STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS FOR #CFB150

- The Cornell football team will kick off its 132nd season of college football when the Big Red visits Marist on Saturday, Sept. 21 at 12:00 p.m. in Poughkeepsie, N.Y.
- This is the 133rd year since the start of Cornell football, but it will be the 132nd season.
- The first official Big Red football team was formed in 1887, and Cornell has sponsored a squad every year since except 1918 during World War I.
- The Big Red has collected five national titles (1915, 1921, 1922, 1923, 1939), won more than 600 games and has had legendary players and coaches perform on historic Schoellkopf Field.
- The Big Red claimed at least a share of the 1915 (Helms Athletic Foundation, Houlgate System, National Championship Foundation and Parke Davis), 1921 (Helms, Houlgate, National Championship Foundation and Parke Davis), 1922 (Helms, Parke Davis), 1923 (Sagarin) and 1939 (Litkenhous, Sagarin) titles.
- All five teams went undefeated and dominated their opponents.
- The 1915 team was 9-0 and outscored its opponents 287-50 with four shutouts.
- The 1921, 1922 and 1923 squads each went 8-0 and outscored their opponents 392-21, 339-27 and 320-33, respectively.
- The teams allowed more than one touchdown in a game just once during that 24-game span while scoring 40 or more points 14 times.
- The 1939 team was 8-0 and defeated Syracuse, Penn State and Ohio State.
- Names such as Glenn "Pop" Warner and Heisman Trophy finalist and NCAA record-breaker Ed Marinaro have suited up for Cornell, while seven College Football Hall of Famers (including Warner, Gil Dobie and Carl Snavely) and multiple-time Super Bowl winner George Seifert have set the strategy as head coaches.
- The Big Red is involved in three of the top 20 most-played rivalries in the FCS.
- The Cornell-Penn series ranks fifth in most games played, a total that will reach 126 this season.
- The 106 meetings between Cornell and Columbia ranks 14th, while the Cornell-Dartmouth rivalries stand 19th with 102 games played.
- Right behind that is the series with Princeton (101 meetings) and Colgate (100 meetings), which sit right outside the top 20.
- The Cornell-Dartmouth and the Cornell-Penn series are the second-longest uninterrupted active series, as the teams have met every season since 1919, a span of 99 years.
- They trail only the Lafayette-Lehigh series, which has been played every year since 1897.
- Football has been publicly recognized by the NCAA for its Academic Progress Report (APR) score being in the top 10 percent nationally in 13 of the 14 seasons since 2004-05, when the scores were first tabulated.
- Cornell was ranked as one of the top 100 football programs of all-time according to the Associated Press in a ranking released in August 2016.
- At No. 72, the Big Red ranked ahead of a number of Bowl Championship Subdivision (BCS) schools and second among Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) programs.
- Only Penn (No. 66) placed higher among current FCS schools, while other Ivy League teams on the list included Dartmouth (No. 87), Yale (No. 90), Princeton (No. 81) and Columbia (No. 99).

THE ROGER J. WEISS '61 HEAD COACH OF FOOTBALL

- Seventh season directing the Big Red football program.
- Became youngest Division I head football coach in the country when he was named the Roger J. Weiss '61 Head Coach of Football on Jan. 3, 2013.
- The 2017 season saw Cornell in contention for the Ivy title in November for the first time since 2000.
- That team's three Ivy wins were the most since 2011 and tied for the best Ivy record by the program in more than a decade.
- Led team to three-game improvement in 2016, tied for program's biggest turnaround since 1986.
- Spent six seasons as an assistant coach at his alma mater, including the last four seasons as the recruiting coordinator.
- Coached the fullbacks, tight ends, running backs, offensive linemen and linebackers during his tenure as an assistant.
- Has developed 36 All-Ivy selections, two Ivy League Rookies of the Year, two Academic All-Americans and four FCS All-Americans in six years as head coach.

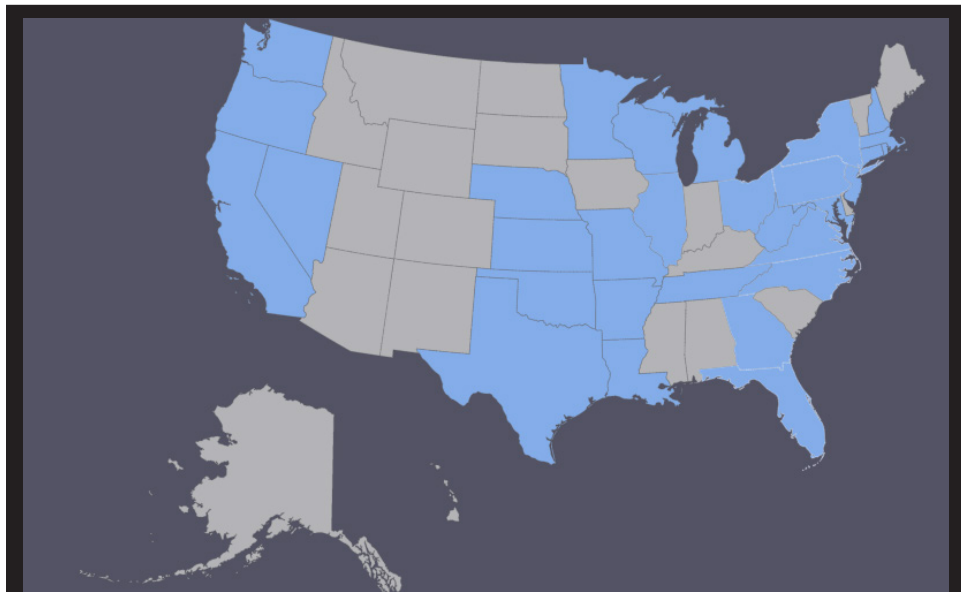

2019 BIG RED SEASON NOTES

- The Big Red returns 14 starters (six offense, eight defense), as well as its punter, place-kicker, long-snapper and return specialists from a year ago.
- Cornell went 3-7 in 2018 with a pair of league losses to top half teams by less than a touchdown (Yale, Columbia).
- The Big Red defeated Harvard for the second straight season for the first time since 1999 and 2000, and hammered previously unbeaten Sacred Heart at home, 43-24.
- Cornell rallied from a double digit deficit at Brown for a 34-16 victory, the Big Red's first win in Providence, R.I. since 2002 and its first consecutive victories over the Bears since 1993 - before any current member of the team was born.
- Cornell's seven losses came against teams that sported a cumulative 53-21 record, including four to nationally ranked opponents (Colgate, Delaware, Princeton and Dartmouth).
- Colgate reached the national quarterfinals and Delaware earned a spot in the FCS Playoffs, while Princeton went undefeated (10-0) and joined fellow Ivy rival Dartmouth (9-1) in the final top 25 poll.
- Cornell also faced seven of the nation's top 20 defenses, but still had its most successful season running the ball since 2006 (156.1 yards per game).
- Six Big Red players earned All-Ivy honors, with Harold Coles (RB) and David Jones (CB) both finding a spot on the second team.
- The Cornell football team was picked to finish seventh in the Ivy League's annual preseason poll.
- For the fourth straight season, the Big Red will look to surpass the prediction from the poll.
- After being picked to place eighth in 2017, the Big Red finished tied for fifth and entered November in the thick of the Ivy race for the first time since 2000.
- The Big Red was chosen to finish eighth in 2016, then started the year 3-0 and took sixth in the final league standings.
- The year before it was eighth in the poll and didn't end there either.
- The 2017 season saw Cornell climb to fifth in the Ivy standings at 3-4 and was in contention for the Ivy title in November for the first time since 2000.
- The team's three Ivy wins were the most since 2011 and tied for the best Ivy record by the program in more than a decade.
- With eight wins, Cornell would reach 650 all-time (13th all-time in FCS history).
- With four wins at Schoellkopf Field in its five-game schedule, the Big Red would close out 300 all-time victories at the historic facility, the fourth-oldest FCS stadium (opened in 1915). Only Penn's Franklin Field (1895), Harvard Stadium (1903) and the Yale Bowl (1914) are older.
- The Big Red's home opener at Schoellkopf against Georgetown, which doubles as Homecoming, will be the 500th game in the history of the facility.



STATING THE STATES

- Cornell's 116-player roster is made up of student-athletes from 30 states, as well as Canada.
- A team-high 11 players come to Cornell from New York.
- Ten players are from Pennsylvania, seven are from California, Florida, Georgia and Illinois and six apiece are from Maryland and Ohio.

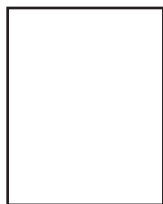

GAME 1 DELAWARE 27, CORNELL 10

Sept. 15, 2018 Delaware Stadium Newark, Del.

GAME NOTES

- Delaware's defense limited Cornell to 232 yards of offense and improved to 2-1 on the season with a 27-10 win at Delaware Stadium.
- Junior quarterback Mike Catanese connected with classmate Davy Lizana in the right corner of the end zone in the game's final minute after Nickolas Null opened the scoring with a field goal in the first quarter, but in between the Blue Hens stifled the Big Red offense and was opportunistic against its defense.
- Blue Hen quarterback Pat Kehoe was just 14-of-29 passing, but threw for 254 yards.
- His favorite target, Joe Walker, hauled in six passes for 154 yards, making him the first Delaware player in school history to register games of 100 yards rushing and receiving and 200 yards passing in a career.
- The Big Red defense kept the visitors in the game nearly the entire way, limiting Delaware to 14 points in the first three quarters.
- Phazione McClurge and Jelani Taylor each were credited with a team-high seven tackles, while fellow defensive back David Jones broke up a pair of passes.
- Three Big Red quarterbacks combined to go 19-of-33 passing for 141 yards and no turnovers, with Catanese completing 5-of-7 passes for 57 yards and the lone score.
- In all, 11 different players caught a pass, eight had at least one carry and 21 different defenders had at least one tackle.

Sept. 22, 2018 Schoellkopf Field Ithaca, N.Y.

GAME NOTES

- Junior running back Harold Coles rushed for one touchdown and caught another with 130 all-purpose yards, but Yale staved off the Cornell football team for a 30-24 victory in the Big Red's Homecoming at Schoellkopf Field.
- Cornell effectively contained vaunted running back Zane Dudek (33 yards on 13 carries) after a pair of first-quarter touchdowns, but Spencer Alston rushed for 120 yards and Yale never trailed.
- Both teams struck for two touchdowns in a marathon opening quarter, and quarterback Mike Catanese's 24-yard run accounted for the Big Red's other touchdown.
- Nickolas Null kicked a 41-yard field goal with 1 minute, 41 seconds to play to get the Big Red back within striking distance, but Yale recovered the onside kick attempt and salted the game away.
- With the game tied at 14 after 15 minutes, Yale's Alex Galland hit three field goals (23, 29 and 42 yards) to give the visitors a cushion they would not concede.
- Coles finished his second straight Ivy game with a pair of touchdowns after closing out 2017 with two scores at Penn.
- Dalton Banks was 16-of-23 for 152 yards and a touchdown.
- For the second straight game, Cornell didn't commit or force a turnover.
- Tight end John Fitzgerald hauled in five passes for 47 yards, both career highs.
- Cyrus Nolan had a pair of sacks on consecutive plays in the third quarter.

GAME 3 CORNELL 43, SACRED HEART 24

Sept. 29, 2018 Schoellkopf Field Ithaca, N.Y.

GAME NOTES

- Cornell scored on every first half offensive possession and once on defense and cruised to a 43-24 victory over previously unbeaten Sacred Heart at Schoellkopf Field to pick up its first win of the season.
- Playing against a defense ranked eighth nationally, Cornell ran for 263 yards and three touchdowns and was efficient through the air, hitting on 13-of-17 passes for 161 yards and two more scores.
- Nearly all of that offense came after the Big Red had taken a 10-0 lead just 5:08 into the game after David Jones returned an interception 48 yards for a score to energize the crowd and his own sideline.
- It was the first interception return for a touchdown by a Cornell player in seven years, since Rush Imhotep took it to the house from 65 yards out in a 62-41 win over Columbia in 2011.
- It was the first turnover of the year caused by the Big Red defense, but not the only one on the day.
- Jones had another interception, while DJ Woullard caused a fumble that was recovered by Malik Leary.
- Harold Coles posted his fourth career 100-yard game on the ground, rushing eight times for 121 yards, including an 85-yard scamper for a touchdown.
- The offensive line, which opened massive holes all afternoon in controlling the line of scrimmage, also did not allow a sack on the afternoon.

CORNELL 28, HARVARD 24

Oct. 6, 2018 Schoellkopf Field Ithaca, N.Y.

GAME NOTES

- Starting at a double-digit deficit at home against Harvard for the second straight year, the Cornell football team was again undaunted.
- The result - the Big Red's first win streak over the Crimson this century.
- Harold Coles rushed for a 34-yard touchdown, then Dalton Banks hit Owen Peters with a 33-yard touchdown pass less than three minutes later to lead the Cornell football team's fourth-quarter rally for a 28-24 victory over rival Harvard at Schoellkopf Field.
- Both teams found offensive traction in the second half.
- Harvard rushed for 288 yards, led by 194 on 27 carries by Aaron Shampklin.
- Banks passed for 201, including 112 on five catches by Peters.
- The Big Red rushing attack ground out 155 yards and a pair of scores against the nation's top-ranked rushing defense, a unit that entered the game averaging just 50.0 yards allowed per outing.
- Mike Catenese ran for 75 yards and a touchdown on 12 carries and Coles rushed 15 times for 70 yards and a score.
- The Big Red defense had three sacks, five tackles for loss and 10 breakups while limiting the Crimson passing attack to 10-of-34 for 137 yards.
- Senior captain Reis Seggebruch led the defense with 11 tackles and a pair of sacks.
- Dylan Otolski blocked a second quarter punt and Justin Bedard scooped it up and scored from 15 yards out to tie the game 7-7 heading into halftime.
- With the win, Cornell has now won consecutive games against Harvard for the first time since the 1999 and 2000 seasons.
- Dalton Banks became the fifth quarterback in Cornell history to surpass 5,000 career yards with his 18-of-24, 201-yard performance. He ended the contest with 5,005 career yards through the air.

- The 100th all-time meeting between Cornell and Colgate was dominated by the Raiders' top-ranked defense, as the home team posted its third shutout in four games with a 31-0 victory at Andy Kerr Stadium.
- Colgate, which has allowed just six points in its last five contests and 23 points all season, defended in the red zone just once, allowed only 252 total yards and limited the Big Red to 4-of-16 on third downs and 2-of-7 on fourth downs.
- It also forced three turnovers against a Cornell offense that had committed just one total in its first four games.
- T.J. Holl had a game-high 18 tackles, including two for a loss, and blocked a Big Red field goal attempt at the end of the first half that kept the visitors off the board.

GAME NOTES

- Trailing 10-0 in a place Cornell hadn't won in since 2002, the Big Red awoke in a big way and all three phases contributed to a 34-16 win at Brown at Brown Stadium.
- It was a true team effort as the Big Red claimed consecutive wins over the Bears for the first time since 1993 - before any member of the current roster was born.
- Cornell piled up 498 yards of offense and scored 34 straight points, the defense had four sacks, forced a fumble and broke up five passes while keeping the Bears off the scoreboard on four consecutive pivotal possessions, and special teams blocked a field goal and allowed just 15 total return yards.
- Senior quarterback Dalton Banks completed 19-of-26 passes for 265 yards and three touchdowns, Harold Coles gained 141 yards on the ground and scored once on the ground and another time through the air, and Lars Pedersen had three catches for 100 yards and a touchdown to pace the offense.
- Owen Peters and J.D. Pickell also reached the end zone.

- The unbeaten, nationally-ranked Tigers turned nearly every Cornell mistake into points and made a rainy, blustery day that much worse in a 66-0 win over the Big Red at Princeton Stadium.
- The Tigers jumped out to a 45-0 halftime lead, taking advantage of three early Cornell turnovers and a blocked punt to pile up 333 yards of offense at the break.

- Freshman Delonte Harrell led the way for the offense with 42 rushing yards on 12 carries.
- In all, the Big Red posted 139 rushing yards against a Princeton defense that ranked 11th nationally, allowing just 97 yards each contest.

- Jordan Landsman had four tackles, one for a loss, an interception and a pass breakup and Jelani Taylor broke up three more passes.
- Cornell dominated the stat sheet, outgaining the Lions 460-235, limited the Lions to 76 rushing yards, controlled time of possession (31:47-28:13), had more first downs (22-13) and ran more plays (87-61).
