GAME PREVIEW

They say it isn't about what happens to you, but how you respond to it.

Central Michigan will look to respond on Saturday when it entertains Akron in its homecoming game (3:30 p.m.) on Kramer/Deromedi Field at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

The Chippewas are 3-3, 1-1 Mid-American Conference after a 37-13 loss last week at Buffalo. CMU committed four turnovers, two of which were interceptions that were returned by the Bulls for touchdowns. The other two turnovers – an interception and a fumble – led directly to 10 Buffalo points.

If you're scoring at home, that's 24 points the Chippewas gave away in turnovers.

"That was a quiet locker room and a quiet trip home and a quiet Sunday meal and a quiet meeting room (on Monday)," fifth-year CMU coach Jim McElwain said. "Which tells me they understand and that's important."

The Chippewas actually finished with more total yardage, 360-355, and more first downs, 21-18, than did the Bulls. But no matter how it's colored or how much sugar is added to the mix, the Chippewas lost the game and now have little room for error in their quest for the MAC West championship.

CMU is in a four-way tie for second place in the division behind Toledo, which is 2-0 in league play. Akron is 1-5, 0-2 and coming off a 55-14 home loss to Northern Illinois. One week prior, the Zips fell at home to Buffalo, 13-10, in overtime.

"It makes each game more important and each day that we prep for the game that much more important," junior safety Trey Jones said. "We know when we go into the meeting room, when we go to practice, we've got to be laser focused and that's happening."



Redshirt sophomore wide receiver Chris Parker scored to give the Chippewas a 14-10 lead going into halftime against Eastern Michigan (Sept. 30). Parker has 14 catches, 255 yards and two touchdowns, all rank second among the CMU receiving corps.

"I do think that we are a better team than what we showed last week. Do we have something to prove? I think we always have something to prove."

The Chippewas are 2-0 at home with both victories coming by slim margins. They kicked a field goal as time ran out in a 45-42 win over New Hampshire

and then held off Eastern Michigan, 26-23, to take their MAC opener when the Eagles missed a potential game-tying field goal with under a minute to play.

Quarterback Jase Bauer, the interceptions notwithstanding, posted career-best numbers last week with 28 completions and two touchdowns on 49 attempts for 280 yards.

"The beautiful thing about playing the quarterback position, as I'm well aware of, when things are going well everybody loves you," said McElwain, who played quarterback at Eastern Washington. "When things fall apart, you're the one they blame. That goes with the territory of playing the position.

"The important thing is to understand what maybe caused some of those plays and (ask), was it all driven from that position or were there things other guys could have done in doing their job the way they've been coached, the way they've practiced it." Regardless, the Chippewas can't dwell on Buffalo. They can only look ahead and be mindful that they need victories to remain in the hunt with the most important part of the season in front of them.

"Really, the message is, it happened, it's in the past, can't do anything about it now," Jones said. "Learn from it, fix it, and get ready for Akron."



CENTRAL MICHIGAN GAME NOTES

Today's Top Storylines

- On a two-game home win streak, Central Michigan returns home to host Akron for its 2023 Homecoming Game.
- The matchup marks Central Michigan's 99th annual Homecoming Game in a tradition dating back to 1924.
- CMU has defeated Akron in nine of the last 10 meetings, including each of the last two contests.

About The Chippewas

Central Michigan (3-3, 1-1 MAC) hits the mid-point of the 2023 season when it hosts Akron (1-5, 0-2 MAC) for its 99th Homecoming Game, third MAC game, and seventh regular season contest on Saturday at Kramer/Deromedi Field at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

Central Michigan enters Saturday's game coming off a 37-13 loss at Buffalo. Buffalo scored 24 points off four Chippewa turnovers, Buffalo returned two interceptions for touchdowns, set up a third touchdown with another interception, and recovered a fumble that led to a field goal. UB led 23-7 at halftime. Ironically, through its first five games, CMU turned the ball over only four times. Central Michigan outgained Buffalo 360-355 in total yardage and gained 21 first downs to UB's 18. Quarterback Jase Bauer registered career-highs for completions (28), attempts (49), passing yards (280), and passing touchdowns (2). Running back Marion Lukes led the Chippewas in all-purpose yards (94) and caught a career-high seven passes for 73 yards. Jesse Prewitt III and Tyson Davis each caught touchdown passes.

Central Michigan is 2-0 in home games this year with wins over New Hampshire (45-42) and Eastern Michigan (26-23). Before a crowd of 28,323 on Sept. 30, the largest crowd to attend a game at CMU since 2016, Central Michigan scored on a 24-yard touchdown run by Lukes to take the lead with 7:55 to play then held off a last minute EMU drive as the Eagles missed a 46-yard field goal with 51 seconds to play to secure a 26-23 victory over Eastern Michigan. Bauer completed 19 of 26 passes for 218 yards and a touchdown and also rushed for another, Myles Bailey rushed for

CENTRAL MICHIGAN GAME NOTES

92 yards, Lukes led the Chippewas with 177 all-purpose yards, Chris Parker caught a 19-yard touchdown pass from Bauer, Kyle Moretti notched two sacks and led the defense with 10 tackles, and Jaylen Evans blocked an EMU PAT attempt which Dakota Cochran picked up and raced 89 yards for a two-point conversion. victory over Kansas on Sept. 9, 2017.

Homecoming Success

On Saturday, Central Michigan will play its 99th all-time Homecoming Game since the tradition began on Nov. 22, 1924 when the Chippewas defeated Alma 13-0.

Central Michigan holds a 59-34-1 all-time record in Homecoming Games. CMU did not play Homecoming games during four years from 1943-45 due to World War II and in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Next year's game marks the 100th anniversary of Homecoming at Central Michigan.

Series vs. Akron

- Central Michigan and Akron meet for the 30th time in a series dating back to Nov. 1, 1969.
- The Chippewas have claimed each of the last two matchups vs. Akron (45-24 in 2019 and 28-21 in 2022).
- Central Michigan holds a commanding 18-10-1 record vs. Akron, while the Chippewas have won nine of the last 10 matchups.
- In home games vs. Akron, CMU has won four straight games dating back to 2003. The Chippewas are 10-4 overall vs. the Zips in home games.

Chippewas in the National Rankings

After six games, Central Michigan finds itself ranked among top-35 national leaders in several statistical categories. The Chippewas rank:

- No. 8 in fumbles lost (1).
- No. 12 in kickoff returns (25.85).
- No. 24 in blocked kicks (1).

- No. 25 in fourth down conversion percentage (70.0).

In addition, several individuals are ranked among the nation's top-35 in a variety of statistics:

- Marion Lukes, No. 1 in kickoff return touchdowns (1).
- Marion Lukes, No. 13 in combined kick returns (324).
- Marion Lukes, No. 14 in kickoff returns (27.0).

- Jase Bauer, No. 24 in rushing touchdowns (6).
- Kyle Moretti, No. 24 in total tackles (9.0 per game).
- Maurice White, No. 29 in fumbles recovered (1).
- Jake Walrath, No. 31 in punting (43.6).
- Marion Lukes, No. 34 in all-purpose yards per game (112.67).

ABOUT AKRON

Akron enters Saturday's game against Central Michigan with a 1-5 overall record and 0-2 MAC record. The Zips have lost four consecutive games to Kentucky (35-3), Indiana (29-27), Buffalo (13-10), and Northern Illinois (55-14). Two of those games went into overtime including the Indiana contest (four overtimes) and the Buffalo game.

Akron is led by quarterback Tahj Bullock, who started the last game against Northern Illinois and has seen action in four contests. On the year, Bullock has completed 54.3 percent of his passes (19 of 35) for 146 yards and one touchdown and rushed for 61 yards on 30 carries with two touchdowns. Backing Bullock up is Jeff Undercuffler Jr. has seen action in four games, completed 28 of 41 passes for 286 yards and a touchdown.

Bullock and Undercuffler are in the mix because quarterback DJ Irons, who started the season's first five games, went down with an injury in the Buffalo game. Through the season's first five games, Irons completed 66.2 percent (88-133) of his passes for 722 yards and three touchdowns and ranked second on the team in rushing with 215 yards and two touchdowns on 61 carries.



Lorenzo Lingard leads the Zips in rushing with 287 yards and a touchdown on 56 carries. He averages 47.8 yards per game and 5.1 yards per carry. Drake Anderson has also rushed for 101 yards on 25 carries and a 4.0 yards per carry average.

Seven Zips receivers have 10 or more receptions. Jasaiah Gathings leads the squad in both receptions (23) and receiving yards (212). Lingard has 14 catches for 191 yards and a touchdown, Daniel George has caught 21 passes for 188 yards, while Alex Adams has 19 receptions for 165 yards and a touchdown. Other leading receivers include TJ Banks (14 receptions for 94 yards and a touchdown), Bobby Golden (12 receptions for 87 yards), and Anderson, who has 11 catches for 49 yards.

On defense, Akron is led by Brian McCoy, who has made 54 tackles (20 solo) with 4.0 tackles for loss and a sack. Antavious Fish has 35 tackles and three quarterback hurries, Darrian Lewis had made 31 tackles, KJ Martin has 27 tackles and CJ Nunnally has 22 tackles, a team-best 8.0 tackles for loss, 5.0 sacks, two quarterback hurries and a fumble return.

Coached by Joe Moorhead, Akron has scored two touchdowns on defense as Devonte Golden-Nelson returned an interception 50 yards for touchdown and McCoy scored on a 13-yard fumble return.





Guest Services/Lost and Found

Permitted Items

The following items may be brought into the stadium:

Prohibited Items

For the safety and game day experience of all fans, the following items are prohibited from entering the stadium:

- Computer bag
- Luggage
- Backpacks
- Fanny Packs
- Personal Seatbacks
- Outside food and drink including bottled water
- Aerosol and spray cans
- Weapons
- Drones
- Umbrellas regardless of size
- Animals (exception of service animals)
- Alcoholic beverages
- Coolers, thermoses, cups, bottles, cans or flasks

- Artificial noisemakers
- Smoking in the stadium
- Signs on poles that block the view of other fans or stadium advertisement

Central Michigan University reserves the right to deny anyone or anything from entering the stadium. Items that are left behind at point of entry are not the responsibility of the university.

Parking

All parking lots open four hours prior to kickoff and continue until kickoff. Tailgate lots will shut down at kickoff. Chippewa Club members and season ticket holders can save money by purchasing a season pass for only \$60. Contact Ticket Central at (989) 774-3045. Single game parking passes purchased in advance are \$15. Parking purchased on game day is \$20 and can only be purchased with cash at the entrance of designated lots.

Pets

All pets (including dogs) are prohibited inside Kelly/Shorts Stadium and tailgate areas. (Exception: Service animals are allowed to assist those with disabilities.)

Security

Our emergency action plan is designed in cooperation with the Department of Homeland Security to keep all fans safe while providing a pleasant game day experience. This is accomplished by all fans being aware of their surroundings and reporting any issues to police or security. Security personnel, trained annually for emergency procedures, are located throughout the stadium. All fans are subject to search as they enter the stadium to ensure a safe and secure environment.

Strollers

Strollers are allowed, but can't be left unattended in the concourse or areas of the stands. They are subject to search at the gates.

Tobacco Use

Central Michigan University establishes the following tobacco free policy, for all CMU properties, facilities, and vehicles in which university functions are offered or carried out, regardless of location. This includes all CMU sites whether owned or leased. As used herein, tobacco products includes traditional cigarettes, ecigarettes, chew, pipes, cigars, hookah or waterpipe smoking, snus, snuff, etc.



PARKING & TAILGATE INFORMATION

Handicapped Parking

Lots with handicapped parking spaces are 63E, 63W, 62E, 62W and 64. Lots 62E, 62W and 64 are reserved for Chippewa Club members. Spaces are on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Security/Safety:

All drivers should be observant of instructions from police officers and parking personnel. Vehicles parked in fire lanes, at the end of aisles and in any other illegal location will be ticketed and/or towed.

Reserving Spaces:

Spaces are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Spaces may not be reserved for later-arriving vehicles unless authorized by the CMU Athletics Department.

RV Parking:

- 1) RV's are permitted to park in lot 63W.
- 2) RV lots open four hours before kickoff. If you are trying to enter the lot during periods of heavy traffic, you may be directed to an alternate lot.
- 3) The cost for an RV parking pass in advance is \$65 for a single game and \$250 for a season pass. The cost of overnight parking is an additional \$40 and is only permitted in Lot 63W. Fans can spend the night before the game for all early kickoffs, and the night of the game for late starts.
- 4) Additional spaces must be purchased if your party exceeds the allotment of 4 spaces

Shuttle Service:

Shuttle service is available two hours prior to the game for patrons needing assistance into the stadium. Patrons will be picked up from four designated areas throughout the lot 62, 63, and 64 parking lots. For further assistance, please call (989) 774-3045.



PARKING/TAILGATING RULES

1. Parking permits should be clearly displayed from the rearview mirror in order to assist parking personnel in directing traffic. Permits should be displayed at all times.
2. All drivers should be observant of instructions from police officers and parking personnel. Vehicles parked in fire lanes, at the end of aisles and in any other illegal location will be ticketed and/or towed. Spaces are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Spaces may not be reserved for later-arriving vehicles unless authorized by the CMU Athletics Department.
3. Vehicles must only occupy one parking space. Tailgating accessories may not be placed in any designated parking space as space can be very limited.
4. Tailgating is permitted from four hours prior to kickoff to the start of the game. Tailgating is not permitted during the game, at halftime or after the game.
5. Michigan laws pertaining to the possession, consumption and distribution of alcohol and controlled substances will be enforced. Tailgating may not include kegs or mass quantities of alcohol. Glass containers are not permitted in the tailgating area.
6. The CMU Police Department determines the tailgating area. Alcohol is not permitted outside this area.
7. Drinking games or activities that encourage excessive alcohol consumption are prohibited.
8. Large trucks (e.g., U-Haul-type, over 2-1/2 tons, etc.), vehicles with trailers and buses are not permitted in the tailgating area without prior written Athletic Department approval.
9. Large grills pulled on their own wheels by vehicles are not permitted in the tailgating area without prior written Athletic Department approval. Open fires are not permitted.
10. No animals, with the exception of service animals, are permitted.
11. The use of external sound systems is permitted, but is subject to the control of CMU Police.
