PUCK DROP

For the first time in 55 days, the Cornell men's hockey team will play a true road game when it takes on Union and RPI in the Capital Region this weekend.

AIC RECAP

Cornell posted an 8-4 victory in the opening game of a two-game series with AIC. JACK MALONE (1+2-3) and ONDREJ PSENICKA (2-1-3) each registered three-point games in the victory for the Big Red. Sophomore SULLIVAN MACK (2-0-2) logged his first career multi-goal game in the win.

In the series finale, Cornell avenged a pair of two-goal deficits to post a 3-3 tie with AIC last Friday (Dec. 30). Freshman NICK DESANTIS recorded a two-goal game and Psenicka tallied the gametying goal during an extra-attacker situation.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...

Seven of Cornell's last eight games have been played at Lynah Rink. The lone game not played at the Big Red's home rink since its last true road game (Nov. 12 at Clarkson) was Nov. 26 at Madison Square Garden in The Frozen Apple when Cornell routed then-No. 6 UConn, 6-0, at the World's Most Famous Arena.

It is the longest stretch between road games since also going 55 days between road games in the 2015-16 season (Nov. 21, 2015 at Brown and Jan. 15, 2016 at RPI).

The 55 days in between Cornell road games is tied for the fifth-longest streak in program history. It trails a quartet of 62-day stretches that occurred during the 2005-06, 2010-11, 2013-14, and 2014-15 campaigns.

This is the seventh time Cornell has had a 55-day stretch in between road games. The other seasons include 2003-04, 2006-07, 2007-08, 2011-12, 2012-13, and 2015-16.

NONE SHALL PASS...

Cornell enters this weekend boasting one of the nation's top scoring defenses. The Big Red has yielded 28 goals over 14 games.

The Big Red's 2.00 goals per game average ranks second in the nation, only behind ECAC Hockey counterpart Quinnipiac (1.84).

■ Dating back to the beginning of the 2016-17 season, Cornell has boasted one of the stingier defensive units in Division I hockey. Cornell has been ranked in the top 10 in scoring defense in five of the last six seasons, with the lone year being 2020-21, which was not played due to the pandemic.

Since 2016-17, Cornell has allowed an average of 1.96 goals per game, which ranks second nationally (Minnesota State — 1.85).

DESANTIS NAMED ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Freshman forward NICK DESANTIS has been named ECAC Hockey's Rookie of the Week, the conference office announced Wednesday morning.

Last week, DeSantis recorded a trio of goals in the Big Red's two-game, non-conference series with AIC at Lynah Rink. DeSantis scored twice in the Big Red's 3-3 tie with the Yellow Jackets last Friday after registering his first career multi-point game in Cornell's 8-4 victory over AIC the previous night.

DeSantis became the third different Cornell player to be named ECAC Hockey's top weekly newcomer, joining **SEAN DONALDSON** (Nov. 21) and **DALTON BANCROFT** (Nov. 28).

The Collegeville, Pa., native currently leads Cornell in goal scoring with five goals. Bancroft, sophomore ONDREJ PSENICKA, and senior TRAVIS MITCHELL are right behind DeSantis with four goals apiece.

Along with having the most goals scored, DeSantis has a shooting percentage of .385, which is the highest of any Big Red skater. Sophomore **SULLIVAN MACK** is the only other player with a shooting percentage north of 30 percent (.333).

The weekly award marks the fourth consecutive time a Cornell player has received recognition from the conference office. Along with the freshman trio, IAN SHANE was tabbed ECAC Hockey's Goaltender of the Week on Dec. 5.

SCHAFER REACHES MILESTONE

Cornell's 37 varsity sports.

MIKE SCHAFER '86, the Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Hockey, reached a historic milestone Nov. 4 in the Big Red's 3-1 win at Princeton.

Schafer logged his 500th career head coaching victory, becoming the 21st Division I hockey head coach to reach the 500-win plateau.

■ He is the eighth active head coach – the fourth at the Division I level – to register 500 career coaching victories.

The other Division I coaches include Rand Pecknold of Quinnipiac (596), Mercyhurst's Rick Gotkin (594), and Notre Dame's Jeff Jackson (567).

Schafer's 507 career wins stand as the most by a Cornell hockey head coach in program history, and is the most by any active head coach of

KILL, RED, KILL

Over its last eight games, Cornell has successfully killed off its last 20 penalties, dating back to Nov. 18 against Yale. The Big Red have also killed off 90.0 percent (36-of-40) of its penalties since Nov. 4.

Thanks to a stingy penalty kill of late, Cornell ranks third nationally in penalty kill percentage (43-of-48-89.6 percent). The Big Red trails Ohio State (76-of-84-90.5 percent) and is right behind Dartmouth (44-of-49-89.8 percent).

© Cornell has yielded just five power-play goals against this season, which is tied with fellow Ivy League foes Dartmouth and Harvard for the fewest by a Division I program this season.

SHANE'S WORLD

Sophomore goaltender IAN SHANE has been strong between the pipes for Cornell so far this year, posting a Division I-leading 1.53 goals-against average.

Shane also has a .926 save percentage, which ranks eighth nationally and is second amongst ECAC Hockey netminders (Harvard's Mitchell Gibson – .928).

Over Shane's last six games, he has posted a 4-1-1 record to go along with a 1.17 goals-against average and a .936 save percentage (102-of-109).

During the stretch, Shane has registered a pair of shutouts which came against then-No. 6 UConn on Nov. 26 at Madison Square Garden, and on Dec. 3 against Dartmouth.

POINT SEGER

GABRIEL SEGER has been having a knack for finding the scoresheet as of late, registering at least one point in nine of his 12 games played. He leads Cornell with 10 points (2-8–10), the lone Big Red player with a double-digit point total.

Seger has an assist in each of his last three games, which is a career-long assist streak for the native of Uppsala, Sweden. He previously had a quartet of two-game assist streaks, three of which came during his time with Union.

With a point in the weekend opener against Union, Seger will have points in four straight games for the second time this season, matching his career long streak (accomplished between Nov. 11 and Nov. 26).

DOMINATING OFFENSIVELY

Sornell has excelled in the second period this season, outscoring its opponents by 12 goals (18-6) in the frame.

In comparison, Cornell has outscored its opponents by just five goals 26-21 in the other two periods of action.

Along with its plus-12 goal differential in the second period, the Big Red have outshot its opponents by 73 shots in the period, 156-83.

In the opening 40 minutes of play, Cornell has a plus-103 advantage in shots on goal (287-184). The third period has not fared as well for the Big Red as Cornell has outshot its opponents by 18, 120-102.

BLUE LINER LIGHTS THE LAMP

Following his second-period goal against AIC last Thursday, TRAVIS MITCHELL became the fourth Cornell defenseman (fifth occurrence) since 1990-91 to score in three consecutive games.

Mitchell was the first Big Red blue liner since NICK D'AGOSTINO in 2010-11 to register a goal in three consecutive games. DOUG MURRAY (4-game streak in 2000-01; 3-game streak in 2001-02) and MARK MoRAE (2000-01) are the others.

ON THIS DATE (JAN. 6)

Cornell is playing on Jan. 6 for the 19th time in program history and for the first time since 2018. The Big Red is 11-6-1 all-time on the date and has won six of its last eight (6-1-1).

The only other time Cornell and Union met on Jan. 6 was back in 1995 when it defeated the Dutchmen, 4-1, at Messa Rink at Achilles Center.

ROB LEVASSEUR (1989) and JAKE KARAM (1995) each recorded hat tricks on the date, coming against Brown and Yale, respectively.

ON THIS DATE (JAN. 7)

Cornell will be playing on Jan. 7 for the 17th time in program history. The Big Red is 10-3-3 all-time on Jan. 7 and is unbeaten over its last seven games on the date (5-0-2).

The Big Red and Engineers have only played on Jan. 7, which also came in 1995. RPI posted a 4-1 victory over the Big Red at Houston Field House.

It will be Cornell's first time playing an ECAC opponent on the date since squaring off against Princeton at Hobey Baker Memorial Rink in 2011. Cornell has played three games since then, squaring off against Colorado College in 2012, Merrimack in 2017, and North Dakota last year.

FRESH(MAN) HAT TRICK

With his hat trick against UConn at Madison Square Garden on Nov. 26, freshman DALTON BANCROFT became the 16th different Cornell freshman to score at least three goals in a game since first-year players were eligible to play beginning in the 1975-76 season.

Bancroft joins the likes of ROY KERLING (1977-78), BROCK TREDWAY (1977-78), DUANNE MOESER (1982-83), PETE NATYSHAK (1982-83), JOE NIEUWENDYK (1984-85), CHRIS GRENIER (1985-86), CASEY JONES (1986-87), TRENT ANDISON (4 goals in 1987-88), VINCENT AUGER (1993-94), RYAN SMART (1994-95), KYLE KNOPP (1995-96), MATT MOULSON (2002-03), JEFF MALOTT (2016-17), KYLE BETTS (2017-18), and BEN BERARD (2019-20).

It was just the second hat trick by a Cornell player in program history at Madison Square Garden, joining DICK BERTRAND who did so against St. Lawrence on Dec. 23, 1969. Bertrand later became the head coach of the Big Red for 12 seasons from 1970-82, taking over for the legendary NED HARKNESS.

Should Bancroft record another hat trick this season, he would become the sixth Cornell freshman with multiple hat tricks in a season, joining ROY KERLING, BROCK TREDWAY, DUANNE MOESER, JOE NIEUWENDYK, and RYAN SMART.

SCHMIDT WITH TEAM USA

Schmidt is slated to be away from the Cornell men's hockey team for this weekend's series, but for a good cause.

Schmidt, who is currently in his 13th season as the Big Red's equipment manager, has been serving as one of two equipment managers with Team USA at the 2023 IIHF World Junior Championships in Halifax, Nova Scotia, and Moncton, New Brunswick.

This is Schmidt's first time working with Team USA's World Junior team, but he is no stranger to USA Hockey. Schmidt has worked multiple USA Hockey camps in Buffalo, N.Y., recently.

ECAC PRESEASON POLL

ECAC Hockey announced Sept. 21 during its annual Media Day call that the Cornell hockey team was slated to finish fourth. Finishing ahead of the Big Red was Quinnipiac, who was dubbed the preseason favorite after finishing with eight first-place votes and a 118-point total. Harvard received the remaining four first-place votes, finishing with 109 points. Clarkson was third with 105 points.

Sornell followed Clarkson with 90 points, while Colgate (77), RPI (70), St. Lawrence (57), Union (45), Dartmouth (43), Yale (32), Brown (26), and Princeton (20) rounded out the poll.

LEADERSHIP GROUP ANNOUNCED

Senior defensemen SAM MALINSKI and TRAVIS MITCHELL were named co-captains, while fifth-year forward MAX ANDREEV and senior forward MATT STIENBURG were tabbed co-alternate captains on Sept. 29.

All four players are assuming leadership roles for the first time with the Cornell hockey program.

FIRST TEAM RETURNERS

Senior defender SAM MALINSKI is one of six returning players who have already received first-team honors from ECAC Hockey. Malinski is the lone Big Red representative on the list, while Clarkson's Alex Campbell and Mathieu Gosselin, Quinnipiac's Zach Metsa and Yaniv Perets, and St. Lawrence's Cameron Buhl (in 2020-21) are the others on the list.

The six ECAC representatives are tied with Atlantic Hockey for the most returning first-team selections for their respective conferences. Three of the six Atlantic Hockey first-team players have since transferred to different programs

© Cornell returns 81 percent of its goals scored from last season, which was the eighth-highest percentage by a Division I program entering the 2022-23 season.

Air Force led the nation, returning all of its scoring from the 2021-22 season. Penn State (93 percent) had the second-highest total, while Dartmouth (86 percent), Northeastern (85 percent), Sacred Heart and Yale (84 percent), and St. Lawrence (83 percent) were ahead of the Big Red.

Colorado College and North Dakota round out the top 10 with their 80 percent totals.

• Of the seven programs ahead of Cornell, the Big Red are slated to play four of the teams this season (Dartmouth, Sacred Heart, St. Lawrence, and Yale).

TOWERING OVER THE COMPETITION

According to CollegeHockeyInc.com's preseason media kit, Cornell entered the 2022-23 season tied for being the second-tallest Division I program.

The Big Red's average 6-foot-1 height was tied with Lindenwood. Both programs trail Vermont, who edges the Big Red and Lions by a mere six inches.

The Big Red have a two-inch advantage over Clarkson for the tallest ECAC Hockey program. The Golden Knights are tied with Boston University for the fourth-tallest Division I program.

Sophomore forward ONDREJ PSENICKA, who stands at 6-foot-6, is tied with Harvard forward Ryan Drkulec, Quinnipiac goaltender Chase Clark, and RPI forward Sutter

MIKE SCHAFER '86

Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Ice Hockey 28th Season as Head Coach • 35th Season at Cornell

The longest-tenured head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, MIKE SCHAFER '86, enters his 28th season at the helm of the Cornell men's hockey program.

When Schafer returned to his alma mater in the summer of 1995 to become Cornell's 12th head coach in men's hockey history, Schafer's goal was to bring the Big Red to a position of national prominence.

Already the winningest head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, Schafer has accomplished that objective with his 505-275-103 record. His 505 wins rank fourth among active Division I coaches and his .630 win percentage is good for sixth among active Division I coaches.

Schafer has guided the Big Red to 12 NCAA Tournament appearances and a berth to the 2003 NCAA Frozen Four — the program's first since 1980. That year, Cornell set a school record for wins (30), finishing with one more victory than the 1969-70 national championship squad, who went undefeated (29-0-0). The 2002-03 team's 19-2-1 record in ECAC Hockey play was Cornell's best mark in league play since 1969-70 when Cornell was 21-0 in league action.

In 2020, Schafer was named a co-winner of the Spencer Penrose Award, given to the nation's top head coach. It was the first time Schafer won the award after being a finalist on five occasions after being named ECAC Hockey's Coach of the Year.

The Big Red have been regularly ranked among the nation's elite during Schafer's tenure, including being named No. 1 in both the USCHO.com and the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls at the time the 2019-20 postseason was halted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Cornell has claimed five Whitelaw Cup (ECAC Hockey tournament titles), which surpassed the legendary NED HARKNESS for the most in program history. Schafer has also led the Big Red to three Cleary Cups (ECAC's top regular-season team) in three of the last four years of competition.

In 2002-03, Schafer led the Big Red to the NCAA Frozen Four, setting a school record with 30 wins, one better than the 1969-70 squad who went 29-0-0. Cornell's 19-2-1 mark in ECAC Hockey in 2002-03 was Cornell's best since the 1969-70 team went 21-0 in league play.

Over his career, Schafer has coached 10 different players to First Team All-America status 11 times, seven Ivy League Players of the Year, 5 ECAC Hockey Ken Dryden Award winners (league's best goaltender), five ECAC Hockey Rookies of the Year, and five Ivy Rookies of the Year, and three ECAC Hockey Players of the Year.

A native of Durham, Ontario, Schafer played junior hockey with the Guelph Jr. A Holody Platers, who were finalists in the Centennial Cup for the National Championship in 1982.

Schafer and his wife, Diane, have two sons, Luke and John '18, and a daughter, Michelle.

BEN SYER

11th Season as Associate Head Coach; 12th Season at Cornell Western Ontario '98

Serving as the Big Red's recruiting director and manager of the team's vaunted defensive

unit, BEN SYER's efforts were perhaps no more celebrated than during the 2017-18 season. He helped Cornell lead the nation in team defense with a paltry 1.58 goals-against average and was named the winner of the American Hockey Coaches Association's 2018 Terry Flanagan Award.

One of the AHCA's major annual awards, the Terry Flanagan Award is presented to the assistant coach whose career body of work best honors that of the award's name sake.

"He can hold court with a group of assistant coaches on the road with the best of them," said MIKE SCHAFER, adding that this is the first time he's nominated anyone for a major AHCA award in his 23-year tenure at the helm of the Big Red. "He knows the elder statesmen, but he also knows the young guys like Terry did. He would make sure to say hello to everyone in the rink and lend a helping hand to young assistants. I admired Terry for this. He and his family are of the highest character, upfront and honest."

Syer joined Cornell in June 2011 as an assistant coach, then was promoted to associate head coach the following summer. He previously served as associate head coach during his 12 seasons at Quinnipiac under head coach Rand Pecknold. During that run, the Bobcats posted a 242-168-46 record with one NCAA tournament appearance (2002) and nine 20-win seasons.

A native of Kitchener, Ontario, Syer arrived at Quinnipiac after serving one season as an assistant coach at Ohio University. A 1998 graduate of Western Ontario, Syer earned a bachelor's degree in urban development. He earned his master's degree in physical education with a concentration in athletic administration in 2000.



SEAN FLANAGAN

Seventh Season as Assistant CoachSt. Lawrence '10

Flanagan enters his seventh season as an assistant coach on head coach MIKE SCHAFER's

staff. During his previous six seasons, Flanagan helped guide the Big Red to post a 108-38-19 record, good for a .712 win percentage. In his first three years on Schafer's staff, Flanagan aided Cornell in going 3-for-3 in advancing to the NCAA Tournament (and likely would have been 4-for-4, if the 2019-20 season had not ended prematurely). Prior to arriving on East Hill prior to the 2016-17 season, Flanagan made a couple of stops after his four-year playing career at St. Lawrence. After playing professionally in the ECHL with the Las Vegas Wranglers and Quad City Mallards, he became an assistant coach at Division III Hobart from 2012-15. While working under former Cornell assistant coach Mark Taylor, he helped

build a team who won the ECAC West titles in 2015 and 2016, leading the Statesmen to NCAA Tournament appearances. After Hobart, Flanagan spent one season as the Director of Hockey Operations at UMass Lowell, during the 2015-16 season. Flanagan is no stranger to ECAC Hockey, as he played 121 career games with St. Lawrence up to the 2010-11 season, where he racked up 12 goals and 40 assists for 52 points, helping the Saints advance to the league's championship weekend twice over his four years with the Saints. Flanagan graduated from St. Lawrence with a bachelor of arts degree in history with a minor in sports studies and exercise sciences in 2010 before receiving his master of education degree from St. Lawrence the following year.



MITCH STEPHENS

Fourth Season as Volunteer Assistant Coach; SUNY Geneseo '07

Stephens returns to Cornell after serving as an assistant coach at Geneseo for five years. In his time behind the bench with his alma mater, Stephens helped the Knights win two

SUNYAC conference championships (2016, 2018) and make three NCAA Tournament appearances (2014, 2016, and 2018), including two trips to the national semifinals. As a senior, Stephens was named runner-up for USCHO Division III Player of the Year, an AHCA Division III First Team, and All-America selection, while being a finalist for the AHCA Sid Watson Memorial Award as the NCAA Division III Player of the Year.



BEN RUSSELL

First Season as Director of Hockey Operations; Cornell '20

Russell rejoined the Cornell men's hockey program in Aug. 2022 to serve as the team's Director of Hockey Operations, after spending the last two seasons as an assistant coach

at St. Olaf College, a Minnesota-based Division III school. At St. Olaf, Russell helped the 2021-22 squad to a Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) tournament title and an NCAA Tournament appearance. While attending Cornell for his undergraduate studies, Russell served as an Assistant Director of Hockey Operations, helping coordinate video, analyzing film, and preparing scouting reports, while incorporating advanced analytics into game preparation.

MACDONALD '15 BECOMES THIRD CORNELLIAN TO HOIST STANLEY CUP

ITHACA, N.Y. (JUNE 26, 2022) — JACOB MacDONALD '15 became the third player in Cornell history to lift the Stanley Cup when his Colorado Avalanche defeated the Tampa Bay Lightning, 2-1, in Game 6 of the 2022 Stanley Cup Playoffs at Amalie Arena in Tampa, Fla.

MacDonald joined six-time winner KEN DRYDEN and three-time champion JOE NIEUWENDYK in hoisting the oldest existing trophy awarded to a professional sports franchise in North America.

Since graduating from Cornell, MacDonald has played in the ECHL with the Elmira Jackals and Toledo Walleye, the AHL with the Springfield Falcons, Albany and Binghamton Devils, Springfield Thunderbirds and Colorado Eagles around NHL stints with

the Florida Panthers in 2018-19 and the Avalanche in both 2020-21 and 2021-22.

He played eight regular-season games with Colorado this season and has two goals and eight assists in 43 regular season NHL games.

MacDonald was called up from Colorado of the AHL in early June to provide the Avalanche with some additional depth at the defenseman position.

The three-year starter for the Big Red accumulated four goals and 17 assists for 21 points in 104 career games. His plus-6 rating as a senior ranked second on the club.


