## FIRST TOUCH

The Cornell men's soccer team returns to Berman Field for its Ivy League-opening match against its Ancient Eight rival, Harvard, this afternoon. First touch is scheduled for 4 p.m.

## MARIST RECAP

Junior defender **KISA KIINGI**'s 70th-minute goal guided the Cornell men's soccer team to a 1-0 victory over Marist at Tenney Stadium last Saturday night in Poughkeepsie, N.Y.

Freshman goalkeeper **RYAN FRIEDBERG** recorded his third solo clean sheet of the season, making three saves for the Big Red in the victory.

## SEPTEMBER SUCCESS

Cornell concluded September with a 6-1-0 record, good for an .857 win percentage. It is the Big Red's best record in a month, with a minimum of five matches played, since going 8-0-0 in September of the 2012 campaign.

The six wins in a calendar month are the most by a Cornell squad since going 6-2-0 in September of 2018.

## ONE FOR THE RECORD BOOKS

The eight goals scored by Cornell against Canisius on Sept. 20 were the second-most by a Big Red squad in a single game, dating back to 1947. It was the most goals scored since the program record was set on Sept. 24, 1965, when Cornell won its season-opener over Syracuse, 12-0.

It was the 14th time in program history, since 1947, in which Cornell scored at least six goals in a match. It was the Big Red's first time netting six-plus goals in a contest since Oct. 12, 2019, in a 6-0 victory over Harvard.

The Big Red score five of its eight goals in the first half on Tuesday, marking the second time in as many years that Cornell has scored five goals in a half. Last year, Cornell scored five first-half goals against Harvard on Oct. 9, before winning the contest, 5-4.

Cornell's eight goals are the third-most by a Division I program this season, trailing Cal St. Fullerton (10 vs. LIFE Pacific, an NAIA school, on Aug. 28) and Butler (9 vs. Lindenwood on Sept. 21).

## ABOUT THE BIG RED

Sophomore forward **ALIOUNE KA** has a team-leading 10 points (four goals, two assists), while senior midfielder **BRANDON MORALES** is right behind with nine points (four goals, one assist). Junior defender **KISA KIINGI** has eight points (three goals, two assists), while fifth-year forward **EMEKA ENELI** and senior defender **CONNOR DROUGHT** both have seven points (one goal, five assists).

Freshman goalkeeper **RYAN FRIEDBERG** has been Cornell's go-to goalkeeper this season. He has started all of the Big Red's seven matches so far this season, posting a 6-1-0 record to go along with a 0.58 goals-against average and a .778 save percentage.

## WHAT'S AT STAKE

- A victory this afternoon would be the Big Red's best eight-game start to a season since 2013, when Cornell opened the year on an eight-game unbeaten streak (6-0-2) before ending with an 8-5-4 mark.
- With a win this afternoon, Cornell would have seven victories in its first eight matches for the first time since 2012, when the Big Red opened play with 12 consecutive wins. Cornell posted a 15-1 regular season record before falling to Syracuse in the NCAA Tournament.
- Cornell would have a 6-1-1 record through its first eight games for a second consecutive season with a draw this afternoon. Last year's squad was 6-1-1 after its first eight games before ending the year with a 11-3-2 mark.

## FRIEDBERG'S STRONG START

- Freshman goalkeeper **RYAN FRIEDBERG** has shined for the Big Red between the pipes this season.
- Friedberg is one victory away from matching **STEPHEN BOTT** (1983) and **QUINN O'SULLIVAN**'s freshman record for wins in a season.
- Last Saturday's clean sheet marked the fourth time Friedberg has been a part of a clean sheet for Cornell this season. He has the third-most shutouts by a Cornell freshman goalkeeper, trailing Bott (7 in 1983) and O'Sullivan (4.5 in 1992).
- Through games played on Sept. 27, Friedberg's 0.58 goals-against average was the best by any Ivy League goalkeeper, and ranked 15th nationally. Penn's Nick Christoffersen has the second-highest average of any Ivy League keeper (0.72).
- Friedberg has the lowest goals-against average by a freshman goalkeeper in Division I. To be eligible, the player must play at have played at least 50 percent of their team's minutes. Friedberg is ahead of Old Dominion's Michael Statham (0.63).
- A two-time Ivy League Rookie of the Week, Friedberg is the first Ivy League keeper to be the top newcomer at least twice in a season since Dartmouth's James Hickok in 2013. Friedberg is Cornell's first player to be Rookie of the Week multiple times since **EMEKA ENELI** in 2018.

## ROAD WARRIORS

- Following last Saturday's victory at Marist, Cornell improved to 23-9-1 on the road since the beginning of the 2018 season, good for a .712 win percentage.
- Cornell is one of four Division I schools to post a win percentage north of .700 on the road over the last four-plus seasons. Only Missouri State (.821), Saint Mary's (.750), and Washington (.729) have higher percentages.
- The Big Red is one of 17 programs to be undefeated on the road this season. Cornell's five road victories in 2022 are the most by a Division I program this season.
- Dating back to last year, Cornell has won its last six road matches, tying Vermont for the longest active Division I road winning streak.

## BERMAN FIELD ADVANTAGE

- After Vermont snapped Cornell's 15-game unbeaten streak at Berman Field on Sept. 13, Cornell bounced back with an 8-0 victory over Canisius on Sept. 20.
- Since the beginning of the 2019 season, the Big Red is unbeaten in 16 of its last 17 matches at Berman Field, posting a 13-1-3 record and a .853 win percentage, which ranks ninth in the nation.
- Georgetown (.890), Missouri State (.889), Pittsburgh (.879), New Hampshire and Yale (.875), Campbell (.864), Kentucky (.863), and Washington (.861) are ahead of Cornell in the top 10.
- Cornell is one of two Division I teams with just one home loss over the last three-plus seasons, with at least 15 home matches played (Yale).

IVY LEAGUE OPENERS

Cornell is seeking its second consecutive victory to open Ivy League play this afternoon against Harvard. Last year, the Big Red won 3-0 in its first Ivy League contest over Penn on Oct. 2 at Rhodes Field in Philadelphia. The Big Red have not won consecutive league openers since the 2011 (1-0) and 2012 (3-2) seasons, when Cornell beat Beat in both instances.

After last year's shutout, the Big Red have never posted consecutive shutouts to open Ivy League play in program history.

The Big Red is 4-5-1 over its last 10 Ivy League-opening matches. Despite the losing record, Cornell is unbeaten in three of its last four Ivy League openers (2-1-1).

This afternoon's match snaps Cornell's streak of opening Ivy League play against Penn. The Big Red and Quakers opened league play in each of the last 13 years of competition, dating back to 2008.

It is the first time Cornell and Harvard are opening Ivy League play against each other since 2007, and for just the fourth time over the last 52 years of competition. The Big Red are 2-7-1 all-time against Harvard in Ivy League openers, dating back to 1955.

IVY LEAGUE PRESEASON POLL

The Cornell men's soccer team was tabbed to finish third in the 2022 Ivy League Men's Soccer preseason poll, the conference office announced on Aug. 23.

Princeton was named the preseason favorite, garnering 12 of the 16 possible first-place votes, finishing with 123 points. Right behind the Tigers was Yale, who received the remaining four first-place votes and had 103 points.

Cornell was third with 97 points, while Harvard (89 points), Penn (56), Brown (45), Dartmouth (39), and Columbia (27) rounded out the poll.

LEADERSHIP TEAM ANNOUNCED

Fifth-year forward **EMEKA ENELI**, senior defender **CONNOR DROUGHT** and sophomore defender **WILSON EISNER** were named the tri-captains for the 2022 season.

Eneli is serving as captain for a third consecutive season. He earned a leadership role in 2020 before the COVID-19 pandemic canceled the season. Last year was the first time Eneli wore the armband during game action.

For Drought and Eisner, it will be the first time in their careers wearing the armband for the Big Red.

SCOUTING THE CRIMSON

Harvard enters this afternoon's contest with a 4-3-1 record. The Crimson had its three-game unbeaten streak snapped on Tuesday with its 2-1 loss to New Hampshire.

In its victory last Saturday over Fairfield, six different Crimson players scored in Harvard's 6-0 victory over the Stags. It was the most goals scored by Harvard in a game since Nov. 14, 2015, when also scoring six goals in a 6-0 victory over Penn.

Harvard scored four of its six goals in the first half, recording its first four-goal half since last year on Oct. 9, when Harvard tried to avenge a 5-0 halftime deficit to Cornell, but the Big Red were able to prevail, 5-4, at Berman Field.

Martin Vician, the reigning Ivy League Rookie of the Week, has a Harvard-leading 11 points through the Crimson's first eight games (five goals, one assist). Willem Ebbinge (three goals), Nik White, Ale Gutierrez and Alessandro Arlotti (two goals each) have scored multiple goals for Harvard this year.

Oskar Nilsson has started seven of Harvard's eight matches this season, posting a 3-2-1 record along with a 1.48 goals-against average and a .706 save percentage.

SERIES VS. HARVARD

This afternoon will be the 70th meeting between Cornell and Harvard on the pitch since 1948. Harvard leads the series, 35-21-13, despite the Big Red being on a four-game win streak over the Crimson.

Cornell has outscored Harvard during its four-game win streak, 16-6, which includes registering at least four goals in each of the last three matches.

The match will mark the third consecutive time Cornell is hosting Harvard, not having played in Cambridge since the 2018 season. It is the first time that a team has played three consecutive home matches in the series since Harvard hosted Cornell in the 1984, 1985 and 1986 seasons.

# JOHN SMITH

**Dr. Daniel P. Wood Head Coach of Men's Soccer**  
**Seventh Season as Head Coach**

Smith enters his seventh season at the helm of the Cornell men's soccer team in 2022 and can be credited with the resurrection of a program that went 1-14-2 during his first season.

Cornell is aiming for its fourth consecutive season with double-digit victories following a 10-win season bookended by 11-win seasons.

Since arriving on East Hill, Smith has led the Big Red to victories over perennially strong programs such as Akron, Michigan State, and Syracuse. During his six-year tenure, Smith has coached 16 players that went on to earn All-Ivy designations and four that earned United Soccer Coaches All-Region honors. Two Cornell student-athletes have reached the professional ranks of American soccer under Smith's tutelage.

Prior to joining the Big Red in 2016, Smith served on the Stanford University coaching staff for four seasons, helping the Cardinal to its first national title in program history, when Stanford defeated Clemson, 4-0, marking the most goals scored in an NCAA final since 1996 and the largest margin of victory since 1975. In 2015 alone, Smith coached two First-Team All-Americans, a program-record five All-Far West Regional selections, the Hermann Award winner, four Major League Soccer draft picks and two U.S. Men's National Team players. He helped lead the program to an 18-2-3 record in 2015 – the team's most wins since 2002 – and a 7-1-2 mark in Pac-12 play, establishing a then-program record.

Before joining Stanford, Smith made two stops as an assistant coach at CSU Bakersfield beginning in 1999 before leaving to become the head coach at Incarnate Word before the 2006 season. He returned to Bakersfield in 2011. While at Incarnate Word from 2006-10, Smith amassed a 62-26-10 record and won three conference championships.

As a player, Smith was drafted in the second round (13th overall) by the Columbus Crew in the 1997 MLS College Draft. A two-time All-American at Rollins College, Smith was inducted into the Sunshine State Conference Hall of Fame in 2004.

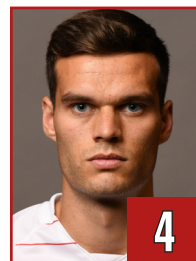

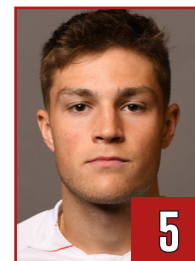
