After starting slowly in Hawaii, the Big Red played better than .500 ball in the Northeast, going 17-15 on the East Coast. Hoy Field was also a friendly spot, with the Red winning 11 of 17 contests on campus.

First baseman Mark Smith was the team's top hitter with a .349 average and led the squad in runs (30), hits (52), total bases (69), doubles (9), triples (4) and slugging percentage (.463). Smith started at shortstop and first base during his four-year career and ended his tenure with Cornell records for games in a season (49) and career (179); at bats in a season (166) and career (606); triples in a career (16); putouts in a season (409); and assists in a season (127).

Second baseman Scott Kenney and Smith were named to the EIBL second team. In the league, Kenney hit .316 and Smith .298. Both players fielded flawlessly against EIBL competition. Kenney was named All-Ivy first team and Smith made the second nine.

Junior right-hander John O'Connor received the Dr. Albert H. Sharpe Most Valuable Player Award. He topped the club in most wins (7-5), innings pitched (71), best earned run average by a regular (3.55) and strikeouts (42). In the pitcher-dominated EIBL, O'Connor was 4-2 with a 2.00 ERA.

Sophomore shortstop Dave Dase received the team's most improved player award. He played in 41 games and batted .307 after hitting .202 as a regular in 1986.

Sophomore Mike Milmo, who played third base and caught, received the Trainers Award for his durability. Milmo batted .250, led the team in walks (21) and was third in RBI with 19.

The Big Red was 6-10 in the EIBL for seventh place. It lost five one-run games and won two against EIBL competition. Dartmouth, the league champion, never made it to Hoy Field. The Big Green was derailed by the New York State Health Department due to a measles epidemic on the Hanover campus.

Sophomore outfielder Paul Kisslinger was Cornell's best hitter against EIBL opponents with a .318 average. Kenney was the only other Big Red player to hit over .300 in the league with a .316 mark.

At Hoy Field, the Big Red hit .304 as a team to the opposition's .271. Smith batted .389 at home, followed by Dase (.349) and Kisslinger (.341).

Six home runs were hit at Hoy Field in 17 games. Cornell hit three of its season's four homers at home with four different players walloping round trippers. It was the lowest output of home runs since the 1965 team hit three in 29 games.

Junior catcher Guy Leach topped the team in RBI with 25, followed by Kisslinger with 22.

Coach Ted Thoren will have a good contingent returning next year, as Smith and pitcher Rich DeSa were the only seniors on the team. Smith, in addition to his All-League recognition, was named to the Academic All-America second team for his outstanding credentials in both the classroom and on the field. He was a pre-med major.

The great 1977 team was well represented on campus on the weekend of May 1-3. Returning members of that EIBL championship squad voted to celebrate and swap stories again in five years. Apparently Gary Kaczor '80 has made the adjustment from the ball field to the golf course; ask any of his returning teammates.

Tremendous alumni support was given to the team on its trip to Hawaii by Chuck Feeney '56, Chuck Rolles '56 and son Scott, Dick Bradley '63 and Dan Begin '59.

Texas will be the site of the 1988 spring trip, with San Antonio being the hub. Two games are also scheduled in Austin against College World Series participant, the University of Texas. Coach Thoren and his wife Jeanne spent their 40th wedding anniversary scouting the Longhorns at the Series in Omaha.
