FIRST TOUCH

► The Cornell women's soccer team plays its final non-conference match before Ivy League play commences next weekend when it travels to suburban Philadelphia to play Villanova at the Higgins Soccer Complex on Sunday afternoon. First touch between the Big Red and Wildcats is slated for 2 p.m.

LAST TIME OUT

► Cornell and its Central New York rival Binghamton played to a 2-2 draw at Berman Field on Wednesday night. The draw ensured Cornell extended its home unbeaten streak to nine matches (4-0-5), tying the program record initially set during the 1985 and 1986 seasons (8-0-1).

► Junior forward **SYDNEY MALAGA** and senior forward **AVA LADEN** scored second-half goals to avenge an early deficit. Binghamton netted the game-tying marker in the 79th minute to level the match.

► Sophomore goalkeeper **NATALIE MEDUGNO** made all three of her saves in the opening 20 minutes of the match, bringing her record on the year to 2-0-2.

► In a tale of two halves, Cornell ended up edging Binghamton in shot attempts, 15-14, which included a 12-5 ledger in the second half. The Big Red had a 7-1 advantage in shots on goal in the latter 45-minute period.

NO 'L' IN UNBEATEN

► After concluding the 2022 campaign with Ivy League victories over Princeton and Dartmouth, Cornell is currently unbeaten over its last seven matches, posting a 4-0-3 mark during the stretch.

► No Cornell team has registered an eight-match unbeaten streak since going 9-0-3 during a 12-match span — the second-longest in the program history — over the final match in 2014 and the first 11 matches in 2015.

► A win or tie on Sunday afternoon against Villanova would mark just the fifth time in program history in which the Big Red has logged an unbeaten streak of at least eight matches (1985-86, 1987-88, 1991, 2014-15).

STARTING OFF STRONG

► Cornell's 2-0-3 record is the best five-match start to a season since the Big Red went 4-1-0 in 2019. With its current record, this season marks the seventh instance in program history in which Cornell has not lost any of its first five contests, joining the squads from 1986, 1991, 1992, 2004, 2005, and 2015.

► With a non-losing result on Sunday afternoon to Villanova, it would mark the fifth time in Cornell program history in which it has not lost in any of its first six matches (1986, 1991, 2005, 2015).

► Regardless of the result of Sunday's match, Cornell will be off to its best six-match start to a season since 2019, when the program had a 4-1-1.

THANKS FOR THE HELP!

► Senior midfielder **REAGAN PAUWELS** has a team-leading three assists on the season, including helpers in the program's last two contests.

► With an assist on Sunday, Pauwels would become the first Big Red player with a three-match assist streak since **AVA LADEN** opened her collegiate career with assists in her first three matches as a sophomore in 2021.

► Pauwels' next assist would be her fourth of the season, making her the eighth Cornell player (10th occurrence) over the last 20 seasons of competition to register at least four assists. The last time a Cornell player had a four-assist season was in 2021 when Laden tallied four helpers.

SHINING IN THE SECOND HALF

► Cornell's offense has kicked into another gear in the second half this season, as five of the team's eight goals have been scored in the final 45-minute period.

► Along with the increased goal total in the second half, Cornell has a plus-21 advantage in shot attempts (44-23) in the frame. In comparison, Cornell has a minus-7 figure in shot attempts in the first half, as opponents have a 24-17 edge.

► Corner kicks have also seen an uptick in the second half as the Big Red only have five first-half corners compared to 13 in the second half.

ANCIENT EIGHT'S SUCCESS

► Through matches completed on Thursday, the Ivy League has excelled on the pitch, posting a combined 32-7-13 record, leading to a Division I-leading .740 win percentage.

► All eight members of the Ivy League have a win percentages north of .500, and six programs currently have at least a .700 win percentage.

► The Ivy League is one of three conferences (Big Ten and SEC) with at least a .700 win percentage.

Cornell is 7-3-1 all-time on Sept. 17; 0-1-1 under **ROB FERGUSON**

Sept. 17, 1984: Cornell opened the 1984 campaign with a 7-0 drubbing of Hamilton, featuring a four-assist performance by **KRISTA KALLIO**. The Big Red out-shot the Continentals in the contest, 27-0, which included 19 shots on goal.

IVY LEAGUE PRESEASON POLL

► Cornell was picked to finish sixth in the 2023 Ivy League women's soccer preseason poll, the conference office announced on Aug. 24.

► Brown received 12 of 16 possible first-place votes, finishing with an Ivy League-best 123 points. Harvard recorded three first-place votes, placing second with 113 points. Yale was the only other school to receive a first-place vote, garnering 88 points and the last first-place vote.

► Princeton (78 points) and Columbia (74 points) were picked fourth and fifth, respectively, and Cornell (35 points) was picked sixth. Dartmouth (33 points) and Penn (32 points) rounded out the poll.

ACROSS THE NATION

► Cornell has no geographical recruiting base, as the Big Red has 16 states on this year's roster.

► California has the most representatives on this year's roster, as five student-athletes reside in the Golden State. New York has the second-highest total with four. Colorado and Texas are right behind with three apiece. Illinois, Maryland, and New Jersey each have two representatives.

► Indiana, Massachusetts, Michigan, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Vermont, Virginia, and Washington are represented once on this year's roster.

CORNELL CONNECTIONS

► Junior forward **SYDNEY MALAGA** is the daughter of Cornell Athletics Hall of Famer **SCOTT MALAGA**, who was inducted in 1999. Scott concluded his Big Red football career with 1,925 rushing yards, which ranks fourth in program history. Sydney's twin brother, Luke, is also actively on the Big Red football team.

► Both senior defender **MIA GONZALEZ** and sophomore defender **GABY GONZALEZ** are third-generation Cornell students. Their father, Jack, and mother, Jodi, graduated from Cornell in 1991. Jack also played on the Cornell men's soccer team from 1988-90. The Gonzalez sisters also have a pair of uncles who graduated from the institution.

► Sophomore forward **GRACE DIEHL** is a third-generation Cornell student-athlete as her father, Jeff (1991-92), and grandfather, Thomas (1967-68), played two seasons on the Cornell football team.

► Fellow sophomore defender **MARAN KINGSLEY** is a third-generation Cornell student. Her mother received her MBA from the institution, and her grandfather was an undergraduate student in the College of Engineering.

► **MARIANA KESSINGER**, a sophomore midfielder, is also following in both of her parent's footsteps as they both attended Cornell.

► Junior defender **ALEX BROTHERTON** is a second-generation Cornell student as her mother, Zela, graduated from Cornell in 2004.

► Senior forward **LAKEN GALLMAN** is the second member of her family to play a sport at Cornell, as her brother, Eric II, spent four years on Cornell's football team (2017-21) before playing a post-grad year at Duke in 2022.

SCOUTING VILLANOVA

- Villanova enters today's match with a 3-0-4 overall record while riding a 10-match unbeaten streak dating back to last season.
- Three of the Wildcats' last four matches have resulted in ties, as Villanova played 1-1 draws with Bucknell (Aug. 31) and Penn (Thursday) and a scoreless draw with West Virginia.
- Today is Villanova's first home match since drawing with Lehigh, 1-1, on Aug. 20. The Wildcats concluded its five-match road trip on Thursday against Penn on the Quakers' home turf.
- Jackie Richards paces Villanova's offense with her team-leading four goals and nine points. Makayla Stadler (three goals) and Alex Little (two goals) are also the Wildcats' multi-goal scorers. Megan Donnelly has a program-leading three assists on the season.
- Goalkeeping duties have been reserved for Payton Woodward, as she has logged all 630 minutes between the pipes for Villanova. Woodward's 0.43 goals-against average (tied for 26th) and .824 save percentage (tied for 64th) rank within the top 65 nationally for Division I goalkeepers. She also has four clean sheets to her credit this season.

VILLANOVA'S LAST TIME OUT

- Villanova and Penn played to a 1-1 draw at Penn Park on Thursday night, increasing the Wildcats' unbeaten streak to 10, dating back to last season.
- Jackie Richards scored for Villanova with a goal off a header in the 81st minute, but Penn responded with a goal off a corner kick just 70 seconds later to draw the contest level.
- Penn's tally was the first time Villanova conceded a goal since drawing with Bucknell, 1-1, on Aug. 31. Villanova goalkeeper Payton Woodward made her lone save of the night in the 87th minute, laying out to make the stop.
- The Quakers held advantages over Villanova in shot attempts (11-8) and corner kicks (7-3) over the 90-minute match.

38 YEARS, 218 MILES, 5 MEETINGS

- Cornell and Villanova are meeting for the sixth time on Sunday afternoon. The Wildcats have a slight 3-2-0 edge over the Big Red in the series.
- Last season, then-freshman defender Gaby Gonzalez netted the game-winning goal on a corner kick in the 18th minute to lift Cornell past Villanova, 2-1, at Berman Field. Laken Gallman opened the scoring with a 13th-minute tally. The win for the Big Red marked the first victory over the Wildcats since the inaugural contest between the programs on Oct. 7, 1984, in Garden City, N.Y.
- Villanova's lone goal last season came from Alexa Wojnovich in the 19th minute, while Payton Woodward stopped seven Cornell shots in the setback for the Wildcats.
- The Big Red is making its second-ever appearance on Villanova's home turf. In the only other meeting held at the Higgins Sports Complex, first-half goals by Chloe O'Neill and Brice McInroy spearheaded a 2-0 victory for the Wildcats. Goalkeeper Megan McClay made four saves in the clean sheet.

FOURTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH

Years at Cornell: Fifth Season
College: University of Manchester

ROB FERGUSON, who enters his fourth season as the head coach of the Cornell women's soccer program, was hired as the sixth head coach in the history of the Cornell women's soccer program in February 2020. Before being appointed head coach, Ferguson was an assistant coach for the 2019 campaign under previous head coach **DWIGHT HORNIBROOK**.

Ferguson's most recent season as head coach featured Cornell going 4-7-5 overall and 2-3-2 in Ivy League play. The Big Red concluded Ancient Eight play tied for fifth place, marking the best finish for the program since 2015. Cornell's conference victories in 2022 came in its final two matches against Princeton and Dartmouth, marking the first time the Big Red won consecutive Ivy League matches since claiming wins in the final match of 2014 and the first fixture in 2015. Cornell also posted an impressive 3-1-3 record on its home pitch, Berman Field, which featured going unbeaten over its final six matches (3-0-3).

The Big Red also had a trio of All-Ivy award winners, including Second Team All-Ivy selections **REAGAN PAUWELS** and **CECILY POKIGO**. It was the most All-Ivy players for Cornell women's soccer since having four players — including a pair of First Team All-Ivy selections — in 2015.

After Ferguson's first year as head coach was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, he guided Cornell to a 3-11-2 overall mark in 2021, which included a 1-6-0 Ivy League record. Cornell's lone Ivy League victory came against Columbia, 1-0, on Sept. 25, 2021, marking the program's first conference win since 2016.

In his first overall season on East Hill in 2019, Ferguson aided the Big Red to four consecutive victories to start the season, including three clean sheets over Siena, Bucknell, and St. Bonaventure. Cornell ultimately finished the season with a 4-10-1 record after the rigors of the most robust Ivy League competition in recent years. Ferguson helped get the Big Red's impact freshman class acclimated to collegiate competition, including 2019 All-Ivy League honorable mention selection **ASHLEY DURIK**.

Ferguson first joined the Big Red after a very successful stint as the Director of Coaching with the WNY Flash Academy. He helped turn the program into a player development leader in Western New York, expanding its footprint from 15 to 34 teams and moving them into national recognition in the Elite Clubs National League (ECNL). Under Ferguson's leadership at the Flash, their 03G ECNL and Flash 02G ECNL advanced into the Elite 8 in June 2018, and the club had their first US Youth National Team Camp call-up.

Before joining the WNY Flash Academy, Ferguson was the head coach of the men's and women's soccer programs at NAIA Huston-Tillotson University in Austin, Texas. Before that, he served as the Executive Director of Business for Lonestar Soccer Club from 2008 until 2015. One of the largest and most successful youth soccer clubs in the country, Ferguson coached the Lonestar 96B Red, 93G Red, 94G Red, and 95G Red, and he helped advance the 95G Red to the USYSNC Region III Championships in June 2013 and 2014.

Previous stops for Ferguson included a stint as the head coach with Albion Hurricanes FC in Houston, where he guided the AHFC 94G Blue to the USYSNC Regionals for the first time in their history. Before that, he was the Director of Coaching for FC Arsenal for three years in Bastrop, Texas, and he was a Regional Manager for Britannia Soccer/ProExcel, based in Seattle.
