GAME PREVIEW

Who would have believed, 11 months ago or even three months ago, that the Central Michigan football team would be where it is today?

The Chippewas are set to play their home finale on Saturday (noon, ESPN+) against Mid-American Conference rival Toledo on Kramer/Deromedi Field at Kelly/Shorts Stadium in a game that could send CMU to the MAC Championship Game at Ford Field in Detroit.

Both teams are 7-4 and tied for second place in the MAC at 5-2.

The Chippewas can reach the league title game under first-year coach Matt Drinkall with a win over the Rockets and losses by Ohio and Miami (Ohio), both of which are also 5-2 in MAC play. The Bobcats play at Buffalo on Friday; the RedHawks entertain Ball State on Saturday.

Whether or not CMU makes it to Ford Field, 2025 has proven to be a turnaround year under Drinkall, a virtual unknown who was named to head the program in December when Jim McElwain retired.

The Chippewas are bowl eligible for the first time since 2021 and are eyeing an unbeaten home slate for the first time since 2019 and the 14th time since 1950.

"To me, it's kind of a captivating, like it's a really nice cap on the season," Drinkall said earlier this week as he prepared his Chippewas to play Toledo, which has arguably been the gold standard in the MAC for the past decade plus and finished first in the preseason poll.

"The team that has been the metric for what success looks like in this conference -- like elite players, elite coaching, elite scheme," Drinkall said of the Rockets. "And we get to go to battle with those guys. This is exactly what (our) guys would want. They wouldn't want it any other way."

The Chippewas are riding a two-game win streak and have won four of their last five and six of their last eight. The Rockets have won three straight and four of their last five. They have dominated the recent series with CMU, winning 13 of the last 15 meetings.

Both of those wins have come at Kelly/ Shorts Stadium.

That said, the Chippewas have clearly turned a corner under the energetic Drinkall, who has instilled a disciplined approach built on solid defense and a foundation of seniors, such as linebacker Jordan Kwiatkowski, quarterback Joe Labas, and defensive end Michael Heldman.

That trio, among many others, chose to remain in Mount Pleasant for their respective final year of collegiate eligibility and help Drinkall lay the foundation for what appears to be a promising future.

"That has been the coolest thing ever," said Drinkall, who is in his 22nd season of collegiate coaching, and his first as a head coach at the Football Bowl Subdivision level. "I mean, this has been the most rewarding, fun year of football I've ever had.

"The rebuild's over. It's done. Those (players) took care of it, not us (coaches). We just came in and implemented a system for these guys. Those guys handled all of that on their own. Everybody associated with Central Michigan is forever indebted to this group of seniors. So it's going to be awesome to get out here and honor those guys in pregame.

"I know we will play really hard and play our butts off for those guys and give them a great experience."

Certainly, there is motivation for the Chippewas to send the seniors out a winner in their final home game. But make no mistake, Toledo is, as it seemingly always is, solid from top to bottom.

The Rockets rank first in the MAC in several statistical categories, scoring offense, scoring defense, passing yards per game, total offense and rushing defense among them.





CENTRAL MICHIGAN GAME NOTES

Saturday's Top Storylines

- Saturday marks Senior Day for Central Michigan as the Chippewas will honor 23 seniors in a pre-game ceremony prior to their final home game.
- With a 7-4 overall record, Central Michigan is bowl eligible for the first time in four years and first time since 2021.
- Central still has a chance to earn a MAC Championship berth. The Chippewas must defeat Toledo and receive help.

About the Chippewas

With a 4-0 record at home, Central is attempting to complete an undefeated season at home for the first time since it went 6-0 in 2019. CMU has won five straight and eight of its last 10 games at home.

On a two-game win streak and winners of six of its last eight games, bowl eligible and second-place Central Michigan (7-4, 5-2 MAC) plays its final regular season game when it hosts second-place Toledo (7-4, 5-2 MAC) for Senior Day on Saturday, Nov. 29 at Kelly/Shorts Stadium. Kickoff is at 12:02 p.m. ET for an ESPN+ national broadcast.

The contest is pivotal for both teams. Central Michigan and Toledo enter the game in a fourway tie for second place in the MAC standings. Western Michigan is in first place with a 6-1 record, followed by Central Michigan, Ohio, Toledo, and Miami, Ohio with identical 5-2 records. The top two teams will advance to the 2025 MAC Championship Game, set for Saturday, Dec. 6 at Ford Field in Detroit, Mich. Kickoff for that game is at noon.

With seven wins, Central Michigan is bowl eligible for the first time in four seasons and since the 2021 season when it won a 24-21 decision over Washington State in the Tony the Tiger Sun Bowl. Central Michigan has made 15 bowl game appearances. With seven victories, the Chippewas have already won more games than they did in each of the last three seasons (4 in 2022, 5 in 2023, and 4 in 2024). With one regular season game remaining, CMU's seven wins are its most since it went 9-4 in 2021.

Central Michigan has an outside opportunity to earn a berth in the 2025 MAC Championship Game. The Chippewas would need to defeat Toledo and receive help from several other teams. CMU has made four appearances in the MAC Championship Game (2006, 2007, 2009, and 2019) and is 3-1 in those games.

In all seven wins this year, Central Michigan has limited opponents to 20 points or less. CMU is 7-1 when leading at halftime, 6-2 when leading at the end of the first quarter, 6-1 when leading time of possession, and an undefeated 4-0 in home games.

With a current 4-0 home record, Central Michigan is attempting to complete a season with an undefeated home record for the first time since it went 6-0 in 2019.

Central Michigan is coming off a 28-16 win at Kent State last Wednesday that gave the Chippewas their seventh victory of the 2025 season. Joe Labas threw two touchdown passes, Brock Townsend scored two rushing touchdowns, and Central Michigan's defense dominated all night long with a season-high 11.0 tackles for loss and 4.0 sacks, led by a 14-tackle, 4.5 tackle for loss performance by linebacker Jordan Kwiatkowski as the Chippewas claimed their fourth win in their last five games.

The Chippewas went up 14-0 and led 14-3 at halftime. CMU set a school-record for longest scoring drive (10:53) as it drove 18 plays and 75 yards ending in a 1-yard pass from Labas to Tommy McIntosh for a 7-0 lead. Kwiatkowski forced a fumble that was recovered by Lawai'a Brown and set up a 2-yard touchdown run by Brock Townsend in the second quarter.

After Kent State responded with a 59-yard punt return for touchdown, CMU drove 75 yards in 10 plays and took a commanding 21-9 lead on a 10-yard touchdown run by Townsend. CMU added an insurance score when Labas hit DeCorion Temple for a 19-yard touchdown pass and commanding 28-9 lead.

CENTRAL MICHIGAN GAME NOTES

Central Michigan claimed its fourth home win, sixth overall win of the season and gained bowl eligibility following a 38-19 win over Buffalo on Nov. 12. The Chippewas forced a season-high five turnovers, recovered three fumbles, intercepted two passes, scored two defensive touchdowns (48-yard interception return, 85-yard fumble return) and the defense totaled a season-high 5.0 sacks.

The Chippewas took a 7-3 lead on a 48-yard interception return for touchdown by linebacker Jordan Kwiatkowski in the first quarter. After Buffalo scored on a 55-yard pass play, the Chippewas grabbed a 14-10 halftime lead following a 71-yard, eight play touchdown drive ending in a 1-yard run by quarterback Marcus Beamon.

After the teams traded field goals, quarterback Joe Labas hit Langston Lewis over the middle for a 75-yard touchdown pass, then linebacker Dakota Cochran picked up a fumble forced by linebacker Korver Demma and returned it 85 yards for a touchdown and 31-13 fourth quarter lead.

On offense, Central Michigan was led by Labas' 247-yard, two-touchdown passing performance while completing 18 of 24 passes and Langston Lewis' six-catch, career-high 118 yards, one touchdown day. Lewis became the Central Michigan receiver to notch back-to-back 100yard receiving games for the first time in 10 seasons. Defensive lineman Michael Heldman had a monster game with two sacks, two pass breakups, and two quarterback hurries, along with four tackles, Kwiatkowski led the Chippewas with nine tackles (seven solo), 1.0 tackle for loss, one forced fumble and an interception for 48 yard touchdown, and linebacker Dakota Cochran had five tackles and his key 85-yard fumble return for touchdown.

Central Michigan's Matt Drinkall is in his first year as the school's head coach. Drinkall became the first coach at CMU since Jim McElwain in 2019 to guide the Chippewas to bowl eligibility in his first season. Drinkall was named the 30th football coach at Central Michigan on Dec. 9, 2024 after serving the previous six seasons on staff at Army. His 2024 Army offensive line won the Joe Moore Award for top offensive line unit in the nation and helped lead the Black Knights to a 12-2 record, No. 22 national ranking in the College Football Playoff poll, and the American Athletic Conference title in the program's first year in the league

In his first 12 months with Central Michigan, Drinkall has initiated a culture change with numerous improvements to the student-athlete experience. With a 3.2 grade point average, the Chippewas put together their best-ever academic semester in spring 2025. The Chippewas now have consistent top-notch

meals provided at their facility by CMU Dining Services, have turned rooms into areas for player use such as the VIP Lounge which was converted into a player lounge, the practice schedule has been revamped, and the team took a teambuilding trip to amusement park Cedar Point in the summer. Those are just a few of the many changes that he has made since his arrival.

In defeating San Jose State 16-14 on Aug. 29, Drinkall became the first coach at Central Michigan to win a debut game on the road since Bill Kelly led CMU to a 34-13 victory at Southern Illinois on Sept. 22, 1951. Drinkall also became the first coach at CMU since Herb Deromedi in 1978 to win his first road game and his first home game in his debut season.

Ranked as one of the nation's top-40 winningest FBS programs of all-time and with eight players currently in the National Football League, Central Michigan is coming off three consecutive sub-500 seasons for the first time since 2002-04. The Chippewas went 4-8 last season and 2-6 in the MAC.

CMU Celebrates Senior Day

In its annual senior day ceremony, Central Michigan will honor its 23 seniors prior to Saturday's game against Toledo.

Those seniors include DL Daniel Bennett, RB Nahree Biggins, DB Maddix Blackwell, LB Lawai'a Brown, LB Dakota Cochran, DB, Brenden Deasfernandes, DL Jonathan Decker, DL Malik Denkins, TE Henry Dryden, DL Dylan Fisher, DB Eljiah Gordon, DL Michael Heldman, OL John lannuzzi, LB Jordan Kwiatkowski, QB Joe Labas, OL Luis Martinez, LS Ben Pratt, LB Cairo Rhodes, DB Elijah Rikard, OL Blake Schlegel, DB Aakeem Snell, and DB Caleb Spann.

Home, Sweet, Home

On a five-game home win streak and with a perfect 4-0 record this year, Central Michigan enjoys a tremendous home field advantage at Kelly/Shorts Stadium. Since 2019, the Chippewas are a combined 26-10 (.722 win percentage) within the confines of Kelly/Shorts Stadium. The Chippewas have won eight of their last 10 and 12 of their last 15 home contests.

On Saturday, Central Michigan will attempt to complete its season with a 5-0 home record.

Kwiatkowski Wins MAC Defensive Player of the Week for the Second time

For the second time this season, linebacker Jordan Kwiatkowski was named the MAC Defensive Player of the Week on Monday, Nov. 24.

In Central Michigan's 28-16 win at Kent State, Jordan Kwiatkowski led the Chippewas with 14 tackles, a career-high 4.5 tackles for loss for 24 yards, a forced fumble and a sack for 12 yards. His 4.5 tackles for loss ranks tied for No. 11 all-time in school history. He registered his second forced fumble in as many games and it marked his 10th career 10-plus tackle game. The 14 tackles were also one shy of Kwiatkowski's career high, when he made 15 vs. Ball State on Sept. 21, 2014.

In each of Central's last two games against Buffalo and Kent State, Kwiatkowski has totaled 23 tackles (13 solo), 5.5 tackles for loss, 1.0 sack, two forced fumbles, and a quarterback hurry.

Working Together for Our Future



First-Year Success

Head Coach Matt Drinkall becomes the fifth coach to lead Central Michigan to bowl eligibility in his first season as head coach. Butch Jones (2007) and Jim McElwain (2019) both had the unique distinction of leading their first teams at CMU to the MAC Championship Game.

A win vs. Toledo on Saturday would give Drinkall his 50th career victory.

Defense Wins Games

In all seven wins this season, Central Michigan has limited its opponents to 20 points or less. In seven MAC games, opponents are averaging just 17.0 points per game, which ranks No. 3 in the league in conference only games.

The last time Central Michigan held as many teams under 20 points in a season was in 2009, when the Chippewas held seven of their 14 opponents to 20 points or less.

Fast Starting Chippewas

Fast starts and early leads have helped Central Michigan claim each of its seven wins this year. When Central Michigan leads at halftime, it is 7-1 on the year. Western Michigan handed Central its first loss when leading at halftime.

Last Wednesday, Central got off to a 14-0 lead in the second quarter against Kent State en route to a 28-16 victory.

The Chippewas took the lead right before halftime against Buffalo and grabbed a key 14-10 advantage and momentum heading into halftime on a 1-yard Marcus Beamon touchdown following a 71 yard, eight play drive.

Against UMass, the Chippewas jumped on top 7-0, then 21-7 with three rushing touchdowns in the first quarter. It led 24-10 at halftime, then tacked on two Joe Labas touchdown passes.

At Bowling Green, Central Michigan scored 17 straight points to take a 17-3 lead in the second quarter. It used a Jordan Kwiatkowski interception and 26-yard return to set up its first touchdown, used a 63-yard pass from Joe Labas to Collin Payne to set up its second touchdown, then stopped a fake punt by BGSU on fourth down to set up a field goal.

In each of its other two home wins (Wagner, EMU), Central Michigan started fast and accumulated 14-0 first quarter leads. Against Wagner, it was CMU's defense that made the plays early as Dakota Cochran picked off a pass and rambled 30 yards for touchdown. On Wagner's second possession, CMU's Michael Heldman forced a fumble that was picked up by Cochran and the Chippewa offense scored on a run for a 14-0 lead.

Against Eastern Michigan, it was Central Michigan's offense that gave the Chippewas an early 14-0 first quarter lead. The Chippewas took their first drive 75 yards in nine plays and scored on a 1-yard pass from Angel Flores to Brock Townsend. On its next drive, CMU went up 14-0 when running back Nahree Biggins burst through the middle for a 49-yard touchdown run.

At San Jose State, Central Michigan used three turnovers to take an early 13-0 lead. San Jose State battled back to take a 14-13 lead, but CMU answered with a Cade Graham field goal and held off the hosts the rest of the way.

Turnover Margin Turnaround

Through 11 games, Central Michigan has a +8 turnover margin, which ranks No. 1 in the MAC and No. 15 in FBS (19 turnovers gained/11 turnovers lost). The Chippewas also rank No. 18 nationally and No. 2 in the MAC in turnovers gained (19), and No. 27 nationally and No. 3 in the MAC in turnover lost (11). The +8 turnover margin currently ranks as the best mark at Central Michigan in 35 years since 1990 when the Chippewas registered a +8 (29 gained/21 lost).

CMU has scored 74 of its 283 points off turnovers and has outscored its opponents 74-34 in points off turnovers. Last year, CMU was ranked No. 133 in turnover margin (-17) and tied a school record for worst turnover margin in a season.

The Chippewas have registered at least one turnover in each of their 11 games this season.

On Nov. 19 at Kent State, CMU forced and recovered a fumble but threw an interception. On Nov. 12 vs. Buffalo, Central Michigan forced five turnovers (three fumble recoveries, two interceptions) and scored two defensive touchdowns on a 48-yard interception return and 85-yard fumble return. It marked the first time CMU forced five turnovers since it forced five vs. Eastern Michigan on Nov. 27, 2020.

In the season opener at San Jose State, Central Michigan forced three first half turnovers including two interceptions and a fumble recovery. The Chippewas scored their first 13 points off those turnovers. CMU also limited San Jose State to just 74 yards rushing on 17 carries. The two interceptions by Brenden Deasfernandes and Elijah Rikard equaled Central Michigan's interception total from the entire 2024 season. Last year, CMU totaled just five turnovers (2 interceptions/3 fumble recoveries).

At Pitt, Central Michigan registered one interception as Jordan Kwiatkowski stepped in front a pass and returned it 18 yards.

At Michigan, Brenden Deasfernandes registered an interception in the second quarter and turned it into three points.

Versus Wagner, Central Michigan turned two turnovers into a 14-0 lead in the first few minutes of the game. On Wagner's first possession, Dakota Cochran intercepted a tipped pass by Jordan Kwiatkowski and returned it 30 yards for a touchdown. On the next drive, Michael Heldman forced a fumble which was picked up by Cochran. The Chippewas scored on a 2-yard run by Angel Flores.

Central Michigan's Maddix Blackwell snatched an interception in the fourth quarter which ended an EMU drive.

At Akron, Caleb Spann intercepted a pass. At Bowling Green, Jordan Kwiatkowski and Jaion Jackson both intercepted passes. Kalen Carroll intercepted CMU's 10th pass of the year vs.

The Chippewas recovered a fumble right before halftime at Western Michigan.

Turnover Free CMU

Central Michigan has turned the ball over just 11 times in 11 games this season. It has surrendered just six turnovers in seven MAC games. Earlier in the season, Central Michigan went 15 quarters without turning the ball over from the Eastern Michigan game through the fourth quarter of the UMass game.

Of the 11 turnovers, six have been committed with the game already decided.

Central has had four games this season where it did not turn the ball over (at San Jose State, Eastern Michigan, at Akron, and at Bowling Green).

Defensive Touchdowns

On the year, Central Michigan has scored three team defensive touchdowns, a mark that currently ranks No. 10 nationally, No. 1 in the MAC, and ranks tied for No. 3 in school history for a season. Dakota Cochran has scored two of those on a 30-yard interception return and 85-yard fumble return, while Jordan Kwiatkowski has a 48-yard interception return.

The Chippewas scored two defensive touchdowns in one game vs. Buffalo on Nov. 12. It marked the first time Central scored on two defensive touchdowns since it scored two at Toledo on Oct. 6, 2006 (31-yard INT return by Doug Kress and 32-yard fumble return by Dan Bazuin).

A Win Over Toledo Would...

- Possibly give Central Michigan a chance to earn a MAC Championship Game berth.
 The Chippewas would need a win vs. Toledo and help.
- Give Central Michigan an 8-4 regular season record. The eight wins would be the most since the 2021 season when the Chippewas went 9-4 and won the Tony the Tiger Sun Bowl with a 24-21 victory over Washington State
- Give Central six wins in MAC play for the first time since 2021 when it won six games.
- End Toledo's three-game win streak in the series.

Toledo needs a win over CMU coupled with a loss by either Ohio or Miami (Ohio) to earn a berth in the MAC Championship Game for the third time in the last four years. Toledo's two MAC losses have come to Western Michigan, 14-13; and to Bowling Green, 28-23.

Toledo has won three consecutive games, capped by a 38-9 home win last week over Ball State. The Rockets' last loss came at Washington

State, 28-7, on Oct. 25. They have won four straight MAC games.

Toledo leads the series with CMU, 30-20-3, and has won 13 of the last 15 meetings. CMU's two wins in that span have both come at Kelly/Shorts Stadium, 26-23 in overtime in 2021, and 49-7 in 2019.

Jason Candle is in his 10th year as the Rockets' coach. He is 80-44 at the school, including 7-2 vs. CMU.

Toledo ranks first in the MAC in several statistical categories, including scoring offense, scoring defense, passing yards per game, total offense and rushing defense. The Rockets rank second among Football Bowl Subdivision teams in total defense behind Ohio



State; they have held six opponents to 14 points or less this season.

Toledo quarterback Tucker Gleason ranks fourth in the MAC with 219.7 passing yards per game and leads the league with 21 touchdown passes. He has been intercepted nine times, which is tied for the second most among MAC passers.

Rocket running back Chip Trayanum ranks second in the MAC with 95.1 rushing yards per game and is fourth with 856 rushing yards. He is third with 10 rushing touchdowns.

Toledo defensive back Braden Awls has a MAC-high five interceptions.

Since 2016, Toledo has won a MACbest 79 games, three better than Ohio.

GAME DAY POLICIES A-Z

Cashless Venue

Central Michigan Athletics has transitioned to cashless payment on game days for all events. Central Michigan has initiated a new digital parking system. Payment by credit and debit cards, Apple Pay, or Google Pay is accepted at all stadium concessions stands, and day-of tickets can be purchased using the same services. Apple pay and Google pay is available with the new parking system as well as credit and debit cards.

Digital Ticketing & Home Football Game Tickets

Central Michigan is utilizing a digital parking system. Fans need to download their apple wallet or google wallet to allow for seamless entry into the lots. The digital parking system will only accept debit card, credit card, apple pay and google pay. Game day lots are located on the south side (scoreboard side of the stadium) in lots 63E, 63W, and 73. All parking lots open four hours prior to kickoff.

Visit the 2025 Ticket Central page for information how to purchase digital tickets and parking passes on a single-game or full-season basis. Accessible seating is available. Fans requiring special assistance are urged to make ticketing arrangements through Ticket Central (989-774-3045) in advance.

Central Michigan Athletics has transitioned to using digital tickets for student admission to all ticketed athletic events beginning with the current 2025-26 academic year. Admission remains free for all Central Michigan students, but students will now be required to present a digital pass upon entrance to ticketed events instead of using a CMU-issued ID. Accessibility – Handicapped Patrons

Accessible seating is available. Fans requiring special assistance are urged to make ticketing arrangements through Ticket Central (989-774-3045) in advance.

Alcoho

It is strictly prohibited to bring alcohol into Kelly/Shorts Stadium. Individuals violating this policy are subject to ejection from the stadium. Alcoholic beverages can be purchased inside the stadium at designated kiosks.

ATM

There are no ATMs located inside the stadium. We recommend visiting an ATM prior to arriving to campus.

Bag Policy

To enhance security measures and help speed entry, Central Michigan has implemented a clear bag policy for all football games. Each spectator is permitted to enter Kelly/Shorts Stadium with one clear plastic, vinyl or PVC bag not to exceed 12 x 6 x 12 and one clutch or wallet no larger than 4.5 x 6.5.

Camera Policy

Small cameras are allowed, however camera bags are not permitted in the stadium.

CMU Merchandise

For official CMU Chippewas merchandise, look no further than the CMU Bookstore. Once the gates open, stop in our Chippewas Varsity Shop stocked with the latest gear from the Adidas sideline collection. Our other game day location is on the island between lots 62 and 63 at the North end of the facility.

Chippewa Pride

We are honored to be known as the Chippewas and we are very proud of our close relationship with the Saginaw Chippewa Indian Tribe. The mimicking, stereotyping, and misrepresentation of Native American cultures and people are attitudes and behaviors that will not be tolerated. Offensive behavior or insensitive actions are not tolerated at any athletic events and will be subject for removal.

Clear Bag Policy

Kelly/Shorts Stadium has a clear bag policy. Fans may enter with a clear tote or storage bag and one handbag. Details on each are listed below:

<u>Clear Tote:</u> plastic, vinyl or PVC no larger than 12x6x12". <u>Storage Bag:</u> 1-gallon clear plastic reusable bag. <u>One Handbag:</u> no larger than 4.5x6.5" with or without strap.

Concessions

Concessions stands are located throughout the entire main (west) and east concourses, at club level and the south entrance. From traditional stadium flare to local flavors, concession stands are located throughout the East and West concourses, at Club Level, and at the South entrance. All points of sale are cashless; FLEX dollars, debit cards, credit cards, Apple Pay, and Google Pay are accepted as payment.

Conduct

Central Michigan Athletics expects all fans to conduct themselves in an appropriate manner at all times before, during and after the game. We expect all fans to treat other fans, players, coaches and officials with courtesy. Fans should contact a stadium official or a police officer if they feel someone is not acting appropriately. Fans may also report game day problems, unruly fans, or suspicious activity by calling (989) 774-3081.

First Aid/Emergency Medical Assistance

First aid is available next to section A in the NW corner of the stadium. The first aid section is operated by MyMichigan Health in partnership with CMU Athletics. In case of emergency, please seek out the nearest police officer, usher, or security guard for assistance, or call Central Michigan Police at (989) 774-3081 or 911.

Food and Beverage

Outside food and beverages are prohibited.

Gates

All gates to Kelly/Shorts Stadium will open 90 minutes prior to kickoff. All bags should adhere to CMU's clear bag policy and are subject to search. There are gates located on all four corners (Northwest, Southwest, Northeast or Southeast) of the stadium.

Game Programs

Official online game programs and the 2025 CMU Football Yearbook are now free! The latest digital game program and CMU Football Digital Yearbook can be at CMUChippewas.com.

Guest Services/Lost and Found

Information regarding Kelly/Shorts Stadium can be found at the Fan Central kiosk located just inside the Northwest gate. If any article is lost or found in the stadium, please inquire about or report it to the Fan Central kiosk. Articles not claimed prior to the end of the game are turned over to the CMU Police, who can be reached at (989) 774-3081.

Permitted Items

The following items may be brought into the stadium:

- One clear plastic, vinyl or PVC bag not to exceed 12x6x12
- One clutch or wallet no larger than 4.5x6.5
- Seat cushions (no pockets)
- · Seatbacks (no pockets)
- Binoculars
- · Cell phones
- · Small non-professional cameras and radios
- Blankets and rain apparel
- Signs

Prohibited Items

For the safety and game day experience of all fans, the following items are prohibited from entering the stadium:

- Computer bags

- Backpacks
- Fanny packs
- Outside food and drink including bottled water
- Aerosol and spray cans
- Weapons
- Drones
- Umbrellas regardless of size
- Animals (exception of service animals)
- Alcoholic beverages
- Coolers, thermoses, cups, bottles, cans or flasks
- Artificial noisemakers
- · Smoking in the stadium
- Signs on poles that block the view of other fans or stadium advertisement

GAME DAY POLICIES A-Z

Central Michigan University reserves the right to deny anyone or anything from entering the stadium. Items that are left behind at point of entry are not the responsibility of the university.

Parking

All parking lots open four hours prior to kickoff and remain open until kickoff. Tailgate lots will shut down at kickoff. Chippewa Club members and season ticket holders can save money by purchasing a season pass. Contact Ticket Central at (989) 774-3045 or visit the 2025 Ticket Central Page for more information.

Any patron interested in parking may purchase passes in Lots 63W, 63E, and 73 based on availability. Parking passes can be purchased in advance at Ticket Central, or through Central Michigan's digital partnership with Paciolan. Fans need to download their apple wallet or google wallet to allow for seamless entry into the lots. The digital parking system will only accept debit card, credit card, apple pay and google pay. Game day lots are located on the south side (scoreboard side of the stadium) in lots 63E, 63W, and 73. All parking lots open four hours prior to kickoff.

Pets

All pets (including dogs) are prohibited inside Kelly/Shorts Stadium and tailgate areas. (Exception: Service animals are allowed to assist those with disabilities.)

Security

Our emergency action plan is designed in cooperation with the Department of Homeland Security to keep all fans safe while providing a pleasant game day experience. This is accomplished by all fans being aware of their surroundings and reporting any issues to police or security. Security personnel, trained annually for emergency procedures, are located throughout the stadium. All fans are subject to search as they enter the stadium to ensure a safe and secure environment.

Spirit Walk

Strollers

Strollers are allowed, but can't be left unattended in the concourse or areas of the stands. They are subject to search at the gates.

Central Michigan University establishes the following tobacco free policy, for all CMU properties, facilities and vehicles in which university functions are offered or carried out, regardless of location. This includes all CMU sites whether owned or leased. As used herein, tobacco products includes traditional cigarettes, ecigarettes, chew, pipes, cigars, hookah or waterpipe smoking, snus, snuff, etc.

Tickets

Tickets may be purchased on in advance or on game day by visiting one of the ticket booths at the stadium. For pricing information, visit the 2025 Ticket Central Page. Ticket windows and public will call windows open three hours prior to kickoff. All other will call windows open 1 1/2 hours prior to kickoff. (Tickets for player guests, recruits and high school coaches will not be given out earlier then 1 1/2 hours before the game.)

CMU students receive free admission to all CMU sporting events with their student ID card. The student gates are located at the Northeast and Southeast gates of the stadium.

50/50 Raffle

50/50 raffle tickets are available at each home game. Ticket sellers can be found throughout the stadium. The winning ticket number is announced in the third quarter.



PARKING & TAILGATE INFORMATION

Handicapped Parking

Lots with handicapped parking spaces are 63E, 63W, 62E, 62W and 64. Lots 62E, 62W and 64 are reserved for Chippewa Club members. Spaces are on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Security/Safety:

All drivers should be observant of instructions from police officers and parking personnel. Vehicles parked in fire lanes, at the end of aisles and in any other illegal location will be ticketed and/or towed.

Reserving Spaces:


Spaces are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Spaces may not be reserved for later-arriving vehicles unless authorized by the CMU Athletics Department.

RV Parking:

- 1) RV's are permitted to park in lot 63W.
- 2) RV lots open four hours before kickoff. If you are trying to enter the lot during periods of heavy traffic, you may be directed to an alternate lot.
- 3) Visit the Ticket Central page at CMUChippewas.com for the latest pricing on single-game and season parking passes.
- 4) Fans can spend the night before the game for all early kickoffs, and the night of the game for late starts.
- 5) Additional spaces must be purchased if your party exceeds the allotment of 4 spaces

Shuttle Service:

Shuttle service is available two hours prior to the game for patrons needing assistance into the stadium. Patrons will be picked up from four designated areas throughout the lot 62, 63, and 64 parking lots. For further assistance, please call (989) 774-3045.



PARKING/TAILGATING RULES

- Parking permits should be clearly displayed from the rearview mirror in order to assist parking personnel in directing traffic. Permits should be displayed at all times.
- All drivers should be observant of instructions from police officers and parking personnel. Vehicles parked in fire lanes, at the end of aisles and in any other illegal location will be ticketed and/or towed. Spaces are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Spaces may not be reserved for later-arriving vehicles unless authorized by the CMU Athletics Department.
- Vehicles must only occupy one parking space. Tailgating accessories may not be placed in any designated parking space as space can be very limited.
- Tailgating is permitted from four hours prior to kickoff to the start of the game. Tailgating is not permitted during the game, at halftime or after the game.
- Michigan laws pertaining to the possession, consumption and distribution of alcohol and controlled substances will be enforced.
 Tailgating may not include kegs or mass quantities of alcohol. Glass

- containers are not permitted in the tailgating area.
- The CMU Police Department determines the tailgating area. Alcohol is not permitted outside this area.
- Drinking games or activities that encourage excessive alcohol consumption are prohibited.
- 8. Large trucks (e.g., U-Haul-type, over 2-1/2 tons, etc.), vehicles with trailers and buses are not permitted in the tailgating area without prior written Athletic Department approval.
- 9. Large grills pulled on their own wheels by vehicles are not permitted in the tailgating area without prior written Athletic Department approval. Open fires are not permitted.
- 10. No animals, with the exception of service animals, are permitted.
- 11. The use of external sound systems is permitted, but is subject to the control of CMU Police.


