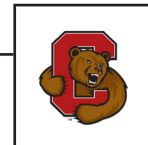

FIRST TOUCH

📍 First place in the Ivy League table is on the line at Berman Field on Saturday when the Penn Quakers and the No. 16-ranked Cornell Big Red square off with the hopes of opening conference play 3-0.

STRONG IVY LEAGUE START

📍 After winning its first two conference matches against Harvard (Oct. 1) and Brown (Oct. 8), Cornell is off to a 2-0 start in Ivy League play for a second consecutive season and 11th overall time since Ivy League play began prior to the 1955 season.

📍 Last year, Cornell opened conference action 2-0 before concluding the season with a 4-2-1 mark in Ivy play.

📍 A victory over Penn this afternoon would give Cornell its sixth 3-0 start in program history and the first since 2012, when that year's squad matched the program record for the best conference record (6-1-0).

📍 Cornell has started 3-0 on five previous occasions (1975, 1979, 1985, 2011, 2012). Only the 1975 and 1985 teams had better starts (5-0).

📍 Opening Ivy League play 2-0 in consecutive seasons is a rare occurrence, becoming just the third time in in program history that has happened, joining the 1975 and 1976 squads, and the 2011 and 2012 teams.

COLGATE RECAP

📍 Aidan Davock's 77th-minute goal and a three-save clean sheet by Andrew Cooke aided Colgate to a 1-0 upset victory over the No. 16-ranked Cornell men's soccer team at Beyer-Small '76 Field on Tuesday.

📍 Senior midfielder **NOEL ORTEGA**, junior forward **DANNY LOKKO**, and fifth-year defender **NICK ALLEN** recorded the three shots on goal for the Big Red in the setback.

CRUNCHING THE NUMBERS

📍 The United Soccer Coaches released its updated rankings just minutes before Cornell and Colgate kicked off at Beyer-Small '76 Field on Tuesday.

📍 After entering the rankings as the No. 22-ranked team, the Big Red's ranking jumped to No. 16 on Tuesday, marking Cornell's highest ranking since being No. 11 on Nov. 13, 2012.

📍 Cornell has received a top-25 ranking for a second consecutive season and the third time in the last four seasons the Big Red has competed.

📍 Following the updated rankings, Cornell is the lone Ivy League program ranked in the top 25. Penn and Yale are the other Ivies garnering national attention, as both teams are also receiving votes.

GONCALVES EARNS HONORS

📍 Junior forward **MATTHEW GONCALVES** was named the Ivy League Player of the Week after scoring game-winning goals in both of the Big Red's victories last week over then-No. 7 Syracuse and Brown.

📍 It marked the second consecutive week that a Big Red player earned Player of the Week honors. Senior midfielder Brandon Morales was tabbed the conference's top player on Oct. 3, following a five-point performance against Harvard.

📍 Goncalves was also named Top Drawer Soccer's Player of the Week for his performances.

HONORS GALORE

- In addition to Goncalves being named to the Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week, senior defender Connor Drought was also acknowledged for his role in the Big Red's pair of victories last week.
- Drought was one of four defenders named to the College Soccer News' Team of the Week after logging an assist on Goncalves' game-winning marker with 17 seconds left against Brown.
- Joining Drought on the Team of the Week was Missouri State's Lewis Green, Wisconsin's Maxwell Keenan, and SMU's Mads Westergren.

BERMAN FIELD ADVANTAGE

- After Vermont snapped Cornell's 15-game unbeaten streak at Berman Field on Sept. 13, Cornell has bounced back by with an 8-0 victory over Canisius and a 3-2 win over Harvard.
- Since 2019, the Big Red is unbeaten in 17 of its last 18 matches at Berman Field, posting a 14-1-3 record and a .861 win percentage, which ranks seventh in the nation.
- Georgetown (.895), Missouri State (.892), New Hampshire (.882), and Washington (.868) are ahead of the Big Red.
- Cornell is the only Division I program over the last three-plus years to have just one loss on its home turf. Georgetown, New Hampshire, Campbell, Marshall, and Yale are those with two home losses during the span.

HAVING AN EYE FOR THE GOAL

- The Big Red has scored 24 goals so far this year, marking the program's 11th overall time since 1946 that Cornell has logged at least 24 goals over its first 11 matches. It is the second consecutive year and third time in the last four seasons of competition that Cornell has at least 24 goals over the first 11 matches.
- Cornell was shutout for the first time in 2022 on Tuesday, snapping the Big Red's 15-game goal streak. Despite Colgate posting the clean sheet on the Big Red, it marks the fifth consecutive season that Cornell has had just one clean sheet against over its first 11 games of a season.
- Dating back to 2019, Cornell has scored in 43 of its last 46 matches and in 76 of the 95 games (80.0 percent) played during **JOHN SMITH's** tenure as head coach at Cornell. The 80 percent figure ranks as the fourth-highest total by a Cornell head coach. It is the highest since **DAN WOOD** (1971-75), the coach in which Smith's position is currently endowed for.

ABOUT THE BIG RED

- Senior midfielder **BRANDON MORALES** is tied for third in the Ivy League for points (six goals, three assists – 15 points), all of which have come over his last seven matches. Sophomore forward **ALIOUNE KA** also has a double-digit point total, logging 10 points on the power of four goals and two assists.
- Fifth-year senior **EMEKA ENELI** (two goals, five assists – nine points), senior defender **CONNOR DROUGHT** (one goal, six assists – eight points) and junior defender **KISA KIINGI** (three goals, two assists – eight points) are nearing the 10-point plateau.
- Freshman goalkeeper Ryan Friedberg has been the Big Red's go-to keeper this year, having started all 11 games this season. Friedberg has logged all but 11:25 of the Big Red's minutes this season, while posting a 9-2-0 record with a 0.83 goals-against average and a .710 save percentage.

REACHING THE 10-WIN PLATEAU

- Cornell is seeking its fourth consecutive 10-win season with a victory this afternoon. Securing a win in its 12th game of the season would be the fastest the Big Red has reached the 10-win mark since 2012 (won first 12 games).
- The Big Red has won its 10th game in a season in 12 games or fewer in four other campaigns (2012 – in 10 games; 1975 – in 11 games; 1971 and 1995 – in 12 games).

FRIEDBERG'S STRONG START

Freshman goalkeeper **RYAN FRIEDBERG** has shined for the Big Red between the pipes this season, as he established the freshman record for wins in a season in the Big Red's upset win at No. 7 Syracuse on Oct. 4. Friedberg bested the record previously set by **STEPHEN BOTT** (1983) and **QUINN O'SULLIVAN** (1992).

Through games completed on Oct. 12, Friedberg's 0.83 goals-against average was second in the Ivy League, trailing Penn's Nick Christoffersen (0.67). Friedberg's figure is the sixth-best by a freshman goalkeeper.

With Friedberg's clean sheet on Sept. 24 against Marist, it marked the fourth time the Westfield, N.J., native has been a part of a Cornell clean sheet in 2022. He has the third-most shutouts by a Cornell freshman keeper, trailing Bott (7 in 1983) and O'Sullivan (4.5 in 1992).

A two-time Ivy League Rookie of the Week, Friedberg is the first Ivy League keeper to be the top newcomer at least twice in a season since Dartmouth's James Hickok in 2013.

ONE FOR THE RECORD BOOKS

The eight goals scored by Cornell against Canisius on Sept. 20 were the second-most by a Big Red squad in a single game, dating back to 1946. It was the most goals scored since the program record was set on Sept. 24, 1965, when Cornell won its season-opener over Syracuse, 12-0.

It was the 14th time in program history, since 1946, in which Cornell scored at least six goals in a match. It was the Big Red's first time netting six-plus goals in a contest since Oct. 12, 2019, in a 6-0 victory over Harvard.

The Big Red scored five of its eight goals in the first half against Canisius, marking the second time in as many years that Cornell has scored five goals in a half. Last year, Cornell scored five first-half goals against Harvard on Oct. 9, before winning the contest, 5-4.

IVY LEAGUE PRESEASON POLL

The Cornell men's soccer team was tabbed to finish third in the 2022 Ivy League Men's Soccer preseason poll, the conference office announced on Aug. 23.

Princeton was named the preseason favorite, garnering 12 of the 16 possible first-place votes, finishing with 123 points. Right behind the Tigers was Yale, who received the remaining four first-place votes and had 103 points.

Cornell was third with 97 points, while Harvard (89 points), Penn (56), Brown (45), Dartmouth (39), and Columbia (27) rounded out the poll.

SCOUTING THE QUAKERS

Penn enters this afternoon's contest on a seven-game win streak, the Quakers' longest win streak since spanning the 1975 and 1976 seasons. The win streak is the longest single-season win streak since Penn won the 1972 Ivy League championship.

Over its 10 matches so far, Penn has a plus-22 goal differential to pace the Ivy League and rank sixth nationally in the category following Wednesday's contests.

Penn's 2.80 goals per game (5th), 17.50 shots per game (7th), and 7.70 shots on goal per game (7th) rank in the top 10 nationally.

Ben Stitz has 20 points (nine goals, two assists), pacing Penn's potent offense. Stas Korzeniowski (six goals, five assists – 17 points) and Michael Hewes (six goals, one assist – 13 points) also have double-digit point totals this season.

Nick Christoffersen has started all 10 games for the Quakers in goal, playing all but 3:45 of Penn's minutes. He has a 0.60 goals-against average, to lead all Ivy League goalkeepers, and a .786 save percentage.

SERIES VS. PENN

Penn leads the all-time series, 39-28-8, and are 5-2-1 against Cornell over its last eight matches. Cornell, however, has won two of the last three matches in the series.

It is the first time the Quakers are playing at Berman Field since Sept. 29, 2018, when the Big Red posted a 1-0 double-overtime victory.

Matches between the Quakers and Big Red have been proven to be close contests. Dating back to 2001, 17 of the last 20 matches have been decided by one goal or less.

Dr. Daniel P. Wood Head Coach of Men's Soccer
Seventh Season as Head Coach

Smith enters his seventh season at the helm of the Cornell men's soccer team in 2022 and can be credited with the resurrection of a program that went 1-14-2 during his first season.

Cornell is aiming for its fourth consecutive season with double-digit victories following a 10-win season bookended by 11-win seasons.

Since arriving on East Hill, Smith has led the Big Red to victories over perennially strong programs such as Akron, Michigan State, and Syracuse. During his six-year tenure, Smith has coached 16 players that went on to earn All-Ivy designations and four that earned United Soccer Coaches All-Region honors. Two Cornell student-athletes have reached the professional ranks of American soccer under Smith's tutelage.

Prior to joining the Big Red in 2016, Smith served on the Stanford University coaching staff for four seasons, helping the Cardinal to its first national title in program history, when Stanford defeated Clemson, 4-0, marking the most goals scored in an NCAA final since 1996 and the largest margin of victory since 1975. In 2015 alone, Smith coached two First-Team All-Americans, a program-record five All-Far West Regional selections, the Hermann Award winner, four Major League Soccer draft picks and two U.S. Men's National Team players. He helped lead the program to an 18-2-3 record in 2015 – the team's most wins since 2002 – and a 7-1-2 mark in Pac-12 play, establishing a then-program record.

Before joining Stanford, Smith made two stops as an assistant coach at CSU Bakersfield beginning in 1999 before leaving to become the head coach at Incarnate Word before the 2006 season. He returned to Bakersfield in 2011. While at Incarnate Word from 2006-10, Smith amassed a 62-26-10 record and won three conference championships.

As a player, Smith was drafted in the second round (13th overall) by the Columbus Crew in the 1997 MLS College Draft. A two-time All-American at Rollins College, Smith was inducted into the Sunshine State Conference Hall of Fame in 2004.

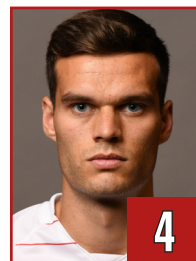

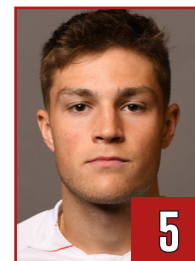

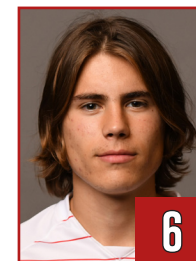
