PUCK DROP

For the first time since 2001-02, the Cornell men's hockey team ships up to Boston to square off against Boston University in the 50th all-time meeting between the two programs.

WEEKEND REWIND

- Cornell swept its annual road trip to the Capital Region when it defeated Union and RPI by respective 6-1 and 6-4 scores.
- Senior forward BEN BERARD led the Big Red in scoring last weekend (2-4-6), while junior forward GABRIEL SEGER (2-3-5) and freshman forward NICK DESANTIS (0-5-5) each had five-point weekends.
- Berard, Seger, and senior forward JACK MALONE were the lone Big Red players with multi-goal weekends. Both of Seger's goals came on the power play.
- In addition to his point prowess, Seger excelled inside the faceoff dot this past weekend, winning 25 of the 32 draws he took, posting a .781 win rate.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

- Senior forward **BEN BERARD** and freshman forward **NICK DESANTIS** received weekly honors from ECAC Hockey on Monday following last weekend's offensive explosion.
- Berard registered six points (2-4-6) on the weekend, which included a career-high four points in the Big Red's 6-4 win over RPI last Saturday.
- All five of DeSantis' points came on assists last weekend. DeSantis had a four-assist game against RPI, which was Cornell's first four-assist game since YANNI KALDIS and BRENDEN LOCKE each had four assists in a 9-1 win over Quinnipiac on March 9, 2018.
- The weekly award for DeSantis was his second in six days after being named the ECAC Hockey Rookie of the Week on Jan. 4.

THANKS FOR THE HELP!

- Behind his four-assist game last Saturday in Cornell's 6-4 win over RPI, freshman forward NICK DESANTIS matched the Cornell program record for assists by a first-year player.
- Since freshman became eligible to play in the 1975-76 season, DeSantis is just one of four Big Red first-year players to log four assists in a game.
- The others to accomplish the feat previously were ROY KERLING (Feb. 4, 1978 vs. Dartmouth), MARK MCRAE (Feb. 11, 2000 at Clarkson), and former NHLer BYRON BITZ (Feb. 13, 2004 vs. Princeton).
- BeSantis' four assists marked the 13th time a Division I players has registered four helpers in a game, with 12 of them coming against Division I opposition (Long Island's Patriks Marcinkevics had a four-assist game on Dec. 10 against Franklin Pierce, a Division III school).
- Of the 13 four-assist games this season, DeSantis is the sixth freshmen player (seventh occurence) to accomplish the feat.
- Wisconsin's Lucius Cruz, Sacred Heart's Marcus Joughin, Quinnipiac's Sam Lipkin (twice), Michigan State's Tiernan Shoudy and Karsen Dorwart as the lone first-year players with four assists in a game this season.



SEEING DOUBLE

Senior forward BEN BERARD has registered multiple points in each of his last four games (2-8-10), including his four-point game last Saturday at RPI (1-3-4).

Berard is the first Big Red player to have four straight multi-point games since MORGAN BARRON opened the 2019-20 campaign with four consecutive multi-point peformances.

With a multi-point game today against Boston University, Berard would be the first Cornell player since Barron in 2018-19 with five multi-point games in a row.

NONE SHALL PASS

Cornell enters this weekend boasting one of the nation's top scoring defenses. The Big Red has yielded just 33 goals allowed so far this year, which ranks as the fewest by a Division I program.

The Big Red's 2.06 goals per game average ranks third in the nation, trailing Quinnipiac (1.71) and St. Cloud State (1.95).

Historically, Cornell has boasted one of the stingier defensive units in Division I hockey. The Big Red has ranked in the top 10 in scoring defense in five of the last six seasons, with the lone year being 2020-21 (did not play — COVID-19 pandemic).

Since 2016-17, Cornell has allowed an average of 1.97 goals per game, which ranks only behind Minnesota State (1.86).

THE SIXTH (GOAL) SENSE

Last weekend, Cornell posted a pair of six-goal games against Union and RPI. The pair of six-goal games marked the first time the Big Red netted at least six goals in consecutive games since defeating Canisius, 6-2, on Dec. 30, 2017, and posting a 7-1 victory over Princeton on Jan. 5, 2018.

With a six-goal performance this afternoon, it would be the first time Cornell has registered three consecutive six-goal games since doing so in four straight games in the 1985-86 season.

POINT SEGER

Junior forward GABRIEL SEGER has been having a knack for finding the scoresheet as of late, registering at least one point in 11 of his 14 games played so far this year.

He enters this afternoon's game with points in his last five games, a career-long streak for the native of Uppsala, Sweden. Over his last five games, Seger has recorded an assist in each game, while posting eight points (two goals, six assists) — five of which came last weekend.

Seger (4-11–15) is currently tied with senior forward **BEN BERARD** (3-12–15) for the team lead in points. Joining the duo with double-digit point totals are freshmen forwards **NICK DESANTIS** (5-6–11) and **DALTON BANCROFT** (4-6–10), as well as senior forward **MAX ANDREEV** (3-7–10).

KILL, RED, KILL

Solution Over its last 10 games, Cornell has successfully killed off 29 of its last 33 penalties (87.8 percent).

All four of the power-play goals allowed by the Big Red since Nov. 18 came last Saturday at RPI, with three of the four markers coming on a five-minute power play.

RPI snapped Cornell's streak of consecutive killed penalties, which stood at 25.

■ Cornell currently ranks 10th nationally in penalty kill percentage (52-of-61 — 85.2 percent). The Big Red's mark is second in ECAC Hockey, only behind Harvard with its 85.7 percent clip (36-of-42).

SHANE'S WORLD

Sophomore goaltender IAN SHANE has been strong between the pipes for Cornell so far this year, posting a 1.67 goals-against average, which ranks third nationally.

Shane trails a pair of his ECAC Hockey counterparts in Yale's Luke Pearson (1.53) and Quinnipiac's Yaniv Perets (1.65).

Over his last nine games, Shane has posted a 7-1-1 record with a 1.56 goals-against average and a .913 save percentage (146 saves on 160 shots).

During the stretch, Shane has registered a pair of shutouts which came against then-No. 6 UConn on Nov. 26 at Madison Square Garden, and on Dec. 3 against Dartmouth.

HELLO, AGAIN, NO. 7

© Cornell is playing the No. 7-ranked team in the country for the third time this season, having previously played Quinnipiac (Nov. 5 - L, 0-2) and Harvard (Dec. 2 - OTL, 1-2) when they were ranked in the same spot in the USCHO poll.

Along with its 6-0 win over then-No. 6 UConn at Madison Square Garden on Nov. 26 in The Frozen Apple, Cornell is playing a top-10 opponent for the fourth time this season.

This marks the second consecutive year and the third time in the last four seasons of competition (2018-19, 2021-22, 2022-23) that Cornell is playing at least four games against top-10 competition in a single season.

Dating back to the 1997-98 campaign, Cornell previously has played a top-10 rank at least three times in a season on six other occasions. This is the first time Cornell is playing at least three games against the No. 7 team in the country.

The others include: **2005-06** — Nos. 5 and 10; **2012-13** — No. 1; **2015-16** — No. 1 (five times); **2016-17** — No. 4; **2021-22** — No. 5.

JOINING RARE COMPANY

With his successful penalty shot in last Saturday's victory over RPI, senior forward ZACH TUPKER joined an esteemed group of Big Red players in recording a penalty shot goal while donning the Carnellian Red and White.

Tupker became the first Cornell player to score on a penalty shot since ALEX RAUTER on Nov. 26, 2016, against New Hampshire at Madison Square Garden in third implementation of the biennial Frozen Apple game.

Being awarded a penalty shot has been a relatively rare feat as of late, as Tupker was the first Cornell player to

attempt a penalty shot since TREVOR YATES on Feb. 11, 2017, against Yale.

The goal by Tupker marked just the third time a Cornell player has scored on penalty shot over the last 37 years, joining Rauter and JOE NIEUWENDYK (Feb. 27, 1987 vs. RPI).

There have only been six converted penalty shots in Cornell program history. Along with Nieuwendyk and Rauter, Tupker joins the likes of CARLO UGOLINI (Jan. 20, 1973 vs. Toronto), BROCK TREDWAY (Jan. 17, 1979 vs. Clarkson), and LEN JANKOWSKI (Feb. 24, 1979 vs. Northeastern).

SECOND PERIOD DOMINANCE

Cornell has excelled in the second period this season, outscoring its opponents by 14 goals (24-10) in the frame.

In comparison, Cornell has outscored its opponents by 10 goals, 32-22, in the other two periods of action.

Along with its plus-14 goal differential in the second period, the Big Red have outshot its opponents by 77 shots in the period, 178-101.

In the opening 40 minutes of play, Cornell has a plus-124 advantage in shots on goal (332-208). In the final period of regulation, the Big Red has a plus-24 advantage in shots (135-111).

SCHAFER REACHES MILESTONE

MIKE SCHAFER '86, the Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Hockey, reached a historic milestone on Nov. 4 in the Big Red's 3-1 win at Princeton.

Schafer logged his 500th career head coaching victory, becoming the 21st Division I hockey head coach to reach the 500-win plateau.

■ He is the eighth active head coach – the fourth at the Division I level – to register 500 career coaching victories.

The other Division I coaches include Rand Pecknold of Quinnipiac (598), Mercyhurst's Rick Gotkin (594), and Notre Dame's Jeff Jackson (568).

Schafer's 507 career wins are the most by a Cornell hockey head coach, and is the most by any active head coach of Cornell's 37 sports.

ON THIS DATE (JAN. 14)

Cornell is 10-5-1 all-time on Jan. 14, with six of its victories coming over its last eight games played on the date (6-1-1).

Back in 1978, five Cornell players registered at least four points in the Big Red's 13-3 rout of Boston College at Lynah Rink.

After Cornell and Boston College traded a pair of goals in the first period, the Big Red used 11 unanswered goals over the second and third periods to coast to the victory.

LANCE NETHERY posted seven points (two goals, five assists), while MARK WEISS (four goals, one assist) and DAVE AMBROSIA (two goals, three assists) each had five-point outputs. BROCK TREDWAY (two goals, two assists) and PETER SHIER (one goal, three assists) tallied four points apiece for the Big Red, who posted two more 10-goal performances in the subsequent games over Clarkson (10-2) and Yale (13-1).

FRESH(MAN) HAT TRICK

With his hat trick against UConn at Madison Square Garden on Nov. 26, freshman DALTON BANCROFT became the 16th different Cornell freshman to score at least three goals in a game since first-year players were eligible to play beginning in the 1975-76 season.

Bancroft joins the likes of ROY KERLING (1977-78), BROCK TREDWAY (1977-78), DUANNE MOESER (1982-83), PETE NATYSHAK (1982-83), JOE NIEUWENDYK (1984-85), CHRIS GRENIER (1985-86), CASEY JONES (1986-87), TRENT ANDISON (4 goals in 1987-88), VINCENT AUGER (1993-94), RYAN SMART (1994-95), KYLE KNOPP (1995-96), MATT MOULSON (2002-03), JEFF MALOTT (2016-17), KYLE BETTS (2017-18), and BEN BERARD (2019-20).

It was just the second hat trick by a Cornell player in program history at Madison Square Garden, joining DICK BERTRAND who did so against St. Lawrence on Dec. 23, 1969. Bertrand later became the head coach of the Big Red for 12 seasons from 1970-82, taking over for the legendary NED HARKNESS.

Should Bancroft record another hat trick this season, he would become the sixth Cornell freshman with multiple hat tricks in a season. The others include former NHLers JOE NIEUWENDYK and BROCK TREDWAY, along with ROY KERLING, DUANNE MOESER, and RYAN SMART.

ECAC PRESEASON POLL

ECAC Hockey announced Sept. 21 during its annual Media Day call that the Cornell hockey team was slated to finish fourth.

Finishing ahead of the Big Red was Quinnipiac, who was dubbed the preseason favorite after finishing with eight first-place votes and a 118-point total. Harvard received the remaining four first-place votes, finishing with 109 points. Clarkson was third with 105 points.

Behind Cornell was Clarkson with 90 points, while Colgate (77) and RPI (70) were picked to finish sixth and seventh, respectively.

St. Lawrence (57), Union (45), Dartmouth (43), Yale (32), Brown (26), and Princeton (20) rounded out the 11-team poll.

- 🝊 Matt Brown paces BU's offense with a team-high 26 points (9-17—26) in 20 games. Lane Hutson, who is coming off winning a bronze medal with Team USA at the 2023 IIHF World Junior Championships, also has hit the 20-point plateau this year (7-14-21).
- Drew Commesso has started 14 of the Terriers' 20 games this season, posting a 2.58 goals-against average and a .910 save percentage, with a 10-4-0 record.

SERIES HISTORY

- Saturday will be the 50th all-time meeting between Cornell and Boston University. Cornell leads the series, 26-20-3, and is unbeaten in four of its last five against the Terriers (3-1-1).
- 🝊 Today's meeting marks the first time Cornell is playing at Agganis Arena. This is the first instance of the Big Red playing at Boston University's home rink since Nov. 24 and 25, 2001.
- 🝊 The previous nine games in the series have come at neutral sites. Eight of the neutral-site games have come at Madison Square Garden in the biennial Red Hot Hockey event, the other was the 2018 NCAA Regional in Worcester, Mass.

MIKE SCHAFER '86

Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Ice Hockey 28th Season as Head Coach • 35th Season at Cornell

The longest-tenured head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, MIKE SCHAFER '86, enters his 28th season at the helm of the Cornell men's hockey program.

When Schafer returned to his alma mater in the summer of 1995 to become Cornell's 12th head coach in men's hockey history, Schafer's goal was to bring the Big Red to a position of national prominence.

Already the winningest head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, Schafer has accomplished that objective with his 505-275-103 record. His 505 wins rank fourth among active Division I coaches and his .630 win percentage is good for sixth among active Division I coaches.

Schafer has guided the Big Red to 12 NCAA Tournament appearances and a berth to the 2003 NCAA Frozen Four — the program's first since 1980. That year, Cornell set a school record for wins (30), finishing with one more victory than the 1969-70 national championship squad, who went undefeated (29-0-0). The 2002-03 team's 19-2-1 record in ECAC Hockey play was Cornell's best mark in league play since 1969-70 when Cornell was 21-0 in league action.

In 2020, Schafer was named a co-winner of the Spencer Penrose Award, given to the nation's top head coach. It was the first time Schafer won the award after being a finalist on five occasions after being named ECAC Hockey's Coach of the Year.

The Big Red have been regularly ranked among the nation's elite during Schafer's tenure, including being named No. 1 in both the USCHO.com and the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls at the time the 2019-20 postseason was halted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Cornell has claimed five Whitelaw Cup (ECAC Hockey tournament titles), which surpassed the legendary NED HARKNESS for the most in program history. Schafer has also led the Big Red to three Cleary Cups (ECAC's top regular-season team) in three of the last four years of competition.

In 2002-03, Schafer led the Big Red to the NCAA Frozen Four, setting a school record with 30 wins, one better than the 1969-70 squad who went 29-0-0. Cornell's 19-2-1 mark in ECAC Hockey in 2002-03 was Cornell's best since the 1969-70 team went 21-0 in league play.

Over his career, Schafer has coached 10 different players to First Team All-America status 11 times, seven Ivy League Players of the Year, 5 ECAC Hockey Ken Dryden Award winners (league's best goaltender), five ECAC Hockey Rookies of the Year, and five Ivy Rookies of the Year, and three ECAC Hockey Players of the Year.

A native of Durham, Ontario, Schafer played junior hockey with the Guelph Jr. A Holody Platers, who were finalists in the Centennial Cup for the National Championship in 1982.

Schafer and his wife, Diane, have two sons, Luke and John '18, and a daughter, Michelle.

BEN SYER

11th Season as Associate Head Coach; 12th Season at Cornell Western Ontario '98

Serving as the Big Red's recruiting director and manager of the team's vaunted defensive

unit, BEN SYER's efforts were perhaps no more celebrated than during the 2017-18 season. He helped Cornell lead the nation in team defense with a paltry 1.58 goals-against average and was named the winner of the American Hockey Coaches Association's 2018 Terry Flanagan Award.

One of the AHCA's major annual awards, the Terry Flanagan Award is presented to the assistant coach whose career body of work best honors that of the award's name sake.

"He can hold court with a group of assistant coaches on the road with the best of them," said MIKE SCHAFER, adding that this is the first time he's nominated anyone for a major AHCA award in his 23-year tenure at the helm of the Big Red. "He knows the elder statesmen, but he also knows the young guys like Terry did. He would make sure to say hello to everyone in the rink and lend a helping hand to young assistants. I admired Terry for this. He and his family are of the highest character, upfront and honest."

Syer joined Cornell in June 2011 as an assistant coach, then was promoted to associate head coach the following summer. He previously served as associate head coach during his 12 seasons at Quinnipiac under head coach Rand Pecknold. During that run, the Bobcats posted a 242-168-46 record with one NCAA tournament appearance (2002) and nine 20-win seasons.

A native of Kitchener, Ontario, Syer arrived at Quinnipiac after serving one season as an assistant coach at Ohio University. A 1998 graduate of Western Ontario, Syer earned a bachelor's degree in urban development. He earned his master's degree in physical education with a concentration in athletic administration in 2000.



SEAN FLANAGAN

Seventh Season as Assistant CoachSt. Lawrence '10

Flanagan enters his seventh season as an assistant coach on head coach MIKE SCHAFER's

staff. During his previous six seasons, Flanagan helped guide the Big Red to post a 108-38-19 record, good for a .712 win percentage. In his first three years on Schafer's staff, Flanagan aided Cornell in going 3-for-3 in advancing to the NCAA Tournament (and likely would have been 4-for-4, if the 2019-20 season had not ended prematurely). Prior to arriving on East Hill prior to the 2016-17 season, Flanagan made a couple of stops after his four-year playing career at St. Lawrence. After playing professionally in the ECHL with the Las Vegas Wranglers and Quad City Mallards, he became an assistant coach at Division III Hobart from 2012-15. While working under former Cornell assistant coach Mark Taylor, he helped

build a team who won the ECAC West titles in 2015 and 2016, leading the Statesmen to NCAA Tournament appearances. After Hobart, Flanagan spent one season as the Director of Hockey Operations at UMass Lowell, during the 2015-16 season. Flanagan is no stranger to ECAC Hockey, as he played 121 career games with St. Lawrence up to the 2010-11 season, where he racked up 12 goals and 40 assists for 52 points, helping the Saints advance to the league's championship weekend twice over his four years with the Saints. Flanagan graduated from St. Lawrence with a bachelor of arts degree in history with a minor in sports studies and exercise sciences in 2010 before receiving his master of education degree from St. Lawrence the following year.



MITCH STEPHENS

Fourth Season as Volunteer Assistant Coach; SUNY Geneseo '07

Stephens returns to Cornell after serving as an assistant coach at Geneseo for five years. In his time behind the bench with his alma mater, Stephens helped the Knights win two

SUNYAC conference championships (2016, 2018) and make three NCAA Tournament appearances (2014, 2016, and 2018), including two trips to the national semifinals. As a senior, Stephens was named runner-up for USCHO Division III Player of the Year, an AHCA Division III First Team, and All-America selection, while being a finalist for the AHCA Sid Watson Memorial Award as the NCAA Division III Player of the Year.



BEN RUSSELL

First Season as Director of Hockey Operations; Cornell '20

Russell rejoined the Cornell men's hockey program in Aug. 2022 to serve as the team's Director of Hockey Operations, after spending the last two seasons as an assistant coach

at St. Olaf College, a Minnesota-based Division III school. At St. Olaf, Russell helped the 2021-22 squad to a Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) tournament title and an NCAA Tournament appearance. While attending Cornell for his undergraduate studies, Russell served as an Assistant Director of Hockey Operations, helping coordinate video, analyzing film, and preparing scouting reports, while incorporating advanced analytics into game preparation.

MACDONALD '15 BECOMES THIRD CORNELLIAN TO HOIST STANLEY CUP

ITHACA, N.Y. (JUNE 26, 2022) — JACOB MacDONALD '15 became the third player in Cornell history to lift the Stanley Cup when his Colorado Avalanche defeated the Tampa Bay Lightning, 2-1, in Game 6 of the 2022 Stanley Cup Playoffs at Amalie Arena in Tampa, Fla.

MacDonald joined six-time winner KEN DRYDEN and three-time champion JOE NIEUWENDYK in hoisting the oldest existing trophy awarded to a professional sports franchise in North America.

Since graduating from Cornell, MacDonald has played in the ECHL with the Elmira Jackals and Toledo Walleye, the AHL with the Springfield Falcons, Albany and Binghamton Devils, Springfield Thunderbirds and Colorado Eagles around NHL stints with

the Florida Panthers in 2018-19 and the Avalanche in both 2020-21 and 2021-22.

He played eight regular-season games with Colorado this season and has two goals and eight assists in 43 regular season NHL games.

MacDonald was called up from Colorado of the AHL in early June to provide the Avalanche with some additional depth at the defenseman position.

The three-year starter for the Big Red accumulated four goals and 17 assists for 21 points in 104 career games. His plus-6 rating as a senior ranked second on the club.


