QUICK HITS

- The Cornell football team will play for history and the Trustees' Cup when it closes out the 2017 season on Saturday, Nov. 18 at 1:30 p.m. at Franklin Field.
- The game will be broadcast live on Eleven Sports and simulcast on the Ivy League Network with Bill Spaulding calling the play-by-play, Matt Goldstein providing the color analysis and Seth Cantor on the sidelines.
- The contest can also be heard locally on WHCU 95.9 FM/870 AM with Barry Leonard and Buck Briggs '76 on the call.
- After being the final contest on Cornell's schedule every year since 1988 and annually on or around Thanksgiving day for more than 60 years, the Ivy League has unveiled a schedule that moves the Big Red-Quakers game from week 10 in 2018.
- The second-longest uninterrupted series in the FCS has been played every season since 1919, making this the 99th straight season the teams have met, with the winner taking home the Trustees Cup for the 23rd time (Penn leads 15-7).
- The series trails only Lafayette-Lehigh, which has been played every year since 1897.
- Alumni from Penn and Cornell gathered at the New York Penn Club on Sept. 6, 1995 for the dedication of the Trustees' Cup, which thereafter has been presented to the winner of the annual football game.
- The idea evolved from a series of discussions between officials and alumni of both universities, focusing on what would be the best way to honor one of college football's most celebrated rivalries — and the decision was made to establish an award to be presented at an annual luncheon, with the winning team taking the prize home and displaying it for a year.
- Cornell's 25 seniors will be playing in their final collegiate game and will have an opportunity to make some history.
- David Archer's first full recruiting class as head coach won just two games in its first two seasons combined, but has won seven in the last two and is on the verge of its first winning conference mark since 2005 (4-3) with a win in the season finale.
- The Big Red can become just the fifth team to post a winning Ivy record after being picked to finish last in the preseason poll (1968 Penn and 1998 Yale each went 5-2, 2004 Cornell and 2012 Princeton went 4-3).
- Cornell was eliminated from Ivy title contention last weekend when it dropped an 18-8 contest to Columbia to slip into a tie for fourth place in the Ancient Eight.
- For the second straight week, the defense kept the Big Red within arm's length throughout the contest, but the Lions were able to limit Cornell to just 257 yards of offense while surrendering only a late touchdown.
- Playing in his final home game, All-America senior safety Nick Gesualdi had nine tackles and a pair of pass breakups, moving up the career charts in both categories.
- Senior Josh Sweet had a 7-yard touchdown run and classmate Hayes Nolte caught a two-point conversion to cap the scoring on offense, while Jack Gellatly (25 yards) and James Hubbard (42 yards) were also big contributors in the loss.
- Seniors Seth Hope (three tackles, 1.5 for a loss, sack, forced fumble), Justin Solomon (six tackles, FTL), Kurt Frimel (six tackles, 0.5 FTL), Geno DeMarco (four tackles) and Dan Crochet (sack, forced fumble) also had standout games on the defense.

ABOUT PENN

- The Quakers head into the season finale with a 5-4 overall record and three consecutive wins in tow after a 23-6 triumph over Harvard last weekend.
- After a four-game losing streak that included three defeats by five points or less to the top three teams in the conference standings, Penn has been on a roll.
- All-America wide receiver and Ivy League Player of the Year candidate Justin Watson (68 receptions, 891 yards, 13 touchdowns) continues to be one of the most difficult players in the league to gameplan against.
- Watson is Penn's career record holder in receptions (273), receiving yards (3,585), receiving touchdowns (32) and consecutive games with a receiving touchdown (9).
- Quarterbacks Will Fischer-Colbrie (1,320 yards, 12 touchdowns) and Nick Robinson (529 yards, six touchdowns) have shared time under center.
- The combination of Karekin Brooks (694 yards, seven touchdowns) and Tre Solomon (458 yards, two touchdowns) have carried the load for the Quakers on the ground so far this season.
- The Penn defense, which had struggled early in the season, limited the Crimson to eight points last week — the first time in eight years it had been held under double digits.
- Nick Miller (92 tackles) has nearly twice as many tackles as any other player on the team and has added 4.5 tackles for loss, three sacks, two interceptions, four fumble recoveries and two forced fumbles.
- Special teams features place-kicker Jack Soslow, who is 10-of-12 on field goals with a long of 51 yards while putting 21 of 50 kickoffs through the end zone for touchbacks, as well as punter Hunter Kelley (39.9 yards per punt, 13 downed inside the 20).
- Isaiah Malcome returns both kicks (22.0 yard average) and punts (8.2 yard average).
- Third year head coach Ray Priore had spent 16 seasons as defensive coordinator and secondary coach and nine as the associate head coach under legendary Al Bagnoli, winning Ivy titles in each of his first two seasons.

THE SERIES

- This will be the 124th meeting between Cornell and Penn, with the Quakers holding a 72-46-5 lead in the series.
- The series is the fifth-most played in college football history.
- The two teams first met in 1893, a 50-0 Penn win.
- Twelve years ago, Cornell claimed a 16-7 win at Franklin Field for the 600th victory in program history.
- Last season, the Quakers retained possession of the Trustees' Cup with a 42-20 win at Schoellkopf Field and have won three games in a row between the teams.

THE TRUSTEES' CUP

- Since 1995, the winner of the Cornell-Penn football game has been awarded the Trustees' Cup.
- Alumni from Penn and Cornell gathered at the New York Penn Club on Sept. 6, 1995 for the dedication of the Trustees' Cup, which thereafter has been presented to the winner of the annual football game.
- The idea evolved from a series of discussions between officials and alumni of both universities, focusing on what would be the best way to honor one of college football's most celebrated rivalries.

GAME NOTES

• Trailing 42-20 in the final minutes, sophomore quarterback Dalton Banks hit senior Ben Rogers for a 39-yard gainer down to the Penn 5.

• Rogers dragged two Quaker defenders for the final 6 yards.

• It was indicative of the 2016 Big Red — lots of fight and forward progress.

• Banks threw for 322 yards and two touchdowns and three trick plays netted another 116 yards through the air to give Cornell 438 passing yards, good for the 12th-highest total in school history.

• Seniors Collin Shaw and Marshall Deutz each reached the end zone, as did sophomore Chris Walker on a 58-yard wheel route on a fake reverse from Rogers.

• On Senior Day, Matt Sullivan caught six passes for 70 yards, Rogers had 84 yards on five catches, Deutz had two catches for 27 yards, Shaw netted 65 yards on four receptions and Nick Bland had two receptions for 44 yards.

• Cornell finished its season 4-6 overall and 2-5 in the Ivy League - a three-game improvement over the 2015 campaign.

• Alek Torgersen completed 24-of-31 passes for 284 yards and a score and junior Justin Watson had 11 catches for 106 yards, but it was Tre Solomon's 173 rushing yards and two touchdowns on 32 carries that proved to be the difference in a game that saw the Quakers hold the ball more than 38 minutes.

• Defensively, Big Red senior Jackson Weber closed his career with 11 tackles to give him 226 in his four-year career, good for 16th on the school's all-time list.

• Sophomore DJ Woullard had an interception, his third of the season, to go along with eight tackles, while junior Geno DeMarco had eight stops.

• Junior Nick Gesualdi had seven tackles, including one for a loss, and backup offensive lineman J. Edward Keating, after moving to the defensive line a week ago after a slew of injuries, had a sack.

THREE WEEKLY HONORS FOR NULL

- Sophomore Nickolas Null was named the Ivy League Special Teams Player of the Week for the third straight week after an outstanding effort in a 10-0 loss to Dartmouth.
- Despite consistently punting into a short field, the sophomore placed a school-record seven punts inside the 20 on 12 attempts.
- Only two of his 12 kicks were returned (a total of 10 yards) and all seven punts were downed inside the 15, with three ending inside the 10.
- He also booted his only kickoff through the end zone for a touchback.
- Null is the first Cornell player to win a weekly Ivy award three weeks in a row since Chad Levitt captured Offensive Player of the Week on 10/13, 10/20 and 10/27 1996 and is just the third player to ever do it (Chris Zingo, Defensive POW in 1992 is the other).
- Null earned the honor for the second week in a row after kicking the game-winning 43-yard field goal with 48 seconds remaining to help the Big Red overcome a 12-point fourth quarter deficit at Princeton on Oct. 28. He also made all three PAT kicks for a career-best 12 points, booted all seven kickoffs through the end zone for touchbacks, and punted four times for a 37.5 yard average (37.0 net yards).
- He averaged 44.2 yards per punt on five kicks without allowing a return yard (netting 44.2 yards per punt) in a game that the Big Red dominated field position, then took over in the second half after an injury to starting place-kicker Zach Mays and hit all three PATs and, more importantly, put all three kickoffs through the end zone for touchbacks in a 34-7 win over Brown on Oct. 21.

IVY LEAGUE HONORS

- Along with Null's three awards, senior Nick Gesualdi (Princeton) and junior Cyrus Nolan (Harvard) have also been honored with weekly citations by the Ancient Eight.
- Gesualdi posted six tackles, including a half-tackle for loss, an interception, and a pair of pass breakups. His three impact plays – both pass breakups and the tackle for loss – ended a Princeton drive midway through the fourth quarter that set up the go-ahead field goal.
- Nolan was a big part of the Big Red's upset of preseason Ivy favorite Harvard and spearheaded one of the best defensive efforts by a Cornell team in a decade. The former walk-on and backup defensive lineman had four tackles, 2.5 tackles for a loss, 1.5 sacks, a forced fumble and a pass breakup as Cornell rallied for a 17-14 win over the Crimson, its first victory over Harvard in 12 tries.

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

- Averaging 6-4, 305 pounds, Cornell's five starting offensive linemen on opening day made up the tallest and heaviest group at Cornell since 2003.
- Cornell played its first-ever game in the state of Delaware this season, making it the 14th state the Big Red has suited up in (California, Connecticut, Illinois, Massachusetts, Maryland, Michigan, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Texas - as well as Washington, D.C.).
- The Big Red roster features 17 players who stand 6-5 or taller, with junior offensive linemen Maximilian Gardner and Zach Strong each reaching 6-9.
- In 2004, Cornell was picked to finish eighth in the preseason media poll. It bucked that trend to become the second Ivy League team ever to go from an 0-7 campaign to a winning league record (4-3) in the span of a year.
- Since taking over the program, head coach David Archer '05 is 5-4 in the trophy series games against Columbia (Empire Bowl, 4-1) and Penn (Trustees' Cup, 1-3).

DEFYING PRESEASON EXPECTATIONS

- The Cornell football team was picked to finish eighth in the Ivy League's annual preseason poll.
- For the third straight season, the Big Red won't finish where they've been picked.

- Cornell can finish no lower than sixth and as high as tied for second entering the final weekend of the season.
- The Big Red was chosen to finish eighth a season ago, then started the year 3-0 and took sixth in the final league standings.
- The year before it was eighth in the poll and didn't end there either.

BIG RED CAPTAINS

- When the Cornell football team took the field for the first time in 2017, the Big Red had four captains leading them out of the locker room.
- Fifth-year senior and three-time captain **Miles Norris** was joined by classmates **Kurt Frimel**, **Jack Gellatly** and **Nick Gesualdi**.
- The four were elected in a vote of their teammates at the start of fall camp.
- Norris joins **Jeff Mathews '14** as the program's lone three-time captains, returning for a fifth season.

FOOTBALL GETS NCAA RECOGNITION (AGAIN)

- Football has been publicly recognized by the NCAA for its Academic Progress Report (APR) score being in the top 10 percent nationally each year since the scores were first tabulated in 2004-05.
- Two Cornell sports (football and men's golf) have been publicly recognized each year since the APR was first released and are among just 93 teams across the country in all sports with that accomplishment.
- Cornell's score of 988 (out of 1,000) this past year is the second-highest in school history (the five highest scores in program history have come over the last five years - 987, 987, 986, 991, 988).
- Only five FCS schools have been honored each year in football (Cornell, Dartmouth, Dayton, Penn and Yale), with four coming from the Ivy League.
- The APR measures semester-by-semester records for every individual team in Division I with regard to each team members' continuing eligibility, retention and progress toward graduation.

BIG RED RANKED AMONG TOP 100 COLLEGE PROGRAMS IN HISTORY BY AP

- Cornell was ranked as one of the top 100 football programs of all-time according to the Associated Press in a ranking released in August 2016.
- At No. 72, the Big Red ranked ahead of a number of Bowl Championship Subdivision (BCS) schools and second among Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) programs.
- Only Penn (No. 66) placed higher among current FCS schools, while other Ivy League teams on the list included Dartmouth (No. 87), Yale (No. 90), Princeton (No. 81) and Columbia (No. 99).
- Few collegiate football programs have the storied history of Cornell.
- With more than 120 seasons of football in the books, the Big Red has claimed five national titles, won more than 600 games and has had legendary players and coaches perform on historic Schoellkopf Field.
- Names such as Glenn "Pop" Warner and Heisman Trophy finalist and NCAA record-breaker Ed Marinaro have suited up for Cornell, while seven College Football Hall of Famers have set the strategy as head coaches.
- The top 10 schools on the list, done to celebrate 80 years of the Associated Press poll, were Ohio State, Oklahoma, Notre Dame, Alabama, USC, Nebraska, Michigan, Texas, Florida State and Florida.

- Cornell's 120-player roster is made up of student-athletes from 28 states, as well as Canada, South Africa and the District of Columbia.
- A team-high 15 players come to Cornell from Pennsylvania.

Schoellkopf At 102 Years Young

- Schoellkopf Field has been an indelible mark of Cornell football since it opened in 1915 and this year will be the 102nd season at the home field.
- A gift from Willard Straight '01 and the family of Henry (Heinie) Schoellkopf '02 made the construction possible for the current stadium.
- The Big Red's first year on the field was one of its best, going 9-0 and winning the national championship.
- In 1915, General Electric Company completed work on a flood searchlight system for the field, and in 1924 a construction project was completed to bring capacity from 9,000 to 21,500 by adding the famed Crescent.
- In 1947 that was increased to its current capacity of 25,597 and a press box was added.
- In 1971 a gift was made to put artificial turf on the field, and it was resurfaced three times, the last time in 1999.
- A new press box was built in 1986.
- The 2008 season saw installation of FieldTurf synthetic grass to replace the artificial turf.
- In 2016, the West Stands were demolished and the field was moved 15 feet toward the Crescent while replacing the FieldTurf to ready for more construction at the site, bringing the capacity to 21,500.

Schoellkopf Facts

- Schoellkopf Field is the fourth-oldest FCS stadium, opening in 1915. Only Penn's Franklin Field (1895), Harvard Stadium (1903) and the Yale Bowl (1914) are older.
- The playing area before World War I was Percy Field, alongside Fall Creek, the present site of Ithaca HS.
- The Big Red's all-time record at Schoellkopf Field is 294-185-15 (.610).

CORNELL FOOTBALL AT 130 YEARS

- This is the 131st year since the start of Cornell football, but it will be the 130th season.
- The first official Big Red football team was formed in 1887, and Cornell has sponsored a squad every year since except 1918 during World War I.
- The Big Red has an overall record of 639-520-34 (.550) in its 130 years of football.
- The program's 639 wins rank 13th among all FCS schools.
- Over the years, Cornell has taken on 90 different opponents, with its most frequent opponent being Penn (124 meetings).

NATIONAL CHAMPIONS

- Cornell holds claim to five national titles in its storied football history.
- The Big Red claimed at least a share of the 1915 (Helms Athletic Foundation, Houlgate System, National Championship Foundation and Parke Davis), 1921 (Helms, Houlgate, National Championship Foundation and Parke Davis), 1922 (Helms, Parke Davis), 1923 (Sagarin) and 1939 (Litkenhous, Sagarin) titles.
- All five teams went undefeated and dominated their opponents.

- The teams allowed more than one touchdown in a game just once during that 24-game span while scoring 40 or more points 14 times.
- The 1939 team was 8-0 and defeated Syracuse, Penn State and Ohio State.

FIVE NAMED TO CoSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT TEAM

- Cornell football had five players named to the 2016 CoSIDA Academic All-District 1 team, with senior **Seth Hope** earning a spot on the Academic All-America second team.
- Senior running back **Jack Gellatly** (3.75 GPA, Government) joined Hope, as well as recent graduates Michael Staples, Jake Waltman and Jackson Weber on the all-district squad.
- The five members of the District 2 team were the most of any school.
- The Big Red has had 13 football players earn a total of 17 appearances on the CoSIDA Academic All-America team dating back to 1977.

FIVE GAMES TELEVISED, EIGHT ON ILN

- Five of Cornell's seven conference football games will be televised and eight of the squad's 10 contests will be available on the Ivy League Network for the 2017 season.
- The Big Red will play a Saturday evening game at Princeton on Oct. 28 that will be broadcast on NBC Sports Network, as well as three other Saturday afternoon contests simulcast on Eleven Sports and ILN - at Yale on Sept. 23, vs. Harvard on Oct. 7 and at Penn on Nov. 18.
- Cornell's matchup with Columbia at Schoellkopf Field on Nov. 11 will be televised by SNY.
- Those games will be among 23 nationally-televised games broadcast throughout the league as part of the conference's package.

- Members of the Cornell Big Red football team recruited bone marrow donors within the University community during May's inaugural Marrow Donor Drive at Willard Straight Hall.
- Players handed out flyers and recruited participants, registering 303 new members during a six-hour period.
- Each year, tens of thousands of patients diagnosed with life threatening diseases, such as leukemia or lymphoma, find themselves in desperate need of a transplant.
- The chances of a patient finding a family related donor is only 30 percent, leaving most patients to rely on an anonymous donor from a registry.
- The program is part of the Get In The Game, Save a Life marrow donor registry recruitment program and the Andy Talley Bone Marrow Foundation.

CORNELL, COLGATE PARTICIPATE IN "COACH TO CURE MD"

- For the 10th year in a row, college football coaches nationwide joined together in support of the Coach To Cure MD program.
- The annual effort has raised more than \$1.5 million dollars to battle Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy (Duchenne).
- On the weekend of September 30th, American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) members wore Coach To Cure MD patches on the sidelines and college football fans will be asked to donate to research projects supported by Parent Project Muscular Dystrophy (PPMD), the largest, most comprehensive nonprofit organization in the U.S. focused entirely on Duchenne.
- Football fans can help support the fight to end Duchenne by either going online to CoachToCureMD.org or by texting the word CURE to 50555 to make a \$10 donation in honor of this year's anniversary.
- Last year, more than 11,350 college coaches at more than 620 different institutions participated in Coach To Cure MD events.
- Duchenne muscular dystrophy is the most common fatal genetic disorder diagnosed during childhood and primarily affects boys across all races and cultures.
- People with Duchenne develop progressive muscle weakness that eventually causes loss of mobility, wheelchair dependency and a decline in respiratory and cardiac function.
- Currently, there is no cure for Duchenne and limited therapeutic options exist.

GAME 2 YALE 49, CORNELL 24

Sept. 23, 2017 Yale Bowl New Haven, Conn.

GAME NOTES

- Yale used a big second half to remain unbeaten, pulling away from Cornell for a 49-24 victory on Saturday afternoon at the Yale Bowl.
- Yale piled up 35 points and nearly 300 rushing yards after halftime, overcoming a first half that saw the Big Red seemingly dominate, but end on the short side of a 14-10 score at the break.
- Both Zane Dudek and DeShawn Salter ran for more than a 100 yards after halftime as the home time grounded out 297 yards on 28 carries in the final two quarters after posting just 55 yards on 11 carries in the first 30 minutes.
- The Bulldogs capitalized on one of the turnovers for a pick-six, and scored the go-ahead touchdown on a two-minute drive to end the half.
- Junior quarterback Dalton Banks completed 26-of-45 passes for 272 yards and two touchdowns, including his 20th and 21st varsity score through the air.
- Freshman Eric Gallman was his favorite target, catching nine passes for a Cornell freshman single-game record 97 yards.
- Both James Hubbard (57 yards) and Chris Walker (19 yards) caught touchdown passes and sophomore Harold Coles posted his first career 100-yard rushing game, including a 90-yard gallop for a score in the fourth quarter.
- That run was the second-longest run in school history.
- Senior Nick Gesualdi had his 12th career interception - third-most in school history - and classmate Kurt Frimel had seven tackles, including one for a loss and a forced fumble.

- Junior quarterback Dalton Banks passed for 239 yards and the Big Red had more total offense than Colgate, but the visitors' defense came up with four interceptions and eight sacks to power the Raiders to a 21-7 victory at Schoellkopf Field.
- Banks accounted for the day's lone touchdown from Cornell on a 1-yard keeper.
- He set up the play with a completion to senior tight end Hayes Nolte on a second-and-24, and the extra point after the score cut the Colgate (2-3) lead in half with 1:25 to play in the third quarter.
- Colgate answered right back with a 15-play drive in which it soaked up nearly seven minutes and restored its two-touchdown lead after a 7-yard pass to the end zone from Grant Breneman to Malik Twyman.
- Senior Collin Shaw had five receptions for 60 yards, enough to move him into the school's career top 20 list with 1,163 yards - good for 19th in Cornell history.
- Senior James Hubbard had three catches for 37 yards, reaching the 50-catch milestone.
- Colgate cut the deficit in the series to 49-47-3 in a series that dates back to 1896.
- Senior Kurt Frimel had a pair of sacks over a span of three Colgate plays from scrimmage, giving him his first career multi-sack contest.
- Junior linebacker Reis Seggebruch tied a career high with 15 tackles, matching his performance against Brown in 2016. He upped his career total to 99 stops.
- Senior Justin Solomon made five tackles, surpassing 100 for his career (102)
- Junior Cyrus Nolan had his first career sack.
- Sophomore Owen Peters, who earned his first career start, made a career-high five catches for 50 yards.
- Also earning a first career start was sophomore offensive lineman Matt Wells.
- The 270 yards allowed was the fewest by a Big Red defense since 2009, when Cornell surrendered just 238 yards in a 33-9 victory over Bucknell.
- It was also the best defensive performance against the Raiders since a 2007 game that Colgate mustered just 265 yards in a 17-14 Big Red win.

GAME NOTES

- The Big Red dominated both lines of scrimmage against the preseason Ivy League favorite Crimson, rallying from a 14-0 deficit to claim a hard-fought 17-14 victory at Schoellkopf Field.
- Junior Zach Mays nailed a 27-yard field goal with 9:58 remaining in the fourth and both units made it hold up.
- The defense allowed 11 yards on 12 plays in the final 10 minutes with four Big Red sacks and a game-saving interception by sophomore Dylan Otolski with four seconds left.
- The offense took the air out of the ball effectively, chewing up 5:28 on an 11-play, 45-yard drive that ended with a punt to give the visitors the ball with just 35 seconds left.

GAME NOTES

- The Columbia defense kept Cornell in check most of the afternoon and did just enough on the other side of the ball to hold off Cornell 18-8 on at Schoellkopf Field.
- The Lions held the Big Red to 179 yards of offense before ending the game with a 78-yard scoring drive for the team's first points of the night.
- Senior Josh Sweet, one of 25 seniors honored prior to their final home game, went the final 7 yards for his second touchdown of the season.
- Fellow senior Hayes Nolte caught a shovel pass for the two-point conversion with 1:09 remaining, but the Lions recovered the on-sides kick and ran out the clock to keep their dream of an Ivy title alive.
- The late touchdown was emblematic of the Big Red's efforts the last two weekends against the league's two teams that share second place in the conference standings - plenty of fight, but a couple plays short.
- The Big Red defense held strong, allowing no points in three possessions that Columbia took over with a short field and surrendering just three field goals over the first 56:32.
- Senior Nick Gesualdi had nine tackles and a pair of pass breakups, sophomore Jelani Taylor was credited with nine as well and seniors Seth Hope and Dan Crochet each forced fumbles.
- Junior Dalton Banks completed 14-of-26 passes for 134 yards through the air, while sophomore Harold Coles was credited with a team-high 62 rushing yards on 10 carries.
- On special teams, three-time reigning Ivy League Special Teams Player of the Week Nicholas Null averaged 45.2 yards on five punts.
- Columbia's Chris Schroer compiled 183 yards and a touchdown on 27 carries on the ground to lead the offense.
- Josh Wainwright (nine receptions, 140 yards) was the favorite target of quarterback Anders Hill (21-of-31, 206 yards) in the passing game.
- Oren Millstein made 3-of-4 field goals and scored 10 of the team's 18 points.
- Connor Heeb had two tackles for a loss, including the third quarter safety that put the Lions in the driver's seat.
