# **GAME PREVIEW**

- Central Michigan (4-0) will make its first road trip of the season this week, visiting Big Ten territory to face Minnesota (1-3) on Thursday evening in an 8 p.m. ET game at the home of the Golden Gophers, Williams Arena
- Central Michigan head coach Keno Davis sits just one wins shy of 200 for his career. Davis has amassed 125 of his 199 wins at Central Michigan, which ranks him fourth on the program's all-time list.
- The Chippewas are 0-3 all-time versus Minnesota, falling to the Gophers in Minneapolis in 2004 (77-63), 2007 (77-59) and 2011 (76-56).
- CMU is coming off its fourth-consecutive win to start the 2019-20 season, a 115-58 rout of Siena Heights in McGuirk Arena, while Minnesota fell at Utah, 73-69, in its last outing on Nov. 15.
- After posting a 7-6 road record in 2018-19, the Chippewas visit Minneapolis for their first road game

of the season. Minnesota is 1-0 at home, opening the 2019-20 campaign with a 85-50 throttling of Cleveland State.

 Central Michigan has a 69-30 record versus nonconference opponents under head coach Keno Davis.

#### TRENDING

- Central Michigan is 4-0 to open a season for the first time since 2016-17.
- Central Michigan set the program record for points in a game, posting 134 in a win over Mississippi Valley State on Nov. 10.
- Central Michigan won its seventh consecutive season opener, downing Michigan-Dearborn, 102-62, at home on Nov. 5.
- By reaching the century mark in their first two games, the Chippewas scored in triple digits in back-to-back games for the first time since the 1972-73 season (Montana State, 102-75; Western Illinois, 102-82). CMU has never scored 100 or more points three times in the span of four games.
- Through four games, Central Michigan is highly-ranked in the NCAA in several stat categories including No. 1 in assist turnover ratio (2.24) and turnover margin (13.8), No. 2 in scoring margin (40.0) and scoring offense (108.8), No. 3 in steals per game (13.8), No. 4 in total steals (55) and No. 5 in turnovers per game (8.3).
- After scoring 100-plus points in three of its first four games this season, CMU has surpassed the century mark a total of 24 times under head coach Keno Davis.
- Central Michigan was selected to place fourth in the MAC West by a vote of the conference coaches in the annual preseason poll. The Chippewas were chosen sixth last season and finished second.
- Central Michigan has had a .500 or better record for five consecutive years, marking the longest such stretch of success since the 1970-71, 1971-72, 1972-73, 1973-74

- and 1974-75 seasons.
- Finishing with 305 in 2018-19, Central Michigan has made 300 or more 3-pointers in five consecutive years.
   The Chippewas are averaging just over 12 triples per game thus far in 2019-20.
- Senior forward David DiLeo needs 38 3-pointers to become Central Michigan's all-time career leader. Over the past two seasons, he has averaged over 94 per year and has never had fewer than 64 in his career.
- DiLeo has led the Mid-American Conference in 3-pointers made in each of the last two seasons, hitting 96 in 2017-18 and 93 in 2018-19.
- Senior guard Kevin McKay is on pace to become the 35th player in program history and seventh under head coach Keno Davis to score 1,000 points for his career. He needs 104 to reach the benchmark and after averaging over 400 points scored in each of the last two seasons.
- With 131, McKay is also four steals shy of moving onto the CMU career list. He is the only player in program history to appear on the single-season steals top 10 list twice.
- McKay, who stands 6-5, was CMU's leading rebounder in 2018-19, averaging 7.5 boards per game. He ranked No. 2 in the NCAA among guards in offensive rebounds.
- The Chippewas have recorded double-digit wins at home for five consecutive years, totaling 66 during that time frame. CMU went 13-4 at home in 2018-19 and is 4-0 thus far in 2019-20.
- Central Michigan posted 11 non-conference victories in 2018-19, tying a program record. The Chippewas set the record in 2017-18.
- Central Michigan defeated rival Western Michigan three times in a season in 2018-19 for this first time in program history.
- Central Michigan will face three nonconference opponents for the first time in program history in 2019-20 -- Mississippi Valley State, Trinity Christian and Texas.

# SCOUTING MINNESOTA

- Led by seven-year head coach Richard Pitino,
   Minnesota has run a rigorous schedule gauntlet early
   this season, dropping three-straight single-digit games
   away from home against Power 5 foes Oklahoma,
   Butler and Utah.
- Sophomore center Daniel Oturu averages a doubledouble, posting a team-high 19.0 points and 11.8 rebounds per game. His rebound average ranks him No. 12 nationally.
- Oturu also leads the Gophers with 12 blocks and is ranked No.10 in the NCAA in blocks per game (3.5).
- Redshirt sophomore guard Marcus Carr averages 14.5
  points and 7.5 rebounds per game, both second on the
  team, and leads UM in assists with 27 and steals with 7.
- Redshirt junior guard Payton Willis averages 11.8 points per game and is tied with sophomore guard Gabe Kalscheur for the team-lead in 3-pointers (10).

### **UP NEXT FOR THE CHIPPEWAS**

- Central Michigan will return home to McGuirk Arena for a 2 p.m. Saturday matchup with non-conference opponent Trinity Christian (3-5).
- CMU has never faced Trinity Chrisitian in the history of the program but the Chippewas are 17-0 vs. non-Division I teams under head coach Keno Davis.
- Trinity Christian has road games in back-to-back days at Calumet and Crown College before visiting Mount Pleasant.
- For CMU, the game will count towards its regular season record while Trinity Christian will consider it an exhibition game.
- The Trolls are led by sophomore guard James
   Pennington, who averages 12.5 points, 5.6 rebounds and 4.3 assists per game.

## **NEWCOMERS FOR 2019-20**

- Even though a strong and experienced group of core players return for Central Michigan, six newcomers will also dot the roster, with many likely to be significant contributors in 2019-20.
- With backcourt mates Larry Austin Jr. and Shawn Roundtree Jr. gone to graduation, the Chippewas will turn to junior college transfer guards Travon Broadway Jr. and Devontae Lane to help fill the void.
- Broadway is a 6-5 shooting guard from Miami, Fla. who comes to CMU from lowa Western Community College.
- Lane is a 6-2 point guard who transferred from Indian Hills Community College. He is a former JUCO teammate of Rob Montgomery and high school teammate of David DiLeo.
- In the season opener vs. Michigan-Dearborn, the duo made an instant impact, with Broadway totaling 17 points and 5 rebounds and Lane collecting 11 points and 6 assists.
- Broadway currently leads CMU with 12 steals while Lane has a team-high 16 assists.
- Also in the mix at guard will be Deschon Winston, who began his career at Cal before moving to City College of

- San Francisco for last season.
- Winston shined in the win over Mississippi Valley State, posting 16 points and 6 assists in 22-plus minutes of court time.
- He shares the team-lead in assists (16) with Lane.
- Preston Enloe, a sharpshooting guard from Division II Tarleton State, will sit out the 2019-20 due to NCAA transfer rules.
- Freshmen recruit Caleb Hodgson, a 6-10 center/forward comes to Mount Pleasant after a distinguished prep career at Dansville High School.
- Another freshman, guard Dylan Jergens, set the MHSAA record for points in a single season, scoring 971 as a senior at Howardsville Christian.

# THE BOOK ON DAVID DILEO

- Senior forward David DiLeo is poised to have a big 2019-20 season.
- He was selected preseason All-MAC West by a vote of the conference coaches and was recognized preseason All-MAC by Lindy's Sports.
- DiLeo has started strong, scoring 22 points on 7-of-10 (5-of-7 from 3) in the opener vs. Michigan-Dearborn and then went off for a career-high 30 points against Mississippi Valley State.
- He also tied with Kevin McKay for the team-lead in points with 17 in the win over Sam Houston State.
- DiLeo is second on the team in scoring, averaging 19.0 points per game.
- DiLeo is the team's returning leading scorer after averaging 12.1 points per game in 2018-19.
- A year ago, he posted the best shooting numbers of his career from the field (.435) and from 3-point range (.417).
- He became the 34th player in program history to score 1,000 career points last season and currently resides in 17th place with 1,217 points.
- DiLeo is on pace to become CMU's career leader in 3-pointers this season, needing 38 to move into the top spot and overtake guard Josh Kozinski (306), who played for the Chippewas from 2013-2018.
- He is also currently ranked No. 10 on the Mid-American Conference career 3-pointers rankings (see page 5).
- DiLeo has led the Mid-American Conference in 3-pointers in each of the last two seasons, making 96 in 2017-18 and 93 in 2018-19.
- At 6-8, DiLeo is also a key rebounder for CMU. He averaged 4.9 boards per game in 2018-19 and has totaled 578 for his career, 21 shy of moving onto the Chippewas' top 10 list.
- DiLeo has played in 107 career games, with 75 starts, most on the current CMU roster.

## THE BOOK ON KEVIN MCKAY

- Senior guard Kevin McKay will be a key piece of the Central Michigan line-up in 2019-20.
- This preseason, McKay was recognized by Lindy's Sports as the Mid-American Conference's Most Versatile Player.
- · McKay has his best game of the season thus far when



- the Chippewas needed it, scoring 12 of his team-high 17 points in the second half, helping CMU come from behind for an 84-77 win over Sam Houston State.
- One of three Chippewas to start all 35 games last season, he averaged 11.3 points and a team-high 7.5 rebounds per game in 31.4 minutes.
- He led the team with 31 blocked shots and tied for the team lead with eight double-doubles, giving him 13 for his career, most among active players.
- · McKay is on pace to become the 35th player in program history and seventh under head coach Keno Davis to score 1,000 points for his career. He needs 104 to reach the benchmark after averaging over 400 points scored in each of the last two seasons.
- With 131, McKay is 4 steals shy of moving onto the CMU career list. He is the only player in program history to appear on the single-season steals top 10 list twice.
- McKay's 262 total rebounds in 2018-19 were the most by a Chippewa since the 2002-03 season. He also ranked No. 2 in the NCAA among guards in offensive rebounds.
- He is 71 rebounds shy of moving onto the CMU career top 10 list.
- · McKay also ranks tied for seventh on the CMU field goal percentage list (.538).

### THE BOOK ON ROB MONTGOMERY

- Senior forward Rob Montgomery had a major impact in his first season as a Chippewa and looks to be in line for another standout year.
- Montgomery kicked off the season in style, just missing a double-double vs. Michigan-Dearborn, posting 12 points and 9 rebounds.
- He followed it up with 17 points and 5 rebounds against Mississippi Valley State.
- Providing CMU with a strong inside presence, he made 31 starts last year, averaging 10.8 points and 5.7 rebounds per game.
- Montgomery also displayed his shooting range in 2018-19, making 21 3-pointers.
- Montgomery scored a season-high 23 points versus Akron and led CMU with 17 points and seven rebounds in the MAC Tournament semifinals against Buffalo.

### THE BOOK ON DALLAS MORGAN

- Senior guard Dallas Morgan provided CMU with important depth in 2018-19 and that role could be expanded this season.
- · Morgan was ultra-efficient in the season opener, scoring a game- and career-high 23 points in 18 minutes of court time. He also had 5 rebounds and 2 steals.
- After posting 17 points and 7 rebounds in the win over Mississippi Valley State, he scored a career high 27 points, making 7-of-11 3-point attempts against Siena Heights in his sixth career start.
- Morgan is a perfect 12-for-12 from the free throw line this season and has made 15 3-pointers (3.8 per
- Regularly the first player off the bench, he averaged 17.4 minutes per game, most among reserves in 18-19.
- Morgan proved to be a reliable outside shooter, knocking down 64 3-pointers, which ranked third on
- Inserted into the starting line-up in five games due to injuries, Morgan stepped up, averaging 12.0 points per game.

### **CHIPPEWAS SIGN 3**

- CMU head coach Keno Davis recently announced his 2020 signing class, which comprises three players, two of which are junior college transfers.
- Ralph Bissainthe of North Miami, Fla., Demarcus Demonia of Fort Washington, Md., and Ra'Shad Weekly-McDaniels of St. Louis make up the class.
- Bissainthe is 6-foot-7 and comes to CMU from Florida Southwestern College, while Demonia is 6-6 and played two years at Allegany (Md.) College. Both are juniors and both are eligible to play in 2020-21.
- Weekly-McDaniels is a 6-1 guard from Trinity Catholic High School. His prep coach, Jeff McCaw, said Weekly-McDaniels "is the most exciting guard I have ever coached."
- · Bissainthe, who spent his freshman season at Illinois-Chicago, is averaging 9.8 points and 4.4 rebounds in helping Florida Southwestern College to a 5-0 start.
- Demonia averaged 21.3 points and 11.9 rebounds per game in leading Allegany to district and regional championships a year ago. He led all junior college

# **THE 3s COMPANY**

- The 3-pointer will once again a central part of the Central Michigan offense in 2019-20, despite losing 76 to the graduation of Shawn Roundtree Jr.
- Central Michigan has made 300 or more 3-pointers for the fifth consecutive year, including 305 in 2018-19.
- Through four games in 2019-20, CMU is averaging just over 12 3-pointers per game, putting them in position to again reach the 300 benchmark.
- David DiLeo and Dallas Morgan, together, have made 31 3s through 4 games and are shooting a combined .477 from beyond the arc.
- CMU's 1,706 total 3-pointers over the past five seasons are third-most in the NCAA.
- Senior forward David DiLeo is poised to be next in line to take over the top spot on the CMU career list, as he resides in 3rd place, needing 38 to take over the top spot. Averaging over 94 3-pointers the last two seasons, he is on pace to break Josh Kozinski's record.
- Senior guard Dallas Morgan will also be a major contributor to the Chippewas' 3-point total this season after making 64 a year ago.

# **STAFF CHANGES**

- With longtime assistants Kyle Gerdeman (head coach at Lindenwood University) and Jeff Smith (associate head coach at Oakland University) moved on to other opportunities, head coach Keno Davis has changes to his staff in 2019-20.
- Davis added Chris Tifft in September, who came to CMU after stints as an assistant coach at Saint Louis (2016-19) and at TCU (2012-16).
- Tifft, who played at Three Rivers (Mo.) Community
  College and at Nevada, began his coaching career as
  an assistant at Nevada from 1996-2001 before moving
  on to Dodge City (Kan.) C.C., where he served as an
  assistant from 2001-04.
- He was the head coach at Lamar (Colo.) C.C. from 2004-09 and at New Mexico Junior College from 2009-12.
- DJ Mocini, who had served as Davis' Director of Basketball Operations since 2013, was elevated to an assistant coaching position.
- Bobby Naubert, who was the team's video coordinator in 2018-19, was hired to replace Mocini as Director of Basketball Operations.
- Chris Davis, who was added to the staff for the 2018-19 season after Kevin Gamble departed CMU for a job with the NBA's Toronto Raptors, returns.
- Davis and head coach Keno Davis coached together at both Drake University and Providence College.

# Head Coach // Eighth Season

In seven years, Keno Davis has built Central Michigan into a championship-caliber program, both on and off the court. In 2018-19, Davis led the Chippewas to a 23-12 finish, tying for the program's second-highest single-season win total. It marked the fifth-consecutive season in which CMU finished .500 or better. It is the first time the program has accomplished such a feat since the early 1970s.

It was CMU's second-consecutive 20-win season and its third in the seven years that Davis has been at the helm. It marked the first time the program has posted back-to-back 20-win seasons since the mid 1960s.

The Chippewas earned a postseason bid for the fourth time in the last five years by accepting a bid to the College Basketball Invitational.

Davis' '18-19 squad was led by the outstanding guard duo of Larry Austin Jr. and Shawn Roundtree Jr.

Austin, a graduate transfer, made a splash in his one and only season as a Chippewa, earning Second Team All-Mid-American Conference honors, a spot on the MAC All-Defensive Team, and to the National Association of Basketball Coaches All-District 14 Second Team. Roundtree, a senior, earned Third Team All-MAC honors.

Austin scored 591 points, the ninth-highest total in program history, and set single-season program records for steals (76) and assists (200).

Under Davis, the Chippewas have produced outstanding tangible results in the won-loss columns and have been highly competitive in the Mid-American Conference. Their success on their home floor, Kulhavi Court at McGuirk Arena, is clearly evident in the numbers covering the past five seasons. In that span, the Chippewas at home are a combined 63-19 (a .768 win percentage), have averaged 12.6 wins per season, are averaging 84.7 points per game, and have hit an average of 10.8 3-pointers per game.

Davis took the reins of the Chippewas before the 2012-13 season and immediately established an exciting brand of basketball featuring up-tempo offense that emphasizes the 3-point shot, giving rise to the program's "3MU" moniker.

The Chippewas once again found remarkable success in '18-19 from beyond the arc, making 8.6 per game, but also from the free throw line, where they set program marks for attempts (908) and makes (609), leading the MAC and finishing in the top 10 nationally in both.

That success from long range and from the line spearheaded an offense that ranked 10th nationally at 82.7 points per game. It marked the second time in the last three years that the Chippewas have finished among the top 10 nationally in scoring.

In 2016-17, that Davis-coached offense ranked third in the nation, averaging an explosive 88.3 points per game. It was triggered by another dynamic backcourt duo, Marcus Keene and Braylon Rayson. Keene led the nation in scoring, becoming the first NCAA Division I player in 20 years to average 30 points per game en route to earning All-America honorable mention. He was the first Chippewa to be so honored since 2003 and he set a MAC record by scoring an eyepopping 959 points, the 20th-highest total for a single-season in Division I history.

Both Keene and Rayson are now playing professionally, joining a growing list of Chippewas who have played for Davis who have gone on to pro careers. In all, nearly two dozen players that Davis has coached in his nine years at the helm of three Division I programs have advanced to the pro ranks.

Keene's exploits brought unprecedented attention to Davis' program and the university by way of full-length feature stories published by the likes of Sports Illustrated, USA Today, and the Wall Street Journal. His highlights were also frequently broadcast on the likes of ESPN's SportsCenter and he was the subject of a feature on the CBS Evening News.

Davis guided CMU to its second consecutive MAC West title, and also accepted a bid to the CollegeInsider.com Tournament, marking the first time since 1971 that CMU had made back-to-back postseason appearances.

The end of the season signaled the end of one era of CMU basketball as Davis said good-bye to a senior class led by Chris Fowler and John Simons. That duo, along with several other key contributors, comprised Davis' first CMU recruiting class and became the foundational building blocks for the program's success under Davis.

In 2014-15, Davis engineered the nation's fifth-largest turnaround and captured CMU's first Mid-American Conference regular-season championship since the 2002-03 season.

Central Michigan posted 23 wins, a 13-win improvement from the previous year, after being selected 11th in the MAC preseason poll. The Chippewas proved to be the class of the conference as they won 12 league games, claimed the MAC West title, and earned the No. 1 seed for the MAC Tournament.

A postseason berth, the program's first in more than a decade, followed as CMU accepted a bit to the National Invitation Tournament.

For orchestrating CMU's historic turnaround, Davis was selected as MAC and National Association of Basketball Coaches District Coach of the Year. In recognition of success achieved on the court and his moral integrity displayed off



the court, Davis was also honored with the 2015 Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award.

Davis' continued emphasis on the importance of academics was reflected in the fact that CMU was one of only 19 Division I schools to receive the Team Academic Excellence Award from the NABC. Seventeen times in Davis' seven seasons in charge of the program have Chippewas landed on the league academic honor squad.

Davis and his assistants have also made inroads in another key area, camps. CMU hosted more than 1,000 youngsters during its four camps throughout the summer months in 2019.

Davis' positive and uplifting message has clearly struck an immediate chord with Chippewa fans. His Twitter account boasts more than 22,000 followers, ranking Davis in the top 15 among all Division I head coaches and first among all mid-major programs.

### DAVIS' BACKGROUND IS STEEPED IN TRADITION AND SUCCESS

Davis was introduced by as the Chippewas' 20th men's basketball coach on April 3, 2012, bringing four years of Division I head coaching experience.

In 2008, Davis was named the coach of the year by six national organizations, including the Associated Press, the U.S. Basketball Writers Association, and The Sporting News.

In one season at Drake and three at Providence, Davis compiled a 74-55 (.574) record and made two postseason appearances.

In 2007-08, Davis' first as a head coach, he led Drake to a 28-5 record, including a 15-3 mark in the Missouri Valley Conference. His team captured its first MVC regular-season title since 1971, the first MVC Tournament championship in program history, and the Bulldogs made their first trip to the NCAA Tournament since 1971.

Drake was nationally ranked for a school-record eight consecutive weeks and finished 14th in the Associated Press Poll and 23rd in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll.

Davis inherited a team that had graduated four starters from a squad that went 17-15 in 2006-07. He took a team that was picked to finish ninth in the MVC to the program's first top-25 ranking since 1974-75.

Moving to Providence in 2008-09, Davis guided the Friars to a 19-14 mark in his first season, including

a 10-8 finish in the BIG EAST. The 19 victories was the most for a first-year coach in the history of the program, and two of those wins came over top-15 teams, including Pittsburgh, which was ranked No. 1 nationally when the Friars posted an 81-73 upset.

That Providence squad finished tied for sixth place in the conference after it was picked to finish 12th in the preseason poll. Davis led Providence to its first BIG EAST Tournament victory in six years and into the postseason as the Friars earned an at-large bid to the NIT.

In 2009-10 Davis' team ranked third in the nation in scoring at 82.4 points per game.

Davis has a proven track record of developing players and preparing them for the next level. At Providence, he mentored MarShon Brooks, who was selected by the Boston Celtics with the 25th pick in the 2011 NBA Draft after Brooks had earned multiple All-America honors.

Prior to taking over as the head coach at Drake, Davis served as an assistant under his father, Dr. Tom Davis, at Drake from 2003-07. Keno Davis began his coaching career in 1995 as an assistant for two years under Bruce Pearl at Southern Indiana, then served as an assistant under Gary Garner at Southeast Missouri State from 1997-2003.

Davis was exposed to basketball at a very young age as he watched his father become one of the NCAA's all-time winningest coaches. In 32 seasons as a head coach at Lafayette (1971-77), Boston College (1977-82), Stanford (1982-86), lowa (1986-99) and Drake (2003-07), Tom Davis registered a 598-355 record (.628), which included 18 postseason appearances and 16 20-win seasons.

Keno and his father share the distinction of being the only father-son duo to have captured national coach of the year honors. In 1987, Tom Davis was named by the Associated Press as its National Coach of the Year. The Davis duo has combined for 797 victories, which ranks 11th all-time in Division I history and third among duos in which one coach remains active.

# GAME 2

Mount Pleasant, Mich. • McGuirk Arena • Nov. 10, 2019 Central Michigan 134, Mississippi Valley State 78

- David DiLeo scored a career-high 30 points as the Central Michigan rolled past Mississippi Valley State, 134-78, in a nonconference game at McGuirk Arena.
- The 134 points is a program record, surpassing the previous best, 127, which was set twice, the first time against Oakland on Dec. 3, 1987, and the second on Jan. 3, 2014 against Marygrove.
- The Chippewas led by nine, 36-27, with just over seven minutes to play in the first half, when Dallas Morgan hit a 3-pointer to trigger a 33-15 CMU onslaught to close the half. The Chippewas led, 69-42, at the break.
- The Chippewas forced 23 turnovers while committing just six, and 16 of Mississippi Valley State's turnovers were Chippewa steals. Kevin McKay, Deschon Winston and Travon Broadway Jr. combined for 10 of the 16 steals.
- The Chippewas outrebounded the Delta Devils 60-37, with 22 of the Chippewas' boards coming on the offensive end. CMU's bench outscored Mississippi Valley State's 57-24, and the Chippewas outscored the Delta Devils, 64-34, in the paint.
- Rob Montgomery and Dallas Morgan added 17 points each for the Chippewas, who had seven players reach double figures.
- Romelo Burrell led the Chippewas in rebounds with 11, and Winston finished with a team-high six assists.
- The Chippewas surpassed the 100-point plateau for the second-consecutive game after their 102-62 victory over UM-Dearborn in their season opener on Tuesday.
- The 134-point effort on Sunday gave CMU its first back-to-back 100-point games since the 1972-73 season, when they beat Montana State, 102-75, and then topped Western Illinois, 102-82.
- The Chippewas have surpassed the century mark 23 times under Davis.

- Dallas Morgan scored a career-high 23 points and David DiLeo added 22 as the Central Michigan opened the season by rolling to a 102-62 nonconference victory over Michigan-Dearborn at McGuirk Arena.
- It was CMU's seventh-consecutive win in a season opener under eighth-year coach Keno Davis, and it marked the fifth time that Davis' Chippewas have crested the 100-point plateau in such games.
- Morgan hit a jumper with 5:11 to play in the first half, putting CMU up 33-30 and triggering a 20-4 run that gave CMU its largest lead of the first half, 51-34, with just under a minute to play before the break.
- DiLeo, who made five of his seven 3-point attempts on the night, drilled three triples and scored 12 points during the surge. The Chippewas began the second half with a 14-2 spurt, extending their lead to 27 points, 65-38, with under 16 minutes to play as they won going away.
- Morgan and DiLeo finished a combined 15 for 22 from the field as the Chippewas hit 52.9 percent of their field goal attempts, including 12 of their 27 3-point tries.
- · CMU caused 25 turnovers, 18 of which were steals. They committed just four
- Rob Montgomery added 12 points and a game-high nine rebounds for the Chippewas.
- Two transfers, guards Devontae Lane and Travon Broadway Jr., playing their first game in a CMU uniform, had 11 and 17 points, respectively, and combined for 11 assists. Broadway made seven of his eight field goal attempts.

- Down 70-65 in the second half with just over four minutes to play, David DiLeo banked in a 3-pointer to spark a 19-7 run and fuel the CMU to an 84-77 win over defending Southland Conference champion Sam Houston State.
- CMU improves to 3-0 while the Bearkats fall to 1-2.
- SHSU got off to a fast start with good ball movement and pesky defense. The lead would grow to as large as 27-15 in the first half for the Bearkats.
- · CMU would answer with a 15-6 run, triggered by a Kevin McKay basket that cut the lead to 33-32.
- The second half featured seven lead changes between the two teams but CMU was strong late and was able to come out on top.
- CMU shot 37.9 percent from the field and 28 percent from beyond the arc as compared to 43.8 percent overall and 40 percent from 3-point range by SHSU.

- Dallas Morgan scored a career-high 27 points to lead six Chippewas in double figures on Monday as Central Michigan cruised past NAIA Siena Heights, 115-58, in a nonconference game at McGuirk Arena.
- It marked the third time this season that CMU (4-0) has scored more than 100 points. The Chippewas entered the game second in the nation in scoring at 106.7 points per game.
