### **FIRST TOUCH**

The Cornell women's soccer team returns to Berman Field for the first time since Sept. 4 this afternoon, hosting St. John's.

### **BINGHAMTON RECAP**

- A pair of saves in the final eight minutes by **NICOLE SHULMAN** helped Cornell to a 1-1 draw with Binghamton on Wednesday night at the Bearcats Sports Complex.
- LAKEN GALLMAN scored the only goal for Cornell, heading in a set piece by AIDAN JULIA REINEMAN.
- Shulman made a total of five saves in the contest. Along with her career-high six saves against Syracuse on Sept. 11, the senior goalkeeper has made 11 saves over her last two matches.

### **ABOUT THE BIG RED**

- © Cornell had scored in six of its first seven games to open the 2022 campaign. The Big Red's eight goals through the first seven games are the most by a Cornell squad since 2015, when the team scored nine goals in its first seven contests.
- After scoring against Binghamton on Wednesday, it marked the 17th time in program history since 1982 that the Big Red have scored in at least six of its first seven games. After doing so in 10 of its first 13 years, the Big Red have accomplished the feat seven times in the last 27 years.
- Junior forward LAKEN GALLMAN has scored her Cornell-best three goals in her last four appearances. Senior forward ASHLEY DURIK is right behind Gallman with her five points (two goals, one assists).
- Senior goalkeeper NICOLE SHÜLMAN has started all seven games for the Big Red this season, posting a 1-2-2 record with a 2.00 goals-against average and a .645 save percentage.

### **TOUGH ROAD AHEAD**

- Following Wednesday's contests, Cornell had the 57th-hardest future schedule among Division I teams, based on the cumulative win percentage of the teams the Big Red has yet to play.
- of the nine remaining teams on Cornell's 2022 schedule, the opponents are a combined 30-14-12. Even though the .643 win percentage ranks 57th among Division I schools, the figure is fifth amongst non-Power Five schools. Santa Clara (.686), Yale (.669), Delaware (.664), and Columbia (.662) are ahead of the Big Red.
- After Wednesday's matches, the Ivy League had the fifthhighest win percentage for its future opponents (.615), trailing the ACC (.802), SEC (.743), Pac-12 (.702), and Big Ten (.668). The West Coast Conference (WCC) is sixth with a .597 win percentage.

## **GOOD COMPANY**

- Gornell is currently a part of one of the winningest conferences in Division I soccer this season.
- Through games played on Sept. 14, the Ivy League is one of seven conferences with a winning percentage north of .600. The Ivy League has the highest win percentage of any non-Power Five conference, ranking fourth with its .673 clip (28-11-10).
- Only the ACC (.806), SEC (.748) and Pac-12 (.722) have higher win percentages. The Big Ten is fifth with a .668 percentage.

### IVY LEAGUE PRESEASON POLL

- Cornell was picked to finish in a tie for seventh in the 2022 lvy League Women's Soccer Preseason Poll, the conference office announced Wednesday afternoon.
- Brown received 11 of the 16 possible first-place votes, finishing with an Ivy League-best 123 points. Harvard recorded three first-place votes, placing second with 108 points. Princeton was the only other school receiving first-place votes, logging the remaining two and concluding with 104 points.
- © Columbia (72 points), Penn (62 points) and Dartmouth (50 points) were picked fourth through sixth, respectively, while the Big Red and Yale each ended with 29 points, tying for the final two positions.

### GABRIEL TRAINS WITH PHILIPPINES NATIONAL TEAM

- Sophomore midfielder REINNA GABRIEL missed the Big Red's first five games as she was training with the Philippines National Team camp in California.
- Gabriel, who made her season debut last Sunday at Syracuse, is seeking to join the Philippines National Team who currently holds its highest-ever world ranking of No. 53 for its first World Cup appearance next summer when Australia and New Zealand host the quadrennial soccer tournament.

### **CORNELL'S 2022 LEADERSHIP TEAM**

- Cornell will deploy a seven-person leadership team for the 2022 season, rotating captains on a game-by-game basis.
- The players named to the leadership team for the season include a trio of seniors (SYDNEY WAITERS, EMILY ST. JOHN, and ISABELLA DELEW), along with a pair of juniors (AVA LADEN and JACKIE LASSETER) and two sophomores (CECILY POKIGO and MADDIE LEROY).

### **ACROSS THE NATION**

- Cornell does not have a geographical recruiting base as the Big Red have 16 different states represented on this year's roster.
- © California is the most represented state with seven players from the Golden State. New York has the second-highest total with five players. Connecticut and Illinois have three players apiece, while Colorado, New Jersey and Vermont each have two representatives.
- Florida, Indiana, Kentucky, Massachusetts, Maryland, North Carolina, Texas, Virginia and Washington are represented once.

### SCOUTING THE RED STORM

- St. John's comes into today's contest with a 3-2-2 record. The Red Storm lost its last game, 1-0, to Lehigh on Sunday. The loss snapped the Red Storm's three-game unbeaten streak.
- Today's match will serve as a tune-up for the Red Storm as they head into Big East play. The Red Storm will open conference play on Thursday when it travels to Boyds, Md., to play Georgetown.
- The road has been unkind for the Red Storm this season, as St. John's is seeking its first victory away from Belson Stadium. The Red Storm are 0-1-2 this season on the road, with the ties coming against NJIT and Columbia.
- Jessica Garziano leads St. John's with her seven points (two goals, three assists) in as many games. Nicole Gordon and Ava Collins each have two goals, matching Garziano, to lead the Red Storm.
- Gina Muzi has started all seven games for St. John's in 2022, logging a 1.08 goals-against average and a .731 save percentage. She has been the Red Storm's goalkeeper of record in all matches, while logging a pair of clean sheets.

### SERIES VS. ST. JOHN'S

- Today marks the fourth all-time meeting between St. John's and Cornell. The Red Storm have the advantage in the series, 2-0-1.
- The match will be the Red Storm's first trip to Berman Field, as the previous three meetings have all occurred at Belson Stadium in Queens.
- It is the first time the teams are meeting since Sept. 21, 2019, when St. John's defeated the Big Red, 2-0.

### **AGAINST THE BIG EAST**

- The match against Villanova will mark Cornell's 40th all-time meeting against a Big East opponent. Over the previous 39 games, the Big Red have a 7-26-6 record against teams from the Big East Conference.
- Cornell's last victory over a Big East opponent came against Seton Hall on Sept. 17, 2015 in South Orange, N.J. The Big Red are 2-6-1 all-time in home games against Big East opponents with the last victory coming against Pittsburgh on Nov. 3, 1996.

# **ROB FERGUSON**

# Women's Soccer Head Coach Third Season as Head Coach • Fourth Season at Cornell

ROB FERGUSON was hired as head coach for the women's soccer program in February 2020 after serving as an assistant coach for the Big Red during the 2019 season.

With the team's 2020 season canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Ferguson made his NCAA head coaching debut in 2021.

In his first season as head coach, Cornell finished with a 3-11-2 record and a 1-6 mark in Ivy League play. The Ivy League victory was the program's first in over five years.

After winning his collegiate debut against Canisius in 2021, Ferguson became the first Cornell women's soccer head coach to win in their first game coaching the Big Red since **GRETCHEN ZIGANTE** in 2006.

Offense has seen an increase during Ferguson's tenure on East Hill. In 2021, the Big Red scored 14 times, which marked the most by a Cornell team since scoring 16 times in 2015.

In his first year on Cornell's coaching staff, Ferguson guide the Big Red to four consecutive victories to start the season – including three straight clean sheets against Siena, Bucknell and St. Bonaventure. Cornell ultimately finished the season with a 4-10-1 record after the rigors of one some of the strongest lvy League competition seen in recent years. Ferguson helped get the Big Red's impact freshman class acclimated to collegiate competition, a group that included 2019 All-Ivy League honorable mention selection ASHLEY DURIK.

Ferguson first joined the Big Red after a very successful stint as the Director of Coaching with the WNY Flash Academy. He helped turn the program into a player development leader in Western New York, expanding the program's footprint from 15 teams to 34 teams and moving them into national recognition in Elite Clubs National League (ECNL). Under Ferguson's leadership at the Flash their 03G ECNL and Flash 02G ECNL advanced into the Elite 8 in June 2018, and the club had their first US Youth National Team Camp call-up.

Before joining the WNY Flash Academy, Ferguson was the head coach of both the men's and women's soccer programs at NAIA Huston-Tillotson University in Austin, Texas. Prior to that, he served as the Executive Director of Business for Lonestar Soccer Club from 2008 until 2015. One of the largest and most successful youth soccer clubs in the country, Ferguson coached the Lonestar 96B Red, 93G Red, 94G Red and 95G Red, and he helped advance the 95G Red to the USYSNC Region III Championships in June 2013 and 2014.

### CORNELL COACHING STAFF



JACKIE FIRENZE Assistant Coach 3rd season Syracuse '16

Firenze joined the Big Red in 2020 after a four-year tenure as an assistant coach at Binghamton, including two seasons as the lead assistant. She helped the Bearcats accumulate a 34-29-10 record in that span, including a 2017 season that ended with an 11-4-4 mark and a share of the America East regular season title. Following that season, Firenze and the rest of Binghamton's staff were honored as America East Co-Coaching Staff of the Year.



DANI BRITT Assistant Coach 2nd season Albany '15

Britt joined the Big Red in advance of the 2021 season after a two-year stint as an assistant coach at Hartford, where she helped the Hawks advance to the 2019 America East Championship finals. Britt helped develop Hartford's Maria Perez into a second-team All-America East and Third Team All-Region honoree. The Hawks ranked second in the league in team defense (1.00 goal per game) while leading the circuit in saves (136).



KELSEY FERGUSON Volunteer Assistant 4th season Richmond '10

Ferguson is in her fourth year on East Hill. She served as an assistant coach for two years, helping the squad start the 2019 season on a four-game winning streak, before becoming a volunteer assistant. She joined the Big Red after a three-year stint as an assistant coach at Buffalo State and serving as a head coach of ECNL teams at the WNY Flash Academy. Before joining the WNY Flash Academy, Ferguson spent seven years with Lonestar Soccer Club, one of the largest and most successful youth soccer clubs in the country.
