KICK OFF

▶ The Cornell men's soccer team returns to East Hill on Sept. 30, for Ivy League action against Brown on homecoming weekend at Berman Field.

UPSET IN EAST HILL

- ▶ The Big Red fans threatened capacity at Berman Field in the home opener last Tuesday, in hopes of watching men's soccer avenge it's 2022 NCAA tournament setback against the Orange. The Cornell men's soccer team downed defending national champion, #7 Syracuse, 2-1 in front of a packed crowd.
- Freshman forward Alex Harris scored two goals for the second time this year.
- ▶ The victory marked the first time that Big Red men's soccer has taken down a defending national champion. The first two tries came against Hartwick in 1978, and Virginia in 1993.

IVY LEAGUE OPENER

- ▶ The Cornell men's soccer team played to a draw in its Ivy League opener at Harvard this past Saturday.
- ▶ Four minutes into the contest, Willem Ebbinge registered the first tally for Harvard at Jordan Field, putting the Crimson ahead 1-0. The Big Red responded just six minutes later on a goal by senior forward Matthew Goncalves that was assisted by freshman forward Alex Harris.
- ▶ The second half showed to be a defensive battle, with neither team finding the back of the net. Ryan Friedberg tallied a pair of saves on the game for the Big Red. Crimson goalie Lucian Wood registered four stops in the net.
- ▶ Four points on one goal and two assists has Mateo Laveque tied with Gabriel Mikina for the Syracuse second-place spot. Mikina's four points were accumulated on two goals, coming against Binghamton and UAlbany, respectively.

HOME, SWEET, HOME

- ▶ Since 2019, the Big Red boasts a 19-2-3 record at Berman Field, which includes an NCAA Tournament victory over the #6 Maryland Terps and last week's victory over the defending national champion, #7 Syracuse Orange.
- ▶ In 2022, the Cornellians outscored East Hill visitors by a count of 22-10.
- ▶ A win against Brown will push the Cornell home winning-streak to six games, dating back to Oct. 18, 2022 when the Big Red took down central New York counterpart Binghamton, 3-1.

PLAYERS TO WATCH

- ▶ Alex Harris (Cornell) Harris was recently named to the Ivy League honor roll list, after a five point performance in the 4-2 victory against Canisius. Alex netted his first collegiate goal, which was followed by another to give him two goals in the game. He would follow up with the first assist of his career, on the third goal that stretched the Big Red's lead to three. Against UMBC, Harris put in the lone Big Red goal on a penalty kick. Harris, a first-year Cornellian, has two multi-goal games on the season, and leads the Ivy League in points (12) and goals with five.
- ▶ Kisa Kiingi (Cornell) Kiingi was recognized as a part of the College Soccer News Men's National Team of The Week for his performances against New Hampshire and Canisius. He was the culprit of the goal that Cornell needed to top New Hampshire 1-0 on the road, and has solidified a Big Red defense that is anchored in goal by Ryan Friedberg. Kiingi also contributed a helper on one of Harris' two goals in the win over Canisius, and one of his goals in the 2-1 victory over rival Syracuse on Tuesday.
- ▶ Ryan Friedberg (Cornell) Friedberg tallied 10 saves in the opening weekend of the season, seven of which came on the back of his shutout win against No. 19 New Hampshire. The reigning Ivy League

THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

- ▶ Cornell began the season ranked 20th in the nation, but dropped out of the polls when it had no competition during the first week of the season.
- ▶ Since opening up the year, the Big Red have matched up with three top-25 opponents in No.-12 Vermont, No.-21 New Hampshire, and No.7 Syracuse, falling to the Catamounts, and defeating the Wildcats and Orange.

Years at Cornell: Eighth Season

College: Rollins and California State - Bakersfield

Entering his his eighth season on East Hill, John Smith has guided Cornell men's soccer to four consecutive 10-win seasons, a feat never accomplished in program history.

During the four-year window with at least 10 wins, Cornell has posted a combined record of 46-18-5 (.703), including a 16-8-4 mark (.643) in Ivy League action.

The 2022 campaign was Cornell's best under Smith as it registered a .763 win percentage thanks to a 14-4-1 overall record. In Ivy League play, Cornell finished in second place for the second consecutive season after going 5-1-1 in Ancient Eight play. Offense was the Big Red's strong suit as it established program records in assists (40) and points (120). Cornell's 40 goals scored were the fourth time in program history it had reached the 40-goal plateau, joining the 1971, 1995, and 2012 campaigns.

Along with its offensive success, Cornell averaged a shade over one goal allowed per game (1.01), leading to freshman Ryan Friedberg in being named the Ivy League's Rookie of the Year — the fourth first-year goalkeeper to be awarded the top newcomer by the lvv League. Due to the Big Red's stout defense, Cornell made its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 2012, reaching the Third Round of the NCAA Division I Men's Soccer

Championship where it lost to Syracuse, 1-0. Prior to its setback to the Orange, Cornell defeated Maryland, 2-1, in a second-round match at Berman Field. Then-sophomore Danny Lokko scored twice in the victory for Cornell. Prior to the NCAA Tournament, Cornell had seven players receive All-Ivy distinctions, including Connor Drought, Emeka Eneli, and Brandon Morales being named First Team All-Ivy selections.

In 2021, the Big Red posted an 11-3-2 overall record and a 4-2-1 mark in Ivy League play, highlighted by Tyler Bagley's 14 goals and finishing the year as the Division I leader in points per game. Bagley was a unanimous All-Ivy League first team selection. Joining Bagley in earning All-Ivy League first team honors were Emeka Eneli and Wilson Eisner. For the second straight year, Cornell finished unbeaten at Berman Field, posting a 6-0-2 record.

Cornell turned in a strong 2019 campaign despite a number of injuries to key players throughout the year, finishing the season with a 10-5-2 record and a 3-2-2 mark in Ivy League competition. The Big Red went undefeated at home, going 6-0-1 at Berman Field. Cornell placed five members of the All-Ivy teams, including Ryan Bayne (first team), John Scearce (first team), Connor Drought (second team), Emeka Eneli (honorable mention) and Harry Fuller (honorable mention). Scearce earned second team all-region honors before signing a professional contract with Union Omaha of the USL One league.

In his third season, Smith led the Big Red to an overall of 11-6, an impressive turnaround from a team that won one game is first season at the helm. Despite a large amount of youth on the Big Red's 2018 roster, the Big Red managed to win 11 games, the program's most since 2012. Of the 28 members of the team, 21 were underclassmen. The Big Red navigated through its lack of experience and led the Ivy League in goals per game with an average of 1.77.

After having a 1-14-2 overall record in his first year at the helm of the Cornell men's soccer program in 2016, the team saw a tremendous turnaround in 2017, emerging with a 7-8-2 record and a 2-4-1 showing in Ivy League play. Under Smith's guidance, the Big Red earned a signature victory over No. 11 Syracuse in overtime, giving Cornell its first win against the Orange since 2001. The squad also saw a massive improvement in its offensive production, netting 22 goals — the third most in the Ivy League — to mark a 10-goal improvement from the previous season. His guidance on the sidelines was also crucial to the team's success in tight overtime games, as the Big Red went undefeated in five of the six overtime contests they played in.

In his seven years on East Hill, Smith has coached 19 players who have combined for 27 All-Ivy honors, including Emeka Eneli and Ryan Friedberg being named Ivy League Rookies of the Year in 2018 and 2022, respectively. Along with All-Ivy honors, Charles Touche (2018 All-Northeast Region Third Team), John Scearce (2019 Second Team All-Northeast Region), and Eneli (First Team All-Northeast Region) are the lone Big Red players to garner regional awards under Smith.
