## IVY CHAMPS IN BASEBALL

**W**hen *Chris Cruz* crushed a two-run home run over the fence in right field on May 6 at Hoy Field, it kicked off one of the wildest celebrations ever seen on the campus diamond. Sure, the sophomore slugger broke a program record for home runs in a season with the blast, his 12th of the campaign. And yes, it came in the bottom of the 11th inning to give the Big Red a 3-1 victory over Dartmouth.

But most importantly, the home run came in the third game of the best-of-three Ivy League Championship Series, giving the Big Red its first Ivy title since the league added baseball as one of its championship sports 20 years prior. Cornell's last baseball league title was in 1977, when it was still competing in the Eastern Intercollegiate Baseball League. For just the second time in the program's 143-year history, the team earned a berth into the Regionals of the NCAA championships.

Pitcher *Kellen Urbon*, who set a program record for saves in a season with nine, was unanimously selected as the Ivy League Rookie of the Year and an All-Ivy League first-team selection. He was joined on the first squad by sophomore pitcher *Connor Kaufmann*, who provided the season's other most memorable moment when he hurled a no-hitter on April 1 against the very same Big Green.

Freshman pitcher *Brian McAfee*, senior catcher *Brandon Lee*, senior outfielder *Brian Billigen* and Cruz were named to the second team. Five more players received honorable mention, including senior first baseman *Frank Hager*, who was named as one of the 11 members of the Capital One Academic All-America All-District Baseball Team.

The awards were individual trophies that ultimately demonstrated what a monumental season the Big Red had to capture the Ivy League title. After going 10-30 in 2011, the diamondmen returned many players at key offensive and defensive positions. The true overhaul was the pitching staff, which featured a plethora of freshmen and returning players shifting into different roles.

It didn't take long to recognize that the formula was a winner. Cornell swept

four games from Maryland-Eastern Shore to start the year, and then won the first two games of a series at George Washington the following weekend to post a 6-0 record for the first time since 1906. Freshman pitcher *Brent Jones* got off to a blazing start with a 4-0 record, 1.44 ERA, 27 strikeouts and three complete games in his first four collegiate appearances. Billigen recorded a 16-game hitting streak, and junior outfielder *Spenser Souza* stole home for the winning run in the ninth inning of a game at Longwood. The team eclipsed its win total from 2011 before it even played its first home game of 2012, bringing a 13-4-1 record into Ivy League play.

The Big Red rattled off a 10-game winning streak to take command of the ultra competitive Lou Gehrig Division, where all four teams won at least half of their games against Red Rolfe Division opponents.

The flair for the dramatic continued, with sophomore *Tom D'Alessandro*'s 11th-inning home run keying a sweep of Brown. The Big Red won the first three contests of a four-game series against both Columbia and Penn to take a three-game division lead over Princeton into the teams' regular season-ending series. The Tigers won the first three outings to set up a winner-take-all finale, which Cornell won on the strength of six scoreless innings of relief from Urbon and a 12th-inning home run by sophomore Ben Swinford.

The following weekend, the Big Red was the host of the Ivy League Championship Series for the first time in the event's history. Cornell claimed the opener, 11-3, powered by a 5-for-5 performance from senior shortstop *Marshall Yanzick*. Dartmouth rebounded to win Game 2 and forced a third and deciding contest the following afternoon. When Cruz's home run cleared the fence, it pushed the Big Red to 5-0 on the season in extra-inning games.

## SETTING THE STAGE FOR EVEN GREATER SUCCESS

Experiences can be some of life's most precious gifts, and the Cornell baseball team realized the experience of a lifetime in winning the Ivy League championship and earning a spot in the NCAA Tournament. And though the Red went 0-2 in the regional held in Chapel Hill, N.C., Head Coach Bill Walkenbach '98 is confident that the experience of competing well in its short stay on the national stage will benefit his squad.

"When they go back to playing Ivy League baseball," he said, "they'll know they stood toe-to-toe with the No. 6 team in the nation, and arguably the best team in the country over the last six or seven years, and gave them a run for their money. It'll do tremendous things for their confidence." After falling to No. 6 North


Carolina, 7-4, on Friday in the regional opener, the Big Red was eliminated from the tournament on Saturday with a 10-6 loss to East Carolina at UNC's Boshamer Stadium. The Big Red's record-setting season ended at 31-17-1, but set the stage, Walkenbach said, for future success.

"We expect that the experience of playing in these really close, high stakes games over the past month will make our players that much tougher when it comes down to the end of ball games in the future," he said. "We'll expect them to expect to win."

Cornell had plenty of reasons to be happy with its season — a school-record 31 wins, its first Ivy League championship and second trip to the NCAA tournament. But those things didn't make the elimination from the NCAA Tournament any easier to take.

"It's a disappointing end to our season," Walkenbach said. "We want to play as long as we can, but we ran into a little better team today."

"But I was very pleased with the effort of our team," he said. "I was pleased with the energy and determination they showed and what they showed all season. It was no surprise to me that we would come out, do well, and compete hard."

# ANOTHER HEPS TITLE FOR WOMEN'S TRACK

**C**ornell women's track and field proved to be the best team in the Ivy League during the 2012 outdoor season, putting forth consistent efforts and claiming the Outdoor Heptagonals championship for the ninth time in 11 years.



Throughout the season, the team was led by a number of talented athletes who performed well in pressure situations. Junior distance runner **Katie Kellner** scored 18 points at the Outdoor Heps, winning the 10K race and finishing second in the 5K. Kellner then took fourth in the 3K at the much larger ECAC Outdoor championships the following week. Her strong efforts earned her a trip to Jacksonville, FL to compete in the 10K at the NCAA Eastern Regionals. Kellner's outstanding season continued with a third-place finish in Jacksonville, qualifying her for the NCAA championships in Des Moines, IA in June.

Several of Kellner's teammates also had strong performances at the Outdoor Heps. Senior co-captain **Molly Glantz** won the 400 hurdles with a time of 59.08. The Big Red's 4x400 relay team of **Libby O'Brien**, **Kelsey Reimnitz**, **Zena Kolliesuah** and **Ebolutalese Airewele** won

that race by three quarters of a second. **Ailish Hanley** was the winner in the high jump and **Victoria Imbesi** claimed the shot put title with a throw of 49' 3 3/4".

Two weeks later at the ECAC Outdoor championships, Cornell again turned in an impressive performance. After winning the ECAC Indoors in March, the Big Red placed third in the spring in a much larger field of 80 teams comprised of schools from North Carolina to Maine. Cornell was led by the 3K steeplechase team of **Genna Hartung** and **Rachel Sorna**, who finished 1-2 in the event to score 18 points for Cornell.

The relay teams also provided Cornell with points, as the 4x400 team of Kolliesuah, Reimnitz, **Katie Woodford** and Airewele won by one one-hundredth of a second and the 4x100 team of **Anjelique Parnell**, Kolliesuah, Airewele, and Woodford finished in sixth place. Other point scorers for Cornell included Kellner in the 3K, **Devin McMahon** in the 5K (seventh place), Glantz in the 400 hurdles (fourth place) and **Erin Rossi** in the hammer throw (eighth place).

The Big Red traveled to Jacksonville with 13 athletes for the NCAA East Regionals. Kellner qualified for the NCAA championships, as did Hartung with an 11th place finish in the 3K steeplechase in a school-record time of 10:10.55. Glantz advanced to the finals of the 400 hurdles but fell one place short of qualifying for the NCAA championships. Her final race in a Cornell uniform was a personal record and the second-best time in school history. The 4x400 relay team of Kolliesuah, Airewele, Reimnitz and Woodford just missed qualifying for the NCAA championships with a 21st-place finish.

On the big stage in Des Moines, Hartung, a junior, placed 13th in her specialty with a time of 10:52.12. Her classmate, Kellner, capped her outstanding season with a 21st-place showing in the 10K run (34:43.67), two minutes behind the winner.

## DESTINY LENDS A HAND IN FRIENDSHIP

During the second weekend of June, juniors Katie Kellner and Genna Hartung both competed for a national championship by participating at the NCAA Championships in Des Moines, Iowa. Their road together to Des Moines began nearly three years ago when they met as freshmen. They've rarely been apart since.

Kellner and Hartung's friendship seemed destined from the start, as they were born just one day apart. But for 18 years, they had never heard of each other.

When she found out Hartung would be attending Cornell as well, Kellner began contacting her on Facebook. Hartung was impressed with Kellner's high school personal records, just a few seconds better than her own, and she piqued Kellner's interest by posting times on Facebook whenever she would finish a run.

Kellner, from West Windsor, N.J., and Hartung, from far upstate (Morrisville) in New York, had never met in real life. But by the time they got on campus together, their friendship began in earnest.

Like everything else, Hartung and Kellner's latest success came together. Fresh off a terrific outdoor season, the two traveled to Jacksonville, Fla., for the NCAA East Regional. In fields of 48 runners in each event, Hartung and Kellner had to make the top 12 for a berth in the NCAA Championships.

Kellner went first in the 10K. Coming into the event, she had the top time of anyone. With that target on her back, though, Kellner was not flustered. She led most of the way and cruised to a comfortable third-place finish in the heat, sealing her opportunity to compete at the NCAA's.

Hartung's race in the 3K steeplechase was not until the next day. But the joke was obvious for everyone involved. "Katie needs a roommate in two weeks," Assistant Coach Artie Smith told them.

Hartung would not disappoint. Seeded as the 22nd entrant out of 48, she might not have been favored to make the top 12. Instead of feeling pressure, though, she was loose and laughing on the starting line. Kellner had enough nerves for the two of them.

"We just care so much about how the other person does and how they're improving," Kellner said. "When [Hartung] was out there on the starting line, I was close to as nervous as she was. I wanted her to make it just as badly as she wanted to make it herself."

The women's lacrosse season was a successful one, as the team finished with an 11-5 record and increased its win total by five games compared to the 2011 season. Senior **Jessi Steinberg** and junior **Caroline Salisbury** led the team with 44 goals each and earned first-team (Steinberg) and second-team (Salisbury) All-Ivy honors. The team's total of 227 goals was the second-highest in program history, just one goal shy of the record.

Senior defender **Cacki Helmer** was also named to the first-team All-Ivy squad. Helmer closed out a terrific career with 48 ground balls and 33 caused turnovers, earning All-America second-team honors in the process.



The season included victories over three ranked opponents and the Big Red finished in a four-way tie for second place in the Ivy League with a 5-2 conference record. The team earned the No. 3 seed in the Ivy League Tournament based

on the league's tiebreaker formula, advancing to the postseason for the second time in three years.

Cornell played well against second-seeded Dartmouth but came up just short in a 9-8 season-ending loss.

The season began with five consecutive victories, including a crucial 12-6 win against league rival Harvard. Cornell's winning streak was snapped by No. 7 Notre Dame in a 17-13 loss in Orlando, but the team rebounded by knocking off No. 11 Loyola-Maryland at home and No. 16 Princeton on the road. The regular season finished on a high note with three consecutive wins before the loss to Dartmouth in the league tournament. The team hoped to receive an at-large berth into the NCAA tournament, but was not among the 16 teams selected despite its fine season.

Nine seniors graduated this spring after helping the team achieve its best record since the 2006 season.

## MEN LACROSSE SUFFERS TOUGH LOSSES

Despite losing **Rob Pannell**, the reigning USILA National Player of the Year, in just its second game of the season, the men's lacrosse team managed to be highly competitive throughout 2012, ranking as high as third in the country before seeing its season come to an end in the opening round of the Ivy League Tournament. Cornell finished the year with a 9-4 record overall and a mark of 4-2 in the conference, good for a second-place finish in the regular-season league standings.

The team saw tremendous individual efforts throughout the year with freshman **Matt Donovan** being named the unanimous Ivy League Rookie of the Year after leading Cornell with 32 points on 18 goals and a team-best 14 assists. Additionally, senior **Roy Lang** and junior **Jason Noble** were named first-team All-Ivy, while senior **Chris Langton** joined Donovan on the second-team. Juniors **Thomas Keith** and **Steve Mock** were named honorable mention selections.

Lang (third-team) and Noble (second-team) also added All-America honors to their list of post-season awards, while Langton

was selected to participate in the USILA North/South Senior All-Star Game.

During the season, the Big Red enjoyed a six-game winning streak, during which it also held the longest home-game winning streak in the nation (15 games), both of which were ended by Ivy foe Brown on a last second goal in a 10-9 loss on Senior Day.

Cornell opened the year with three consecutive victories over in-state rivals Binghamton (17-12), Army (18-7) and Canisius (19-4), before falling 9-8 in overtime to then-ranked No. 1 Virginia in the Inside Lacrosse/Konica Minolta Face-Off Classic. From there, the Big Red rattled off six straight wins, including slim victories over Yale (8-7), Denver (9-8 OT) and Dartmouth (7-5) and used a gutsy performance against Penn to overcome an early 7-2 deficit and beat the Quakers, 16-11. The Red also easily dispatched central New York foe Syracuse (12-6) under the lights at Schoellkopf Field, and Ivy foe Harvard (14-10) before falling to the Bears.

## **MEN'S TRACK HAS EXCELLENT SPRING**

**T**he Big Red men's track and field team had another great season, taking second place in the Outdoor Heptagonal championships and also finishing second in the much larger IC4A Outdoor meet.

Standout performances from the Outdoor Heps included a decathlon victory by senior co-captain **Nick Huber**. Huber, who scored 7,632 points to set a new school record, was superb throughout the season and earned an automatic spot in the 2012 NCAA Outdoor championships in Des Moines, IA, in June as one of the best 12 decathlon athletes east of the Mississippi River.


Other strong Heps performances included **Peter Roach**, who improved his personal best by seven inches to win the pole vault and earn a spot in the NCAA Regionals, and **Chase Aaronson**, who won his first ever Heps individual title with a 24' 2 1/2" leap in the long jump. Freshman **Stephen Mozia**, who was spectacular all year, won the Heps shot put with a throw of 61' 8 1/2", the second-best throw in school history. Senior co-captain **Dan Hagberg** won the 110 hurdles,

and **Kenny McClain** was the 400 hurdles champion. Cornell also claimed first place in the 4x100 relay.

At the IC4As, the Big Red's success included two second-place finishes by Mozia and a second-place finish by the 4x800 relay team of **Will McFall, Ben Potts, Brian Freitas and Will Weinlandt**. Cornell scored 52 points to finish second in a field of more than 80 teams.

Thirteen athletes advanced to the NCAA East Regionals in Jacksonville, FL. Freshman **Montez Blair** joined Huber in qualifying for the NCAA championships with a top-12 finish in the high jump at the East Regionals.

Moving on to the NCAAs, Huber ended his phenomenal collegiate career by finishing 11th in the decathlon, capping the five-event competition with a fifth-place showing in the 1500-meter run of 4:29.99. Blair, who holds the school record in the high jump, cleared the bar at 7 1/2" to place 14th out of 24 participants.



## **YOUNG SOFTBALL TEAM CONTINUES ITS SUCCESS**

**T**he Cornell softball team has been doing it so long, it almost looks easy. For the fourth consecutive year, the Big Red won the Ivy League South Division title, but it was anything but easy. In 2012, Cornell won a share of the crown by winning its final five games, all on the road, with two in extra innings.



The Big Red's heroics late in the season put it atop the division in a final tie with Penn at 15-5 in conference action. Cornell lost a one-game divisional playoff to the Quakers, who advanced to the Ivy League Championship series.


With a young squad that was challenged by the graduation losses of two-time Ivy Pitcher of the Year, **Elizabeth Dalrymple**, and first-team All-Ivy outfielder, **Marissa Amiraian**, Cornell started slowly and ended with a flourish to post a 25-23 overall record.

Picking up the gauntlet in the circle was sophomore **Alyson Onyon**, who was named second-

team All-Ivy. Along with first-teamers, **Lauren Bucolo** (outfield) and **Kristen Towne** (catcher), and second-team second baseman **Jenny Edwards**, all of who are underclassmen, the future looks as bright as the past.

Over the past decade and a half, few programs in college softball have been more consistently successful than the Big Red. Under the direction of Head Coach **Dick Blood**, Cornell has won at least 25 games in 16 consecutive years. The next best active mark in the Ivy League is Harvard with six. In 13 of those seasons, Cornell has won at least 30 games, and has reached the rarified 40-win mark three times.

The Big Red has earned a staggering 90-29 record in league play since scheduling a 20-game Ivy League slate in 2007. Blood is the all-time winningest coach in Cornell athletics history for a single sport and finished the season with 567 triumphs (567-266-2) and five conference crowns.


## RECAP

### HEAVYWEIGHT ROWERS MAKE SOLID SHOWING

**A**fter opening the season with solid results at both the San Diego Crew Classic and the George Washington Invitational, the heavyweight crew earned the Stagg Point Trophy over Syracuse and Navy before upsetting Princeton and Yale to earn the Carnegie Cup. It was Cornell's first Carnegie Cup since 2009, and just the third time since 1974 that the Big Red defeated both the Tigers and the Bulldogs in the same season. The heavies then closed out the cup season in stellar fashion, sweeping Penn to win its fourth consecutive Madeira Cup, as well as the James Wray Memorial Trophy.

During the championship season, Cornell advanced four boats to the Grand Finals at the 2012 EARC Sprints, with the Freshmen 8 earning the bronze medal. The Second Freshmen 8 took fourth place and both the Second Varsity 8 and the Third Varsity 8 took sixth overall. The Varsity 8 rounded out the team's performance with a fourth-place finish in the Petite Finals for 10th place overall.

At the 110th edition of the IRA Rowing Championships, all four crews either equaled or exceeded their initial seeding and in the race for the Ten Eyck Award, given to the team with the highest point total, the Big Red finished fifth overall, two points ahead of Ivy foe Princeton. On the course, the Varsity 8 placed ninth, while the Second Varsity 8 took eighth. The Open 4+ won the Petite Finals to finish seventh in the nation and the highlight of the regatta was the fourth-place finish of the Freshmen 8 in the Grand Final to finish just outside the medals.



### CUP SEASON GOOD TO LIGHTWEIGHT CREWS

**T**he Cornell men's lightweight crews enjoyed a successful cup season. First the Big Red won the Matthews Cup, defeating Penn in the Varsity 8 race, as well as the Leonard Cup for the best team performance against the Quakers and Harvard.

Cornell went on to edge Princeton in the Varsity 8 race by .3 seconds to win the Platt Cup for the first time since the 2007 season. The lightweights rebounded to losses to Yale by defeating Columbia and MIT for their fifth consecutive Geiger Cup before Dartmouth claimed the Baggaley Bowl.

The Big Red then advanced all four crews to the Grand Finals at the 2012 EARC Sprints, earning the gold medal in the Third Varsity 8 and the silver in the Second Varsity 8. In addition to the outstanding medal

performances, the Freshmen 8 took fourth place in the Grand Finals, while the Varsity 8 placed sixth overall.

The lightweight season concluded at the IRA Championship where the Varsity 8 placed fifth in the Grand Final and the Varsity 4 took second, crossing the line just .7 of a second behind first-place Wisconsin and more than a second in front of Ivy League foe Yale.

Individually, **Ben Perry** '12 has been selected for the 2012 US Rowing Lightweight Men's Under 23 national team sweep camp. The team will be coached by former Cornell lightweight rowing captain **Colin Farrell** '05, who will be in charge of selecting the men's lightweight 4+ to compete at the World Rowing Under 23 Championships July 11-15 in Trakai, Lithuania.





## WOMEN'S ROWING EXCELS AT IVES

The women's rowing team had one of the most successful seasons in recent history. Under the guidance of the 2012 CRCA Mid-Atlantic Regional Coach of the Year **Hilary Gebman**, Cornell earned victories over Syracuse, Boston University, Yale, Columbia and Dartmouth during the Cup season before taking the silver medal in the varsity 8 race at the inaugural Ivy League championship. Overall, 2012 was the women's best season in the past 22 years.

The Big Red placed fourth in team points at the Ivy League championship, edged by third-place Yale by just one-point, but used that performance to secure a berth to the 2012 NCAA Women's Rowing Championship, its second selection to NCAAs overall and its first in 10 years. Cornell beat its seed and place 13th overall, finishing one-point behind 12th place Radcliffe and six points in front of Brown.

The Varsity 4 was the highest placing boat at the championship, placing fourth in the Petite Final to finish 10th in the nation, while the Varsity 8 took fifth in the Petite Final for 11th place. The Second Varsity 8 finished second in the Third Level Final to place 14th in the country.

During the NCAA championship, junior **Shelly Tremaglio** was named the recipient of the Elite 89 Award, presented to the student-athlete with the highest cumulative grade-point average participating at the finals site for each of the NCAA's championships.

The day after Sunday's NCAA championship, the nine seniors who competed at the regatta were also honored by vice president for Student and Academic Services **Susan Murphy** and other university senior staff at a commencement ceremony held in the Hall of Fame Room in Friends Hall.

With such an amazing season in the books, it's no surprise that individual accolades poured in for the Big Red student-athletes. Topping the list was a pair of CRCA All-American selections for **Taylor Goetzinger** '12 and **Cecelia Madsen** '12. Goetzinger was named to the first team and became Cornell's first repeat CRCA All-American selection, while Madsen earned a spot on the second team. The duo took the honor after being named Mid-Atlantic Region first-team selections along with teammates **Leigh Archr** '13 and **Jeannie Friedman** '12, while **Tracy Eisser** '12 was a regional second-team honoree. Eisser and Friedman were also named CRCA National Scholar Athletes, along with teammates **Judy Amsalem** '12, **Maggie Cook** '12, and **Anna Psiaki** '12.

Additionally, for their effort at the Ivy League championship, the entire Varsity 8 crew of Friedman, Madsen, Goetzinger, Archr, Eisser, Psiaki, **Kay C. Byrnes** '12, **Stephanie Lohberg** '12 and **Stephanie Kuntz** '13 were named second-team All-Ivy.

## MEN'S & WOMEN'S TENNIS TEAMS HAVE BRIGHT FUTURE

Without a senior on either roster, the men and women's tennis teams continued to mold their programs in 2011-12.

The men competed with one of the youngest lineups in the country, frequently comprised of one sophomore and five freshmen. The Big Red faced a challenging non-league schedule before the always-demanding Ivy League slate.

The results were understandably mixed, but the season ended on a strong note with three consecutive victories against Ivy foes Yale, Penn and Princeton.

The late surge propelled the Big Red back into the national rankings, where it was tabbed 72nd by the ITA as of early May. The squad's final record was 10-15, including a 3-4 mark in league matches. Eleven of the team's 15 losses were against teams ranked nationally at the time, and six were by the narrowest of margins, 4-3.

Sophomore **Venkat Iyer** and freshman **Sam Fleck** were both named to the All-Ivy League second team, giving the Big

Red multiple selections to the first two teams for a third consecutive year. Freshman **Quoc-Daniel Nguyen** led the team with 14 singles victories in dual matches under **Silvia Tanasoiu**, the first-year Director of Intercollegiate Tennis and Savitt-Weiss Head Coach of Men's Tennis.

The women's team also earned two All-Ivy League honors, with the doubles duo of junior **Sarah O'Neil** and freshman **Lauren Frazier** earning a first-team nod, after posting an 8-3 record from the No. 1 spot - including a 5-2 mark in league play. Under second-year Head Coach **Mike Stevens**, the Big Red women recorded a 9-10 record with a 1-6 mark in Ivy League play. The team toppled 48th-ranked Brown, 4-3, on April 14 at Reis Tennis Center. Sophomore **Ryann Young** won a team-high 13 singles matches in dual play, while freshman **Gabby Sullivan** was close behind with 10 from the lower half of the order.

## LINKSMEN HAVE BRIGHT FUTURE

The men's golf team finished its eight-tournament season in late April with a seventh-place finish in the Ivy League championships. Tied for sixth after the first day and all alone in sixth at the end of the second day, Cornell was overtaken in the standings by Yale on the final day of competition.

As he had all season, *Carl Schimenti* led the Big Red in the Ivy League championship. Schimenti, just a sophomore, was the team's standout golfer all season. He had three rounds of 70 during the year, including two even par rounds and one round of one under par. His one-under-par round came at the Princeton Invitational on April 15, helping Cornell finish in eighth place out of 14 teams.

Fellow sophomore *Craig Esposito* also had a strong season. Esposito had the second-lowest average on the team, shooting a mean of 76.75 strokes per outing. His one-under-par 69 in the second round of the St. Bonaventure Invitational in September was the team's best showing of the season.

Senior co-captains *Alex Simson* and *John Dean* completed their careers in Ithaca by also competing in the Ivy League championship. Dean, who did not miss a single event all year, averaged a 79.7 during the season and was the team's lowest scorer in the second round of the Big 5 Invitational in October. Simson played in four tournaments and averaged an 80.3 throughout the season.

The team's outlook for the 2012-13 year is strong with its top three scorers — Schimenti, Esposito and *Zach Bosse*, another sophomore — all returning. *Max Koehler*, who also had one round of 70 in October, will be back for his junior season, and freshmen *Andrew Palmer* and *Jared Hoffman* will look to contribute.

# A TRIBUTE TO BOB BRUNET

## CLASS OF '41

**B**ob Brunet was a proud member of the Class of 1941. He loved Cornell and his many Cornell friends... they were not like family, they were family. Bob did not have siblings and never married. He passed quietly on March 16. He didn't want a memorial service, a funeral, or any recognition of his life. He simply asked that his body be sent to a crematorium and the ashes buried next to his father in Rhode Island.

He grew up during the depression and like many of that era; he was shaped indelibly by those circumstances. He attended Cornell on a McMullen Scholarship and earned a degree in mechanical engineering. He was an active member of Psi Upsilon fraternity and the Big Red track team.

More importantly, he was a member of the greatest generation. Shortly after graduating he enlisted in the Navy and served in the Pacific theater during WWII and was a decorated combat veteran.

Bob spent most of his professional life working in the energy industry and finished his professional career at the New England Mutual Life Insurance Company as an estate planner.

He was frugal, and quietly amassed a modest fortune. He retired in Cambridge, Mass and inhabited a humble abode on Memorial Drive across from the Charles.

Often when the Big Red competed in Cambridge, Bob was the first fan in the stands. He particularly enjoyed our women's teams. He paid much closer attention to the manner in which the athletes and coaches conducted themselves—more so than the final score. As a track athlete, he became close to Coach Lou Duesing, and they developed a relationship that lasted until the day Bob passed.

Lou Duesing on Bob: "He was a man of character and integrity, as well as a very humble and gracious person always concerned about others. I will miss his warmth, his humor, his generous nature and the care, concern and love he had for Cornell in general and our respective sports in particular. We were lucky to have had him as a supporter, but we were more fortunate to have had him as a friend."

When Cornell started an intercollegiate softball team, Bob would be at all the Cornell games at Harvard's Soldier's Field. Bob was a great admirer of softball mentor and Coach Dick Blood. He saw Dick as a consummate professional and a great ambassador for Cornell. He was also fond of our women's hockey team. An astute observer of character, he recognized Doug Derraugh's work ethic and his calm, positive demeanor.


Doug Derraugh on Bob: "Obviously I did not know him at all when I first started coaching at Cornell, but by the time of his passing we had become very good friends. He loved the passion and enthusiasm that the women had for their sport at Cornell. When I went to visit him in his modest home, I told him for someone so generous he did not have a single lavish thing for himself. He said he did not need anything, but wanted us to have

everything. He wanted to ensure that the women's programs were getting everything they needed to be successful."

Truth be told, there was no one else in the country that was more generous to the annual funds of Cornell's women's teams than Bob Brunet. In the past eight years he gave over \$700,000 in annual fund gifts to women's hockey, track, and softball. In the end, the cumulative gift to the university will be multiple millions.

The vast majority of his estate will come to Cornell. He was so appreciative of his Cornell education and such an admirer of John McMullen, that he will pay back his McMullen award and will in perpetuity, through a bequeathed endowment, help cover the cost of future engineers to attend Cornell.



### TREMAGLIO WINS ELITE 89 ROWING AWARD

Junior Amanda Tremaglio received the Elite 89 award for the 2012 NCAA Division I Women's Rowing Championship. The Elite 89 award, presented by the NCAA, recognizes an individual who has reached national championship level of competition, while also achieving the highest academic standard among his or her peers. Tremaglio, a double major in history and French, currently has earned a 4.062 grade-point average.

### RICHIE MORAN IS 2012 SPIRIT OF TEWAARATON AWARD RECIPIENT

Former Cornell coach Richie Moran, an icon in the lacrosse world, is the recipient of the 2012 Spirit of Tewaaraton Award, presented to an individual in lacrosse who reflects the virtues of the Tewaaraton Award and its mission, and who in the course of his or her life, has made a significant contribution to society and the lives of others. Without question, Coach Moran influenced the lives of many Cornellians over his 29 years at the helm of the Big Red stickmen. His teams reached nine Final Fours, won three NCAA championships (1971, 1976, 1977), and 15 Ivy League titles. They set an NCAA record of 42 consecutive wins from 1976-78. Currently, he is president of the Irish Lacrosse Foundation and coached Team Ireland in the World Lacrosse Championships in 2002 and 2006.

### URBON LAUDED AS TOP BASEBALL ROOKIE

Right-handed pitcher Kellen Urbon was named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American, and chosen on the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association Freshman All-American first team. He was also named Ivy League Rookie of the Year for the Big Red's first selection since his head coach, Bill Walkenbach '98, received the honor in 1995. Immediately established as the team's closer, Urbon compiled a 3-1 record in 21 appearances, and was named All-Ivy first team. Urbon led the Ancient Eight in saves (5) with a 0.52 ERA. He pitched 6.1 innings of relief in the 12th-inning triumph over Princeton that won the Gehrig Division, and then hurled five scoreless frames in the Ivy League Championship Series to capture the 11th-inning Game 3 finale against Dartmouth. This summer, he is pitching with the Vermont Mountaineers in the New England Collegiate Baseball League.

### THREE WOMEN'S LACROSSE PLAYERS ON ALL-REGION TEAM

Seniors Jessi Steinberg and Cacki Helmer, and junior Caroline Salisbury were named to the IWLCA All-Northeast Region team. Steinberg, Cornell's co-leader in goals scored (44), and Helmer, the Red's leader in ground balls (44) and caused turnovers (33), were named to the Region first team, as they also were earlier in the Ivy League. Salisbury, tied with Steinberg as the team's top goal scorer, was a Regional second-team selection. She was All-Ivy second team, and named to the All-Ivy Tournament

team. Helmer also earned second-team All-America honors, and was selected to play in the IWLCA North-South Game, along with teammate Shannon McHugh.

### HAGER NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Senior first baseman Frank Hager was named to the Capital One Academic District I first team. Hager earned a 3.31 GPA in economics. He started all 47 games for the Big Red, and led the team in doubles (15). He hit .333 with two doubles and three RBI in the three-game Ivy League Championship Series. By being named to the district first team, Hager became eligible for the balloting on the national level.

### NOBLE AND LANG NAMED LACROSSE ALL-AMERICANS

Junior defenseman Jason Noble was named to the USILA All-America second team, while senior midfielder Roy Lang received third-team honors. Noble received honorable mention a year ago, and Lang was on the first team in 2011. Both players were on the '12 All-Ivy first team.

### FORMER CORNELL SID SALUTED WITH LESTER JORDAN AWARD

Dave Wohlhueter, Cornell's sports information director from 1977-98, was recently honored by the College Sports Information Directors of America as the recipient of the Lester Jordan Award. The award is named in honor of Jordan, the founder of the Academic All-America teams. Wohlhueter, a member of the CoSIDA, Cornell and Ithaca College Halls of Fame, has contributed greatly to the Academic All-America program during his 35 years as treasurer of the national organization, a position he is retiring from at the annual convention in June. He will also be presented with CoSIDA's Distinguished Service Award, and is only the second person to receive this award in the organization's 56-year history.

### WOMEN'S HOCKEY WINS CORNELL CUP

Every year, the Cornell Cup, a competition organized by the Red Key Society, recognizes varsity teams that thrive in the classroom, excel in competition, as well as participate in community service projects, offer support to other Cornell varsity teams, and attend Student Athlete Advisory Council and Red Key sponsored events. This year's winner is the women's hockey team. In addition to playing in its third consecutive Frozen Four, the women skaters had one of the highest GPA's of any of the teams for the 2011 fall semester. Other off the ice activities were a Big Sister program, volunteering with Feed My Starving Children, and collecting donations for Cops, Kids and Toys. The United Way and the Salvation Army were other organizations that benefited from team donations. During 2012 spring final examinations, the women helped build a house for Habitat for Humanity.
