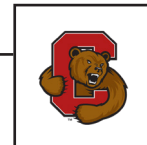

FIRST TOUCH

📖 Cornell welcomes its Central New York rival Binghamton to Berman Field this evening. Tonight's match will be the Big Red's final non-conference match of the season before playing the remaining four Ivy League matches on the schedule.

PENN RECAP

📖 Penn's 89th-minute goal pushed the Quakers past No. 16 Cornell in a spirited 3-2 final on Saturday afternoon at Berman Field.
 📖 Fifth-year forward **EMEKA ENELI** and senior defender **CONNOR DROUGHT** each scored for the Big Red in the contest. Freshman goalkeeper **RYAN FRIEDBERG** made four saves in the setback.

CRUNCHING THE NUMBERS

📖 Pending the update in the United Soccer Coaches poll set to be released a couple hours prior to kickoff, Cornell continues to hold onto its No. 16 ranking.
 📖 After entering the rankings as the No. 22-ranked team, the Big Red's ranking jumped to No. 16 on Tuesday, marking Cornell's highest ranking since being No. 11 on Nov. 13, 2012.
 📖 Cornell has received a top-25 ranking for a second consecutive season and the third time in the last four seasons the Big Red has competed.
 📖 Prior to the updated rankings, Cornell is the lone Ivy League program ranked in the top 25. Penn and Yale are the other Ivies garnering national attention, as both teams are also receiving votes.

ABOUT THE BIG RED

📖 Senior midfielder **BRANDON MORALES** is tied for third in the Ivy League for points (six goals, three assists — 15 points). Fifth-year senior **EMEKA ENELI** is tied for the eighth-most points with 11 on the power of three goals and five assists. Sophomore forward **ALIOUNE KA** (four goals, two assists), and senior defender **CONNOR DROUGHT** (two goals, six assists) also have double-digit point totals.
 📖 Junior defender **KISA KIINGI** (three goals, two assists — eight points) is the lone Cornell nearing the 10-point plateau, needing one goal to accomplish the feat.
 📖 The Big Red currently has four players with at least 10 points this season, the first time that has happened on a Cornell squad since 2012 (**DANIEL HABER**, **CONOR GOEPEL**, **TYLER REGAN**, and **STEPHEN REISERT**). It is the ninth time since 1947 that a Cornell team has had four 10-point scorers in the same season, joining the 1971, 1973, 1974, 1977, 1981, 1995, 1999, and 2012 teams.
 📖 Freshman goalkeeper **RYAN FRIEDBERG** has been the Big Red's go-to keeper this year, having started all 12 games this season. Friedberg has logged all but 11:25 of the Big Red's minutes this season, while posting a 9-3-0 record with a 1.01 goals-against average and a .684 save percentage.
 📖 After falling to Colgate last Tuesday in Hamilton and to Penn on Saturday at home, Cornell enters tonight's match on a two-game losing streak, the program's first since falling to Yale and UAlbany on Oct. 18 and 22, 2019.

BERMAN FIELD ADVANTAGE

📖 After Vermont snapped Cornell's 15-game unbeaten streak at Berman Field on Sept. 13, Cornell had bounced back by with 8-0 and 3-2 victories over Canisius and Harvard prior to Saturday's setback.
 📖 Since 2019, the Big Red is unbeaten in 17 of its last 19 matches at Berman Field, posting a 14-2-3 record and a .816 win percentage, which ranks 14th in the nation. Cornell is joined by Georgetown, New Hampshire, and Yale as the lone programs with two home losses during that span.
 📖 The Big Red is 9-1-1 over its last 11 home non-conference matches, dating back to the 2018 campaign. Cornell's lone loss in that span came on Sept. 13 against Vermont.

HAVING AN EYE FOR THE GOAL

The Big Red has scored 26 goals so far this year, marking the program's 10th overall time since 1946 that Cornell has logged at least 26 goals over its first 12 matches. It is the second consecutive year and just the third time in the last 25 seasons of competition that Cornell has at least 26 goals over the first 12 matches.

Cornell was shutout for the first time on the season at Colgate last Tuesday, snapping the Big Red's 15-game goal streak. Despite the Raiders posting a clean sheet over the Big Red, it marked the fourth consecutive season that Cornell has conceded just one clean sheet over its first 12 games of a season.

Dating back to 2019, Cornell has scored in 44 of its last 47 matches and in 77 of the 96 games (80.2 percent) played during **JOHN SMITH's** tenure as head coach at Cornell. The 80.2 percent figure ranks as the fourth-highest total by a Cornell head coach. It is the highest since **DAN WOOD** (1971-75), the coach in which Smith's position is currently endowed for.

REACHING THE 10-WIN PLATEAU

With a victory tonight, Cornell would increase its already established program record for consecutive 10-win seasons to four.

Securing a win in its 13th game of the season would be the third time over the last four seasons of competition that Cornell has won its 10th game in the 13th match of the season (2021, 2018).

FRIEDBERG'S STRONG START

Freshman goalkeeper **RYAN FRIEDBERG** has shined for the Big Red between the pipes this season, as he established the freshman record for wins in a season in the Big Red's upset win at No. 7 Syracuse on Oct. 4. Friedberg bested the record previously set by **STEPHEN BOTT** (1983) and **QUINN O'SULLIVAN** (1992).

Through games completed on Oct. 16, Friedberg's 1.01 goals-against average ranks third in the Ivy League, trailing Penn's Nick Christoffersen (0.73) and Brown's Henrik Weiper (0.89). Friedberg's figure is the eighth-best by a freshman goalkeeper.

With Friedberg's clean sheet on Sept. 24 against Marist, it marked the fourth time the Westfield, N.J., native has been a part of a Cornell clean sheet in 2022. Friedberg has the third-most shutouts by a Cornell freshman keeper, trailing Bott (7 in 1983) and O'Sullivan (4.5 in 1992).

A two-time Ivy League Rookie of the Week, Friedberg is the first Ivy League keeper to be the top newcomer at least twice in a season since Dartmouth's James Hickok in 2013. Friedberg is also Cornell's first player to be Rookie of the Week multiple times since **EMEKA ENELI** in 2018.

ONE FOR THE RECORD BOOKS

The eight goals scored by Cornell against Canisius on Sept. 20 were the second-most by a Big Red squad in a single game, dating back to 1946. It was the most goals scored since the program record was set on Sept. 24, 1965, when Cornell won its season-opener over Syracuse, 12-0.

It was the 14th time in program history, since 1946, in which Cornell scored at least six goals in a match. It was the Big Red's first time netting six-plus goals in a contest since Oct. 12, 2019, in a 6-0 victory over Harvard.

The Big Red scored five of its eight goals in the first half against Canisius, marking the second time in as many years that Cornell has scored five goals in a half. Last year, Cornell scored five first-half goals against Harvard on Oct. 9, before winning the contest, 5-4.

Cornell's eight goals are tied for the second-most in a game featuring two Division I programs this season. Cal St. Fullerton has the most goals in a single-game this season, potting 10 goals against LIFE Pacific, an NAIA school, on Aug. 28. Butler has the most in a match between two Division I schools, scoring nine goals versus Lindenwood on Sept. 21. Akron (8 vs. Chicago State on Oct. 9), Binghamton (8 vs. Hartford on Sept. 27), Siena (8 vs. Hartford on Sept. 11), and UMBC (8 vs. Fairfield on Aug. 26) are the other programs along with Cornell with eight-goal games in Division I matches in 2022.

HELPING THE TEAM OUT

Senior defender **CONNOR DROUGHT** has been an assist machine for the Big Red this season, logging six assists so far on the season. Drought's six assists are tied with Harvard's Willem Ebbs for the Ivy League lead. and are tied for the 27th nationally.

Drought's six assists are tied for the third-most by a designated defender, joined by Memphis' Hayden Anderson, Wake Forest's Jahlane Forbes, Washington's Omar Grey, Siena's Jesper Schone Vogtengen, Indiana's Nyk Sessock, and LIU's Robert Winkler. Only Quinnipiac's Alexander Stjernegaard (nine assists) and San Francisco's Nathan Simeon (eight assists) have more than Drought.

The six assists by Drought are the most by a Cornell defender on record in program history and is tied for the 12th-most by a Big Red player in program history. With his next assist, he will match **RICHARD STIMPSON** (2000), **IAN PILARSKI** (2001), **DANIEL HABER** (2012), **TYLER BAGLEY** and **EMEKA ENELI** (2021) for the seventh-most assists in a season.

IVY LEAGUE PRESEASON POLL

The Cornell men's soccer team was tabbed to finish third in the 2022 Ivy League Men's Soccer preseason poll, the conference office announced on Aug. 23.

Princeton was named the preseason favorite, garnering 12 of the 16 possible first-place votes, finishing with 123 points. Right behind the Tigers was Yale, who received the remaining four first-place votes and had 103 points.

Cornell was third with 97 points, while Harvard (89 points), Penn (56), Brown (45), Dartmouth (39), and Columbia (27) rounded out the poll.

LEADERSHIP TEAM ANNOUNCED

Fifth-year forward **EMEKA ENELI**, senior defender **CONNOR DROUGHT** and sophomore defender **WILSON EISNER** were named the tri-captains for the 2022 season.

Eneli is serving as captain for a third consecutive season. He earned a leadership role in 2020 before the COVID-19 pandemic canceled the season. Last year was the first time Eneli wore the armband during game action.

For Drought and Eisner, it will be the first time in their careers wearing the armband for the Big Red.

SCOUTING THE BEARCATS

Binghamton enters tonight's contest with a 3-6-4 record and a 1-1-2 mark in America East play. Despite the Bearcats' record, Binghamton is currently unbeaten over its last five matches (3-0-2).

The Bearcats are coming off a 4-1 victory over UMass Lowell at the Bearcats Sports Complex in Vestal. Devin Heanue, Ethan Homler, Matthew Cozetti, and Anthony Lazaridis all scored for the Bearcats. Mats Roorda made four saves in the victory.

Cozetti paces a balanced Bearcats offense with eight points (three goals, two assists). Heanue, Lazaridis, and Markos Touroukis all have registered seven points on the season.

Roorda has started in 10 of Binghamton's 13 matches to date, logging a 3-4-3 record to go along with a 1.02 goals-against average and a .773 save percentage. P.J. Parker has started the other three matches, registering a 1.93 goals-against average and a .667 save percentage.

SERIES VS. BINGHAMTON

Cornell has a 14-5-2 advantage over Binghamton in the series, which dates back to 1974. The Big Red opened the series with seven wins over the first eight matches between 1974 and 1981 before the two programs did not play until the 2007.

Upon the resumption of the annual meetings between Binghamton and Cornell, the Bearcats went 3-0-1 over the Big Red. Cornell has won seven of the last nine meetings between the two programs, going 7-1-1.

JOHN SMITH

Dr. Daniel P. Wood Head Coach of Men's Soccer
Seventh Season as Head Coach

Smith enters his seventh season at the helm of the Cornell men's soccer team in 2022 and can be credited with the resurrection of a program that went 1-14-2 during his first season.

Cornell is aiming for its fourth consecutive season with double-digit victories following a 10-win season bookended by 11-win seasons.

Since arriving on East Hill, Smith has led the Big Red to victories over perennially strong programs such as Akron, Michigan State, and Syracuse. During his six-year tenure, Smith has coached 16 players that went on to earn All-Ivy designations and four that earned United Soccer Coaches All-Region honors. Two Cornell student-athletes have reached the professional ranks of American soccer under Smith's tutelage.

Prior to joining the Big Red in 2016, Smith served on the Stanford University coaching staff for four seasons, helping the Cardinal to its first national title in program history, when Stanford defeated Clemson, 4-0, marking the most goals scored in an NCAA final since 1996 and the largest margin of victory since 1975. In 2015 alone, Smith coached two First-Team All-Americans, a program-record five All-Far West Regional selections, the Hermann Award winner, four Major League Soccer draft picks and two U.S. Men's National Team players. He helped lead the program to an 18-2-3 record in 2015 – the team's most wins since 2002 – and a 7-1-2 mark in Pac-12 play, establishing a then-program record.

Before joining Stanford, Smith made two stops as an assistant coach at CSU Bakersfield beginning in 1999 before leaving to become the head coach at Incarnate Word before the 2006 season. He returned to Bakersfield in 2011. While at Incarnate Word from 2006-10, Smith amassed a 62-26-10 record and won three conference championships.

As a player, Smith was drafted in the second round (13th overall) by the Columbus Crew in the 1997 MLS College Draft. A two-time All-American at Rollins College, Smith was inducted into the Sunshine State Conference Hall of Fame in 2004.

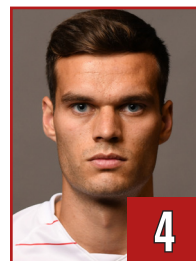
