

List Fans 18 as Cornell Nine Ends Season Successfully

With Bob List, 6-foot 2-inch sophomore southpaw, mowing 'em down, Cornell defeated Colgate, 4-2, Saturday on Hoy Field to finish its season quite successfully.

Three victories in four days in the last week of the campaign made up for some mid-season setbacks when the club was down in its luck. But all three of the victories, one over St. Lawrence and two over Colgate, failed to get the record over .500. It settled for 7-8 in its first year under Coach George Patte.

It was a good season for a comparatively new aggregation and under a new coaching regime. Pitching played a prominent role and it was never more pronounced than in the Colgate series. Ted Thelander pitched a 1-0 shutout at Hamilton on Friday. List had his best day as a Cornelian on Saturday.

Record for Whiffs

The Westfield, N. J., youngster had 13 strike outs—a school record. Seven Raiders were called out, including five in the first three innings. After that they began swinging futilely at his roundhouse curve. He was just wild enough to be effective. He had four walks, a balk, and he hit a Raider in the head. The victim was First Baseman Al Simpson. He failed to duck a slow curve in the third and was felled. But he didn't stay down for long and, showing no apparent ill effects, finished it out.

List had at least one strike out in every inning and he retired the side in that manner in the second, fourth and seventh. He fanned two in the ninth to nip off a mild Raider threat. The fact was he was always nipping off Raider scoring attempts as the nine Colgate LOBs indicate.

The easy going type, it is characteristic of him to get the first two outs and then play around a little. He did that a couple of times, but managed to get himself out of the jams. Colgate scored in the first on two singles and a sacrifice. Tony Nicotera tripled to open the fifth and scored on List's balk. Bob's spikes caught and he stumbled off the rubber.

That closed out the scoring. List came in with the deuce in each of the last three innings after runners had gotten on early. He walked the first batter in the seventh. Chuck Halper, second up in the eighth, cracked a triple, but it was a waste of time. The leadoff hitter in ninth singled, but he, too, wasted his time.

Suiter Bats in Pair

Cornell teed off on lefthander Ron Greenleese for six hits and four runs in the first three innings and made them stand up. It loaded the bases in the first on Ron Muzii's single and walks to Nick Schiff and Norm Juvonen. Jim Suiter knocked in two with a single. List led off the second with a single and got around on a single, sacrifice and an infield out. Suiter doubled in the third and got home on a throwing error and Muzii's single.

Muzii and Suiter had three hits apiece. List had two. But Bob Flynn, who sacrificed twice with well-placed bunts, but who went 0-for-3, wound up with a .309 average.

This was the first time in many years that Cornell swept the Colgate series. By winning the two games it clinched the Central New York Big Three title. Both clubs had broken even with Syracuse.

Coach Patte has a good nucleus for next year. Only four seniors are lost. They are Suiter, the

catcher; Capt. Dick Shigekane, first baseman; Bob Verstandig, utility infielder; and John Marchell, outfielder.
