# 2005 Season Preview

The SUNY Cortland football team is coming off a 5-4 season last fall that included a third-place 4-2 record in the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC). The Red Dragons were only a combined four points, however, from a league title and an NCAA bid — goals the 2005 squad feels are definitely within its reach as the season opens.

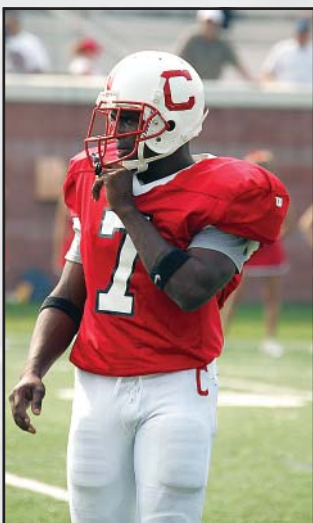
The Red Dragons, selected second in the seven-team preseason NJAC coaches' poll, return 15 starters from a year ago. Ninth-year head coach **Dan MacNeill's** team is still relatively young, though, as all eight returning defensive starters are sophomore or juniors, as are five of the seven returning starters on offense and special teams.

Junior tackle **Adam Haas** and junior end **Rich Coyne** anchor Cortland's defensive line. Haas was a second team All-East and first team All-NJAC lineman last fall after recording 47 tackles, including team-highs of 9.5 sacks, 14.5 total tackles for losses and 14 quarterback hurries. Coyne recorded 15 tackles and 2.5 sacks in six games a year ago. **Eric Czachor**, one of only four seniors on Cortland's preseason roster, looks to battle for a starting end spot along with junior **Rich DeJesus** and sophomore **Charles Johnson**. Junior **Michael Connolly** and sophomores **Dave Fregelette**, **Brad Robison** and **Greg Sims** are among the group battling for playing time at tackle.

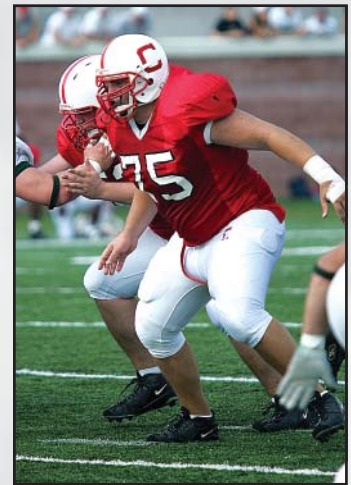
Junior captains **Matt Montpetit** and **Josh Jablonski** and sophomore **Dave D'Aurelio** highlight Cortland's corps of returning linebackers. Montpetit, a first team All-NJAC and All-ECAC selection, led the Red Dragons last fall with 82 tackles. He made 9.5 tackles for losses, including three sacks, and forced two fumbles. Jablonski, an honorable mention All-NJAC choice, was second on the team with 68 tackles and five sacks. He also intercepted a pass, broke up six others and blocked a team-high three kicks. D'Aurelio started two of nine games last fall and finished with 36 tackles and two interceptions, both of which he returned for touchdowns. Sophomore **Bill Hauser** is a top candidate for a starting linebacker spot, while sophomore **Chris Gagstetter** is slated in the preseason to back up Montpetit.

All four starters return in the Cortland secondary. Junior safety **Stef Sair** earned second team All-East and first team All-NJAC honors last fall and sophomore cornerback **Jeff Beck** was an honorable mention All-NJAC selection. Sair and Beck shared the team lead with three interceptions and 10 pass breakups each. Sair was third on the team with 67 tackles, while Beck finished the season with 31 tackles. Junior safety **Chuck Eich** finished last season with 61 tackles and broke up two passes. Sophomore cornerback **Greg Steward** registered 36 tackles and three pass breakups. Sophomore **Mark Schaller** will also battle for time at safety, while junior **Ricky Case** returns as a cornerback after breaking up two passes in seven games.

Sophomore quarterback **Alex Smith** is one of six returning offensive starters. Last season, Smith became the first Cortland freshman quarterback since 1983 to start on opening day. He held that job the remainder of the year and earned honorable mention All-NJAC honors after completing 57 percent of his passes (132-of-230) for 1,599 yards and 13 touchdowns. He was intercepted just eight times, including only three picks in his final six games, and was the team's second-leading rusher with 257 yards on 64 attempts.

Three starting offensive linemen return to protect Smith. Senior guard **Bobby DeThomas**, a two-time team captain, is back along with senior guard **Eric Jendryaszek** and junior tackle **Matt Ciquera**. Jendryaszek was a second team All-NJAC selection last season. Cortland led the NJAC in rushing last year, averaging 155.1 yards per game, and allowed just 11 sacks all year. Junior **David Holleran** looks to compete for a starting tackle position, while sophomore **Dan DiFalco** is the top candidate at center. DiFalco played in the final five games last season and was the starting center for the last three contests. Also competing for playing time on the offensive line is sophomore **Steve Longinott**, a reserve defensive lineman last year, and sophomore **Nate Howe**.

The starting tailback role is up for grabs for the first time in a while with the departure of **Steve Davis**, a four-time All-NJAC selection and Cortland's second all-time leading rusher (2,826 yards). Junior captain **Matt Rickert**, Cortland's starting fullback last season, will compete for the starting tailback position along with sophomore **Dustin Bowser**. Both averaged more than five yards per carry last fall. Two returning players, junior **Mike Emard** and sophomore **Mike Sveda**, are the top candidates at fullback.

The offensive area most depleted from a year ago is the receiving corps. Rickert is actually the team's top returning receiver with 19 catches for 209 yards and a touchdown out of the backfield last year. Junior **Anthony Morat** caught 14 passes for 147 yards and two touchdowns in seven games, six as a starter, last year. Junior **Drew Lascari** was the team's backup quarterback the last two seasons, but is now competing for a starting wide receiver role. Also in the mix are sophomores **Stan Cadet** and **Keith Greene**. Sophomore **Paul Caughell** is the top candidate for the starting tight end spot. As a backup last year, Caughell caught eight passes for 120 yards and two touchdowns.

Junior **Matt Librock** returns after handling punting duties in his first season with the team last fall. He averaged close to 31 yards per punt and pinned opponents inside their 20-yard line 15 times. Sophomore **Derek Ziders** took over placekicking duties toward the end of last season and made both of his field goal attempts, including a 39-yarder versus Ithaca. Sophomore **Matthew Mintz**, who handled Cortland's kickoffs in 2004, will also compete for placekicking responsibilities.

# Coaching Staff



**Dan MacNeill,  
Head Coach**

Dan MacNeill enters his ninth season as SUNY Cortland's head football coach in 2005. His teams are a combined 45-36 and have made three post-season appearances.

In 2002, MacNeill led the Red Dragons to a 9-2 mark -- the most wins at the school since 1990 -- and the ECAC Division III Northwest title. The team also placed second in the New Jersey Athletic Conference (NJAC) with a 4-2 record. In 2003, Cortland finished the regular season with a 5-4 mark before losing in the ECAC Northwest championship game. In his first season at the helm in 1997, MacNeill guided Cortland to an 8-3 mark and a berth in the NCAA Division III playoffs.

Among MacNeill's other highlights at Cortland are a 32-31 win over nationally second-ranked and eventual national semifinalist Rowan University in the 2001 season and four victories against rival Ithaca College in the annual "Cortaca Jug" game.

MacNeill has coached four All-Americans, 37 All-East and 34 All-ECAC players at Cortland, including Omar Darling, the 1997 ECAC Upstate New York Player of the Year, and Chuck Eich, the 2003 ECAC Upstate New York Defensive Rookie of the Year. In addition, his players have earned 56 All-NJAC honors since the program joined the league in 2000.

An assistant coach at Division I-AA Villanova University from 1984-1996, MacNeill is Cortland's 11th head coach since the school's modern era of football began in 1924. MacNeill served as linebackers coach at Villanova and was the team's defensive coordinator from 1988-96. One of the nation's top defensive coaches, MacNeill's charges consistently ranked among the best defensive teams in the Yankee Conference. His 1991 squad finished the year first nationally in scoring defense, second in total defense and fifth in rushing defense while leading the Yankee Conference in every defensive category. The Wildcats placed first nationally in rushing defense

in 1992. In 1996, Villanova finished 8-4 and earned a berth in the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs.

While at Villanova, MacNeill coached three AFCA/Kodak First Team All-Americans, one Associated Press All-American, six first team All-Yankee Conference performers, six first team All-ECAC selections and one player who went on to the NFL. He received a Master's degree in Educational Administration from Villanova in 1994.

A 1979 Cortland graduate with a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education, MacNeill was a four-year Red Dragon letterwinner and three-year starter at linebacker and defensive tackle. He served as a team tri-captain during his senior campaign in 1978. In his last varsity game against Southern Connecticut State, he was credited with 11 unassisted tackles and three quarterback sacks.

MacNeill began his football coaching career as an assistant at Port Byron (N.Y.) Central High School from 1980 to 1982, prior to being named as a graduate assistant coach at Ithaca College. He coached Ithaca's junior varsity team in 1982 and was in charge of the Bombers' receivers in 1983.

A native of Walton, N.Y., MacNeill was an all-league defensive end at Walton Central High School as a senior in 1974. MacNeill and his wife, Sherrie, have two daughters -- Mikayla, 9, and Maura, 6.

## 2005 Assistant Football Coaches



**Larry Czarnecki,**  
**Tight Ends**

Larry Czarnecki will work with Cortland's tight ends in 2005 as he continues a long-standing coaching career with the Red Dragons.

Czarnecki served as Cortland's offensive coordinator from 2001-04 and was the team's defensive coordinator and interior defensive line coach from 1999-2000. He was Cortland's head football coach from 1983-85 after working as the team's defensive line coach in 1978 and defensive coordinator from 1979-82.

A former Cortland track and field head coach, Czarnecki was named the State University of New York Athletic Conference (SUNYAC) Men's Track and Field Coach of the Year in both 2001 and 2002 after guiding the Red Dragons to two outdoor league titles. In 1999, Czarnecki earned SUNYAC Women's Track and Field "Coach of the Year" honors after leading the Red Dragons' to indoor and outdoor league titles and a 12th-place outdoor national finish. Czarnecki served as Cortland's assistant track and field coach from 1978-85, working with the Red Dragons' field event athletes. He was the program's interim head coach in 1981.

Czarnecki received a Bachelor of Science in Physical Education from Ithaca College in 1976 and his master's degree in the same field the following year. He returned to his alma mater in 1986 as an assistant football and track and field coach. He worked with the Bombers' football squad until 1996, coaching the offensive line on squads which won NCAA Division III titles in 1988 and 1991.

Czarnecki was a standout defensive tackle at Ithaca, earning Kodak and Associated Press First Team All-America honors. He was named the ECAC Division III Football "Player of the Year" as a senior captain in 1975. He led the Bombers to Lambert Trophies and appearances in the NCAA Division III championship games in his junior and senior seasons. Czarnecki also competed on Ithaca's Track and Field club team and played semi-pro football with the Scranton Stars (1976-78) and Binghamton Jets (1979-80).



**Kory David,**  
**Safeties/Special Teams and Strength and Conditioning Coordinator**

Kory David enters his sixth season on Cortland's coaching staff in 2005. He will work with the team's safeties this fall after coaching inside linebackers last year and

outside linebackers prior to that. David also continues as both Cortland's special teams and strength and conditioning coordinator. In 2003, freshman linebacker Chuck Eich was named the ECAC Northwest Rookie of the Year under his tutelage.

Prior to joining Dan MacNeill's staff, David enjoyed a highly successful four-year playing career with the Red Dragons.

He played from 1996-99, serving as a team captain in his junior and senior seasons. The physical education major graduated in 2000.

As a senior linebacker, David recorded 51 tackles and three interceptions in nine contests. As a junior in 1998, he was a second team ECAC Upstate New York all-star and third team *Football Gazette* All-East selection. He also earned third team All-East honors in 1997, helping Cortland make the NCAA Division III playoffs. He registered 259 tackles in four collegiate seasons.

A 1995 graduate of Massena Central, David played football, ice hockey and lacrosse. He was an all-state football selection in 1994. He originally enrolled at the University at Albany in 1995 before transferring to Cortland. He is currently single and resides in Cortland.



**Ryan Fullen,**  
**Cornerbacks**

Ryan Fullen joins the Cortland coaching staff in 2005. A 2005 graduate of Salve Regina University in Rhode Island, Fullen was a standout safety and linebacker for the Seahawks from 2000-03. He recorded 72 tackles as a senior and was the squad's Defensive Impact Player of the Year as a junior.

Fullen served as an assistant coach at St. George's School in Newport, R.I., in 2004. The Toms River, N.J., native is a graduate of Monsignor Donovan High School, where he lettered in football and tennis. He is currently single and resides in Cortland.



**Casey Goff,**  
**Defensive Line**

Casey Goff starts his second season working with Cortland's defensive linemen in 2005. He came to Cortland after serving as linebackers coach at Mansfield (Pa.)

University in the spring of 2004 and as the defensive line coach at Emmaus (Pa.) High from 2002-03. Goff has also worked as a defensive line coach at Muhlenberg (Pa.) College in 2001 and as a student assistant at Susquehanna University (Pa.) in 2000.

Goff graduated from Susquehanna with a bachelor's degree in history in 2001. He played four seasons of football for the Crusaders -- three years as a defensive tackle and one as an outside linebacker. He received a Coaches Award in 1999. The Montrose, Pa., native graduated from Montrose Area High School in 1996. He earned all-conference honors as a linebacker during his senior year. Goff is currently single and resides in Cortland.



**Ryan Jones,  
Wide Receivers**

Ryan Jones begins his first season on the Cortland coaching staff in 2005. A Miami University of Ohio graduate this past spring, Jones served as a four-year student assistant coach for the Red Hawks. The team played

in the Independence Bowl in 2004 and won the Mid American Conference title and defeated Louisville in the GMAC Bowl in 2003.

A native of Wapakoneta, Ohio, Jones is a 2000 alumnus of Wapakoneta High School. The valedictorian of his class, Jones was a three-year letterwinning wide receiver and played in the 2000 Northwest Ohio All-Star Game. He is currently single and resides in Cortland.



**Dan Lounsbury,  
Quarterbacks/Offensive Coordinator**

Dan Lounsbury begins his second season as quarterbacks coach and his first as offensive coordinator for the Red Dragons in 2005. Lounsbury brings an extensive coaching background to the program,

having most recently served as quarterbacks coach and offensive coordinator at Division I Tulsa University before his arrival at Cortland.

Lounsbury has also coached on the Division I level at Texas Christian, Kentucky, Houston, Purdue and Texas. He has professional experience with the New York/New Jersey Knights of the World League of American Football, the Toronto Argonauts of the Canadian Football League and the Shreveport Knights.

Lounsbury began his career at Sam Houston St. as quarterbacks and wide receivers coach and offensive coordinator. His teams set 15 offensive school records during his tenure. He eventually moved to Howard Payne and Texas A & M at Commerce before securing the head coaching position at Southeastern Oklahoma St. He also earned head coaching experience at the University of Wisconsin-Superior. His teams have set numerous conference and national offensive records through the years and have played in three bowl games.

Lounsbury received his Bachelor of Science and Master of Education from the University of Arkansas. He currently resides in Sackets Harbor with his wife, Lea.



**Nate Milne,  
Offensive Line**

Nate Milne starts his second season with the Red Dragon coaching staff in 2005. He will work with the offensive line this season after serving as the team's running backs coach in 2004.

The Jamestown, N.Y., native served as an assistant coach at Hamilton College in the fall of 2003. Milne was a four-year varsity letterwinner as an offensive lineman at Hobart College from 1999-2002, earning first team all-conference honors as a senior. The Statesmen tied for ninth nationally in 2000 and won the Upstate Collegiate Athletic Association crown in 2002. He graduated that spring with a bachelor's degree in history.

Milne is a 1999 graduate of Jamestown High School, where he was a two-time first team All-ECIC and first team All-Western New York selection in football. He is currently single and resides in Cortland.



**Matt Steenberg,  
Running Backs**

Matt Steenberg begins his third stint with the Cortland coaching staff in 2005. He last served on the staff from 1996-98, coaching the quarterbacks in 1996 and the wide receivers in 1997 and 1998. Steenberg was

previously the wide receivers and defensive back coach for the Red Dragons from 1984-85 and the quarterback coordinator from 1985-86.

In 1986, Steenberg became the head football coach at Christian Brothers Academy in Syracuse. He coached at CBA until 1989 before taking over head coaching duties at Fayetteville-Manlius High, where he remained until returning to Cortland.

Steenberg completed his bachelor's degree in physical education at Ithaca College in 1977 and earned a master's degree in physical education from Ithaca in 1978. He played on Ithaca teams that advanced to the NCAA Division III championship game in 1974 and 1975. While working on his master's degree, he served as the Bombers' defensive backs and wide receivers coach.

A native of Syracuse, Steenberg graduated from Nottingham High School in 1973. He currently resides in DeWitt, N.Y., and is a physical education teacher in the Fayetteville-Manlius School District. He and his wife, Lynn, have three children -- Chrysa, 24, Ryan, 21, and Sara, 19.

## In Memoriam



The Cortland football family remembers Shane Geisler, who tragically passed away this past spring at the age of 29. Shane was one of the Red Dragons' top wide

receivers during Dan MacNeill's first two seasons as head coach.

As a senior in 1998, he caught 42 passes for 600 yards and two touchdowns. In his junior season, he caught 18 passes, including a 64-yard touchdown at Ithaca, in addition to his six receptions in Cortland's NCAA playoff game versus The College of New Jersey. Geisler was a member of Cortland's JV team in 1996.

# About SUNY Cortland

Located atop one of the rolling hills in central New York's "City of Seven Valleys," the State University of New York College at Cortland was founded in 1868 as the Cortland Normal School, which included among its earliest students inventor and industrialist Elmer A. Sperry of Sperry-Rand Corp. fame.

Over the decades, the campus expanded and in 1941, by an act of legislature and the Board of Regents, the institution officially became a four-year college providing courses leading to the bachelor's degree. In 1948, Cortland was a founding member of the State University of New York.

Today, approximately 7,500 students are pursuing degrees within the College's three academic divisions — arts and sciences, professional studies and the school of education. Twenty-three departments with a faculty of more than 400 offer the SUNY Cortland student body 70 majors and 44 minors from which to choose.

The College's main campus covers 191 acres and includes 31 traditional and modern buildings. Fifteen of these structures are residence halls providing on-campus housing for approximately 3,000 students. Cortland also operates its Outdoor Education Center at Raquette Lake in the Adirondacks, the Hoxie Gorge Nature Preserve outside Cortland, and the Brauer Memorial Geological Field Station on the Helderberg Escarpment near Albany.

At Cortland, athletics are viewed as having an important role in the educational mission of the College. During the fall, winter and spring seasons, Cortland participates in 25 intercollegiate sports — 14 women's and 11 men's — in an attempt to provide a broad program which meets the needs, interests and abilities of its students.

The Cortland athletic program placed 13th nationally out of 434 colleges and universities in the 2004-05 all-sport United States Sports Academy Directors' Cup Division III standings. The award was formerly known as the Sears Directors' Cup from 1995-2002 and the National Association of Collegiate Directors of

Athletics (NACDA) Directors' Cup in the 2002-03 school year. Cortland is the only New York school and one of only six nationwide to finish in the top 20 each of the last 10 years. Since 1989, the Red Dragons have captured 12 NCAA Division III team titles.

The College offers its student-athletes excellent athletic facilities. The newly-constructed on-campus stadium features two artificial turf fields. One field seats 6,500 spectators, the other 1,500. The Cortland football, field hockey, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's lacrosse and men's and women's track and field teams are among those who utilize the facility, which the *New York Times* called "...a new stadium worthy of a major university power."

The Bessie L. Park Physical Education and Recreation Center, opened in 1973, features the Whitney T. Corey Gymnasium with a 3,500 seating capacity; the Olympic-sized Harriet Holsten swimming pool with gallery seating for 1,500; the Alumni Ice Arena, a facility which can accommodate 2,500 spectators; a 500-seat gymnastics arena, racquetball and squash courts, a wrestling room, modern athletic training facilities and the state-of-the-art Francis Woods Fitness Facility.

Nearby Clayton R. Lusk Field House, with its tartan-textured surface, is home for the indoor track teams, varsity practice sessions and recreational activities. Cortland's soccer teams play on T. Fred "Prof" Holloway Field, which has lights for night contests and newly installed bleachers. The College also has 22 outdoor tennis courts and two outdoor basketball courts and boasts Robert H. Wallace Field (baseball) and Dragon Field (softball) as part of its 51 acres of athletic fields.
