PUCK DROP

After outscoring its opponents 13-2 in its pair of exhibitions, the No. 20-ranked Cornell men's hockey team looks to keep its potent offense on display as the Big Red travels to Amsoil Arena in Duluth, Minn., to square off against No. 19 Minnesota Duluth to open the 2022-23 regular season.

EXHIBITION REWIND

- Cornell displayed its scoring prowess in its pair of exhibitions against uOttawa and Guelph, posting 5-1 and 8-1 victories, respectively.
- Five Big Red players logged four points apiece over the pair of exhibitions. Seniors JACK MALONE and SAM MALINSKI each registered two goals and two assists, while fellow seniors MAX ANDREEV, MATT STIENBURG and BEN BERARD each scored one goal and assisted on three others. Sophomore ONDREJ PSENICKA had a team-high three goals, including his two goals last week against Guelph. Freshmen SEAN DONALDSON and WINTER WALLAGE had a goal and two assists.
- Freshman REMINGTON KEOPPLE stopped a team-high 16 shots on 18 attempts in a pair of appearances. Sophomore IAN SHANE did not yield a goal on his nine shots faced, while junior transfer RYAN McINCHAK stopped the lone shot he faced in third-period action against uOttawa.

SEASON-OPENING SERIES

- © Cornell enters this weekend's series on a four-game win streak in games played in the opening weekend of regular-season play. The streak began in 2019-20 when the Big Red swept Michigan State in East Lansing. Last year, Cornell swept Alaska Fairbanks in a pair of overtime victories at Lynah Rink.
- Since 2012-13, Cornell is 12-4-2 in its first two regular season games. During the span, the Big Red has outscored its opponents 52-33, while limiting its opponents to two goals or less in 13 of the 18 games.

ONE WIN AWAY

- MIKE SCHAFER, the Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Hockey, is just one victory away from reaching a historic milestone.
- With his next victory, Schafer would notch his 500th career head coaching victory, and become

the 29th head coach in college hockey history to reach the 500-win milestone.

- Schafer would be just the seventh active head coach the fourth at the Division I level to register 500 career coaching victories. He would join Mercyhurst's Rick Gotkin (588), ECAC Hockey counterpart Rand Pecknold of Quinnipiac (583), and Notre Dame's Jeff Jackson (560) in reaching the 500 career victories.
- Schafer's 499 career wins already stands as the most victories by a Cornell hockey head coach and are the most by any active head coach of Cornell's 37 varsity sports.
- With his already etched in ECAC Hockey lore, Schafer's current win total is the most in ECAC history.

RETURNING TO MINNESOTA

This weekend will be the seventh and eighth time Cornell is playing in the state of Minnesota. It will be the program's first time playing in the state since March 27, 2005, when the Big Red fell to Minnesota in overtime of the 2005 NCAA Tournament West Regional final.

Each of the last four games played by the Big Red in the Land of 10,000 Lakes were played at Mariucci Arena (1993 and 1994 Mariucci Classics, and two NCAA Tournament games in 2005).

The remaining two games played by Cornell in Minnesota were both in Duluth at the 1968 Frozen Four. Cornell fell to North Dakota in the national semifinals, 3-1, before winning the third-place game over Boston College, 6-1. Both games were played at the Duluth Arena Auditorium.

AGAINST THE NCHC

© Cornell is 8-5-1 all-time against NCHC schools since the conference's inception prior to the 2013-14. The Big Red has won five of its last seven against NCHC schools, including the last three (Miami in 2017-18 and last year's sweep at North Dakota).

The Big Red has a 31-22-4 all-time record against the eight current NCHC schools.

ECAC PRESEASON POLL

ECAC Hockey announced Sept. 21 during its annual Media Day call that the Cornell hockey team was slated to finish fourth.

Quinnipiac was dubbed the preseason favorite after receiving eight first-place votes, finishing with 118 points. Harvard received the remaining four first-place votes, logging a 109-point total. Clarkson was the only other program to have a point total over the century mark (105).

© Cornell followed Clarkson with its 90 points, while Colgate finished in fifth with 77 points. RPI (70), St. Lawrence (57), and Union (45), Dartmouth (43), Yale (32), Brown (26), and Princeton (20) rounded out the poll.

PUTTING A NUMBER ON IT

© Cornell opened the 2022-23 season as the No. 19 ranked team in both the DCU/USCHO. com and USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls, both organizations announced Sept. 19.

In the most recent update on Oct. 24, Cornell continues is ranked No. 20 in both polls despite not having play any regular-season contests.

The Big Red are one of three ECAC Hockey programs currently ranked, joining Quinnipiac (No. 7/6) and Harvard (No. 14/13). RPI is the lone program receiving votes in both polls. Brown is receiving votes in the USCHO.com poll, while Clarkson is receiving votes in the USA Today/ USA Hockey Magazine poll.

LEADERSHIP GROUP ANNOUNCED

Senior defensemen SAM MALINSKI and TRAVIS MITCHELL were named co-captains, while fifth-year forward MAX ANDREEV and senior forward MATT STIENBURG were tabbed co-alternate captains on Sept. 29.

HIGH RATINGS

Senior defensemen SAM MALINSKI and TRAVIS MITCHELL are currently tied for the ninth-highest plus-minus rating by active defensemen in Division I hockey.

Malinski and Mitchell each have a career plus-34 rating, which is the second-highest rating by an ECAC Hockey defenseman. Only Quinnipiac's Zach Metsa has a higher rating, a plus-63, which is tied with Minnesota State's Andrew Carroll for the highest rating in Division I hockey.

The Cornell defensemen tandem are just one of two sets of teammates ranked in the top-10 in plus-minus rating. Minnesota State's trio of Andrew Caroll (plus-63), Akito Hirose (plus-46) and Jake Livingstone (plus-42) are the other set of teammates in the top 10.

FIRST TEAM RETURNERS

Senior defender SAM MALINSKI is one of six returning players who have already received first-team honors from ECAC Hockey. Malinski is the lone Big Red representative on the list, while Clarkson's Alex Campbell and Mathieu Gosselin, Quinnipiac's Zach Metsa and Yaniv Perets, and St. Lawrence's Cameron Buhl (in 2020-21) are the others on the list.

The six ECAC representatives are tied with Atlantic Hockey for the most returning first-team selections for their respective conferences. Three of the six Atlantic Hockey first-team players have since transferred to different programs.

WELCOME BACK!

Cornell returns 81 percent of its goals scored from last season, which was the eighth-highest percentage by a Division I program entering the 2022-23 season.

Air Force led the nation, returning all of its scoring from the 2021-22 season. Penn State (93 percent) had the secondhighest total, while Dartmouth (86 percent), Northeastern (85 percent), Sacred Heart and Yale (84 percent), and St. Lawrence (83 percent) were ahead of the Big Red.

Of the programs remaining seven teams in the top eight, Cornell will be playing four of the teams this season (Dartmouth, Sacred Heart, St. Lawrence, and Yale).

TOWERING OVER THE COMPETITION

According to CollegeHockeyInc.com, Cornell enters the 2022-23 season as tied for the second-tallest Division I program. The Big Red's average height is 6-foot-1 is tied with Lindenwood, while both programs trail Vermont, who edges the Big Red and Lions by six inches.

The Big Red have a two-inch advantage over Clarkson for the tallest ECAC program. The Golden Knights are tied with Boston University for the fourth-tallest Division I program entering the 2022-23 season.

Sophomore forward ONDREJ PSENICKA is tied with Harvard forward Ryan Drkulec, Quinnipiac goaltender Chase Clark, and RPI forward Sutter Muzzatti for being the thirdtallest player in ECAC Hockey this season. Only Dartmouth's Cooper Black (6-foot-8) and Quinnipiac's Noah Altman (6foot-7) have listed heights taller than the quartet of 6-foot-6 players.

- 🧸 After sweeping Arizona State in its season-opening series, No. 19-ranked Minnesota Duluth has lost its last four games, being swept on the road against then-No. 5 Minnesota State and at home to an unranked Wisconsin team.
- The Bulldogs' four-game losing streak is the program's longest since early in the 2015-16 season, when Minnesota Duluth lost at home to UMass Lowell (Oct. 31), swept at Omaha (Nov. 6-7) and losing the first of a two-game home series with Denver (Nov. 13).
- Despite being held to just three goals during its four-game losing streak, the Bulldogs have four players leading the team with three points apiece. Luke Loheit and Ben Steeves each have two goals and one assist, while Owen Gallatin (one goal, two assists) and Carter Loney (three assists) are the others.
- Zach Stejskal has started in four of the Bulldogs' six games between the pipes this season. Stejskal has a 1-3-0 record with a 3.81 goals-against average and an .875 save percentage in 220:31 of action. Matthew Thiessen, a transfer from Maine, has appeared in four games, two of which were starts. The Vancouver Canucks seventh-round draft pick has a 1-1-0 record with a 1.33 goals-against average and a .949 save percentage during 135:30 inside the blue paint. Thiessen's goals-against and save percentages are both fourth nationally.
- Minnesota Duluth has struggled in multiple offensive categories so far this season. Over its six games, the Bulldogs have killed 66.7 percent of its penalties (16-of-24), ranking as the fourthworst in Division I hockey. The Bulldogs' 1.67 goals-per-game is also near the bottom, placing 51st out of 54.

Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Ice Hockey 27th Season as Head Coach • 35th Season at Cornell

The longest-tenured head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, MIKE SCHAFER '86, enters his 27th season at the helm of the Cornell men's hockey program.

When Schafer returned to his alma mater in the summer of 1995 to become Cornell's 12th head coach in men's hockey history, Schafer's goal was to bring the Big Red to a position of national prominence.

Already the winningest head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, Schafer has accomplished that objective with his 499-271-103 record. His 499 wins rank fourth among active Division I coaches and his .631 win percentage is good for fifth among active Division I coaches.

Schafer has guided the Big Red to 12 NCAA Tournament appearances and a berth to the 2003 NCAA Frozen Four — the program's first since 1980. That year, Cornell set a school record for wins (30), finishing with one more victory than the 1969-70 national championship squad, who went undefeated (29-0-0). The 2002-03 team's 19-2-1 record in ECAC Hockey play was Cornell's best mark in league play since 1969-70 when Cornell was 21-0 in league action.

In 2020, Schafer was named a co-winner of the Spencer Penrose Award, given to the nation's top head coach. It was the first time Schafer won the award after being a finalist on five occasions after being named ECAC Hockey's Coach of the Year.

The Big Red have been regularly ranked among the nation's elite during Schafer's tenure, including being named No. 1 in both the USCHO.com and the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls at the time the 2019-20 postseason was halted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Cornell has claimed five Whitelaw Cup (ECAC Hockey tournament titles), which surpassed the legendary **NED HARKNESS** for the most in program history. Schafer has also led the Big Red to three Cleary Cups (ECAC's top regular-season team) in three of the last four years of competition.

In 2002-03, Schafer led the Big Red to the NCAA Frozen Four, setting a school record with 30 wins, one better than the 1969-70 squad who went 29-0-0. Cornell's 19-2-1 mark in ECAC Hockey in 2002-03 was Cornell's best since the 1969-70 team went 21-0 in league play.

Over his career, Schafer has coached 10 different players to First Team All-America status 11 times, seven Ivy League Players of the Year, 5 ECAC Hockey Ken Dryden Award winners (league's best goaltender), five ECAC Hockey Rookies of the Year, and five Ivy Rookies of the Year, and three ECAC Hockey Players of the Year.

A native of Durham, Ontario, Schafer played junior hockey with the Guelph Jr. A Holody Platers, who were finalists in the Centennial Cup for the National Championship in 1982.

Schafer and his wife, Diane, have two sons, Luke and John '18, and a daughter, Michelle.

BEN SYER

11th Season as Associate Head Coach; 12th Season at Cornell Western Ontario '98

Serving as the Big Red's recruiting director and manager of the team's vaunted defensive

unit, BEN SYER's efforts were perhaps no more celebrated than during the 2017-18 season. He helped Cornell lead the nation in team defense with a paltry 1.58 goals-against average and was named the winner of the American Hockey Coaches Association's 2018 Terry Flanagan Award.

One of the AHCA's major annual awards, the Terry Flanagan Award is presented to the assistant coach whose career body of work best honors that of the award's name sake.

"He can hold court with a group of assistant coaches on the road with the best of them," said MIKE SCHAFER, adding that this is the first time he's nominated anyone for a major AHCA award in his 23-year tenure at the helm of the Big Red. "He knows the elder statesmen, but he also knows the young guys like Terry did. He would make sure to say hello to everyone in the rink and lend a helping hand to young assistants. I admired Terry for this. He and his family are of the highest character, upfront and honest."

Syer joined Cornell in June 2011 as an assistant coach, then was promoted to associate head coach the following summer. He previously served as associate head coach during his 12 seasons at Quinnipiac under head coach Rand Pecknold. During that run, the Bobcats posted a 242-168-46 record with one NCAA tournament appearance (2002) and nine 20-win seasons.

A native of Kitchener, Ontario, Syer arrived at Quinnipiac after serving one season as an assistant coach at Ohio University. A 1998 graduate of Western Ontario, Syer earned a bachelor's degree in urban development. He earned his master's degree in physical education with a concentration in athletic administration in 2000.



SEAN FLANAGAN

Seventh Season as Assistant CoachSt. Lawrence '10

Flanagan enters his seventh season as an assistant coach on head coach MIKE SCHAFER's

staff. During his previous six seasons, Flanagan helped guide the Big Red to post a 108-38-19 record, good for a .712 win percentage. In his first three years on Schafer's staff, Flanagan aided Cornell in going 3-for-3 in advancing to the NCAA Tournament (and likely would have been 4-for-4, if the 2019-20 season had not ended prematurely). Prior to arriving on East Hill prior to the 2016-17 season, Flanagan made a couple of stops after his four-year playing career at St. Lawrence. After playing professionally in the ECHL with the Las Vegas Wranglers and Quad City Mallards, he became an assistant coach at Division III Hobart from 2012-15. While working under former Cornell assistant coach Mark Taylor, he helped

build a team who won the ECAC West titles in 2015 and 2016, leading the Statesmen to NCAA Tournament appearances. After Hobart, Flanagan spent one season as the Director of Hockey Operations at UMass Lowell, during the 2015-16 season. Flanagan is no stranger to ECAC Hockey, as he played 121 career games with St. Lawrence up to the 2010-11 season, where he racked up 12 goals and 40 assists for 52 points, helping the Saints advance to the league's championship weekend twice over his four years with the Saints. Flanagan graduated from St. Lawrence with a bachelor of arts degree in history with a minor in sports studies and exercise sciences in 2010 before receiving his master of education degree from St. Lawrence the following year.



MITCH STEPHENS

Fourth Season as Volunteer
Assistant Coach; SUNY Geneseo '07

Stephens returns to Cornell after serving as an assistant coach at Geneseo for five years. In his time behind the bench with his alma mater, Stephens helped the Knights win two

SUNYAC conference championships (2016, 2018) and make three NCAA Tournament apperances (2014, 2016, and 2018), including two trips to the national semifinals. As a senior, Stephens was named runner-up for USCHO Division III Player of the Year, an AHCA Division III First Team, and All-America selection, while being a finalist for the AHCA Sid Watson Memorial Award as the NCAA Division III Player of the Year.



BEN RUSSELL

First Season as Director of Hockey Operations; Cornell '20

Russell rejoined the Cornell men's hockey program in Aug. 2022 to serve as the team's Director of Hockey Operations, after spending the last two seasons as an assistant coach

at St. Olaf College, a Minnesota-based Division III school. At St. Olaf, Russell helped the 2021-22 squad to a Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) tournament title and an NCAA Tournament appearance. While attending Cornell for his undergraduate studies, Russell served as an Assistant Director of Hockey Operations, helping coordinate video, analyzing film, and preparing scouting reports, while incorporating advanced analytics into game preparation.





MACDONALD '15 BECOMES THIRD CORNELLIAN TO HOIST STANLEY CUP

ITHACA, N.Y. (JUNE 26, 2022) — JACOB MacDONALD '15 became the third player in Cornell history to lift the Stanley Cup when his Colorado Avalanche defeated the Tampa Bay Lightning, 2-1, in Game 6 of the 2022 Stanley Cup Playoffs at Amalie Arena in Tampa, Fla.

MacDonald joined six-time winner KEN DRYDEN and three-time champion JOE NIEUWENDYK in hoisting the oldest existing trophy awarded to a professional sports franchise in North America.

Since graduating from Cornell, MacDonald has played in the ECHL with the Elmira Jackals and Toledo Walleye, the AHL with the Springfield Falcons, Albany and Binghamton Devils, Springfield Thunderbirds and Colorado Eagles around NHL stints with

the Florida Panthers in 2018-19 and the Avalanche in both 2020-21 and 2021-22.

He played eight regular-season games with Colorado this season and has two goals and eight assists in 43 regular season NHL games.

MacDonald was called up from Colorado of the AHL in early June to provide the Avalanche with some additional depth at the defenseman position.

The three-year starter for the Big Red accumulated four goals and 17 assists for 21 points in 104 career games. His plus-6 rating as a senior ranked second on the club.




