GAME PREVIEW

Central Michigan football had its coming-out party last week in front of its home crowd, delivering a resounding 49-10 nonconference victory over Wagner.

It's time to ratchet it up with every remaining game taking on increased importance and the Chippewas fighting in their own weight class.

The Chippewas entertain Eastern Michigan in the Mid-American Conference opener for both schools on Saturday (1 p.m., ESPN Plus) on Kramer/Deromedi Field at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

CMU is 2-2; Eastern is 1-3 and coming off a 34-31 win over Louisiana.

"This is the point in time," first-year CMU coach Matt Drinkall said, "when everyone associated with Central Michigan University needs to jump on board and pull the rope in the same direction.

"We need as many fans, faculty, staff members, people in the community – we need them at the game, we need them cheering like crazy because it takes everybody pulling the rope in the same direction to get over the hump.

"This is a great opportunity. We've positioned ourselves and now it's put up or shut up time."

The Chippewas impressed last week in their win over Wagner, and the result against a winless Football Championship Subdivision foe came as no surprise.

What was perhaps surprising – pleasantly, for CMU supporters — was how dominant the Chippewas were on both sides of the ball. They held the Seahawks without a first down in the second half and on offense, rolled up 506 yards and scored touchdowns on four of their first five drives

Starting quarterback Joe Labas threw for 241 yards and a career-high-tying three touchdowns on 12-of-14 passing, while Angel Flores, the Chippewas' QB1A, ran for two TDs and passed for another.

"The thing that was really great about (Labas') performance on Saturday was, how well he played, that probably holds up against anybody," Drinkall said. "He was accurate, on time, very decisive. There wasn't an ounce of fat on a single one of his reps.

"Joe runs it some when he's in, and Angel throws it pretty well when he's in. Those two just keep getting better and better."

Which is a good sign heading into the league opener. And while the Chippewas have answered plenty of questions through their first four games, there are plenty more and the stakes now increase.

"The mood is definitely high and we're approaching it like we approach every week – confident," cornerback Kalen Carroll said. "Going against a team like Eastern and it's MAC play, it adds a chip on your shoulder.

"Surprisingly, we came into our Sunday meeting (after the Wagner win), and it wasn't all laughing and giggles and 'good job' like you might think it would be.

"It was, 'We still need to get better on things.' People say comfort kills. We have a standard and we want to live up to that. That's the approach every week."

CENTRAL MICHIGAN GAME NOTES

Today's Top Storylines

Central Michigan and Eastern Michigan open MAC play with a key September matchup in Mount Pleasant.

CMU and EMU meet for the 103rd time in series history, the longest-running series between any two MAC schools. The two teams meet for the 54th consecutive year. CMU has won four of the last six, nine of the last 13, and 11 of the last 16. The Chippewas have won each of the last six series games played in Mount Pleasant.

The contest also marks the first of three Michigan MAC Trophy matchups between CMU, EMU, and WMU. The school with the best head-to-head record earns the right to the Michigan MAC Trophy.

About the Chippewas

Central Michigan (2-2, 0-0 MAC) opens Mid-American Conference play with its fifth overall game and second home game of the 2025 season when it hosts Eastern Michigan (1-3, 0-0 MAC) in a Saturday contest at Kramer/Deromedi Field at Kelly/Shorts Stadium. Kickoff is at 1 p.m. for a televised game on ESPN+.

Central Michigan is coming off a dominating 49-10 home victory over Wagner on Saturday, which saw the Chippewas rack up 506 yards of total offense, 233 yards rushing, 273 yards passing, and 24 first downs. CMU's defense also limited Wagner to 113 yards of total offense, six first downs, 72 yards rushing and only 41 yards passing.

It was defense that gave the Chippewas an early lead in the game's first six minutes. On Wagner's second offensive play of the game, Jordan Kwiatkowski tipped a pass into the waiting arms of Dakota Cochran, who gathered the ball and ran 30 yards for an interception return touchdown and 7-0 lead. Then on Wagner's next drive, Michael Heldman's sack forced a fumble that Cochran picked up. The play gave the ball back to Central Michigan, which drove 36 yards in six plays and ended in a 2-yard touchdown run by Angel Flores and commanding 14-0 lead.

Then the Chippewas offense came to life led by quarterback Joe Labas, who threw three touchdown passes and for 241 yards, and completed 85.7 percent (12 of 14) of his passes, which ranked as the fifth-best performance in school history. Labas' 301.02 passing efficiency rating

CENTRAL MICHIGAN GAME NOTES

ranked as the second-best all-time game performance in school history behind Dan LeFevour (303.7) at Buffalo on Nov. 24, 2006. His touchdown passes in the second quarter included an 88-yard screen pass to Nahree Biggins, a 33-yard pass to Tommy McIntosh, and a 33-yard pass to a wide open Tyson Davis and the Chippewas took a 35-3 lead into halftime.

CMU's quarterbacks combined for six of the Chippewas' seven touchdowns (Labas, three TD passes; Flores, 2 rushing scores, one passing).

Previously, Central Michigan opened its season with three straight road games for the first time since 1972. The Chippewas dropped a 63-3 loss at Michigan before 110,740 fans at Michigan Stadium on Sept. 13. Angel Flores led the CMU offense with a career-high 100 total yards, including a career-high 76 yards rushing, and Elijah Gordon and Elijah Rikard both finished with eight tackles on defense.

It dropped a 45-17 decision at Pittsburgh on Sept. 6. The Chippewas trailed 24-17 after DeCorion Temple scored on a 6-yard pass from Joe Labas in the third quarter, but Pitt answered 45 seconds later with a long kickoff return and 48-yard touchdown pass. The Panthers scored two more times for the final score. Central Michigan completed 20 of 27 passes for 177 yards and a touchdown in the game. The Chippewas led time of possession 36:43-23:17 but Pitt scored fast and finished with 464 yards of total offense and 340 passing yards.

In its season opener on Aug. 29 Central Michigan claimed a 16-14 come-from-behind victory at San Jose State. The Chippewas forced three first half turnovers and went up 13-0 in the second quarter. A Brenden Deasfernandes interception in the end zone stopped a Spartan scoring drive and led to a 29-yard touchdown run by Trey Cornist. A forced fumble by Michael Heldman led to a fumble return by Fernando Sanchez III and eventual 34-yard field goal by Cade Graham. Then Elijah Rikard intercepted another pass that set up a 28-yard field goal by Graham and 13-0 CMU lead. San Jose State scored before halftime and then took the lead 14-13 in the third quarter.

Central Michigan contined to battle. The Chippewas drove down to the SJSU one-yard line but couldn't convert. After the CMU defense forced a punt, Central Michigan drove 80 yards in 14 plays and used 7:16 of clock time in a drive that ended in a 28-yard field goal by Graham. That put the Chippewas up 16-14. The Chippewas defense forced two missed field goals by San Jose State to secure the win.

The win represented the first for coach Matt Drinkall as Central Michigan's football coach. Saturday's game at Wagner marks his first game coaching at Kelly/Shorts Stadium. Drinkall was named the 30th football coach at Central Michigan on Dec. 9, 2024 after serving the previous six seasons on staff at Army. His 2024 Army offensive line won the Joe Moore Award for top offensive line unit in the nation and helped guide the Black Knights to a 12-2 record, No. 22 national ranking in the College Football Playoff poll, and the American Athletic Conference title in the program's first year in the league.

In his first 10 months with the Central Michigan Football program, Drinkall has initiated a culture change with numerous improvements to the student-athlete experience. With a 3.2 grade point average, the Chippewas put together their best-ever academic semester in spring 2025. The Chippewas now have top-notch meals provided at their facility by CMU Dining Services, have turned rooms into areas for player use such as the VIP Lounge which was converted into a player lounge, the practice schedule has been revamped, and the team took a team-building trip to amusement park Cedar Point in the summer. Those are just a few of the many changes that he has made since his arrival.

Drinkall became the first coach at Central Michigan to win a debut game on the road since Bill Kelly won a 34-13 victory at Southern Illinois on Sept. 22, 1951.

Ranked as one of the nation's top 40 winningest FBS programs of all-time and with eight current players in the National Football League, Central Michigan is coming off three consecutive sub-.500 seasons for the first time since 2002-04. The Chippewas went 4-8 last season and 2-6 in the MAC.

On a two-game home win streak, historically, Central Michigan enjoys a tremendous home field advantage at Kelly/Shorts Stadium. Since 2019, the Chippewas are a combined 23-10 with a .697-win percentage within the confines of Kelly/Shorts Stadium. The Chippewas have won five of their last seven and nine of its last 12 home contests.

The last time CMU completed a season with an undefeated home record was when the Chippewas went a perfect 6-0 in 2019. The last several seasons, CMU went 1-2 in 2020, 5-1 in 2021, 2-4 in 2022, 4-1 in 2023, 3-2 in 2024, and 1-0 in 2025 at Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

Series vs. Eastern Michigan

- Central Michigan has won the majority of recent games in the series as the Chippewas have won four of the last six, nine of the last 13, and 11 of the last 16.

ABOUT EASTERN MICHIGAN

Eastern Michigan enters Saturday's Mid-American Conference opener at CMU at 1-3 and coming off a 34-31 home win over Louisiana. Rudy Kessinger kicked a 42-yard field goal with 3 seconds remaining to lift the Eagles to the win.

EMU opened with a 52-27 loss at Texas State, and then dropped a 28-23 decision at home to Football Championship Subdivision Long Island. They then lost, 48-23, at Kentucky.

The Eagles rank first in the MAC in passing yards per game (248.3), third in scoring offense (26.8) and in total offense per game (393.0). They are allowing a

MAC-worst 272.3 yards per game on the ground and rank 12th in the league in total defense (507.0 yard per game allowed).

EMU running back Dontae McMillan ranks second in the MAC with 345 rushing yards and is second in the league with a 7.0-yards-per-carry average.

EMU quarterback Noah Kim, who spent the 2024 season at Coastal Carolina after appearing in 10 games (five starts) at Michigan State in 2022-23, is the MAC's leading passer at 248.3 yards per game. His 993 passing yards lead the MAC and he is completing 64 percent of his passes. He is tied

for second in the league with five touchdown passes and has been intercepted twice.

Terry Lockett is EMU's top receiver with 18 catches for 259 yards and one TD.

EMU punter Mitchell Tomasek leads the MAC with a 49.8-yard average. Kessinger has made eight of his 10 field goal attempts with a long of 50 yards.

Saturday's game marks the 103rd meeting between CMU and EMU. The rivalry began in 1902 and stands as the longest-running

series between MAC members. CMU holds a 64-32-6 advantage in the series and is 37-13-2 against the Eagles in Mount Pleasant. The Chippewas have won six consecutive games against Eastern at home. The Eagles have won two of the last three meetings; both wins have come in Ypsilanti, including 38-34 last season.

The Eagles are led by Chris Creighton, who is in his 12th year at EMU. He and Chuck Martin of Miami (Ohio), who is also in his 12th season, are the longest tenured MAC coaches.

Concessions

- Signs on poles that block the view of other fans or stadium advertisement

Central Michigan University reserves the right to deny anyone or anything from entering the stadium. Items that are left behind at point of entry are not the responsibility of the university.

Parking

All parking lots open four hours prior to kickoff and continue until kickoff. Tailgate lots will shut down at kickoff. Chippewa Club members and season ticket holders can save money by purchasing a season pass for only \$60. Contact Ticket Central at (989) 774-3045. Single game parking passes purchased in advance are \$15. Parking purchased on game day is \$20 and can only be purchased with cash at the entrance of designated lots.

Pets

All pets (including dogs) are prohibited inside Kelly/Shorts Stadium and tailgate areas. (Exception: Service animals are allowed to assist those with disabilities.)

Security

Our emergency action plan is designed in cooperation with the Department of Homeland Security to keep all fans safe while providing a pleasant game day experience. This is accomplished by all fans being aware of their surroundings and reporting any issues to police or security. Security personnel, trained annually for emergency procedures, are located throughout the stadium. All fans are subject to search as they enter the stadium to ensure a safe and secure environment.

Strollers

Strollers are allowed, but can't be left unattended in the concourse or areas of the stands. They are subject to search at the gates.

Tobacco Use

Central Michigan University establishes the following tobacco free policy, for all CMU properties, facilities, and vehicles in which university functions are offered or carried out, regardless of location. This includes all CMU sites whether owned or leased. As used herein, tobacco products includes traditional cigarettes, ecigarettes, chew, pipes, cigars, hookah or waterpipe smoking, snus, snuff, etc.



PARKING & TAILGATE INFORMATION

Handicapped Parking

Lots with handicapped parking spaces are 63E, 63W, 62E, 62W and 64. Lots 62E, 62W and 64 are reserved for Chippewa Club members. Spaces are on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Security/Safety:

All drivers should be observant of instructions from police officers and parking personnel. Vehicles parked in fire lanes, at the end of aisles and in any other illegal location will be ticketed and/or towed.

Reserving Spaces:

Spaces are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Spaces may not be reserved for later-arriving vehicles unless authorized by the CMU Athletics Department.

RV Parking:


- 1) RV's are permitted to park in lot 63W.
- 2) RV lots open four hours before kickoff. If you are trying to enter the lot during periods of heavy traffic, you may be directed to an alternate lot.
- 3) The cost for an RV parking pass in advance is \$65 for a single game and \$250 for a season pass. The cost of overnight parking is an additional \$40 and is only permitted in Lot 63W. Fans can spend the night before the game for all early kickoffs, and the night of the game for late starts.
- 4) Additional spaces must be purchased if your party exceeds the allotment of 4 spaces

Shuttle Service:

Shuttle service is available two hours prior to the game for patrons needing assistance into the stadium. Patrons will be picked up from four designated areas throughout the lot 62, 63, and 64 parking lots. For further assistance, please call (989) 774-3045.

PARKING/TAILGATING RULES

- Parking permits should be clearly displayed from the rearview mirror in order to assist parking personnel in directing traffic. Permits should be displayed at all times.
- All drivers should be observant of instructions from police officers and parking personnel. Vehicles parked in fire lanes, at the end of aisles and in any other illegal location will be ticketed and/or towed. Spaces are available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Spaces may not be reserved for later-arriving vehicles unless authorized by the CMU Athletics Department.
- 3. Vehicles must only occupy one parking space. Tailgating accessories may not be placed in any designated parking space as space can be very limited.
- Tailgating is permitted from four hours prior to kickoff to the start of the game. Tailgating is not permitted during the game, at halftime or after the game.
- Michigan laws pertaining to the possession, consumption and distribution of alcohol and controlled substances will be enforced. Tailgating may not include kegs or mass quantities of alcohol. Glass


- containers are not permitted in the tailgating area.
- The CMU Police Department determines the tailgating area. Alcohol is not permitted outside this area.
- Drinking games or activities that encourage excessive alcohol consumption are prohibited.
- Large trucks (e.g., U-Haul-type, over 2-1/2 tons, etc.), vehicles with trailers and buses are not permitted in the tailgating area without prior written Athletic Department approval.
- Large grills pulled on their own wheels by vehicles are not permitted in the tailgating area without prior written Athletic Department approval. Open fires are not permitted.
- 10. No animals, with the exception of service animals, are permitted.
- 11. The use of external sound systems is permitted, but is subject to the control of CMU Police.
