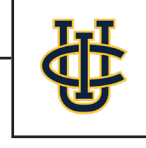

First Touch

The Cornell men's soccer team opens its 2022 season with a pair of Labor Day weekend contests in the Golden State, squaring off against UC Santa Barbara on Friday before heading down the coast to play UC Irvine on Monday afternoon.

California Dreaming

The pair of Labor Day weekend contests in California marks Cornell's first trip to the Golden State since 2018, when the Big Red played Cal St. Northridge and Cal St. Fullerton.

Cornell is 4-4-0 all-time in matches played in California, having won three of its last four in the Golden State.

Scoring multiple goals in a game played in California has bode well for the Big Red, as Cornell is 4-0 when scoring at least twice. In the team's four losses, Cornell has scored just once.

The Big Red are 7-5 all-time against California-based schools. This weekend's matches will be the eighth and ninth different schools from California that Cornell has played in men's soccer (California, Cal St. Fullerton, Cal St. Northridge, Loyola Marymount, Stanford, UCLA, UC Santa Barbara).

Season-Opening History

Cornell is 34-29-11 (.534) in its last 75 season openers, dating back to 1949. The Big Red are winless in seven of its last eight season-opening matches (1-3-4) and are 3-10-4 in its last 17.

The only victories over the last 17 years of competition were against Kentucky (2007 – W, 2-0), Cal St. Fullerton (2012 – W, 2-1) and Binghamton (2018 – W, 2-0).

This is the Big Red's third time opening its season with a California-based opponent. The others were against California in 2008 (L, 0-5) and Cal St. Fullerton in 2012.

About The Big Red

The Big Red enter its seventh season with head coach **JOHN SMITH** at the helm of the program. Following its 11-3-2 overall record in 2021, the Big Red have three consecutive 10-win seasons – the first time that has been accomplished in Cornell program history.

Cornell returns a pair of All-Ivy League first team players from last year's squad in fifth-year forward **EMEKA ENELI** and sophomore defender **WILSON EISNER**, who became the first Cornell freshman to earn All-Ivy League distinctions since **RICHARD STIMPSON** in 1997.

Ivy League Preseason Poll

The Cornell men's soccer team was tabbed to finish third in the 2022 Ivy League Men's Soccer preseason poll, the conference office announced on Aug. 23.

Princeton was named the preseason favorite, garnering 12 of the 16 possible first-place votes, finishing with 123 points. Right behind the Tigers was Yale, who received the remaining four first-place votes and had 103 points.

Cornell was third with 97 points, while Harvard (89 points), Penn (56), Brown (45), Dartmouth (39) and Columbia (27) rounded out the poll.

Dr. Daniel P. Wood Head Coach of Men's Soccer John Smith

JOHN SMITH enters his seventh year as the Dr. Daniel P. Wood Head Coach of Men's Soccer at Cornell. Over the last three years of competition, the Big Red have posted an 32-14-4 record, good for a .660 win percentage.

Smith has played an integral role in aiding the Big Red to its three consecutive 10-win seasons, a feat never accomplished before in program history.

Leadership Team Announced

Fifth-year forward **EMEKA ENELI**, senior defender **CONNOR DROUGHT** and sophomore defender **WILSON EISNER** were named the tri-captains for the 2022 season.

Eneli is serving as captain for a third consecutive season. He earned a leadership role initially in 2020 prior to its cancellation. Last year was the first time Eneli wore the armband in game action.

For Drought and Eisner, it will be the first time in their careers wearing the armband for the Big Red.

Berman Field Advantage

Cornell is unbeaten in its last 15 home games at Berman Field, a streak that spans back to the beginning of the 2019 season.

The Big Red's last home loss came in a 2-1 setback against Dartmouth on Nov. 3, 2018. Since the streak began, Cornell is 12-0-3 (.900) on its home turf over the last three seasons.

Of the schools with at least 15 home games played between the 2019 and 2021 seasons, Cornell has the third-highest home win percentage among Division I schools. Only Georgetown (32-1-3 - .931) and Missouri State (26-2-0 - .929) have higher win percentages.

The Big Red are the only team (min. 15 home games) to not lose a home game since 2019. Georgetown (32-1-3), New Hampshire (23-1-4) and Yale (12-1-1) are the lone programs with one home loss over the last three years entering 2022.

Scouting the Gauchos

UC Santa Barbara opened its season with a 1-1 draw at No. 19 Missouri State on Aug. 25 before returning home to defeating California Baptist, 2-0, on Aug. 28.

Salvador Aguilar has two of the Gauchos' three goals this season, registering a team-leading four points. Thaabit Baartman has the other goal for UCSB.

Carlos Zuniga has logged all 180 minutes of action for the Gauchos this season, logging a 0.50 goals against average and an .800 save percentage.

Series vs. UC Santa Barbara

Friday will be the second all-time meeting between the Big Red and Gauchos. The first meeting between the two teams occurred last season on Sept. 12 at Berman Field, in which Cornell won in overtime, 4-3.

HENRY HYLBERT deposited the game-winning goal in the 103rd minute, receiving a feed from **TYLER BAGLEY**, who added a pair of goals with his helper. **HARRY FULLER** scored the game-tying goal on a penalty kick in the 85th minute.

Scouting the Anteaters

Cornell is facing UC Irvine for the first time in program history on Monday. The Anteaters opened its 2022 season with a pair of losses to ranked opponents, dropping its season-opening match to No. 23 UCLA on Aug. 25, 1-0, before falling to No. 19 Missouri State on Aug. 28, 3-0.

By the time the Big Red and Anteaters play, UC Irvine will be in the midst of a four-game homestand. After hosting California on Sept. 2 and Cornell on Sept. 5, they'll welcome UCF (Sept. 9) and Saint Mary's (Sept. 12).

Dr. Daniel P. Wood Head Coach of Men's Soccer
Seventh Season as Head Coach

Smith enters his seventh season at the helm of the Cornell men's soccer team in 2022 and can be credited with the resurrection of a program that went 1-14-2 during his first season.

Cornell is aiming for its fourth consecutive season with double-digit victories following a 10-win season bookended by 11-win seasons.

Since arriving on East Hill, Smith has led the Big Red to victories over perennially strong programs such as Akron, Michigan State, and Syracuse. During his six-year tenure, Smith has coached 16 players that went on to earn All-Ivy designations and four that earned United Soccer Coaches All-Region honors. Two Cornell student-athletes have reached the professional ranks of American soccer under Smith's tutelage.

Prior to joining the Big Red in 2016, Smith served on the Stanford University coaching staff for four seasons, helping the Cardinal to its first national title in program history, when Stanford defeated Clemson, 4-0, marking the most goals scored in an NCAA final since 1996 and the largest margin of victory since 1975. In 2015 alone, Smith coached two First-Team All-Americans, a program-record five All-Far West Regional selections, the Hermann Award winner, four Major League Soccer draft picks and two U.S. Men's National Team players. He helped lead the program to an 18-2-3 record in 2015 – the team's most wins since 2002 – and a 7-1-2 mark in Pac-12 play, establishing a then-program record.

Before joining Stanford, Smith made two stops as an assistant coach at CSU Bakersfield beginning in 1999 before leaving to become the head coach at Incarnate Word before the 2006 season. He returned to Bakersfield in 2011. While at Incarnate Word from 2006-10, Smith amassed a 62-26-10 record and won three conference championships.

As a player, Smith was drafted in the second round (13th overall) by the Columbus Crew in the 1997 MLS College Draft. A two-time All-American at Rollins College, Smith was inducted into the Sunshine State Conference Hall of Fame in 2004.

Staats enters his first season as an assistant coach for the Cornell men's soccer program. He arrives on East Hill after a four-year tenure at Chowan University, where he served as an assistant and associate head coach.

In 2021, Staats' first season as associate head coach, he helped lead the Hawks to a program Division II-record 13 wins (13-4-2), along with a number of firsts: Conference Carolinas Tournament championship, NCAA Tournament bid, NCAA tournament win and NCAA Sweet 16 appearance, as well as its highest final national ranking (No. 14).
