he led the Red Devils in scoring and shot 41.4 percent from three-point territory in 2007–08. He was named to the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Honors Court for his achievements on the hardwood and in the classroom.

Darnall earned his bachelor's degree in sports management in 2009 and his master's degree in sports management from Illinois State in 2011.

Thomas Ammon—Assistant Coach

Thomas Ammon is in his third season as a member of the Chico State men's basketball coaching staff. In his first two years under Greg Clink, the North State native has helped the Wildcats win 29 games and reach postseason play in 2017–18.

Ammon joined the Wildcats after spending four seasons as an assistant coach at Fresno City College. From 2013–17, he helped guide the Rams to four straight Central Valley Conference (CVC) titles, two postseason trips to the California Junior College Elite Eight and one California Community College Athletic Association (CCCAA) Final Four appearance.

University President Gayle Hutchinson

An accomplished former professor and dean, President Gayle Hutchinson returned to Chico State in June 2016 after working for three years as provost and vice president for Academic Affairs at CSU, Channel Islands. She is Chico State's 15th president and the first female president in the University's 132-year history.

Hutchinson built her career in higher education at Chico State, where she was hired in 1990 as a member of the Chico State faculty and taught kinesiology with a specialty in teacher preparation. She went on to serve as chair of the Department of Kinesiology from 2002–07 and dean of the College of Behavioral and Social Sciences from 2007–13, and she participated in the prestigious American Council on Education Fellows program from 2005–06. She was elected Academic Senate chair in 2006 and also served as statewide senator from 2003–05,

and she chaired the Diversity Scorecard Committee responsible for drafting the University's Diversity Action Plan.

Prior to her service in the CSU, she served as the principal investigator and co-director of the Northern California Physical Education-Health Subject Matter Project, the project director for the Pacific Wellness Center, and developed curriculum and taught physical education in elementary schools. Hutchinson's scholarship and grant writing focused on teacher socialization, social psychology of sport, comprehensive school-based wellness programs, and equity in sport and physical education.

Hutchinson holds a bachelor's degree in physical education teacher education from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst; a master's degree in teaching analysis and curriculum development from Teachers College, Columbia University; and a doctorate in teacher education and staff development from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst.



Athletic Director Anita Barker

Anita Barker is in her 18th year as the athletic director for the University's 13 intercollegiate athletics teams. Barker has successfully worked to build on the prior success of the department and continues to focus on improving fundraising and marketing efforts to offer more athletic grant-in-aid to deserving student-athletes. She also served as president of the Division II Athletics Directors Association from 2012–14.

Under Barker's guidance, 2018–19 produced another outstanding year for Chico State Athletics. The Wildcats claimed California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA) titles in men's cross country, women's cross country, and men's track and field, with softball and women's soccer posting second place conference finishes. The Chico State baseball and women's track and field programs netted third place CCAA finishes as 10 teams advanced to

postseason competition over the course of the year.

The Chico State men's cross country team won the NCAA West Regional title, while men's golf and men's track and field finished No. 1 in the 2018–19 NCAA West Region rankings.

With eight sports reaching the NCAA Championships, the Wildcats finished 48th among all Division II schools in the final 2018–19 Learfield Sports Directors' Cup standings. Chico State has finished in the top five of the Directors' Cup standings five times since 2004–05, and in all but two years of that run has ranked among the top 10 percent of D-II athletic departments nationwide.

With Barker leading the way, Chico State Athletics has been the recipient of five CCAA Robert J. Hiebert Commissioners' Cups over the past decade. The award is presented to the conference's member institution with the best overall athletics performance during the academic year.

Barker's efforts have resulted in several well-deserved individual honors, including National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) Division II West Region Athletic Director of the Year awards in 2009 and again in 2019.

Barker has worked in the athletics department since 1990, when she was hired as the assistant athletic trainer. She began working in athletics administration in 1995, when she was appointed the assistant athletic director and senior women's administrator. In 1997, she was promoted to associate athletic director.

Barker graduated from Ohio Northern University in 1985 and received her master's degree from the University of Arizona in Tucson in 1987. She has worked at all three divisions in the NCAA.

Barker and her husband, Scott, the Wildcats' head athletic trainer, have two children, Luke and McKena—both former Chico State student-athletes.

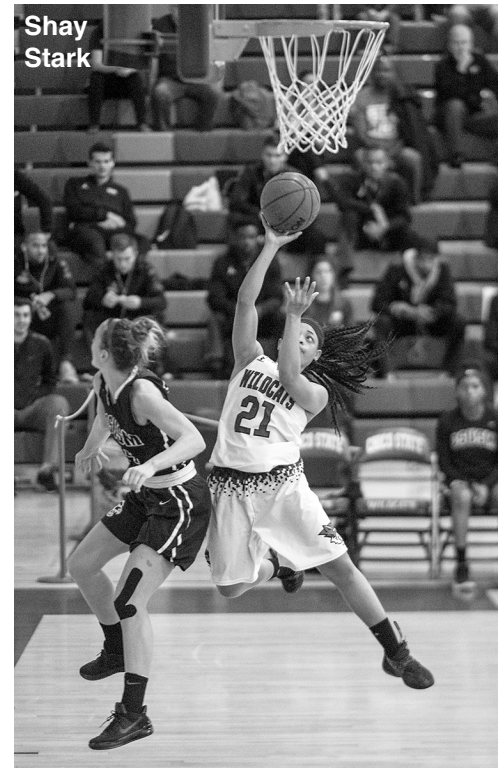

Wildcats to use the fast track to return to winning ways in 2019–20

As far as worst-case scenarios go, the end of the 2018–19 Chico State women's basketball season ranks right up there as one of the most frustrating a team could experience. Heading into the final month of play the Wildcats were sitting pretty, with a 12-5 record, a share of third place in the California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA) standings, and five of its last eight games taking place in the friendly confines of Acker Gym. Any sort of decent finish would assure the program's third consecutive postseason appearance.

Instead, the unthinkable happened. The bottom completely fell out of the 'Cats' 2018–19 campaign.

Chico State ended the season on an eight-game losing streak, which included three overtime defeats as well as agonizing one- and four-point losses. The Wildcats not only finished below .500 with an overall 12-13 record, but were left on the outside looking in by failing to qualify for the CCAA and NCAA Tournaments.

Brian Fogel, now in his 12th year as Chico State head coach, doesn't have to search hard for a word to sum up the 'Cats' finish. "Disappointing," he said on the eve of the team's 2019–20 season. "It was extremely disappointing to be so close, to have things within our control, and not be able to finish the job."

But rather than dwell on the negative, Fogel and his players have turned the page and are using last season as an incentive to reestablish the program's winning tradition.

"If you look at it over a long period of time, it's just a stretch in a season," Fogel said. "It just happened to come at the time when we needed to nail things down.

"A lot of teachable moments resulted. We've built some character from (last season's finish), and our 10 returning players have gained invaluable experience. They're looking at this season as a new opportunity."

During its fall practices—and a competitive exhibition game against Division I University of San Francisco—the 2019–20 edition of the Wildcats has Fogel feeling the program is back on the right track.

Fogel has loaded up on fast guards and perimeter players, and that backcourt depth could keep opponents scrambling and backpedaling all season long.

"I think our speed and quickness is going to bother some people," Fogel said. "We're not a particularly big team at all, but we feel that we have five or six wings that can play at any given time. When we figure out the rotation and which player combinations work best, teams are going to have trouble keeping up with us."

One of the most significant additions to the 'Cats' attack is junior point guard Daisha Abdelkader, a transfer from Pleasant Hill's Diablo Valley College.

"Daisha is extremely quick. She's the fastest player on our team, and that's saying something when you have (returners) Maddy Wong and Shay Stark out there," Fogel said. "Daisha has a really good feel for the game. She'll disrupt things on the defensive end,

and on offense her style is a lot like (NBA Hall of Famer) Steve Nash. She'll get to the basket, but she won't pick the ball up. She'll continue to dribble it and find avenues to pass to different people. When we learn how to adjust to her style of play, that's going to really help players get some shot opportunities that weren't available in years past."

Abdelkader will have plenty of shooters to feed in the lightning-fast offensive attack that Fogel envisions. Entering her final season as a Wildcat, Wong averaged a career-high 10.8 points a game in 2018–19 and ranked third among all conference players with 66 3-point field goals, earning All-CCAA honors.

"Maddy will primarily be running from the wing, and hopefully that will free her up for more 3-point shooting opportunities," Fogel said. "That will help extend defenses and also create driving opportunities for her teammates."

A junior this season, Stark also garnered All-CCAA recognition in 2018–19 by averaging a team-high 11.4 points a game and leading the conference in free throw percentage (82.8 percent).

"Shay's a drive first, shoot second kind of player," Fogel said. "We want to get her in the open court; maybe get her with the ball off a screen to allow her to attack the basket more often than not. We're really looking for her to take a big step forward this season."

Junior Vanessa Holland, who has drained 63 treys as a Wildcat, will be asked to take on additional scoring duties in 2019–20.

"Vanessa has been one of the program's most consistent 3-point shooters for the past couple of seasons, but this year we want her to contribute even more," Fogel said. "I really believe that the way we're going to play, she's going to get some better opportunities to get her feet set and launch some 3's."

Sophomore Myli Martinez will provide the 'Cats with some hard-nosed play on both ends of the floor, and she gives Chico State another legitimate scoring option.

"Myli's a tough kid. She loves to mix it up, and isn't afraid to drive to the basket," Fogel said. "She's worked hard on her shot this summer, and if we can rely on her to score consistently, it'll make us even more of a threat from the perimeter."

With a year of Division II experience under their belts, sophomores Bailey Jones and Mikaela Bismillah are also primed to supply the Wildcats with some valuable minutes in the backcourt. Junior Brynn Thoming is another 3-point shooting threat who can also post up and provide the 'Cats with some physical play near the hoop.

The undersized Wildcats will face challenges in the rebounding department this season. But Fogel feels he's got the talent to compete down low—all he needs is for his "bigs" to execute.

Junior forward Hannah Washington could play a huge role in the Wildcats' fortunes. "I think she is capable of averaging 10 points and six to seven rebounds a game," Fogel said. "If we can get that sort of consistent production from Hannah, that would be outstanding. She worked hard over the summer and is in the best shape she's ever been since joining the program."

Fogel feels sophomore forward Mikaila Wegenke will be one of the big beneficiaries of the Wildcats' revved-up offense. "Because we're playing faster, I think she'll have more opportunities to drive to the basket," he said. "We'll still need her to post up a little bit inside so we maintain a presence down low. But we're looking for her to shoot her 15-16 foot jump shot and take people off the dribble."

Sophomore Haley Ison also figures to be an asset down on the low block. "Haley's not super-big by any means, but she's a strong player who'll provide some toughness in the paint," Fogel said. "We'll need her to rebound, move the ball, set good screens. If Haley can do that, it would be very beneficial to our attack."

The Wildcats will also utilize the talents of a pair of true freshmen in 2019–20. Forward Caylee Hermanson (Tustin High School) and guard Jasmine Hess (Cosumnes Oaks High School in Elk Grove) have already proven they can keep up with the 'Cats' go-go style of play, and can compete and contribute at the Division II level.

Fogel promises an exciting, swarming style of play by the Wildcats on the defensive end. "It's going to be predominantly man-to-man," he said. "We're going to try to pick up and pressure the ball all over the place, and try to make people as uncomfortable as we possibly can."

Chico State has the pieces in place to quickly put last season's finish in the "file and forget" department and deliver an exciting brand of basketball that will once again make the Wildcats a postseason contender.

"We have to put in a 40-minute effort, night in and night out," Fogel said. "We need to keep from turning the ball over, make people uncomfortable, stay close in rebounding, shoot a better percentage from the foul line than we did last year, and just have an attitude that we're never going to die—we're going to keep clawing and scratching and fighting until the end. For us, we just want to be able to feel good about ourselves every time we take the floor."

Head Coach Brian Fogel

Brian Fogel is in his 12th season as Head Coach of the Chico State women's basketball team. Since taking over the program in 2008–09, Fogel has continued the Wildcats' long tradition of excellence, compiling a 178-130 record, a California Collegiate Athletic Association (CCAA) title, eight postseason appearances, and four NCAA Championship Tournament berths. Entering the 2019–20 season, Fogel boasts a career record of 267-179 in 16 years as an NCAA head coach.

Several Chico State players have been recognized for their individual efforts under Fogel's tenure. Over his 11 seasons at the helm, the Wildcats have boasted 28 All-CCAA honors, four All-West Region recipients, one All-America, and one NCAA Woman of the Year finalist. Fogel himself was named the CCAA Coach of the Year in 2012–13.

Fogel piloted Chico State to a 12-13 record in 2018–19, coming up just short of a CCAA Tournament berth. Forward McKena Barker, who finished her Chico State career ranked fourth in program history in rebounds (771) and fifth in double-doubles (22), earned Second Team All-CCAA honors and was named the *Chico Enterprise-Record* Female Senior Athlete of the Year. Team scoring leader Shay Stark (11.4 points a game) and Madison Wong (10.8 points a game, 66 3-pointers) each received All-CCAA Honorable Mentions.

Fogel led Chico State to a 17-11 record and a fourth place CCAA finish in 2017–18. The Wildcats returned to postseason play for the second straight year, reaching the semifinals of the CCAA Tournament. Senior guard Whitney Branham capped off a tremendous Wildcat career, leading the CCAA in scoring and free throw percentage to earn First Team All-CCAA honors, while becoming Chico State's all-time 3-point shooter with 208 buckets from behind the arc. Senior forward Kayla Taylor was a Second Team All-CCAA selection, with Barker named All-CCAA Honorable Mention.

Fogel guided the Wildcats to a 15-12 record in 2016–17 to reach the postseason for the first time in three years. Branham earned First Team All-CCAA honors, while Taylor was an All-CCAA Honorable Mention.

The Fogel-led Wildcats were 19-10 in 2013–14, finishing second in the CCAA. Ranked fourth in the West Region, Chico State earned its 10th trip to the NCAA Championship Tournament in 12 seasons and advanced to the West Region semifinals.

Chico State claimed the program's 12th conference crown in 2012–13, finishing atop the CCAA standings and posting an overall 23-6 record, matching Fogel's highest single season win total as Wildcats coach. In postseason play, the 'Cats reached the semifinals of the CCAA Championship Tournament and were one of three CCAA schools to advance to the NCAA Championship Tournament.

Fogel's 2011–12 Wildcats won their final five regular season games to finish the season with an 18-11 record. Chico State's postseason was highlighted by a road victory over rival Humboldt State in the opening round of the CCAA Tournament and an NCAA Championship Tournament berth.

Despite battling injuries and a lineup that at times featured four freshmen on the floor, Fogel steered Chico State to a 15-12 record in 2010–11, earning another postseason appearance.

Chico State's 2009–10 season was one of the program's most exciting in years. Just a game over .500 midway through the season, Fogel rallied the Wildcats to a huge finish. Between January 23 and March 2, 2010, the 'Cats won 10 straight games and 13 of 14 to post a 23-10 overall record and a third place CCAA finish. The late-season surge vaulted Chico State into postseason play, where the Wildcats came within one victory of capturing the CCAA Tournament title before reaching the NCAA Championship Tournament's Sweet 16 with West Regional victories over Western Washington and Humboldt State.

In his first year as head coach, Fogel led Chico State to a 16-13 record in 2008–09. Despite playing with just two returning starters, Fogel led the 'Cats to the CCAA Tournament semifinals.

Fogel served as a Chico State assistant coach in 2007–08, helping lead the Wildcats to a school record-tying 28 wins. He was named the fifth head coach in the program's history August 4, 2008.

Prior to coming to Chico, Fogel served as head coach of the UC Davis men's basketball program, posting an 89-49 record over five seasons and making two trips to the NCAA Championship Tournament. His 1999–2000 Aggies squad advanced all the

way to the Sweet 16.

Fogel's coaching career began in the 1989–90 season, immediately following his graduation from Sonoma State. He helped coach his alma mater to a Northern California Athletic Conference (NCAC) title and NCAA Tournament berth. After assisting at UC Berkeley the following season, Fogel moved on to become an assistant coach at San Francisco State, where he helped the Gators bump their win total from seven to 21 in three seasons and advance to the NCAA Championship Tournament.

Fogel's first head coaching assignment came in 1994–95 at Skyline Community College, where his team compiled a 16-14 record and advanced to the Northern California Regional Championships. He joined the UC Davis staff for the 1995–96 season and the Aggies were 164-66 during his tenure there.

An All-NCAC player while at Sonoma State, Fogel still ranks sixth on the school's career 3-pointers list with 141 (in just 56 games) and fourth in career 3-point shooting percentage (.429). He played his first two years of collegiate ball at Santa Monica College.

Fogel earned his bachelor's degree in physical education from Sonoma State in 1990 and his master's degree in health, physical education, and recreation from Saint Mary's College in 1992.

Fogel and his wife, Kerry, have two daughters, Katrina and Brooke. This fall Brooke is completing a four-year career as a member of the Chico State volleyball team.

Meghan de los Reyes—Assistant Coach

The 2019–20 season marks the second year for Meghan de los Reyes as a member of the Chico State women's basketball coaching staff.

Before joining head coach Brian Fogel in 2018–19, De los Reyes logged three successful seasons as an assistant coach at Southern Oregon. Working with head coach Alex Carlson, de los Reyes helped lead the Raiders to a combined 88-12 record, two Cascade Collegiate Conference titles, and three trips to the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) Division II Championship Tournament, including an appearance in the 2015–16 tournament title game.

Prior to her stint at Southern Oregon, de los Reyes spent four years at Hoosac Valley High School in Cheshire, Massachusetts. From 2011 to 2015, she served as a physical education teacher and was an assistant coach for a Hurricanes program that played in two state title games.

de los Reyes began her coaching career in 2008–09 as an assistant at Alaska Anchorage and helped guide the Seawolves to a program-record 31 wins and an NCAA Division II Championship Tournament Final Four appearance.

As an undergraduate, de los Reyes was a practice player at Boston College, but used her final year of NCAA eligibility to play at Alaska Anchorage. In her lone season with the Seawolves (2006–07), de los Reyes appeared in 29 games, averaging 4.4 points a contest and ranking third on the team with 31 3-pointers. She finished the season as the Seawolves' Most Improved Player, and was third in the Great Northwest Athletic Conference (GNAC) in 3-point field goal percentage (42.5 percent).

de los Reyes was a multi-sport standout at Wahconah Regional High School in Dalton, Massachusetts, lettering in basketball, soccer, and track.

de los Reyes earned a bachelor's degree in biology and pre-medicine at Boston College in 2006. She received her master's degree in public health from Alaska Anchorage in 2013.

Monnie Davidson-Mays—Assistant Coach

Monnie Davidson-Mays is in her third season as part of the Chico State women's basketball coaching staff in 2019–20. The former Wildcat star has played an important role in the program reaching postseason play in her first year on the Chico State sidelines.

Davidson-Mays returned to Chico State in 2017–18 after beginning her coaching career with a two-year stint as an assistant coach at Butte College in Oroville.

As a player, Davidson-Mays posted two productive seasons at Chico State, helping lead the Wildcats to a pair of NCAA Championship Tournament berths and the 2012–13 CCAA regular season title. Davidson-Mays averaged over 10 points and five rebounds a game as a senior to earn First Team All-CCAA honors.

Prior to Chico State, Davidson-Mays played at Butte College, where she was a two-time All-Golden Valley Conference First Team selection and was named All-State in 2010–11. Davidson-Mays was a prep standout in both basketball and softball at Oakland Technical High School.

Davidson-Mays received her bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Chico State in 2015.
