GAME PREVIEW

- Central Michigan (6-2) will wrap up a three-game stretch of road games on Tuesday, Dec. 4 when it travels to take on Youngstown State (3-6) in a 7 p.m. game at Beeghly Arena.
- CMU owns a 5-2 record in the all-time series versus Youngstown State, including a 75-63 win in the teams' last meeting on Nov. 18, 2014 in Mount Pleasant.
- Central Michigan is coming off its first road loss of the season, a 89-62 setback at TCU, which ended a three-game win streak, while Youngstown State fell to West Virginia, 106-72, in Morgantown in its last outing, the Penguins fourth loss in their last five games.
- CMU is 1-1 in road games in 2018-19 while Youngstown State is unbeaten with a 3-0 record at home.
- Under head coach Keno Davis, CMU is 60-29 versus nonconference opponents.

- Central Michigan leads the MAC and ranks 10th in the NCAA in steals, averaging 9.6 per game.
- Three Chippewas appear in the MAC individual steals rankings, led by Larry Austin Jr. (2.1, No. 2), Kevin McKay (2.0, No. 3) and Shawn Roundtree Jr. (1.6, No. 8).
- In the win over Sam Houston State, junior forward David DiLeo moved into the top 10 on the CMU 3-pointers career list. He currently ranks 10th with 178 and also ranks ninth on the career attempts list (493).
- Kevin McKay and Larry Austin Jr. are the lone guards in the MAC ranked in the top 15 in field goal percentage. McKay is 7th (.586) while Austin is 12th (.575). All of the others players on the list are forwards or centers.
- By scoring over 100 points twice thus far in 2018-19, including posting 103 in a win over Siena Heights on Nov. 25, CMU has surpassed the century mark in 19 games under head coach Keno Davis.
- Central Michigan won a preseason tournament for the second consecutive year, claiming the title at the 2018 Junkanoo Jam. The Chippewas also won the 40th and final edition of the Great Alaska Shootout last season.
- Senior guard Larry Austin Jr. was named MVP of the Junkanoo Jam, averaging 19.7 ppg, 5.3 rpg, 2.7 apg, 2.3 spg over the course of the three-game tournament while Kevin McKay (16.3 ppg, 9.0 rpg, 2.3 spg, 2.0 apg, 2.0 bpg) received all-tournament team honors.
- Austin was also selected as MAC West Player of the Week, an honor attained in just the second week of his first season in the Maroon and Gold.
- With the victory over Chicago State on Nov. 9, head coach Keno Davis captured his 100th career win at Central Michigan. He resides in fourth place on the program career wins list, currently with 104.
- The Chippewas have recorded double-digit wins at home for four consecutive years, totaling 49 during that time frame. CMU went 11-5 at home in 2017-18

and is 3-0 in McGuirk Arena thus far this season.

- Central Michigan set a single-season program record for nonconference victories with 11 in 2017-18. The Chippewas have six thus far in 2018-19.
- Central Michigan has posted a .500 or better record for four consecutive years, marking the longest such stretch of success since the 1971-72, 1972-73, 1973-74 and 1974-75 seasons.
- Finishing with 356 in 2017-18, Central Michigan has made 300 or more 3-pointers in four consecutive years.
- Entering the 2018-19 season, CMU's 1,401 total 3-pointers over the past four seasons are third-most in the NCAA.
- CMU participated in a preseason tournament for the fourth consecutive year. After playing in the Gulf Coast Showcase in Estero, Fla. in 2015, the Lone Star Showcase in Austin, Texas in 2016 and the Great Alaska Shootout in Anchorage, Alaska in 2017, the Chippewas traveled to the Bimini, Bahamas for the 2018 Junkanoo Jam.

SCOUTING YOUNGSTOWN STATE

- Led by second-year head coach Jerrod Calhoun, Youngstown State enters Tuesday's contest coming off a 106-72 road loss to West Virginia, which dropped the Penguins to 3-6 on the season.
- All three of YSU's wins have come at home but just one, a 94-83 victory over Columbia, was against a Division I opponent.
- Youngstown State has scored over 100 points twice this season -- against Heidelberg and Westminster (Pa.) -- but has also surrendered 100 points two times -- versus Florida International and the Mountaineers.
- Sophomore guard Garrett Covington (11.3 ppg) and junior guard Kendale Hampton (10.9 ppg) are YSU's top scorers and only two players who average in double figures.
- Covington also leads the Penguins in steals with 16

while Hampton has a team-high 23 3-pointers.

- YSU features three players who have 24 or more assists -- freshman guard Darius Quisenberry (24), junior guard Devin Morgan (27) and sophomore forward Naz Bohannon (28).
- Bohannon also far and away leads the Penguins in rebounding, averaging 8.8 boards per game. Thirty-nine of his 79 rebounds have come on the offensive end.
- Freshman guard Jelani Simmons shoots an impressive .533 from the field while junior guard Donel Cathcart III is the team's top free throw shooter (.944, 17-of-18).
- Youngstown State gets contributions from numerous players, as a total of nine average double-digits in minutes played, led by Bohannon (26.1 ppg).

UP NEXT FOR THE CHIPPEWAS

- Central Michigan will open a four-game home stand, which will span the remainder of the month of December, beginning on Saturday, Dec. 8 when the Chippewas host Southern Utah.
- CMU will have payback on its mind when it meets the Thunderbirds in McGuirk Arena, as the Chippewas saw a seven-game winning streak halted by SUU a year ago, 86-80, in Cedar City, Utah.
- Southern Utah possesses a 4-1 record but only two of its wins have come against Division I competition. The Thunderbirds will visit Long Beach State before making the cross country trip to Michigan.
- The Chippewas will also face UMKC (2-7) (Dec. 19), Jackson State (1-7) (Dec. 22) and Indiana South Bend (3-8) (Dec. 30) during its December home stand.

CMU CLAIMS JUNKANOO JAM TITLE

- Central Michigan captured a preseason tournament title for the second consecutive year, going 2-1 en route to winning the 2018 Junkanoo Jam in Bimini, Bahamas.
- The Chippewas opened play with a 67-55 win over Cal State Bakersfield, the same team it defeated a year ago to secure the crown at the Great Alaska Shootout.
- Shawn Roundtree Jr. lead CMU with 16 points, Larry Austin Jr. contributed 14 points with eight rebounds and four assists. Kevin McKay finished with 13 points and eight rebounds, while David DiLeo contributed 15 points and a team-high nine rebounds.
- CMU then fell victim to a buzzer beater in its second game, dropping a 78-76 heartbreaker to Weber State.
- The loss spoiled a standout performance by Larry Austin, who scored a team season-high 30 points.
- The Chippewas bounced back in their final tournament game, using a buzzer beater of its own.
- Shawn Roundtree's runner in the lane with four seconds remaining lifted CMU to a thrilling 76-74 victory over San Jose State.
- Kevin McKay notched the team's first double-double of the season and the sixth of his career, totaling 24 points and 12 rebounds.
- With Cal State Bakersfield's win over Weber State in the ensuing tournament finale, CMU was crowned

champion of the 2018 Junkanoo Jam. Central Michigan, Weber State and CSUB all finished tournament play 2-1, but it was the Chippewas' 12-point win over in the opener that was the deciding factor.

- Larry Austin was named MVP of the Junkanoo Jam, averaging 19.7 ppg, 5.3 rpg, 2.7 apg, 2.3 spg while Kevin McKay (16.3 ppg, 9.0 rpg, 2.3 spg, 2.0 apg, 2.0 bpg) received all-tournament team honors.

AUSTIN NAMED MAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Larry Austin Jr. was named the Mid-American Conference West Division Player of the Week for leading the Chippewas to a first-place finish in Junkanoo Jam in Bimini, Bahamas.
- He averaged 19.7 points, 5.3 rebounds, 2.7 assists and 2.3 steals in earning the tournament Most Valuable Player Award as the Chippewas finished 2-1 on the weekend.
- In a 67-55 win over Cal State Bakersfield on Thursday, Austin scored 14 points on 6-of-7 shooting, to go along with eight rebounds and four assists.
- Against Weber State on Friday, Austin flexed his offensive muscles, posting a game-high 30 points while adding six rebounds (three offensive) and three steals. The 30 points were the most by a Chippewa this season.
- In the finale on Sunday night, a 76-74 win against San Jose State, Austin made six of his nine field goal attempts in scoring 15 points. He came up big in the final minute of the thriller, sinking a go-ahead free throw, recording a key block, and then stealing the in-bounds pass on the Spartans' last-second Hail Mary attempt.

NEWCOMERS MAKING AN IMPACT

- Central Michigan's newcomers have played a prominent role thus far this season.
- Most notably is graduate transfer guard Larry Austin Jr., who comes to CMU after stops at Vanderbilt and Xavier.
- Austin has paired with Shawn Roundtree Jr. to provide the Chippewas with a formidable back court tandem.
- Austin already has earned tournament MVP (Junkanoo Jam) and MAC Player of the Week honors.
- He ranks second in the MAC in scoring (19.0 ppg) and steals (2.1 per game), fifth in assists (4.4) and 12th in field goal percentage (.575)
- Junior forward Rob Montgomery, who transferred to CMU from junior college powerhouse Indian Hills in Iowa, has helped to fill the void left by the graduation of post players Luke Meyer and Cecil Williams.
- He leads CMU with 13 blocked shots and is second on the team in rebounding (6.0 rpg)
- Junior guard Dallas Morgan is a Moberly Area CC product, the same school that sent Cecil Williams and Rayshawn Simmons to CMU.
- He has lent key minutes from the guard position, averaging 5.5 points per game while knocking down 10 3-pointers.
- Romelo Burrell (John A. Logan College), a forward, has supplied depth down low, averaging 2.5 points and 3.5

ROUNDTREE ON POINT

- Shawn Roundtree Jr., a transfer from Mineral Area College (Mo.), capably filled the point guard spot in 2017-18 and is building on that success in 2018-19.
- Thus far this season, Roundtree ranks third on the team in scoring (14.0 ppg), second in 3-pointers (13) and leads CMU in minutes played per game (30.9).
- He hit the buzzer-beating shot in a 76-74 win over San Jose State on Nov. 18, which helped Central Michigan secure the title at the Junkanoo Jam.
- Roundtree sparked CMU in the second half of the road win over Sam Houston State, scoring 11 points, including nine off a season-high three 3-pointers.
- Last year, Roundtree led the team in assists (151) and was second in free throws made (144) and scoring (14.8 ppg) and third in 3-pointers with 56.
- Roundtree's 2017-18 season ranked just outside the CMU top 10 lists in both assists and free throws made.
- He scored in double digits in 30 games, which tied for first on the team.
- With 628 points, he is potentially on pace to reach the 1,000-point barrier in just his second season at Central Michigan.
- Roundtree was among the MAC's top free throw shooters a year ago, finishing seventh (82.3%).
- He was named Most Outstanding Player of the Great Alaska Shootout after averaging 15.0 ppg, 3.0 rpg and 5.6 apg as CMU went 3-0 and captured the tournament title.

DILEO KEY TO FORTUNES IN 2018-19

- Junior David DiLeo will be a keystone for the 2018-19 Central Michigan team.
- Through eight games, he leads the Chippewas with 18 3-pointers and is third on the team in rebounding (4.5 rpg).
- In 2017-18, DiLeo emerged as a principle player for the Chippewas, leading the team in rebounding (6.6 rpg) and minutes played (33.6 mpg) and ranking third in scoring (12.4 ppg).
- He shot .390 from the field overall and .805 from the free throw line.
- His 96 3-pointers led the MAC and ranked third on the CMU single season list behind Chippewa icons Marcus Keene (125) and Robbie Harman (105).
- After Josh Kozinski set the standard for career 3-pointers in 2017-18, DiLeo is next in line, as he recently moved into the top 10 with 177.
- Averaging 80 3-pointers per season, he is on pace to break Kozinski's record.
- DiLeo is tied for the team-lead among all active Chippewas with six career double-doubles.

BIG PLAY MCKAY

- Junior guard Kevin McKay flashed early on this season what he became synonymous for last year -- production.
- Against Concordia, he totaled a game-high 27 points, 5 rebounds, 3 assists and 3 steals.
- He followed that up with an 11-point, 8-rebound, 3-assist,

- At the Junkanoo Jam, McKay averaged 16.3 points, 9.0 rebounds, 2.3 steals, 2.0 assists and 2.0 blocks over the course of the three games, earning a spot on the all-tournament team.
- In the decisive tournament finale against San Jose State, McKay recorded his sixth career double-double, posting 24 points and 12 rebounds.
- Against Siena Heights, McKay posted a game-high 23 points, on 9-of-13 shooting, 18 of which came in the first half.
- McKay is third in the MAC in steals per game (2.0 spg) and ranks No. 6 in offensive rebounds (3.3 rpg).
- McKay, along with teammate Larry Austin Jr., are the lone guards in the MAC ranked in the top 15 in field goal percentage. McKay is ranked 7th (.586).
- McKay finished the 2017-18 season as one the hottest players in the MAC, averaging 16.5 ppg and 7.4 rpg while shooting 56.3% from the field and 86.4% from the line over his last 12 games. During that span, he has set single-game career highs in points (33), rebounds (16) and assists (7).
- His biggest improvement came from the free throw line, as he first in the MAC (86.1%). In 2016-17, he shot 51% from the line.
- He shot .554 overall from the field, which ranked No. 7 in the conference.
- McKay ranked No. 2 in the MAC in offensive rebounds (3.4 rpg) and No. 3 in steals per game (2.1 spg) (MAC games only).
- He led CMU with 98 offensive rebounds, over 30 more than the No. 2-ranked player.
- McKay recorded at least one steal in 30 of the 34 games in which he has played last season, which included a streak of 18 straight.
- His 62 steals ranked tied for second in the CMU single season record book, just one shy of the top spot held by Dave Grauzer (1978-79)
- Averaging 27.1 minutes per game, McKay ranked tied for second on the team in rebounding (6.5 rpg) and fourth in scoring (12.2 ppg).
- As a freshman, McKay played in 28 games, averaging 1.7 points and 1.5 rebounds per game in 4.2 minutes of playing time.

CMU SIGNS 3

- Central Michigan head coach Keno Davis has announced the signing of three players who will join the Chippewa program for the 2019-20 season.
- The trio includes 6-foot-5 guard Travon Broadway of Miami, Fla., 6-2 guard Devontae Lane of Iowa City, Iowa and 6-9 forward Caleb Hodgson of Dansville, Mich.
- Broadway is playing this season at Iowa Western Community College after playing last season at St. Petersburg (Fla.) Community College. At SPCC, Broadway averaged 14.2 points and 6.1 rebounds per game, earning FCSAA First Team All-Conference honors.

- Lane, who attended Iowa West High School, the alma mater of Davis and junior forward David DiLeo, was a three-time first team all-state selection for the Trojans. This season and last, Lane has been running the point for Indian Hills Community College, the same school that sent Rob Montgomery to CMU. A year ago, the Warriors went 33-1.
- Hodgson is a senior at Dansville High School. As a junior, he averaged 23.0 points, 14.0 rebounds and 3.7 blocks per game, earning First Team All-State recognition from the AP, Detroit News, Detroit Free Press and BankHoops.com.

- Central Michigan improved to 2-0 to open a season for the first time since 2002-03 following a 75-63 win over Youngstown State (1-2) at McGuirk Arena.
- CMU outrebounded the Penguins, 54-30, and only allowed three offensive rebounds for YSU, including zero in the second half.
- John Simons dominated the boards pulling down a career-high 13 rebounds, while chipping in nine points for the Chippewas.
- CMU jumped out to a 12-3 lead in the first half when Austin Stewart hit a three with 15 minutes remaining.
- Stewart totaled eight points, five rebounds and a game-high three steals.
- Youngstown State would hit back-to-back 3-pointers to tie the game up at 14-all at the 10:45 mark but that was as close as it would get as the Chippewas never gave up the lead after scoring the first bucket of the game.
- Chris Fowler sank two free throws heading into halftime to give the Chippewas an 11-point lead at the break, 36-25.
- Fowler ended the night with a team-high 16 points in 34 minutes. The junior dished out eight assists and went 8-of-9 from the stripe.
- The Chippewas led by at least six throughout the second half and led by as many as 15 with just under eight minutes to play, 59-44.
- Freshman forward Luke Meyer had his second-straight double-digit scoring game, recording 13 points, in addition to collecting nine rebounds.

In six years, Keno Davis has built Central Michigan into a championship-caliber program, both on and off the court.

In 2017-18, Davis led the Chippewas to a 21-15 finish, the program's second-highest single-season win total since 2002-03, and the fourth-consecutive season in which CMU finished .500 or better, marking the first time the program has accomplished such a feat since the early 1970s.

CMU earned a postseason bid for the third time in the last four years and set a program standard by winning back-to-back road games – the first at Fort Wayne, the second at Wofford -- in the CollegelInsider.com Postseason Tournament.

The 2017-18 Chippewas set a program record by making 80.6 percent of their free throw attempts. They ranked second nationally in that category.

Davis took the reins of the Chippewas before the 2012-13 season and immediately established an exciting brand of basketball featuring up-tempo offense that emphasizes the 3-point shot, giving rise to the program's "3MU" moniker.

The Chippewas averaged 9.9 triples per game in '17-18, ranking first in the Mid-American Conference and 25th nationally. That success from long range spearheaded an offense that averaged 78.8 points per night, which was 58th best among the 351 teams in Division I.

In 2016-17, that Davis-coached offense ranked third in the nation, averaging an explosive 88.3 points per game, triggered by the dynamic backcourt duo of Marcus Keene and Braylon Rayson, the former the nation's leading scorer and the first NCAA Division I player in 20 years to average 30 points per game en route to earning All-America honorable mention, the first Chippewa to be so honored since 2003.

Keene set a Mid-American Conference record by scoring an eye-popping 959 points, the 20th-highest total for a single-season in Division I history.

Keene's exploits brought unprecedented attention to Davis' program and the university by way of full-length feature stories published by the likes of Sports Illustrated, USA Today, and the Wall Street Journal. His highlights were also frequently broadcast on the likes of ESPN's SportsCenter and he was the subject of a feature on the CBS Evening News.

Eight times in 2016-17, Davis' Chippewas scored 100 points or more points in a game, and they have hit the century mark 17 times during Davis' tenure.

The offensive fireworks left the Chippewas ranked in the top 10 nationally in six statistical categories, including points per game. The Chippewas made 399 3-pointers, setting the program mark for the third-straight season.

Davis guided CMU to a 16-16 finish in '16-17, and in '15-16, Davis' Chippewas won their second consecutive MAC West title, and also accepted a bid to the CollegelInsider.com Tournament, marking the first time since 1971 that CMU had made back-to-back postseason appearances.

The end of the season signaled the end of one era of CMU basketball as Davis said good-bye to a senior class led by Chris Fowler and John Simons. That duo, along with several other key contributors, comprised Davis' first CMU recruiting class.

The group became the building blocks for the foundation of Davis' program, and both Fowler and Simons wrapped up their remarkable careers having left a lasting on the court and off. Simons left as CMU's all-time leader in 3-pointers made and attempted, and was supplanted in both categories the following season by Rayson and then by Josh Kozinski in 2017-18.

Fowler and Keene are among four of the players that Davis has mentored at CMU (Rayshawn Simmons and Kyle Randall are the others) who have gone on to play professionally. In all, 20 players that Davis has coached in his nine years at the helm of three Division I programs have advanced to the pro ranks.

In 2016, CMU led the conference with four Academic All-MAC selections, twice as many as any other team, and it marked the third consecutive year that CMU had more players honored for their academic success than any team in the league. Fifteen times in Davis' six seasons in charge of the program have Chippewas landed on the league academic honor squad.

In 2014-15, Davis engineered the nation's fifth-largest turnaround and captured CMU's first Mid-American Conference regular-season championship since the 2002-03 season.

Central Michigan posted 23 wins, a 13-win improvement from the previous year, tying for the second most in program history. After being selected 11th in the MAC preseason poll, the Chippewas proved to be the class of the conference as they won 12 games, claimed the MAC West title, and earned the No. 1 seed for the MAC Tournament.

A postseason berth, the program's first in more than a decade, followed as CMU earned a No. 6 seed for the National Invitation Tournament.

For orchestrating CMU's historic turnaround, Davis was selected as MAC and National Association of Basketball Coaches District Coach of the Year. In recognition of success achieved on the court and his moral integrity displayed off the court, Davis was also honored with the 2015 Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award.



Davis' continued emphasis on the importance of academics was reflected in the fact that CMU was one of only 19 Division I schools to receive the Team Academic Excellence Award from the NABC.

Davis and his assistants have also made inroads in another key area, camps. CMU hosted more than 1,000 youngsters during its four camps throughout the summer months in 2018.

Davis' positive and uplifting message has clearly struck an immediate chord with Chippewa fans. His Twitter account boasts more than 22,000 followers, ranking Davis in the top 15 among all Division I head coaches and first among all mid-major programs.

DAVIS' BACKGROUND IS STEEPED IN TRADITION AND SUCCESS

Davis was introduced by as the Chippewas' 20th men's basketball coach on April 3, 2012, bringing four years of Division I head coaching experience.

In 2008, Davis was named the coach of the year by six national organizations, including the Associated Press, the U.S. Basketball Writers Association, and The Sporting News.

In one season at Drake and three at Providence, Davis compiled a 74-55 (.574) record and made two postseason appearances.

In 2007-08, Davis' first as a head coach, he led Drake to a 28-5 record, including a 15-3 mark in the Missouri Valley Conference. His team captured its first MVC regular-season title since 1971, the first MVC Tournament championship in program history, and the Bulldogs made their first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 1971.

Drake was nationally ranked for a school-record eight consecutive weeks and finished 14th in the Associated Press Poll and 23rd in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll.

Davis inherited a team that had graduated four starters from a squad that went 17-15 in 2006-07. He took a team that was picked to finish ninth in the MVC to the program's first top-25 ranking since 1974-75.

Moving to Providence in 2008-09, Davis guided the Friars to a 19-14 mark in his first season, including a 10-8 finish in the BIG EAST. The 19 victories was the most for a first-year coach in the history of the program, and two of those wins came over top-15 teams, including Pittsburgh, which was ranked No. 1 nationally when the Friars posted an 81-73 upset.

That Providence squad finished tied for sixth place in the conference after it was picked to finish 12th in the preseason poll. Davis led Providence to its first BIG EAST Tournament victory in six years and into the postseason as the Friars earned an at-large bid to the NIT.

In 2009-10 Davis' team ranked third in the nation in scoring at 82.4 points per game.

Davis has a proven track record of developing players and preparing them for the next level. At Providence, he mentored MarShon Brooks, who was selected by the Boston Celtics with the 25th pick in the 2011 NBA Draft after Brooks had earned multiple All-America honors.

Prior to taking over as the head coach at Drake, Davis served as an assistant under his father, Dr. Tom Davis, at Drake from 2003-07. Keno Davis began his coaching career in 1995 as an assistant for two years under Bruce Pearl at Southern Indiana, then served as an assistant under Gary Garner at Southeast Missouri State from 1997-2003.

Davis was exposed to basketball at a very young age as he watched his father become one of the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches. In 32 seasons as a head coach at Lafayette (1971-77), Boston College (1977-82), Stanford (1982-86), Iowa (1986-99) and Drake (2003-07), Tom Davis registered a 598-355 record (.628), which included 18 postseason appearances and 16 20-win seasons.

Keno and his father share the distinction of being the only father-son duo to have captured national coach of the year honors. In 1987, Tom Davis was named by the Associated Press as its National Coach of the Year. The Davis duo has combined for 776 victories.

- Head coach Keno Davis earned his 100th career win at Central Michigan as the Chippewas defeated Chicago State, 101-60, in McGuirk Arena.
- CMU improves to an unblemished 2-0, while the Cougars fall to 0-3.
- Five CMU players finished with double-digit point totals. Senior Larry Austin Jr. lead the Chippewas with 17 points and nine assists, sophomore Matt Beachler added a career-high 16 points off the bench, Kevin McKay posted 11 points and a team-high eight rebounds, while reserves Romelo Burrell and Dallas Morgan added 11 and 10 points, respectively.
- The Chippewas showcased game action for 14 players, with 11 players making up CMU's 101 points.
- Senior Shawn Roundtree Jr. scored the game's first five points to spark the Chippewa offense but two early personal fouls forced him to the bench. Up by 17 points, Morgan earned the first of his two assists with an alley-ooop to Austin Jr., increasing CMU's lead to 19, leading to an eruption from the 2,110 fans in attendance.
- CMU continued its first half offense dominance, shooting 59 percent from the field, 53 percent from 3-point range and received offensive production from 10 of 11 players in the first half. The Chippewas held Chicago State 44 percent from the field while forcing 14 Cougar turnovers.
- The Chippewas continued their pressure on the offensive and defensive side of the ball, forcing eight more turnovers while holding the Cougars to 35.7 percent shooting and just 12.5 percent from behind the arc.
- The Chippewas have reached the century mark in scoring 18 times during the Keno Davis era.
- The Chippewas are currently averaging 99.5 points per game.

- Central Michigan opened the 2018 Junkanoo Jam in successful fashion, knocking off Cal State Bakersfield, 67-55.
- The meeting marked the second consecutive season CMU defeated Bakersfield in an early-season tournament, as the Chippewas downed the Roadrunners, 75-72, to claim the 2017 Great Alaska Shootout crown.
- Senior Shawn Roundtree Jr. lead CMU with 16 points, senior Larry Austin Jr. contributed 14 points with eight rebounds and four assists. Junior Kevin McKay finished with 13 points and eight rebounds, while David DiLeo contributed 15 points and a team-high nine rebounds.
- CSU Bakersfield's Damiyne Durham lead the Roadrunners with 16 points.
- CMU opened the first half on an 11-2 run lead by Roundtree Jr.'s five points. The Roadrunners would cut the lead to three points, but the Chippewa defense held CSU Bakersfield scoreless for a 6:09 stretch, part of a 12-1 Chippewa run.

- The Chippewas forced 20 turnovers, including tallying 13 steals, while shooting 47 percent from the field, 15-of-30 in the second half, but finished 7-of-30 from beyond the arc.
- The Spartans shot 51 percent from the floor and 44 percent from three, including 5-of-10 in the first half.
- The Spartans shot 58 percent from the field in the first half, including 5-of-10 from the 3-point line, but the Chippewas trailed by only four points going into intermission. - TCU proved its worth on Friday in handing the Chippewas an 89-62 nonconference loss at the Horned Frog's Schollmaier Arena.
- The losses ended CMU's win streak at three games. The Chippewas (6-2) go to Youngstown State on Tuesday, Dec. 4. TCU, which fell out of the top 25 with a loss to Lipscomb last week, is 5-1.
- The Chippewas never led, but were within striking distance at 24-17 with under six minutes to play in the first half. The Horned Frogs outscored the Chippewas, 22-9, over the final 5:28 of the half for a 46-26 halftime lead.
- CMU never got closer than 17 points in the second half.
- Larry Austin Jr. scored 19 points to lead CMU, while Shawn Roundtree Jr. added 16. David DiLeo led CMU with seven rebounds and Austin dished out five assists.
- The Chippewas made just 32.8 percent of their field goals and 17.4 percent of their 3-point attempts.
- Desmond Bane scored 24 points to lead TCU, which outrebounded the Chippewas 48-31.
- The Chippewas committed nine turnovers and attempted just one free throw in the first half. In the final 20 minutes, CMU turned the ball over just three times and went to the line 18 times. They finished 14-for-19 from the charity stripe.
