THE STARTING LINEUP

SETTING THE SCENE

- Central Michigan (1-0, 1-0 MAC) heads out on the road for the first time when it travels to Northern Illinois (0-1, 0-1 MAC) on Wednesday, Nov. 11
- The contest is scheduled for a 8 p.m. ET kickoff and will be broadcast on ESPNU with Mike Corey (play-by-play) and Rocky Boiman (analyst) calling the action.
- Central Michigan captured its fifth MAC West Division title last season. CMU's previous titles came in 2006, 2007, 2009 and 2015. It was the first outright title since the 2009 season.
- The Maroon and Gold stands 26-18-1 in MAC road openers. CMU lost at WMU, 31-15, last year and at NIU, 24-16, in 2018 but won two straight prior to that. The Chippewas beat Ohio, 26-23, in 2017 in Athens and tallied a 34-28 victory at Northern Illinois in 2016.
- The Maroon and Gold are looking to go to 2-0 in conference action for the first time since 2009. CMU went 8-0 in MAC action that year. The Chippewas defeated Ohio, 30-27, to open the season last week in Kelly/Shorts Stadium. A victory over the Huskies would be CMU's first 2-0 start to the season since 2017 when the Chippewas opened with wins over Rhode Island and at Kansas.

CENTRAL MICHIGAN-NIU SERIES

- Central Michigan owns a 30-24-1 record in its all-time series versus Northern Illinois.
- The Chippewas are 11-15-1 in DeKalb.
- The Chippewas are 19-9 against NIU at home.
- Central Michigan has dominated the series with the Huskies of late, winning five of the last six meetings:
 - 2019: at CMU 48, NIU 10
 - 2018: at NIU 24, CMU 16
 - 2017: at CMU 31, NIU 24
 - 2016: CMU 34, at NIU 28 (3OT)
 - 2015: at CMU 29, NIU 19
 - 2014: CMU 34, at NIU 17
- CMU has also won 10 of its last 13 games against Northern Illinois.

FIRST TIME

- Central Michigan had six first-time starters against Ohio: OL Deiyantei Powell-Woods, QB Daniel Richardson, WR Dallas Dixon, DL Tico Brown, LB Chuck Jones and DB Brian Edwards.

- For Dixon and Edwards, it was their first action ever as a Chippewa. Joining them were DB Daedae Hill, RB Zahir Swann, DB Richard Bowens, DB Donte Kent, LB Jayden Cray, P Luke Elzinga, LS Riley John and OL Cade Klimczak.
- CMU had four true freshman see action: Cray, Hill, Kent and Swann.

DANIEL RICHARDSON TAKES THE REIGNS

- Daniel Richardson joined four other players who were the primary starting quarterback to start the season as an underclassmen since 2000. Ryan Radcliff, Tony Poljan and Richardson started the season at QB while Dan LeFevour started in his second career game and Cooper Rush got his first start three games into his freshman year.
- Here is how each player fared his first year as starter:
 - LeFevour (Fr. Year) – 247-388, 3,031 yards, 26 TDs, 10 INTs
 - Radcliff (So. Year) – 282-466, 3,358 yards, 17 TDs, 17 INTs
 - Rush (Fr. Year) – 177-312, 2,349 yards, 15 TDs, 15 INTs
 - Poljan (So. Year) – 76-147, 625 yards, 2 touchdowns, 5 INTs
- LeFevour also ran for 521 yards and seven touchdowns.
- The last CMU freshman to begin the season as starter at QB was Jeff Bender in 1988. He finished his first season going 93-169 with 1,309 yards and seven touchdowns.

MOUNT PLEASANT, MICH. – In a show-me game, Central Michigan showed up, big-time.

The Chippewas scored touchdowns on their first three drives en route to a 28-point halftime lead on Saturday as they rolled past Northern Illinois, 48-10, in a Mid-American Conference game before 10,438 at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

The win kept the Chippewas, 6-4, 4-2 MAC, in the hunt for the West Division title and it came one week after they took a 43-20 beating in a league game at Buffalo.

CMU goes to division-leading Ball State on Nov. 16. The Cardinals are 3-1 in the league and play at Western Michigan on Tuesday, Nov. 5.

The Chippewas rolled through the Huskie defense to the tune of a season-high 615 yards. They did not commit a turnover after giving it away five times a week ago.

With six wins, CMU is bowl eligible for the 11th time in the last 14 seasons and is 5-0 at home for the first time since 2009, when they won the MAC championship.

Kobe Lewis ran for 143 yards and Jonathan Ward had 138 to lead a Chippewa ground game that churned out 327 yards. CMU quarterback Quinten Dormady had 288 yards and three touchdowns on 18-of-24 passing.

Dormady capped CMU's opening drive with a 14-yard TD pass to Kalil Pimpleton, then Tommy Lazzaro scored on a 3-yard run to give CMU a 14-0 lead.

After an NIU field goal, Lewis scored on a 16-yard run and Ryan Tice kicked a 32-yard field goal to up CMU's lead to 24-3 just three minutes into the second quarter. Dormady tossed a 39-yard TD pass to Tony Poljan and then hit Tyrone Scott for a 16-yard score as CMU took complete control, leading 38-10 at halftime.

The 38 points was the most a Chippewa team has scored in the first half of a game since 2006.

The Chippewa defense forced four turnovers and limited NIU running back Tre Harbison to 17 yards on 10 carries. Harbison had run for a combined 500 yards in the Huskies' previous four games. The Huskies finished with 251 total yards, just 22 of which came on the ground.



CHIPPEWA NAME

The Central Michigan University Board of Trustees has approved the continued use of the nickname "Chippewas" in association with CMU. The university's goals are to use the name with honor and respect, increase supportive connections between CMU and Native Americans, and improve efforts to sensitize students, faculty, and staff to Native American traditions and cultures.

Media representatives have been extremely cooperative as we have worked to address this important issue. In nearly all cases, print and broadcast reporters have supported CMU's efforts to eliminate the use of symbols, headlines, and copy that present inappropriate and inaccurate images of Native Americans.

Central Michigan University is grateful for your help, and we ask for your continued cooperation and sensitivity. With your assistance, we can continue to use the Chippewa name with dignity and respect.

NEWS & NOTES

ONES TO WATCH

- Three Chippewas were named to the watch list for a combined six awards in the run-up to the 2020 season.
- Wide receiver/kick returner Kalil Pimpleton was named to the Maxwell (outstanding player in college football), Hornung (most versatile player), and Biletnikoff (outstanding receiver) award watch lists.
- Linebacker Troy Brown was named to the Bronco Nagurski Trophy (top defensive player) and Bednarik Award (top defensive player) watch lists
- Running back Kobe Lewis was named to the Doak Walker Award (top running back) watch list. All three Chippewas are juniors.

DYNAMIC DUO

- Central Michigan features one of the best receiving duos in the nation in junior Kalil Pimpleton and senior JaCorey Sullivan.
- Both earned First Team All-MAC honors in 2019. Pimpleton was also named a first-team all-leaguer as a punt returner.
- The pair combined to catch 139 passes for 1,702 yards and nine touchdowns in 2019.
- Pimpleton, a junior, led the MAC in both receptions (82) and receiving yardage (894) and his six TD receptions tied him for fourth in the conference. Pimpleton ranked first in the MAC in receptions per game (5.9) and was second in both receiving yards per game (63.9) and punt-return average (8.7 yards).
- Pimpleton begins the 2020 season on the Maxwell (outstanding player in college football), Hornung (most versatile player), and Biletnikoff (outstanding receiver) award watch lists.
- Pimpleton had 11 receptions vs. Miami (Fla.) on 9/21/19. The 11 catches tied for the most by a MAC receiver in a single game in the 2019 season; his total was also the most for a Chippewa since Cody Wilson had 11 against Northern Illinois in a 2010 game.
- Pimpleton's 82 catches in 2019 rank as the sixth-best total in CMU history.
- Sullivan, a senior, made 57 catches for 808 yards – ranking third in the MAC in both categories -- and three TDs in 2019.
- Both hail from Muskegon and were senior teammates on the Muskegon High School team that posted a 12-2 record and finished as the state runner-up.

JOIN THE PARTY

- Ty Scott, a sophomore, became a solid playmaker as a complement to Pimpleton and Sullivan in the receiving corps in 2019.

Scott ranked third on the team with 37 catches and 650 yards for a team-best 17.7-yard-per-catch average. He ranked second on the team with five TD receptions.

1,000-YARD MAN

- Running back Kobe Lewis enjoyed a breakout season in 2019, rushing for 1,074 yards and 12 TDs on 182 carries. He averaged 5.9 yards per carry, ranking fourth in the MAC. He was sixth in the league in rushing yardage and in rushing TDs.
- Lewis also caught 23 passes for 164 yards and returned 13 kicks for 308 yards, a 23.7-yard average. He ranked sixth in the MAC in kick-return average.
- Lewis posted the 38th 1,000-yard rushing season in program history and became the 27th Chippewa to accomplish the feat.
- Lewis and Jonathan Ward both surpassed the 1,000-yard milestone in 2019, marking the first time two Chippewas had done that in the same season in program history. Ward, now in the NFL with the Arizona Cardinals, collected 1,108 rushing yards.

BURSTING ONTO THE SCENE

- Linebacker Troy Brown burst onto the scene in 2019, earning First Team All-MAC honors and the Herb Deromedi Team Most Valuable Player Award.
- Brown led the Chippewas in total tackles (91), solo tackles (75), tackles-for-loss (16.5), and shared the team lead in interceptions (3) and fumble recoveries (1).
- He ranked second in the MAC and 20th nationally in solo tackles and was 23rd nationally in tackles-for-loss.
- Brown, a junior, moved to linebacker from the secondary prior to the 2019 season. He played almost exclusively on special teams as a redshirt freshman in 2018.
- Brown served as a team captain in 2019.

McELWAIN HONORED BY MAC

- Head Coach Jim McElwain was named the MAC Coach of the Year in 2019, his first year in charge of the program.
- McElwain is the third CMU coach to earn the MAC Coach of the Year Award and the first since Dick Flynn in 1994.

Herb Deromedi was named the league's top coach in 1980 and in 1990.

- It marks the third time in his career that McElwain has earned a league coach of the year award. He was named the Mountain West Coach of the Year while leading Colorado State in 2014 and he earned the Southeastern Conference Coach of the Year Award at Florida in 2015.
- McElwain is just the fourth individual to earn COY honors in three Division I conferences. The others are: Brady Hoke (2008 MAC - Ball State; 2010 MWC - San Diego State; 2011 Big Ten - Michigan). Hoke is beginning his second stint as the head coach at San Diego State.
- Gary Patterson (2002 C-USA - TCU; 2005 and 2009 MWC - TCU; 2014 Big 12 - TCU).
- Dennis Stolz (1974 Big Ten - Michigan State; 1982 and 1985 MAC - Bowling Green; 1986 WAC - San Diego State).

CHIPPEWAS RETURN FOUR ALL-MAC HONOREES

- Eight Central Michigan football players earned individual accolades from the Mid-American Conference in 2019. Four of those players – Kalil Pimpleton, JaCorey Sullivan, Troy Brown and Robi Stuart -- return in 2020.
- Kalil Pimpleton was named to the first team at two positions, wide receiver and punt returner. Also named to the first team were wideout JaCorey Sullivan, linebacker Troy Brown, and defensive lineman Sean Adesanya.
- Tight end Tony Poljan and linebacker Michael Oliver were each named to the second team, while running back Jonathan Ward and defensive lineman Robi Stuart each earned a spot on the

third team. Stuart is back in 2020.

NATION'S TOP TURNAROUND

- Central Michigan recorded the biggest turnaround in the nation in 2019, both overall and in conference games. After finishing 1-11, 0-8 MAC in 2018, the Chippewas went 8-6, 6-2.
- In winning seven more games in 2019 than it did in 2018, CMU tied Navy for the biggest one-season win increase. The Midshipmen went 10-2 in 2019 after finishing 3-10 in '18.
- The Chippewas also finished the MAC schedule plus-six in the win category, one better in terms of conference improvement than Navy (American) and Louisville (ACC).
- CMU matched the biggest turnaround in program history in 2019. The 1909 team went 7-1, a seven-game improvement from the previous year.
- The Chippewas won the MAC West title and earned a berth in the MAC Championship Game, accomplishing those feats for the first time since 2009.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Under Jim McElwain, the Chippewas are unbeaten (7-0) at home. CMU went 6-0 last year, the first time they have accomplished that feat since 1980.
- In those games, the Chippewas outscored their opponents, 294-133, at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.
- The 264 points last year were the most any Chippewa team has ever scored in at home in a season. The previous top mark was 253 by the 2009 squad.
- At home, CMU's offense was dynamic, averaging 42.0 points per game (23 rushing TDs, 15 passing TDs), 532.7 yards per game (270.4 rushing, 262.3

passing) and 25.2 first downs per game. CMU allowed just two sacks in the seven games. Five times -- vs. Akron, Eastern Michigan, New Mexico State, Northern Illinois, Toledo and Ohio -- the Chippewas did not surrender a sack.

- The CMU defense was also strong, particularly against the run, in Kelly/Shorts. CMU allowed just 69.5 rushing yards per game, an average of 2.4 yards per carry, and only four rushing touchdowns. The CMU defense had 56 tackles-for-loss and 24 sacks.
- Kelly/Shorts Stadium began hosting CMU football games in 1972. The Chippewas have posted a 174-81-4 record (.677 winning percentage) at home.

GOING NATIONAL

- Four of the Chippewas' six games in 2020 are slated to be televised nationally, beginning with the Wednesday, Nov. 4 opener at Kelly/Shorts Stadium against Ohio. The game will be carried live by ESPN and is scheduled to kick off at 7 p.m.
- CMU's other three nationally televised games: Wednesday, Nov. 11 at Northern Illinois, 8 p.m. EST, ESPNU; Wednesday, Nov. 18 vs. Western Michigan, 7 p.m., ESPN2; Friday, Nov. 27 at Eastern Michigan, 4 p.m. kickoff, CBS Sports Network.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

- The Chippewas scored 426 points in 2019, the fourth-highest total in program history behind the 487 scored by the 2007 team.
- CMU averaged 433.6 yards per game in 2019, ranking fifth in the MAC and 37th nationally in total offense. The Chippewas averaged 252.2 yards per game through the air last season, ranking second in the MAC.
- The Chippewas converted 56.6 percent (17 of 30) of their fourth-down attempts in 2019. Their opponents converted 37.5 percent.
- The Chippewas rolled up 615 yards of total offense in a 48-10 victory over Northern Illinois on Nov. 2, 2019. The yardage total was the most for a CMU team since the 2007 squad rolled up 639 yards in a 35-32 victory over Akron.
- CMU posted back-to-back 300-yard rushing games in 2019, the first time the Chippewas have accomplished that feat since

1994. They finished with 308 yards in a victory over Eastern Michigan (10/5/19) and then followed with a 352-yard effort against New Mexico State (10/12/19).

- The 352 yards rushing against New Mexico was the most by a CMU squad since it tallied 352 against New Hampshire in 2003.

LOOK AT THE O-LINE

- Central Michigan enters the 2020 season with a reworked offensive line. Four players who started in 2019 are gone to graduation (Center Steve Eipper, Tackle Clay Walderzak and Guard Oge Udeogu) or injury (Tackle Luke Goedeke). In total, CMU lost 85 starts from this group.
- Derek Smith returns as a starting tackle after playing at guard last year and Jamezz Kimbrough will start at center. Kimbrough was a starter in 2018 and sat out 2019 with an injury.
- Among those expected to start or play significant snaps up front 2020 are guards Deiyantei Powell-Woods and Danny Motowski.
- Junior Bernhard Raimann has moved to tackle from tight end to shore up the interior of the line. Keegan Cossou also moved to tackle from defensive line after coming to CMU as a tight end.

EXPLOSIVES

- Explosive plays were a big part of several Central Michigan victories in 2019. In those games, the Chippewas had 23 scoring plays that covered at least 25 yards.

- CMU added another explosive touchdown against Ohio with a 50-yard touchdown pass from Daniel Richardson to Kalil Pimpleton.

A BIG RUSH

- The Chippewas won eight games in 2019, averaging 262.8 yards rushing in those eight victories. In their six losses, they averaged 72.8 yards on the ground.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- CMU returns nine of its top 14 tacklers from the 2019 season, led by linebacker Troy Brown, a First Team All-MAC selection, and safety Devonni Reed.
- Brown was the Chippewas' top tackler (91 total stops) in 2019, while Reed was third on the team with 74. The other seven returnees who were among the defensive leaders a year ago are linebacker Chuck Jones, safeties Gage Kreski, Alonzo McCoy and Willie Reid, linemen Laquan Johnson and Robi Stuart, and end Troy Hairston.
- The Chippewa defense in 2019 ranked second in the MAC, having allowed an average of 363 yards per game.
- CMU ranked second in the MAC and 24th in the nation in rush defense, allowing 122.8 yards per game last season.
- The Chippewas averaged 7.9 tackles-for-loss in 2019, leading the MAC and ranking eighth nationally.

SWITCHING IT UP

- Multiple CMU student-athletes have switched positions or taken new roles this offseason
- Bernhard Raimann is now at left tackle after playing his first two seasons at tight end.
- Darius Bracy is now a running back, moving over from defensive back. Bracy was a quarterback in high school.
- Kumehnnu Gwilly is now on defense, playing linebacker and defensive line, after seeing action at running back the last

three years.

- Keegan Cossou has moved to offensive tackle from defensive end.

CMU OPENS CHIPPEWA CHAMPIONS CENTER

- The Central Michigan football coaches, student-athletes and support staff have moved into the brand new Chippewa Champions Center in the north end of Kelly/Shorts Stadium. Highlights of the building include:
- More than 50,000 square feet dedicated to the student-athlete excellence.
- A 7,000 square foot, state-of-the-art performance center focused on the growth and development of football student-athletes.
- Expanded sport medicine and rehabilitation facility with hydrotherapy pools serving as the primary hub for the CMU Athletics training team.
- A Champions Plaza at the entrance of the facility showcasing the rich history of CMU Athletics.
- The 4,000-square-foot Isabella Bank Field level club and 16 Loge boxes on the second level.
- Two fuel stations to accommodate the nutrition needs of nearly 500 student-athletes.
- A 4,200 square foot football locker room.
- More than 7,100 square feet of coaches offices and meeting spaces.

CHIPPEWAS IN THE NFL

- Ten former Chippewas currently reside on NFL rosters.
- Eric Fisher, the No. 1 pick in the 2013 NFL Draft, is in his eighth season with the Kansas City Chiefs. He entered the 2020 season having played in more than 100 NFL games, nearly all of them starts, and helped lead the Chiefs to victory in Super Bowl LIV.

HEAD COACH JIM McELWAIN

SECOND SEASON 9-6 AT CMU, 53-34 CAREER

In his first season at Central Michigan, Jim McElwain led the Chippewas to a remarkable turnaround as CMU won the Mid-American Conference West Division championship and earned a berth in the New Mexico Bowl.

McElwain inherited a program that won one game in 2018 and transformed it immediately into a winner, leading CMU to an 8-6 record in 2019.

The seven-win improvement was the best among Football Bowl Subdivision programs in 2019 and the Chippewas made their first appearance in the MAC Championship Game in more than a decade. McElwain earned the MAC Coach of the Year Award.

McElwain lived up to his reputation as an offensive mastermind as the 2019 Chippewas nearly doubled their 2018 yardage total and scored 426 points, a 246-point improvement over the previous season.

From Opening Press Conference:
We want to find out who wants to be here, we want to find out who's committed to being a Chippewa; that is important. Yet, that gets lost in translation. We're going to find out who our leaders are, we're going to find out who we can count on and move forward and build from there. Where are our strengths? I've got an idea of some, but I haven't seen them yet, right? I haven't met with them individually, so I want to find out how they're made up, what makes them want to be a Chippewa and understand this: It's a privilege, and not a right.

HEAD COACH JIM McELWAIN (CONTINUED)

CMU running backs Jonathan Ward and Kobe Lewis both surpassed 1,000 yards rushing, marking the first time in the long and illustrious history of Chippewa football that two players reached the 1,000-yard milestone in the same season.

Ward finished fourth in the MAC and Lewis was sixth in rushing yardage, while Lewis was second and Ward was third in all-purpose yardage. The Chippewas featured three of the top five wide receivers in the MAC in Kalil Pimpleton, JaCorey Sullivan and Tyrone Scott.

Pimpleton led the league in both receptions (90) and receiving yardage (934) and earned First Team All-MAC honors as both a wide receiver and as a punt returner. Sullivan also earned first team all-conference honors.

In all, eight Chippewas earned All-MAC honors in 2019. Five, including first-team linebacker Troy Brown, are set to return in 2020;.

McElwain was named to head the program on Dec. 2, 2018. He came to CMU with an exceptional resumé that included successful runs in heading the programs at Florida and at Colorado State, along with membership on coaching staffs of national-championship teams.

- McElwain coached at Florida from 2015-17, compiling a 22-12 overall record, two SEC East titles and two SEC Championship Game appearances. He earned the SEC Coach of the Year Award in 2015.
- Those titles made him the first coach in league history to reach the SEC Championship Game in his first two seasons as head coach. Just two other coaches reached the title game in their first season.
- He led Colorado State to a 10-3 finish in 2014, earning the Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year Award. He earned American Football Coaches Association regional coach of the year awards in both 2014 and 2015.
- As the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach under Nick Saban at Alabama from 2008-11, McElwain helped the Crimson Tide to two national championships and coached 2009 Heisman Trophy winner Mark Ingram.
- McElwain served as an assistant at Michigan under

Jim Harbaugh during the 2018 season, helping the Wolverines to a 10-2 regular-season finish and a top-10 ranking.

In nearly 30 years of collegiate coaching, McElwain has consistently displayed an ability to build winning teams with a focus on academic success, an eagerness to engage fans and the community, and a determination to maintain integrity throughout the program.

McElwain is a native of Missoula, Mont. He played quarterback at Eastern Washington from 1980-83 and began his climb up the coaching ladder at his alma mater, first as a graduate assistant and then as the quarterbacks/wide receivers coach from 1987-94.

He moved on to Montana State in 1995, serving as the Bobcats' offensive coordinator, their wide receivers coach, and as their special teams coordinator.

McElwain served as the wide receivers team/special teams coordinator at Louisville from 2000-02 and at Michigan State as the assistant head coach, wide receivers coach and special teams coordinator from 2003-05.

In 2006, McElwain moved on to the NFL as the quarterbacks coach for the Oakland Raiders. He returned to the college game in 2007, helping lead Fresno State to a 9-4 finish while serving as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach.

In 2008, McElwain joined Saban's staff at Alabama. The Crimson Tide amassed an incredible 48-6 combined record in McElwain's four years on the staff, winning national titles in 2009 and 2011.

In 2012-14, McElwain led Colorado State to a combined 22 victories including 10 in 2014. The 10 wins tied for the second most in program history. Colorado State had won just nine games in the combined three years prior to McElwain's arrival.

McElwain and his wife, Karen, have three children: JoHanna, Elizabeth and Jerret.

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. – Redshirt freshman quarterback Daniel Richardson threw for 243 yards and a touchdown and the Central Michigan defense pitched a second-half shutout on Wednesday as the Chippewas won their long-delayed season opener, 30-27, over Ohio at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

Richardson, who threw three passes as a true freshman in 2019, completed 23 of his 41 attempts and his TD pass, the first of his career, was a 50-yard dart to Kalil Pimpleton.

“D-Rich, for his first start, really handled it well, really proud of him, the way he played,” McElwain said. “He did a great job of taking care of the football.”

Ohio returned the second-half kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown to seize a 27-20 lead. The Chippewas answered with an 8-yard Kobe Lewis touchdown run with under 11 minutes remaining in the third quarter, tying it at 27-all.

Freshman Marshall Meeder’s first career field goal, a 20-yarder, with 9:05 to play put CMU up, 30-27, and proved to be the difference as the Chippewa defense buckled down in the second half, forced two turnovers, and slammed the door.

Kobe Lewis ran for 112 yards and two touchdowns on 28 carries to lead the Chippewa ground game. He and Darius Bracy recorded a number of carries out of the wildcat formation.

“With D-Rich, this being his first start, we didn’t want to put him in too many awkward situations,” said Lewis, a junior, who said he had not run the ball out of the wildcat formation since high school. “We took a load off for him. It really helped him out today.”

Not that D-Rich, who posted video-game-like numbers as a high school phenom in Miami, Fla., necessarily needed it. But it certainly helped as the Chippewas held a nine-plus-minute advantage in possession time.

Richardson and the Chippewa offense was impressive right off the bat, marching 75 yards in 16 plays on the game’s opening drive and taking a 7-0 lead on Richardson’s 1-yard TD sneak.

That touched off an entertaining first half that was filled with big plays and ended in a 20-20 tie. De’Montre Tuggle broke the tie by returning the second-half kickoff 93 yards for a score to put Ohio up 27-20.

But after that, the CMU defense took center stage and the Chippewa run game did enough to get the job done.
