FIRST TOUCH

The No. 22-ranked Cornell men's soccer program, coming off a 2-1 upset victory over No. 7 Syracuse on Tuesday, plays the middle game of its three-game road swing on Saturday afternoon against Brown at Stevenson-Pincince Field in Providence, R.I.

SYRACUSE RECAP

A Syracuse own goal in the first half and a second-half goal on a penalty by junior forward MATTHEW GONCALVES aided newly-ranked Cornell to a 2-1 upset victory over Syracuse at a brisk SU Soccer Stadium on Tuesday evening.

Freshman goalkeeper RYAN FRIEDBERG made four of his season-high five saves over the contest's final 17 minutes to ensure his eighth victory of the season.

CRUNCHING THE NUMBERS

As Cornell boarded the bus for its one-hour trip north to Syracuse, the United Soccer Coaches poll was released, which featured Cornell in the top 25 for the first time this season.

The No. 22 ranking marks the second consecutive season, and third time over the Big Red's last four years of competition that they have achieved a top-25 ranking.

Cornell is the lone lvy League program currently ranked in the top 25, while Penn and Yale are currently receiving votes.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

Senior midfielder BRANDON MORALES and freshman midfielder BEN GOULDING were honored by the lvy League on Monday for their efforts last weekend against Harvard.

Morales was named the Ivy League Player of the Week after factoring in all three of Cornell's goals in the Big Red's 3-2 win over the Crismon at Berman Field. The Pharr, Texas, native scored one goal and assisted on the other two, which included Goulding's first collegiate goal, which proved to be the game-winning goal.

It is the first time Cornell has swept the lvy League's weekly awards since Oct. 11, 2021, when TYLER BAGLEY won Player of the Week and WILSON EISNER was named Rookie of the Week.

ROAD WARRIORS

With Tuesday's victory over No. 7 Syracuse, Cornell improved to 24-9-1 on the road since the beginning of the 2018 season, good for a .721 win percentage.

Cornell is one of four Division I schools to post a win percentage north of .700 on the road over the last four-plus seasons. Only Missouri State (.828), Washington (.743), and Saint Mary's (.727) have higher percentages.

The Big Red is one of 13 programs to be undefeated on the road this season. Cornell's six road victories in 2022 are the most by any Division I program this season. Entering Wednesday's contests, Cleveland State (5-0-1), No. 10 Denver (5-1-1), Gardner-Webb (5-1-2), No. 18 Lipscomb (5-1-1), and No. 15 Vermont (5-0-0) were the other schools with five road wins in 2022.

Dating back to last year, Cornell has won its last seven road matches, which is tied with Vermont for the longest active Division I streak.

ONE OF THE BEST

Cornell's 8-1-0 record has the Big Red tied with Western Michigan (8-1-0) and No. 3 Kentucky (7-0-2) for the nation's fifth-highest win percentage following Tuesday's matches.

Only top-ranked Washington (9-0-1 - .950), No. 16 Dayton (8-0-1 - .944), No. 4 Wake Forest (10-1-0 - .909) and No. 2 Duke (8-0-2 - .900) are currently ranked higher than the Big Red.

The Big Red enter Saturday's match on a five-game win streak, which is tied with No. 1 Washington, fellow Ivy League foe, Penn, and St. Francis (N.Y.) for the fourth-longest active win streak in Division I soccer.

🥌 Prior to Wednesday's matches, only Western Michigan (8 games), No. 15 Vermont and LIU (7 games) had longer streaks.

STARTING STRONG

Cornell is off to its best nine-game start since the 2012 season when the Big Red opened the year with 12 consecutive wins before concluding the year with a 15-1 regular season record before falling to Syracuse in the NCAA Tournament.

The eight wins over the Big Red's first nine games is just the third time in program history that Cornell has posted eight wins over its first nine matches (1975 and 2012). Back in 1975, the squad also had an 8-1 record in its first nine games before concluding with a 12-4 record.

HAVING AN EYE FOR THE GOAL

1946 and the third time over the previous 46 years that Cornell has logged at least 22 goals over its first nine matches. It is the second consecutive year that Cornell has 22-plus goals in the first nine games.

🥌 Over Cornell's first nine matches in 2022, the Big Red has yet to be shut out. It marks the 10th overall time since 1946, and the second consecutive year, that a Big Red squad has scored at least once

over its first nine matches (1948, 1958, 1965, 1971, 1976, 1993, 2011, 2012, 2021, 2022). The 1948 and 1958 squads scored goals in all nine of its games played that year.

Cornell has scored a goal in each of its last 14 games (last five in 2021, first nine in 2022) and in 42 of its last 44 games, dating back to 2019.

During JOHN SMITH's tenure at Cornell, which began in 2016, the Big Red has scored in 75 of the 93 matches played (80.6 percent). The percentage ranks as the fourth-highest by a Cornell head coach and the highest since DAN WOOD, the coach in which Smith's position is currently endowed for, from 1971-75.

ABOUT THE BIG RED

Senior midfielder Brandon Morales has a team-leading 13 points (five goals, three assists), all of which have come over his last five matches. Sophomore forward ALIOUNE KA also has a double-digit point total, logging 10 points on the power of four goals and two assists. Fifth-year senior EMEKA ENELL is nearing the 10-point plateau as he has nine points (two goals, five assists).

🥾 Freshman goalkeeper RYAN FRIEDBERG has been Cornell's go-to goalkeeper this season. He has started all of the Big Red's nine matches so far this season, posting an 8-1-0 record to go along with a 0.79 goals-against average and a .741 save percentage.

FRIEDBERG'S STRONG START

Freshman goalkeeper RYAN FRIEDBERG has shined for the Big Red between the pipes this season, as he established the freshman record for wins in a season on Tuesday at No. 7 Syracuse. He bested the record previously set by STEPHEN BOTT in 1983 and QUINN O'SULLIVAN in 1992.

🝊 Friedberg's clean sheet on Sept. 24 against Marist marked the fourth time he has been a part of a Cornell clean sheet in 2022. He has the third-most shutouts by a Cornell freshman keeper, trailing Bott (7 in 1983) and O'Sullivan (4.5 in 1992).

🝊 Through games completed on Oct. 4, Friedberg's 0.79 goals-against average was second in the Ivy League, trailing Penn's Nick Christoffersen (0.754). Freidberg's mark ranks 36th nationally.

🝊 Friedberg, through games completed on Oct. 4, had the seventh-lowest goals-against average for a first-year Division I goalkeeper.

- A two-time Ivy League Rookie of the Week, Friedberg is the first Ivy League keeper to be the top newcomer at least twice in a season since Dartmouth's James Hickok in 2013.

STRONG IVY LEAGUE STARTS

🐻 Cornell is seeking its second consecutive 2-0 start to Ivy League play on Saturday against Brown. It would mark the first time Cornell opened conference play with two consecutive wins in back-to-back seasons since 2011 and 2012.

Last year, the Big Red won its first Ivy League contest over Penn, 3-0, on Oct. 2 at Rhodes Field in Philadelphia before defeating Harvard at home, 5-4, on Oct. 9.

ONE FOR THE RECORD BOOKS

The eight goals scored by Cornell against Canisius on Sept. 20 were the second-most by a Big Red squad in a single game, dating back to 1946. It was the most goals scored since the program record was set on Sept. 24, 1965, when Cornell won its season-opener over Syracuse, 12-0.

It was the 14th time in program history, since 1946, in which Cornell scored at least six goals in a match. It was the Big Red's first time netting six-plus goals in a contest since Oct. 12, 2019, in a 6-0 victory over Harvard.

The Big Red scored five of its eight goals in the first half against Canisius, marking the second time in as many years that Cornell has scored five goals in a half. Last year, Cornell scored five first-half goals against Harvard on Oct. 9, before winning the contest, 5-4.

Cornell's eight goals are the third-most by a Division I program this season, trailing Cal St. Fullerton (10 vs. LIFE Pacific, an NAIA school, on Aug. 28) and Butler (9 vs. Lindenwood on Sept. 21).

IVY LEAGUE PRESEASON POLL

🥌 The Cornell men's soccer team was tabbed to finish third in the 2022 Ivy League Men's Soccer preseason poll, the conference office announced on Aug. 23.

Princeton was named the preseason favorite, garnering 12 of the 16 possible first-place votes, finishing with 123 points. Right behind the Tigers was Yale, who received the remaining four first-place votes and had 103 points.

Cornell was third with 97 points, while Harvard (89 points), Penn (56), Brown (45), Dartmouth (39), and Columbia (27) rounded out the poll.

LEADERSHIP TEAM ANNOUNCED

Fifth-year forward EMEKA ENELI, senior defender CONNOR DROUGHT and sophomore defender WILSON **EISNER** were named the tri-captains for the 2022 season.

🥌 Eneli is serving as captain for a third consecutive season. He earned a leadership role in 2020 before the COVID-19 pandemic canceled the season. Last year was the first time Eneli wore the armband during game action.

For Drought and Eisner, it will be the first time in their careers wearing the armband for the Big Red.

SCOUTING THE BEARS

Brown enters this afternoon's contest with a 5-2-1 overall record and an 0-0-1 mark in Ivy League play. The Bears played to a scoreless draw with Columbia in its Ivy League opener last Saturday.

Currently on a four-game unbeaten streak (3-0-1), Brown is coming off a 1-0 home victory over Northeastern on Tuesday.

Brown currently has a top-20 ranking in save percentage (.800) and shutout percentage (.500), as the Bears have four clean sheets on the season.

🥌 Jamin Gogo Peters leads Brown's offense with seven points (three goals, one assist). Kojo Dadzie is the other Bears player to score multiple goals (two goals).

🧸 Henrik Weiper has started six of Brown's eight games this season, posting a 4-1-1 record and a .806 save percentage. Weiper and Connor Smith each have a 1.00 goals-against average on the season.

SERIES VS. BROWN

This afternoon will be the 68th all-time meeting between the Big Red and Bears. Brown has the advantage in the series, 39-23-5, despite Cornell entering the match on a four-game unbeaten streak (3-0-1). Cornell has outscored Brown during its unbeaten streak by six goals, 8-2.

🝊 It will be Cornell's first road match against Brown since Oct. 20, 2018, when the Big Red, who were ranked No. 25, prevailed 2-1 on the power of goals from JOHN SEARCE and CHARLES TOUCHE.

JOHN SMITH

Dr. Daniel P. Wood Head Coach of Men's Soccer Seventh Season as Head Coach

Smith enters his seventh season at the helm of the Cornell men's soccer team in 2022 and can be credited with the resurection of a program that went 1-14-2 during his first season.

Cornell is aiming for its fourth consecutive season with double-digit victories following a 10-win season bookended by 11-win seasons.

Since arriving on East Hill, Smith has led the Big Red to victories over perennially strong programs such as Akron, Michigan State, and Syracuse. During his six-year tenure, Smith has coached 16 players that went on to earn All-Ivy designations and four that earned United Soccer Coaches All-Region honors. Two Cornell student-athletes have reached the professional ranks of American soccer under Smith's tutelage.

Prior to joining the Big Red in 2016, Smith served on the Stanford University coaching staff for four seasons, helping the Cardinal to its first national title in program history, when Stanford defeated Clemson, 4-0, marking the most goals scored in an NCAA final since 1996 and the largest margin of victory since 1975. In 2015 alone, Smith coached two First-Team All-Americans, a program-record five All-Far West Regional selections, the Hermann Award winner, four Major League Soccer draft picks and two U.S. Men's National Team players. He helped lead the program to an 18-2-3 record in 2015 — the team's most wins since 2002 — and a 7-1-2 mark in Pac-12 play, establishing a then-program record.

Before joining Stanford, Smith made two stops as an assistant coach at CSU Bakersfield beginning in 1999 before leaving to become the head coach at Incarnate Word before the 2006 season. He returned to Bakersfield in 2011. While at Incarnate Word from 2006-10, Smith amassed a 62-26-10 record and won three conference championships.

As a player, Smith was drafted in the second round (13th overall) by the Columbus Crew in the 1997 MLS College Draft. A two-time All-American at Rollins College, Smith was inducted into the Sunshine State Conference Hall of Fame in 2004.

TYLER BAGLEY (2021), WILSON EISNER (2021).




