PUCK DROP

Following a three-week break from competition, the Cornell men's hockey team returns to action for a two-game, non-conference series against American International College. Puck drop for both contests at Lynah Rink are slated for 7 p.m.

LAST TIME OUT

- Cornell split its last series against a pair of lvy League foes in No. 7 Harvard and Dartmouth.
- Sean Farrell scored 1:11 into overtime to aid the visting No. 7 Crimson to a 2-1 victory over the Big Red on Dec. 2 at Lynah Rink.
- Senior defenseman TRAVIS MITCHELL scored early in the first period, and sophomore goaltender IAN SHANE stopped all 11 shots in Cornell's 1-0 victory over Dartmouth on Dec. 3. Mitchell also scored the lone goal in the overtime loss to Harvard.

BLUELINER LIGHTS THE LAMP

- After scoring in each of his last two games, senior defenseman Travis Mitchell is looking to become the fifth Cornell defenseman since 1990-91 to score in three consecutive games.
- NICK D'AGOSTINO is the last Cornell blueliner to light the goal light in three consecutive games, when he did so during the 2010-11 season.
- DOUG MURRAY (four-game streak in 2000-01 and a three-game streak in 2001-02) and MARK McRAE (2000-01) are the others to accomplish the feat.

- Sophomore goaltender IAN SHANE was ECAC Hockey's most recent Goaltender of the Week on Dec. 5 after stopping 34 of 36 shots in Cornell's most recent weekend series.
- It marked the third consecutive week Cornell received a weekly honor, as freshman forward SEAN DONALDSON received Rookie of the Week honors on Nov. 21 and fellow freshman forward DALTON BANCROFT was tabbed the ECAC's Forward and Rookie of the Week on Nov. 28.

LYNAH FAITHFUL

- Playing in front of the Lynah Faithful has favored Cornell since MIKE SCHAFER took over as head coach prior to the 1995-96 season.
- Under Schafer, the Big Red is 265-102-44 at Lynah Rink (.698). According to data compiled from CollegeHockeyNews.com's database, Cornell has the sixth-best home win percentage in that span, trailing Michigan (.752), North Dakota (.726), Quinnipiac (.723), Boston College (.712), and Denver (.704).
- © Cornell has been a hostile place to play college hockey dating back to the 2017-18 season. The Big Red has posted a 51-13-5 (.775) record, which trails Minnesota State's .863 clip.

NONE SHALL PASS...

Cornell enters this two-game series boasting the nation's top scoring defense. The Big Red has vielded 21 goals over 12 games.

The 1.75 goals per game average makes Cornell one of four programs to average less than two goals allowed per game (Merrimack - 1.82, Quinnipiac -1.89, and UMass Lowell -1.94).

Dating back to the beginning of the 2016-17 season, Cornell has featured one of the stingier defensive units in Division I hockey. Cornell has been ranked in the top 10 in scoring defense in five of the last six seasons, with the lone year being 2020-21, which was not played due to the pandemic.

Since 2016-17, Cornell has allowed an average

of 1.94 goals per game, which ranks second nationally (Minnesota State - 1.84). The Big Red's 344 goals allowed are the fewest by a Division I program in the last six-plus

seasons. Cornell's bitter rival, Harvard, is in second with 439 goals. SCHAFER REACHES MILESTONE

MIKE SCHAFER '86, the Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Hockey, reached a historic milestone Nov. 4 in the Big Red's 3-1 win at Princeton.

Schafer logged his 500th career head coaching victory, becoming the 21st Division I hockey head coach to reach the 500-win plateau.

He is the eighth active head coach — the fourth at the Division I level — to register 500 career coaching victories.

The other Division I coaches include Rand Pecknold of Quinnipiac (595), Mercyhurst's Rick Gotkin (594), and Notre Dame's Jeff Jackson (566).

Schafer's 506 career wins stand as the most by

a Cornell hockey head coach in program history, and is the most by any active head coach of Cornell's 37 varsity sports.

PUTTING SPECIAL IN SPECIAL TEAMS

Over its last six games, Cornell has successfully killed off its last 15 penalties and has killed off 90.3 percent (28-of-31) of its penalties dating back to Nov. 4 at Princeton.

Thanks to its stingy penalty kill of late, Cornell has jumped to fifth in the nation in penalty kill percentage (38-of-43 – 88.4 percent).

Only Harvard (30/33 – 90.9%), UConn (77/85 – 90.6%), Ohio State (76/84 – 90.5%), and UMass Lowell (53/59 – 89.8%) are ahead of the Big Red.

On the other side of special teams, after opening the year scoring on just three of its first 27 power-play opportunities (11.1 percent), the Big Red has posted a 45.5 power-play percentage clip (5-for-11) over its last six games.

SHANE'S WORLD

Sophomore goaltender IAN SHANE has been strong between the pipes for Cornell so far this year, posting a Division I-leading 1.43 goals-against average.

Shane also has a .934 save percentage, which ranks third nationally, narrowly trailing UMass Lowell's Gustavs Davis Grigals (.937) and Luke Pavicich of UMass (.935).

Over Shane's last four games, he has posted a 3-1-0 record to go along with a 0.75 goals-against average and a .962 save percentage (76-of-79). He has registered a pair of shutouts over his last three games (UConn - Nov. 26 at Madison Square Garden and Dartmouth on Dec. 3).

DOMINATING OFFENSIVELY

Cornell has excelled in the second period this season, outscoring its opponents by a 13-5 margin in the middle frame of its 12 games played so far this year.

In comparison, Cornell has outscored its opponents by just five goals 20-15 in the other two periods of action.

Along with its plus-8 goal differential in the second period, the Big Red have outshot its opponents by a whopping 67 shots in the period, 139-72.

Additionally, Bancroft recorded the second hat trick by a Cornell player in program history at Madison Square Garden, joining DICK BERTRAND who did so against St. Lawrence on Dec. 23, 1969. Bertrand later became the head coach of the Big Red for 12 seasons (1970-82), taking over for the legendary NED HARKNESS.

THURSDAY NIGHT HOCKEY

The opening game of this two-game series against AIC will mark the 18th time in program history that Cornell is playing a home game on a Thursday.

Thursday's game will be Cornell's first regular-season home game on a Thursday since defeating Robert Morris, 4-1, on Oct. 26, 2006. It is the program's first Thursday game in regular-season action since playing Colorado College in Estero, Fla., at the Florida College Classic on Dec. 29, 2016.

Cornell is unbeaten in its last 13 home games played on a Thursday, posting a 12-0-1 record during the streak, which began on Nov. 28, 1963, when the Big Red posted a 4-3 victory over Canadian-based school Waterloo.

During the unbeaten streak, Cornell has outscored its opponents by a whopping 83 goals (107-24), which includes six 10-goal games.

ON THIS DATE (DEC. 29)

The opening game of the two-game series will mark the 38th time Cornell is playing on Dec. 29, and just the sixth time that it is not playing in a tournament setting.

Cornell is 15-20-2 all-time on the date and is winless over its last nine (0-7-2). The Big Red last won on Dec. 29 in

Cornell has won its last seven games against Atlantic Hockey opponents dating back to its first such game in 2003-04 against Mercyhurst.

The Big Red is 11-4-1 (.719) all-time against AHA opposition, and Cornell's last defeat came to Mercyhurst in a 5-4 setback on Oct. 29, 2011.

Cornell's .719 win percentage against Atlantic Hockey teams is the best win percentage against a conference that is not ECAC Hockey.

ECAC PRESEASON POLL

ECAC Hockey announced Sept. 21 during its annual Media Day call that the Cornell hockey team was slated to finish fourth. Finishing ahead of the Big Red was Quinnipiac, who was dubbed the preseason favorite after finishing with eight first-place votes and a 118-point total. Harvard received the remaining four first-place votes, finishing with 109 points. Clarkson was third with 105 points.

Cornell followed Clarkson with 90 points, while Colgate (77), RPI (70), St. Lawrence (57), Union (45), Dartmouth (43), Yale (32), Brown (26), and Princeton (20) rounded out the poll.

LEADERSHIP GROUP ANNOUNCED

Senior defensemen SAM MALINSKI and TRAVIS MITCHELL were named co-captains, while fifth-year forward MAX ANDREEV and senior forward MATT STIENBURG were tabbed co-alternate captains on Sept. 29.

All four players are assuming leadership roles for the first time with the Cornell hockey program.

FIRST TEAM RETURNERS

Senior defender SAM MALINSKI is one of six returning players who have already received first-team honors from ECAC Hockey. Malinski is the lone Big Red representative on the list, while Clarkson's Alex Campbell and Mathieu Gosselin, Quinnipiac's Zach Metsa and Yaniv Perets, and St. Lawrence's Cameron Buhl (in 2020-21) are the others on the list.

The six ECAC representatives are tied with Atlantic Hockey for the most returning first-team selections for their respective conferences. Three of the six Atlantic Hockey first-team players have since transferred to different programs

WELCOME BACK!

Cornell returns 81 percent of its goals scored from last season, which was the eighth-highest percentage by a Division I program entering the 2022-23 season.

Air Force led the nation, returning all of its scoring from the 2021-22 season. Penn State (93 percent) had the second-highest total, while Dartmouth (86 percent), Northeastern (85 percent), Sacred Heart and Yale (84 percent), and St. Lawrence (83 percent) were ahead of the Big Red.

Colorado College and North Dakota round out the top 10 with their 80 percent totals.

Of the seven programs ahead of Cornell, the Big Red are slated to play four of the teams this season (Dartmouth, Sacred Heart, St. Lawrence, and Yale).

TOWERING OVER THE COMPETITION

According to CollegeHockeyInc.com's preseason media kit, Cornell entered the 2022-23 season tied for being the second-tallest Division I program.

The Big Red's average 6-foot-1 height was tied with Lindenwood. Both programs trail Vermont, who edges the Big Red and Lions by a mere six inches.

The Big Red have a two-inch advantage over Clarkson for the tallest ECAC Hockey program. The Golden Knights are tied with Boston University for the fourth-tallest Division I program.

Sophomore forward ONDREJ PSENICKA, who stands at 6-foot-6, is tied with Harvard forward Ryan Drkulec, Quinnipiac goaltender Chase Clark, and RPI forward Sutter

SCOUTING AIC

AIC enters the series with an overall record of 10-7-4 and an 8-5-2 mark in Atlantic Hockey Association play. The Yellow Jackets have not played since Dec. 8-9 when it took four of six points from AHA rival Niagara.

Since being swept by Canisius on Nov. 11-12 in Buffalo, AIC has registered 17 out of a possible 21 points over its last seven AHA games (5-0-2). Following the sweep by the Golden Griffins, AIC has a 5-1-2 overall mark while outscoring its opponents by 13 goals (27-14). The lone loss in the span came in a road non-conference contest against Maine on Nov. 26, 5-1.

Over its last six games, AIC has displayed a tenacious offense while also playing strong defensively. The Yellow Jackets have scored at least three goals in six of its last eight games, and have allowed no more than three goals in its last six contests.

Jordan Biro paces AIC's offense with a team-high 22 points (8-14–22). Blake Bennett also has been a key contributor, posting an AIC-leading 12 goals (12-8–20). Brian Kramer (12) and Matt Rickard (12) each have 10-plus assists on the blueline for the Yellow Jackets.

■ Jarrett Fiske has been the starting goaltender in 12 of his 15 appearances this season (6-3-4, 2.10 GAA, .927 SV%). Alexandros Aslanidis (six starts in eight appearances — 4-2-0, 2.23 GAA, .913 SV%) and Troy Kobryn (two starts in six appearances — 0-2-0, 2.91 GAA, .905 SV%) have also made starts for AIC.

SERIES HISTORY

The pair of games with AIC will be the second and third instances that the two programs will be squaring off against each other. It is the first time the two programs are meeting since Dec. 3, 1963, in which the Big Red posted a 7-0 victory over the Yellow Jackets at Lynah Rink.

Cornell's top line of JERRY KOSTANDOFF, MURRAY STEPHEN, and JIM STEVENS combined to score four of Cornell's seven goals, while aiding goaltender ERROL McKIBBON to a nine-save shutout.

PETE CLARK, STEVE POOLE, and GEORGE WALKER also scored for Cornell.

Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Ice Hockey 28th Season as Head Coach • 35th Season at Cornell

The longest-tenured head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, MIKE SCHAFER '86, enters his 28th season at the helm of the Cornell men's hockey program.

When Schafer returned to his alma mater in the summer of 1995 to become Cornell's 12th head coach in men's hockey history, Schafer's goal was to bring the Big Red to a position of national prominence.

Already the winningest head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, Schafer has accomplished that objective with his 505-275-103 record. His 505 wins rank fourth among active Division I coaches and his .630 win percentage is good for sixth among active Division I coaches.

Schafer has guided the Big Red to 12 NCAA Tournament appearances and a berth to the 2003 NCAA Frozen Four — the program's first since 1980. That year, Cornell set a school record for wins (30), finishing with one more victory than the 1969-70 national championship squad, who went undefeated (29-0-0). The 2002-03 team's 19-2-1 record in ECAC Hockey play was Cornell's best mark in league play since 1969-70 when Cornell was 21-0 in league action.

In 2020, Schafer was named a co-winner of the Spencer Penrose Award, given to the nation's top head coach. It was the first time Schafer won the award after being a finalist on five occasions after being named ECAC Hockey's Coach of the Year.

The Big Red have been regularly ranked among the nation's elite during Schafer's tenure, including being named No. 1 in both the USCHO.com and the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls at the time the 2019-20 postseason was halted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Cornell has claimed five Whitelaw Cup (ECAC Hockey tournament titles), which surpassed the legendary NED HARKNESS for the most in program history. Schafer has also led the Big Red to three Cleary Cups (ECAC's top regular-season team) in three of the last four years of competition.

In 2002-03, Schafer led the Big Red to the NCAA Frozen Four, setting a school record with 30 wins, one better than the 1969-70 squad who went 29-0-0. Cornell's 19-2-1 mark in ECAC Hockey in 2002-03 was Cornell's best since the 1969-70 team went 21-0 in league play.

Over his career, Schafer has coached 10 different players to First Team All-America status 11 times, seven Ivy League Players of the Year, 5 ECAC Hockey Ken Dryden Award winners (league's best goaltender), five ECAC Hockey Rookies of the Year, and five Ivy Rookies of the Year, and three ECAC Hockey Players of the Year.

A native of Durham, Ontario, Schafer played junior hockey with the Guelph Jr. A Holody Platers, who were finalists in the Centennial Cup for the National Championship in 1982.

Schafer and his wife, Diane, have two sons, Luke and John '18, and a daughter, Michelle.

BEN SYER

11th Season as Associate Head Coach; 12th Season at Cornell Western Ontario '98

Serving as the Big Red's recruiting director and manager of the team's vaunted defensive

unit, BEN SYER's efforts were perhaps no more celebrated than during the 2017-18 season. He helped Cornell lead the nation in team defense with a paltry 1.58 goals-against average and was named the winner of the American Hockey Coaches Association's 2018 Terry Flanagan Award.

One of the AHCA's major annual awards, the Terry Flanagan Award is presented to the assistant coach whose career body of work best honors that of the award's name sake.

"He can hold court with a group of assistant coaches on the road with the best of them," said MIKE SCHAFER, adding that this is the first time he's nominated anyone for a major AHCA award in his 23-year tenure at the helm of the Big Red. "He knows the elder statesmen, but he also knows the young guys like Terry did. He would make sure to say hello to everyone in the rink and lend a helping hand to young assistants. I admired Terry for this. He and his family are of the highest character, upfront and honest."

Syer joined Cornell in June 2011 as an assistant coach, then was promoted to associate head coach the following summer. He previously served as associate head coach during his 12 seasons at Quinnipiac under head coach Rand Pecknold. During that run, the Bobcats posted a 242-168-46 record with one NCAA tournament appearance (2002) and nine 20-win seasons.

A native of Kitchener, Ontario, Syer arrived at Quinnipiac after serving one season as an assistant coach at Ohio University. A 1998 graduate of Western Ontario, Syer earned a bachelor's degree in urban development. He earned his master's degree in physical education with a concentration in athletic administration in 2000.



SEAN FLANAGAN

Seventh Season as Assistant CoachSt. Lawrence '10

Flanagan enters his seventh season as an assistant coach on head coach MIKE SCHAFER's

staff. During his previous six seasons, Flanagan helped guide the Big Red to post a 108-38-19 record, good for a .712 win percentage. In his first three years on Schafer's staff, Flanagan aided Cornell in going 3-for-3 in advancing to the NCAA Tournament (and likely would have been 4-for-4, if the 2019-20 season had not ended prematurely). Prior to arriving on East Hill prior to the 2016-17 season, Flanagan made a couple of stops after his four-year playing career at St. Lawrence. After playing professionally in the ECHL with the Las Vegas Wranglers and Quad City Mallards, he became an assistant coach at Division III Hobart from 2012-15. While working under former Cornell assistant coach Mark Taylor, he helped

build a team who won the ECAC West titles in 2015 and 2016, leading the Statesmen to NCAA Tournament appearances. After Hobart, Flanagan spent one season as the Director of Hockey Operations at UMass Lowell, during the 2015-16 season. Flanagan is no stranger to ECAC Hockey, as he played 121 career games with St. Lawrence up to the 2010-11 season, where he racked up 12 goals and 40 assists for 52 points, helping the Saints advance to the league's championship weekend twice over his four years with the Saints. Flanagan graduated from St. Lawrence with a bachelor of arts degree in history with a minor in sports studies and exercise sciences in 2010 before receiving his master of education degree from St. Lawrence the following year.



MITCH STEPHENS

Fourth Season as Volunteer Assistant Coach; SUNY Geneseo '07

Stephens returns to Cornell after serving as an assistant coach at Geneseo for five years. In his time behind the bench with his alma mater, Stephens helped the Knights win two

SUNYAC conference championships (2016, 2018) and make three NCAA Tournament appearances (2014, 2016, and 2018), including two trips to the national semifinals. As a senior, Stephens was named runner-up for USCHO Division III Player of the Year, an AHCA Division III First Team, and All-America selection, while being a finalist for the AHCA Sid Watson Memorial Award as the NCAA Division III Player of the Year.



BEN RUSSELL

First Season as Director of Hockey Operations; Cornell '20

Russell rejoined the Cornell men's hockey program in Aug. 2022 to serve as the team's Director of Hockey Operations, after spending the last two seasons as an assistant coach

at St. Olaf College, a Minnesota-based Division III school. At St. Olaf, Russell helped the 2021-22 squad to a Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) tournament title and an NCAA Tournament appearance. While attending Cornell for his undergraduate studies, Russell served as an Assistant Director of Hockey Operations, helping coordinate video, analyzing film, and preparing scouting reports, while incorporating advanced analytics into game preparation.

MacDonald joined six-time winner KEN DRYDEN and three-time champion JOE **NIEUWENDYK** in hoisting the oldest existing trophy awarded to a professional sports franchise in North America.

graduating from Cornell. MacDonald has played in the ECHL with the Elmira Jackals and Toledo Walleye, the AHL with the Springfield Falcons, Albany and Binghamton Devils, Springfield Thunderbirds and Colorado Eagles around NHL stints with

the Florida Panthers in 2018-19 and the Avalanche in both 2020-21 and 2021-22.

He played eight regular-season games with Colorado this season and has two goals and eight assists in 43 regular season NHL games.

MacDonald was called up from Colorado of the AHL in early June to provide the Avalanche with some additional depth at the defenseman position.

The three-year starter for the Big Red accumulated four goals and 17 assists for 21 points in 104 career games. His plus-6 rating as a senior ranked second on the club.
