GAME NOTES

SETTING THE SCENE

Central Michigan (1-1, 0-0 MAC) travels to St. Petersburg, Fla. to play two neutral site games in the Showdown in St. Pete. Both games will be played at Eckerd College's McArthur Center. The Chippewas will take on South Alabama (3-0, 0-0 SBC) on Thursday at 11 a.m. ET, then play Coppin State (0-3, 0-0 MEAC) on Friday at 11 a.m. ET. Both games will be streamed live on youtube.com.

New head coach Andy Bronkema made his debut and coached in his first game on Monday as he led the Chippewas to an 82-66 home victory over Appalachian State in the MAC/SBC Challenge. It was his debut and first regular season game coaching Central Michigan. Bronkema, along with his entire staff and 15-player roster, all made their Central Michigan debuts on Monday night. The entire coaching staff and roster is new from Central Michigan's 2024-25 team.

The Chippewas then hit the road for their first non conference road game at Bradley and dropped a 85-54 loss at Carver Arena.

Thursday's and Friday's contests will be streamed on youtube with Rocco Miller (play-by-play) and Nina Omidvar (color analyst) making the call.

Thursday's and Friday's contest can also

be listened to live on the Chippewa Sports Radio Network on 98.5-FM (WUPS-FM) and/or nationally on the Varsity Network app. Adam Jaksa (play-by-play) and Kyle Sandel (color analyst) handle announcing duties.

South Alabama and Central Michigan meet for the third time in history with the series tied at 1-1. CMU and Coppin State meet for the first time. Coppin State plays at South Florida on Wednesday, Nov. 12.

Central Michigan also defeated Saginaw Valley State 77-56 in an exhibition game on Friday, Oct. 24. Four Chippewas reached double figure scoring led by Jaxon Whitaker (16 points), Nathan Claerbaut (14), Will Ashford (12), and Tamario Adley (12).

The Chippewas opened their regular season with a dominating 82-66 home win over Appalachian State. Tamario Adley led the Chippewas with 22 points and seven rebounds, Logan McIntire finished with 14 points and hit 4-5 3-pointers as CMU jumped out to an early first half lead and never looked back.

TOP STORYLINES

- Central Michigan travels to St. Petersburg, Fla. to compete in the two-game Showdown in St. Pete against South Alabama (Nov. 13) and Coppin State (Nov. 14). Both games will be played at the McArthur Center at Eckerd College.
- The Chippewas enter the game with a 1-1 record after convincing home win over Appalachian State and a decisive loss at Bradley.
- Head Coach Andy Bronkema, the 22nd head men's basketball coach in school history, will coach in his third and fourth games at Central Michigan on Thursday and Friday in St. Petersburg.
- Central Michigan's entire 15-player roster and coaching staff made their Chippewa debuts on Monday.
- The Chippewas are coming off a 2024-25 season that saw them finish 14-17 overall and 7-11 in the MAC.

made up of 12 transfers and three freshmen. The 12 transfers include Phat Phat Brooks (Michigan), Rodney Johnson, Jr. (Tennessee Tech), Logan McIntire (Kentucky Wesleyan), Keenan Garner (IU-Indianapolis), Nick Mullen (IU-South Bend), Will Ashford (Purdue Northwest), Kayden Nation (Indian Hills C.C.), Tamario Adley (Wayne State), Kareem Aburashed (Wayne State), Nathan Claerbaut (Ferris State), Jaxson Whitaker (Ferris State), and Jorden Brooks (Ferris State). CMU's three true freshmen are Jalen Kampen, Uchenna Amene, and Nskian Usen.

- With no players returning to the program, the entire 15-player roster was assembled by Central Michigan's coaching staff from April through June, 2025.
- New head coach Andy Bronkema was named the program's 22nd head men's basketball coach on April 14, 2025. The university hosted a Welcome Event for Bronkema on the following day, April 15.
- A McBain, Mich. native, Bronkema spent the last 19 overall years and previous 12 years as the head coach at NCAA Division II Ferris State, where he accumulated a 278-105 overall record, 166-73 GLIAC record, captured one national championship (2017-18), claimed nine combined GLIAC titles (four regular season, five tournament), and guided the Bulldogs to nine NCAA Tournament appearances. He led the Bulldogs to four straight NCAA Tournament appearances from 2021-25.

- Central Michigan's coaching staff is comprised of Associate Head Coach Brooks Miller, assistant coaches Jim Lake and Raymon McAfee, Director of Player Personnel Josh Fleming, and Director of Basketball Operations Jimmy Booth. Miller is coming off a 14-year tenure at Trine University, where he won an NCAA Division III national championship in 2023-24 and went 247-121 and won three MIAA titles in 14 seasons. Lake is a Central Michigan graduate who previously served as the head coach at Wisconsin-Stout for the last seven years. McAfee joins the staff after coaching the last three years at Wayne State, and Fleming and Booth both served as Ferris State's assistant coaches over the last three seasons. Lake, McAfee, Fleming, and Booth all worked with Bronkema at Ferris State through the years, while McAfee and Fleming both played for Bronkema at Ferris.
- Central Michigan is coming off a 2024-25 season that saw it finish 14-17 overall and tied for ninth place in the Mid-American Conference with a 7-11 record. The Chippewas did not advance to the MAC Tournament. Tony Barbee was the program's previous head coach. Ugnius Jaresevicus (First Team) and Anthony Pritchard (All-Defensive Team/Third Team) both earned All-MAC honors last year. Jarusevicus transferred to Nebraska and Pritchard graduated.

Conference opponents. Johnson hit 11 of 16 field goals, 3-5 3-pointers and 8-12 free throws, grabbed six rebounds. He led three Bradley players in double figure scoring, along with AJ Smith, who finished with 18 points with six rebounds, and Alex Hulbregtse added 11.

- The Braves led for 39 of the game's 40 minutes. Bradley converted 51.8 percent (29-56) of its field goals, hit 10 3-pointers and outrebounded Central Michigan 39-29. The Chippewas shot just 36.4 percent (20-55) from the floor and was 2-13 from 3-point range.
- Keenan Garner finished with 12 points and a team high-eight rebounds, Nathan Claerbaut added 10 points, and Phat Phat Brooks finished with 10 points, all in the first half.
- From the tipoff, Bradley got off to a quick start and used a 7-0 run to build a 9-2 lead in the opening minutes. Later, the Braves used a 9-0 rally to build a 16-point first half lead (28-12) at the 8:52 mark.
- But the Chippewas got back into it late in the first half with an 11-1 run to cut Bradley's lead down to seven points. Phat Phat Brook's up-and-under-bucket cut the Braves' lead to 32-25 with 1:12 to go in the first half. Brooks scored 10 of CMU's 25 first half points.
- After trailing 35-25 at halftime, Central Michigan quickly cut Bradley's lead down to six points early in the second half (37-31) on a Tamario Adley jumper with 18:27 to play. But that was as close as the Chippewas came as Johnson responded with seven consecutive points to push the lead back up to 13 points at 44-31. He hit a 3-pointer, drove to the basket for a layup, then followed with another layup.

APPALACHIAN STATE RECAP

- Tamario Adley scored a game-high 22 points and Logan McIntire hit a game-high four 3-pointers and finished with 14 points as Central Michigan built an early first half lead and never looked back in claiming an 82-66 season opening victory over Appalachian State Monday night at McGuirk Arena. The contest was being played as part of the MAC/SBC Challenge.
- The victory also marked head coach Andy Bronkema's first win in his first game at CMU. The entire 15-player Chippewa team was making its season debut in Mount Pleasant.
- Central Michigan converted 51.7 percent (30-58) of its field goals and outrebounded the taller Mountaineers 43-33. The

Chippewas hit 8-17 3-pointers, out-scored App. State 40-22 in the paint, and dished out 14 assists. Adley converted 8-12 field goals, hit 3-3 3-pointers, grabbed seven rebounds and dished out three assists. McIntire hit 4-6 field goals and had six rebounds, Keenan Garner scored nine points, Nick Mullen added eight points, and Phat Phat Brooks finished with seven points.

- The Chippewas built a 38-26 lead at halftime. The Chippewas used a 14-0 run to take 22-7 lead at the 9:38 mark. Adley scored on a layup in the paint, Rodney Johnson, Jr. scored on a turnaround shot in the post, and Phat Phat Brooks followed with a 3-point play on a driving layup. Brooks followed with another layup for a 17-7 lead, Garner added another 3-point play on a driving layup, and Adley made it 22-7 on a turnaround jumper in the paint.
- CMU hit five 3-pointers and Adley scored 15 points in the second half. It was McIntire who opened the second half with back-to-back 3-pointers and Adley followed with a layup to give the Chippewas a commanding 18-point lead (46-28) with 17:01 to play. Minutes later, CMU pushed its lead to as many as 20 points.
- App State would cut the lead down to as few as 12 points (74-62) with 3:40 to play.
- Kasen Jennings led App State with 21 points and drew 10 fouls, while Alonzo Dodd scored 11 points.
- The Chippewas started Adley, Brooks, and McIntire at guard, Nathan Claerbaut at center, and Keenan Garner at forward.
- Central Michigan won its fourth consecutive MAC/SBC Challenge game and improved to 4-1 in the event. CMU also improved to 2-0 all-time vs. Appalachian State.

SAGINAW VALLEY STATE RECAP

- Central Michigan outscored Saginaw Valley State 26-9 over a 10-minute span and built a 17-point first half lead, then coasted to a 77-56 exhibition win Friday evening at McGuirk Arena. With the matchup, fans received their first glimpse of the 2025-26 Central Michigan men's basketball team.
- Sophomore Jaxson Whitaker hit 4-4 3-pointers and scored 12 of his 16 points in the first half, senior Nathan Claerbaut finished with 14 points and six rebounds, sophomore Will Ashford scored 12 points, dished out three assists and added five rebounds, and senior Tamario Adley added 12 points. Senior

Nick Mullen grabbed seven rebounds, blocked three shots and added three steals. Sophomore Keenan Garner led the Chippewas with eight rebounds.

- The Chippewas outrebounded the Cardinals 48-31 and held SVSU to 33.3 percent (9-27) shooting in the first half.
- Head Coach Andy Bronkema played 13 players in the game and 10 played at least 10 or minutes.
- Central Michigan built a 40-23 halftime lead after outscoring Saginaw Valley State 26-9 over the half's final 10 minutes. Whitaker led the Chippewas with 13 points while hitting 3-3 3-pointers in the first half and Adley added 12 points.
- Central Michigan started slowly on offense as it hit just one of its first 15 field goal attempts. In the low post, Claerbaut scored seven of CMU's first 11 points but Saginaw Valley built a 14-11 lead with 11:04 to go in the first half.
- At that point, the Chippewas suddenly caught fire. A 3-pointer by Jaxson Whitaker tied the game at 14-14, then Adley backed down a defender and scored on a turnaround jumper to give Central Michigan its first lead of the game, 16-14, at the 8:56 mark.
- SVSU's Marquese Josephs followed with a 3-pointer to give the lead back to the Cardinals, 17-16 with 7:59 to play. But Whitaker responded as he swished another 3-pointer for a 19-17 lead with 7:26 to go, Nick Mullen then stole the ball out of a timeout and went down and scored to put CMU up 21-17. Whitaker followed with another 3-pointer for a 24-19 lead, then scored on a driving layup for a 26-19 advantage.
- Adley gave CMU a 29-19 lead with a driving layup at the 3:47 mark. It marked the largest CMU lead of the game up until that point.
- In the second half, Central Michigan expanded its lead to as many as 26 points, 69-43, with 8:26 to play.
- Saginaw Valley State is coached by former Central Michigan star Chris Fowler. During pre-game, Central Michigan honored Fowler with a video of his highlights as a Chippewa.
- Before the game, the Central Michigan Men's Basketball program hosted an Alumni Game where over 20 former players, coaches and managers attended.
- The Chippewas started guards Tamario Adley, Will Ashford, and Logan McIntire, forward Keenan Garner, and center Nathan Claerbaut.

2024-25 REWIND

Central Michigan is coming off a 2024-25 season that saw it finish 14-17 overall and 7-11 in the MAC (tied for 9th place). The Chippewas did not advance to the MAC Tournament (top-eight teams advance).

- Central Michigan came within a game of advancing to the 2025 MAC Tournament but dropped an 83-81 double overtime loss to Northern Illinois at home.
- The Chippewas finished off their season by winning three of their last five games and had a chance to advance to the MAC postseason tournament.
- Two Chippewas earned All-MAC honors including center Ugnius Jaresevičius, who was named to the All-MAC First Team, and point guard Anthony Pritchard, who earned All-MAC Defensive Team honors and All-MAC Third Team accolades.
- Jarusevicius, who transferred to Nebraska, became the 17th player in CMU history to earn First Team All-MAC honors. He led CMU in scoring (16.2 ppg.), rebounding (7.3 rpg.), free throw attempts (170), and field goal percentage (53.7) while averaging 26.7 minutes per game in 26 games played. He reached double figure scoring in 23 games, registered two 30-point games, two 30-point/10-rebound games, eight 20-point games, eight double figure rebounding games, eight double-doubles, and led the Chippewas in scoring seven times and rebounding 10 times.
- Pritchard graduated from Central Michigan in May 2025. He became the first player in CMU program history to earn MAC All-Defensive Team honors for the second year. In 2023-24, he was named the MAC Defensive Player of the Year, becoming just the second player in school history to earn that honor following Chris Kaman in 2003. Pritchard led the Chippewas in assists and steals, averaged 13.1 points, 4.6 rebounds, 5.5 assists, and 1.9 steals per game. Pritchard concluded his two-year career ranked among all-time program leaders in three statistics: No. 10 in career assists (305), No. 6 in season assists (169 in 2024-25), and No. 6 in season steals (60 in 2024-25). On Feb. 22, 2025 at Western Michigan, he became the first player in program history to register a triple-double with 10 points, a career-high 12 assists, and a career-high 10 rebounds.
- Other key performers from Central Michigan last year included forward Jakobi Heady (15.0 ppg., 6.5 rpg), guard

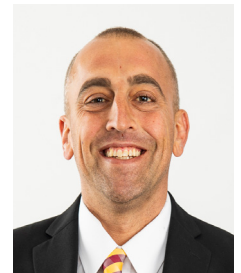

A 19-year men's basketball coaching veteran, Bronkema has spent the previous 12 years as the head coach at NCAA Division II Ferris State University, where he won one national championship, claimed nine combined Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference championships, and guided the Bulldogs to nine NCAA tournament appearances.

A strong motivator and communicator, Bronkema takes over at Central Michigan after leading Ferris State to the 2017-18 national championship, three NCAA Division II Sweet Sixteen appearances, nine overall NCAA tournament appearances and a 278-105 overall record. He has led the Bulldogs to four GLIAC regular season championships (2016-17, 2017-18, 2019-20, and 2021-22), five GLIAC tournament titles, 10 20-win seasons and a 166-73 record in GLIAC play. He has guided the Bulldogs to four consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances.

"Andy's ability to raise a program to excellence and sustain it at the highest level is impressive," Folan said. "He is a Michigan native who has built his whole career in this state and is well-respected in the coaching ranks at many levels. He is the perfect fit for what we need at Central Michigan and at this time in intercollegiate athletics. Excellence and innovation are qualities that a coach needs to be successful in this current collegiate environment."

"Coach Bronkema clearly understands how to create and sustain a winning culture that prepares student-athletes for tremendous success on the basketball court, in their educational careers and for life after the game," CMU President Neil MacKinnon said. "We are Fired Up to welcome him and his family to our community as he continues pushing for success as a CMU Chippewa."

His 2024-25 Ferris State team finished 25-9 overall and 14-6 in the GLIAC and earned its fourth straight NCAA Division II Tournament appearance. His 2023-24 team won the GLIAC Tournament Championship in 2023-24 and claimed the Midwest Regional Championship en route to an NCAA Division II Elite Eight appearance.

During a four-year period from 2015-18,

Bronkema led the Bulldogs to four-straight GLIAC tournament championship games and NCAA Tournament appearances.

In 2017-18, he led Ferris State to one of the most historic seasons in NCAA Division II men's basketball history as Ferris State claimed the school's first National Championship with a memorable 38-1 record, tying the all-time mark for most wins in school history. For his efforts, Bronkema was a consensus choice as the National Coach of the Year and led the Bulldogs to a second-straight GLIAC regular-season crown and the school's fourth tourney title in a row.

The Bulldogs posted their sixth-straight 20-win campaign in 2019-20 while recapturing the GLIAC Championship and earning yet another NCAA Division II National Tournament berth. In 2016-17, Ferris State posted a then school all-time best 28-5 overall record under Bronkema's direction while capturing both the GLIAC regular season and tournament championships. FSU advanced to the Midwest Regional Semifinals and led the country in blocked shots for the second-straight year. The Bulldog men's basketball squad closed a memorable 2015-16 campaign with a 24-10 overall record. FSU also reached the NCAA Division II Sweet Sixteen while finishing with its first back-to-back 20-win campaigns since the late 1980's. The Bulldogs made their first appearance in the NCAA Tournament under his direction in 2014-15 after claiming the league tournament title.

Before earning the head coaching job at Ferris State, Bronkema served as the Bulldogs' top assistant coach for six years from 2007-13. He was named interim head coach after the resignation of former head coach and colleague Bill Sall, who accepted the head coaching position at fellow Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) counterpart Northern Michigan. An individual with championship experience at every stop of his prep and collegiate playing and coaching career, Bronkema was heavily involved with all phases of the program as the top assistant coach, including recruiting, scouting, on-floor coaching and administrative tasks in addition to running the summer camp program, assisting with fundraising efforts and monitoring the program's academic progress.

In his first year as the program's top assistant in 2010-11, the Bulldogs won the GLIAC North Division Championship and reached the NCAA Division II Sweet Sixteen. FSU followed



up the memorable campaign by winning a share of a second-straight GLIAC North Division crown in 2011-12. The Bulldogs made five-straight league tournament berths in Bronkema's tenure as an assistant coach and FSU recorded more victories in the competitive GLIAC North than any other school in his three years as the top assistant. Bronkema helped recruit, coach and develop seven all-conference players and a pair of All-Americans in his stint as an assistant coach, including the 2010-11 Division II National Player of the Year Justin Keenan.

He worked three seasons as an assistant on the Bulldog staff from 2007-10 while also teaching elementary physical education at Crossroads Charter Academy in Big Rapids. The Bulldogs averaged 15 wins per year and twice reached the GLIAC postseason tournament in that stretch as he assisted in all aspects of the program with an emphasis on player development.

Before his arrival at FSU, Bronkema was a collegiate standout at NAIA Division II member Cornerstone University in Grand Rapids, Mich. A two-time All-America student-athlete at Cornerstone University in Grand Rapids, Mich., he served as team captain in both his junior and senior seasons. Bronkema was voted All-Wolverine Hoosier Athletic Conference (WHAC) three times and twice garnered NAIA Honorable Mention All-America laurels. He was also chosen as a Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan (BCAM) Scholar-

Athlete Award recipient and was a two-time academic all-conference honoree. In his four years of college hoops, Bronkema led Cornerstone to two regular-season WHAC Championships, one WHAC Tournament crown and four national tournament appearances, including a NAIA Final Four showing. He concluded his collegiate career with 1,725 points, 982 rebounds, 336 assists along with 140 steals.

As a prepster, Bronkema was a three-sport athlete and competed in football, basketball and baseball at McBain High School in Northern Michigan. He was part of 14 championship teams while at McBain and helped the Ramblers to a state hoops title in 2002 in addition to a state football runner-up effort in 2001.

A member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC), Bronkema also holds membership in the BCAM, the Michigan High School Coaches Association and the National High School Athletic Coaches Association.

He earned his bachelor's degree in Education from Cornerstone University in 2007 and earned his Master's Degree in Education at Ferris State in 2016. While at FSU, he's also served as an adjunct professor for the College of Education and Human Services.

Bronkema's father Joel, sister Emily Michalak, great grandmother and grandmother are all Central Michigan graduates.

Bronkema relocates to Mount Pleasant. He has three daughters: Eliana (15), Cambria (14), Seneca (9).
