

#### KNIGHTS OPEN ECAC HOCKEY PLAY

he 56th season of ECAC Hockey play begins for the Clarkson University Hockey team this weekend as the Golden Knights host defending league champion, 6th/7th-ranked Quinnipiac and Princeton in a pair of 7:00 p.m. games at Cheel Arena.

Guided by sixth-year head coach Casey Jones and assistants Phil Roy '00 and Josh Hauge, the Golden Knights faced a challenging non-conference October slate in preparation for the league campaign. Clarkson owns a 3-4-1 overall record with all four losses coming at home after suffering just two defeats at Cheel Arena in 2015-16.

This past weekend the Green and Gold hosted Big 10 powers Minnesota and Wisconsin in their first ever visits to Cheel. Facing its third consecutive Top-15 ranked team, Clarkson jumped all over Minnesota early on Friday, taking a 3-0 first-period lead. The Gophers, however, scored the final four goals, including the game-winner just 1:57 into overtime to gain the road win. On Saturday, the Knights struggled with consistency against Wisconsin, but managed to come back several times to keep the game close on the scoreboard. The Badgers took a 5-3 lead just 15 seconds into the third period before senior Jordan Boucher completed his first career hat trick late in the period to cut the deficit to one. Time ran out, however,

- Balance and Depth. Sixteen different Golden Knights have accounted for Clarkson's 26 goals through the first eight games. Nineteen players have recorded at least one point.
- Jordan Boucher recorded a career-high four points, including his first career hat trick in Saturday's game against Wisconsin. The three-goal effort by Boucher was the Knights' first hat trick since Joe Zarbo tallied three times in a win at Harvard on January 25, 2013. Boucher leads the Green and Gold in scoring six goals and eight points. Boucher was named ECAC Hockey Player of the Week.
- Devin Brosseau leads all ECAC Hockey freshmen in scoring, averaging a point per game. He has tallied seven points, including six assists, and also posts a +6 plus/minus rating, tops among conference rookies. Brosseau is tied with junior Sam Vigneault (I-6) for second in Clarkson scoring. Brosseau was named ECAC Hockey Rookie of the Month.
- Senior captain **James de Haas** leads the Knights in scoring from the blueline with six points on two goals and four assists. He is also Clarkson's current career scoring leader with 51 points (19-32) through 120 games.
- Junior defenseman **Kelly Summers**, with one goal and an assist, and Vigneault, with two assists, were the only Knights to record a point in both games over the weekend.
- Freshman forward **Haralds Egle** became the latest Golden Knight to score his first career goal when he tallied a powewr-play marker in Friday's game against Minnesota.

## Head Coach Casey Jones "The Leonard S. Ceglarski Head Men's Hockey"



Casey Jones is in his sixth year as the Golden Knights head coach in 2016-17. Named a finalist three times for ECAC Hockey Coach of the Year in his short tenure at Clarkson, Jones was designated the second Leonard S. Ceglarski Chair for the Golden Knights in May of 2011, becoming one of few coaches nationally to hold an endowed coaching position in the sport of ice hockey.

In each of his first five campaigns, Jones has had Clarkson in contention for an ECAC Hockey playoff first-round bye right up until the final weekend of the regular season. In two of the past three years, the Green and Gold have skated to 20 wins in a season.

Last season Clarkson was one of the hottest teams in the nation during the 2016 portion of the schedule and was one of only two ECAC Hockey programs to reach the 20-win mark overall. The Knights skated to a 20-15-3 overall record in 2015-16 and finished in a tie for fifth place in the conference standings, just two points shy of a top-four showing, with a 10-9-3 league mark. The Knights played in a school-record four straight overtime postseason games, sweeping Princeton (3-2 2ot, 3-2ot) in first round action at Cheel before falling at St. Lawrence (3-2ot, 3-2 2ot) in the quarterfinals.

Clarkson has steadily boosted its national presence under Jones and is bringing in some of the finest student-athletes in the country. Four current Golden Knights have been selected in the NHL Draft. The crowds at Cheel have also progressively increased with Jones behind the bench, making the Green and Gold's home ice one of the most intimating venues for opposing teams in the nation. In 2015-16 Clarkson boasted the third best home-winning percentage in Division I. The Knights posted a .842 winning% with a 15-2-2 mark at Cheel Arena.

Several Knights have earned postseason honors during Jones' tenure, including Matt Zarbo, who in 2013 became the first Clarkson player to ever receive the prestigious ECAC Hockey Student-Athlete of the year award. Paul Geiger and James de Haas earned league all-star accolades last season.

After an extensive national search Jones returned to the University after serving the previous three years as associate coach at Cornel. A native of Temiscaming, Quebec, Jones has recruited players and/or coached teams that have participated in the NCAA Tr. eight times, including three schools and in two different leagues. He worked as an assistant for the Knights under head coach Mark Morris from 1993-95. He spent 13 years (1995-2008) at Ohio State as a coach before returning to ECAC when he joined the staff at his alma mater, Cornell, for the 2008-09 campaign. When Jones was at Clarkson from 1993 to 1995, he contributed to the Golden Knights 43-19-9 record, an ECAC Hockey championship and a berth in the NCAA tournament in 1995.

Jones was a four-year letter winner as a player for the Big Red, serving as team captain in 1989-90. For his career, he scored 112 points on 30 goals and 82 assists while playing in 110 contests. He was selected by the Boston Bruins in the 10th-round of the 1987 NHL Entry Draft.

Jones and his wife, Kimberlee, also a Cornell graduate, have a daughter, Gabrielle, and a son, Bryan.

— THE SERIES

Quinnipiac leads the all-time series, which first started with a 4-0 Clarkson win in Northford, CT on February 8, 2000, 13-9-3. Last season the Bobcats, who hold a slim 2-1-2 edge over the past five games, took three of four points from the Knights in two close games. The teams skated to a 1-1 tie at High Points Solutions Arena last November 20. In their last meeting Quinnipiac pulled out a 3-2 overtime victory at Cheel Arena on February 13. The teams split during the 2014-15 campaign. Clarkson broke out of a seven-game winless skid against Quinnipiac with a 2-1 victory in Potsdam in on November 21. The Bobcats skated to a 4-1 triumph on February 14, 2015.

James de Haas leads the current Knights in scoring against Quinnipiac with three points on one goal and two assists. Jordan Boucher has two points on a goal and an assist. Perry D'Arrisso and Nic Pierog are the only other Knights with a goal in the series. Steve Perry boasts a .946 save percentage, a 0.96 goals against average and a 1-0-1 record against Quinnipiac.

Clarkson holds a decisive 82-31-5 lead in the all-time series against Princeton, which began with an 8-5 Knight victory in New Jersey on January 17, 1928. Clarkson is 7-3 over the Tigers in their last 10 games and is coming off an ECAC Hockey first-round series sweep of Princeton in their last meetings. The Green and Gold defeated the Tigers 3-2 in overtime contests on March 4-5 at Cheel Arena. During the 2015-16 regular season, Princeton handed Clarkson just its second shutout loss in the series with a 3-0 victory at Hobey Baker Rink in their first meeting last year on November 21. The Knights defeated Princeton 5-2 in Potsdam on February 12 to start the current three-game winning streak in the series. Clarkson is 29-5-0 against the Tigers on the Cheel Arena ice.

James de Haas, who tallied both overtime game-winners in last year's conference playoffs, has a team-high four goals in 10 games against Princeton. Jordan Boucher has recorded a team-high six points in the series with three goals and three assists through 10 games. Terrance Amorosa is averaging a point per game against the Tigers with one goal and four assists through five games.

**Steve Perry** is 4-1 against the Tigers with two shutouts on a .939 save percentage and a 1.61 goals against average.

A three-goal, first-period lead would not hold up for Clarkson as the Golden Knights fell to 12th-ranked Minnesota in overtime. The Gophers outshot Clarkson 36-22, including a 24-10 margin combined over the final 40 minutes of regulation play. The Knights were 1-of-5 on the power play while Minnesota went 2-of-6 with the man-advantage. Playing its third straight game against a Top-15 ranked program the Knights were all over Minnesota in the opening 20 minutes and jumped out to a 3-0 lead. Junior defenseman Kelly Summers started the Clarkson scoring with his first of the year, finishing off a give-and-go with classmate Sam Vigneault on a shot from the bottom of the left circle at 5:53. Clarkson's freshman line made it 2-0 when Sheldon Rempal scored from the slot at 16:56 with Devin Brosseau and Nico Sturm setting up the play. With just 16 seconds left in the first, Clarkson connected on the power play when freshman Haralds Egle found a loose puck at the top of the crease and swept in his first goal as a Golden Knight. Rempal and Brosseau assisted. A pair of power-play goals by the Gophers two minutes apart midway through the middle frame gave Minnesota the momentum, cutting the Knights' lead to 3-2 after 40 minutes. Despite a hat trick from senior Jordan Boucher Clarkson suffered its second straight one-goal loss at home to a Big 10 foe over the weekend. Clarkson never led against Wisconsin, but managed to come back several times to keep the game close on the scoreboard. Wisconsin took the lead with a pair of goals 39 seconds apart early in the first. The Badgers then took a string of five straight penalties to close out the first.
