PUCK DROP

© Coming off a dominant victory over UConn at Madison Square Garden in the Frozen Apple last weekend, the Cornell men's hockey team returns to Lynah Rink this weekend to square off against No. 7-ranked Harvard and Dartmouth in a pair of ECAC Hockey and Ivy League matchups.

LAST TIME OUT

- Freshman DALTON BANCROFT recorded his first collegiate hat trick as the Cornell men's ice hockey team cruised to a 6-0 win over No. 6 UConn last Saturday in the Frozen Apple at Madison Square Garden.
- Sophomore IAN SHANE stopped all 27 shots he faced to earn his fourth career shutout, leading the Big Red (6-4-0) to its fourth consecutive win.

FRESH(MAN) HAT TRICK

- With his hat trick against UConn at Madison Square Garden last Saturday, **DALTON BANCROFT** became the 16th different Cornell freshman to score at least three goals in a game since first-year players were eligible to play beginning in the 1975-76 season.
- Bancroft joins ROY KERLING (1977-78), BROCK TREDWAY (1977-78), DUANNE MOESER (1982-83), PETE NATYSHAK (1982-83), JOE NIEUWENDYK (1984-85), CHRIS GRENIER (1985-86), CASEY JONES (1986-87), TRENT ANDISON (4 goals in 1987-88), VINCENT AUGER (1993-94), RYAN SMART (1994-95), KYLE KNOPP (1995-96), MATT MOULSON (2002-03), JEFF MALOTT (2016-17), KYLE BETTS (2017-18), and BEN BERARD (2019-20).
- Additionally, Bancroft recorded the second hat trick by a Cornell player in program history at Madison Square Garden, joining DICK BERTRAND (Dec. 23, 1969), who later became the head coach of the Big Red from 1970-82.
- No Cornell player has recorded a hat trick in consecutive games since **DOUG DERRAUGH**, the current Cornell women's hockey head coach, against Colgate (1/22/91) and Dartmouth (1/26/91).
- The only freshman to record a pair of hat tricks in consecutive games happened by **BROCK TREDWAY** when he logged three hat tricks in as many games against Yale (1/21/78), Princeton (1/25/78) and Penn (1/28/78).

LYNAH FAITHFUL

- Playing at Lynah Rink in front of the Lynah Faithful has favored Cornell since MIKE SCHAFER '86 took over as head coach prior to the 1995-96 season.
- Under Schafer, Cornell has a 265-102-48 record at Lynah Rink, good for a .696 win percentage. According to data from CollegeHockeyNews.com's database, the Big Red has the sixth-best home win percentage over the last 28-plus seasons.
- Michigan (.751), North Dakota (.726), Quinnipiac (.720), Boston College (.712), and Denver (.703) have higher win percentages on home ice than the Big Red.
- Since the beginning of the 2017-18 season, Cornell has been one of the more hostile places to play college hockey. Cornell has a 50-12-6 (.779) home record over the last five-plus seasons, which is second in Division I hockey behind Minnesota State (.880).

OPENING STRONG AT LYNAH

Cornell has won its first three home games of the season and is looking to open 4-0 at home for the third consecutive year, and the fourth time in the last five seasons.

The last time Cornell opened 4-0 on home ice in three consecutive seasons came during a stretch where Cornell won its first four home games in 10 straight years, spanning the 1964-74 seasons.

With a win over Harvard on Friday, it would be the 23rd time in Cornell's program history in which it has started 4-0 at home (1921-22, 1964-74, 1977-78, 1980-81, 1982-83, 1988-89, 2001-03, 2004-05, 2009-10, 2017-18, 2019-20, and 2021-22).

BANCROFT EARNS HONORS

Freshman DALTON BANCROFT was named the ECAC Hockey Forward and Rookie of the Week after registering four points (three goals, one assist) in games against Sacred Heart and UConn last weekend.

Bancroft is the first Cornell player to earn multiple weekly awards from ECAC Hockey since goaltender MATTHEW GALAJDA was the conference's Goaltender and Rookie of the Week on Feb. 13, 2018.

It marked the second consecutive week Cornell has taken home the Rookie of the Week honor, as SEAN DONALDSON received the award on Nov. 21 after logging a pair of two-assist games against Yale and Brown.

STRONG DEFENSE

Dating back to the beginning of the 2016-17 season, Cornell has boasted one of the strongest defensive units in Division I hockey.

Over the last six-plus seasons, Cornell has allowed an average of 1.95 goals per game, ranking second nationally behind Minnesota State (1.83).

The Big Red's 342 goals allowed are the fewest by a Division I program over the last six-plus years. Harvard is second with 432 goals.

Cornell, who enters the weekend with the fourth-best scoring defense this season, has been in the top 10 in five of the last six years. The lone year was 2020-21, which was not played due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

SCHAFER REACHES MILESTONE

MIKE SCHAFER '86, the Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Hockey, reached a historic milestone on Nov. 4 at Hobey Baker Memorial Rink in Princeton, N.J.

With the Big Red's 3-1 victory over Princeton, Schafer notched his 500th career head coaching victory, becoming the 21st Division I hockey head coach to reach 500 career

Schafer is the seventh active head coach, and the fourth at the Division I level, to register 500 career coaching victories.

The other Division I coaches with at least 500 career wins include Mercyhurst's Rick Gotkin (593), ECAC Hockey counterpart Rand Pecknold of Quinnipiac (591), and Notre Dame's Jeff Jackson (565).

Schafer's 505 career wins stand as the most by a Cornell hockey head coach and is the most by any active head coach of Cornell's 37 varsity sports.

FINDING THE SCORESHEET

Sophomore SULLIVAN MACK and freshman DALTON BANCROFT enter this weekend riding four-game point streaks, both of which are career longs for the Big Red duo.

🝊 Bancroft has seven points (four goals and three assists) during his point streak, while Mack has five points (one goal and four assists).

The four-game point streak is the longest by a freshman since JUSTIN ERTEL and HANK KEMPF each had four-game point streaks last season.

No Cornell freshman has had a five-game point streak since BEN BERARD went five straight games with a point during the 2019-20 campaign.

PUTTING SPECIAL IN SPECIAL TEAMS

After opening the year scoring on just three of its first 27 power-play opportunities (.111), the Big Red has gone 5-for-9 (.556) with the man advantage during its four-game win streak.

On the other side of special teams, this weekend at Lynah Rink will feature three of the top penalty killing units at the Division I level.

Harvard enters this weekend with the nation's best penalty kill, allowing just one power-play goal in 28 chances this season (96.4 percent). Dartmouth ranks fourth nationally (25-of-28 - 89.3 percent) while Cornell is seventh (34-of-39 - 87.2 percent).

During the Big Red's four-game win streak, Cornell has successfully killed off its last 11 penalties and are 24-of-27 dating back to Nov. 4 at Princeton.

SHANE'S WORLD

Sophomore goaltender IAN SHANE has been strong between the pipes for Cornell so far this year, posting a 1.54 goals-against average and a .933 save percentage.

Shane's 1.54 goals-against average ranks third nationally and second in ECAC Hockey. St. Cloud State's Dominic Basse (1.29) and Princeton's Ethan Pearson are the only players ahead of Shane at the Division I ranks.

The Manhattan Beach, Calif., native also has the seventh-best save percentage among eligible Division I netminders, while also ranking second among ECAC Hockey goaltenders. Basse (.948), Pearson (.940), Northeastern's Devon Levi (.936), Merrimack's Zachary Borgiel (.934), Michigan State's Dylan St. Cyr (.934), and Michigan Tech's Blake Pietila (.933) have higher percentages.

In Shane's last three games, he has posted a 1.00 GAA and a .952 save percentage (60-of-63).

© Cornell has excelled in the second period this season, outscoring its opponents by a 13-4 margin in the middle frame of its 10 games played so far on the year.

In comparison, Cornell has outscored its opponents by just three goals 18-15 in the other two periods of action.

Along with its plus-9 goal differential in the second period, the Big Red have outshot its opponents by a whopping 52 shots in the period, 115-63. Cornell has just plus-20 advantage in shots on goal (177-157) in the other 40 minutes.

© Cornell has scored 31 goals in its first 10 games while giving up 19, good enough for a 1.20 scoring margin, which ranks ninth among Division I programs.

• Of the 31 goals scored by Cornell so far this season, the Big Red have been getting contributions from everyone on the squad as 18 players have already found the back of the net early on in the season.

Last year, Cornell had 20 different goal scorers in its 32 games played during the 2021-22 campaign.

The Big Red's 1.20 scoring margin on the year ranks third in ECAC Hockey, trailing Quinnipiac (1.79) and Harvard (1.78), who are currently assuming the top two spots nationally.

DOMINATING IVY LEAGUE PLAY

Cornell has excelled in Ivy League play over its last 30 games, posting a 21-5-4 record in that span, which includes the Big Red's active four-game win streak against Ancient Eight opposition.

The remaining five Ivy League opponents that field hockey programs have had a hard time defeating the Big Red on its home ice, as Cornell is 18-1-3 at home against Ivy League teams since 2017-18.

Cornell's lone loss came to Princeton (Jan. 21, 2022), while two of the three Big Red ties have come against Harvard (Jan. 25, 2020 & Jan. 28, 2022). Dartmouth had the other tie (Jan. 29, 2022).

ECAC PRESEASON POLL

ECAC Hockey announced Sept. 21 during its annual Media Day call that the Cornell hockey team was slated to finish fourth. Finishing ahead of the Big Red was Quinnipiac, who was dubbed the preseason favorite after finishing with eight first-place votes and a 118-point total. Harvard received the remaining four first-place votes, finishing with 109 points. Clarkson was third with 105 points.

Cornell followed Clarkson with 90 points, while Colgate (77), RPI (70), St. Lawrence (57), Union (45), Dartmouth (43), Yale (32), Brown (26), and Princeton (20) rounded out the poll.

LEADERSHIP GROUP ANNOUNCED

Senior defensemen SAM MALINSKI and TRAVIS MITCHELL were named co-captains, while fifth-year forward MAX ANDREEV and senior forward MATT STIENBURG were tabbed co-alternate captains on Sept. 29.

All four players are assuming leadership roles for the first time with the Cornell hockey program.

FIRST TEAM RETURNERS

Senior defender SAM MALINSKI is one of six returning players who have already received first-team honors from ECAC Hockey. Malinski is the lone Big Red representative on the list, while Clarkson's Alex Campbell and Mathieu Gosselin, Quinnipiac's Zach Metsa and Yaniv Perets, and St. Lawrence's Cameron Buhl (in 2020-21) are the others on the list.

The six ECAC representatives are tied with Atlantic Hockey for the most returning first-team selections for their respective conferences. Three of the six Atlantic Hockey first-team players have since transferred to different programs

© Cornell returns 81 percent of its goals scored from last season, which was the eighth-highest percentage by a Division I program entering the 2022-23 season.

Air Force led the nation, returning all of its scoring from the 2021-22 season. Penn State (93 percent) had the second-highest total, while Dartmouth (86 NGAA LEADERS

percent), Northeastern (85 percent), Sacred Heart and Yale (84 percent), and St. Lawrence (83 percent) were ahead of the Big Red.

Colorado College and North Dakota round out the top 10 with their 80 percent totals.

• Of the seven programs ahead of Cornell, the Big Red are slated to play four of the teams this season (Dartmouth, Sacred Heart, St. Lawrence, and Yale).

TOWERING OVER THE COMPETITION

According to CollegeHockeyInc.com's preseason media kit, Cornell entered the 2022-23 season tied for being the second-tallest Division I program.

The Big Red's average 6-foot-1 height was tied with Lindenwood. Both programs trail Vermont, who edges the Big Red and Lions by a mere six inches.

The Big Red have a two-inch advantage over Clarkson for the tallest ECAC Hockey program. The Golden Knights are tied with Boston University for the fourth-tallest Division I program.

Sophomore forward ONDREJ PSENICKA, who stands at 6-foot-6, is tied with Harvard forward Ryan Drkulec, Quinnipiac goaltender Chase Clark, and RPI forward Sutter Muzzatti for being the third-tallest player in ECAC Hockey this season.

Bartmouth's Cooper Black (6-foot-8) and Quinnipiac's Noah Altman (6-foot-7) have listed heights taller than the quartet of 6-foot-6 players.

MIKE SCHAFER '86

Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Ice Hockey 28th Season as Head Coach • 35th Season at Cornell

The longest-tenured head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, MIKE SCHAFER '86, enters his 28th season at the helm of the Cornell men's hockey program.

When Schafer returned to his alma mater in the summer of 1995 to become Cornell's 12th head coach in men's hockey history, Schafer's goal was to bring the Big Red to a position of national prominence.

Already the winningest head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, Schafer has accomplished that objective with his 505-275-103 record. His 505 wins rank fourth among active Division I coaches and his .630 win percentage is good for sixth among active Division I coaches.

Schafer has guided the Big Red to 12 NCAA Tournament appearances and a berth to the 2003 NCAA Frozen Four — the program's first since 1980. That year, Cornell set a school record for wins (30), finishing with one more victory than the 1969-70 national championship squad, who went undefeated (29-0-0). The 2002-03 team's 19-2-1 record in ECAC Hockey play was Cornell's best mark in league play since 1969-70 when Cornell was 21-0 in league action.

In 2020, Schafer was named a co-winner of the Spencer Penrose Award, given to the nation's top head coach. It was the first time Schafer won the award after being a finalist on five occasions after being named ECAC Hockey's Coach of the Year.

The Big Red have been regularly ranked among the nation's elite during Schafer's tenure, including being named No. 1 in both the USCHO.com and the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls at the time the 2019-20 postseason was halted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Cornell has claimed five Whitelaw Cup (ECAC Hockey tournament titles), which surpassed the legendary NED HARKNESS for the most in program history. Schafer has also led the Big Red to three Cleary Cups (ECAC's top regular-season team) in three of the last four years of competition.

In 2002-03, Schafer led the Big Red to the NCAA Frozen Four, setting a school record with 30 wins, one better than the 1969-70 squad who went 29-0-0. Cornell's 19-2-1 mark in ECAC Hockey in 2002-03 was Cornell's best since the 1969-70 team went 21-0 in league play.

Over his career, Schafer has coached 10 different players to First Team All-America status 11 times, seven Ivy League Players of the Year, 5 ECAC Hockey Ken Dryden Award winners (league's best goaltender), five ECAC Hockey Rookies of the Year, and five Ivy Rookies of the Year, and three ECAC Hockey Players of the Year.

A native of Durham, Ontario, Schafer played junior hockey with the Guelph Jr. A Holody Platers, who were finalists in the Centennial Cup for the National Championship in 1982.

Schafer and his wife, Diane, have two sons, Luke and John '18, and a daughter, Michelle.

BEN SYER

11th Season as Associate Head Coach; 12th Season at Cornell Western Ontario '98

Serving as the Big Red's recruiting director and manager of the team's vaunted defensive

unit, BEN SYER's efforts were perhaps no more celebrated than during the 2017-18 season. He helped Cornell lead the nation in team defense with a paltry 1.58 goals-against average and was named the winner of the American Hockey Coaches Association's 2018 Terry Flanagan Award.

One of the AHCA's major annual awards, the Terry Flanagan Award is presented to the assistant coach whose career body of work best honors that of the award's name sake.

"He can hold court with a group of assistant coaches on the road with the best of them," said MIKE SCHAFER, adding that this is the first time he's nominated anyone for a major AHCA award in his 23-year tenure at the helm of the Big Red. "He knows the elder statesmen, but he also knows the young guys like Terry did. He would make sure to say hello to everyone in the rink and lend a helping hand to young assistants. I admired Terry for this. He and his family are of the highest character, upfront and honest."

Syer joined Cornell in June 2011 as an assistant coach, then was promoted to associate head coach the following summer. He previously served as associate head coach during his 12 seasons at Quinnipiac under head coach Rand Pecknold. During that run, the Bobcats posted a 242-168-46 record with one NCAA tournament appearance (2002) and nine 20-win seasons.

A native of Kitchener, Ontario, Syer arrived at Quinnipiac after serving one season as an assistant coach at Ohio University. A 1998 graduate of Western Ontario, Syer earned a bachelor's degree in urban development. He earned his master's degree in physical education with a concentration in athletic administration in 2000.



SEAN FLANAGAN

Seventh Season as Assistant CoachSt. Lawrence '10

Flanagan enters his seventh season as an assistant coach on head coach MIKE SCHAFER's

staff. During his previous six seasons, Flanagan helped guide the Big Red to post a 108-38-19 record, good for a .712 win percentage. In his first three years on Schafer's staff, Flanagan aided Cornell in going 3-for-3 in advancing to the NCAA Tournament (and likely would have been 4-for-4, if the 2019-20 season had not ended prematurely). Prior to arriving on East Hill prior to the 2016-17 season, Flanagan made a couple of stops after his four-year playing career at St. Lawrence. After playing professionally in the ECHL with the Las Vegas Wranglers and Quad City Mallards, he became an assistant coach at Division III Hobart from 2012-15. While working under former Cornell assistant coach Mark Taylor, he helped

build a team who won the ECAC West titles in 2015 and 2016, leading the Statesmen to NCAA Tournament appearances. After Hobart, Flanagan spent one season as the Director of Hockey Operations at UMass Lowell, during the 2015-16 season. Flanagan is no stranger to ECAC Hockey, as he played 121 career games with St. Lawrence up to the 2010-11 season, where he racked up 12 goals and 40 assists for 52 points, helping the Saints advance to the league's championship weekend twice over his four years with the Saints. Flanagan graduated from St. Lawrence with a bachelor of arts degree in history with a minor in sports studies and exercise sciences in 2010 before receiving his master of education degree from St. Lawrence the following year.



MITCH STEPHENS

Fourth Season as Volunteer
Assistant Coach; SUNY Geneseo '07

Stephens returns to Cornell after serving as an assistant coach at Geneseo for five years. In his time behind the bench with his alma mater, Stephens helped the Knights win two

SUNYAC conference championships (2016, 2018) and make three NCAA Tournament appearances (2014, 2016, and 2018), including two trips to the national semifinals. As a senior, Stephens was named runner-up for USCHO Division III Player of the Year, an AHCA Division III First Team, and All-America selection, while being a finalist for the AHCA Sid Watson Memorial Award as the NCAA Division III Player of the Year.



BEN RUSSELL

First Season as Director of Hockey Operations; Cornell '20

Russell rejoined the Cornell men's hockey program in Aug. 2022 to serve as the team's Director of Hockey Operations, after spending the last two seasons as an assistant coach

at St. Olaf College, a Minnesota-based Division III school. At St. Olaf, Russell helped the 2021-22 squad to a Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) tournament title and an NCAA Tournament appearance. While attending Cornell for his undergraduate studies, Russell served as an Assistant Director of Hockey Operations, helping coordinate video, analyzing film, and preparing scouting reports, while incorporating advanced analytics into game preparation.





MACDONALD '15 BECOMES THIRD CORNELLIAN TO HOIST STANLEY CUP

ITHACA, N.Y. (JUNE 26, 2022) — JACOB MacDONALD '15 became the third player in Cornell history to lift the Stanley Cup when his Colorado Avalanche defeated the Tampa Bay Lightning, 2-1, in Game 6 of the 2022 Stanley Cup Playoffs at Amalie Arena in Tampa, Fla.

MacDonald joined six-time winner KEN DRYDEN and three-time champion JOE NIEUWENDYK in hoisting the oldest existing trophy awarded to a professional sports franchise in North America.

Since graduating from Cornell, MacDonald has played in the ECHL with the Elmira Jackals and Toledo Walleye, the AHL with the Springfield Falcons, Albany and Binghamton Devils, Springfield Thunderbirds and Colorado Eagles around NHL stints with

the Florida Panthers in 2018-19 and the Avalanche in both 2020-21 and 2021-22.

He played eight regular-season games with Colorado this season and has two goals and eight assists in 43 regular season NHL games.

MacDonald was called up from Colorado of the AHL in early June to provide the Avalanche with some additional depth at the defenseman position.

The three-year starter for the Big Red accumulated four goals and 17 assists for 21 points in 104 career games. His plus-6 rating as a senior ranked second on the club.






