#### **LOOSE ENDS**

Princeton is 48-66-11 all-time against Colgate and 16-33-5 in Hamilton dating back to a series which started in 1935 with a10-2 Princeton win in New Jersey on December 18. The Tigers will be looking to snap an 0-8-3 skid against the Raiders and pick up their first win over Colgate since a 4-3 (OT) win in Game 2 of the 2017 ECAC First Round. Princeton's last regular season win over Colgate was a 4-2 win in Hamilton on February 8, 2013 -- 19 regular season games ago. Looking ahead to Saturday, Princeton is 55-99-8 all-time against Cornell and is 17-53-2 in Ithaca. The two teams split the series last year, including a 2-1 (OT) Princeton win at Hobey Baker Rink before Cornell scored a 6-2 win at Lynah.

#### **GLORY DAYS**

The Tigers have won the ECAC Championship three times, doing so in 1998, 2008 and 2018. Princeton's four Ivy League championships came in 1941, 1953, 1999 and 2008. The Tigers have played in four NCAA Tournaments, reaching the national tournament in 1998, 2008, 2009, 2018.

#### **LONG WALK HOME**

Saturday night at Lynah Rink will be a short walk home from the bus for **Ben Syer**, but it will be a long walk to the visitor's bench as head coach of the Tigers following a 13-year stint as an assistant with the Big Red. Syer's 13 seasons at Cornell included seven Ivy League championships, three ECAC regular season titles and one ECAC Championships postseason title which came this past March. Overall, he was part of a Big Red program that qualified for seven NCAA Tournaments and reached four Regional Finals.

#### DANCING IN THE DARK

Princeton had the spark to start the fire in the crowd, inciting Tiger fans to cheer and dance in the dark often to the tune of the No. 5 Scoring Offense in the ECAC and No. 29 in the nation last year, coming in at 2.97 goals-per-game. The Tigers scored 2+ goals in 26 of 30 games, and were not shut out until a 1-0 loss at Harvard on the first round of the ECAC Playoffs. The Tigers are averaging 2.25 goals-per-game this season and have 2+ goals in 2 of 4 outings.

#### **HUNGRY HEART**

The Tigers laid down their money and played their part on the power play last season, leading the ECAC and ranking No. 4 in the country going 25-for-90 to the tune of a 27.8% conversion rate. Princeton returns 64% of its power play scoring from last year, including **Kai Daniells** who had five PPGs as a freshman. **Jack Cronin** has 10 career power-play goals entering his senior season, with 10 of his 25 career goals (40%) coming on the man advantage. After going 1-for-7 on the PP in the first weekend, Princeton was 2-for-5 last weekend and enter this week ranked No. 9 in the country (25.0%; 3-for-12).

#### **LUCKY TOWN**

Princeton played nine overtime games out of its 30 contests last season, posting a 5-0-4 record in games going more than 60:00 to lose the blues they found along the way. No team in the country played as many overtime games without suffering a loss in them as Princeton did. The five OT wins in a season set a new program record and were one off the ECAC record held by Colgate (2008-09) and Cornell (1985-86). Naturally, the Tigers went to overtime in the opener and had that run of OT appearances without a loss snapped by Harvard. So far this season, Princeton is 0-1-1 in OT games with a loss to Harvard and tie (shootout loss) at Brown.

#### **HIGH HOPES**

Seven of Princeton's 13 returning upperclassmen from last season are coming off seasons where they set a new career high in points and have high hopes to build off that for 24-25. David Jacobs (+9), Tyler Rubin (+8), Jaxson Ezman (+5), Brendan Gorman (+5), Jack Cronin (+1), Noah de la Durantaye (+1), and Brendan Wang (+1) all set new career highs last season.

#### **HUMAN TOUCH**

Princeton has had the first human to touch the puck on face-offs at a good clip to start the season, ranking No. 9 in country in faceoff % at .545 (122-102) through four games. Freshman **Drew Garzone** is 66% on faceoffs this season (35-18) and ranks No. 4 in the country in faceoff win percentage among players to win at least 35 draws.

#### I'M A ROCKER

Princeton has a lot of rock stars back and returns 53 of its 89 goals scored last season, accounting for 60% of its total goals. **Jack Cronin** is the leading goal scorer back for the Tigers, with 11 goals last season and 25 for his career. **Kai Daniells** is next with eight tallies last season as a freshman. The goal number matches up closely with the overall points back as the Tigers return 144 of 245 points registered last season [59%].

#### I'LL SEE YOU IN MY DREAMS

In terms of games that live on in the dreams of Princeton fans, the Tigers have 57 wins over ranked opponents all-time dating back to its first – a 3-2 win over No. 1 Boston University on December 30, 1997. The most recent win over a ranked opponent was a 2-1 (OT) win over No. 10 Cornell at Hobey Baker Rink on November 18, 2023.

#### **GHOSTS OF TOM JOAD**

Princeton won't be seeing any ghosts of Tom Joad, but they will be replacing a seven-player senior class from last season that played a total of 623 combined games and accumulated 235 points as a group. Ian Murphy, who led the Class of 2024 with 71 points (35g, 36a) in 81 games, is playing a graduate season/COVID year at Notre Dame, while defenseman Nick Carabin (29 points on the blue line) is doing the same at UConn. Adam Robbins has signed on with the Tahoe Knight Monsters (ECHL) after posting 58 points in 111 career games at Princeton. A pair of seniors from last year's team have started their pro careers together with the Coventry Blaze of the EIHL in England - forward Nick Seitz (49 points in 114 career Princeton games) and defenseman Mike Kennedy (13 points in 76 career games).

#### **BORN TO RUN**

Princeton has four seniors about to embark on their own "last chance power drive" in Noah de la Durantaye, Jack Cronin, Ethan Pearson and Alex Konovalov. They started their careers during a 2021-22 season which was full of starts and stops due to COVID-19 protocols and now have played 252 combined games with one appearance in the ECAC Quarterfinals. The four seniors on their roster are the fewest of any ECAC team and tied for second-fewest among all Division I teams. Only Northern Michigan [3] has fewer seniors than the Tigers.

#### IF I SHOULD FALL BEHIND

Princeton struggled out of the gate last season, being outscored in the first period by an 42-21 margin over its 30 games during the 2023-24 season. So far this season, Princeton has a +2 (3-1) goal differential in the first period.

#### LAND OF HOPE AND DREAMS

Grab your ticket and your suitcase, hockey fans as we embark on the 2024-25 season which started with Princeton slotted No. 9 in the ECAC Preseason Poll. Faith will be rewarded as the Tigers look for their first trip back to Lake Placid since the 2018 team carried some saints and sinners to the ECAC title and the NCAA Tournament.

#### THE NEW TIMER

In addition to six members of the freshman class this season, two Tigers are still in search of their first career goal as 2024-25 opens. Senior Alex Konovalov has six assists in 44 career games, but is looking for his first career goal – he did score against Waterloo in the exhibition game in October. Junior defenseman Brendan Wang has played 45 games and has one assist. Freshman forward Jake Manfre tallied his first career goal at Yale (11/15), while sophomore defenseman Ian Devlin scored against Dartmouth (11/9) to get his first collegiate goal in his 13th game.

### **BREAKAWAY**

Princeton was 2-1 in official shootouts last season, picking up extra ECAC points at Harvard and against Union. **Noah de la Durantaye** is the top option returning in the shootout for the Tigers entering 2024-25 with a 2-for-3 mark including the deciding goal at Harvard last season. **Ethan Pearson** is 7-for-11 in his three shootout appearances in goal with a 1-2 record overall.

#### **GROWIN' UP**

The Class of 2027 grew up quickly last season as all five skaters recorded at least one point and goalie **Conor Callaghan** had a win in his first career start in goal. **Kai Daniells** led the way with his 19 points (8g, 11a) and 5 PPGs while playing all 30 games. **Joshua Karnish** scored in his first collegiate game and went on to tally four points in 27 games. **Carson Buydens** played in 22 games and had three points. **Ian Devlin** was limited to just 12 games on the back end due to injury, but acclimated himself well while picking up an assist.

#### I'M ON FIRE

In terms of single-game point streaks last season by players back for 2024-25, the largest came when Kai Daniells opened his collegiate career with points in four consecutive games from 11/3-11/11. He also tallied a point in three straight games from 12/9-1/5. Noah de la Durantaye had a four-game point streak (1/13-30) and a pair of three-game streaks while **David Jacobs** had three consecutive games with a point on three different occasions. Jack Cronin, Brendan Gorman and Tyler Rubin each had two separate three-game point streaks during the season. David Ma, Nick Marciano and Jaxson Ezman enter this weekend with two-game point streaks.

#### **BECAUSE THE NIGHT**

25 of Princeton's 29 games this regular season are scheduled for 7 p.m. starts with four non-conference games set for 4 p.m. starts – Ohio State (11/30), Army West Point (12/28), New Hampshire (1/4) and Bentley (1/26).

#### **AMERICAN LAND**

Princeton's 19 US-born players hail from eight different states, led by five from Massachusetts and four from New Jersey.

### **ACROSS THE BORDER**

Princeton counts eight of its 27 players (30%) as Canadian, led by three from British Columbia (Kai Daniells, Luc Pelletier, and Brendan Wang).

### **BRILLIANT DISGUISE**

If you were keeping an eye on NHL Development Camps this summer, you may have seen a few Tigers donning the brilliant disguise of NHL organizations as three players on this year's team attended NHL Development Camps for the second time in their careers:

Noah de la Durantaye - Vegas (2022, 2024) Brendan Gorman - Vegas (2023),

San Jose 2024) Arthur Smith - Tampa Bay (2022), Philadelphia (2024)

A total of 24 Tigers have been drafted in the NHL since the draft began in 1963.

#### MY BEAUTIFUL REWARD

Princeton has made a habit of appearing on SportsCenter's Top-10 Plays over the past two years, earning some beautiful rewards for standout play. Tiger players have made five appearances on the nightly highlight reel dating back to 2022-23, with Ian Murphy's appearance at #1 on March 2 the pinnacle. The appearance was Murphy's second of the season -- he was #6 after combining with David Jacobs for a pretty play on January 6. Adam Robbins has made two appearances over the past two seasons, coming in at #5 on November 11 following his 0T winner against Yale this season and taking the #4 spot on January 7, 2023 after a penalty shot goal against Harvard. Aidan Porter earned the #6 play on March 11, 2023 following his sliding save against Harvard in the ECAC Playoffs last year.

#### NO SURRENDER

There was no retreat from senior defenseman **Noah de la Durantaye** last season as he had career highs in points (18) and assists (15) while his three goals were one away from his career high. He is Princeton's active leader in games played (92) and assists (35) and second in points (46).

#### JACOB'S LADDER

**David Jacobs** had 15 points (5g, 10a) as a freshman in 2022-23 over 32 games before climbing the points ladder last year and becoming almost a point-per-game player with 24 points in 30 games last season as a sophomore. He already has three points (3a) in four games this season.

#### **JACK OF ALL TRADES**

**Jack Cronin** was on pace to well-surpass his single-season bests last season before missing four games with injury. Still, he did set a career high in points (19) and assists (8) while his 11 goals were one off his career high.

### MY FATHER'S HOUSE

Junior **Brendan Gorman** has taken to Baker Rink and had more success on-ice in the former home of his father (Sean, Class of 1991) as well as older brother Liam (Class of 2023). Here's the family scoring race entering the season.

#### THE 'E' STREET SHUFFLE

There were some sparks flying in E's crease as **Ethan Pearson** made 50 saves and allowed just two goals in a 1-0-1 weekend at Yale and Brown to earn ECAC Goaltender of the Week honors. Pearson is 1-1-1 overall this season and boasts a 1.90 GAA (#2 in ECAC and #17 in NCAA) and .929 save% (#2 in ECAC and #18 in NCAA).

#### THE WALL

**Arthur Smith** was named honorable mention All-Ivy last season in goal as a freshman bolstered by a 5-1-0 record against Ivy opponents with a 2.26 GAA and a .926 save percentage.

#### **WAITING ON A SUNNY DAY**

Princeton fans have been waiting on the return of **David Ma** since the end of the 2022-23 season and he returns to the defensive corps for his junior season after missing all of last season as he dealt with an injury that had limited him to just 35 games over his first two seasons. He had 7 points (2g, 5a) in 18 games in 21-22 before adding 4 assists in 17 games in 22-23. A puck-moving defenseman, Ma won a Clark Cup with the Chicago Steel in 2021 and played for Team USA at the 2019 Hlinka-Gretzky Cup. He has three points (1g, 2a) in four games this season -- scoring at Brown (11/16) for his first goal in 1,099 days dating back to 11/13/21 at LIU.

#### **THE RISING**

Already through four games this season, **Nick Marciano's** career high in points has started rising. He has three points (1g, 2a) in four games after posting four total points over his first 48 games.

#### MAN AT THE TOP

#### STREETS OF PHILADELPHIA

The lone Pennsylvania native on the team is **Jayden Sison** who hails officially from Paoli and played for the Philadelphia Junior Flyers growing up before heading to Mount St. Charles. Sison played 30 games at forward during the 2022-23 season, tallying 8 points (2g, 6a) before injuries to Princeton back end led to him playing 30 more on defense last season where had had four assists.
