PUCK DROP

The Cornell men's hockey team heads to the Big Apple to play No. 6-ranked UConn this evening in the fifth implementation of The Frozen Apple at Madison Square Garden. Puck drop between the Huskies and Big Red is slated for 8 p.m. from midtown Manhattan.

LAST TIME OUT

Sophomores **KYLE PENNEY** and **SULLIVAN MACK** scored third-period goals to avenge a 1-0 deficit to lead Cornell to a 2-1 victory over Sacred Heart at Lynah Rink on Tuesday.

The victory was Cornell's third in a row, as the Big Red have won three of its last four and four of its last six games.

Fellow sophomore **IAN SHANE** made 17 saves in the victory, improving to 4-3-0 on the year.

Cornell improved to 6-0-1 in its last seven non-conference home games and is 15-2-1 over its last 18 such games, dating back to the start of the 2015-16 campaign.

BACK IN THE BIG APPLE

Cornell will be playing its 27th all-time game at Madison Square Garden this evening – the 19th at its current location. The Big Red holds an all-time record of 16-8-2 at the World's Most Famous Arena, which includes a 5-1-1 mark in its last seven games played at the venue.

Six different players scored for Cornell in its 6-4 victory over Boston University last year at Madison Square Garden in the biennial Red Hot Hockey game between the Terriers and Big Red.

SAM MALINSKI and **BRENDEN LOCKE** each registered multi-point nights for the victorious Big Red, registering a goal and an assist. Goaltender **JOE HOWE** stopped 27 shots in the win.

Cornell is 3-1 all-time in the Frozen Apple, defeating Michigan (5-1) in 2012 before posting consecutive 3-1 victories over Penn State (2014) and New Hampshire (2016). Harvard won the last Frozen Apple contest, 4-1, in 2018.

SCHAFER REACHES MILESTONE

MIKE SCHAFER '86, the Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Hockey, reached a historic milestone on Nov. 4 at Hobey Baker Memorial Rink in Princeton, N.J.

With the Big Red's 3-1 victory over Princeton, Schafer notched his 500th career head coaching victory, becoming the 21st Division I hockey head coach to reach 500 career wins.

Schafer is the seventh active head coach, and the fourth at the Division I level, to register 500 career coaching victories.

The other Division I coaches with at least 500 career wins include Mercyhurst's Rick Gotkin (591), ECAC Hockey counterpart Rand Pecknold of Quinnipiac (590), and Notre Dame's Jeff Jackson (564).

Schafer's 504 career wins stand as the most by a Cornell hockey head coach and is the most by any active head coach of Cornell's 37 varsity sports.

DONALDSON EARNS WEEKLY HONOR

Freshman forward **SEAN DONALDSON** was named ECAC Hockey's Rookie of the Week on Monday morning, the conference announced.

Donaldson recorded a team-high four points in the Big Red's pair of victories of Yale and Brown last weekend. The Vancouver, British Columbia, native registered a pair of two-assist games for Cornell.

FINDING THE SCORESHEET

👤 Sophomores **JACK O'BRIEN** and **SULLIVAN MACK**, and freshmen **SEAN DONALDSON** and **DALTON BANCROFT** enter tonight's game riding three-game point streaks, which are career longs for the Big Red quartet.

👤 O'Leary has points in four of his five games played this season. He and Mack both have one goal and two assists during their respective three-game point streaks.

👤 Donaldson has registered five assists over his last three games, which includes a pair of two-assist games against ECAC Hockey and Ivy League rivals Yale and Brown last weekend.

👤 Bancroft has four points (one goal, three assists) over his last three games.

POWER PLAY HEATING UP

👤 Cornell took advantage of its power-play situations last weekend, going 4-for-6 with the man advantage. The Big Red has scored on four of its last six power-play opportunities, following Tuesday's 0-for-1 outing against Sacred Heart.

👤 The four power-play goals last weekend marked the first time Cornell logged at least four goals with a man advantage since the last weekend of regular-season play in 2019-20 (5).

KEOPPLE EARNS FIRST WIN

👤 Freshman goaltender **REMINGTON KEOPPLE** earned his first collegiate victory on Saturday against Brown in the Big Red's 5-1 victory.

👤 Keopple stopped 17 of the 18 shots in the victory — including the final 15 he faced — in the Big Red's Ivy League foe, becoming the first Cornell netminder to record his first collegiate win at Lynah Rink since **JOE HOWE** last year against Alaska Fairbanks (Oct. 30, 2021).

DOMINATING THE SECOND PERIOD

👤 Cornell has excelled in the second period this season, outscoring its opponents 11-4 in the middle frame this season.

👤 Opponents have fared better in the other two periods, outscoring the Big Red by a slim 15-14 advantage.

👤 In addition to its plus-7 goal differential in the second period, the Big Red have outshot its opponents 108-54 in the second period this season. In the other two periods combined, Cornell has just plus-15 advantage in shots on goal (154-139).

ECAC PRESEASON POLL

- ECAC Hockey announced Sept. 21 during its annual Media Day call that the Cornell hockey team was slated to finish fourth.
- Quinnipiac was dubbed the preseason favorite after receiving eight first-place votes, finishing with 118 points. Harvard received the remaining four first-place votes, logging a 109-point total. Clarkson was the only other program to have a point total over the century mark (105).
- Cornell followed Clarkson with its 90 points, while Colgate finished in fifth with 77 points. RPI (70), St. Lawrence (57), and Union (45), Dartmouth (43), Yale (32), Brown (26), and Princeton (20) rounded out the poll.

LEADERSHIP GROUP ANNOUNCED

- Senior defensemen **SAM MALINSKI** and **TRAVIS MITCHELL** were named co-captains, while fifth-year forward **MAX ANDREEV** and senior forward **MATT STIENBURG** were tabbed co-alternate captains on Sept. 29.
- All four players are assuming leadership roles for the first time with the Cornell hockey program.

TOP 10 SHOWDOWN

- Cornell and UConn rank in the top 10 nationally in a pair of categories entering this weekend's matchup at Madison Square Garden.
- UConn has one of the best penalty kill units in the country, successfully killing 61 of its 66 man-down situations. The Big Red is tied with Northeastern for the eighth-best penalty kill (85.7 percent – 30-of-35).
- The Big Red enters the weekend with the eighth-best scoring defense, yielding just over two goals per game (2.11). UConn is right behind Cornell with its 2.13 goals allowed per game.

SHANE'S SHOW

- Sophomore goaltender **IAN SHANE** has been strong between the pipes for Cornell so far this year, posting a 1.77 goals-against average and a .921 save percentage.
- Shane's 1.77 goals-against average so far on the year ranks second in ECAC Hockey, trailing Harvard's Mitchell Gibson. The .921 save percentage by the Manhattan Beach, Calif., native ranks fifth in ECAC Hockey.

ECAC ACTIVE LEADERS

- After spending his first three seasons at Union – a fellow ECAC school – Seger has the fourth-most faceoff wins by an active player in the conference (602). Quinnipiac's Skyler Brind'Amour has the most with 1,021. Andreev also ranks in the top 10 with his 534 faceoff wins, ranking sixth.
- The tandem of Seger and Andreev are the second pair of ECAC Hockey teammates to have least 500 career faceoff wins, joining Quinnipiac (Brind'Amour and Desi Burgart).
- Andreev also has the fifth-most assists by an active ECAC player. de Jong also leads this category with his 68 career helpers.
- Sophomore goaltender **IAN SHANE** has the second-lowest goals-against average (1.73) and the second-highest save percentage (.929) by an active ECAC Hockey goaltender. Quinnipiac's Yaniv Perets has the lead in both categories.
- Cornell is one of two ECAC programs to have at least three players ranking in the top 10 in career plus-minus rating. **TRAVIS MITCHELL** (5th – +36), **SAM MALINSKI** (6th – +35), and Andreev (8th – +32) are the Big Red trio currently in the top 10. Quinnipiac has four players, including the top three.

WELCOME BACK!

Cornell returns 81 percent of its goals scored from last season, which was the eighth-highest percentage by a Division I program entering the 2022-23 season.

Air Force led the nation, returning all of its scoring from the 2021-22 season. Penn State (93 percent) had the second-highest total, while Dartmouth (86 percent), Northeastern (85 percent), Sacred Heart and Yale (84 percent), and St. Lawrence (83 percent) were ahead of the Big Red.

Colorado College and North Dakota round out the top 10 with their 80 percent totals.

Of the seven programs ahead of Cornell, the Big Red are slated to play four of the teams this season (Dartmouth, Sacred Heart, St. Lawrence, and Yale).

TOWERING OVER THE COMPETITION

According to CollegeHockeyInc.com's preseason media kit, Cornell entered the 2022-23 season tied for being the second-tallest Division I program.

The Big Red's average 6-foot-1 height was tied with Lindenwood. Both programs trail Vermont, who edges the Big Red and Lions by a mere six inches.

The Big Red have a two-inch advantage over Clarkson for the tallest ECAC Hockey program. The Golden Knights are tied with Boston University for the fourth-tallest Division I program.

Sophomore forward **ONDREJ PSENICKA**, who stands at 6-foot-6, is tied with Harvard forward Ryan Drkulec, Quinnipiac goaltender Chase Clark, and RPI forward Sutter Muzzatti for being the third-tallest player in ECAC Hockey this season.

Dartmouth's Cooper Black (6-foot-8) and Quinnipiac's Noah Altman (6-foot-7) have listed heights taller than the quartet of 6-foot-6 players.

SCOUTING UCONN

- UConn enters tonight's game with a 10-2-3 overall record and a 7-2-2 mark in Hockey East play. The Huskies, in the most recent iteration of the USCHO.com and USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls, are ranked No. 6 nationally.
- Coming off a split of a home-and-home series with UMass Lowell last weekend, the Huskies have generated points in six of its last seven games, going 4-1-2 in the stretch.
- Ryan Tverberg has a team-leading 16 points (10 goals, six assists) in 15 games, and is one of six Huskies with 10-plus points on the year. Matthew Wood (five goals, seven assists), Andrew Lucas (one goal, 11 assists), Hudson Schandor (two goals, nine assists), Chase Bradley (six goals, four assists), and Justin Pearson (four goals, six assists) are the others.
- Goaltending duties have been split between Logan Terness (eight starts in 12 games) and Arsenii Sergeev (seven starts in eight games). Terness has a 1.45 goals-against average, which ranks third nationally, and a .947 save percentage that is second. Sergeev – a 2021 seventh-round draft pick by Calgary – has a 2.69 goals-against average and a .917 save percentage. Matt Pasquale (three games) and Ryan Keane (one game) have also spent time between the pipes for UConn this year.
- UConn totes one of the best penalty killing units in the nation, ranking third among Division I programs. The Huskies are 61-of-66 on the penalty kill this year, good for a .924 percentage. Only Harvard (22-of-23 – .957) and Ohio State (50-of-54 – .926) have higher figures.

SERIES HISTORY

- Tonight marks the first all-time meeting between UConn and Cornell. The Big Red will be playing its 71st all-time game against a Hockey East opponent since the conference was founded in 1984.
- Cornell is 29-34-7 all-time against Hockey East opposition. Over the Big Red's last 17 games against teams playing in Hockey East, Cornell has a 10-4-3 record.

MIKE SCHAFER '86

Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Ice Hockey
28th Season as Head Coach • 35th Season at Cornell

The longest-tenured head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, **MIKE SCHAFER '86**, enters his 28th season at the helm of the Cornell men's hockey program.

When Schafer returned to his alma mater in the summer of 1995 to become Cornell's 12th head coach in men's hockey history, Schafer's goal was to bring the Big Red to a position of national prominence.

Already the winningest head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, Schafer has accomplished that objective with his 504-275-103 record. His 504 wins rank fourth among active Division I coaches and his .630 win percentage is good for sixth among active Division I coaches.

Schafer has guided the Big Red to 12 NCAA Tournament appearances and a berth to the 2003 NCAA Frozen Four – the program's first since 1980. That year, Cornell set a school record for wins (30), finishing with one more victory than the 1969-70 national championship squad, who went undefeated (29-0-0). The 2002-03 team's 19-2-1 record in ECAC Hockey play was Cornell's best mark in league play since 1969-70 when Cornell was 21-0 in league action.

In 2020, Schafer was named a co-winner of the Spencer Penrose Award, given to the nation's top head coach. It was the first time Schafer won the award after being a finalist on five occasions after being named ECAC Hockey's Coach of the Year.

The Big Red have been regularly ranked among the nation's elite during Schafer's tenure, including being named No. 1 in both the USCHO.com and the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls at the time the 2019-20 postseason was halted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Cornell has claimed five Whitelaw Cup (ECAC Hockey tournament titles), which surpassed the legendary **NED HARKNESS** for the most in program history. Schafer has also led the Big Red to three Cleary Cups (ECAC's top regular-season team) in three of the last four years of competition.

In 2002-03, Schafer led the Big Red to the NCAA Frozen Four, setting a school record with 30 wins, one better than the 1969-70 squad who went 29-0-0. Cornell's 19-2-1 mark in ECAC Hockey in 2002-03 was Cornell's best since the 1969-70 team went 21-0 in league play.

Over his career, Schafer has coached 10 different players to First Team All-America status 11 times, seven Ivy League Players of the Year, 5 ECAC Hockey Ken Dryden Award winners (league's best goaltender), five ECAC Hockey Rookies of the Year, and five Ivy Rookies of the Year, and three ECAC Hockey Players of the Year.

A native of Durham, Ontario, Schafer played junior hockey with the Guelph Jr. A Hoolody Platers, who were finalists in the Centennial Cup for the National Championship in 1982.

Schafer and his wife, Diane, have two sons, Luke and John '18, and a daughter, Michelle.

Serving as the Big Red's recruiting director and manager of the team's vaunted defensive unit, **BEN SYER**'s efforts were perhaps no more celebrated than during the 2017-18 season. He helped Cornell lead the nation in team defense with a paltry 1.58 goals-against average and was named the winner of the American Hockey Coaches Association's 2018 Terry Flanagan Award.

One of the AHCA's major annual awards, the Terry Flanagan Award is presented to the assistant coach whose career body of work best honors that of the award's name sake.

"He can hold court with a group of assistant coaches on the road with the best of them," said **MIKE SCHAFFER**, adding that this is the first time he's nominated anyone for a major AHCA award in his 23-year tenure at the helm of the Big Red. "He knows the elder statesmen, but he also knows the young guys like Terry did. He would make sure to say hello

to everyone in the rink and lend a helping hand to young assistants. I admired Terry for this. He and his family are of the highest character, upfront and honest."

Syer joined Cornell in June 2011 as an assistant coach, then was promoted to associate head coach the following summer. He previously served as associate head coach during his 12 seasons at Quinnipiac under head coach Rand Pecknold. During that run, the Bobcats posted a 242-168-46 record with one NCAA tournament appearance (2002) and nine 20-win seasons.

A native of Kitchener, Ontario, Syer arrived at Quinnipiac after serving one season as an assistant coach at Ohio University. A 1998 graduate of Western Ontario, Syer earned a bachelor's degree in urban development. He earned his master's degree in physical education with a concentration in athletic administration in 2000.



SEAN FLANAGAN

Seventh Season as Assistant Coach St. Lawrence '10

Flanagan enters his seventh season as an assistant coach on head coach **MIKE SCHAFFER**'s staff. During his previous six seasons, Flanagan helped guide the Big Red to post a 108-38-19 record, good for a .712 win percentage. In his first three years on Schaffer's staff, Flanagan aided Cornell in going 3-for-3 in advancing to the NCAA Tournament (and likely would have been 4-for-4, if the 2019-20 season had not ended prematurely). Prior to arriving on East Hill prior to the 2016-17 season, Flanagan made a couple of stops after his four-year playing career at St. Lawrence. After playing professionally in the ECHL with the Las Vegas Wranglers and Quad City Mallards, he became an assistant coach at Division III Hobart from 2012-15. While working under former Cornell assistant coach Mark Taylor, he helped

build a team who won the ECAC West titles in 2015 and 2016, leading the Statesmen to NCAA Tournament appearances. After Hobart, Flanagan spent one season as the Director of Hockey Operations at UMass Lowell, during the 2015-16 season. Flanagan is no stranger to ECAC Hockey, as he played 121 career games with St. Lawrence up to the 2010-11 season, where he racked up 12 goals and 40 assists for 52 points, helping the Saints advance to the league's championship weekend twice over his four years with the Saints. Flanagan graduated from St. Lawrence with a bachelor of arts degree in history with a minor in sports studies and exercise sciences in 2010 before receiving his master of education degree from St. Lawrence the following year.



MITCH STEPHENS

Fourth Season as Volunteer Assistant Coach; SUNY Geneseo '07

Stephens returns to Cornell after serving as an assistant coach at Geneseo for five years. In his time behind the bench with his alma mater, Stephens helped the Knights win two SUNYAC conference championships (2016, 2018) and make three NCAA Tournament appearances (2014, 2016, and 2018), including two trips to the national semifinals. As a senior, Stephens was named runner-up for USCHO Division III Player of the Year, an AHCA Division III First Team, and All-America selection, while being a finalist for the AHCA Sid Watson Memorial Award as the NCAA Division III Player of the Year.



BEN RUSSELL

First Season as Director of Hockey Operations; Cornell '20

Russell rejoined the Cornell men's hockey program in Aug. 2022 to serve as the team's Director of Hockey Operations, after spending the last two seasons as an assistant coach at St. Olaf College, a Minnesota-based Division III school. At St. Olaf, Russell helped the 2021-22 squad to a Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) tournament title and an NCAA Tournament appearance. While attending Cornell for his undergraduate studies, Russell served as an Assistant Director of Hockey Operations, helping coordinate video, analyzing film, and preparing scouting reports, while incorporating advanced analytics into game preparation.

MACDONALD '15 BECOMES THIRD CORNELLIAN TO HOIST STANLEY CUP

ITHACA, N.Y. (JUNE 26, 2022) — **JACOB MACDONALD '15** became the third player in Cornell history to lift the Stanley Cup when his Colorado Avalanche defeated the Tampa Bay Lightning, 2-1, in Game 6 of the 2022 Stanley Cup Playoffs at Amalie Arena in Tampa, Fla.

MacDonald joined six-time winner **KEN DRYDEN** and three-time champion **JOE NIEUWENDYK** in hoisting the oldest existing trophy awarded to a professional sports franchise in North America.

Since graduating from Cornell, MacDonald has played in the ECHL with the Elmira Jackals and Toledo Walleye, the AHL with the Springfield Falcons, Albany and Binghamton Devils, Springfield Thunderbirds and Colorado Eagles around NHL stints with

the Florida Panthers in 2018-19 and the Avalanche in both 2020-21 and 2021-22.

He played eight regular-season games with Colorado this season and has two goals and eight assists in 43 regular season NHL games.

MacDonald was called up from Colorado of the AHL in early June to provide the Avalanche with some additional depth at the defenseman position.

The three-year starter for the Big Red accumulated four goals and 17 assists for 21 points in 104 career games. His plus-6 rating as a senior ranked second on the club.

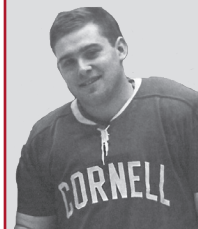

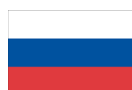

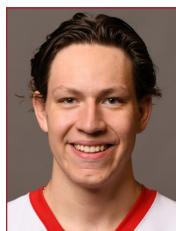
