### **PUCK DROP**

The Cornell men's hockey team continues its season-opening, six-game road trip this weekend when the Big Red returns to the Eastern time zone this weekend to open ECAC Hockey play against Princeton and No. 7 Quinnipiac, the ECAC preseason favorite.

### LAST TIME OUT

- No. 19 Minnesota Duluth swept Cornell's season-opening series with 3-2 and 4-2 victories over the Big Red at Amsoil Arena in Duluth, Minn., last weekend.
- 🐻 Senior BEN BERARD, junior JACK O'LEARY, and freshmen SEAN DONALDSON and WINTER WALLAGE, scored for the Big Red in the two-game series.
- Junior GABRIEL SEGER went 24-of-34 in the faceoff circle, posting a .706 success rate. Seger's 12.0 faceoff wins per game is currently tied with Yale's William Dineen for the highest average in ECAC Hockey. In the series finale, Seger won 16 faceoffs which is tied for the second-most faceoff wins by an ECAC player this season (Quinnipiac's Skyler Brind'Amour – 17 vs. LIU on Oct. 9).
- 🥌 The pair of losses in the opening weekend marked just the fifth time in the 27 seasons of competition under Cornell head coach MIKE SCHAFER '86, that the Big Red has opened its season with a 0-2-0 record.

### **ECAC OPENING WEEKEND**

- Since MIKE SCHAFER '86 took over as the head coach of the Cornell men's hockey team prior to the 1995-96 season, Cornell has excelled in its first weekend of ECAC Hockey play. Over the previous 26 seasons of competition, the Big Red is 38-10-3 (.775) in the first weekend of league play.
- 🝊 Over the last four years, Cornell has a 7-1-0 mark in the first weekend of ECAC play. The lone setback in the stretch came to Harvard on Nov. 5, 2021.
- Cornell has at least one win in the opening weekend of ECAC Hockey play in 25 of the 26 seasons with Schafer behind the bench. The lone year the Big Red went winless in the first weekend was 2016-17 when Cornell tied with Dartmouth and lost to Harvard.

### **ONE WIN AWAY**

- MIKE SCHAFER '86, the Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Hockey, is one victory away from reaching a historic milestone.
- With his next victory, Schafer would notch his 500th career head coaching victory, becoming the 18th Division I hockey head coach to reach 500 career wins.
- Schafer would become just the seventh active head coach - the fourth at the Division I level to log 500 career coaching victories. The other Division I coaches include Mercyhurst's Rick Gotkin (589), ECAC Hockey counterpart Rand Pecknold of Quinnipiac (584), and Notre Dame's Jeff Jackson Wayne Wilson 415 292 77 ...578 (562).
- Schafer's 499 career wins stand as the most by a Cornell hockey head coach and is the most by any active head coach of Cornell's 37 varsity sports.

### **ECAC PRESEASON POLL**

**SECAC** Hockey announced Sept. 21 during its annual Media Day call that the Cornell hockey team was slated to finish fourth.

Quinnipiac was dubbed the preseason favorite after receiving eight first-place votes, finishing with 118 points. Harvard received the remaining four first-place votes, logging a 109-point total. Clarkson was the only other program to have a point total over the century mark (105).

Cornell followed Clarkson with its 90 points, while Colgate finished in fifth with 77 points. RPI (70), St. Lawrence (57), and Union (45), Dartmouth (43), Yale (32), Brown (26), and Princeton (20) rounded out the poll.

### LEADERSHIP GROUP ANNOUNCED

Senior defensemen SAM MALINSKI and TRAVIS MITCHELL were named co-captains, while fifthyear forward MAX ANDREEV and senior forward MATT STIENBURG were tabbed co-alternate captains on Sent. 29

All four players will be assuming leadership roles for the first time with the Cornell hockey program.

### SHANE'S STRONG START

Sophomore goaltender IAN SHANE has had a strong start to the season so far, posting a 2.32 goals-against average (fifth in ECAC Hockey) and his .927 save percentage is third among ECAC netminders, trailing Yale's Nathan Reid (.961) and Brown's Mathieu Caron (.941).

Shane stopped 29 of 32 Minnesota Duluth shots last weekend in the series opener, before saving all nine shot attempts he faced in the third period after relieving freshman goaltender REMINGTON KEOPPLE in the series finale.

### **LUCK OF THE DRAW**

Junior forward GABRIEL SEGER excelled in the faceoff circle in his first weekend with Cornell. He went 24-of-34 (.706) last weekend in Minnesota, registering 12.0 faceoff wins per game, which is tied with Yale's William Dineen for the ECAC lead.

### ON THE PLUS SIDE...

Saturday's matchup between Cornell and Quinnipiac will feature myriad of players who help benefit their team's offense.

Of the top 10 active ECAC Hockey players in plus-minus rating, eight of the players will be playing at M&T Bank Arena in Hamden, Conn. Quinnipiac's Zach Metsa (No. 1 - +62), Ethan de Jong (No. 2 - +49), and Michael Lombardi (No. 3- +47) assume the top three positions. Cornell defensemen TRAVIS MITCHELL (No. 4 - +34) and SAM MALINSKI (No. 5 -+33) are right behind the Quinnipiac trio, while forward MAX **ANDREEV** (No. 6 - +32) is right behind the Big Red blueline tandem.

Mitchell's figure is the second-highest by a defenseman, trailing Metsa's ECAC Hockey-leading total. Malinski and Andreev are both third in their respective positions.

🥌 livari Räsänen (T-7th — +29) and Jayden Lee (No. 10 — +28) are the other two Bobcat players appearing in the top 10. Clarkson's Mathieu Gosselin (7th - +31) and Harvard's Henry Thrun (T-8th -+29) are the others on the list.

### FIRST TEAM RETURNERS

Senior defender SAM MALINSKI is one of six returning players who have already received first-team honors from ECAC Hockey. Malinski is the lone Big Red representative on the list, while Clarkson's Alex Campbell and Mathieu Gosselin, Quinnipiac's Zach Metsa and Yaniv Perets, and St. Lawrence's Cameron Buhl (in 2020-21) are the others on the list.

The six ECAC representatives are tied with Atlantic Hockey for the most returning first-team. selections for their respective conferences. Three of the six Atlantic Hockey first-team players have since transferred to different programs.

### **WELCOME BACK!**

Cornell returns 81 percent of its goals scored from last season, which was the eighth-highest percentage by a Division I program entering the 2022-23 season.

Air Force led the nation, returning all of its scoring from the 2021-22 season. Penn State (93 percent) had the secondhighest total, while Dartmouth (86 percent), Northeastern (85 percent), Sacred Heart and Yale (84 percent), and St. Lawrence (83 percent) were ahead of the Big Red.

Colorado College and North Dakota round out the top 10 with their 80 percent totals.

Of the seven programs ahead of Cornell, the Big Red are slated to play four of the teams this season (Dartmouth, Sacred Heart, St. Lawrence, and Yale).

### **TOWERING OVER THE COMPETITION**

According to CollegeHockeyInc.com's preseason media kit, Cornell entered the 2022-23 season tied for being the second-tallest Division I program.

The Big Red's average 6-foot-1 height was tied with Lindenwood. Both programs trail Vermont, who edges the Big Red and Lions by a mere six inches.

The Big Red have a two-inch advantage over Clarkson for the tallest ECAC Hockey program. The Golden Knights are tied with Boston University for the fourth-tallest Division I program.

Sophomore forward ONDREJ PSENICKA, who stands at 6-foot-6, is tied with Harvard forward Ryan Drkulec, Quinnipiac goaltender Chase Clark, and RPI forward Sutter Muzzatti for being the third-tallest player in ECAC Hockey this season.

- Jacob Quillan has a team-leading seven points (two goals, five assists) over the Bobcats' six games so far. Ethan de Jong has a Quinnipiac-best three goals on the year.
- Sample Yaniv Perets, the reigning ECAC Hockey Goaltender of the Year, has started all six games between the pipes for Quinnipiac, posting a 3-1-2 record with a 2.47 goals-against average and a .909 save percentage.
- Quinnipiac enters the weekend ranking in the top 10 in scoring margin (+1.33) and scoring offense (3.83) this season.

## **MIKE SCHAFER '86**

Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Ice Hockey 27th Season as Head Coach • 35th Season at Cornell

The longest-tenured head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, MIKE SCHAFER '86, enters his 27th season at the helm of the Cornell men's hockey program.

When Schafer returned to his alma mater in the summer of 1995 to become Cornell's 12th head coach in men's hockey history, Schafer's goal was to bring the Big Red to a position of national prominence.

Already the winningest head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, Schafer has accomplished that objective with his 499-271-103 record. His 499 wins rank fourth among active Division I coaches and his .631 win percentage is good for fifth among active Division I coaches.

Schafer has guided the Big Red to 12 NCAA Tournament appearances and a berth to the 2003 NCAA Frozen Four — the program's first since 1980. That year, Cornell set a school record for wins (30), finishing with one more victory than the 1969-70 national championship squad, who went undefeated (29-0-0). The 2002-03 team's 19-2-1 record in ECAC Hockey play was Cornell's best mark in league play since 1969-70 when Cornell was 21-0 in league action.

In 2020, Schafer was named a co-winner of the Spencer Penrose Award, given to the nation's top head coach. It was the first time Schafer won the award after being a finalist on five occasions after being named ECAC Hockey's Coach of the Year.

The Big Red have been regularly ranked among the nation's elite during Schafer's tenure, including being named No. 1 in both the USCHO.com and the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls at the time the 2019-20 postseason was halted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Cornell has claimed five Whitelaw Cup (ECAC Hockey tournament titles), which surpassed the legendary NED HARKNESS for the most in program history. Schafer has also led the Big Red to three Cleary Cups (ECAC's top regular-season team) in three of the last four years of competition.

In 2002-03, Schafer led the Big Red to the NCAA Frozen Four, setting a school record with 30 wins, one better than the 1969-70 squad who went 29-0-0. Cornell's 19-2-1 mark in ECAC Hockey in 2002-03 was Cornell's best since the 1969-70 team went 21-0 in league play.

Over his career, Schafer has coached 10 different players to First Team All-America status 11 times, seven Ivy League Players of the Year, 5 ECAC Hockey Ken Dryden Award winners (league's best goaltender), five ECAC Hockey Rookies of the Year, and five Ivy Rookies of the Year, and three ECAC Hockey Players of the Year.

A native of Durham, Ontario, Schafer played junior hockey with the Guelph Jr. A Holody Platers, who were finalists in the Centennial Cup for the National Championship in 1982.

Schafer and his wife, Diane, have two sons, Luke and John '18, and a daughter, Michelle.

## **BEN SYER**

## 11th Season as Associate Head Coach; 12th Season at Cornell Western Ontario '98

Serving as the Big Red's recruiting director and manager of the team's vaunted defensive

unit, BEN SYER's efforts were perhaps no more celebrated than during the 2017-18 season. He helped Cornell lead the nation in team defense with a paltry 1.58 goals-against average and was named the winner of the American Hockey Coaches Association's 2018 Terry Flanagan Award.

One of the AHCA's major annual awards, the Terry Flanagan Award is presented to the assistant coach whose career body of work best honors that of the award's name sake.

"He can hold court with a group of assistant coaches on the road with the best of them," said MIKE SCHAFER, adding that this is the first time he's nominated anyone for a major AHCA award in his 23-year tenure at the helm of the Big Red. "He knows the elder statesmen, but he also knows the young guys like Terry did. He would make sure to say hello to everyone in the rink and lend a helping hand to young assistants. I admired Terry for this. He and his family are of the highest character, upfront and honest."

Syer joined Cornell in June 2011 as an assistant coach, then was promoted to associate head coach the following summer. He previously served as associate head coach during his 12 seasons at Quinnipiac under head coach Rand Pecknold. During that run, the Bobcats posted a 242-168-46 record with one NCAA tournament appearance (2002) and nine 20-win seasons.

A native of Kitchener, Ontario, Syer arrived at Quinnipiac after serving one season as an assistant coach at Ohio University. A 1998 graduate of Western Ontario, Syer earned a bachelor's degree in urban development. He earned his master's degree in physical education with a concentration in athletic administration in 2000.



## **SEAN FLANAGAN**

## **Seventh Season as Assistant Coach**St. Lawrence '10

Flanagan enters his seventh season as an assistant coach on head coach MIKE SCHAFER's

staff. During his previous six seasons, Flanagan helped guide the Big Red to post a 108-38-19 record, good for a .712 win percentage. In his first three years on Schafer's staff, Flanagan aided Cornell in going 3-for-3 in advancing to the NCAA Tournament (and likely would have been 4-for-4, if the 2019-20 season had not ended prematurely). Prior to arriving on East Hill prior to the 2016-17 season, Flanagan made a couple of stops after his four-year playing career at St. Lawrence. After playing professionally in the ECHL with the Las Vegas Wranglers and Quad City Mallards, he became an assistant coach at Division III Hobart from 2012-15. While working under former Cornell assistant coach Mark Taylor, he helped

build a team who won the ECAC West titles in 2015 and 2016, leading the Statesmen to NCAA Tournament appearances. After Hobart, Flanagan spent one season as the Director of Hockey Operations at UMass Lowell, during the 2015-16 season. Flanagan is no stranger to ECAC Hockey, as he played 121 career games with St. Lawrence up to the 2010-11 season, where he racked up 12 goals and 40 assists for 52 points, helping the Saints advance to the league's championship weekend twice over his four years with the Saints. Flanagan graduated from St. Lawrence with a bachelor of arts degree in history with a minor in sports studies and exercise sciences in 2010 before receiving his master of education degree from St. Lawrence the following year.



### **MITCH STEPHENS**

Fourth Season as Volunteer Assistant Coach; SUNY Geneseo '07

Stephens returns to Cornell after serving as an assistant coach at Geneseo for five years. In his time behind the bench with his alma mater, Stephens helped the Knights win two

SUNYAC conference championships (2016, 2018) and make three NCAA Tournament appearances (2014, 2016, and 2018), including two trips to the national semifinals. As a senior, Stephens was named runner-up for USCHO Division III Player of the Year, an AHCA Division III First Team, and All-America selection, while being a finalist for the AHCA Sid Watson Memorial Award as the NCAA Division III Player of the Year.



**BEN RUSSELL** 

First Season as Director of Hockey Operations; Cornell '20

Russell rejoined the Cornell men's hockey program in Aug. 2022 to serve as the team's Director of Hockey Operations, after spending the last two seasons as an assistant coach

at St. Olaf College, a Minnesota-based Division III school. At St. Olaf, Russell helped the 2021-22 squad to a Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) tournament title and an NCAA Tournament appearance. While attending Cornell for his undergraduate studies, Russell served as an Assistant Director of Hockey Operations, helping coordinate video, analyzing film, and preparing scouting reports, while incorporating advanced analytics into game preparation.





# MACDONALD '15 BECOMES THIRD CORNELLIAN TO HOIST STANLEY CUP

ITHACA, N.Y. (JUNE 26, 2022) — JACOB MacDONALD '15 became the third player in Cornell history to lift the Stanley Cup when his Colorado Avalanche defeated the Tampa Bay Lightning, 2-1, in Game 6 of the 2022 Stanley Cup Playoffs at Amalie Arena in Tampa, Fla.

MacDonald joined six-time winner KEN DRYDEN and three-time champion JOE NIEUWENDYK in hoisting the oldest existing trophy awarded to a professional sports franchise in North America.

Since graduating from Cornell, MacDonald has played in the ECHL with the Elmira Jackals and Toledo Walleye, the AHL with the Springfield Falcons, Albany and Binghamton Devils, Springfield Thunderbirds and Colorado Eagles around NHL stints with

the Florida Panthers in 2018-19 and the Avalanche in both 2020-21 and 2021-22.

He played eight regular-season games with Colorado this season and has two goals and eight assists in 43 regular season NHL games.

MacDonald was called up from Colorado of the AHL in early June to provide the Avalanche with some additional depth at the defenseman position.

The three-year starter for the Big Red accumulated four goals and 17 assists for 21 points in 104 career games. His plus-6 rating as a senior ranked second on the club.


