GAME NOTES

LIVE LINKS: Live Stats will be available at all three Arizona venues this week, with Live Video expected at two of the sites. The season opening doubleheader at Arizona Christian will feature Live Video and Live Stats through ACU's [Stretch Internet Portal](#); at Ottawa, Live Stats will be available through OUAZ's [SIDEARM Stats Portal](#) and Live Video through OUAZ's [Stretch Internet Portal](#); while at Benedictine Mesa, Live Stats will be available through Ben-U's [Stretch Internet Portal](#).

HISTORY IN ARIZONA: It marks C of I's third trip all-time to Arizona, with the Yotes a combined 10-5 in the desert. The 2005 team traveled to Tucson to compete at the Tucson Invitational Games, going 4-3, while last season, C of I played eight games in four days, finishing 6-2 overall.

PLAYING IN JANUARY: It is the third time the Yotes have started their season in January – going 3-0-1 in the Bay Area in 2016 and posting the 6-2 record last season in Arizona.

OPPONENT PREVIEW – ARIZONA CHRISTIAN: The 2019 season opens at Golden State Athletic Conference foe Arizona Christian, where the Firestorm (16-27) feature a new head coach in Anna Welsh – who had marked success at both Bethel (Ind.) and Southeastern (Fla.). ACU returns two of their top hitters – Kylee Brown (.372 9 HR 35 RB) and Elsy Guzman (.317 3 HR 21 RBI) – along with their No. 1 pitcher, Hilaria Stewart (8-8 4.04 ERA). C of I swept both games with ACU last season.

OPPONENT PREVIEW – OTTAWA: Second-year program and first-year NAIA member, Ottawa, meets C of I for the second-straight season. The Spirit (10-38), members of the California Pacific Conference, look for improvement behind hitters Sydney Saxton (.379 1 HR 18 RBI) and Emily Stebbins (.318 0 HR 29 RBI), while returning their workhorse in the circle, Sabrina Jimenez (8-22 5.93 ERA). C of I picked up a pair of victory against OUAZ last season.

OPPONENT PREVIEW – BENEDICTINE MESA: The trip ends at Benedictine Mesa of the Cal Pac – with the Redhawks (23-29) finishing in the upper half of their league standings in 2018. Ben-U returns the middle of their line-up in infielder Vanessa Marquez (.449 11 HR 48 RBI) and outfielder Samantha Yingling (.320 6 HR 36 RBI), while pitcher Megan Grigsby (6-6 6.10 ERA) leads a new-look group in the circle. The two teams split a pair of games in 2018.

CCC PRESEASON POLL: The College of Idaho was picked to finish in a tie for fifth in the 2019 Cascade Conference Softball Preseason Coaches' Poll, released by the league office in December. C of I received 45 voter points from the 10 league coaches – tied with Carroll College for the No. 5 spot. Defending conference champion and national semifinalist, Southern Oregon (80 points), were the odds-on favorite to win the title, followed by Oregon Tech (70), Corban (69) and Eastern Oregon (49) – all teams that qualified for the NAIA Championships.

Honors:

Mendiola was named 2007 Cascade Conference and NAIA Region I Coach of the Year, while earning NFCA West Region Coach of the Year honors in 2014. He has coached 21 All-CCC players, four NAIA All-Americans, 38 CCC All-Academic Team selections, and 17 NAIA Scholar-Athlete award winners.

Postseason:

Under Mendiola, the Yotes have made seven postseason appearances, including the 2006, 2007, 2009, 2013, 2014 and 2017 CCC tournaments; the 2007 and 2008 NAIA Region I tournaments; and berths in the 2008, 2009, 2013, and 2014 NAIA Softball National Championships. His 2007 team set a school record with 37 wins, winning the CCC title and finishing as the regional runners-up; his 2008 team won the regional crown and made their first appearance in the NAIA World Series; his 2009 team won the CCC regular-season title and finished in a three-way tie for first-place in their pool at the NAIA World Series; with his 2013 team winning the CCC postseason tournament and advancing to the title game of the Irvine NAIA Opening Round Tournament. In 2014, Mendiola's Yotes won the Caldwell NAIA Opening Round tournament, advancing to the NAIA World Series, where they finished fifth - ending the year ranked No. 7 in the NAIA Top-25 poll.

As an Assistant:

Outside of softball, Mendiola was the head coach of the Caldwell Silver Streaks American Legion baseball team from 1997-07 and has also assisted with the Boise Clippers men's fastpitch team. He was also an assistant coach for the C of I baseball team for seven years.

POSITIONAL PREVIEW – PITCHERS: Adding to the depth of the pitching staff was the No. 1 key for head coach Al Mendiola during the offseason – looking to solidify the No. 2 starting pitcher slot and deepen C of I's bullpen. Heading into 2019, the Yotes have accomplished what they set out to do. A staff of seven pitchers – including five returners – will give Mendiola plenty of options throughout the season. "The biggest improvement our team has made from last season, through the fall and now into the preseason, is in the circle," the 14th-year head coach said. "We return an all-conference pitcher, but have added depth to be able to staff games if need be. Our No. 2, 3, 4, and 5 pitchers as a group are the best we've had in a decade." Anchoring the staff is ace Colette Robert, who has led the team in every pitching statistical category in each of the past two seasons. The hard-throwing lefty earned All-Cascade Conference honors as a junior after posting a 15-9 record with a 2.04 ERA – striking out 115 batters and walking just 21 – in 154 innings, with seven of her nine losses coming in 1-run games. C of I used a revolving door in the No. 2 starter role in 2018 – with three different players logging at least four starts. The squad will begin the season with true freshman Hannah McNeerney in that role – after an outstanding prep career and a great showing during the fall season. The 5-foot -10 right-hander was a Oregon 5A first-team All-State selection as a senior at Hood River Valley High, earning Columbia River Conference Player of the Year honors after recording 12 wins and 152 strikeouts. Sophomore Loryn Fonger will be key in the Yotes success after a solid 2018 season – working either as a starter or as one of the first options out of the pen. Fonger made 15 appearances in her first year in the Purple and Gold, including eight starts, going 2-3 with a 4.20 ERA in 40 innings. True freshman Reylene Cortes makes the jump from high school to college softball after winning three-straight 4A state titles at Middleton High – and will be utilized out of the bullpen. During her prep career, Cortes posted a 26-2 record with a 1.64 ERA, with 182 strikeouts – including a 10-0 mark as a senior. Three other returners will give the Yotes an opportunity to work against specific match-ups out of the bullpen. Senior Haylie Hudson made 11 appearances in 2018 and posted a 3.71 ERA in 11 innings of work; with sophomores, Nichole Giesy and Kendyll Boltz, combining to see action in 10 games out of the pen. "One thing to our advantage is our pitchers complement each other," Mendiola said. "Depending on the match-up – we can throw a rise-ball pitcher with speed, a drop-ball pitcher, or a pitcher with a lot of spin. It is a luxury we haven't had in recent years. The key, however, is working ahead and throwing strikes."

POSITIONAL PREVIEW – INFIELD/CATCHERS: The Coyotes return experience throughout the diamond – as the team must replace just one player from the 2018 infield (four-year starter, Kristin Paulazzo). At first base, three players with starting experience are all battling for the job. All-CCC selection Jordan Maddox had an outstanding freshman season – hitting .368 with five homers and 22 RBI, tying for the team lead with 10 doubles. Also back is two-year starter Martha Tooley, a career .300 hitter with pop in her bat, with sophomore Lacie Miller making the move to first after recording seven doubles and ranking second on the team with 11 walks in her first season with the team. Another first-baseman, senior Hailee Kiser, is battling back after missing 2018 due to injury. Across the diamond, Benti Corta makes the move from second base to third – a similar change that Paulazzo made before her senior season. Corta hit .267 as a junior – but had an impressive fall camp. Miller and Tooley are also in the mix at third base. Depth up the middle is key for the Yotes – as Trystin Crofts returns at shortstop after a breakout 2018 season. The junior hit a career-best .343 and led the team with eight home runs and 30 RBI. A versatile player, Crofts may also see time at third base and also in the outfield. Kylie Smith had an outstanding freshman season and is comfortable at either middle infield position – hitting .281 in 2018 with 10 doubles and 25 RBI in 41 games and tied for the team lead in stolen bases with eight. Fellow sophomore, Aleah Mendiola hit .429 in limited action – but is one of the top defensive players on the diamond. Newcomer Haley Loffer will be a factor – with the ability to play up the middle, along with adding depth at the Coyotes catching position. The freshman had a banner prep career at Lake City High, earning 5A All-Inland Empire League honors all four years of high school – finishing with a .452 career batting average with 100 stolen bases and 74 RBI. The depth continues behind the plate, with the Yotes returning multiple options at catcher. Sophomores Taylor Eakle and Mallory Copeland shared time in 2018 – Eakle the offensive force, hitting .284 with six home runs, with Copeland an outstanding defender with a strong arm. Brielle Stephens returns after missing most of last season due to injury, freshman Kiley Kendall was an All-Southern Idaho Conference pick at Ridgevue High, helping her team to consecutive 4A state tournament runner-up finishes, with Loffer adding a fifth component.

POSITIONAL PREVIEW – OUTFIELDERS: The outfield returns experience and depth, with the Yotes having the ability to cover foul pole to foul pole. Four-year starter Delaney Atkins has been the everyday centerfielder throughout her career – earning All-CCC honors as a sophomore. Atkins is a career .280 hitter with 20 doubles and 51 RBI and among the top defensive players at her position in the league. Also returning is senior Marissa Maddox, who took over the right field spot in 2018 and earned All-CCC honors in the process. Maddox hit .359 with six home runs and 24 RBI and added three outfield assists. C of I will have to replace four-year starter Courtney Ellis in left field – with returners Micha Fortune and Emily Aspden the leading candidates. Fortune, a sophomore, had nine hits and 14 at bats during last season's Arizona trip before an injury sidelined her for the season. Aspden, a slap-hitting two-sport athlete, hit .280 and is one of the fastest players on the team. Four freshmen will also battle to crack the line-up – Kona Bustos, Alyssa Goff, Payton Bates and Charmayne Bennett. Both Bustos and Goff were All-Southern Idaho Conference selections at Vallivue High; Bates was a 4A All-State selection at Camas High in Washington; with Bennett an All-District pick at Weston-McEwen High in Oregon.

CAREER RECORDS: Six players begin 2019 ranked among the Top-20 in the C of I career record book. Four players rank among the offensive leaders – as Delaney Atkins is No. 8 in triples (3), No. 10 in hit by pitches (13), No. 15 in runs scored (66) and doubles (20), No. 18 in RBI (51), No. 19 in total bases (145) and No. 20 in at bats (359); Trystin Crofts is No. 11 in home runs (10), No. 14 in triples (2), No. 16 in assists (126) and No. 18 in stolen bases (13); Martha Tooley is No. 12 in putouts (299) and No. 20 in defensive chances (357); with Marissa Maddox No. 14 in triples (2). Two pitchers are in the Top-20 all-time as well, as Colette Robert ranks No. 3 in saves (3), No. 4 in ERA (2.35) and shutouts (7), No. 6 in wins (27) and complete games (36), No. 7 in strikeouts (193), No. 8 in innings pitched (277.1) and No. 9 in appearances (48) and starts (42); with Loryn Fonger No. 20 in games started (8).

LOOKING AHEAD: C of I will have the next two weekends off in preparation for a Feb. 16 scrimmage vs. the College of Southern Idaho, followed by welcoming Willamette and Menlo to Caldwell for six games in three days.
