FIRST TOUCH

► The Cornell women's soccer team returns to the pitch this evening when it takes on Marist in the first road match of the 2023 campaign.

LAST TIME OUT

► Cornell and Lehigh played to a 2-2 draw at Berman Field on Sunday in the Big Red's season and home opener.

► Senior forward **LAKEN GALLMAN** assisted on both Cornell goals scored by junior forward **MADDIE LEROY** and sophomore midfielder **ABIGAIL BISHARA**. Leroy and Bishara's tallies were the first of their respective collegiate careers.

► Sophomore goalkeeper **NATALIE MEDUGNO** made one save for the Big Red in the draw.

THANKS FOR THE HELP!

► In Sunday's draw with Lehigh, senior forward **LAKEN GALLMAN** recorded Cornell's first multi-assist performance in nearly nine years.

► The last time Cornell had a multi-assist game was when **CLAIRE MACMANUS** had two assists in a 5-0 victory over VMI on Sept. 12, 2014.

► Gallman's two-assist night was the first time in her collegiate career that she assisted on multiple goals in a single match.

EMPIRE STATE OF MIND

► Tonight's match will be the first of four consecutive contests against programs based in New York State and the second of five straight games played in the Empire State.

► Cornell has a 4-2-6 record (.583) over its last 12 matches played in New York or against schools based in the state. Also during the span, the Big Red is unbeaten over its previous six, posting a 3-0-3 record (.750).

STARTING STRONG

► Through the first weekend of play in which Ivy League programs were permitted to compete in regular-season matches, the Ancient Eight excelled on the pitch, posting a combined 12-0-3 record.

► The Ivy League's combined .900 win percentage ranks as the best of any Division I conference that sponsors women's soccer, currently situated 124 points higher than the conference in second place (SEC — .776).

► The win percentage is leading the nation and 175 points better than the second-highest non-Power Five conference (Sun Belt — .725). After the Sun Belt, the next best non-Power Five conference is the Big East (.618).

RETURN OF THE MAAC

- ▶ Cornell will be playing a member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) for a fifth consecutive season of competition (2018, 2019, 2021, 2022, 2023).
- ▶ The Big Red is seeking to snap a five-match losing streak to MAAC opponents, including a pair of losses to Niagara and being defeated by Canisius, Iona, and Marist.
- ▶ A win tonight would be Cornell's first against a MAAC opponent since defeating Canisius, 2-0, in the 2021 season opener. The last time Cornell drew against a team playing in the MAAC was in 2015, when it played Siena to a scoreless draw in that year's season opener.

PICK UP WHERE SHE LEFT OFF

- ▶ Junior goalkeeper **ERICA FOX** enters tonight's match riding a career-long shutout streak. Fox has not allowed a goal in over 170 minutes after posting a clean sheet in last season's finale against Dartmouth at Berman Field. The last time Fox conceded a goal was a 10th-minute tally against Princeton on Oct. 29.
- ▶ Sophomore goalkeeper **NATALIE MEDUGNO**, who started Sunday's match against Lehigh, opened her collegiate career with a shutout streak spanning over 141 minutes before conceding the first goal of her collegiate career in the 51st minute on Sunday.

IVY LEAGUE PRESEASON POLL

- ▶ Cornell was picked to finish sixth in the 2023 Ivy League women's soccer preseason poll, the conference office announced Thursday afternoon.
- ▶ Brown received 12 of 16 possible first-place votes, finishing with an Ivy League-best 123 points. Harvard recorded three first-place votes, placing second with 113 points. Yale was the only other school to receive a first-place vote, garnering 88 points and the last first-place vote.
- ▶ Princeton (78 points) and Columbia (74 points) were picked fourth and fifth, respectively, and Cornell (35 points) was picked sixth. Dartmouth (33 points) and Penn (32 points) rounded out the poll.

2023 LEADERSHIP TEAM

- ▶ Cornell has six student-athletes on its leadership team for the 2023 campaign, rotating captains each game.
- ▶ Two sophomore, junior, and senior members were named to this year's leadership team. Those named to the team were seniors **JACKIE LASSETER** and **AVA LADEN**, juniors **MADDIE LEROY** and **SYDNEY MALAGA**, and sophomores **ABIGAIL BISHARA** and **IZZY SCOTT**.

Cornell is 2-0-0 all-time on Aug. 30; 0-0-0 under **ROB FERGUSON**

Aug. 30, 2019: Cornell opened the 2019 campaign with a 3-1 victory over Iona at Berman Field. Then-freshman **ASHLEY DURIK** netted two second-half goals to lift the Big Red past the Gaels. Durik was the first Big Red freshman to score twice in a season-opening match since **MIKI AGRAWAL** in 1997.

ACROSS THE NATION

- Cornell has no geographical recruiting base, as the Big Red has 16 states on this year's roster.
- California has the most representatives on this year's roster, as five student-athletes reside in the Golden State. New York has the second-highest total with four. Colorado and Texas are right behind with three apiece. Illinois, Maryland, and New Jersey each have two representatives.
- Indiana, Massachusetts, Michigan, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Vermont, Virginia, and Washington are represented once on this year's roster.

CORNELL CONNECTIONS

- Junior forward **SYDNEY MALAGA** is the daughter of Cornell Athletics Hall of Famer **SCOTT MALAGA**, who was inducted in 1999. Scott concluded his Big Red football career with 1,925 rushing yards, which ranks fourth in program history. Sydney's twin brother, Luke, is also actively on the Big Red football team.
- Both senior defender **MIA GONZALEZ** and sophomore defender **GABY GONZALEZ** are third-generation Cornell students. Their father, Jack, and mother, Jodi, graduated from Cornell in 1991. Jack also played on the Cornell men's soccer team from 1988-90. The Gonzalez sisters also have a pair of uncles who graduated from the institution.
- Sophomore forward **GRACE DIEHL** is a third-generation Cornell student-athlete as her father, Jeff (1991-92), and grandfather, Thomas (1967-68), played two seasons on the Cornell football team.
- Fellow sophomore defender **MARAN KINGSLEY** is a third-generation Cornell student. Her mother received her MBA from the institution, and her grandfather was an undergraduate student in the College of Engineering.
- Senior midfielder **KENDALL PATTEN** is the fourth member of her family to attend Cornell, as her mother, **CORRINE (CANTRALL) PATTEN**, was a member of the Cornell soccer program from 1989-91, and her sister, Dillyn, is a sophomore on the Big Red women's lacrosse program. Kendall's great-uncle, Walter 'Bud' Patten, was a 1949 graduate from Cornell.
- **MARIANA KESSINGER**, a sophomore midfielder, is also following in both of her parent's footsteps as they both attended Cornell.
- Junior defender **ALEX BROTHERTON** is a second-generation Cornell student as her mother, Zela, graduated from Cornell in 2004.
- Senior forward **LAKEN GALLMAN** is the second member of her family to play a sport at Cornell, as her brother, Eric II, spent four years on Cornell's football team (2017-21) before playing a post-grad year at Duke in 2022.

UP NEXT

► Following tonight's contest, the Big Red will play its third match in seven days when it returns to Berman Field entertain Central New York rival Syracuse. First touch between the Big Red and Orange is slated for 1 p.m. Game action will be broadcast ESPN+.

FOURTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Years at Cornell: Fifth Season
College: University of Manchester

ROB FERGUSON, who enters his fourth season as the head coach of the Cornell women's soccer program, was hired as the sixth head coach in Cornell women's soccer program history in February 2020. Prior to his appointment as head coach, Ferguson served as an assistant coach for the 2019 campaign under previous head coach **DWIGHT HORNIBROOK**.

Ferguson's most recent season featured Cornell going 4-7-5 overall and 2-3-2 in Ivy League play. The Big Red concluded Ancient Eight play in fifth place, marking the best finish for the program since 2015. Both of Cornell's conference victories in 2022 came in its final two matches of the season against Princeton and Dartmouth, marking the first time the Big Red won consecutive Ivy League matches since claiming wins in the final match of 2014 and the first fixture in 2015. Cornell also posted an impressive 3-1-3 record on its home pitch, Berman Field, which included featured going unbeaten over its final six matches (3-0-3).

The Big Red also had a trio of All-Ivy award winners, including Second Team All-Ivy selections **REAGAN PAUWELS** and **CECILY POKIGO**. It was the most All-Ivy players for Cornell women's soccer since having four players — including a pair of First Team All-Ivy selections — in 2015.

After Ferguson's first year as the Big Red's head coach was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, he guided Cornell to a 3-11-2 overall mark in 2021, which included a 1-6-0 Ivy League record. Cornell's lone Ivy League victory came against Columbia, 1-0, on Sept. 25, 2021, marking the program's first conference win since 2016.

In his first overall season on East Hill in 2019, Ferguson aided the Big Red to four consecutive victories to start the season — including three straight clean sheets over Siena, Bucknell, and St. Bonaventure. Cornell ultimately finished the season with a 4-10-1 record after the rigors of one some of the strongest Ivy League competition seen in recent years. Ferguson helped get the Big Red's impact freshman class acclimated to collegiate competition, a group that included 2019 All-Ivy League honorable mention selection **ASHLEY DURIK**.

Ferguson first joined the Big Red after a very successful stint as the Director of Coaching with the WNY Flash Academy. He helped turn the program into a player development leader in Western New York, expanding the program's footprint from 15 teams to 34 teams and moving them into national recognition in Elite Clubs National League (ECNL). Under Ferguson's leadership at the Flash their 03G ECNL and Flash 02G ECNL advanced into the Elite 8 in June 2018, and the club had their first US Youth National Team Camp call-up.

Before joining the WNY Flash Academy, Ferguson was the head coach of both the men's and women's soccer programs at NAIA Huston-Tillotson University in Austin, Texas. Prior to that, he served as the Executive Director of Business for Lonestar Soccer Club from 2008 until 2015. One of the largest and most successful youth soccer clubs in the country, Ferguson coached the Lonestar 96B Red, 93G Red, 94G Red and 95G Red, and he helped advance the 95G Red to the USYSNC Region III Championships in June 2013 and 2014.

Previous stops for Ferguson included a stint as the head coach with Albion Hurricanes FC in Houston, where he guided the AHFC 94G Blue to the USYSNC Regionals for the first time in their history. Before that, he was the Director of Coaching for FC Arsenal for three years in Bastrop, Texas, and he was a Regional Manager for Britannia Soccer/ProExcel, based in Seattle.
