Added to the "spoiler" win over Yale was the fact that the victory was the 400th for Coach Thoren in his 22 years at the helm of the Red. He ranks number one on the all-time Ivy list in total games coached in all sports (875) and is second on the all-time list in both baseball wins (400) and total baseball games (761).
