PUCK DROP

The No. 11-ranked Cornell men's hockey team returns to action this weekend, opening a three-game homestand at Lynah Rink when its hosts RPI and Union. Puck drop for both games are scheduled for 7 p.m.

WEEKEND REWIND

Cornell split its trip to New England last weekend, posting a 3-2 victory over Dartmouth before falling to then No. 10-ranked Harvard, 6-2, at Bright-Landry Hockey Center.

Senior defenseman SAM MALINSKI had a team-high three points (two goals, one assist) on the weekend. Freshman forward DALTON BANCROFT and senior forward MAX ANDREEV chipped in two assists apiece.

SAM IS THE MAN

Senior defenseman **SAM MALINSKI** enters this weekend riding a career-long eight-game point streak.

Malinski's point streak matches the longest by a Cornell defenseman in the MIKE SCHAFER era, dating back to the 1995-96 season. MARK MCRAE (2002-03) and PATRICK MCCARRON (2016-17) were the other pair of blueliners to accomplish the feat previously.

With a point on Friday against RPI, Malinski would become the sixth Big Red player (seventh occurrence) to have a nine-game point streak under Schafer, joining MATT STIENBURG (11 games in 2021-22), MATT MOULSON (10 games in 2005-06 and 9 games in 2003-04), RYAN KNOPP (9 games in 1996-97), MIKE KNOEPFLI (9 games in 2004-05), and TOPHER SCOTT (9 games in 2006-07).

Among active streaks, Malinski has the second-longest point streak by a defenseman, trailing Boston University's freshman blueliner Lane Hutson (10 games).

LYNAH FAITHFUL

Five of Cornell's next six games will be played at the friendly confines of Lynah Rink, and history has shown playing in front of the Lynah Faithful has favored the Big Red.

Since MIKE SCHAFER '86 took over as head coach prior to the 1995-96 season, the Big Red have a 268-102-45 record at Lynah Rink (.700).

Per data compiled from CollegeHockeyNews.com's database, Cornell boasts the sixth-highest home win percentage since Schafer took over as head coach. Only Michigan (.752), Quinnipiac (.726), North Dakota (.723), Boston College (.708), and Denver (.706) have higher win percentages.

Cornell has been a hostile place to play over the last six-plus seasons, as the Big Red's .781 win percentage at home (54-13-6) is second behind Minnesota State (.850).

'SPECIAL' IN SPECIAL TEAMS

Cornell had its streak of consecutive games with a power-play goal snapped at seven in last Saturday's loss to Harvard, going 0-for-3 on the man advantage.

The Big Red has recorded a power-play goal in seven of its last eight games, converting 44.0 percent (11-of-25) of its opportunities in the span.

Cornell has the third-best power play percentage in Division I hockey (19-of-66 - .288), trailing North Dakota (36-of-111 — .324) and UMass (20-of-67 — .299).

Over its last seven games, Cornell has scored on six of its last nine power plays in the second period, and is 7-of-15 (.467) overall in the stretch.

KILL, RED, KILL

Cornell has successfully killed 39 of its last 46 penalties (84.5 percent) over its last 15 games. Four of the seven power-play goals allowed by the Big Red since Nov. 18 came on Jan. 7 against RPI, with three of the four markers coming during a five-minute power play.

Entering this weekend, Cornell ranks 14th nationally in penalty kill percentage (.838) and its 12 power-play goals against is tied with Michigan Tech, UMass Lowell, and Ohio State for the fourthfewest by a Division I program this season. Harvard (8), Dartmouth and Sacred Heart (9 each) - all teams Cornell has played this season — have fewer totals.

In the first period this season, Cornell has killed 19 of its opponent's 20 power plays in the opening 20 minutes. After allowing a power-play goal to Clarkson on Nov. 12, the Big Red has killed its last 11 penalties in the first period.

RARELY VISITING THE SIN BIN

Cornell has only been called for four minor penalties over its last 10 periods, dating back to the third period of the Big Red's upset of then-No. 1 Quinnipiac at Lynah Rink on Jan. 20.

🧸 The Big Red had a stretch of 92:26 in which it did not commit a penalty, including the entire duration of Cornell's 3-2 win over Dartmouth last Friday, before that streak ended at Harvard.

Last Friday's game against Dartmouth was the first time Cornell did not commit a penalty in a game since Jan. 4, 2019, at Princeton, in which both teams did not incur a penalty.

Over Cornell's last 11 games, the Big Red has had just four penalties called against them in the third period. After conceding a third-period power-play goal at Boston University on Jan. 14, Cornell has gone the last 88:10 of third-period action without having a penalty called.

NONE SHALL PASS

Cornell enters this weekend boasting one of the nation's top scoring defenses. The Big Red has yielded 47 goals allowed so far this year, the fewest allowed by a Division I program.

The Big Red's 2.24 goals allowed average ranks seventh in the nation, and is second in ECAC Hockey only behind Quinnipiac (1.85).

Historically, Cornell has boasted one of the stingiest defensive units in Division I hockey. The Big Red has ranked in the top 10 in scoring defense in five of the last six seasons. The lone year Cornell did not rank in the top 10 was 2020-21, the year the Big Red did not play due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Since 2016-17, Cornell has allowed 370 goals which stands as the fewest by a Division I team in that span, and is 94 goals ahead of Harvard, who is in second with 464 goals allowed in

the span. The Big Red's 1.99 goals allowed per game average since 2016-17 ranks second behind Minnesota State (1.84).

SHANE'S WORLD

Sophomore goaltender IAN SHANE has been strong between the pipes for Cornell so far this year, posting a 1.92 goals-against average, which ranks sixth nationally and is second in ECAC Hockey behind Quinnipiac's Yaniv Perets, who has a Division I-leading 1.78 figure.

Shane is currently up for two award nominations, as he was named to the Mike Richter Award watch list on Jan. 12, and is Cornell's lone nominee for this year's Hobey Baker Memorial Award.

He is the first Cornell goaltender to be named to the Richter Award watch list in consecutive seasons since Michael Galajda in 2018-19 and 2019-20.

Over Shane's last 13 games, he has garnered an 9-3-1 record with a 1.93 goals-against average and .909 save percentage (251 saves on 276 shots).

■ During the stretch, Shane has recorded all three of his shutouts this season, two of which have come against opponents ranked in the top 10 of the USCHO.com poll, including No. 6 UConn on Nov. 26 at Madison Square Garden, and last Friday against then-top-ranked Quinnipiac.

Recording a pair of shutouts against top-10 opposition has been a rare feat this season as Shane is one of three Division Lolar

been a rare feat this season as Shane is one of three Division I players to do so, joining Wisconsin's Jared Moe and St. Cloud State's Jaxon Castor.

SECOND PERIOD DOMINANCE

Cornell has excelled in the second period this season, outscoring its opponents by 13 goals (29-16) in the frame and outshooting the opposition by 81, 228-147.

In comparison, Cornell has outscored its opponents by a combined 12 goals, 42-30, in the other two periods of action.

Over the opening 40 minutes of play, Cornell has generated a plus-144 advantage in shots on goal (444-300). In the final period of regulation, the Big Red has a plus-21 advantage in shots (175-154).

SPREADING THE WEALTH

Cornell has been spreading the wealth offensively this season as every single skater has recorded at least one point this season.

• Of the 22 skaters who have played this season, every player has recorded at least one point. It is the most players with a point since the 2019-20 team had 23 players register at least one point.

The 20 different goal scorers this year marks the seventh consecutive year at least 20 players have scored a goal for the Big Red, and the 20 different players with an assist is the eighth straight season Cornell has had 20-plus players with at least one helper.

Cornell's win over Princeton on Jan. 21 marked the 1,200th all-time victory for the Cornell men's hockey program.

With the victory, the Big Red became the 17th college program to reach the 1200-win plateau, and just the fourth ECAC Hockey program to do so (Clarkson, Harvard, and Yale). The others on the list include Minnesota, Michigan, Boston College, Boston University, North Dakota, Denver, Michigan State, Michigan Tech, Wisconsin, New Hampshire, Colorado College, Minnesota Duluth, and Army.

JOINING RARE COMPANY

With his penalty shot goal in the Big Red's victory over RPI on Jan. 7, senior forward **ZACH TUPKER** joined an rare group of Big Red players in scoring on a penalty shot while donning the Carnellian Red and White.

Tupker became the first Cornell player to score on a penalty shot since **ALEX RAUTER** on Nov. 26, 2016, against New Hampshire at Madison Square Garden.

Being awarded a penalty shot has been a relatively rare feat for Cornell, as Tupker was the first Big Red player to attempt a penalty shot since **TREVOR YATES** on Feb. 11, 2017, against Yale.

MIKE SCHAFER '86, the Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Hockey, reached a historic milestone on Nov. 4 in the Big Red's 3-1 win at Princeton.

Schafer logged his 500th career head coaching victory, becoming the 21st Division I hockey head coach to reach the 500-win plateau.

■ He is the eighth active head coach — the fourth at the Division I level — to register 500 career coaching victories.

The other Division I coaches include Rand Pecknold of Quinnipiac (598), Mercyhurst's Rick Gotkin (594), and Notre Dame's Jeff Jackson (568).

Schafer's 512 career wins are the most by a Cornell hockey head coach, and is the most by any active head coach of Cornell's 37 sports.

Cornell will be playing on Feb. 3 for the 23rd time in program history on Friday, and the first time since 2018 when RPI defeated the Big Red 2-1 at Lynah Rink.

🥌 The Big Red have a 12-8-2 record on Feb. 3, and has won six of its last nine games (6-2-1) on the date.

It will be the fourth time Cornell and RPI are playing on Feb. 3. RPI is unbeaten in the contests, 2-0-1, claiming a 4-3 victory in 1984, along with the 2018 win. The two teams played to a 2-2 tie in 2012 at Houston Field House.

© Cornell's last win on Feb. 3 came in 2017 when it defeated No. 4-ranked Union, 5-3. **ANTHONY ANGELLO** scored twice, while **JEFF KUBIAK**, **TREVOR YATES**, and **JAKE WEIDNER** each logged two-point nights.

ON THIS DATE (FEB. 4)

Saturday's game will be Cornell's 18th all-time game on Feb. 4. The Big Red have an 11-5-1 mark on the date, having won five of its last seven (5-1-1).

It will be the second meeting between Union and Cornell on Feb. 4, with the other instance coming at Messa Rink in 2012 when the contest was played to a 4-4 tie. Future NHLer Shayne Gostisbehere factored in all four of Union's goals (one goal, three assist). **PATRICK McCARRON** (two assists) and **MATHIEU BRISSON** (goal, assist) had multiple points for Cornell.

Back in 1978, Cornell defeated Dartmouth, 12-2, at Lynah Rink behind six-point nights by **ROY KERLING** (two goals, four assists) and **MARK WEISS** (three goals, three assists). **LANCE NETHERY** and **BROCK TREDWAY** each chipped in with a goal and three helpers.

Cornell is 5-1 all-time at Lynah Rink on Feb. 4, and 6-2 all-time at home. The Big Red defeated UMass, 4-0, in 1922, and lost to Williams, 4-2 in double overtime, in 1927 on Beebe Lake.

FRESH(MAN) HAT TRICK

With his hat trick against UConn at Madison Square Garden on Nov. 26, freshman **DALTON BANCROFT** became the 16th Cornell freshman to score at least three goals in a game since first-year players were eligible to play in 1975-76.

Bancroft joined ROY KERLING (1977-78), BROCK TREDWAY (1977-78), DUANNE MOESER (1982-83), PETE NATYSHAK (1982-83), JOE NIEUWENDYK (1984-85), CHRIS GRENIER (1985-86), CASEY JONES (1986-87), TRENT ANDISON (4 goals in 1987-88), VINCENT AUGER (1993-94), RYAN SMART (1994-95), KYLE KNOPP (1995-96), MATT MOULSON (2002-03), JEFF MALOTT (2016-17), KYLE BETTS (2017-18), and BEN BERARD (2019-20).

It was just the second hat trick by a Cornell player in program history at Madison Square Garden, joining **DICK BERTRAND** who did so against St. Lawrence on Dec. 23, 1969. Bertrand later became the head coach of the Big Red for 12 seasons from 1970-82, taking over for the legendary **NED HARKNESS**.

Should Bancroft record another hat trick this season, he would become the sixth Cornell freshman with multiple hat tricks in a season. The others include former NHLers JOE NIEUWENDYK and BROCK TREDWAY, along with ROY KERLING, DUANNE MOESER, and RYAN SMART.

ECAC PRESEASON POLL

© ECAC Hockey announced Sept. 21 during its annual Media Day call that the Cornell hockey team was slated to finish fourth.

Finishing ahead of the Big Red was Quinnipiac, who was dubbed the preseason favorite after finishing with eight first-place votes and a 118-point total. Harvard received the remaining four first-place votes, finishing with 109 points. Clarkson was third with 105 points.

Behind Cornell was Clarkson with 90 points, while Colgate (77) and RPI (70) were picked to finish sixth and seventh, respectively.

St. Lawrence (57), Union (45), Dartmouth (43), Yale (32), Brown (26), and Princeton (20) rounded out the 11-team poll.

LEADERSHIP GROUP ANNOUNCED

Senior defensemen **SAM MALINSKI** and **TRAVIS MITCHELL** were named co-captains, and fifth-year forward **MAX ANDREEV** and senior forward **MATT STIENBURG** were tabbed co-alternate captains back on Sept. 29.

All four players are currently assuming leadership roles for the first time with the Cornell hockey program.

- In a tale of two venues, the Engineers have a 10-3-1 record on its home ice at Houston Field House this season, but is winless in its contests away from Troy (0-12-0).
- The Engineers are coming off a 6-0 loss to its Capital Region rival Union in the 10th annual Mayor's Cup at MVP Arena in Albany last Saturday.
- Sutter Muzzatti paces the Engineers offense with 17 points (six goals, 11 assists). Jakob Lee is right behind with 16 points (six goals, 10 assists). Ryan Mahshie has a team-leading 10 goals on the year.
- Jack Watson has started 23 of RPI's 26 games this season, logging a 3.20 goals-against average and an .888 save percentage.

SERIES HISTORY

- Friday will be the 118th all-time meeting between the two Empire State programs, which dates back to the first meeting back on Jan. 31, 1908 in Albany, N.Y., at Empire Rink.
- Sornell has a 67-39-11 advantage in the series, with the Big Red going unbeaten in nine of its last 11 against the Engineers (7-2-2).

Since 2016-17, Cornell has scored at least three goals in 14 of the 15 games against Union. The Big Red have also scored at least four goals in 10 of the 15 meetings, including each of the last four.

In his first game at Messa Rink since transferring from Union, junior forward **GABRIEL SEGER** posted his third career three-point game, aiding Cornell to a 6-1 victory over the Dutchmen on Jan. 6.

Seger scored a goal and logged a pair of assists to record his third career three-point game, while senior forward **JACK MALONE** registered his first career multi-goal game with his two tallies.

Fellow seniors **SAM MALINSKI** (two assists) and **BEN BERARD** (one goal, one assist) also logged multi-point nights for Cornell.

Sophomore goaltender IAN SHANE stopped 18 Union shots for the Big Red.

FAMILIAR FACES

Along with Seger squaring off against the team he spent the previous three years with, Union has a familiar face to many Cornell fans in **BEN TUPKER**, the twin brother of current Big Red forward **ZACH TUPKER**.

MIKE SCHAFER '86

Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Ice Hockey 28th Season as Head Coach • 35th Season at Cornell

The longest-tenured head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, MIKE SCHAFER '86, enters his 28th season at the helm of the Cornell men's hockey program.

When Schafer returned to his alma mater in the summer of 1995 to become Cornell's 12th head coach in men's hockey history, Schafer's goal was to bring the Big Red to a position of national prominence.

Already the winningest head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, Schafer has accomplished that objective with his 512-278-104 record. His 512 wins rank fourth among active Division I coaches and his .631 win percentage is good for sixth among active Division I coaches.

Schafer has guided the Big Red to 12 NCAA Tournament appearances and a berth to the 2003 NCAA Frozen Four — the program's first since 1980. That year, Cornell set a school record for wins (30), finishing with one more victory than the 1969-70 national championship squad, who went undefeated (29-0-0). The 2002-03 team's 19-2-1 record in ECAC Hockey play was Cornell's best mark in league play since 1969-70 when Cornell was 21-0 in league action.

In 2020, Schafer was named a co-winner of the Spencer Penrose Award, given to the nation's top head coach. It was the first time Schafer won the award after being a finalist on five occasions after being named ECAC Hockey's Coach of the Year.

The Big Red have been regularly ranked among the nation's elite during Schafer's tenure, including being named No. 1 in both the USCHO.com and the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls at the time the 2019-20 postseason was halted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Cornell has claimed five Whitelaw Cup (ECAC Hockey tournament titles), which surpassed the legendary NED HARKNESS for the most in program history. Schafer has also led the Big Red to three Cleary Cups (ECAC's top regular-season team) in three of the last four years of competition.

In 2002-03, Schafer led the Big Red to the NCAA Frozen Four, setting a school record with 30 wins, one better than the 1969-70 squad who went 29-0-0. Cornell's 19-2-1 mark in ECAC Hockey in 2002-03 was Cornell's best since the 1969-70 team went 21-0 in league play.

Over his career, Schafer has coached 10 different players to First Team All-America status 11 times, seven Ivy League Players of the Year, 5 ECAC Hockey Ken Dryden Award winners (league's best goaltender), five ECAC Hockey Rookies of the Year, and five Ivy Rookies of the Year, and three ECAC Hockey Players of the Year.

A native of Durham, Ontario, Schafer played junior hockey with the Guelph Jr. A Holody Platers, who were finalists in the Centennial Cup for the National Championship in 1982.

Schafer and his wife, Diane, have two sons, Luke and John '18, and a daughter, Michelle.

BEN SYER

11th Season as Associate Head Coach; 12th Season at Cornell Western Ontario '98

Serving as the Big Red's recruiting director and manager of the team's vaunted defensive unit, **BEN SYER**'s efforts were perhaps no more celebrated

than during the 2017-18 season. He helped Cornell lead the nation in team defense with a paltry 1.58 goals-against average and was named the winner of the American Hockey Coaches Association's 2018 Terry Flanagan Award.

One of the AHCA's major annual awards, the Terry Flanagan Award is presented to the assistant coach whose career body of work best honors that of the award's name sake.

"He can hold court with a group of assistant coaches on the road with the best of them," said **MIKE SCHAFER**, adding that this is the first time he's nominated anyone for a major AHCA award in his 23-year tenure at the helm of the Big Red. "He knows the elder statesmen, but he also knows the young

guys like Terry did. He would make sure to say hello to everyone in the rink and lend a helping hand to young assistants. I admired Terry for this. He and his family are of the highest character, upfront and honest."

Syer joined Cornell in June 2011 as an assistant coach, then was promoted to associate head coach the following summer. He previously served as associate head coach during his 12 seasons at Quinnipiac under head coach Rand Pecknold. During that run, the Bobcats posted a 242-168-46 record with one NCAA tournament appearance (2002) and nine 20-win seasons.

A native of Kitchener, Ontario, Syer arrived at Quinnipiac after serving one season as an assistant coach at Ohio University. A 1998 graduate of Western Ontario, Syer earned a bachelor's degree in urban development. He earned his master's degree in physical education with a concentration in athletic administration in 2000.



SEAN FLANAGAN

Seventh Season as Assistant Coach

St. Lawrence '10

Flanagan enters his seventh season as an assistant coach on head coach **MIKE SCHAFER**'s staff. During his previous six seasons, Flanagan

helped guide the Big Red to post a 108-38-19 record, good for a .712 win percentage. In his first three years on Schafer's staff, Flanagan aided Cornell in going 3-for-3 in advancing to the NCAA Tournament (and likely would have been 4-for-4, if the 2019-20 season had not ended prematurely). Prior to arriving on East Hill prior to the 2016-17 season, Flanagan made a couple of stops after his four-year playing career at St. Lawrence. After playing professionally in the ECHL with the Las Vegas Wranglers and Quad City Mallards, he became an assistant coach at Division III Hobart from 2012-15. While working under

former Cornell assistant coach Mark Taylor, he helped build a team who won the ECAC West titles in 2015 and 2016, leading the Statesmen to NCAA Tournament appearances. After Hobart, Flanagan spent one season as the Director of Hockey Operations at UMass Lowell, during the 2015-16 season. Flanagan is no stranger to ECAC Hockey, as he played 121 career games with St. Lawrence up to the 2010-11 season, where he racked up 12 goals and 40 assists for 52 points, helping the Saints advance to the league's championship weekend twice over his four years with the Saints. Flanagan graduated from St. Lawrence with a bachelor of arts degree in history with a minor in sports studies and exercise sciences in 2010 before receiving his master of education degree from St. Lawrence the following year.



MITCH STEPHENS

Fourth Season as Volunteer
Assistant Coach; SUNY Geneseo '07

Stephens returns to Cornell after serving as an assistant coach at Geneseo for five years. In his time behind the bench with his alma mater, Stephens helped the Knights win two SUNYAC

conference championships (2016, 2018) and make three NCAA Tournament appearances (2014, 2016, and 2018), including two trips to the national semifinals. As a senior, Stephens was named runner-up for USCHO Division III Player of the Year, an AHCA Division III First Team, and All-America selection, while being a finalist for the AHCA Sid Watson Memorial Award as the NCAA Division III Player of the Year.



BEN RUSSELL

First Season as Director of Hockey Operations; Cornell '20

Russell rejoined the Cornell men's hockey program in Aug. 2022 to serve as the team's Director of Hockey Operations, after spending the last two seasons as an assistant coach at St. Olaf

College, a Minnesota-based Division III school. At St. Olaf, Russell helped the 2021-22 squad to a Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) tournament title and an NCAA Tournament appearance. While attending Cornell for his undergraduate studies, Russell served as an Assistant Director of Hockey Operations, helping coordinate video, analyzing film, and preparing scouting reports, while incorporating advanced analytics into game preparation.

MACDONALD '15 BECOMES THIRD CORNELLIAN TO HOIST STANLEY CUP

ITHACA, N.Y. (JUNE 26, 2022) — **JACOB MACDONALD** '15 became the third player in Cornell history to lift the Stanley Cup when his Colorado Avalanche defeated the Tampa Bay Lightning, 2-1, in Game 6 of the 2022 Stanley Cup Playoffs at Amalie Arena in Tampa, Fla.

MacDonald joined six-time winner **KEN DRYDEN** and three-time champion **JOE NIEUWENDYK** in hoisting the oldest existing trophy awarded to a professional sports franchise in North America.

Since graduating from Cornell, MacDonald has played in the ECHL with the Elmira Jackals and Toledo Walleye, the AHL with the Springfield Falcons, Albany and Binghamton Devils, Springfield Thunderbirds and Colorado Eagles around NHL stints with the Florida Panthers in 2018-19 and the Avalanche in both 2020-21 and 2021-22.

He played eight regular-season games with Colorado this season and has two goals and eight assists in 43 regular season NHL games.

MacDonald was called up from Colorado of the AHL in early June to provide the Avalanche with some additional depth at the defenseman position.

The three-year starter for the Big Red accumulated four goals and 17 assists for 21 points in 104 career games. His plus-6 rating as a senior ranked second on the club.




