

Cornell Heavyweight Rowing Team Awards

Butler Memorial Trophy

The Butler Memorial Trophy is awarded to a member of the varsity squad voted by his teammates to have done the most for Cornell rowing during the year. The trophy was put up by members of Cornell's 1930 champion crew in memory of their crewmate, Arthur Bell Butler '30, who rowed in the second seat. An infantry major, Butler was killed in action in Korea in August, 1950. He was awarded the Distinguished Service Cross and the Silver Star.
