FIRST TOUCH

▶ The Cornell women's soccer team concludes its three-match road trip with a visit to Providence on Thursday evening before returning to Berman Field on Sunday afternoon to welcome Binghamton in the Big Red's first home contest in two weeks.

WEEKEND REWIND

- ▶ Cornell is coming off a challenging beginning to its three-match road trip last weekend, falling to unbeaten Delaware and ACC foe Syracuse. Despite the setbacks, the Big Red had some encouraging moments — highlighted by sophomore defender **ELLA KOSCHINEG**'s first career goal and a season-high eight-save performance from freshman goalkeeper SAMANTHA QURESHEY.
- ▶ At Delaware, Koschineg provided the spark for Cornell in the 38th minute, driving a left-footed free kick past the Blue Hens' keeper to bring the Big Red within a goal before halftime. Qureshey added four saves, matching her season high for the third time this fall.
- ▶ Cornell returned to New York, where it traveled north on Interstate 81 to face Syracuse, where the Orange scored twice in a 23-second span early in the second half to pull away in a 3-0 contest. Qureshey made eight saves — the most by a Cornell keeper in nearly two years — while senior TANUM NELSON and junior **SYDNEY ALLEN** had the lone shots on goal for the Big Red.

FRESHMAN IN FOCUS

▶ Freshman goalkeeper SAMANTHA QURESHEY has made an impact in her first collegiate season. By starting the season opener at Boston College, Qureshey became just the eighth freshman goalkeeper in program history to start a season opener, joining LISA BRIGHAM (1982), KATE THOMPSON (1983), KATE ALEXANDER (1992), KATIE THOMAS (2001), JODI PALMER (2007), NICOLE SHULMAN (2019), and ERICA FOX (2021). Her clean sheet over the Eagles made her the fifth Big Red freshman goalkeeper to

post a shutout in a season opener, joining Thompson (1983), Alexander (1992), Thomas (2001), and Fox (2021).

▶ Qureshey followed with another clean sheet against La Salle on Aug. 28, making her the ninth true freshman goalkeeper in program history with multiple solo clean sheets, and the first since KELSEY TIERNEY (2 in 2013).

▶ With another clean sheet, Qureshey would be the fifth Cornell rookie to post three or more solo shutouts in a season, joining Brigham (3 in 1982), Thompson (9 in 1983), SHERRIE CHOCOLA (5 in 1984), and Alexander (6 in 1992).

▶ Through the completion of Monday's matches, Qureshey is one of 21 freshmen goalkeepers to have multiple clean sheets, and one of two Ivy League first-year keepers to accomplish the feat, joining Dartmouth's Paige Knoth (three).

NEWS AND NOTES

- ▶ Thursday marks the fifth all-time meeting between Cornell and Providence, with the Big Red holding a 2-0-2 advantage in the series. The programs last met on Nov. 16, 2002, when Cornell advanced on penalty kicks in the ECAC Tournament in Queens, N.Y.
- Cornell's last victory in regulation against the Friars came on Oct. 31, 1993, in Providence. Amy Duesing delivered the game-winner with 2:03 remaining to cap a three-point performance in a 2-1 decision, while Sue DeLong made eight saves in goal.
- ▶ Providence was picked sixth in the 11-team BIG EAST Preseason Coaches' Poll, with defender Ella McBride earning the Friars' lone Preseason All-BIG EAST selection.
- ▶ The Friars are in the midst of a four-match homestand that opened last week against Sacred Heart. Their contest with Rutgers was postponed due to weather and will will conclude on Wednesday against fellow lvy League foe Brown.
- Amaya Coffie, Lily Gibbs, Isabella Kloock-Jensen, and Courtnee Pickles are all tied for the team lead in goals (1) and points (2).

NEWS AND NOTES

- Sunday will be the 17th all-time meeting between Cornell and Binghamton, with the Big Red claiming a slight 6-5-5 advantage in the series.
- After not playing last year, the Central New York rivalry will be renewed for the first time since the teams played to a 2-2 tie on Sept. 13, 2023, on Berman Field.
- Cornell will look to snap its six-match winless streak against Binghamton (0-3-3) as the Big Red's last victory against the Bearcats came in a 1-0 result on Sept. 18, 2016, in Vestal. The last home victory for the Big Red over the Bearcats was in 2015, when it also won by a 1-0 decision.
- ▶ Binghamton enters Sunday's match riding a four-match unbeaten streak (3-0-1), defeating Marist (2-1 on Aug. 28), George Washington (4-1 on Aug. 31), and Colgate (3-2 on Sept. 7), and also playing to a scoreless draw with Syracuse (Sept. 4).
- Five of Binghamton's seven matches have featured the Bearcats scoring at least two goals, highlighted by their season-high four-goal output against George Washington. Jahkaya Davis has a team-high five goals and is tied with Paige Luke (four goals, four assists) for the team lead in points (12).

NEWS AND NOTES

- Next Saturday marks the 39th all-time meeting between Cornell and Columbia, with the Big Red holding a 20-17-1 advantage in the series despite going winless in 15 of the last 18 matchups (3-14-1).
- Cornell will open Ivy League play against its Empire State and Ancient Eight rival for the 25th time overall, and the first since 2022. It will also be the 20th occasion this century that the Big Red begins conference play against the Lions.
- Columbia has endured a slow start to the 2025 season, having a 1-4-1 record entering this weekend's slate. After suffering setbacks to Hofstra, Villanova, Pepperdine, and Loyola Marymount, the Lions have defeated St. John's (1-0 last Thursday) and played to a 1-1 draw with La Salle on Sunday.
- ▶ Krystal Medina has been the offensive catalyst, leading the team in goals (2) and points (5) and factoring in three of Columbia's four tallies. Maia Beltran and Evelyn Javers have provided the Lions' other goals.
- ▶ In goal, Samantha Mahoney has started five of Columbia's six contests, posting a 1-3-1 mark with a 1.40 goals-against average and .462 save percentage.

#YELLCORNELL

HOME, SWEET, HOME

- ▶ Before embarking on its current three-match road swing, Cornell wrapped up a homestand by going unbeaten, posting wins over Colgate (Aug. 24) and La Salle (Aug. 28) before drawing with Kent State (Aug. 31).
- ▶ The run marked just the 10th time in program history that the Big Red has gone unbeaten during a singleseason homestand of at least three matches, and the first since 2013, when it defeated in-state foes Marist, UAlbany, and Binghamton.
- ▶ Cornell's 2-0-1 home record is the 12th instance in program history the Big Red has opened a season unbeaten through three home matches, most recently achieved in 2023 (1-0-2). A result against Binghamton on Sunday would extend that streak to four for the first time since 2023 (2-0-2). With a win, Cornell would notch at least three victories in its first four home matches for the ninth time in program history, and the first since 2019 (3-0-1).
- ► A result Sunday would also give Cornell a four-match unbeaten streak, its longest since setting a programrecord 11-match stretch (5-0-6) spanning the 2022 and 2023 seasons. It would be the 18th time the Big Red has gone unbeaten in at least four home matches in program history.
- ► Following the conclusion of Monday's matches, Cornell is one of 119 Division I programs yet to drop a home match this season, and one of three Ivy League teams still unbeaten on its home pitch, joining Dartmouth (1-0-1) and Penn (2-0-1).
- Although Princeton snapped Cornell's program-record 14-match goal-scoring streak last Sept. 28, the Big Red has continued to produce offense at Berman Field, finding the back of the net in 19 of its last 21 — and 22 of its last 26 — home contests dating back to 2022.
- ▶ Over the 21-match span, Cornell is averaging 1.38 goals per game, including eight multi-goal efforts, highlighted by its 4-0 rout of UAlbany on Oct. 17, 2023.

THE FINISHING TOUCH

- ▶ Junior forward **SYDNEY ALLEN** has built a reputation as one of Cornell's most reliable clutch performers. She delivered again in the Big Red's home-opening win over Colgate on Aug. 24, netting her fourth career goal, which remarkably all of which have come on Berman Field and has served as game-winning markers.
- Another decisive strike would cement her in Cornell's record book, creating a five-way tie for 10th on the program's all-time list for game-winners alongside DINA GROSSMAN (1988-91), AMY DUESING (1991-94), JEN TIDSBURY (1991-94), and EMILY KNIGHT (2000-03). At the top stands LAURIE COLLIER (1984-87), who owns the program standard with 11.
- ▶ Allen's knack for big moments was on full display last fall, when her winner against Yale on Oct. 19 made her just the 12th player (14th instance) in school history to record at least three game-winning goals in a single season. She became the first to accomplish the feat since MANEESHA CHITANVIS in 2010 and went on to finish the season tied for the Ivy League lead with Harvard's Josefine Hasbo and Princeton's Brooke Dawihare and Pietra Tordin in game-winners while ranking 94th nationally.
- ▶ Her finishing touch has also fueled a broader offensive trend under head coach ROB FERGUSON. Since his arrival, the Big Red has scored in 46 of their 69 matches (66.7 percent), the second-highest rate in program

history behind only the 68.1 percent mark set by founding coach RANDY MAY (1982-99). Ferguson is one of six Cornell coaches to see their teams score in at least 60 percent of matches played — a group that features May, BERHANE ANDERBERHAN (66.0 percent, 2000-05), GRETCHEN ZIGANTE (64.7 percent, 2006), and PATRICK FARMER (62.2 percent, 2012–16).

A GLANCE AT WHAT'S BACK

- ▶ Cornell brings back a strong returning group in 2025, with 18 players who saw action last fall. The Big Red also return four of its top six scorers and half of the team's offensive production (17 of 34 points: six goals, five assists).
- Leading the way is junior forward SYDNEY ALLEN, the Big Red's top returning scorer after tying LAKEN GALLMAN for the team lead in goals (3) and finishing with six points. She is joined by senior midfielders ABIGAIL BISHARA and TANUM NELSON, and junior forward ALANNA COLBERT, each of whom added a goal and an assist last season.
- ▶ Bishara, a Second Team All-Ivy selection in 2024, is one of 13 all-conference honorees returning across the Ivy League this fall — with all eight programs represented.
- ▶ Cornell's 18 returners are tied with Columbia and Penn for the second-most in the Ivy League, trailing only Brown (19). The Big Red is also one of four Ivy programs bringing back at least half of last year's scoring output, alongside Brown (64.4 percent), Penn (64.1 percent), and Princeton (56.3 percent).
- ▶ In goal, seniors NATALIE MEDUGNO and HANNAH **GRIMES** return as experienced options. Medugno made 11 appearances (10 starts) in 2024, compiling a 2-4-4 record, while Grimes saw her first collegiate action

against Pepperdine, closing out the final 9:27 after starter **ERICA FOX** received a red card.

MOST POINTS RETURNING FROM 2024

▶ The Big Red also regains senior forward SYDNEY MALAGA, who missed the 2024 campaign due to injury. In 2023, Malaga finished in a four-way tie with LAKEN GALLMAN, MIA GONZALEZ, and AVA LADEN for the team lead in goals (three), which included scoring the game-winning goal against Colgate (Sept. 26, 2023).

BLEEDING CARNELIAN RED

- ▶ Family ties run deep within the Cornell women's soccer program, where this year's roster features an impressive group of third-generation Big Red student-athletes, carrying legacies that span football fields, soccer pitches, and classrooms across campus.
- ► Senior forward **SYDNEY MALAGA** is one of those players, following in the footsteps of her father, SCOTT MALAGA, a Cornell Athletics Hall of Famer inducted in 1999. Scott concluded his standout career with the Big Red amassing 1,925 rushing yards, which still ranks ninth in program history. Sydney's twin brother, LUKE, also represented the Big Red on the gridiron from 2021-24.
- ▶ On the back line, senior defender **GABY GONZALEZ** continues her family's strong Cornell tradition. A third-generation student, she follows her parents, JACK and JODI (both Class of 1991). Jack, played for the men's soccer team from 1988-90, while Gaby's older sister, MIA, was a four-year member of the women's soccer team (2020-24) before completing her collegiate career at Vanderbilt last year. Gaby also had a pair of uncles who graduated from Cornell.
- ▶ Fellow senior forward **GRACE DIEHL** also represents a multi-generational Cornell Athletics legacy. Her father, JEFF (1991-92), and late grandfather, THOMAS (1967-68), each played football for the Big Red, with Thomas later serving as a faculty member in the Nolan School of Hotel Administration. Senior forward MARAN KINGSLEY is another third-generation Cornell student; her mother, Peggy, earned an MBA at Cornell, and her grandfather was an undergraduate student in the College of Engineering.
- Senior midfielder MARIANA KESSINGER is following the path of both parents, who attended Cornell, while sophomore defender JANE OFFIT is a third-generation Cornellian whose mother, Amanda, and grandfather also studied on East Hill. Freshman midfielder CHLOE BENIK joins the Big Red as the second member of her family to attend Cornell, alongside one of her cousins.

GEOGRAPHICALLY DIVERSE

- Cornell's 2025 roster highlights the program's broad national reach, featuring players from 14 states across all four contiguous U.S. time zones. The roster reflects the Big Red's ability to attract talent from coast to coast while maintaining strong ties to its home region.
- ▶ New York leads the way with eight representatives, underscoring the program's roots within its home state. California, Pennsylvania, and Texas each have three players, while Connecticut, Georgia, Illinois, and New Jersey provide two student-athletes apiece. Rounding out the roster are single representatives from Massachusetts, Maryland, Michigan, South Carolina, Vermont, and Washington.

GETTING THE CAPTAIN'S BAND

- ▶ Leadership for the 2025 season will be guided by a three-player captaincy, with senior midfielders ABIGAIL BISHARA and TANUM NELSON joined by senior defender GABY GONZALEZ.
- ▶ Bishara enters her third year in a leadership role, having served on the team's leadership council the past two seasons. Nelson and Gonzalez assume leadership responsibilities for the first time this season.

SCOUTING PROVIDENCE

- ▶ Providence (3-0-1) continues its homestand Thursday after defeating Sacred Heart, 1-0, last Wednesday. The Friars' weekend match against Rutgers was postponed due to inclement weather. Providence will close out the homestand next Wednesday when it welcomes another Ivy League opponent, Brown, to Chapey Field at Anderson Stadium.
- ► Stephanie Schoeley was named BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week after anchoring the Friars' back line in the win over Sacred Heart, holding the Pioneers to just one shot attempt.
- ▶ Four players Amaya Coffie, Lily Gibbs, Isabella Kloock-Jensen, and Courtnee Pickles share the team lead with one goal and two points apiece. Goalkeeper Ellie Thallman has played every minute for the Friars this season, posting a 0.75 goals-against average, .800 save percentage, and a pair of clean sheets. She was tabbed BIG EAST Goalkeeper of the Week on Aug. 18 after recording a shutout against Army.
- ▶ The Friars were picked sixth in the BIG EAST Preseason Coaches' Poll. Defender Ella McBride earned the team's lone Preseason All-BIG EAST honor and has already collected BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week recognition (Aug. 25) after limiting Northeastern to just two shots.

LAST TIME AGAINST PROVIDENCE

- ▶ QUEENS, N.Y. (NOV. 16, 2002) After a 1-1 draw through regulation and two overtimes, the Cornell women's soccer team advanced past Providence with a 3-0 result in penalty kicks in the ECAC semifinals at Belson Stadium on the campus of St. John's.
- ▶ EMILY KNIGHT opened the scoring in the 70th minute, volleying home a free kick from freshman ALI GOMBAR to give Cornell a 1-0 lead. Providence responded late, as Lauren Ritchie headed in an equalizer off a set piece with just 4:17 remaining in regulation. Neither side could break through in the two extra periods, sending the match to penalties.
- ► Cornell converted on its first three attempts, with senior co-captain **SARAH OLSEN**, Gombar, and senior **CAILIN RICE** all finding the net. Providence missed on its first three tries, including a decisive save by Cornell goalkeeper **KRISTIN LOTITO**, sealing the Big Red's 2-1 victory.
- ▶ Lotito finished with 11 saves in a standout performance, while Providence's Caroline Haines turned aside 12 Cornell shots. The Big Red outshot the Friars, 20-17, while Providence held a 7-4 edge in corner kicks.

PROVIDENCE'S LAST TIME OUT

- ▶ PROVIDENCE, R.I. (SEPT. 3, 2025) Isabella Kloock-Jensen netted her first collegiate goal in the 60th minute, and Ellie Thallman made one save as Providence cruised past Sacred Heart, 1-0, on Chapey Field at Anderson Stadium.
- ▶ Kloock-Jensen deposited a shot past Sacred Heart goalkeeper Casey Mulligan, who played the entirety of the second half, off a cross from the left-side of the box by Thaea Mouratidis. Both Mulligan and Sacred Heart's starting keeper Kyran Thievon made six saves in the setback.
- ▶ Despite the final score, Providence dominated the match statistically, out-shooting the Pioneers by a 21-1 clip and owning a 13-1 edge in shots on goal. The Friars had four corner kicks compared to Sacred Heart's one.

32 YEARS, 324 MILES, 4 MEETINGS

- ▶ Thursday will be the first time Cornell and Providence are meeting since 2002, when the Big Red defeated the Friars in penalty kicks in the ECAC semifinals.
- ► Cornell has yet to lose a match to Providence, having won the first two matches in New York (1992) and Providence (1993) before playing to 1-1 draws in Ithaca (1994) and Queens (2002).

SCOUTING BINGHAMTON

- ▶ Binghamton (5-1-1) enters Sunday's match on a four-match unbeaten streak, highlighted by a 3-2 victory over Colgate this past Sunday at the Bearcats Sports Complex. The Bearcats are off to their best start in eight years.
- ▶ Alexus Worrell delivered the game-winner in the 84th minute against Colgate, extending Binghamton's unbeaten streak to four matches (3-0-1). The streak began with wins over Marist (2-1 on Aug. 28) and George Washington (4-1 on Aug. 31) before playing to a scoreless draw against Syracuse on Sept. 4.
- ▶ The Bearcats' offense has been balanced with four key contributors, highlighted by Jahkaya Davis leading the team with five goals. Davis (five goals, two assists) is tied with Paige Luke (four goals, four assists) for the team lead in points (12). Worrell and Ale Victoriano have each scored twice.
- ▶ In goal, Rebecca Kessler has started all seven matches, posting a 3-1-1 record with a 1.00 goalsagainst average, .793 save percentage, and one shutout. Bella Grace Dunn has come off the bench twice, earning wins in both appearances while registering a 2.00 goals-against average and .667 save percentage.

LAST TIME AGAINST BINGHAMTON

- ▶ ITHACA, N.Y. (SEPT. 13, 2023) In the last meeting between Cornell and Binghamton, then-junior SYDNEY MALAGA and then-senior AVA LADEN scored second-half goals to erase an early deficit, but a late Bearcats tally forced a 2-2 draw at Berman Field.
- ▶ The result extended Cornell's home unbeaten streak to nine matches, matching the program record set in 1985-86 (8-0-1), and pushed the Big Red's overall unbeaten streak to seven (4-0-3) dating back to the previous season. Laden's strike marked her second of the year, while Malaga netted her first. Sophomore goalkeeper NATALIE MEDUGNO made three first-half saves to help Cornell (2-0-3) post its best five-match start since 2019 (4-1-0).
- ▶ For Binghamton (1-4-3), Lexi Vogoda factored into both goals, registering a three-point night, while Paige Luke provided the equalizer and Kaitlyn Williams made seven saves in net.

BINGHAMTON'S LAST TIME OUT

- ▶ VESTAL, N.Y. (SEPT. 7, 2025) Binghamton rallied from a 1-0 halftime deficit to defeat Colgate, 3-2, behind a trio of second-half goals at the Bearcats Sports Complex.
- ▶ Alexus Worrell delivered the decisive strike in the 84th minute, capping a comeback that extended the Bearcats' unbeaten streak to four matches (3-0-1) and secured their best start to a season in eight
- ▶ Paige Luke was at the center of the attack, opening the scoring for Binghamton before setting up the team's final two goals. Ale Victoriano also found the back of the net, recording her second tally of the season to help fuel the Bearcats' surge.

23 YEARS, 54 MILES, 16 MEETINGS

- ▶ Cornell holds a narrow 6-5-5 edge in its all-time series with Binghamton, a matchup that began in 2001 during the Bearcats' first season at the Division I level. The rivalry has been marked by close, hard-fought contests, with three of the last four meetings ending in draws — including each of the past two matchups (1-1 in Vestal in 2022; 2-2 in Ithaca in 2023).
- ▶ The Big Red will be aiming to break that recent deadlocks and secure its first victory over the Bearcats since Sept. 18, 2016, when Cornell capped a run of four straight wins in the series. Since then, Binghamton has gone unbeaten over the last six meetings (0-3-3).

ROB FERGUSON

SIXTH YEAR AS HEAD COACH (FIFTH SEASON)

Season at Cornell: Seventh Season College: University of Manchester

ROB FERGUSON, who is entering his sixth year as the head coach of the Cornell women's soccer team, was hired as the sixth head coach in program history in February 2020. Prior to his appointment as head coach, Ferguson served as an assistant coach for the Big Red during the 2019 campaign under previous head coach **DWIGHT HORNIBROOK**.

His most recent season in 2024 saw Cornell have an overall record of 3-9-4 and a 2-5-0 mark in Ivy League action, matching the most conference wins by the Big Red under Ferguson (2-3-2 in 2022). The Big Red had two Second Team All-Ivy honorees in junior midfielder ABIGAIL BISHARA and senior defender LILY ELLINGSON.

Cornell opened the 2024 campaign without a loss in its first three matches, highlighted by a 2-1 victory over Syracuse (Sept. 1, 2024), the second consecutive year the Big Red defeated its Central New York rival. It marked the 12th instance in program history and the first time since 2014 and 2015 that it did not lose any of its first three matches in back-to-back years.

The 2023 campaign saw Cornell go 4-5-6 overall and 0-5-2 in Ivy League action. The Big Red had its highest offensive production in a season since 2015, as the Big Red recorded 21 goals and 58 points. **REAGAN PAUWELS** was named a Second Team All-Ivy selection for a second consecutive season while MIA GONZALEZ (forward) and CECILY POKIGO (defender) earned Honorable Mention All-Ivy honors. The trio of Big Red players marked the first time Cornell has had at least three players earn All-Ivy honors in consecutive seasons since 2014 and 2015.

Cornell also opened the 2023 campaign unbeaten over its first six matches of the season (2-0-4), marking the fifth time in program history that the Big Red had not lost any of its first six matches of a season (1986, 1991, 2005, 2015, 2023). The Big Red also went 2-0-3 in its first five home games to register a program-record 11-game home unbeaten streak that dated back to 2022 (5-0-6).

Posting a 4-7-5 record with a 2-3-2 Ivy League ledger in 2022, both of Cornell's conference victories - the most in a season since 2016 - came in the program's final two matches of the season. It was the first time Cornell had won consecutive Ivy League matches since the last match in 2014 and the first fixture in 2015. The Big Red had a 3-1-3 record on Berman Field, which included going unbeaten in its final six matches (3-0-3). The Big Red also had a trio of All-Ivy award winners, including Pauwels and Pokigo receiving Second Team All-Ivy honors.

After Ferguson's first year as head coach in 2020 was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Cornell had a 3-11-2 mark in 2021, including a 1-6-0 lvy League record. The Big Red recorded its first conference win at home against Columbia, its first Ancient Eight win since 2016.

In his first season on East Hill as an assistant coach on Hornibook's staff in 2019, Ferguson guided the Big Red to four consecutive victories to start the season – including three straight clean sheets over Siena, Bucknell, and St. Bonaventure. Cornell ultimately finished the season with a 4-10-1 record after the rigors of one some of the strongest Ivy League competition seen in recent years. Ferguson helped get the Big Red's impact freshman class acclimated to collegiate competition, a group that included 2019 All-Ivy League honorable mention selection Ashley Durik.

Ferguson joined the Big Red following a very successful stint as the director of coaching with the WNY Flash Academy. He helped turn the program into a player development leader in Western New York, expanding the program's footprint from 15 teams to 34 teams, and moving them into national recognition in Elite Clubs National League (ECNL).

Under Ferguson's leadership at the Flash, their 03G ECNL and 02G ECNL advanced into the Elite 8 in June 2018, and the club had their first US Youth National Team Camp call-up.

Before joining the WNY Flash Academy, Ferguson was the head coach of both the men's and women's soccer programs at Huston-Tillotson University, an NAIA institution based in Austin, Texas Prior to that, he served as the executive director of business for the Lonestar Soccer Club for eight years, spanning from 2008 to 2015.

One of the largest and most successful youth soccer clubs in the country, Ferguson coached the Lonestar 96B Red, 93G Red, 94G Red and 95G Red, helping advance the 95G Red to the USYSNC Region III Championships in 2013 and 2014.

Previous stops for Ferguson included a stint as the head coach with Albion Hurricanes FC in Houston, where he guided the AHFC 94G Blue to the USYSNC Regionals for the first time in their history. Before that, he was the director of coaching for FC Arsenal for three years in Bastrop, Texas, and was a regional manager for Brittania Soccer/ProExcel, based in Seattle.

Ferguson is a graduate of the University of Manchester, where he received a bachelor of arts degree in sports studies and business management. He lives with his wife, Kelsey, their two children, Maxwell and Mirann, and their two dogs, Bonsai and Charlie.
