PUCK DROP

The Cornell men's hockey team concludes a three-game homestand at Lynah Rink this evening when the Big Red takes on Sacred Heart at 7 p.m.

WEEKEND REWIND

- Cornell scored five goals in both of its games this past weekend, aiding the Big Red to a pair of victories over Ivy League opponents Yale and Brown.
- The five-goal outputs in both games marked the first time Cornell had scored at least five times in each of its first two home games in a season since posting consecutive 7-1 victories over Army and Sacred Heart on Oct. 29 and 30, 2004.
- Freshman SEAN DONALDSON had a team-high four points, all of which came on assists, in the weekend sweep. Senior ZACH TUPKER (two goals, one assist), sophomore KYLE PENNEY (one goal, two assists), and freshman DALTON BANCROFT (one goal, two assists) each had three-point weekends.
- © Cornell excelled at the faceoff circle on the weekend, winning 72 of the 119 draws taken (60.5 percent). Junior GABRIEL SEGER had a team-best .760 win percentage on draws (19-of-25) in the pair of contests. Tupker had a Big Red-leading 21 wins at the faceoff dot.
- The Big Red also did not waste their power-play opportunities on the weekend, going 4-for-6 with the man advantage. Cornell went 2-for-3 on the power play in both games.

PRE-TURKEY DAY TILT

- Tonight's game against Sacred Heart will be the 14th time in program history that the Big Red will be playing on the Tuesday before Thanksgiving.
- Of the 13 previous instances, eight have been during the tenure of MIKE SCHAFER '86. Cornell is 5-2-1 in those games and is unbeaten in its last five games under the circumstances (4-0-1).
- It will the fourth consecutive time Cornell is squaring off against an Atlantic Hockey opponent on the Tuesday leading up to Thanksgiving. The previous three meetings were against fellow Empire State program Niagara (2011, 2013, 2017).

LYNAH FAITHFUL

- Playing at Lynah Rink in front of the Lynah Faithful has favored Cornell since MIKE SCHAFER '86 took over as head coach prior to the 1995-96 season.
- Under Schafer, Cornell has a 263-102-48 record at Lynah Rink, good for a .695 win percentage. According to data from CollegeHockeyNews.com's database, the Big Red has the sixth-best home win percentage over the last 28-plus seasons.
- Only Michigan (.751), North Dakota (.725), Quinnipiac (.720), Boston College (.713), and Denver (.703) have higher win percentages on home ice than the Big Red.
- Since the beginning of the 2017-18 season, Cornell has been one of the more hostile places to play college hockey. Cornell has a 47-12-6 (.769) home record over the last five-plus seasons, which is the second-highest home win percentage in Division I hockey. Minnesota State has a 104-point lead on the Big Red with its .880 win percentage (90-11-3) on home ice.
- Cornell, over its last 33 games at Lynah Rink, has a 24-4-5 record dating back to the 2018-19 season.

With the Big Red's 3-1 victory over Princeton, Schafer notched his 500th career head coaching victory, becoming the 21st Division I hockey head coach to reach 500 career wins.

Schafer is the seventh active head coach, and the fourth at the Division I level, to register 500 career coaching victories.

The other Division I coaches with at least 500 career wins include Mercyhurst's Rick Gotkin (591), ECAC Hockey counterpart Rand Pecknold of Quinnipiac (590), and Notre Dame's Jeff Jackson (564).

KEOPPLE EARNS FIRST WIN

Freshman goaltender REMINGTON KEOPPLE earned his first collegiate victory on Saturday against Brown in the Big Red's 5-1 victory.

🥌 Keopple stopped 17 of the 18 shots in the victory — including the final 15 he faced — in the Big Red's Ivy League foe, becoming the first Cornell netminder to record his first collegiate win at Lynah Rink since JOE HOWE last year against Alaska Fairbanks (Oct. 30, 2021).

ECAC PRESEASON POLL

ECAC Hockey announced Sept. 21 during its annual Media Day call that the Cornell hockey team was slated to finish fourth.

Quinnipiac was dubbed the preseason favorite after receiving eight first-place votes, finishing with 118 points. Harvard received the remaining four first-place votes, logging a 109-point total. Clarkson was the only other program to have a point total over the century mark (105).

Cornell followed Clarkson with its 90 points, while Colgate finished in fifth with 77 points. RPI (70), St. Lawrence (57), and Union (45), Dartmouth (43), Yale (32), Brown (26), and Princeton (20) rounded out the poll.

LEADERSHIP GROUP ANNOUNCED

Senior defensemen SAM MALINSKI and TRAVIS MITCHELL were named co-captains, while fifth-year forward MAX ANDREEV and senior forward MATT STIENBURG were tabbed co-alternate captains on Sept. 29.

All four players are assuming leadership roles for the first time with the Cornell hockey program.

PUTTING THE BODY ON THE LINE

Cornell defensemen TRAVIS MITCHELL and HANK KEMPF both rank in the top 10 in ECAC Hockey for blocked shots per game.

Kempf is tied for fourth with his average of two blocked shots per game. Mitchell's 15 shots over his eight appearances is tied for eighth among ECAC players with Yale's Kieran O'Hearn (1.88).

The Big Red is one of four ECAC Hockey programs to have multiple players in the top 10 in blocked shots, joined by fellow Ivy League opponents Brown, Princeton, and Yale.

ECAC ACTIVE LEADERS

After spending his first three seasons at Union — a fellow ECAC school - junior GABRIEL SEGER has the fourthmost faceoff wins by an active player in the conference (602). Quinnipiac's Skyler Brind'Amour has the most with 1,021. Senior forward MAX ANDREEV has won 525 draws, ranking as the sixth-most faceoffs won by an active ECAC player.

The tandem of Seger and Andreev are the second pair of ECAC Hockey teammates to have least 500 career faceoff wins, joining Quinnipiac (Brind'Amour and Desi Burgart).

Sophomore goaltender IAN SHANE has the second-lowest goals-against average (1.76) and the second-highest save percentage (.929) by an active ECAC Hockey goaltender. Quinnipiac's Yaniv Perets has the lead in both categories.

Cornell defensemen TRAVIS MITCHELL and SAM MALINSKI, along with Andreev, rank in the top 10 in highest plus-minus figures among active ECAC players.

Malinski and Mitchell are currently tied for the fifthhighest plus-minus rating (plus-35). Both players have the second-highest plus-minus rating by an active ECAC Hockey blueliner. The tandem trails Quinnipiac's Zach Metsa, who has an ECAC Hockey-leading plus-67 rating.

Of the forwards currently listed in the top 10, Andreev has the fourth-highest rating by a forward. Quinnipiac's Ethan de Jong (plus-51) and Michael Lombardi (plus-50), and Clarkson's Mathieu Gosselin (plus-39) having higher career plus-minus ratings.

SCOUTING SACRED HEART

Sacred Heart enters tonight's game with a 6-5-1 overall record and a 6-3-1 mark in Atlantic Hockey Association action.

After starting the year with a 6-1-0 record, the Pioneers have been on a four-game winless skid, including dropping its last three games.

Neil Shea leads Sacred Heart in scoring with 12 points in as many games (four goals, eight assists). Blake Humphrey (four goals, six assists) and Conner Hutchison (one goal, nine assists) also have double-digit point totals for the Pioneers.

Luke Lush has started 10 of his 11 appearances this season, logging a 5-4-1 record with a 2.42 goals-against average and a .906 save percentage. Justin Robbins has started the remaining two games for Sacred Heart, posting a 1-1-0 record with a 4.20 goals-against average and a .833 save percentage.

SERIES HISTORY

Tonight will be just the fourth meeting all-time between Sacred Heart and Cornell, and will be the first between the two programs since Jan. 6, 2007. The Big Red trails in the series, 1-2-0, but has outscored the Pioneers, 11-8, thanks to a 7-1 victory on Oct. 30, 2004.

In the Big Red's six-goal victory during the 2004-05 season, future NHLer MATT MOULSON scored two goals and was one of five players to register two-point nights for Cornell. Goaltender DAVID MCKEE made 24 saves in the victory.

TIM REGO and Brendan Kennette were teammates on the Brooks Bandits during the 2020-21 season.

MAX ANDREEV and Todd Goehring played on the New Jersey Junior Titans during the 2016-17 campaign.

JACK LAGERSTROM played with Andrius Kulbus-Marino and Chikara Hanzawa on the 2019-20 Tri-City Storm. Kyler Kovich joined the Tri-City Storm in 2020-21, playing with Conner Hutchison.

MIKE SCHAFER '86

Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Ice Hockey 28th Season as Head Coach • 35th Season at Cornell

The longest-tenured head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, MIKE SCHAFER '86, enters his 28th season at the helm of the Cornell men's hockey program.

When Schafer returned to his alma mater in the summer of 1995 to become Cornell's 12th head coach in men's hockey history, Schafer's goal was to bring the Big Red to a position of national prominence.

Already the winningest head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, Schafer has accomplished that objective with his 503-275-103 record. His 503 wins rank fourth among active Division I coaches and his .629 win percentage is good for sixth among active Division I coaches.

Schafer has guided the Big Red to 12 NCAA Tournament appearances and a berth to the 2003 NCAA Frozen Four — the program's first since 1980. That year, Cornell set a school record for wins (30), finishing with one more victory than the 1969-70 national championship squad, who went undefeated (29-0-0). The 2002-03 team's 19-2-1 record in ECAC Hockey play was Cornell's best mark in league play since 1969-70 when Cornell was 21-0 in league action.

In 2020, Schafer was named a co-winner of the Spencer Penrose Award, given to the nation's top head coach. It was the first time Schafer won the award after being a finalist on five occasions after being named ECAC Hockey's Coach of the Year.

The Big Red have been regularly ranked among the nation's elite during Schafer's tenure, including being named No. 1 in both the USCHO.com and the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls at the time the 2019-20 postseason was halted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Cornell has claimed five Whitelaw Cup (ECAC Hockey tournament titles), which surpassed the legendary NED HARKNESS for the most in program history. Schafer has also led the Big Red to three Cleary Cups (ECAC's top regular-season team) in three of the last four years of competition.

In 2002-03, Schafer led the Big Red to the NCAA Frozen Four, setting a school record with 30 wins, one better than the 1969-70 squad who went 29-0-0. Cornell's 19-2-1 mark in ECAC Hockey in 2002-03 was Cornell's best since the 1969-70 team went 21-0 in league play.

Over his career, Schafer has coached 10 different players to First Team All-America status 11 times, seven Ivy League Players of the Year, 5 ECAC Hockey Ken Dryden Award winners (league's best goaltender), five ECAC Hockey Rookies of the Year, and five Ivy Rookies of the Year, and three ECAC Hockey Players of the Year.

A native of Durham, Ontario, Schafer played junior hockey with the Guelph Jr. A Holody Platers, who were finalists in the Centennial Cup for the National Championship in 1982.

Schafer and his wife, Diane, have two sons, Luke and John '18, and a daughter, Michelle.

BEN SYER

11th Season as Associate Head Coach; 12th Season at Cornell Western Ontario '98

Serving as the Big Red's recruiting director and manager of the team's vaunted defensive

unit, BEN SYER's efforts were perhaps no more celebrated than during the 2017-18 season. He helped Cornell lead the nation in team defense with a paltry 1.58 goals-against average and was named the winner of the American Hockey Coaches Association's 2018 Terry Flanagan Award.

One of the AHCA's major annual awards, the Terry Flanagan Award is presented to the assistant coach whose career body of work best honors that of the award's name sake.

"He can hold court with a group of assistant coaches on the road with the best of them," said MIKE SCHAFER, adding that this is the first time he's nominated anyone for a major AHCA award in his 23-year tenure at the helm of the Big Red. "He knows the elder statesmen, but he also knows the young guys like Terry did. He would make sure to say hello to everyone in the rink and lend a helping hand to young assistants. I admired Terry for this. He and his family are of the highest character, upfront and honest."

Syer joined Cornell in June 2011 as an assistant coach, then was promoted to associate head coach the following summer. He previously served as associate head coach during his 12 seasons at Quinnipiac under head coach Rand Pecknold. During that run, the Bobcats posted a 242-168-46 record with one NCAA tournament appearance (2002) and nine 20-win seasons.

A native of Kitchener, Ontario, Syer arrived at Quinnipiac after serving one season as an assistant coach at Ohio University. A 1998 graduate of Western Ontario, Syer earned a bachelor's degree in urban development. He earned his master's degree in physical education with a concentration in athletic administration in 2000.



SEAN FLANAGAN

Seventh Season as Assistant CoachSt. Lawrence '10

Flanagan enters his seventh season as an assistant coach on head coach MIKE SCHAFER's

staff. During his previous six seasons, Flanagan helped guide the Big Red to post a 108-38-19 record, good for a .712 win percentage. In his first three years on Schafer's staff, Flanagan aided Cornell in going 3-for-3 in advancing to the NCAA Tournament (and likely would have been 4-for-4, if the 2019-20 season had not ended prematurely). Prior to arriving on East Hill prior to the 2016-17 season, Flanagan made a couple of stops after his four-year playing career at St. Lawrence. After playing professionally in the ECHL with the Las Vegas Wranglers and Quad City Mallards, he became an assistant coach at Division III Hobart from 2012-15. While working under former Cornell assistant coach Mark Taylor, he helped

build a team who won the ECAC West titles in 2015 and 2016, leading the Statesmen to NCAA Tournament appearances. After Hobart, Flanagan spent one season as the Director of Hockey Operations at UMass Lowell, during the 2015-16 season. 
BEN RUSSELL

ITHACA, N.Y. (JUNE 26, 2022) — JACOB MacDONALD '15 became the third player in Cornell history to lift the Stanley Cup when his Colorado Avalanche defeated the Tampa Bay Lightning, 2-1, in Game 6 of the 2022 Stanley Cup Playoffs at Amalie Arena in Tampa, Fla.

MacDonald joined six-time winner KEN DRYDEN and three-time champion JOE NIEUWENDYK in hoisting the oldest existing trophy awarded to a professional sports franchise in North America.

Since graduating from Cornell, MacDonald has played in the ECHL with the Elmira Jackals and Toledo Walleye, the AHL with the Springfield Falcons, Albany and Binghamton Devils, Springfield Thunderbirds and Colorado Eagles around NHL stints with

the Florida Panthers in 2018-19 and the Avalanche in both 2020-21 and 2021-22.

He played eight regular-season games with Colorado this season and has two goals and eight assists in 43 regular season NHL games.

MacDonald was called up from Colorado of the AHL in early June to provide the Avalanche with some additional depth at the defenseman position.

The three-year starter for the Big Red accumulated four goals and 17 assists for 21 points in 104 career games. His plus-6 rating as a senior ranked second on the club.
