FIRST TOUCH

📖 The Cornell women's soccer team travels to Cambridge, Mass., for a matchup against No. 25 Harvard this afternoon at Jordan Field.

COLGATE RECAP

📖 Sophomore midfielder **PEYTON NICHOLS** scored her first goal of the season and freshman goalkeeper **NATALIE MEDUGNO** logged a four-save clean sheet in her collegiate debut, aiding Cornell to a 1-0 victory over Colgate at Beyer-Small '76 Field on Tuesday night.

📖 Medugno became the second Cornell goalkeeper in as many years to earn a shutout in her collegiate debut. **ERICA FOX** had a two-save clean sheet against Canisius in her first collegiate game on Aug. 27, 2021.

ABOUT THE BIG RED

📖 Junior forward **LAKEN GALLMAN** continues to lead the Big Red in goals (four) and points (eight). Senior forward **ASHLEY DURIK** has the second-most points with six, on the power of two goals and two assists.

📖 Senior goalkeeper **NICOLE SHULMAN** has started eight of the Big Red's 11 games this season, posting a 1-3-3 record with a 1.83 goals-against average and a .656 save percentage.

NOT THROWING AWAY THEIR SHOTS

📖 After not recording a shot against Colgate on Tuesday, **LAKEN GALLMAN** no longer qualifies for ranking amongst Division I players in shooting accuracy, as she does not meet the two shots per game requirement.

📖 Through games completed on Oct. 4, Gallman's .737 shooting accuracy (14 shots on goal in 19 attempts) would rank fourth nationally and lead the Ivy League, being 119 points higher than current Ivy League leader Ava Seelenfreund of Brown (.618).

📖 In Gallman's first 10 appearances with Cornell since transferring from the University of Tampa, a Division II school, the junior forward has logged at least one shot attempt and one shot on goal in all but two matches (Sept. 11 at Syracuse, and Tuesday at Colgate).

📖 Cornell, however, is the only Ivy League program with at least two players ranking in the top 5 in shooting accuracy, as Aidan Julia Reineman (.565) and Ashley Durik (.545) rank third and fourth, respectively.

AGAINST RANKED OPPONENTS

📖 Cornell is playing a ranked Harvard team for the second time in as many seasons. Last year, the Big Red fell to the Crimson, who were ranked No. 18, 4-0, at Berman Field. Harvard scored all four of its goals in the second half.

📖 This afternoon's match is the sixth consecutive year of competition that Cornell is playing a ranked opponent and the fifth straight year facing a ranked Ivy League opponent. Along with last year's defeat to Harvard, the Big Red fell to No. 24 Brown, 2-0, on Oct. 26, 2019, to Princeton in consecutive years (2017 and 2018) by identical 2-0 scores, and dropped a 2-0 match to No. 23 Rutgers on Sept. 9, 2016.

📖 The previous three matches against ranked opponents have all come at Berman Field, as the last road match against a ranked opponent came to then-No. 15 Princeton on Oct. 28, 2017.

NOBODY WINS

Last Saturday's draw with Penn was Cornell's fourth game decided without a team winning. The draw matched the Cornell single-season program record, which was initially set in 2015 when the Big Red posted a 9-4-4 overall mark.

Three of Cornell's last five matches, and four of its last seven, have resulted in draws. Of the four draws this season, three of have been by 1-1 scores.

GABRIEL TRAINS WITH PHILIPPINES NATIONAL TEAM

Sophomore midfielder **REINNA GABRIEL** missed the Big Red's first five games as she was training with the Philippines National Team camp in California.

Gabriel, who made her season debut Sept. 11 at Syracuse, is seeking to join the Philippines National Team – who currently holds its highest-ever world ranking of No. 53 – for its first World Cup appearance next summer when Australia and New Zealand host the quadrennial soccer tournament.

CORNELL'S 2022 LEADERSHIP TEAM

Cornell will deploy a seven-person leadership team for the 2022 season, rotating captains on a game-by-game basis.

The players named to the leadership team for the season include a trio of seniors (**SYDNEY WAITERS**, **EMILY ST. JOHN**, and **ISABELLA DeLEW**), along with a pair of juniors (**AVA LADEN** and **JACKIE LASSETER**) and two sophomores (**CECILY POKIGO** and **MADDIE LEROY**).

ACROSS THE NATION

Cornell does not have a geographical recruiting base as the Big Red have 16 different states represented on this year's roster.

California is the most represented state with seven players from the Golden State. New York has the second-highest total with five players. Connecticut and Illinois have three players apiece, while Colorado, New Jersey and Vermont each have two representatives.

Florida, Indiana, Kentucky, Massachusetts, Maryland, North Carolina, Texas, Virginia and Washington are represented once.

SCOUTING THE CRIMSON

Harvard enters this afternoon's contest ranked No. 25 in the United Soccer Coaches poll, the lone Ivy League to earn a ranking in the top 25.

Despite outshooting its fellow Boston-based institution, Boston University, 27-2 on Tuesday, the Crimson dropped its first contest of the season on Tuesday to the Terriers, 1-0.

The Crimson enter today's contest with a plus-20 goal differential, outscoring its opponents, by a 27-7 margin. Hannah Bebar and Ainsley Ahmadian pace Harvard's balanced scoring attack, which features 13 different goal scorers, with five goals apiece. Bebar has a team-leading 16 points (five goals, six assists).

Goalkeeping duties have been split between Hannah Gardner and Anna Karpenko. Gardner has started six matches, going 3-1-1 with a 0.60 goals-against average and a .800 save percentage. Karpenko is 4-0-1 with a 0.80 goals-against average and a .733 save percentage.

SERIES VS. HARVARD

This afternoon will be the 40th all-time meeting between the Big Red and Crimson, dating back to 1982. Harvard has dominated the series, posting a 27-3-9 record over Cornell.

Cornell is seeking to snap its 27-game winless streak (0-22-5) against Harvard, last defeating the Crimson, 1-0, on Oct. 2, 1993.

The Big Red have a 1-14-4 all-time record at Harvard, with the lone win coming on Oct. 8, 1988, in a 3-0 victory.

Harvard has posted six clean sheets in its last seven matches against the Big Red, including each of the last three.

Women's Soccer Head Coach
Third Season as Head Coach • Fourth Season at Cornell

ROB FERGUSON was hired as head coach for the women's soccer program in February 2020 after serving as an assistant coach for the Big Red during the 2019 season.

With the team's 2020 season canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Ferguson made his NCAA head coaching debut in 2021.

In his first season as head coach, Cornell finished with a 3-11-2 record and a 1-6 mark in Ivy League play. The Ivy League victory was the program's first in over five years.

After winning his collegiate debut against Canisius in 2021, Ferguson became the first Cornell women's soccer head coach to win in their first game coaching the Big Red since **GRETCHEN ZIGANTE** in 2006.

Offense has seen an increase during Ferguson's tenure on East Hill. In 2021, the Big Red scored 14 times, which marked the most by a Cornell team since scoring 16 times in 2015.

In his first year on Cornell's coaching staff, Ferguson guide the Big Red to four consecutive victories to start the season – including three straight clean sheets against Siena, Bucknell and St. Bonaventure. Cornell ultimately finished the season with a 4-10-1 record after the rigors of one some of the strongest Ivy League competition seen in recent years. Ferguson helped get the Big Red's impact freshman class acclimated to collegiate competition, a group that included 2019 All-Ivy League honorable mention selection **ASHLEY DURIK**.

Ferguson first joined the Big Red after a very successful stint as the Director of Coaching with the WNY Flash Academy. He helped turn the program into a player development leader in Western New York, expanding the program's footprint from 15 teams to 34 teams and moving them into national recognition in Elite Clubs National League (ECNL). Under Ferguson's leadership at the Flash their 03G ECNL and Flash 02G ECNL advanced into the Elite 8 in June 2018, and the club had their first US Youth National Team Camp call-up.

Before joining the WNY Flash Academy, Ferguson was the head coach of both the men's and women's soccer programs at NAIA Huston-Tillotson University in Austin, Texas. Prior to that, he served as the Executive Director of Business for Lonestar Soccer Club from 2008 until 2015. One of the largest and most successful youth soccer clubs in the country, Ferguson coached the Lonestar 96B Red, 93G Red, 94G Red and 95G Red, and he helped advance the 95G Red to the USYSNC Region III Championships in June 2013 and 2014.

Firenze joined the Big Red in 2020 after a four-year tenure as an assistant coach at Binghamton, including two seasons as the lead assistant. She helped the Bearcats accumulate a 34-29-10 record in that span, including a 2017 season that ended with an 11-4-4 mark and a share of the America East regular season title. Following that season, Firenze and the rest of Binghamton's staff were honored as America East Co-Coaching Staff of the Year.

Britt joined the Big Red in advance of the 2021 season after a two-year stint as an assistant coach at Hartford, where she helped the Hawks advance to the 2019 America East Championship finals. Britt helped develop Hartford's Maria Perez into a second-team All-America East and Third Team All-Region honoree. The Hawks ranked second in the league in team defense (1.00 goal per game) while leading the circuit in saves (136).

Ferguson is in her fourth year on East Hill. She served as an assistant coach for two years, helping the squad start the 2019 season on a four-game winning streak, before becoming a volunteer assistant. She joined the Big Red after a three-year stint as an assistant coach at Buffalo State and serving as a head coach of ECNL teams at the WNY Flash Academy. Before joining the WNY Flash Academy, Ferguson spent seven years with Lonestar Soccer Club, one of the largest and most successful youth soccer clubs in the country.
