PUCK DROP

With a potential 25th lvy League title on the line, the No. 13-ranked Cornell men's hockey team heads east to square off against lvy League rivals Brown and Yale to conclude the 2022-23 regular season.

WEEKEND REWIND

- Cornell was swept at home to its North Country counterparts Clarkson and St. Lawrence. The Golden Knights posted a 4-3 victory on Friday night before the Skating Saints scored with 2:45 left in regulation to beat the Big Red 1-0 on Saturday.
- The pair of victories by the North Country travel partners marked the first time since the 1997-98 season in which Cornell lost to both Clarkson and St. Lawrence in the same weekend at Lynah Rink.
- It was the first time Cornell was swept in a weekend series at Lynah Rink since opening the 2018-19 season with a pair of losses to Michigan State.
- Emil Zetterquist's 28-save shutout on Saturday was the first time an opponent blanked Cornell on its home ice since Clarkson's Jake Kielly registered a 15-save shutout in Nov. 2017.
- Offensively for Cornell on the weekend, senior forward **BEN BERARD** scored twice for the Big Red, while fellow senior forward **JACK MALONE** tallied the other goal. Junior forward **GABRIEL SEGER** notched a pair of assists in the setback for Cornell.

IVY LEAGUE ON THE LINE

- Cornell is currently in second place in the Ivy League standings with 19 points. The Big Red trails Harvard who concluded Ivy League play with 24 points following a 9-1-0 record. Six of the Crimson's nine victories came in regulation.
- With five points this weekend a win in overtime or a shootout, coupled with a regulation win — Cornell would share the lvy League title with Harvard.
- Two wins in regulation this weekend for the Big Red would ensure Cornell its first Ivy League title since 2019-20.
- Claiming the Ivy League title would be the third time in the last five years that the Big Red has won the Ancient Eight title, joined by the 2018-19 and 2019-20 squads.
- Entering this weekend, Cornell's 24 Ivy League titles trail Harvard who has an Ivy League-leading 28 Ancient Eight titles since the first title was awarded to Dartmouth following the 1933-34 campaign.

- With its 4-4 tie to Colgate on Feb. 11, Cornell clinched one of the coveted top-four seeds in this year's ECAC Hockey Championships.
- Excluding the 2020-21 season that featured just four of the 12 ECAC Hockey programs play, Cornell has clinched a top-four seed in each of the last sixth tournaments. Since the adoption of the 12-team tournament format before the 2002-03 season, Cornell has been a top-four seed in 16 of the 20 tournaments played.

POINT SEGER

Junior forward GABRIEL SEGER has recorded seven assists over his last five games. During the stretch, Seger has three multi-assist performances.

The native of Uppsala, Sweden, has 21 assists so far this season, which is tied with Colgate's Nick Anderson for the fourth-most by a player in ECAC Hockey.

Seger's 21 assists are the most by a Cornell player since defenseman **YANNI KALDIS** recorded 24 helpers during the 2018-19 campaign. No Cornell forward has had at least 20 assists in a season since GREG MILLER registered 25 assists during the 2010-11 slate.

SAM'S THE MAN

Senior defenseman SAM MALINSKI is tied with Harvard's Henry Thrun and St. Lawrence's Luc Salem for the second-most points by a blueliner this season. The 25 points (eight goals, 17 assists) by Malinski is one off from matching Quinnipiac's Zach Metsa for the lead in ECAC Hockey.

Malinski's 25 points are the most by a Cornell defenseman in a season since YANNI KALDIS concluded the 2019-20 season with 25 points (five goals, 20 assists).

With his next point, Malinski would have the most points by a Cornell blueliner since Kaldis' 28-point season in 2018-19 (four goals, 24 assists).

'SPECIAL' IN SPECIAL TEAMS

Cornell currently has the second-best power play nationally as the Big Red is converting at a 28.9 percent clip. North Dakota paces the nation at 31.1 percent.

B Despite scoring on one of its seven power-play opportunities last weekend against Clarkson and St. Lawrence, the Big Red has scored a power-play goal in nine of its last 14 contests, going 18-of-48 in the span (37.5 percent).

POWER-PLAY GOALS GALORE!

Earlier this month against Union on Feb. 4, Cornell scored six power-play goals in its 10-1 victory over the Dutchmen. The six goals were one shy of matching the program record that was established on Nov. 18, 1977 against York. It was the most power-play goals in a Division I game since Jan. 30, 2015, when Boston University scored six against UMass.

• Of the six power-play goals against Union, five came in the first period (four during a five-minute major penalty) to set Cornell's modern-era record for power-play goals in a period. The previous record of four happened on four other occasions, most recently on Feb. 8, 2003, against Vermont.

THAT WAS FAST...

Freshman forward **DALTON BANCROFT**, sophomore forward **ONDREJ PSENICKA**, and fellow freshman forward **NICK DESANTIS** combined to score three goals in 23 seconds against Union in the 10-1 win on Feb. 4.

The 23-second span between the trio of goals was the quickest Cornell has scored three goals in the program's modern era — since the reinstatement of hockey before the 1957-58 season.

Cornell's trio of goals in 23 seconds bested the previous record of 24 seconds from Feb. 28, 1976, against Princeton. FRED TOMCZYK had his tally bookended by goals from MARK TRIVETT.

In addition to the three goals in 23-second span, the Big Red scored four times in a 54-second span, which marked the first time in the modern era that Cornell scored four times in under a minute. The previous record of 1:34 was done against Penn in a 13-1 win on March 4, 1961. **RUDY MATEKA** (16:34), **BOB MYERS** (17:28), **WEBB NICHOLS** (17:46), and Myers (18:08) were the goal scorers in the stretch.

■ To put the record into perspective, the National Hockey League record for the quickest four goals scored by one team was done in 1:20 by the Boston Bruins against the New York Rangers on Jan. 21, 1945 (Bill Thoms — 6:34, Frank Mario — 7:08 and 7:27, and Ken Smith — 7:54).

RANKING IN THE TOP 10

Cornell is one of four programs currently ranking in the top 10 in both scoring offense and scoring defense.

• Offensively, the Big Red is tied with its bitter Ivy League rival Harvard for the seventh-most goals per game this season, scoring at a 3.64 clip.

The Big Red's 2.22 goals allowed per game ranks fifth in the nation, trailing Quinnipiac (1.66), Michigan Tech (2.09), Minnesota State (2.09), and UMass Lowell (2.13).

NONE SHALL PASS...

Cornell enters this weekend boasting one of the nation's top scoring defenses. The Big Red has yielded 60 goals allowed so far this year, which is the second-fewest by a Division I program this season, trailing ECAC Hockey rival Quinnipiac (53).

Historically, Cornell has boasted one of the nation's stinglest defensive units in Division I hockey. The Big Red has ranked in the top-10 in scoring defense in each of its last five seasons of competition.

Since the 2016-17 season, Cornell has yielded 383 goals against which stands as the fewest by a Division I team in the span. Harvard is second in the category with 478 goals allowed.

The Big Red's 1.99 goals allowed per game average in the timeframe ranks second, only behind Minnesota State (1.84).

SHANE'S WORLD

Sophomore goaltender IAN SHANE has been strong between the pipes for Cornell this year, posting a goals-against average of 1.97 that ranks fifth nationally and is second in ECAC Hockey behind Quinnipiac's Yaniv Perets, who paces the nation with his 1.61 average.

Shane was up for two award nominations this season. He was named to the Mike Richter Award watch list on Jan. 12 and is Cornell's lone nominee for the Hobey Baker Memorial Award.

Despite not being named one of the nine semifinalists for the Richter Award last week, Shane was Cornell's first goaltender to be named to the Richter Award watch list in consecutive years since MATTHEW GALAJDA in 2018-19 and 2019-20.

JOINING RARE COMPANY

With his penalty shot goal in the Big Red's victory over RPI on Jan. 7, senior forward **ZACH TUPKER** joined an rare group of Big Red players in scoring on a penalty shot while donning the Carnellian Red and White.

Tupker became the first Cornell player to score on a penalty shot since **ALEX RAUTER** on Nov. 26, 2016, against New Hampshire at Madison Square Garden.

The goal by Tupker marked just the third time a Cornell player has scored on penalty shot over the last 37 years, joining Rauter and JOE NIEUWENDYK (Feb. 27, 1987 vs. RPI).

SCHAFER REACHES MILESTONE

MIKE SCHAFER '86, the Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Hockey, reached a historic milestone on Nov. 4 in the Big Red's 3-1 win at Princeton.

Schafer logged his 500th career head coaching victory, becoming the 21st Division I hockey head coach to reach the 500-win plateau.

He is the eighth active head coach — the fourth at the Division I level — to register 500 career coaching victories.

The other Division I coaches include Rand Pecknold of Quinnipiac (603), Mercyhurst's Rick Gotkin (596), and Notre Dame's Jeff Jackson (571).

Schafer's 515 career wins are the fourth-most in Cornell history by a head coach in one sport. He trails **DICK BLOOD** (softball — 623), TED THOREN (baseball — 541), and DAVE ELDREDGE (women's polo — 518).

FRESH(MAN) HAT TRICK

With his hat trick against UConn at Madison Square Garden on Nov. 26, freshman DALTON BANCROFT became the 16th Cornell freshman to score at least three goals in a game since first-year players were eligible to play in 1975-76.

Bancroft joined ROY KERLING (1977-78), BROCK TREDWAY (1977-78), DUANNE MOESER (1982-83), PETE NATYSHAK (1982-83), JOE NIEUWENDYK (1984-85), CHRIS GRENIER (1985-86), CASEY JONES (1986-87), TRENT ANDISON (4 goals in 1987-88), VINCENT AUGER (1993-94), RYAN SMART (1994-95), KYLE KNOPP (1995-96), MATT MOULSON (2002-03), JEFF MALOTT (2016-17), KYLE BETTS (2017-18), and BEN BERARD (2019-20).

It was just the second hat trick by a Cornell player in program history at Madison Square Garden, joining DICK BERTRAND who did so against St. Lawrence on Dec. 23, 1969. Bertrand later became the head coach of the Big Red for 12 seasons from 1970-82, taking over for the legendary **NED HARKNESS**.

Should Bancroft record another hat trick this season, he would become the sixth Cornell freshman with multiple hat tricks in a season. The others include former NHLers JOE NIEUWENDYK and BROCK TREDWAY, along with ROY KERLING, DUANNE MOESER, and RYAN SMART.

ECAC PRESEASON POLL

ECAC Hockey announced Sept. 21 during its annual Media Day that Cornell was slated to finish fourth in its preseason poll.

🐻 Finishing ahead of the Big Red was Quinnipiac, who was dubbed the preseason favorite after finishing with eight first-place votes and a 118-point total. Harvard received the remaining four first-place votes, finishing with 109 points. Clarkson was the only other team ahead of Cornell with 105 points.

🧸 Cornell followed Clarkson with 90 points, while Colgate finished in fifth with 77 points. RPI (70), St. Lawrence (57), Union (45), Dartmouth (43), Yale (32), Brown (26), and Princeton (20) rounded out the poll.

SCOUTING BROWN

Brown enters the final weekend of the regular season with a 9-16-2 overall record and a 5-13-2 mark in ECAC Hockey play.

Since defeating Harvard on Jan. 21 at Meehan Auditorium, 3-2, the Bears have lost five of its last six games. The lone victory since defeating the Crimson was against RPI, 3-2, on Feb. 10 in Troy, N.Y., at Houston Field House.

With two games remaining in the regular season, Brown can finish anywhere between the No. 8 and No. 12 seeds for the ECAC Hockey Championship, which begins next weekend with first-round matchups being hosted by the No. 5 through No. 8 seeds.

Ryan Bottrill leads Brown in points with 19. His 13 assists are tied with Luke Krys for the team lead. James Crossman's nine goals paces the Bears this season.

Mathieu Caron has started all 21 of his appearances this year, logging an 8-10-2 record with a 2.33 goals-against average and a .924 save percentage.

SERIES HISTORY

Friday will be the 137th all-time meeting between the two lvy League rivals, which Cornell has an 84-44-8 advantage in.

Cornell has dominated the series as of late going unbeaten in 19 of its last 21 games against the Bears, dating back to the 2011-12 season. During the stretch, the Big Red is 16-2-3.

Since Mike Schafer '86 took over the Cornell program prior to the 1995-96 season, the Big Red has a 42-8-6 mark against its Ancient Eight rival.

At Meehan Auditorium, Cornell has a 12-3-2 record dating back to the 2004-05 season. Nine of the last 22 meetings on Brown's home ice have gone to overtime.

Five different Cornell players found the back of the net to aid freshman goaltender **REMINGTON KEOPPLE** in recording his first collegiate win in the Big Red's 5-1 victory over Brown at Lynah Rink back on Nov. 19.

JACK O'LEARY, MATT STIENBURG, JACK LAGERSTROM, WINTER WALLACE, and KYLE PENNEY all scored for the Big Red.

Keopple, who was making his first start in front of the Lynah Faithful, made 17 saves to improve to 1-1-0 on the year.

Matt Sutton scored the lone goal for Brown, who had a 34-save performance from goaltender Mathieu Caron.

- 📕 The Bulldogs' 4-0 shutout of Princeton last Saturday snapped Yale's three-game losing streak.
- This weekend marks Yale's first pair of home games since posting back-to-back 4-0 shutouts over Clarkson and St. Lawrence. Goaltender Luke Pearson was subsequently named ECAC Hockey's Goaltender of the Week for his performances against the pair of North Country foes.
- In five of its last six home games, Yale has picked up at least one point by registering a 3-2-1 record in the span. One of the losses came in overtime to Harvard on Jan. 20.
- lan Carpentier has a Yale-leading 15 points (eight goals, seven assists) enter this weekend's slate. Carpentier's eight goals are the most by a Bulldogs player this year. Briggs Gammill and William Dineen are tied for the team lead in assists with eight helpers apiece.
- Pearson has started appeared in 16 games this year for the Bulldogs, starting in 15 of the contests. He has a 4-7-4 record with a 2.25 goals-against average and a .924 save percentage. Nathan Reid has made 13 appearances with 10 starts for Yale, going 2-7-0 with a 2.98 goals-against average with a .908 save percentage.

- Saturday will be the 161st all-time meeting between the Ancient Eight rivals. Cornell leads the series, 90-62-8, and is 13-5-3 over its last 21 games against Yale.

MIKE SCHAFER '86

Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Men's Ice Hockey 28th Season as Head Coach • 35th Season at Cornell

The longest-tenured head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, MIKE SCHAFER '86, enters his 28th season at the helm of the Cornell men's hockey program.

When Schafer returned to his alma mater in the summer of 1995 to become Cornell's 12th head coach in men's hockey history, Schafer's goal was to bring the Big Red to a position of national prominence.

Already the winningest head coach in Cornell men's hockey history, Schafer has accomplished that objective with his 515-280-105 record. His 515 wins rank fourth among active Division I coaches and his .631 win percentage is good for fifth among active Division I coaches.

Schafer has guided the Big Red to 12 NCAA Tournament appearances and a berth to the 2003 NCAA Frozen Four — the program's first since 1980. That year, Cornell set a school record for wins (30), finishing with one more victory than the 1969-70 national championship squad, who went undefeated (29-0-0). The 2002-03 team's 19-2-1 record in ECAC Hockey play was Cornell's best mark in league play since 1969-70 when Cornell was 21-0 in league action.

In 2020, Schafer was named a co-winner of the Spencer Penrose Award, given to the nation's top head coach. It was the first time Schafer won the award after being a finalist on five occasions after being named ECAC Hockey's Coach of the Year.

The Big Red have been regularly ranked among the nation's elite during Schafer's tenure, including being named No. 1 in both the USCHO.com and the USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine polls at the time the 2019-20 postseason was halted due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Cornell has claimed five Whitelaw Cup (ECAC Hockey tournament titles), which surpassed the legendary NED HARKNESS for the most in program history. Schafer has also led the Big Red to three Cleary Cups (ECAC's top regular-season team) in three of the last four years of competition.

In 2002-03, Schafer led the Big Red to the NCAA Frozen Four, setting a school record with 30 wins, one better than the 1969-70 squad who went 29-0-0. Cornell's 19-2-1 mark in ECAC Hockey in 2002-03 was Cornell's best since the 1969-70 team went 21-0 in league play.

Over his career, Schafer has coached 10 different players to First Team All-America status 11 times, seven Ivy League Players of the Year, 5 ECAC Hockey Ken Dryden Award winners (league's best goaltender), five ECAC Hockey Rookies of the Year, and five Ivy Rookies of the Year, and three ECAC Hockey Players of the Year.

A native of Durham, Ontario, Schafer played junior hockey with the Guelph Jr. A Holody Platers, who were finalists in the Centennial Cup for the National Championship in 1982.

Schafer and his wife, Diane, have two sons, Luke and John '18, and a daughter, Michelle.

BEN SYER

11th Season as Associate Head Coach; 12th Season at Cornell Western Ontario '98

Serving as the Big Red's recruiting director and manager of the team's vaunted defensive unit, **BEN SYER**'s efforts were perhaps no more celebrated

than during the 2017-18 season. He helped Cornell lead the nation in team defense with a paltry 1.58 goals-against average and was named the winner of the American Hockey Coaches Association's 2018 Terry Flanagan Award.

One of the AHCA's major annual awards, the Terry Flanagan Award is presented to the assistant coach whose career body of work best honors that of the award's name sake.

"He can hold court with a group of assistant coaches on the road with the best of them," said **MIKE SCHAFER**, adding that this is the first time he's nominated anyone for a major AHCA award in his 23-year tenure at the helm of the Big Red. "He knows the elder statesmen, but he also knows the young guys like Terry did. He would make sure to say hello to everyone in the rink and lend a helping hand to young assistants. I admired Terry for this. He and his family are of the highest character, upfront and honest."

Syer joined Cornell in June 2011 as an assistant coach, then was promoted to associate head coach the following summer. He previously served as associate head coach during his 12 seasons at Quinnipiac under head coach Rand Pecknold. During that run, the Bobcats posted a 242-168-46 record with one NCAA tournament appearance (2002) and nine 20-win seasons.

A native of Kitchener, Ontario, Syer arrived at Quinnipiac after serving one season as an assistant coach at Ohio University. A 1998 graduate of Western Ontario, Syer earned a bachelor's degree in urban development. He earned his master's degree in physical education with a concentration in athletic administration in 2000.



SEAN FLANAGAN

Seventh Season as Assistant Coach

St. Lawrence '10

Flanagan enters his seventh season as an assistant coach on head coach **MIKE SCHAFER**'s staff. During his previous six seasons, Flanagan

helped guide the Big Red to post a 108-38-19 record, good for a .712 win percentage. In his first three years on Schafer's staff, Flanagan aided Cornell in going 3-for-3 in advancing to the NCAA Tournament (and likely would have been 4-for-4, if the 2019-20 season had not ended prematurely). Prior to arriving on East Hill prior to the 2016-17 season, Flanagan made a couple of stops after his four-year playing career at St. Lawrence. After playing professionally in the ECHL with the Las Vegas Wranglers and Quad City Mallards, he became an assistant coach at Division III Hobart from 2012-15. While working under

former Cornell assistant coach Mark Taylor, he helped build a team who won the ECAC West titles in 2015 and 2016, leading the Statesmen to NCAA Tournament appearances. After Hobart, Flanagan spent one season as the Director of Hockey Operations at UMass Lowell, during the 2015-16 season. Flanagan is no stranger to ECAC Hockey, as he played 121 career games with St. Lawrence up to the 2010-11 season, where he racked up 12 goals and 40 assists for 52 points, helping the Saints advance to the league's championship weekend twice over his four years with the Saints. Flanagan graduated from St. Lawrence with a bachelor of arts degree in history with a minor in sports studies and exercise sciences in 2010 before receiving his master of education degree from St. Lawrence the following year.



MITCH STEPHENS

Fourth Season as Volunteer
Assistant Coach; SUNY Geneseo '07

Stephens returns to Cornell after serving as an assistant coach at Geneseo for five years. In his time behind the bench with his alma mater, Stephens helped the Knights win two SUNYAC

conference championships (2016, 2018) and make three NCAA Tournament appearances (2014, 2016, and 2018), including two trips to the national semifinals. As a senior, Stephens was named runner-up for USCHO Division III Player of the Year, an AHCA Division III First Team, and All-America selection, while being a finalist for the AHCA Sid Watson Memorial Award as the NCAA Division III Player of the Year.



BEN RUSSELL

First Season as Director of Hockey Operations; Cornell '20

Russell rejoined the Cornell men's hockey program in Aug. 2022 to serve as the team's Director of Hockey Operations, after spending the last two seasons as an assistant coach at St. Olaf

College, a Minnesota-based Division III school. At St. Olaf, Russell helped the 2021-22 squad to a Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAC) tournament title and an NCAA Tournament appearance. While attending Cornell for his undergraduate studies, Russell served as an Assistant Director of Hockey Operations, helping coordinate video, analyzing film, and preparing scouting reports, while incorporating advanced analytics into game preparation.

MACDONALD '15 BECOMES THIRD CORNELLIAN TO HOIST STANLEY CUP

ITHACA, N.Y. (JUNE 26, 2022) — **JACOB MACDONALD** '15 became the third player in
Cornell history to lift the Stanley Cup when his
Colorado Avalanche defeated the Tampa Bay
Lightning, 2-1, in Game 6 of the 2022 Stanley
Cup Playoffs at Amalie Arena in Tampa, Fla.

MacDonald joined six-time winner **KEN DRYDEN** and three-time champion **JOE NIEUWENDYK** in hoisting the oldest existing trophy awarded to a professional sports franchise in North America.

Since graduating from Cornell, MacDonald has played in the ECHL with the Elmira Jackals and Toledo Walleye, the AHL with the Springfield Falcons, Albany and Binghamton Devils, Springfield Thunderbirds and Colorado Eagles around NHL stints with the Florida Panthers in 2018-19 and the Avalanche in both 2020-21 and 2021-22.

He played eight regular-season games with Colorado this season and has two goals and eight assists in 43 regular season NHL games.

MacDonald was called up from Colorado of the AHL in early June to provide the Avalanche with some additional depth at the defenseman position.

The three-year starter for the Big Red accumulated four goals and 17 assists for 21 points in 104 career games. His plus-6 rating as a senior ranked second on the club.
