01 A Word From Boosters' President Sandi Petrou

Greetings, Cardinal Nation! In the past year, YOUR Colerain Boosters Association has achieved remarkable success by actively engaging with the school community and providing unwavering support to our students. Through strategic fundraising initiatives (The Gala) and collaborative efforts (increasing corporate sponsorship twelve-fold), we have been able to enhance the high school experience for all students by investing in extracurricular activities, facility upgrades, and sports teams. Additionally, our focus on promoting school spirit and unity has resulted in increased participation in school events and a strong sense of pride among students, parents, and staff. By fostering meaningful relationships and partnerships within the community, the Boosters Association has been able to facilitate an environment where every student feels valued, supported, and inspired to reach their full potential.

We kicked off our 100th year in August 2023 and banners were placed all around Colerain Ave and Springdale Rd, highlighting this amazing achievement! Community members attended a reenactment of the original school dedication at what is now Colerain Elementary, placed yard signs all around with the 100th year logo, and wrapped up the festivities by honoring the original NINE (!!) Colerain High School graduates by awarding nine \$1000 scholarships! Our very own Greg Stanley spent countless hours researching and compiling All Century Teams for 23 sports, highlighting a century's worth of athletes who were at the top of their game!

Undoubtedly, the most talked about and attended event in our Century Celebration was The Gala, a first ever over-21 event held in the school gym. A dedicated committee of 12, led by Kerri Robers, planned and executed the event which ultimately sold nearly DOUBLE the tickets originally anticipated! The event was so successful the NWLSD BOE voted to allow the Boosters to host a second Gala on March 15, 2025 so MARK YOUR CALENDARS! But the Boosters didn't focus solely on the Century Celebrations, there was other work to be done! We tapped the Campus Beautification initiative and painted all outdoors benches, picnic tables, trash receptacles, bike racks, traffic posts, and signage in the Cardinal Village! The door wraps in the Village and at the door of the Athletic offices rounded out the project. The tennis courts received a much-needed resurfacing and signage, marching band replenished equipment, baseball and softball received state of the art scoreboards. After several years closing the in-school Cardinal Corner, the Colerain Boosters brought it back to life and WOW – what a great space we have in the front hall! Volunteers Tracy Borgemenke and her bestie Megan Begley, planned and executed the design and concept. In its first year of existence, the Cardinal Corner has outsold the past four years combined of spirit wear and quickly became a hang out spot for many students during lunchtime. Last year, we kicked off everything with a fantastic Open House at our Fall Meet the Team Night featuring many student groups and outside organizations that have supported us throughout the years. That was followed by a walk down memory lane and a packed house at the Reenactment of the Cornerstone laying at Colerain Elementary. Excitement continued as we danced the night away at the very successful, first-ever, Booster Gala. Another highlight was the announcement of the All-Century Teams comprised of stand-out athletes from the last 100 years. Jarrett Grace, Class of 2011, is a graduate of the University of Kentucky's College of Medicine. Prior to medical school, he received both his bachelor's and master's degrees in Business Administration from the University of Notre Dame. While at Notre Dame, he was a 4-year letter winner on the football team. In 2013 and 2015, he received the Rockne Student Athlete Award presented to the student athlete with the highest GPA. In 2014, he was named to the Butkus Award Watch List which recognizes the nation's best Linebacker. Jarrett is a 4th generation Colerain Cardinal and was inducted into the school's Athletic Hall of Fame in 2023.

Ken Dirr served as Superintendent of the Northwest Local School District from 1994 – 2001. He began his career in 1968 as a junior high Math teacher and coach of three sports. In 1972, he became an Assistant Principal at Northwest High School. He served as Principal from 1979 – 1981. In 1981, he moved to the Central Office and oversaw Human Resources and then became an Assistant Superintendent. As Superintendent, he saw an opportunity for Colerain High School to become a member of the Greater Miami Conference (GMC). Ken enlisted the district's Partners in Education, Corporate Partners and the Boosters to ensure that the school's commitment to the league could be met. As a result of his vision, Colerain was accepted as a full member of the league in the Fall of 1997. Ken's three children all graduated from Colerain High School.

Mary Lee Tracy, Class of 1977, is the President and Head Coach of the Cincinnati Gymnastics Academy (CGA). The mission at CGA is to teach gymnastics through loving discipline while influencing the lives we touch in a positive way! She served as a Coach for the US Women's Gymnastics Olympic team in 1996 and 2000. She has coached 28 members of the US National Team. She was inducted into the USA Gymnastics Hall of Fame in 2008. She was named USA Gymnastics' Women's Coach of the Year for three consecutive years from 1994 – 1996 and is a seven-time Region 5 Coach of the Year. In 1996, Mary Lee was named a Distinguished Graduate of Colerain High School.

Nicole Taulbee, Class of '97, was elected to the NWLSD Board of Education in November 2021 and currently serves as Board President. Nicole and her husband Tom who is also a 1997 Colerain graduate have three sons: Carson a freshman studying Education and playing baseball at Mount St. Joseph University, Austin an 8th grader at Colerain Middle School and Blake a third grader at Colerain Elementary. Nicole has worked at Ameritas as a Senior Data Scientist on the IT Data and Analytics team for the past 25 years. Nicole has also helped lead Ameritas' Community Involvement Council for over 20 years. She looks forward to giving back to the district and continuing to make NWLSD a district where students thrive and are prepared for the future.

Bill "Seg" Dennison, Class of 1976, got his start in broadcasting at Colerain High School as a member of the WNSD radio staff. Bill graduated from Northern Kentucky University in 1980 with a degree in Communications. In 1978 he was hired by WLW and started out producing helicopter traffic reports. He moved into sports with the help of Andy MacWilliams and Bob Trumpy. He has covered the Reds, Bengals, Bearcats, Musketeers and RedHawks. He has also reported on All Star games, Super Bowls, World Series, and the Indy 500. He has worked in the Reds radio booth for over 35 years with Marty Brennaman, the late Joe Nuxhall, Jeff Brantley, Tommy Thrall and Thom Brennaman. In 2015, Bill was named a Distinguished Graduate of Colerain High School.

Archie Brown, Class of 1978, is the President and Chief Executive Officer of First Financial Bank. First Financial has \$17 billion in assets with 130 branches in Ohio, Indiana, Kentucky, and Illinois. He currently is a Board and Executive Committee member of the Cincinnati City Development Corporation (3CDC), a Board member of the Cincinnati Business Committee, a Board member of the Cincinnati USA Regional Chamber, a member of the Board of Directors of the Cincinnati Branch of the Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland and a member of the Commercial Club of Cincinnati. Archie's wife, Sharen, is a 1977 graduate of Northwest High School. In 2023, Archie was named a Distinguished Graduate of Colerain High School.

In conjunction with the celebration of Colerain High School's 100th graduating class and its storied past in athletics, All Century teams have been selected for 23 sports. The teams reflect the extraordinary accomplishments of its student athletes over the past 100 years. Selections were made strictly on the student's high school career. Teams were selected based on the following:

- Recommendations from teammates, coaches, athletic directors and administrators
- Input from independent resources
- Statistical evaluation and ranking using available school records
- Whether an athlete was recognized as All City, All Southwest District or All State
- Review of Cincinnati Enquirer and Cincinnati Post archives
- Review of yearbooks

There was no "set" number of athletes to be included on any given team. Every attempt was made to ensure that no deserving athlete was overlooked. There is representation from every decade going back to the 1920s.

1,066 athletes have been identified as All Century with approximately 5% recognized in 3 or more sports. Additionally 56 All Century Coaches and 3 Athletic Directors have been selected.

CENTURY SCHOLARSHIPS



First Graduating Class from Colerain Centralized School 1925

The first commencement of the Colerain Township High School was held on Friday evening June 25, 1925. The Class of 1925 had 9 graduates – Helen Craig, Robert Foster, Helen Hoock, Howard Hoock, Alfred Huttles, Richard Joyce, Lourine Kraus, George Ruoff and Mildred Shaw. On Tuesday May 21, Colerain High School held its 100th commencement ceremony. The Class of 2024 joined the ranks of alumni with over 33,000 other graduates. In memory of the Class of

1925 and to honor Colerain's 100th graduating class, the Colerain Boosters presented \$1,000 Century Scholarships to 9 members of the Class of 2024. Scholarships were funded through donations in honor of or in memory of teachers, classmates, family members or friends. Students applied with an essay discussing how education at Colerain has changed over the past 100 years and how it will change in the next 100 years.
