

#### **PUCK DROP**

- ▶ The Cornell men's hockey team (6-2-0, 5-1-0 ECAC Hockey), ranked No. 17 in the latest USCHO.com poll, looks to claim the Kelley-Harkness Cup for a fifth consecutive time when it faces No. 19 Boston University (6-7-1, 4-4-0 Hockey East) in the 10th edition of the biennial Red Hot Hockey game at Madison Square Garden. The matchup serves as a rematch of last year's Toledo Regional Final in the NCAA Division I Men's Hockey Championship.
- ▶ Puck drop is scheduled for 8 p.m., with game action streaming on ESPN+ featuring JASON WEINSTEIN (play-by-play) and former Cornell forward ANTHONY ANGELLO (analyst) on the call.

#### RETURN OF RED HOT HOCKEY

- ▶ Tonight's game marks the 10th installment of the biennial Red Hot Hockey series, which began in 2007-08. Boston University went unbeaten in the first five matchups (3-0-2), but Cornell has won four straight to claim possession of the Kelley-Harkness Cup.
- In the most recent meeting in 2023, third-period goals from then-freshman forward RYAN WALSH and then-junior **ONDREJ PSENICKA** powered Cornell to a 2-1 victory over No. 5 Boston University. Then-junior goaltender IAN SHANE made 35 saves as Cornell hoisted the Kelley-Harkness Cup for a fourth consecutive time.
- ▶ The nine previous Red Hot Hockey games have drawn 147,957 fans, averaging 16,440 per contest.

### **BACK IN THE NEW YORK GROOVE**

- ▶ Cornell will be playing its 30th all-time game at Madison Square Garden tonight and its 22nd at the current location. The Big Red hold an 18-8-3 record at The World's Most Famous Arena and are unbeaten in nine of the last 10 contests at the venue (7-1-2).
- Last year, No. 11 Cornell battled No. 18 Quinnipiac to a 3-3 tie in the Frozen Apple before claiming victory in a shootout.
- ▶ Since a 4-1 loss to Harvard in the 2018 Frozen Apple, the Big Red are unbeaten in its last five games at Madison Square Garden, defeating Boston University in 2019, 2021, and 2023 while blanking No. 6 UConn 6-0 in 2022.

#### **WEEKEND REWIND**

- ▶ Cornell completed a perfect four-game homestand with a weekend sweep of Union and RPI at Lynah Rink, improving to 6-2-0 overall and 5-1-0 in ECAC Hockey play.
- ▶ The Big Red are off to its best eight-game start since 2021-22 (7-1-0) and have won its first four home games for the first time since that season.
- Friday's 2-1 victory over No. 20 Union showcased the Big Red's defensive prowess, limiting the nation's third-best scoring offense to just 19 shots. Sophomore **CHARLIE MAJOR** netted the game-winner with 1:49 left in the second period, while freshman goaltender ALEXIS COURNOYER made 18 saves, including four crucial stops in the final five minutes to preserve the narrow lead.
- ► Saturday brought a dominant 6-1 rout of RPI, powered by a newly formed line of Major, junior RYAN WALSH, and junior LUKE DEVLIN that combined for 10 points in their debut as a unit. Walsh recorded a career-high five assists, while Devlin notched his first career multi-goal game with two tallies and Major posted a career-high three points on a goal and two assists. Cournoyer continued his strong play with 23 saves, earning ECAC Hockey Rookie of the Week honors for the second time in three weeks.

#### **NEWS AND NOTES**

- Cornell and Boston University are meeting for the 54th time in program history this evening. The Big Red have had a 27-23-3 advantage in the series and are 13-11-3 in contests played on neutral ice.
- Nine of the last 12 meetings have been decided by one goal, and all 12 contests have been determined within two goals.
- ▶ Tonight is the 13th time in the last 14 meetings the Big Red and Terriers are playing at a neutral site (10 at MSG, once each at DCU Arena, Huntington Center, and SNHU Arena).
- ▶ Boston University (6-7-1, 4-4-0) is coming off a split of its home-and-home series with Northeastern last weekend, falling to the Huskies at Matthews Arena in the final minute, 3-2, before posting a 4-3 overtime victory at Agganis Arena the following night.
- ▶ Defenseman Cole Hutson (7-11—18) leads the team in all three major scoring categories, while scoring three of the Terriers' six game-winning goals.
- Mikhail Yegorov (6-6-1, 3.60, .886) has started all 14 games for the Terriers this season, allowing at least three goals in nine of his 14 outings.

#### **NEWS AND NOTES**

- Cornell has won four of the last seven matchups against Clarkson (4-2-1), highlighted last year's victory in the ECAC Hockey Championship game in Lake Placid, N.Y.
- Clarkson is 2-0-2 in its last four home games against Cornell and has a 4-2-6 record in the previous 12 games at Cheel Arena against the Big Red, who will be seeking its first win in Potsdam since a 4-2 triumph on Nov. 15, 2019.
- Two of Clarkson's four victories on the season have come against top-10 opponents, as it defeated No. 4 Penn State, 6-4, on the road (Oct. 9) and bested No. 8 North Dakota, 5-2, at home (Oct. 24). All four of Clarkson's wins have featured the Golden Knights scoring at least five goals.
- Senior forward Ryan Bottrill (2-12—14) leads Clarkson in both assists and points while serving as the lone player to average at least one point per game. Freshman forward Owen Van Steensel (5-3—8) has the team lead in goals.
- Junior Shane Soderwall (4-8-0, 3.16, .895), a Division III transfer from Curry College, has started in 12 of the Golden Knights' 14 games this season, while graduate student Keenan Rancier (0-2-0, 4.18, .836) has started the other two.

#### **WALSH HEADED TO SPENGLER CUP**

- ▶ Junior captain **RYAN WALSH** was named to the United States Collegiate Selects roster for this year's Spengler Cup, it was announced Nov. 6. Walsh will compete Dec. 26-31 in Davos, Switzerland, in the 97th Spengler Cup, marking the first year a select team representing college hockey will participate in the prestigious tournament. Only two U.S.-based college programs Minnesota (1981) and North Dakota (1982) have previously competed in the event.
- ▶ Walsh is the 14th Cornell player since 1983 named to a Spengler Cup roster, joining LANCE NETHERY (HC Davos, 1983-89), DAN RATUSHNY (Team Canada, 1988, 1990, 2000), BRAD CHARTRAND (Team Canada, 1997), JASON ELLIOTT (TPS, 2002), DAVE LENEVEU (Team Canada, 2009), CHARLIE COOK (HC Davos, 2010), MIKE IGGULDEN (Team Canada, 2010), MIKE KNOEPFLI (HC Fribourg-Gottéron, 2012), KIRILL GOTOVETS and BEN SCRIVENS (Dinamo Minsk, 2016), RYAN VESCE (HC Lugano, 2016; EHC Olten, 2017), RILEY NASH (Team Canada, 2022), ALEX GREEN (Straubing Tigers, 2024).

#### **FIVE-PIECE, PLEASE**

- ► Since being named to the Spengler Cup roster on Nov. 6, junior forward **RYAN WALSH** has found his scoring touch, collecting eight points (3-5—8) of his team-leading 10 on the season.
- ▶ In last Saturday's 6-1 win over RPI, Walsh recorded a career-high five assists, becoming the 21st Big Red player (30th instance) to register at least five assists in a game and the first since current Cornell head coach CASEY JONES '90 on Jan. 6, 1989, against Brown.

- ▶ He became the first Division I player to record a five-assist game since Army's Nils Forselius tallied five helpers in a six-point performance during a 13-1 win over Mercyhurst on Jan. 11, 2025.
- ▶ Walsh is the fifth player this season to register at least four assists in a game, joining Bemidji State's Kasper Magnussen, Boston University's Sacha Boisvert, North Dakota's Ben Strinden, and St. Thomas' Charlie Schoen.

#### SPECIAL TEAMS SPECIAL

- ▶ Paired with RYAN WALSH's five-assist performance last Saturday, junior forward JONATHAN CASTAGNA achieved another relatively rare feat in the same game, scoring on both the power play and while short-handed against RPI.
- ▶ The last Big Red player to score on both ends of special teams was **ONDREJ PSENICKA** on Feb. 19, 2022, against Clarkson. However, Psenicka's short-handed goal was scored on an empty net, making Castagna the first Cornell player to score both a power-play and short-handed goal against an opposing goaltender since **MIKE RUTTER** on Feb. 11, 2000, at Clarkson.

- ► Castagna is the 17th Cornell player (24th instance) since 1960-61 to register a power-play and short-handed goal in the same game, and only the fourth player (sixth occurrence) to accomplish the feat over the last 45 years, joining JOE NIEUWENDYK (three times), Rutter, and Psenicka.
- ▶ This season, Castagna is one of eight Division I players this season to score both a power-play and short-handed goal in the same contest. Notably, three of the eight instances have been recorded by ECAC Hockey players, including Quinnipiac's Chris Pelosi (Nov. 21 vs. Clarkson), and RPI's Filip Sitar (Nov. 8 vs. Clarkson). #### ALEXIS-CELLENCE BETWEEN THE PIPES

- ► Freshman goaltender ALEXIS COURNOYER has been nothing short of stellar between the pipes through his first seven collegiate games, compiling a 6-1-0 record with a 1.30 goals-against average and .953 save percentage, ranking third in goals-against and second in save percentage among qualified Division I goaltenders.
- ▶ Cournoyer is the sixth Cornell goaltender over the last 20 seasons to post a goals-against average under 2.00 through his first seven career games, trailing only MATTHEW GALAJDA (1.27, 2017-18), HAYDEN STEWART (1.48, 2014-15), IAN SHANE (1.62, 2021-22), MITCH GILLAM (1.82, 2013-15), and AUSTIN McGRATH (1.84, 2018-19) round out the top six.
- ▶ His .953 save percentage ranks as the best mark by a Cornell goaltender through their first five seven games since the 2005-06 season, ahead of Stewart's .952 clip.
- ▶ Among active Division I goaltenders, Cournoyer's 1.30 goals-against average and .953 save percentage both rank second through a player's first seven career games, trailing only Michigan's Jack Ivankovic (1.00, .954).

Cournoyer is one of four active Division I goaltenders with a sub-1.50 goals-against average through their first seven games (minimum 400 minutes), joining Ivankovic (1.00, 2025-26), Denver's Quentin Miller (1.41, 2025-26), and Michigan State's Luca DiPasquo (1.49, 2023-25).

#### (BIG) RED MEANS STOP

- ▶ Cornell has allowed 11 goals through its first eight games, marking the fifth time the Big Red have surrendered 11 or fewer goals to start a season, previously accomplished in 1965-66 (8), 1967-66, 2002-03, and 2004-05 (11 each).
- ▶ The Big Red's stinginess has carried over from recent seasons, as Cornell owns the second-best scoring defense as of Wednesday morning (1.38 goals allowed per game). Cornell has ranked among the top 10 nationally in scoring defense 12 times over the past two decades — more than any other program — and is one of only three teams (Denver and Minnesota State with 10 each) to post at least 10 top-10 finishes in that span.
- ► Cornell has not allowed more than two goals in any of its first eight games, marking the fourth time in program history the Big Red have accomplished the feat, joining the teams from 2019-20 (first 14 games), 1965-66, and 2004-05 (first 10 games each).
- Over the last nine seasons, Cornell has finished in the top 10 in scoring defense seven times, tied with Minnesota State for the most in Division I, and in the top 12 in each of its last eight seasons, the longest active streak nationally. The Big Red have also ranked in the top 12 in 10 of the past 11 seasons.
- ▶ Since 2014-15, Cornell has allowed 1.968 goals per game joining Minnesota State (1.889) as the only Division I programs under 2.00 in that span — and has not conceded 100 goals in a season since 1997-98, a 26-year streak twice as long as any other active run (Minnesota State and Providence — 13 each). Within ECAC Hockey, Clarkson (8) and Quinnipiac (7) rank second and third, respectively.

#### JONNY-ON-THE-DOT

- ▶ Through the first eight games, junior forward JONATHAN CASTAGNA boasts the nation's top faceoff win percentage among players with a minimum of 75 faceoff wins, winning 91 of the 142 draws (64.1 percent). He is one of 12 players with at least a 60.0 percent win percentage on faceoffs. Quinnipiac's Victor Czerneckianair has the second-highest average in ECAC Hockey (119-of-196 — .6071).
- In the 2025 calendar year, Castagna has been one of the nation's most reliable players at the dot, winning 62.0 percent of his draws (298-of-479), making him one of two active Division I players with at least a 60 percent success rate on faceoffs (Wisconsin's Gavin Morrissey (400-of-666 — .601).

- ► The success that junior forwards JONATHAN CASTAGNA (91 faceoff wins, 64.1 percent) and RYAN WALSH (90 faceoff wins, 55.2 percent) have had at the dot has enabled Cornell to serve as the lone Division I program with multiple players averaging at least 10 faceoff wins per game this season.
- ► Castagna's team-leading 91 faceoff wins has resulted in an 11.38 faceoff wins per game average, ranking 12th nationally. Walsh is right behind at 11.25 faceoff wins per game, placing him 13th nationally. Both players have the
- second- and third-highest faceoff wins per game total in ECAC Hockey, trailing only Dartmouth's Hank Cleaves (12.17).

▶ With Castagna and Walsh's faceoff percentages being above 55 percent, Cornell is one of nine programs with multiple players having at least 75 faceoff wins and be successful on 55 percent of faceoffs taken, joining Wisconsin (three), Arizona State, Bowling Green, Colorado College, Maine, Michigan, North Dakota, and Quinnipiac (two each).

#### **GIO-GETTER**

- Freshman forward GIO DIGIULIAN has been a clutch scorer from the start, opening his collegiate career with goals in the first three games of the season. He became just the second Cornell freshman to score in the Big Red's first three games, joining TRENT ANDISON (1987-88), and the ninth player in their first year of eligibility to accomplish the feat.
- ▶ DiGiulian's knack for timely tallies reached historic proportions with his game-winning goal against Brown on Nov. 14, making him the first freshman or first-year eligible player in Cornell program history to net multiple game-winning goals through the team's first five games. After scoring against Brown, DiGiulian also became the third Cornell freshman to score in four of the first five games of a season, joining GARY CULLEN (1981-82) and **KENT MANDERVILLE** (1989-90). It was the first time the feat had been accomplished - regardless of class since MATT MOULSON in 2003-04.

▶ Should DiGiulian net a game-winning goal tonight, he would become the first Cornell freshman or first-year eligible player with three game-winning goals through the first nine games in program history. He would also become the 10th player in program history to record three game-winning goals through the team's ninth game of a season, joining EDMUND "STUBBY" MAGNER (five in 1910-11), NICK D'AGOSTINO (four in 2011-12), and FRANK CRASSWELLER (1910-11), MIKE DORAN (1966-67), **GARTH RYAN** (1969-70), **DOUG MARRETT** (1972-73), **LANCE NETHERY** (1976-77), **PAT HEAPHY** (1987-88), and MICHAEL REGUSH (2019-20), all of whom had three game-winning goals.

#### FRESH IMPACT

Cornell's 12-player freshman class has made an immediate impression, combining for 24 of the Big Red's 66 points this season (36.4 percent). Cornell is one of 11 Division I programs receiving at least 35 percent of its offensive production from first-year players, joining Miami (55-of-126 — 43.7 percent), St. Lawrence (37-of-85 — 43.5 percent), New Hampshire (33-of-76 — 43.4 percent), Merrimack (38-of-91 — 41.8 percent), Providence (41-of-102 — 40.2 percent), Quinnipiac (53-of-135 — 39.3 percent), Maine (54-of-142 — 38.0 percent), Michigan Tech (43-of-116 — 37.1 percent), Michigan State (43-of-117 — 36.8 percent), and North Dakota (45-of-126 — 35.7 percent).

**NCAA LEADERS** 

- ▶ The Big Red enter this weekend serving as one of 13 programs nationally with at least seven freshmen have multiple points so far this season. Arizona State, Boston University, Merrimack, Miami, and Michigan Tech all have eight players meeting the criteria, while Clarkson, Denver, Michigan, North Dakota, Providence, St. Lawrence, and Wisconsin all have seven first-year players with at least two points.
- ▶ Eleven of Cornell's 25 goals this season have come from first-year players, led by forward GIO DIGIULIAN's four tallies. The Big Red's 44.0 percent scoring share from freshman ranks sixth nationally, only trailing New Hampshire (48.1 percent — 13-of-27), Michigan State and Michigan Tech (45.2 percent — 19-of-42), Quinnipiac (44.9 percent — 22-of-49), and Niagara (44.1 percent — 15-of-34).

#### LIGHTING THE LAMP (CARNELIAN) RED

- ▶ Beyond its defensive prowess, Cornell has shown a consistent ability to light the lamp, averaging at least three goals per game in each of the past seven seasons dating to 2017-18.
- ▶ The Big Red's seven-year streak of averaging three or more goals per game is the second-longest active run in Division I hockey, trailing Western Michigan's nine-season streak. Boston University and North Dakota each enter the season with six consecutive seasons above the three-goal mark, while Quinnipiac holds ECAC Hockey's second-longest active streak at five seasons.
- ▶ Since 2017-18 season, Cornell ranks 12th nationally in goal scoring (3.202), one of 18 Division I programs to average at least three goals per contest. The Big Red's average is second in ECAC Hockey behind only Quinnipiac (3.441, sixth nationally), while Denver leads all Division I teams at 3.658 goals per game.

#### PASSING THE TORCH ON EAST HILL

- ▶ A new era has arrived on East Hill as former captain CASEY JONES '90 assumed head coaching duties from legendary head coach MIKE SCHAFER '86, who retired following last season after a 30-year tenure.
- ▶ With Jones at the helm, the 2025-26 season marks the 39th consecutive year that a Cornell graduate is serving as the Big Red's head coach, continuing a lineage featuring BRIAN McCUTCHEON '71 (1987-95) and Schafer (1995-2025). Cornell owns the second-longest active streak in Division I hockey with an alumnus serving as head coach, trailing only Boston University (53 years). New Hampshire (36 years) and Boston College (32 years) are the only other programs with 30-plus-year streaks.
- ► Since 1970-71, when **DICK BERTRAND** '70 became head coach, the Big Red have featured an alum as head coach in 50 of the last 56 seasons.

▶ Jones is one of 11 new head coaches in Division I hockey this season and one of three in ECAC Hockey, joining RPI's Eric Lang and Yale's Joe Howe, who is serving as interim head coach.

#### MODEL OF CONSISTENCY

- ▶ With ECAC Hockey play underway, Cornell looks to extend its streak of consecutive 10-win seasons in conference play. The Big Red have reached double-digit ECAC Hockey victories in each of the last eight seasons, the third-longest streak in program history behind runs of 19 seasons (1964-83) and 13 seasons (1999-2012).
- ▶ Under MIKE SCHAFER '86, who retired following last season, Cornell posted at least 10 conference wins in 24 of 29 seasons (82.8 percent). The Big Red's active streak is the fourth-longest in Division I hockey, trailing only Minnesota State (13 seasons), Boston University (11), and Western Michigan (9).

#### PERENNIAL POWER

- ▶ Cornell opened the season ranked No. 17 in the preseason USCHO.com poll, marking the Big Red's ninth consecutive season starting ranked in the top 20 — the second-longest streak in program history behind an 11-year run from 2002 to 2012.
- ▶ The Big Red are one of just four Division I programs ranked in the preseason top 20 in each of the last nine seasons, joining Denver, North Dakota, and Providence. North Dakota (25 consecutive years) and Denver (24 straight) have been ranked in every preseason poll since USCHO permanently expanded from 15 to 20 teams in 2005-06, while Providence has appeared in every preseason poll since 2013-14.

Across USCHO's 29 preseason polls, Cornell has been ranked 23 times — one of seven Division I programs to appear in at least 20, alongside North Dakota (29), Boston College (27), Michigan (27), Minnesota (26), Boston University (25), and Denver (25).

#### ECAC HOCKEY PRESEASON POLL

- ► Cornell was picked to finish third in the ECAC Hockey coaches' preseason poll announced Sept. 25. The Big Red received one of 12 first-place votes and finished with 111 points, one of three teams to surpass 100 points.
- Quinnipiac was tabbed as the regular-season favorite with nine first-place votes and 129 points, 11 points ahead of Clarkson (two first-place votes, 118 points). Dartmouth (97 points) finished 14 points behind Cornell in fourth to round out the projected first-round byes for the 2026 ECAC Hockey Championship.
- ▶ Union was fifth with 93 points, followed by Harvard (79), Colgate (77), and Princeton (55) in the projected host positions for first-round playoff games. St. Lawrence (48), Brown (47), RPI (42), and Yale (27) rounded out the 12-team poll.
- ► Cornell has been picked to finish in the top four in eight consecutive ECAC Hockey preseason polls, excluding

2020-21 when only four league members competed due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Clarkson holds the conference's longest active streak with nine straight top-four selections dating to 2016-17. Eight of the last nine preseason favorites have been either Cornell or Quinnipiac.

#### TIME TO STUDY THE ROSTER

- ► Cornell has 14 newcomers on this year's roster 12 freshmen and two sophomore transfers — matching the program's highest total since 2021-22, when the Big Red added 14 freshmen following the cancellation of the 2020-21 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- ▶ Only four teams in program history have had more newcomers: 1992-93 (18), 1957-58 (16), 1964-65 (16), and 1978-79 (16), which included four transfers from Penn after the Quakers disbanded their program.
- ▶ Newcomers comprise 45.2 percent of Cornell's roster, the 13th-highest percentage in the program's modern era (since 1957-58) and the highest since 2021-22 (46.7 percent).
- ▶ The Big Red's 12 freshmen are tied with Alaska, Boston University, Bowling Green, Colorado College, UMass Lowell, and Miami for second-most in Division I, trailing only Michigan Tech (13).

#### YOU FEEL THAT (NHL) DRAFT?

- ▶ Cornell has nine players drafted by NHL clubs, the program's highest total since 2005-06. Only the 1990-91 (14) and 2004-05 (10) teams had more NHL draft picks on their roster.
- ▶ For the first time in program history, Cornell has three draft picks selected within the first three rounds: junior forward JONATHAN CASTAGNA (70th overall, Utah via Arizona), sophomore defenseman MICHAEL FISHER (76th, San Jose) and junior defenseman GEORGE FEGARAS (83rd, Dallas). The Big Red previously had two players selected in the first three rounds 10 times, most recently in three of the last four seasons.
- ▶ Fisher is the highest-drafted Cornell defenseman since SASHA POKULOK went 14th overall to Washington in 2005, while becoming the first Big Red player selected by the Sharks since **JOAKIM RYAN** was taken in the seventh round (198th overall) in 2012.
- ► Freshman goaltender ALEXIS COURNOYER was Cornell's lone selection in June's NHL Entry Draft, taken in the fifth round (145th overall) by Montréal. He became the 13th Big Red goaltender to be drafted and the first since **DAVID LENEVEU** in 2002 (48th overall to Phoenix).
- ► Cornell's nine NHL draft picks are tied with Colorado College for 11th-most in Division I. Boston University leads the nation with 19, followed by Michigan State (15), Denver (14), Michigan and Minnesota (13 each), Boston College and North Dakota (12 each), and Harvard, Western Michigan and Wisconsin (10 each).

#### SCOUTING BOSTON UNIVERSITY

- ▶ Boston University enters tonight's matchup coming off a split of its home-and-home series with Northeastern last weekend, falling to the Huskies at Matthews Arena in the final minute, 3-2, before posting a 4-3 overtime victory at Agganis Arena the following night.
- ▶ The Terriers have scored the second-most shorthanded goals this season, potting six tallies while down a man. Kamil Bednarik (2-4—6) and Jonathan Morello (3-3—6) are tied for second nationally with two shorthanded tallies each. Cole Hutson (7-11—18), who leads the team in all three major scoring categories, has three of Boston University's six game-winning goals, tied for the second-most in Division I.
- ▶ Goaltender Mikhail Yegorov (6-6-1, 3.60, .886) has started all 14 games for the Terriers this season and has allowed at least three goals in nine of his 14 outings.

#### 100 YEARS. 328 MILES. 53 MEETINGS

- ▶ Cornell and Boston University are meeting for the 54th time in program history this evening. The Big Red have had a 27-23-3 advantage in the series and are 13-11-3 in contests played on neutral ice.
- ▶ Nine of the last 12 meetings have been decided by one goal, and all 12 contests have been determined within two goals.
- ▶ Tonight will be the 13th time in the last 14 meetings that the Big Red and Terriers are playing at a neutral site (10 at Madison Square Garden, once each at DCU Arena, Huntington Center, and SNHU Arena). Cornell is 3-5-2 in its previous 10 neutral site games against BU.

#### FRESHMAN SCORING AT MSG

- First-year players have consistently produced at Madison Square Garden, with a freshman scoring in seven of the last nine games at the venue. Last year's 3-3 tie against No. 18 Quinnipiac snapped a three-season streak of freshmen finding the back of the net at MSG.
- ▶ Since freshmen became eligible for varsity competition in 1975-76, 11 first-year players have scored at Madison Square Garden: Lance Nethery (1975-76), Riley Nash (two goals in 2007-08), Teemu Tiitinen (2012-13), Anthony Angello (2015-16), Noah Bauld (2016-17), Tristan Mullin (2017-18), Liam Motley (2018-19), Kyler Kovich and Ondrej Psenicka (2021-22), Dalton Bancroft (hat trick in 2022-23), and Ryan Walsh (2023-24).
- ▶ Walsh scored the game-tying goal in the third period of the last edition of Red Hot Hockey, setting up Psenicka for the game-winner. Three years ago, Bancroft became the first freshman to record a hat trick at Madison Square

Garden, joining Dick Bertrand '70 as the only Cornell players to accomplish the feat. Bertrand scored three goals on Dec. 22, 1969, in a 7-2 victory over St. Lawrence.

### LOOKING TO EXTEND THE STREAK

- ▶ Despite having its four-game win streak snapped last year with its 3-3 tie against No. 18 Quinnipiac, the Big Red are sporting a five-game unbeaten streak (4-0-1), where it has outscored opponents by a 19-8 mark.
- ▶ With a win or tie tonight, Cornell will have its secondlongest unbeaten streak at Madison Square Garden, trailing only a nine-game win streak between Dec. 22, 1964, and Jan. 5, 1975, with the first five wins coming at Madison Square Garden III and the first four at the current venue.

f you've never been to a Big Red hockey game at Cornell's Lynah Rink, there are quite a few things you've never experienced. You've never camped in line to get season tickets and ensure your spot as one of the raucous and devoted "Lynah Faithful." But most importantly, if you've never been to Lynah, you've never experienced all the best that college hockey offers.

Lynah Rink, which enters its 68th year serving as the home of Big Red hockey this season, was formally dedicated on April 6, 1957, a month after its opening to the public on March 4, 1957. The facility, which was built following a \$500,000 anonymous donation (approximately \$5.59 million in 2024), honors the late JAMES LYNAH '05, who served as the director of athletics at Cornell from 1935-43.

The donation to build Lynah Rink resurrected the

Cornell hockey program following a 10-year hiatus, ensuring hockey returned as a varsity sport for the 1957-58 season.

Cornell began sponsoring hockey as a varsity sport with the 1900-01 season, which featured all Big Red home games played on the university's outdoor rink on Beebe Lake. Due to a series of abnormally mild winters, the program was left — literally — on thin ice, causing Cornell to drop the program entirely after the 1947-48 campaign.

Since its opening in March of 1957, Lynah Rink has received numerous face-lifts since hosting its inaugural event on March 21, 1957, a 7-3 victory for the NHL's New York Rangers in an exhibiton against the Rochester Americans of the American Hockey League (AHL). Hockey Hall of Fame goaltender Gump Worsley stopped 44 shots in the victory for the Rangers.

Among the renovations, Cornell spent nearly \$1 million in the summer of 2000, to replace the rink floor, drainage system, frost protection and refrigeration piping, and adding new boards and seamless glass.

During the summer of 2006, a 16,700-square-foot expansion added new locker rooms, coaches offices, study lounges, new athletic training space, and approximately 450 new seats in the seating bowl.

Over last season's winter break, updated Cornell branding on the façade and south concourse brought a more modern look to the facility.

Though many physical aspects of Lynah Rink have changed over time, the crowd remains constant. Lynah Rink can hold 4,267 boisterous Cornell hockey fans, who provide unwavering support for the Big Red while creating an unparalleled atmosphere in college hockey.

Although many rinks in the nation are bigger in capacity, few are known to be louder. The Cornell fans, aptly named the "Lynah Faithful," stream into every home contest, making themselves as much a part of the game as the players do. Whether they're cheering for the Big Red or joining the pep band in their rendition of "Give My Regards to Davy," the Lynah Faithful reaffirms the old saying, "There's no place like home."

Since the doors opened on Lynah Rink, the Cornell men's hockey program has won a pair of NCAA Division I men's hockey championships in 1967 and 1970, garnering an ECAC Hockey-record 13 tournament championships (1967-70, 1973, 1980, 1986, 1996-97, 2003, 2005, 2010, 2024) and 26 lvy League titles, 22 of which have been won outright.

### CASEY JONES '90

1ST SEASON AS CORNELL HEAD COACH

Years at Cornell: 7th Season: 2nd Season of Third Stint College: Cornell '90

ASEY JONES '90 is entering his first season as the Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Cornell Men's Ice Hockey, taking over for soon-to-be Cornell Athletics Hall of Fame head coach MIKE SCHAFER '86, who retired after spending a program-record 30 seasons as the Big Red's head coach (1995-25).

Officially the 13th head coach in Cornell program history, Jones is entering the second season of his third stint on the Big Red coaching staff, having served as an assistant coach (1991-93) and associate head coach between 2008-11 in addition to last season.

Returning to East Hill following a 13-year tenure at fellow ECAC Hockey rival Clarkson (2012-24), Jones amassed a record of 234-185-56 (.552) with the Golden Knights, which included him winning the Tim Taylor Award, ECAC Hockey's Coach of the Year, in 2019.

While at Clarkson, the Golden Knights registered six 20-win seasons, four of which came during a five-year stretch between 2015 and 2020. Clarkson, who finished within the top 16 in pairwise ranking for five consecutive seasons (2017-22), made a pair of NCAA Tournaments in 2018 and 2019, and was poised for a third consecutive trip in 2020 before the COVID-19 pandemic halted those aspirations. The Golden Knights made the ECAC Hockey semifinals on three occasions (2018, 2019, 2022) under Jones, which included claiming the 2019 ECAC Hockey Tournament title.

Prior to his first head coaching appointment, Jones returned to Cornell for a three-year stint, serving as an associate head coach from 2008-11. The Big Red appeared in two NCAA Tournaments and won the 2010 ECAC Hockey Championship title while Jones was on staff, where the Big Red posted a 59-34-11 (.620) record and 38-20-8 (.636) mark in ECAC Hockey contests.

Jones returned to East Hill after coaching at Ohio State for 13 seasons (1995-2008) on John Markell's staff, serving as an assistant coach for nine years (1995-2004) before being elevated to associate head coach for his remaining four years with the Buckeyes. While at Ohio State, Jones served as the program's recruiting coordinator, aiding in the recruitment of 20 NHL draft picks including a trio of first-round picks in R.J. Umberger (16th overall in 2001), Dave Steckel (30th overall in 2001), and Ryan Kesler (23rd overall in 2003).

Known for being a staunch recruiter, the Buckeyes earned five NCAA Tournament appearances, highlighted by a trip to the 1998 Frozen Four, where Ohio State fell to Boston College in the national semifinal. Ohio State won one Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Super Six title in 2004, defeating Michigan for the program's first CCHA championship in 32 years.

One year following his graduation from Cornell in 1990 with a degree in business management, Jones found his spot on Cornell's bench, serving as an assistant coach under BRIAN McCUTCHEON, the head coach whom he played for. Jones spent two seasons on McCutcheon's staff from 1991-93 before making the move north to Clarkson for a two-year stint as an assistant on Mark Morris' staff from 1993-95. While with the Golden Knights, Clarkson generated a 43-19-9 (.669) record, winning the 1995 ECAC Hockey Championship title to clinch the league's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament.

A standout centerman for the Big Red between 1986 and 1990, Jones accrued 112 points (30 goals, 82 assists) in 110 career games for Cornell, highlighted by registering 30-point seasons as a sophomore in 1987-88 (10-22—32) and a junior in 1988-89 (8-27—35). Jones also served as a captain during his senior season.

Following his freshman season at Cornell, Jones was drafted by the Boston Bruins in the 10th round (203rd overall) of the 1987 NHL Entry Draft.

Originally from Témiscaming, Québec, Jones is married to his wife, Kimberlee, a Cornell alumna, and has two children, Gabi and Bryan.

## KEN DRYDEN

1947-2025

**EN DRYDEN** '69, the legendary Cornell men's hockey goaltender who still holds the program record for career wins (76) and backstopped the Big Red to its first national championship in 1967, died Sept. 5, after a courageous battle with cancer. He was 78.

**"KEN DRYDEN** was not only one of the greatest goaltenders in the history of hockey, but also a symbol of excellence, intellect, and leadership who represented Cornell with unmatched distinction," said Dr. **NICKI MOORE**, Cornell's Meakem & Smith Director of Athletics & Physical Education. "His impact on the game, on our university, and in communities throughout his homeland in Canada will endure far beyond the ice. Cornell Athletics & Physical Education mourns his passing, and we extend our deepest condolences to his family, friends, and all who were inspired by his extraordinary life."

**"KEN DRYDEN** was the quintessential student-athlete," added **CASEY JONES** '90, the current Jay R. Bloom '77 Head Coach of Cornell Men's Ice Hockey. "He was a great ambassador for Cornell and hockey in general. Our thoughts are with his family and friends."

"Intelligent, classy, articulate, kind, athletic, and thoughtful are just a few characteristics that come to mind," stated former Cornell men's hockey head coach MIKE SCHAFER '86. "KEN DRYDEN was a legend and a trailblazer in the sport of hockey. Cornell University, Cornell Hockey, the Montréal Canadiens, and the hockey community have lost one of the greatest ambassadors for our sport. Our thoughts go out to his family, and especially his wife, Lynda."

At Cornell, Dryden compiled a remarkable 76-4-1 record with a 1.59 goals-against average and .939 save percentage, while leading the Big Red to the first three of its four consecutive ECAC Hockey Tournament titles (1967-69), two ECAC Hockey regular-season championships (1968 and 1969), and the 1967 NCAA title. His career goals-against average and save percentage still rank second in program history among eligible goaltenders.

After graduating from Cornell in 1969 with a degree in history, Dryden launched an extraordinary eight-year NHL career with the Montréal Canadiens. He won six Stanley Cups, five Vezina Trophies, the Conn Smythe Trophy in 1971 as the Stanley Cup Playoffs' MVP, and the Calder Trophy in 1972 as the league's Rookie of the Year.

In 1973, Dryden earned the first of his five Vezina Trophies after leading the league in wins (33), goals-against average (2.26), and save percentage (.926). He remains one of four goaltenders in NHL history to win the award at least five times, alongside Jacques Plante (seven), Bill Durnan (six), and Dominik Hasek (six).

Dryden stepped away from hockey for the 1973-74 season, briefly retiring while earning a law degree from McGill University and working at a Toronto law firm, before returning to the Canadiens in 1974. Over the next five seasons, he anchored one of the NHL's most dominant dynasties, guiding the Canadiens to four straight Stanley Cups (1976-79) and capturing the Vezina Trophy each year. During that stretch, he posted a 150-33-30 record with a 2.13 goals-against average, .920 save percentage, and 28 shutouts.

"From the moment **KEN DRYDEN** joined Montréal as a 23-year-old rookie in 1971, he made an immediate and lasting impact on the NHL, the Canadiens franchise, and the goaltending position," said NHL Commissioner and fellow Cornell alumnus **GARY BETTMAN** '74 in a statement." After playing six regular-season games during that first year, Ken proceeded to lead his team to a Stanley Cup while winning the Conn Smythe Trophy as the playoffs' most valuable player. It is almost incomprehensible to believe that he accomplished all of that the year prior to winning the Calder Memorial Trophy as the League's best rookie in 1971-72.

"Ken's early success was only a harbinger of what was to come. In eight years with the Canadiens, Ken would lead a team filled with future Hall of Famers to six Stanley Cup championships, quickly becoming a beloved figure in his adopted hometown of Montréal. He won five Vezina Trophies as the League's top goaltender, including four consecutive awards from 1975-76 to 1978-79. Named as a member of the League's Greatest 100, he was the NHL's dominant goaltender during the 1970s.

"On a personal note, Ken was a fellow Cornellian whose career ranks among the greatest runs in collegiate hockey and famously led the Big Red to the 1967 NCAA Championship. On behalf of the National Hockey League, we mourn the passing of a legendary Canadian and extend our sincere condolences to his wife Lynda, family, and many friends and fans all over the hockey world."

Dryden was inducted into the Cornell Athletics Hall of Fame in 1978 and the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1983, both in his first year of eligibility. His No. 29 sweater was retired by the Canadiens in 2007, and his No. 1 sweater was retired by Cornell in 2010, alongside JOE NIEUWENDYK'S No. 25.

A 1983 inductee into the Hockey Hall of Fame, **KEN DRYDEN** parlayed his dominant Cornell career — where he went 76-4-1 into one of the most remarkable eight-year runs in NHL history with the Montréal Canadiens.

Dryden backstopped Canadiens to six Stanley Cups, compiling a career regular-season record of 258-57-74 with a 2.24

goals-against average, a .922 save percentage and 46 shutouts. He claimed the Vezina Trophy as the NHL's top goaltender five times, including in each of his final four seasons — a feat matched only by fellow Canadiens netminders

In 1971, Dryden became the first rookie in league history to capture the Conn Smythe Trophy as the most valuable player of the Stanley Cup playoffs, cementing his place as one of the game's greats. He was named one of the NHL's top 100 players of all time in 2017.

Inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame in 2011, **JOE NIEUWENDYK** wasted no time making his mark in the NHL after a three-year career at Cornell.

As a rookie with Calgary in 1987-88, he scored 51 goals and 92 points to earn the Calder Trophy, the NHL's Rookie of the Year, one of four players in NHL history to record a 50-goal rookie season (Mike Bossy, 1977-78; Teemu Selänne, 1992-93;

Alex Ovechkin, 2005-06).

A three-time Stanley Cup champion (Calgary in 1989, Dallas in 1999 and New Jersey in 2003), Nieuwendyk also captured the 1999 Conn Smythe Trophy as the most valuable player of the Stanley Cup playoffs, presented by fellow Cornell alumnus and NHL Commissioner GARY BETTMAN '74. He also won the 1995 King Clancy Memorial Award for leadership and humanitarian contributions and was recognized in 2017 as among the NHL's 100 greatest players.
