Ted Thoren and Tom McGory will team up for the 20th year with the varsity baseball team in 1980-81. Last season, Thoren chalked up his eighth 20 vins or more campaign and his 14th winning slate in 19 years. During that time the Big Red has been 343-298-9 overall and 264-176-4 against competition in the Northeast.

Each year Cornell plays the most competitive spring schedule of any of the teams in the Northeast. This past year's schedule featured games with perennial powers Stetson, University of South Florida (coached by Robin Roberts), University of Central Florida and participation in the prestigious Rollins Tournament. The Red finished second at the Rollins Tournament and defeated College World Series participant Clemson, 7-6, in 10 innings.

Cornell in 1981 will visit the Southwest for the third time. Games are scheduled with St. Marys and Trinity in San Antonio; Rice and the University of Houston in Houston; Lamar University in Lamar, Texas; Louisiana State in Baton Rouge; and the University of New Orleans in New Orleans.

The Big Red has the best league record in the EIBL over the past five years. Cornell is 44-20 (.688), followed by Navy 44-22-1 (.664), Columbia 42-27 (.607), Penn 39-24-2 (.615) and Harvard 41-27 (.603).

Third baseman Dave Waters, one of the team's tri-captains, was the recipient of the Dr. Albert H. Sharpe Award as the most valuable player on the 1980 nine. The left-handed hitter batted .275 and led the team in triples (5), stolen bases (15), and walks (30). Waters also received the ECAC Medallion as one of Cornell's top scholar-athletes. He will enter Cornell's College of Veterinary Medicine, compiling a four-year cumulative average of 3.78.

First baseman Mike Branca, a sophomore, received the most improved player award after batting .292. He hit .225 as a frosh. Mike was second on the team in doubles (8) and RBIs (27).

Centerfielder Greg Allen, a junior, was the recipient of the trainers award for durability as he played in 43 of the team's 44 games, topping the club in runs scored (31).

Freshman outfielder John DeGiovanni led the team in hitting with a .351 average and doubles with nine. Second baseman Marlin McPhail, a sophomore, was second in batting with a .325 average and he topped the nine in RBIs (39) and hits (46).

<u>DeGiovanni</u> was one of two freshmen named to the All-EIBL first team, hitting .425 against league competition. Named to the second team were sophomore right-hander Greg Myers and classmate John DeMayo, the right fielder. Waters and designated hitter Bill Bacon, a junior, received honorable mention.

All-Ivy selections: DeGiovanni, Myers, first team; DeMayo, second team; Waters, Bacon, honorable mention.

Tri-captain Gary Kaczor, a first baseman, played in only 15 games due to a wrist injury, but had the most home runs (4). Kaczor, who participated in 132 games during his four-year career, now holds Cornell career records for at bats (449), hits (151), doubles (29), home runs (21), RBIs (99) and total bases (255). Gary currently is playing ball with Auburn in the New York-Penn League.
